Notification vide No. F.10(1)-GA(P&T)/2004(P) dated 5th January, 2018 from the next advertisement for the recruitment to the Tripura Civil Service, Grade-II and Tripura Police Service, Grade-II Examination(excluding ongoing selection process vide Advt. No. 04/2016 dated 30.04.2016).

In the new process, the main examination consists of 6(six) papers(all compulsory) instead of 56(fifty six) papers in the existing system.

The process mentioned above is being introduced in the interest of candidates and administrative expediency.

- Short Title & Commencement.**
 - These regulations may be called the "Tripura Civil Service and Tripura Police Service (Appointment by Combined Competitive Examination) 14th(Fourteenth Amendment) Regulations, 2017";
 - They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- Amendment of Regulation 12 of Part-II:-**
