## 10 Killed in Fire at **Rio Football Centre**

A fire swept through the training centre of Rio de Janeiro soccer club Flamengo on Friday, killing 10 people, including members of the club's youth side, firefighters and news reports said. At least three youths aged 14 and 15 were injured in the blaze. All three were taken to hospital, one of them reportedly in a serious condition. The fire broke out in the early hours of the morning at the Ninho do Urubu. a state-of-the-art training centre that was expanded and opened only two months ago. Like many clubs who sign youngsters from across the country, the facility has accommodation for teenagers. although it was unclear exactly how many players were among the dead.

### **Three-Team IPL** for Women?

From one exhibition match last year, the women's participation in the IPL is set to become a threeteam affair spread over seven to 10 days with the Committee of Administrators (CoA) mulling an expansion this year. However, the full-fledged women's IPL is still a long shot as, according to an official, the BCCI is finding it extremely difficult to get good investors/team bidders. Last year, the BCCI organised one exhibition match with two teams -- IPL Trailblazers and IPL Supernovas led by Mithali Raj and Harmanpreet Kaur respectively. This year, the parent body wants to scale it up a bit in order to set the ball rolling for a women's IPL in a few years' time.

### Ole: Fulham Clash a Character Test

Manchester United must treat Saturday's Premier League trip to Fulham as a test of character before a run of season-defining fixtures across domestic and European competitions, caretaker boss Ole Gunnar Solskjaer said on Friday. Solskjaer has won nine out of his first 10 games at Old Trafford but he knows tougher challenges lie in wait as they face French champions Paris St Germain in a Champions League last-16 tie and Chelsea in the FA Cup fifth round this month. "You take one step at a time, and that's one of the goals we have set - moving into the top four," Solskjaer told reporters. "Fulham is a 'character revealer'. It reveals 'do we have the focus on what's important?' It's always the next game in football.

### Fed Cup: India Lose 0-3 to Kazakhstan

"It's still a special match, I respect the fans and the club a lot, in the end they gave me the opportunity to play when I was just 19 years old. I only have good memories.

Courtois' season has taken a similar trajectory to his team's. There was a shakev start, when Julen Lopetegui rotated him with Keylor Navas, before a clear improvement, with Courtois now established as Santiago Solari's first choice.
