SEBI bars Prannoy, Radhika Roy from NDTV board They allegedly concealed material info from shareholders while entering into loan agreements between 2008 and 2010

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has barred Prannoy Roy and his wife Radhika Roy from holding any directorship in New Delhi Television Ltd. (NDTV) for a period of two years.

Mrs. and Mr. Roy, along with their holding firm RRPR Holdings, have also been barred from accessing the securities' market for two years for allegedly concealing material information from shareholders while entering into loan agreements between 2008 and 2010.

Mr. Roy and his wife have also been restrained from being directors in any listed entity for an year.

As per information available on the BSE, Mr. Roy is currently the executive director - chairperson of the listed media entity while Ms. Roy is an executive director.

"... the Noticee no. 2 (Mr. Roy) and 3 (Ms. Roy) had this avowed duty to act in a fair and transparent manner to protect the interest of their minority shareholders and not to indulge in any fraudulent activity or any activity detrimental to the interest of

the shareholders of NDTV," stated the SEBI order by whole-time member S.K. Mohanty.

"However, contrary to the same, in the present case, the Noticees i.e. the promoters and directors of NDTV have been found to have indulged in fraudulent acts wherein they have bartered away the interests of NDTV...," it added.

Starts probe

SEBI initiated an investigation after receiving a complaint in 2017 wherein it was alleged that the three entities concealed material information from shareholders while entering into loan agreements with first, ICICI Bank and thereafter, Vishvapradhan Commercial Pvt. Ltd. (VCPL). The SEBI probe found that in August 2009, RRPR Holdings entered into a amended loan agreement with ICICI Bank to prepay a loan taken from the bank in October 2008. Under the loan agreement, the firm had undertaken not to permit any restructuring of the listed entity without the approval of the bank.

While the binding clauses

of the agreement were not disclosed to the stock exchanges, Mr. Roy and Ms. Roy transferred their shares to the holding entity in offmarket transactions.

Thereafter, another loan agreement for ₹350 crore was entered into with VCPL in July 2009 to repay the loan taken from ICICI Bank. The agreement with VCPL required RRPR Holdings to issue warrants, which were convertible into equity shares totalling 99.99% of the share capital of RRPR Holdings.

In January 2010, another loan worth ₹53.85 crore was taken from VCPL wherein apart from the earlier terms, it was stipulated that the NDTV promoters would allow VCPL to indirectly acquire 30% shares of NDTV through conversion of warrants into equity shares of RRPR Holdings.

According to the SEBI order, none of these loan agreements and their clauses was disclosed to the stock exchanges, leading to investors not being able to take an informed decision while dealing in shares of NDTV.

"The loan agreements were unmistakably structured as a scheme to defraud the investors by camouflaging the information about the adversarial terms and conditions impinging upon the interest of NDTV's shareholders, thereby inducing innocent investors to continue to trade in the shares of NDTV oblivious to such adversarial developments in the shareholding of NDTV," stated the SEBI order.

While Mr. Roy holds a stake of 15.94% in the company, Ms. Roy's stake is pegged at 16.32%. RRPR Holding has a stake of 29.18% in the listed

HDFC sells over 4.22% stake in Gruh

Mortgage lender HDFC on Friday said it had sold more than 4.22% stake in subsidiary Gruh Finance Ltd. (Gruh), which is proposed to be amalgamated with Bandhan Bank, for ₹899.43 crore.

The sale of 3,10,00,000 equity shares representing 4.22% of the issued and paid-up share capital of Gruh was carried out through stock exchanges at the prevailing market price, HDFC said in a regulatory filing.

The average price was ₹290.14 a share, it added. "Post the completion of the aforesaid sale of shares, Gruh would cease to be a subsidiary of the Corporation (HDFC)," HDFC said.

HDFC had sold 6.1% stake in Gruh earlier in May for ₹1,327.89 crore.

Flipkart, Indian start-up settle dispute over sharp discounting

GOQii claimed its devices were discounted by about 70%

Walmart unit Flipkart has settled a legal dispute with an Indian start-up that alleged it suffered losses because its products were sharply discounted on the global retailer's website.

GOQii, a seller of smartwatch-type health devices, sued Flipkart last month in a Mumbai court, alleging its devices were discounted by around 70% to the retail price, much more than the two sides had agreed. The court had, as an interim measure, ordered device Flipkart.

In a joint statement on

Friday, the companies said the dispute had been resolved and GOQii health devices would again be available on Flipkart. They didn't say how the settlement was reached.

Vishal Gondal, CEO of GO-Qii, told Reuters the company would withdraw the case against Flipkart. The e-commerce retailer's "team worked on a resolution benefitting the brand and the customers," Mr. Gondal said in the statement.

Test case

The legal spat was seen as a test case of the giant retailer's operating strategy in the

GOQii said it signed an agreement last year with a Flipkart unit to sell two of its devices at a price not below ₹1,999 (\$28.63) and ₹1,499. It later found the devices were being sold for ₹999 and ₹699, calling it "unauthorised" discounting.

In response, Flipkart said it reserved "the right to institute actions for defamation, both civil and criminal," arguing it wasn't responsible for any discounts which are determined by third-party firms which sell via its website. The two companies struck a friendlier tone in their joint statement on Friday as they brought the legal battle to an end.

Trade deficit widens to \$15.36 bn in May

Imports grow faster than exports; electronics, chemicals see good export growth

India's trade deficit widened in May 2019 to \$15.36 billion, with imports growing faster that exports during the period, official data released on Friday showed.

Exports grew 3.93% in May to \$30 billion compared with \$28.86 billion worth of exports in the same month last year.

The industries that saw a major growth in exports include electronic goods (50.97%), organic and inorganic chemicals (20.64%), and readymade goods of all textiles (14.15%).

INTERVIEW | ANIL KUMAR JHA

'Coal will remain the dominant source'

We are chasing a 600-million tonne target this fiscal, says Coal India chairman

A year after taking charge as chairman at Coal India Ltd.. Anil Kumar Jha looks back at the year gone by with a degree of satisfaction. CIL's subsidiaries, spread across India, operate round-theclock in temperatures that vary between O degrees celsius in winter and about 50 in summer. "Our men work round the clock in areas where the police fear to go after dark," he said in an interaction with The Hindu. The company's bugbears remain the same.. land acquisition, delayed forest clearances and law and order issues. Yet, coal is here to stay for the foreseeable future. CIL also has overseas ambitions. *Edited excerpts:*

Tell us about your journey since May last year.. To what extent could you fulfil your agenda?

■ It has been challenging, yet amply satisfying. My aim was to take the production to higher level and increase supplies to consuming segments, especially power sector. The 2018-19 figures bear testimony to our success achieved through a unified, concerted team effort.

Coal India for the first time breached the 600 Million Tonne (MT) production and offset mark, clocking growths of 7% and 4.8% respectively. Coal production was 607 MTs against MoU target of 610 MTs.

We have been able to script a new high in coal-supplies to thermal power plants. Most importantly, as of April 1, 2019, there was not a single coal-fired power plant in critical or supercritical list for want of coal.

What are the main challenges before CIL now? ■ Primarily land acquisi-

estry clearances, law and order situation and R&R issues are major challenges to ramp up our production. We are also beset with evacuation issues.

> What are your views on CIL achieving its production target this fiscal. Are last year's growth levels sustainable?

■ Production will pick up gradually. We are chasing a 660-million tonne MoU target. Many of our companies have taken measures to keep production during the monsoon months on an even keel. We face some problems in Mahanadi Coalfields Ltd. (MCL) and in Bharat Coking Coal Ltd. (BCCL). Efforts are on to tackle them.

Some subsidiaries like BCCL are not doing too well. Could you elaborate a little on this? Also, is the OBR satisfactory?

■ BCCL is besieged with land acquisition, R&R, law and order and certain encroachment issues that impeded its production. We are dealing the issues with the appropriate authorities to iron them out. There have been some bottlenecks regarding over burden removal (OBR). Land acquisition is one issue for which we have taken necessary steps making some

headway. Timely nonfinalisation of contracts issue was a bottleneck because of certain in-built clauses. These are being addressed and tendering for purchase

tion, environmental and for- high capacity. Heavy earth moving machinery has been fast-tracked. Once inducted, things would improve. MCL faces law and order problems.

> How did you manage the good numbers for CIL last fiscal?

■ Yes, it was a phenomenal performance by CIL. The bottomline was good for the fourth quarter and the year. Better average realisation in both FSA and e-auction sales, coupled with operacost-control, protional pelled CIL to its best-ever fiperformance. Importantly, coal quality variance was under control and we have been able to arrest the grade slippage largely.

Bottomline improvement was also due to the major provisioning that you had to make in 2017-18 on account of the enhancement of the gratuity ceiling.

■ Yes. Over 40% of the cost of production is on account of salaries. As of April 2019, CIL's workforce stood at 2.85 lakh, but this is reducing by around 16,000 annually through natural attrition. Induction is around 3,000 on account of employment for land-losers and for statutory jobs. We do expect to protect our profits, this year.

> You have commissioned two long-pending rail infrastructure projects. Has it improved

evacuation and what more needs to be done?

As far as rail logistics is concerned, rake supply has considerably improved. We are refurbishing our sidings for increased loading. Tori-Shivpur rail line (Jharkhand) is already operational. Once road infrastructure linking the pit-head to loading point is further intensified and sidings'capacity is optimised, evacuation will improve. At Iharsuguda-Sardega line (Odisha), rake-loading will increase. The East Corridor in Chhattisgarh linking Kharsia-Dhananjaygarh is expected to become operational soon. All these measures will bring net addition to our loading. We are setting up new sidings and Rapid Loading Systems also.

Going forward, what will be coal's position in India, especially with govt. stress on renewables?

Presently, as base fuel for

power generation, coal is the ready answer in India. Around 73% of the power generated is coal-based. Till alternative renewable energy sources come up in a big way, coal-fired power generation will continue to meet India's electricity demand. Amid fast-expanding energy needs, the nation is exploring shift from being a largely fossil-driven energy economy to one that is powered by clean and renewable energy especially solar. This is a welcome step. I feel renewable energy sources, at this juncture, have a supplementary role and cannot substitute coal as energy contributors. Renewables and coal have to co-exist for some time before renewable can significantly contribute to a larger share of India's energy basket. At some point of time in future, this is bound to happen but till such time coal remains the dominant source.

WPI inflation at 2-year low in May

Inflation in food articles basket was at 6.99%, down from 7.37% in April

Wholesale price-based inflation hit a 22-month low of 2.45% in May on falling prices of food articles, fuel and power items.


The Wholesale Price Index (WPI)-based inflation was at 3.07% in April this year. It was 4.78% in May 2018.

Inflation in the food articles basket was 6.99% in May 2019, down from 7.37% in April, official data released on Friday said.

However, onion prices spiked during the month with inflation at 15.89%, as against (-) 3.43% in April. Inflation in pulses continued in double digit for the fourth consecutive month at 18.36% in May, up from 14.32% in the previous month.

Downward course

Wholesale price inflation fell to a two-year low on falling prices of food articles, fuel and power items.



WPI inflation in May is the lowest in 22 months, since July 2017, when it was at 1.88%. India Ratings & Research principal economist Sunil Kumar Sinha said the core inflation at 1.2% is 29

months' low in May 2019.

"This is clearly an indication of weakening of demand impulse in the economy. Dwindling auto and FMCG sales growth has been pointing towards this for past several months."

The delayed and less than normal monsoon could aggravate the food inflation further in the coming months lest the government monitors the situation proactively, checks speculative activities, and intervenes in the market to stabilise prices, he added.

Vegetables inflation eased to 33.15% in May, down from 40.65% in the previous month. Inflation in potato was (-) 23.36%, against (-) 17.15% in April. Inflation in 'fuel and pow-

er' category cooled to 0.98% from 3.84% last month on account of softening global crude oil prices.

Manufactured items too saw decline in prices with inflation at 1.28% in May, against 1.72% in April.
