Kerala's U-turn: Just 2 women in 10-50 age group entered Sabari

Thiruvananthapuram:

Days after courting controversy over a list of 51 women who had entered the Sabarimala temple, the Kerala government on Monday said only two women of menstrual age had visited the shrine after a Supreme Court judgement removed the bar on their entry.

In a written reply in the state assembly, the government also said the visit of a Sri Lankan woman in early January was yet to be confirmed. Devaswom Minister Kadakampally Surendran, in response to an unstarred question, said two women had offered prayers at the Lord Ayyappa shrine according to the report of the temple executive officer.

He also said they were awaiting confirmation on whether Sasikala, the 47-yearold Sri Lankan woman whose visit was confirmed by sources in the CM's office and police, visited the hill shrine. Surendran was replying to a question by Congress legislators on how many women in the age group of 10-50 years had offered prayers at the temple.

The state government had filed an affidavit in the SC saying 51 young women had entered the temple during the annual pilgrim season. PTI

245 sedition cases since BJP came to power in Assam

Guwahati: The Assam government on Monday said as many as 245 sedition cases were registered across 17 districts since the BJP-led alliance came to power in the state in 2016.

In a written reply in the Assam assembly, parliamentary affairs minister Chandra Mohan Patowary said 245 sedition cases were filed against various individuals and banned organisations since May 26, 2016, when the present coalition government took charge. Excluding these two districts, the actual number of sedition cases filed in the state during this period stood at 245 in 17 districts. Replying to a query by the leader of Opposition Debabrata Saikia of Congress, the minister said sedition cases have been filed against militant groups such as ULFA(I), NDFB (S), NDFB(B), KLO, NSLA, NSLA(AT), UPLFS, NSCN, DHD, DHNA, NSCN(IM), ZUF and ATF, among others. New Delhi: In a rare action, attorney general KK Venugopal moved the Supreme Court on Monday seeking to punish activist advocate Prashant Bhushan for committing contempt of court by insinuating that the government had fabricated the highpowered committee's decision to authenticate M Nageswara Rao's appointment as interim CBI director.



Land bought after Feb 1? No PM-KISAN cover for 5 yrs

New Delhi: Anyone purchasing a small piece of cultivable land now will not be eligible for benefit under assured income support scheme announced in the government's interim budget on February 1. For that they will have to wait five years.

Spelling out basic details of the scheme (called PM-KI-SAN), the Centre has told states that only those whose names appear in land records as on February 1, 2019 will be eligible for benefit under the scheme, but "changes thereafter in land records will not be considered for eligibility of the benefit to the new land holder for the next five years".

Explaining the provision, Union agriculture secretary Sanjay Agarwal told TOI on Monday, "Though the scheme's benefit will be allowed beyond cut-off date of February 1 in case of transfer of ownership of cultivable land due to succession, a new buyer who might have bought land after the cut-off date would not be eligible to receive Rs 6,000 annually under the scheme for next five years.'

He said, "We have prepared a detailed guideline. It will hopefully be released after incorporating suggestions, if any, of states on Tuesday." Under the scheme, each

🔪 ver a dozen farmers, some of them as old as 62 years, were injured when policemen in UP's Bijnor used force to disperse the sugarcane growers who had gathered in front of DM office to "immolate themselves" against delay in payment of their dues by nine mills. The police "excess" drew condemnation from all the quarters, even from the BJP MP of the constituency, Bhartendra Singh, who has assured to raise the matter further.

On Monday morning, hundreds of sugarcane farmers started their planned march towards district magistrate office seeking their dues. To their surprise, a large contingent of police force was waiting for them. The farmers reached the DM office and started piling up woods for "immolation". And, as one of them lit a blaze, fire tenders doused the flames and the policemen started chasing and beating the protesters after a brief argument. Harveer Dabas TNN

annually from the Centre in three equal instalments of Rs 2,000 each in a "period of every four months" in a financial year.

The states were also told that 'Aadhaar' may be optional for farmers getting first instalment of Rs 2,000 under the scheme, but the beneficiaries will have to "compulsorily" provide this unique identification number for getting subsequent instalments post-March 31.

These provisions were communicated to all states and Union Territories (UTs) by Agarwal in his note, sent a few hours after the interim budget on last Friday.

Explaining definition of a small and marginal 'landholder farmer family' (LFF) for extending benefits under the PM-KISAN, his note said such families were defined as one which comprises of husband, wife and minor children (up to 18 years of age) who collectively own

cultivable land up to two hectares (little less than five acres) as per land records of the concerned state/UT."

It said, "If a LFF has land parcels spread across different village or revenue records, then land will be pooled for determining the benefit." The ministry will soon set up an exclusive portal for the scheme where all states and UTs will be required to upload certified district-wise lists of beneficiaries which, an official said, would ultimately pave the way for a centralised database of all farmers.

The database comprises of details of landholders such as name, gender, SC/ST status, Aadhaar number, bank account number and mobile number: "This JAM (Jan Dhan bank account number, Aadhaar and Mobile) will be the ultimate verification tool to reach out to actual beneficiaries and weed out ineligible ones," said an official.
