Masalawala & Kalburgi case: **Entry in diary** helps SIT nab murder suspect

AN ENTRY, 'Masalawala', in a diary seized from a key accused in the killings of journalist Gauri Lankesh and Kannada scholar M M Kalburgi in 2017 and 2015 enabled a Special Investigation Team of Karnataka Police to identify and arrest a 27-year-old Belagavi man in the Kalburgi

murder case on May 31. The SIT, during the course of its investigation into the Lankesh murder case and the arrest of prime suspect Amol Kale in May 2018, found a notebook used as a diary by Kale. It contained references to persons recruited for subversive activities by a radical right wing outfit linked to the Sanatan Sanstha group. The diary

West Bengal, Centre face off again: Home flags state law failure, angry TMC hits out

Centre expresses 'deep concern'; Governor leaves for Delhi; State says it's in control

A DAY after violence in the Basirhat subdivision of North 24 Parganas claimed the lives of two workers of the BIP and one of the Trinamool Congress, the West Bengal government and the Centre were on a collision course with the Union Home Ministry describing the situation on the ground as "a failure of the law enforcement machinery", and the Trinamool Congress saying it "will respond appropriately" to this "political conspiracy".

In an advisory to the West Bengal government, the Ministry of Home Affairs, while

expressing "deep concern", said: "The unabated violence over the past weeks appear to be a failure on the part of the law enforcement machinery of the state to maintain the rule of law and inspire confidence among people." It asked the state government to not only ensure maintenance of law and order but to also identify and punish "delin-

quent" officers. "It is strongly advised to ensure that all necessary measures are taken to maintain law and order, peace and public tranquility. It is also requested to take strict action against officials

Woman at centre of UP video row has guards: To stop her from running away

Mother says her daughter is 'mentally unwell', marriage didn't last 2 weeks

SITTING IN her two-room house on the first floor of a run-down building in a local market in Kanpur city, the 32-year-old woman – now at the centre of a video row that has led to the arrest of a freelance journalist and an editor and head of a Noidabased channel — watches videos on a loop on her cellphone.

A woman officer of the UP Police's Local Intelligence Office sits in another room while on the ground floor, near a few vegetable

vendors, sits a male constable. They have been here since the video, in which she is heard making claims about Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, was aired by the Noida channel. While the woman says the police personnel are here for her "security", the mother says they have been helpful in "stopping her from running off to Lucknow, now and then".

The woman, her mother says, was married to a Kanpur-based man two years ago, but came home barely 10 days later. Much of the space in the two rooms is

Key goals unmet, call for action against Jaish, LeT

THE JOINT Group of Asia Pacific Group (APG) has informed Pakistan that an assessment of its action plan against eight proscribed terror outfits, including Lashkar-e-Tayyaba and Jaish-e-Muhammad, after it was greylisted by the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) for terror financing has found that its compliance on 18 of 27 action plans was unsatisfactory.

In its assessment report, sources told The Indian Express, APG specifically demanded stringent actionable steps by Pakistan against Da'esh, Al Qaeda, Jamaat-ud Dawa, Falahi-Insaniyat Foundation, Lashkare-Tayyaba, Jaish-e-Muhammad,

Haqqani Network, and persons affiliated with the Taliban, and that its law enforcement agencies show more concrete outcomes on fighting money laundering and terror-financing.

The report, sources said, essentially asks Pakistan to do more until September when the FATF Action Plan is concluded for a final assessment.

This assessment report, which was shared last week with Islamabad, is based on last month's APG Joint Group meeting in Guangzhou where Pakistan presented its case and provided details of all the actions it had taken in compliance with FATF directions. India's Financial Intelligence Unit (FIU) Director General was a co-chair at the APG meeting despite Pakistan's CONTINUED ON PAGE 2

the last rites of their near and dear ones here)...," reads the stone plaque outside the cremation ground at village Gobindpura in Nabha tehsil of Patiala district of Punjab.

In Punjab, the land of Sikhism whose Gurus denounced casteism and popularised concepts such as the langar (community kitchens where everybody sits together and eats), caste remains a reality whosevice-like grip often follows people to their grave, with several

villages setting up separate cremation grounds for Dalits. However, that's slowly changing in villages such as Gobindpura.


