WHAT'S THE best way to crack open a tight situation and win a high-pressure World Cup game against Pakistan? On Sunday, Kuldeep Yadav had a simple plan: produce two magical deliveries to take out their bigmatch batsmen, Babar Azam and Fakhar Zaman.

Yadav's double strike pushed Pakistan to 126 for three and

India's total of 336 for five, which Rohit Sharma had helped set with a wonderful 140, looked way out of reach. In the end, Pakistan were stranded at 212 for six in 40 overs, losing by 89 runs under the D/L method when rain washed out the last

stretch of play.

It was a tame end to one of the most anticipated match-ups in this World Cup, with people streaming in from 8 am, twoand-a-half hours before start of play. The familiar chants filled the English air — "Jeetega Bhai Jeetega"

Online payment of bills: Four-fold surge in rural and semi-urban India

KARISHMA MEHROTRA NEW DELHI. JUNE 16

WITH COMMON Service Centres (CSC) replacing pre-mobile era PCO booths, government data show a surge in electricity bill payments and insurance premium renewals, which have emerged as some of the fastest growing non-banking services across rural and semi-urban India over the last five years.

CSC data from 2014 to 2019 analysed by *The Indian Express* show that customers of CSCs have paid for almost Rs 2,000

crore worth online electricity bills over the last five years, rising from 25 lakh transactions in financial year 2014-15 to almost 1 crore in the last fiscal — a fourfold increase.

Similarly, insurance premium renewals have brought in Rs 1,600 crore, with transactions growing more than six-fold from 2.6 lakh to 17.34 lakh over the past five years.

Bengal strike: Stage set for talks, doctors want end to deadlock

SIGNALLING A way forward to resolve their face-off with the West Bengal government, the junior doctors on strike for the sixth day in the state sought an "immediate end to this impasse" and said Sunday that they have decided to leave the choice of venue for talks to Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee.

The doctors, however, demanded that the venue should accommodate representatives from all medical college hospitals and the media. So far, the doctors had insisted that Banerjee visit them at NRS Medical College and Hospital for talks.

Sources in the government said the meeting is likely to be held at the state secretariat Monday afternoon. They said that the latest offer by the doctors still leaves two major points of contention: presence of me-

THE NEAREST railway station in Balharshah is 100 km away but doctor-couple Anant Jadhao, an obstetrician, and Ashelesha Gadbail, an anaesthetist, have made Aheri in Gadchiroli their home, spending most of their time at the 50-bed sub-district hospital.

In drought-prone Kavathe Mahakal in Sangli, gynaecologist Dr Vijay Hande has monitored an average of 100 normal deliveries every month and another 40-42 C-sections over the last year at the sub-district hospital.


