Mystery loss of post-dated cheques: one more Ansal, IL&FS link

IL&FS FINANCIAL Services MD Ramesh Bawa allegedly bending norms to favour Ansal Group, as reported by *The Indian Express* Wednesday, isn't the only questionable link between the two companies.

Last year, PenBrook Capital, an India-focused real estate fund. discovered that another IL&FSlinked firm had mysteriously "lost" post-dated cheques (PDCs) issued by Ansal Hi-Tech Townships against investments in 2014-15 of around Rs 200 crore by PenBrook, sources have confirmed to The Indian Express.

UTTAR PRADESH'S first woman Bar Council chairperson Darvesh Singh Yadav was shot dead inside the Agra district court Wednesday by another lawyer Manish Babu Sharma, who then turned the gun on himself.

Sharma fired at least three rounds at Yadav inside the another lawver's chamber just minutes after she ended a victory procession at the Agra court for being elected Bar Council chief on June 9. While Yadav (37) was de-

clared dead at an Agra hospital, Sharma (35) is in critical condition. Police said they were yet to ascertain the motive behind the

INTHE first major terror attack after the car bombing in Pulwama that prompted the Balakot airstrikes, militants Wednesday targeted a CRPF deployment in South Kashmir's Anantnag district, killing five personnel.

Three other personnel and a I&K Police officer were injured in the attack. A militant, believed to be a foreign national, was killed in retaliatory fire while his associate is believed to have escaped.

Officials said the attack took place near a private school on KP Road in Anantnag town around 4.50 pm, when the two militants arrived on a motorcycle and opened fire at personnel of the 116 Battalion who were posted in the area to maintain law and order.

## Bengal political pot simmers as hospital protests spread

WHAT STARTED as a clash between angry relatives of a patient who died and junior doctors at Nilratan Sircar Medical College in Kolkata leaving two interns injured — one critically — has spilled over to all state-run medical college hospitals and become a rallying point for the political opposition, led by the BJP.

Coming days after political violence in Basirhat where two workers of the BJP and one of Trinamool Congress were killed,

the doctors' protests have kept the political pot boiling.

On Wednesday, the "ceasework" agitation by junior doctors and interns snowballed from NRS hospital to all 13 medical college hospitals and at least six district hospitals. Many of them pulled shutters down on their Outpatient Departments (OPD) and, in some places, even emergency services.

Those affected include: Calcutta Medical College and Hospital, Calcutta National Medical College Hospital, RG Kar Hospital, SSKM Hospital and medical colleges in North Bengal,
