About 17 people who took shelter under a tree were struck by lightning and one of them, Subir Pal died.

ISRO arm begins search for PSLV makers

NSIL invites expression of interest from experienced companies to produce launchers

NewSpace India Ltd, the new public sector space business launched a formal search for industry consortia which can regularly manufacture and deliver entire PSLV satellite launch vehicles for its parent, the Indian Space Research Organisation.

It will initially outsource five PSLVs - Indian rockets that can lift light payloads to 'low earth orbits' some 600 km in space. NSIL has called a pre-bid meeting of potential parties on August 26.

The four-stage PSLV is needed to place both Indian remote sensing satellites and small satellites of foreign customers to space.

At the Bengaluru Space Expo held a year ago, ISRO Chairman K. Sivan had urged industries to relieve ISRO of the manufacturing burden, saying the space agency must do 59 launches by 2021 and needed a PSLV strike rate of two a month.

Of the over ₹6,000 crore sanctioned last year for the

cost of 30 PSLVs required during 2019-24, 85% of the money would go to industries, he had said.

ISRO currently sources separate rocket parts from around 500 big and small vendors and does the AIT itself at its facilities in Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh.

Core job

For almost a decade, it has been planning to hand the production over to public and private industries and itself focus on its core job of space R&D.

On the satellite side, groups of industries are already helping ISRO in AIT at the Bengaluru-based U.R. Rao Satellite Centre and have produced a couple of midsized satellites.

ISRO also has two increasingly more powerful launchers in that order - the GSLV and the GSLV-Mk III, used to lift 2,000 kg and 4,000 kg communication satellites to higher orbits.

Drug control inspector booked for asking bribe

CBI has registered a case against him


The CBI has booked a Central Drug Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) inspector and others for allegedly demanding bribe to ignore the deficiency in samples of dobutamine injection produced by an Amritsar-based pharma company. The drug is used to treat acute heart failure.

Those accused in the FIR are inspector Ankur Bansal, Kwality Pharmaceutical Limited managing director Ramesh Arora, its director Ajay Kumar Arora and chief pharmacist Karunakar Tiwari, besides unknown public servants.

The CBI registered the case following a source information about alleged conspiracy between certain CDSCO officials, working under the Health & Family Welfare Ministry, and owners/representatives of companies manufacturing drugs to manage adverse test re-

The agency alleges that samples of the injection manufactured by the Kwality Pharmaceuticals Limited (Amritar) were collected by CDSCO for testing. They failed the test after which its managing director challenged the reports.

On July 18, it is alleged, Mr. Tiwari – in connivance with Mr. Arora, approached the drug inspector for a favourable decision. The inspector assured him of getting the matter settled and later informed Mr. Tiwari that injection samples had again failed the tests.

Row over a deleted Facebook post raked up again, she says

GUWAHATI

A Gauhati University research scholar at the centre of a 'beef' controversy over a Facebook post she had deleted two years ago, has said she is being targeted to stop her from working on the ground to help people stressed out by the ongoing exercise to update the National Register of Citizens (NRC).

In a video and statement sent to The Hindu, Rehna Sultana said news stories about her by a section of the media were part of a "wellplanned conspiracy to defame me and the work I am currently engaged in."

The 28-year-old research scholar said she did not circulate any post on beef consumption or supporting the Pakistan cricket team on

The Assam police on August 14 registered an FIR against Ms. Sultana over the Facebook post that resurfaced on social media platforms more than two years after she had deleted it. She was booked under Section 153A of the Indian Penal Code and Section 67 of the Information Technology "This is to bring to your

notice that I had written a post in 2017. The context of the post was a cricket match and the post was written in the form of a parody, primarily out of the frustration of India having lost to Pakistan because of bad fielding and batting. That was also the time when many lynchings had taken place over beef," Ms. Sultana said.

"I had deleted the post barely two minutes after posting it, having realised it was done in an agitated state of mind and could convey a different meaning. I also gave a clarification regarding the same," she said.
