

Dense fog, cold nights ahead: Met

pells of dense to very dense fog are likely in Delhi-NCR during the rest of the week, along with a return of peak cold conditions and a possibility of light rain on Friday, the Met office warned. Officials said visibility could fall to 0-50 metres during this period, particularly on Republic Day and January 27, due to high moisture in the air after Tuesday's rain.

Night temperatures are expected to steadily drop over the next few days and may touch around 4 degrees C on Sunday - a drop of 3-4 degrees from Wednesday's minimum of 8 degrees C. Days may also get slightly colder. Air quality, meanwhile, returned to the "poor" range on Wednesday with an overall AQI of 212, after having improved to 104 on rain-hit Tuesday - the cleanest air quality recorded this year. Officials said 27.8mm of rain was recorded in the last 24 hours. P7

CBI books AI ex-CMD, 4 others for violating norms for promotion

New Delhi: The CBI has filed a case against former Air India chairman-cum-managing director Arvind Jadhav for allegedly violating procedures while deciding on various promotions and appointments.

Along with Jadhav, the CBI has also named then executive director(personnel)LPNakhwa (now retired) and former additional general managers (operations) A Kathpalia, Amitabh Singh and Rohit Bhasin in its FIR registered under IPC sections related to criminal conspiracy and under provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act.

The agency has alleged that Jadhav had constituted a panel in 2010 to promote officers to the rank of GM (operations) in violation of laid-down procedures. The three-member panel included then chief operating officer Gustav Baldauf, then executive director

- Regularised L P Nakhwa (earlier GM) in the post of ED (medical services) without following due procedure. Civil aviation ministry annulled appointment

Nakhwa, who was general manager (medical services), was given the rank of executive director (medical services) after the post was upgraded as a temporary measure till August 31, 2009.

Plea in HC against 3.8% pension levy in bijli bills

New Delhi: The Delhi high court has converted into a PIL a letter opposing the surcharge of 3.8% added to the bills of consumers for payment of pension of the erstwhile Delhi Vidyut Board employees.

In their letter to the HC, the Federation of Resident Welfare Associations of Yamuna Vihar in northeast Delhi had complained that their discom was passing on the burden to consumers without any justification. It challenged the Delhi government's tariff order of March last year under which the surcharge was being levied, saying it had been slapped on consumers unfairly by BSES Yamuna Pvt Ltd (BYPL) and BSES Rajdhani.

The PIL was listed on Wednesday but since the bench of Chief Justice Rajendra Menon and Justice V K Rao didn't assemble, the matter has been listed for hearing on February 4. Last year, DERC had hiked

the surcharge from 3.7 to 3.8%. Earlier, in another petition, consumers had challenged the 3.7% surcharge in the high court. They had accused the power regulator of allowing, since 2011, the collection of Rs 3,020 crore for a government pension fund from consumers through their electricity bills without informing them.

6 Indian sailors killed, 6 missing in ship accident

Moscow/New Delhi: At least six Indian sailors were killed and an equal number of them were missing after two fuel ships carrying Indian and Turkish crew members caught fire in the Kerch Strait, where the blaze was still raging following the accident on Monday, officials said on Wednesday.

Russian authorities on Wednesday resumed the search for 10 missing sailors, including four Indians, in the Kerch Strait which separates Russia from Crimea. One of the ships, the Candy, had a 17-member crew — nine Turkish citizens and eight Indian nationals. The other one, the Maestro, had a 15-member crew comprising seven Turkish nationals, seven Indians and an intern from Libya. "We regret to inform there have been casualties among Indian seamen working on these ships," the MEA said. PTI


