'No wasting police resources': J&K govt withdraws security to four separatists

Centre Signals Crackdown On Hurriyat

New Delhi/Srinagar: In a crackdown on pro-Pakistan elements, the Jammu and Kashmir government on Sunday withdrew security and allied government facilities provided to four separatist leaders, including Hurriyat chairman Mirwaiz Umar Farooq and his colleague Abdul Gani Bhat, for the past several years.

"In view of the recent terror attack on a CRPF convoy, in which 40 CRPF men lost their lives, the government of India has emphasised the need to immediately review the wastage of police resources in providing unnecessary security to a large number of non-go-

vernment persons in the state. This is particularly relevant in context of security provided to separatists and their sympathisers," the J&K authorities said in an order. It added that "as a first step", the security and allied arrangements provided to Mirwaiz, Bhat, Bilal Lone and Shabir Ahmad Shah were being withdrawn with immediate effect.

Two top Hurriyat leaders, Syed Ali Shah Geelani and Yasir Malik, were already not getting state protection or any other government facility. Geelani is currently under house arrest. The order said a separa-

Pulwama terrorist switched from Qaida arm to JeM

Aadil Ahmad Dar, the terrorist who drove an explosive-packed car into a CRPF convoy, didn't suddenly drift into Pakistan-based terror outfit Jaish-e-Muhammed. Aadil was already "fully radicalised" when he joined Jaish. Sources said Aadil was a member of the Kashmir-based Zakir Musa-led Ansar Ghazwat-ul-Hind, which claims to be affiliated to al-Qaida, reports Neeraj Chauhan.

The outfit, which came into being in July 2017 after Musa parted ways with Hizbul Mujahideen, is now almost defunct with most of its members killed by security forces. Its strength is said to have come down to only four. **P 10**

Four Pak soldiers killed in Baloch attack: Report

Three days after the Pulwama terror strike, at least four members of the Pakistani security forces were killed in an attack on the China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) route in Balgatar area of Balochistan, according to a report in The Balochistan Post. The report said the Baloch Raji Ajoji Sangar (BRAS) had claimed responsibility for the attack.

A BRAS spokesperson was quoted as saying that their fighters had attacked a Pakistani Army patrolling team and a camp at the same time on Sunday morning.

Arpit hotel owner arrested at IGI on return from Qatar

New Delhi: The owner of hotel Arpit Palace in Karol Bagh, where 17 people had died in a massive fire on Tuesday morning, was arrested by the Delhi Police crime branch on Sunday from Delhi airport after he landed here from Qatar.

DCP (crime) Rajesh Deo said police had issued a lookout circular for the accused, Rakesh Goyal, and have been granted two-day police remand for his interrogation.

Cops said Goyal was in Qatar, attending a wedding, when the fire broke out in his hotel. He arrived in Delhi on an IndiGo flight and was detained by immigration authorities, who alerted the crime branch. While Goyal looked after the business, the
