Won't allow Assam to turn into another Kashmir: Shah

At Rally, BJP Chief Bats For Citizenship Bill

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Guwahati: BJP president Amit Shah on Sunday said Assam will not be allowed to turn into "another Kashmir" while adding that the sacrifices by CRPF jawans in the Pulwama attack will not be in vain.

Addressing a Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha rally at Lakhimpur, about 400 km from Shah weaved in an argument in support of the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill, saying the Bill was "meant to stop Assam from becoming a second Kashmir". Shah's oblique reference was to the state's Muslim demographic, which makes up about 34% of Assam's population.

"The Bill intended to save Assam from the demographic changes that would endanger

the state's identity, if not stopped." He added that BJP will bring back the Bill "when PM Modi returns to power".

Shah said only BJP could

ensure the country's security and added that it would not allow "demographic shifts" to alter national identity.

Speaking on the National Register of Citizens issue, the BJP chief said: "It is our commitment — infiltrators will not be allowed into Assam. If required, we are ready to re-

peat the process of updating the NRC to detect infiltrators and deport them." Talking about the Pulwama terror strike, the BJP president said only Modi has the political will to respond to such attacks "through both diplomatic and military channels".

"Be it Kashmir or the north-east, our government is determined to uproot terrorism because at the Centre, we have the Modi government, not a Congress government," he added.

J&K strike like Mughal attack, says Assam CM

Lakhimpur (Assam): Assam CM Sarbananda Sonowal on Sunday likened the Pulwama terror incident to the "attacks of Mughals".

The chief minister was addressing a public rally of the Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha here in the presence of BJP president Amit Shah. "The recent Kashmir incident is an Islamist terrorist attack on India. Our brave jawans were martyred and I pay my sincere homage to them," he said.

"We have to continue the fight against the Mughals even today. The attack of the Mughals is not over yet and the Kashmir incident is a proof of that," Sonowal said.

Forty CRPF jawans were killed in the terror attack in Pulwama on Thursday. **PTI**

Bengal BJP neta held for his daughter's kidnapping

Labhpur: BJP leader Suprabhat Batyabhal and two others were arrested in West Bengal's Birbhum district on Sunday in connection with the kidnapping of his daughter, a senior police officer said.

Batyabhal's daughter, who was kidnapped at gunpoint on Thursday, was "rescued" from Uttar Dinajpur district, he said. In a joint operation with Uttar Dinajpur police, a police team from Birbhum traced the 22-year-old woman to Dalkhola railway station area on Sunday, the officer said.

Batyabhal and two of his associates were arrested after preliminary investigation indicated that they played a role in the kidnapping, he added. "We have rescued the girl after talking to her to find out what had happened. We have also arrested the girl's father who seems to have played an important role in the kidnapping," Birbhum SP Shyam Singh said.

Asked about the motive, Singh said, "There might be a family problem or gaining political mileage could also be the motive." The girl's kidnapping had sparked tensions in Labhpur, with protesters blocking the Suri-Katwa road for three days. **PTI**

Polio-hit doc served for 2 yrs, new rule turns him 'ineligible'

After completing MBBS in 2016 from a government college and working as a junior resident for almost two years, Dr Mohamad Shaloo, who has post-polio residual paralysis, has cleared the post-graduate entrance exam but has been told that under the new Medical Council of India guidelines, he is "ineligible" to study further.

Despite both his legs being polio affected, Dr Shaloo, from Makrana in Nagaur district of Rajasthan, was determined to become a doctor. He went to Kota for coaching and in 2011 got admission in the government medical college in Ajmer under the disability quota.

After MBBS, he did eight months as a junior resident (JR) in the paediatrics department of his college and was then selected on a temporary basis as a JR in the Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation department of RML Hospital in Delhi where he worked for a year. He then cleared the NET PG exam. However, in Safdarjung Hospital's PMR department he was told that as he had over

90% disability, he was "ineligible for admission".

The eligibility guidelines for undergraduate medical education fixed by MCI and notified on February 4 stated that those with disability beyond 80% would be ineligible to appear for MBBS entrance and determine their functional competency with the aid of assistive devices if they were selected.

"They have come up with these arbitrary guidelines for undergraduate medical edu-

cation and now the same is being applied to post-graduate education. Dr Shaloo's case shows how ridiculous this is. He has done his MBBS. How can you suddenly question his competency? Ironically, he was doing residency in the PMR department and these guidelines were framed by a single person in AIMS PMR department," said Dr Satendra Singh of Doctors With Disabilities.

"After having achieved my dream to become a doctor, it hurt to see the word 'ineligible' on the disability certificate given by Safdarjung Hospital," said Dr Shaloo, who said he was currently waiting for an order posting him in the Community Health Centre in Nagaur district.

"Why 80%? Why not 90%? You are disqualifying a person by an arbitrary number. Some disciplines in medicine might be difficult for persons with certain disabilities to cope with, but there are many others which would be suitable. Why can't they identify the disciplines instead of just saying you are totally ineligible?" the colleague asked.

"All my life I was helped by many people. I will not let this stop me," asserted Dr Shaloo.

Why 1 egg per week, not 5, in midday meal, SC asks Bihar

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New Delhi: The Supreme Court has asked the Bihar government why it has been providing just one boiled egg a week to school children under the midday meal scheme when it had ordered all governments in drought affected states to provide egg or milk five days a week.

A bench of Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi and Justice Sanjiv Khanna issued notices to the Bihar government and the Centre on Friday on a PIL filed by NGO 'Veterans Forum For Transparency in Public Life', which said Bihar had received below average rainfall for the last three years and 23 districts were declared drought affected. The SC sought their responses in four weeks.

The petitioner said the Nitish Kumar government had violated the SC's May 2015 judgment in 'Swaraj Abhiyan' case, in which it had directed governments in drought affected states of Bihar, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh to immediately make "adequate provision for sup-

ply of eggs or milk or other nutritional substitute" for children under midday meal scheme. "Eggs, milk or any other nutritional substitute should be given preferably five days in a week or at least three days in a week," advocate Rabin Majumder said.

Despite the severity of the drought and in utter violation of the SC's judgment, the Bihar government on October 20, 2017, had directed all district programme officers to provide one boiled egg or seasonal fruit only on one day of the week. The NGO said it had petitioned public authorities for the last two years but no remedial steps were taken.

ICJ to hold public hearings in Jadhav case from today

The Hague: Amidst fresh Indo-Pak tensions, top legal eagles of the two countries will present their arguments in the high-profile Kulbhushan Jadhav case before the International Court of Justice (ICJ) on Monday during four days of public hearings.

Jadhav, a retired Indian Navy officer, was sentenced to death by a Pakistani military court on charges of espionage and terrorism in April 2017.

India moved the ICJ in May the same year against the "farfetched trial" by the military court of Pakistan against Jadhav. India first approached the ICJ on May 8, 2017 for the "egregious violation" of the provisions of the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations, 1963 by Pakistan by repeatedly denying it consular access to Jadhav.

A 10-member bench of

the ICJ on May 18, 2017 had restrained Pakistan from executing Jadhav till adjudication of the case.

The ICJ has set a timetable for the public hearing in the case from today to February 21 in The Hague. The hearings at the ICJ will take place four days after one of the worst terror attacks in Jammu & Kashmir that killed 41 CRPF soldiers. Pakistan-backed Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) claimed responsibility for the attack.

Former solicitor general Harish Salve is expected to represent India while Pakistan will be represented by Barrister Khawar Qureshi. It is expected that the ICJ's decision may be delivered by the summer of 2019. Ahead of the hearing, a senior Pakistani official said that his country is committed to implement the decision of the ICJ in the Jadhav case. **PTI**

Vande Express' first run ends in delay

The debut commercial run of Vande Bharat Express between Delhi and Varanasi was delayed by an hour and 25 minutes due to fog on Sunday. It reached Varanasi at 3.25pm instead of its scheduled arrival at 2pm.



The train was running late by 2 hours and 5 minutes on its return journey to Delhi when the report was filed. The train was expected to reach New Delhi station around 1am on Monday while the original schedule was 11pm. Officials said the journey was delayed since it took more time to reach Varanasi. "Weather condition often impacts running of trains. Safety is our prime concern. The train ran smoothly and ran at 130 kmph on certain stretches," a railway official said. Vande Bharat is the fastest train in India which can go up to 180 kmph. The train had developed some glitches on Saturday when it was returning from Varanasi after the inaugural run. Officials had fixed the problem and the train left New Delhi on time on Sunday. **TNN**
