# Seventh heaven beckons Federer, Djokovic

Question marks remain over World No. 2 Nadal's fitness

Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic will be gunning for a record seventh Australian Open crown from Monday, but Andy Murray will make his last appearance in Melbourne as the era of the 'Big Four' draws to a close.

Top seed Djokovic and third seed Federer face a stern challenge from the likes of Alexander Zverev, seeded four, who is still looking for a first Major to cement his place as torch-bearer for the

Murray dropped a pre-Grand Slam bombshell, breaking down during a press conference as he revealed chronic hip pain means he will retire after Wimbledon – if he can carry on that long.

And, question marks remain over the fitness of World No. 2 Rafael Nadal, who pulled out of his Brisbane warm-up but arrived in Melbourne professing he was "fully fit" and promising to unleash a remodelled serve.

It all means the era of the 'Big Four' is almost over after a season in which Federer who opens his title defence against Denis Istomin on Monday – rolled back the

January 14, 2011 saw India slump to a 5-2 loss against Bahrain and exit the AFC Asian Cup after failing to register a single win. Indian football has come a long way since and eight years to the day, the side has a chance to erase the painful memories and re-write history when the two sides face-off in their

final group stage match here. The Blue Tigers have three points to their name after a 4-1 pummelling of Thailand in the opening game, which was followed by a deflating 2-0 loss to the United Arab

Emirates. Bahrain, however, has had a mediocre campaign and has managed to amass only one point from two games, after a 1-1 draw with UAE and a 1-0 loss to Thailand.

Monday night's clash at the Sharjah Football Stadium will be one of the most important games of coach Stephen Constantine's career. A win, or even a draw, will see India progress to the knockout stage of the continental showpiece for the first time, making it the team's biggest achievement on the global

India has had a fairly impressive run at the tournament thus far and has played a more enterprising brand of football as compared to its opponents. The team has looked

of the game. Bahrain will head into the match with the sole aim of claiming all three points if it is to remain in the competition. Constantine acknowledges that this will ensure a thrilling contest.

"The more you have to fight for, the more you have to lose and the harder you have to try. When someone is backed into a corner, he has nothing to lose. They have to win, a draw will do nothing for them," he said.

India's top-scorer Sunil Chhetri is the only player in the current side who had played on 2011 and incidentally, Chhetri had bagged a goal in the 2011 game against Bahrain.

"We haven't achieved anything substantial yet.

What I want to achieve is to reach the top-10 in Asia and rub shoulders with the best. For that, we have to improve a lot. The first step starts with a result against Bahrain," he said.

### Possible scenarios for India to qualify

INDIA WINS: A win will take India to the round-of-16 regardless of the result of the game between the UAE and Thailand. India will top the group if UAE loses but will finish second if UAE wins.

INDIA DRAWS: India can qualify in case of a draw. If UAE beats Thailand, it will finish on top with India second. India will finish second even if UAE and Thailand play a draw as India has a better head-to-head record against Thailand.

If the UAE loses, then India will be in the third spot, but will still have a chance to progress. The odds favour India as Kyrgyzstan and Philippines are yet to open

their accounts in Group C and the same is the case with Vietnam and Yemen (Group D), North Korea and Lebanon (Group E) and Oman (Group F). Even if these teams do

claim a win, they would not match India's tally of four

**INDIA LOSES:** A loss would leave India with just three points, while Bahrain will have four to its name. If Thailand beats UAE, then India will finish fourth and would be eliminated.

However, if UAE defeats Thailand, then India will remain in the hunt as it could advance as one of the four best third-placed teams
