Announcement Being Seen As Bid To De-Escalate India-Pakistan Tension



New Delhi: Despite the prevailing tensions, India and Pakistan will go ahead with the March 14 meeting between officials to finalise the modalities for the opening of the Kartarpur corridor. Significantly, India had last week declared that it was not just in favour of going ahead with the Kartarpur initiative, which is meant to facilitate pilgrimage to Kartarpur Sahib gurudwara in Pakis-

Pakistan also told Ahluwalia that its high commissioner Sohail Mahmood was going to return to India after "completion of consultations". Mahmood is expected to arrive in India in the next few days.

Pakistan conveyed to Ahluwalia that its delegation will visit India "followed by the return visit of the Indian delegation to Islamabad on March 28 to discuss the draft agreement on Kartarpur Corridor". Pakistan had earlier agreed to send its delegation to India on the condition that the next meeting is held in Islamabad.

India had last week said, even before the release of Wing Commander Abhinandan Varthaman, that it was not going to cancel the Kartarpur meeting and accused Pakistan of creating war hysteria by shutting down its air space. The government has all along maintained that its Balakot air strikes were a "limited, counter-terror" exercise.

"It is Pakistan which created the impression that the two countries were going to war, not us. There was never any effort by India to cancel the meeting on Kartarpur," said a government source.

It is perhaps significant that Pakistan conveyed its decision to send a delegation to India on a day it seemed to be acting finally, even if ostensibly, trying to assuage concerns over terrorism. It detained 44 members of internationally proscribed organisations, including Masood Azhar's brother Rauf Asghar, who is one of the main accused in the Pathankot attack case. Also significant was Pakistan PM Imran Khan's decision to sack a Punjab minister for his derogatory remarks against Hindus.

Green crackers ready for production, SC informed

New Delhi: Almost four months after the Supreme Court banned manufacture of polluting firecrackers and allowed bursting of only 'green' crackers, the chemical formulation of these crackers have been finalised and bulk manufacturing could start from May after getting the necessary approvals from Petroleum and Explosives Safety Organisation by April 30.

The Council of Scientific and Industrial Research and the National Environmental Engineering Research Institute, which were entrusted with the task by the court to formulate the chemical composition of green crackers, said trial samples had been developed and tested.

They told a bench of Justices A K Sikri and S Abdul Nazeer, "After the joint work in various fireworks manufacturing factories situated in and around Sivakasi and after observing materials, analysis/assessment of the manufacturing process and testing performance efficiency, it appears that the above mentioned manufacturing shall reduce the emission of pollutants PM2.5 at least by 25-30% and it will be a win-win situation in the interest of all stake-holders in public interest," it said.

Advocate Gopal Shankaranarayanan, appearing for the petitioners, however, objected to the new composition and told the court that the Centre had earlier opposed using barium in crackers but the minutes of the meeting said barium nitrate and potassium nitrate would be used in the new formulation. He pleaded the court to seek response from the Centre on the issue. The bench adjourned the hearing to March 12 and asked the Centre to file its response on whether it was agreeable to the proposed chemical com-

position of green crackers.

Jaipur: A single-judge bench of the Rajasthan high court has issued notice to the defence secretary on a case of sexual harassment filed by a woman Army officer of Major rank. She was allegedly harassed by an officer of Brigadier rank.

The HC has sought replies also from the general officer commanding-in-chief, headquarters, south-western command, chief of staff, headquarters, south-western command and presiding officer/chairperson, internal complaints committee on sexual harassment.

The bench of Justice Ashok Kumar issued the notices following the petition filed by the Major. "The petitioner stated that during her tenure of first posting, the behaviour of a Brigadier was indecent, unwarranted and qualified to be an action oriented towards sexual harassment," Yadav told TOI.

Can estranged couples be forced to cohabit, asks PIL

New Delhi: Citing the Supreme Court's landmark judgments giving primacy to an individual's privacy and autonomy, two PIL petitioners have challenged a provision of Hindu Marriage Act that empowers courts to force an estranged couple to cohabit and resume marital relations.

Section 9 of the Act allows one of the spouses, living separately, to move court seeking restitution of conjugal rights. If a court of law orders restitution of conjugal rights and an unwilling partner refuses to live with his/her spouse,

then he/she faces confiscation of personal property for dishonouring a court decree. Appearing for two law stu-

dents, Ojaswa Pathak and Mayank Gupta, advocate Sanjay Hegde cited constitution bench judgments declaring privacy as a fundamental right in the Aadhaar case, terming autonomy of sexual preference integral to right to privacy while decriminalising Section 377 and making adultery a ground for divorce rather than a criminal offence.

A bench of Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi and Justice Sanjiv Khanna decided to post the matter before a three-judge bench.

The petitioners said though Section 9 was gender neutral, in practice it was mostly used by men to get decrees from courts to force their wives to resume conjugal relationship. Such coercion through judiciary under Section 9 leads to serious violation of rights of women.

The petitioners said, "Constitution guarantees to every individual the right to be left alone — even within the framework of a family. Any provision which forces an individual to have sexual relations or even cohabit a home without her will violates the right to privacy..."
