Centre defers investor summit

The Centre has decided to postpone by a month its planned maiden investor summit in Jammu and Kashmir, a senior government official told The Hindu.

The meet, originally scheduled for October, had been postponed as arrangements, including those for security for the delegates, could not be made in

"There is no time to make the preparations and arrange the logistics," said the official speaking on condition of anonymity. "It has been decided to postpone the summit by a month."

Navin K. Choudhary, Principal Secretary, Industry & Commerce and Tourism Department, Jammu & Kashmir, announced on August 13 that the summit would be held in Srinagar and Jammu from October 12 to 14.

Union Ministers, representatives of various State governments and top industrialists and business groups of the country were expected to participate.

Another official said that the Cabinet Secretary was monitoring the situation in the Kashmir Valley. "All Ministries have been asked to make a blueprint on how they could generate employment and contribute to development in J&K," the official said.

U.S. again expresses concern on J&K

Comments come three days after Trump said Modi felt he had the situation under control

Three days after U.S. President Donald Trump met Prime Minister Narendra Modi in France and discussed the situation in Kashmir. American officials said they were "concerned" about the continuing communication restrictions and detentions.

Mr. Trump had said that during their discussion on the Kashmir issue, Mr. Modi had said that he "really feels he has it under control", and that India and Pakistan could resolve the issue bilaterally.

Sources told The Hindu that diplomats from different embassies, including senior U.S. and U.K. officials, had

been meeting External Affairs Ministry officials over the past few days to stress that they were watching the situation closely.

A U.S. Embassy spokesperson said on Thursday:

"We continue to be very concerned by reports of detentions and the continued restrictions on the residents of the region. We urge respect for human rights, compliance with legal procedures, and inclusive dialogue with those affected. We welcome Prime Minister Modi's statement that J&K will soon return to a normal political

The spokesperson added, "We call on all parties to maintain peace and stability along the Line of Control and to prevent cross-border terrorism. We continue to support direct dialogue between India and Pakistan on Kashmir and other issues of con-

The comments, which also addressed recent statements by Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan, said: "The United States is watching the situation in Jammu and Kashmir closely. We continue to call for calm and restraint, including on rhetoric...We note the broader implications of the developments in Jammu and Kashmir and the potential for increased instability in the region."

The comments came on a day Human Rights Watch issued a statement urging the government to lift the communication shutdown and alleging that the curbs had caused "disproportionate harm on the population".

The government has maintained that the restrictions are necessary to prevent large-scale violence and subvert terrorist threats.

India condemns Pak. call for jihad 'No alarming situation in J&K'

Pakistan's recent statements regarding Kashmir are aimed at painting an alarming situation in India, Raveesh Kumar, spokesperson of the External Affairs Ministry, said here on Thursday.

At the weekly briefing, Mr. Kumar condemned Pakistan's statements that had called for waging a jihad against India.

"Statements and tweets have been issued from Pakistan that have called for violence in India. Pakistan should understand that the world has realised its clever moves and they will not be fooled by such tactics. We strongly condemn highly irstatements responsible made by the Pakistani leadership that called for jihad and intended to present an alarmist situation in India," Mr. Kumar said.

The statement came a day after Islamabad's Human Rights Minister Shireen Mazari wrote to several UN officials citing human rights violations in Kashmir after India ended the special status of Jammu and Kashmir on August 5 and bifurcated the territory.

The Minister has argued in her public statements that the right of self-determination is a "legally enforceable" right.

However, Mr. Kumar said he would not like to lend any credence to the letter

from the Minister.

"The letter is not even worth the paper on which it was written on," said Mr. Kumar, who urged Pakistan to behave like a "normal coun-

He reiterated the Indian position about Pakistan using terrorists and terror groups operating from its

"Normal neighbours do not push terrorists into a neighbouring country. Normal neighbours do normal talk and normal trade. This is not something that Pakistan is doing," said Mr. Kumar, acknowledging that intelligence reports suggest some terror elements from Pakistan are trying to enter Indian territory through the sea route.

He maintained that the Indian military is ready to deal with any such threat.

Pakistan on Thursday tested a short-range ballistic missile, after informing India and by following protocol.

Mr. Yechury arrived at the Srinagar airport in the afternoon and was received by senior police officials, who es-

corted him to the State guest house, sources said. His movement was constantly monitored by security

Later, he arrived at Mr. Ta-

rigami's residence on Gupkar Road, which was cordoned off with concertina Abiding by the SC direc-

tion that he should not talk

to anyone in Kashmir other than Mr. Tarigami, Mr. Yechury refused to answer media questions. "Whatever I have to say, I will say it in Delhi," he said. The CPI(M) leader will be

staying overnight in Kashmir and is expected to meet other party workers.

Jamia Millia Islamia student Aleem Ahmad, who was also allowed by the Supreme Court to visit the Valley after he filed a petition on remaining cut off from his family in Anantnag, was escorted on the Srinagar-Jammu highway to reach the south Kashmir district.

Meanwhile, a spontaneous shutdown affected life for the 24th day on Wednesday. Most educational institutes and private offices remained closed. Private vehicles were seen on the commercial hub Lal Chowk but remained few elsewhere in the Valley.

Javadekar says he was misquoted

At a community radio awards function, Mr. Javadekar said, "What is the biggest punishment, when people are not able to con tact anyone, when they are not able to talk to anyone and when you do not have any tool to communicate.. this is the punishment."

The Press Bureau of Information, in a statement, quoted Mr. Javadekar as saying that "sections of media have unnecessarily attempted to link the situation in Jammu & Kashmir region with my comments about the significance of community radio and communication in general, which amounts to irresponsible and unethical iournalism."

Digital media firms say FDI norms are 'restrictive'

They feel existing and new platforms will be affected

NEW DELHI Companies operating news portals expressed disappointment on Thursday with the government's new Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) policy capping the investment in digital media at 26%, saying that the measure would impact both existing digital platforms as also affect new platforms that may be looking to expand.

On Wednesday, Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal announced that the Cabinet had cleared FDI up to 26% under the "government route" for digital media companies that upload or stream news and current af-

This is a departure from the existing policy, as until now only the print media and news broadcast television companies in India



have had FDI caps of 26% and 49%, respectively.

Several digital media out-

lets that *The Hindu* spoke to were unwilling to speak on record but explained that some of them would likely have to restructure and look for Indian investors as they had more than 26% foreign investment. 'The Indian investors are

not bullish and are mostly reluctant to invest in media portals, more so in the current economic situation," said Vignesh Vellore, CEO of

The News Minute. "The new policy hurts smaller players like us and the ones who are looking to launch new proiects. In future, when we have to look at investments to scale up our operations, this kind of cap will be very discouraging," he said. "Digital news media was

unregulated & thriving so far. 100% FDI was allowed in start ups. Now govt wants to limit FDI to 26%. This is regressive. Cos already operating with 50% or 100% FDI will have to divest foreign equity in favour of domestic when capital is scarce and scared!" M. K. Venu, a founding editor of The Wire, tweeted.

In a series of tweets, Nikhil Pahwa, founder of Medianama, a portal dedicated to digital business, described the new policy as 'restric-
