Rohit's Cup runneth over, record fifth ton

FOR WHOLESOME mastery, there's Virat Kohli; for ingenuity, there is Steve Smith; for batting for your life, there is Kane Williamson but to replenish a burnt-out soul, who else but Rohit Sharma?

Sachin Tendulkar, India's greatest batsman, had six hundreds in all world cups. Sharma has six from two world cups, a world-record five in this one alone. Here is another incredible stat: Tendulkar played 45 world cup matches; Sharma has had 16 games. Let it sink in: six from 16

And he only needs 27 more runs to overhaul Tendulkar's record run-tally (673 in 2003) in a single world cup. Here's one more: in the last 12 months, Sharma has scored 2,063 runs in 34 innings with 10 hundreds. No one in history has piled up 10 centuries in a span of 365 days. Sharma has the highest average in the world cup (69.78) for anyone who has played at least 15 innings. The second Indian on the list, and fifth overall, is

Cong-JD(S) coalition on brink as 14 MLAs resign

Cong leaders rush to Bengaluru, Speaker says will decide in House

THE RULING Congress-JD(S) coalition in Karnataka slipped to the brink of collapse Saturday after 10 Congress and three JD(S) MLAs submitted their resignations to the Speaker and later met Governor Vajubhai Vala. The move comes days after another Congress MLA, Anand Singh, resigned on July 1.

If the Speaker accepts the 14 resignations, the coalition will lose majority in the 224member Assembly as its strength will come down to 104 against the BJP's 105. The coalition's current strength, including those who have resigned, is 118 (Congress-78, JD(S)-37, BSP-1 and Independents-2), besides the Speaker.

Amid crisis in Congress, Amarinder calls for 'young leader'

AS THE Congress grapples with its worst-ever leadership crisis in two decades, Puniab Chief Minister Amarinder Singh on Saturday suggested that a "young leader" should be appointed as party president. His remarks stunned the party's old guard, but were welcomed by the younger generation of leaders.

The party has been groping in the dark ever since Rahul Gandhi made his resignation public earlier this week. Senior leaders have held several rounds of informal discussions but are yet to arrive at a consensus on a leader who can helm the party at such a critical juncture, keep it united, and breathe life into it to take on an ascendant BJP.

EXPLAINING the rationale behind setting a \$5-trillion GDP target, Prime Minister Narendra Modi cited an English phrase — "size of the cake matters" — Saturday to underscore that if the size of the economy grows, every stakeholder benefits.

"If you see the history of any developed nation, at one point in time, their per capita income was not very high. But there came a time for these nations when the per capita income saw a significant jump and that is when they went from being developing nations to developed nations," Modi said addressing BIP workers at the launch of a membership drive in Varanasi.
