Statehood for Jammu & Kashmir will be restored: PM

Modi promises more investment, jobs and pay parity for J&K, Ladakh

Two days after both Houses of Parliament cleared the reading down of Article 370 and the reorganisation of Jammu and Kashmir into two separate Union Territories Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in a televised address to the nation on Thursday, said it was a historic move and a new beginning for Jammu and Kashmir as well as Ladakh. He also unveiled measures that would follow this change.

Modi, however, Mr. stressed that the Union Territory status for Jammu and Kashmir, from being a full State, was a "temporary" measure and that at some point, statehood would be restored. Ladakh, he added, would remain a Union Territory.

Assembly election soon

He also said that the Assembly election, held in a transparent manner and with a process that had integrity, would take place soon, and that MLAs and the Chief Minister would be from among the people of the Union Territory. "You will choose your representative who will emerge from among you. I have full faith that under this new arrangement, we will destroy terrorism and free Jammu and Kashmir," Mr.

Mr. Modi's speech, which

lasted 39 minutes, began by explaining the imperative for the abrogation of Article 370, which he termed a "weapon used by Pakistan against India and to invoke sentiments among the people."

"Article 370 and Article 35A had only given terrorism, separatism, nepotism and massive corruption to Jammu and Kashmir. These articles have been used as a weapon by Pakistan," he

Disturbances over the last 30 years, Mr. Modi said, had ended up killing 42,000 innocent people.

The Prime Minster pointed out that while the country took justifiable pride in its democratic process of lawmaking, many of these laws, including the Right to Education, the Minimum Wages Act and Acts to prevent atrocities on Dalits, were not applicable in the State in the

He also pointed out that those who had settled in Jammu and Kashmir after Partition could only vote in the Lok Sabha elections and not in the Assembly or local bodies elections. With the reading down of Articles 370 and 35A, this was now over, he

Review decision on ties, India tells Pakistan

NEW DELHI Pakistan should review its decision to downgrade ties and suspend trade with India, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Thursday.

In a statement, the Ministry said Pakistan's actions were aimed at presenting an "alarmist picture to the world."

It said the ending of the special status to Jammu and Kashmir was an internal matter of India, aimed at bringing development opportunities to the people

there. Pakistan exploited the lack of development to generate disaffection and "to justify its cross-border terrorism", it said.

"The Government of India regrets the steps announced by Pakistan yesterday [on Wednesday] and would urge that country to review them so that normal channels of communications are preserved," the statement said.

Samjhauta Express not suspended: Railways

A senior Railways official said on Thursday that the Lahore-Attari Samjhauta Express train service had not been suspended.

The clarification followed Pakistan's decision to stop the train from Lahore to Attari at Wagah in Pakistan, citing security concerns, leaving 110 passengers, including 48 Pakistanis, stranded.

Following this, the Railways sent its crew and guard to escort the train to its destination.

"Pakistan authorities had

raised concerns about security for the crew and guard... We told them that the situation is normal on this side," Northern Railway spokesperson Deepak Kumar said.

After a delay of several hours, the train with the Indian crew reached Attari at 5.15 p.m. The return train, with 70 passengers waiting to cross over to Pakistan, left Attari at 6.40 p.m.

A resident of Baramulla in north Kashmir, Sajjad has not heard from his mother for the past week. "Tell them to restore mobile connectivity for only a minute, I just want to tell Ammi I am fine. She could be almost dead without hearing from me," the 27-year-old hotel employee said. "They say everything is normal in Kashmir. The last time I read a newspaper was five days ago. I do not trust what the Delhibased television channels are airing. There is no celebra-

tion here, we are not happy." Sajjad's sentiments are echoed by a large number of people The Hindu spoke to in Srinagar after the Valley was placed under lockdown on the night of August 4. There is palpable anger at the Centre's decision to annul Article 370, which gave a special status to Jammu & Kashmir.

Emotions are running high. Just before noon, some men converged at Zero Bridge, one of the arterial roads of the city, smashed vehicles and tried to damage the camera of a television channel.

SAIL chairman assaulted in road rage incident

Drunk accused attacked him with iron rod; two arrested, two on the run

NEW DELHI The chairman of Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL), Anil Kumar Chaudhary, was assaulted in the Hauz Khas area in an alleged case of road rage, the police said on Thursday. Two accused were arrested from the spot while two others managed to flee, said the police, adding that a manhunt has been launched for

them. The incident was reported at 10.30 p.m. on Wednesday when Mr. Chaudhary was returning home from office. His car was hit by another car

near Ansal Plaza on August Kranti Marg.

"The car then stopped in front of Mr. Chaudhary's vehicle, forcing his driver to apply the brakes. When the driver stepped out of the car, the occupants in the other car held him by the neck. To pacify the aggressors, Mr. Chaudhary came out of his car and was also attacked," said Vijay Kumar, DCP (South).

Rescued by patrol team Mr. Chaudhary was assaulted with an iron rod and suffered injuries on his head, neck, knees and legs. Two policemen from Defence Colony police station who were patrolling in the area reached the spot after seeing a man being thrashed on the road,

Mr. Kumar said. "Two of the attackers were caught by the policemen

while two others managed to flee the spot. The arrested accused have been identified as Lalit, a resident of Dwarka, and Amardeep, from Uttam Nagar, and their car has been impounded. They were in an inebriated state at the time of

arrest," said Mr. Kumar. A case under Sections 307 and 34 of the IPC has been registered. Reacting to the incident, Mr. Chaudhary said, "I was taken by surprise by this unexpected and violent attack by the assailants. I am confident that the police will probe the matter and book all the culprits."

FinMin mulls tweaks to FPI surcharge up to Budget

In a bid to ease the concerns of foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) over the increased surcharge announced in the Budget, the Finance Ministry is considering "grandfathering" the income earned by them up to the Budget (July), a Minis-

try official said. Under the proposal, FPIs that are so far structured as trusts will not have to pay the increased surcharge. But if they don't change their structure, they will have to pay the surcharge from the set date. "There is a proposal being considered where the government is considering grandfathering the income earned by FPIs that are trusts up to the date of the Budget," the official told The Hindu. "But no decision has been taken as yet on this." Markets reacted favourably to the news that the surcharge would be tweaked, with the Sensex and the Nifty posting their biggest single-day gains since May.
