New anti-terror clause will not be misused, says official

The first ones to be designated will be Azhar and Saeed

NEW DELHI

The proposed amendment to the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) that enables the government to designate individuals as terrorists will be used "sparingly", a senior government official said on Friday.

Once the anti-terror law is amended, the first ones to be designated on a priority basis will be Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammad's Masood Azhar and Lashkar-e-Taiba chief Hafiz Saeed, the official said.

Rules yet to be defined

The government is yet to define the rules that will govern the Unlawful Activities Prevention (Amendment) Bill, 2019. The official said the entire process was non-

Targeting terror

The UAPA (Amendment) Bill will enable the government to designate a person as a terrorist

- The proposal to designate an individual as a terrorist will come from security agencies
- The information will then be corroborated through multiple agencies
- The Home Ministry will examine the proposal. Once the Ministry is convinced, the proposal will be signed by the Home Minister


Yediyurappa takes oath as CM, to face floor test on Monday

B.S. Yediyurappa took oath as the 31st Chief Minister of Karnataka on Friday, three days after the collapse of the Congress-JD(S) government. He is set to take the floor test on Monday to prove his majority. This is the 76-yearold's fourth stint at the helm of the State.

Mr. Yediyurappa's first announcements were sops for farmers and weavers. He said an additional sum of ₹4,000 in two instalments would be given to farmers from the State government under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi, which will take the total benefit to ₹10,000, including ₹6,000 from the Centre.

Apologise or face action, Lok Sabha Speaker tells Azam Khan

SP member told to appear before Om Birla on July 29

Samajwadi Party MP Azam Khan has been asked to appear before Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla on July 29 and tender an unconditional apology in the House for his "sexist" remarks against BJP member Rama Devi.

On Friday evening, the Speaker's office is said to have informed Mr. Khan of the direction to appear before Mr. Birla on Monday. "If Mr. Khan fails to apologise, he may have to face strict action," sources said.

All-round condemnation Earlier in the day, members, cutting across party lines,



condemned Mr. Khan's remarks and demanded "exemplary action" against him.

Mr. Birla assured them that he would call a meeting of MPs of all parties to decide on the future course of

The matter was first raised, during the Zero Hour, by Union Minister Smriti Irani who said Mr. Khan's remarks during the debate on the Triple Talaq Bill on Thursday were a "blot" on all legislators, including men. "This is a blot on all legislators, including men. We cannot remain silent spectators... We have to speak in one voice that this is unacceptable," she said.

Supporting Ms. Irani, Law Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad said that either Mr. Khan should tender an apology or he should be suspended from the House.

Respond to plea on lynching order: SC

The Supreme Court on Friday sought the response of the Central government, the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) and the State governments to a plea for the implementation of its July 2018 judgment laying down preventive, remedial and punitive measures to combat lynching.

A Bench, led by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi,

issued notice to the Centre and several States, including Haryana, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Bihar, Assam, Madhya Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir, on a plea by NGO Anti-Corruption Council of India. The NGO also sought a law to make lynching a cognizable, non-bailable and non-compoundable offence, which has to be tried by a court of law in a timebound manner.

'No plans to advance Delhi Assembly election'

CEC clarifies after 'clerical error' triggered speculation; term of House ends in Feb. 2020

Amid speculation in Delhi's political circles that the Assembly poll would be advanced by a few months, **Election Commission of India** officials said this week that they had no plan to hold early election.

Asked about reports of the Delhi Assembly poll being held along with those for Haryana and Maharashtra in October, instead of the expected

February 2020, Chief Election Commissioner Sunil Arora said they were "factually incorrect".

Though the term of the Delhi Assembly is till February 22, 2020, Aam Aadmi Party leaders have expressed apprehension over the ECI advancing the election.

Recently, a "clerical error", according to an ECI official, led to renewed specula-

tion about early election in

the Capital. A June 26 com-

munication to the Chief Electoral Officers of Jharkhand, Harvana, Maharashtra and Delhi about "media monitoring and paid news" had been "inadvertently issued" to Jharkhand and Delhi, a corrigendum sent to the CEOs on Tuesday said.

AAP concern

Expressing concern, AAP spokesperson Saurabh Bharadwaj said: "Our government got elected for five years by the people. Each government has its road map of delivering its promises to the people. We have been hearing that a section in the Central government wants early election because they are nervous of our ongoing works like the CCTV project."

Hitting out at the ECI, Mr. Bharadwaj said: "The Election Commission has lost much of its credibility in the last few years, so it's difficult to believe in their neutrality."

The BJP, however, dismissed AAP's apprehensions. Leader of the Opposition in the Delhi Assembly Vijender Gupta said the Central government had nothing to do with the elections.

"AAP is afraid that they have not done any work and that they will not come back to power. They are engaging in gossip. Talk of the government advancing the election is completely baseless," said Mr. Gupta.
