Bridge or causeway: India and Pak differ on Kartarpur corridor

India wants all-weather bridge, cites Ravi flooding; Pak says will miss deadline

DEEPTIMANTIWARY NEW DELHI, JUNE 22

A BRIDGE at Zero Line on the Indo-Pak border at Dera Baba Nanak has emerged as the latest bone of contention between India and Pakistan on the Kartarpur corridor issue, government sources said.

The two countries have had run-ins in the past over the

corridor, including over pro-Khalistani faces in a committee set up by Pakistan and over Pakistan's refusal to allow at least 5,000 visitors a day from India.

While India wants a bridge over the Zero Line and has already begun constructing one on its side, Pakistan is insisting on constructing a causeway, sources said. India is of the view that not building a bridge would lead to flooding of Indian areas

during monsoon when the Ravi river overflows.


The issue was discussed at a technical meeting held between officials of the two countries at the Attari-Wagah border on May 27.

"We are at a lower gradient vis-a-vis Ravi floodplains in Pakistan. So when Ravi floods. the water comes towards us. Without a bridge, the water won't drain out and will flood us.

Hurriyat leaders ready for talks, says Governor

If Centre shows sincerity, will respond in appropriate manner: Mirwaiz Umar Farooq to local daily

APPEARING TO signal that the time was ripe for dialogue in Jammu & Kashmir, Governor Satya Pal Malik made a public statement on Saturday, in the presence of two ministers from the Narendra Modi Cabinet, that the separatist Hurriyat leaders were ready for talks.

"Things are much better than when I came here. Look at the Hurrivat, Ram Vilas Paswan stood at their door and they didn't open the door. Now they are ready for talks," Malik said.

MP to ease cow transport rules, farmers can buy from each other

MILIND GHATWAI BHOPAL, JUNE 22

THE CONGRESS government in Madhya Pradesh has decided to ease rules governing the transportation of cows to ensure that farmers and traders are not harassed by cow vigilantes and stopped by police. The government has also decided to allow trade of cows between farmers by removing a condition that they could buy bovines only from bazaars or haats.

Animal Husbandry Minister Lakhan Yadav told The Sunday Express that the new rules would allow farmers in Madhya Pradesh seeking to buy cattle from another state or district to approach the sub-divisional magistrate (SDM) in their area and seek a No-Objection Certificate (NOC) by giving details of the number of cattle, the prospective buyer and the route they were likely to take while transporting the animals. The NOC will be prominently pasted on the vehicle transporting the **CONTINUED ON PAGE 2**

Following her complaint, the Joint Commissioner of Police (Crime) Sanjay Saxena raided a house in Kandivali, in Mumbai's western suburbs, in June 2016, and arrested four alleged traffickers, Vimal Thakur, Jitendra Thakur, Anju Thakur and Poonam Thakur. Two others, Sushil Thakur and Radheshyam Padamsingh Bhato, got anticipatory bail from the Mumbai ses-

sions court. Three months after their arrest, the four arrested persons also got bail.

Investigations through 2016 and 2017 showed the woman had changed hands for about Rs 20,000 at a fair in Nagla Surajbhan, an Agra village. Those who bought her allegedly changed her name and created a fake birth certificate from Ghaziabad.

The certificate names her father as Sushil Thakur and his wife Raieshwari as her mother. The couple were subjected to a DNA test in 2016 that confirmed they were not her biological parents.
