Rifts emerge as G7 summit kicks off

U.S. President at odds with Western allies on issues ranging from his trade war with China to Iran

President Trump insisted on Sunday that he was getting along well with leaders at a G7 summit in France, but rifts emerged with his Western allies on issues ranging from his trade war with China to Iran, North Korea and Russia.

The G7 gathering is taking place against a backdrop of worries about a global economic downturn and coincides with an era of international disunity across an array of matters.

"Before I arrived in France, the Fake and Disgusting News was saying that relations with the 6 other countries in the G7 are very tense, and that the two days of meetings will be a disaster," Mr. Trump wrote on Twitter shortly before meeting new British Prime Minister Boris Johnson.

"Well, we are having very good meetings, the Leaders are getting along very well, and our Country, economically, is doing great - the talk of the world!"

Tensions were quickly on show, however, as the first full day of talks between the

leaders of Britain, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan and the United States got underway in the Basque coast resort of Biarritz in southwest France.

Trump's call

Before leaving Washington, Mr. Trump stepped up his tariff war with Beijing in a battle between the world's two largest economies that has spooked financial markets, and called on U.S. companies to move out of China.

Britain's Johnson voiced concern on Saturday about creeping protectionism and said those who support tariffs "are at risk of incurring the blame for the downturn in the global economy." Sitting across from Mr. Trump on Sunday, he said: "We're in favour of trade peace on the whole, and dialling it down if we can." Asked if he was being pressed by allies to relent in his standoff with China, Mr. Trump said: "I think they respect the trade war."

Underlining the multilateral discord even before the summit got under way, Mr. Trump threatened the meeting's host, saying Washington would tax French wine "like they've never seen before" unless Paris dropped a digital tax on U.S. technology companies.

European Council President Donald Tusk, who takes part in the G7 discussions, warned the EU would respond "in kind" if Mr. Trump acted on his threat.

U.S. President dangles trade deal for Britain

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson on Sunday said he and U.S. President Donald Trump were "gung-ho" about a post-Brexit trade deal but cautioned that the United States would be a tough negotiator and that he would not rush talks. Mr. Trump promised a big trade deal for Britain after it leaves the European Union, which he said had been a drag on Britain's ability to cut a good deal. REUTERS

'Trump regrets not raising tariffs on China'

When President Donald Trump said on Sunday that he had second thoughts about escalating the trade war with China, he meant that he wished he had raised tariffs on Beijing even higher, the White House said. "His answer has been greatly misinterpreted. President Trump responded in the affirmative - because he regrets not raising the tariffs higher," White House spokeswoman Stephanie Grisham said in a

Modi, Johnson agree to step up bilateral cooperation

Meeting comes after India ended special status for J&K

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had a "good" meeting with his British counterpart Boris Johnson here on Sunday and they discussed ways to strengthen bilateral cooperation in areas like trade, investment, defence and education.

Mr. Modi met Mr. Johnson on the sidelines of the G7 summit. The Prime Minister arrived in Biarritz from Manama, the capital of Bahrain after concluding the first-ever prime ministerial visit to the Gulf nation.

"PM @narendramodi had a good meeting with UK PM @BorisJohnson on margins of #G7 summit. Discussions focused on strengthening our bilateral ties going forward, inter alia, in trade & investment, defence & security, S & T and education sectors," Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Raveesh Kumar tweeted.

"PM Modi begins by congratulating PM Johnson on England's spectacular win in the Third Test of the Ashes a short while ago," the Prime

Minister's Office tweeted earlier.

This is the first meeting between the two leaders after Mr. Johnson became Prime Minister last month, the third in fairly quick succession since Britain voted to leave the EU in June 2016 following on from David Cameron and Theresa May.

Their meeting came against the backdrop of the Indian government revoking the special status to Jammu and Kashmir and bifurcating the State into two Union

During a telephone call early this week, Mr. Johnson told Mr. Modi that Kashmir remains a bilateral matter between India and Pakistan as far as the UK's view is concerned.

"The Prime Minister made clear that the UK views the issue of Kashmir as one for India and Pakistan to resolve bilaterally. He underlined the importance of resolving issues through dialogue," a Downing Street spokesperson said in an official readout of the phone call on Tuesday.

Brazil's army fights Amazon fires after more flare-ups

Two C-130 Hercules aircraft deployed to rein in the blaze

Brazil on Sunday deployed two C-130 Hercules aircraft to douse fires devouring parts of the Amazon rainforest, as hundreds of new blazes were ignited ahead of nationwide protests over the destruction.

Heavy smoke covered the city of Porto Velho in the northwestern state of Rondonia where the defense ministry said the planes have started dumping thousands of liters of water, amid a global uproar over the worst fires in years.

Swathes of the remote region bordering Bolivia have been scorched by the blazes, sending thick smoke billowing into the sky and increasing air pollution across the world's largest rainforest, which is seen as crucial to mitigating climate change.

Experts say increased land clearing during the months-long dry season to make way for crops or grazing has aggravated the problem this year.

"It gets worse every year this year, the smoke has been really serious," Deliana Amorim, 46, told AFP in Porto Velho, where half a million people live.

At least seven states, including Rondonia, have requested the army's help in

the Amazon, where more than 43,000 troops are based and available to combat fires, officials said.

Dozens of firefighters are en route to Porto Velho to help put out the blazes. Justice Minister Sergio Moro has also given the green light for the deployment of security forces to tackle illegal deforestation in the region.

Trade deal

The fires threaten to torpedo a huge trade agreement between the European Union and South American countries, including Brazil, that took 20 years to negotiate.

EU Council president Donald Tusk told reporters at the G7 on Saturday that it was hard to imagine European countries ratifying a trade pact with the Mercosur bloc as long as Brazil fails to curb the fires ravaging the Amazon.

Pope Francis on Sunday also voiced concern for the rainforest, which he described as a "vital" lung for the planet.

Under intensifying pressure, Bolsonaro on Friday vowed a "zero tolerance" approach to criminal activities in the Amazon and promised strong action to control the fires.

Days earlier, he had accused non-government organizations of igniting the blazes.

"There are forest fires all over the world, and this cannot be used as a pretext for possible international sanctions," Bolsonaro said.



Sadana and Sadhya bhakti

Sadana bhakti is trying to cultivate love and devotion to God through devotional practices of worship, such as sravana, kirtana, archana, Pada sevana, atma nivedana, etc. It should lead to Sadhya bhakti, the highest form, when devotion to the Lord becomes an end in itself. But at times the motive of sadana or austere disciplines gets deflected into self seeking goals as in the case of Hiranyaksha or Ravana.

It is also possible to have the Lord's darshan through rigorous sadana, but merely seeing God without devotional fervour is not the goal. It is how one sees God that matters. To the devout who seek Him with selflessness He reveals His true nature and rewards them with the highest goal enlightenment, pointed out Sri B. Damodhara Dikshitar in a discourse. Parikshit says he is able to experience the very God in Suka's narration. The way Tara sees Rama is not the same as how He is perceived by Vali or Sugriva. Though grief stricken at Vali's death, it is a moment of realisation for Tara when in her inner being she experiences the very essence of the Supreme Lord behind the human form of Rama. In her spontaneous address, Rama is the 'Aprameya,' one who is immeasurable in point of time, space and substance. He is the one who is difficult to approach even for yogis. He is a Jitendriya, a master over senses, is the embodiment of the highest virtues ever, enjoys undying fame, and is endowed with the extraordinary forbearance on a par with the earth. When the Lord incarnates and takes a human form, not all are able to recognise His Paratva. Bhishma and Kunti realise that Krishna is the Absolute Lord while some others disrespect and dishonour Him. Kamsa is determined to kill Krishna and Duryodhana sees Him as a mere cowherd boy and also as one who easily deceives people with magic.
