Doctors stir: Home Ministry sends advisory to West Bengal

Strike enters sixth day; Mamata says all demands accepted

As the stand-off between the West Bengal government and the junior doctors of the State-run hospitals continued for the sixth consecutive day on Saturday, the Union Home Ministry sought an urgent report from the State government on the strike and issued an advisory on the issue.

"This Ministry is in receipt of a number of representations from doctors and medical associations from different parts of country for their security in view of the ongoing strike by doctors in West Bengal. It is requested that a detailed report be sent urgently on the ongoing strike by the doctors," it

Want to make India a \$5 trillion economy by 2024, says PM

At NITI Aayog meet, he sets up agri task force and asks States to boost growth

Each State must aim to at least double its economy if the country is to achieve the target of a \$5 trillion economy by 2024, Prime Minister Narendra Modi told the Chief Ministers gathered for the NITI Aayog's fifth Governing Council meeting Saturday.

Responding to concerns from the States, he announced the setting up of a high-level task force on structural reforms in the farm sector, as well as a potential revision of disaster relief fund norms.

Byelections to six Rajya Sabha seats in Odisha, Gujarat and Bihar will be held on July 5, the Election Commission (EC) announced on Saturday. The counting of votes will be done the same

The notification for the elections will be issued on June 18. The last date for filing nominations is June 25.

Three seats from Odisha are vacant, while the number of vacancies from Guja-

Encephalitis toll in Bihar mounts to 69 Seven die while cleaning

Most of the victims are aged between one and seven

The death toll among children suffering from suspected Acute Encephalitis Syndrome (AES) in Bihar's Muzaffarpur rose to 69 on Saturday, with most of the victims aged between one and seven.

"The death toll today [Saturday] of children has gone up to 69 - 58 at government hospital, SKMCH, and 11 at privately owned Kejriwal hospital," Muzaffarpur civil surgeon Shailesh Prasad Singh told The Hindu over phone.

"We're making all efforts to tackle the situation with all our infrastructure and additional support... sick children continue to come in at the hospital and total 110 children are currently admitted at the SKMCH,"

Dr. Singh added.

Police file charges against hotel owner

Seven people, including four sanitation workers, died while cleaning a septic tank in a hotel near Vadodara on Saturday. Three of the victims used to work at Darshan Hotel, while the others were hired to clean the sewer line and the septic tank.

The police have lodged a complaint under charges of culpable homicide and causing death due to negligence against hotel owner Hassan Abbas Bhoraniya, who was arrested on Saturday.

Vadodara's officiating District Collector Kiran Zaveri said, "They died of asphyxiation inside the tank as revealed in their post-mortem examination, conducted at a Vadodara hospital." The bobeen handed over to their families. The deceased have been identified as Mahesh Patanwadiya, 47: Ashok Harijan, 45; Brijesh Harijan, 25; Mahesh Harijan, 25; Vijay Chaudhary, 22: Sahdey Vasava, 22; and Ajay Vasava, 22.

Gujarat Chief Minster Vijay Rupani expressed sorrow after coming to know about the incident and announced compensation of ₹4 lakh each to the dependents of the deceased.

BJP MLA Shailesh Mehta, who represents the Dabhoi Assembly constituency, said four sanitation workers were from nearby Thuvavi village and were hired to clean the sewer lines.

He added that the incident shows sheer disregard for the safety of workers.

Hong Kong suspends extradition Bill

Leader Carrie Lam yields after violent street protests

Hong Kong leader Carrie Lam on Saturday indefinitely delayed a proposed law that would have allowed extraditions to mainland China, in a dramatic retreat after anger over the Bill triggered the city's biggest and most violent street protests in decades.

The Bill, which would

have covered Hong Kong's 7 million residents as well as foreign and Chinese nationals there, was seen by many as a threat to the rule of law in the former British colony.

Around a million marched through Hong Kong last Sunday to oppose the Bill, according to organisers of the protest. "After repeated internal deliberations over the
