SC agrees with EC on clean chit to Modi, Shah speeches

Asks Congress MP to file fresh petition against comments 'violating' poll code

The Supreme Court on Wednesday agreed with the contention of the Election Commission of India (EC) that its clean chit to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and BJP president Amit Shah for their poll speeches may be right or wrong, but the court certainly cannot examine the merit of its decisions on the basis of a public interest litigation (PIL) petition filed by Congress MP Sushmita Dev.

A Bench led by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi, however, gave Ms. Dev the liberty to challenge afresh, if she so desired, the merit of the EC orders clearing Mr. Modi and Mr. Shah of violating the Model Code of Conduct by delivering alleged

'Plea deals with delay' The hearing saw the Bench fundamentally agreeing to the objection raised by the

poll body that Ms. Dev's present plea dealt solely with the issue of delay shown by it in deciding complaints against Mr. Modi and Mr. Shah. The EC said Ms. Dev cannot later improve on her PIL plea through affidavits challenging the merits of its orders.

"The PIL has become infructuous. The complaints have been decided by us, rightly or wrongly. Our orders have been communicated to the Congress party, to Mr. Randeep Surjewala... This petition is only about delay. The petitioner cannot expand the petition and go into the merits of our orders," senior advocate Rakesh Dwivedi, for the EC, a preliminary raised objection.

Ms. Dev's latest affidavit, filed on May 7, accuses Mr. Modi of making "obscene" remarks to "malign" the image of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi.

Rahul Gandhi tenders an unconditional apology to SC

Says he wrongfully attributed 'chowkidar' remark to court

Congress president Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday unconditionally apologised to the Supreme Court for wrongfully attributing the phrase 'Chowkidar chor hai' (watchman is a thief) to it.

"The deponent [Gandhi] unconditionally apologises for the wrongful attributions to the Supreme Court. The deponent further states that any such attributions were entirely unintentional, nonwilful and inadvertent," Mr. Gandhi submitted in a threepage additional affidavit.

Admit mistake: judge

"Any person can make a mistake, but having made it, you should go ahead and admit it," Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul on the Bench had told senior advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi, who represented Mr. Gandhi.

"And what is this 'regret' written inside brackets," Chief Justice Gogoi had asked Mr. Singhvi.

The court had said it could make no sense of what Mr. Gandhi wanted to convey in his earlier 28-page affidavit, which expressed 'regret' without apologising.

Naidu meets Rahul; to call on Mamata too


Opposition leaders plan conclave on May 21 to discuss post-poll arrangement

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu met Congress president Rahul Gandhi in New Delhi on Wednesday morning before heading out to West Bengal.

Neither the Congress chief nor Mr. Naidu spoke to the media after the meeting.

Mr. Naidu will be meeting West Bengal Chief Minister and Trinamool Congress chief Mamata Baneriee and attending her party's rallies on Thursday and Friday.

Opposition leaders are trying to work out a meeting on May 21, two days before the Lok Sabha results, to discuss the prospects of a post-poll arrangement.

In an interview to The Hindu on Wednesday, Mr. Naidu asserted that post-May 23, a new Prime Minister would replace Narendra Modi. The prime ministerial candidate would be amicably selected, he said.

"There are only three possible options. where the Congress leads; second, where the Congress supports from outside like in the United Front government, or third, where the

Congress has to join the alliance. There is no fourth option," he said.

Mr. Naidu was in Delhi to attend the Supreme Court hearing on a review petition filed by 21 Opposition parties demanding 50% Voter-Verified Paper Audit Trail count. The court dismissed the petition, following which the parties again met the Election Commission to press their de-

3 arrested in Alwar gang rape case, SP shunted out

Three of the five accused in the Alwar gang-rape case of April 26, which caused widespread outrage after video footage of the incident was uploaded on social media, have been arrested by the police. The State government also shunted out Superintendent of Police, Alwar, Rajiv Pachar on Tuesday night.

The accused have been identified as Indraraj, Ashok and Mukesh, while two of their accomplices are absconding.

Inspector General of Police, Jaipur Range, S. Sengathir on Wednesday said that Mukesh had recorded the crime and uploaded the video on social media.

Mr. Sengathir said 14 police teams have been formed to arrest the remaining accused. The victim – a Dalit woman – was allegedly raped in front of her husband after the couple was waylaid on Thanagazi-Alwar bypass road and dragged to a deserted

The SHO of Thanagazi police station has been suspended and four policemen sent to the police

Protests erupted in Thanagazi on Wednesday as residents blocked the Alwar-Jaipur highway demanding immediate arrest of all the accused.

In Jaipur, BJP leader and Rajya Sabha MP Kirori Lal Meena led a protest march with his supporters to the Chief Minister's residence. The police stopped the march at the Civil Lines

The Supreme Court on Wednesday asked Assam National Register of Citizens (NRC) Coordinator Prateek Hajela to act with "wise discretion" while dealing with people who had failed to appear for scheduled hearings on their objections filed against exclusion from the draft NRC.

"Objections" hearings have started. 'Objectors' are not appearing in most cases," Mr. Hajela reported to a Special Bench of Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi and Jus-
