Series reduced to a two-match affair

Relentless rain forced the abandonment of the first India-South Africa Twenty20 International here Sunday.

The downpour began two hours before play was scheduled to start at 7 p.m. and the match was officially called off at 7.45 p.m.

There was neither any inspection nor the toss.

The series now stands reduced to a two-match affair, just as in South Africa's previous T20 series here in 2015. The caravan now travels to Mohali for the second match of the series on Wednesday.

Cueist par excellence outplays Thway Oo to make it four-in-a-row in the 150-up format

Pankaj Advani, India's poster boy of cue sports, once again did what he does best - winning a World title.

Advani Sunday, breezed past local favourite Nay Thway Oo 6-2 in the 150up format at the IBSF World billiards championship in Mandalay, in what was a repeat of last year's final - the scoreline including.

"It's an incredible feeling," Advani told *The Hindu*. "I am as passionate and as hungry as I was as a teenager," said Advani about his fifth title in the short format of billiards in the last six years.

Advani was in full flow right from the start and, with fluent breaks of 145, 89 and 127, took a 3-0 lead. Oo pulled it back with breaks of 63 and 62, but was forced to watch Advani extend the lead as the Indian secured the next two frames, including a 150 unfinished break. After a reverse in the seventh frame, the Indian scored a 74 to close out the match.

The Bengaluru-based cueist, who has won more World titles in his sport than anyone else, added "every year the competition keeps improving and you need to stay ahead.

Matthew Wade's defiant 117 proved in vain as England bowled Australia out for 263 to win the final Test at The Oval by 135 runs on Sunday and ensure the first drawn Ashes series since 1972. England had appeared to

be on course for a comfortable win when it dismissed Steve Smith for 23, just after lunch, but Wade dug in to post his fourth Test century and Australia, which retained the Ashes, fell short in its bid for a first Test series win in England since 2001. Chasing a stiff target of

399, Australia lost Marcus Harris, David Warner and Marnus Labuschagne in the morning after England had added 16 runs to its overnight score of 313 for eight.

Kavinder Singh Bisht (57kg) and Sanjeet (91kg) advanced to the pre-quarterfinals with hard-fought wins in the World men's boxing championships here on Sunday.

While fifth-seeded Bisht edged past China's Chena Zhihao 3-2, Sanjeet defeated Scotland's Scott Forrest in an equally draining contest for a 4-1 verdict in his fa-

Bisht will square off

against Finland's Arslan Khataev in the round of 16.

Spain beats Argentina for the big prize

Gasol claims NBA-World Cup double

Three-time All-Star Marc Gasol became only the second man to win an NBA crown and the World Cup in the same year after Spain brushed aside Argentina 95-75 here on Sunday.

Spain, which survived double overtime against Australia to reach the final, led throughout in Beijing to win international basketball's biggest prize a second

The only previous occasion was in 2006 with the two Gasol brothers, Marc and older sibling Pau, on the

Pau did not feature in China because of injury.

The latest triumph was particularly sweet for the 34-year-old centre Gasol, who three months ago also played a key part in the Toronto Raptors' run to the NBA title.

Gasol, who had 14 points, seven rebounds and seven assists, joins Lamar Odom, a double winner in 2010 with the United States and Los Angeles Lakers.

Surprise finalists Argentina had not triumphed since it hosted the inaugural World Cup in 1950.

As a contest, the final was over by the fourth quarter – although the Argentines did rally belatedly to reduce Spain's previously mighty

Barcelona's 16-year-old forward Ansu Fati continued his explosive start to life in the first team by scoring and providing an assist as the *La* Liga champion thrashed Valencia 5-2 on Saturday.

Fati struck his first goal at the Camp Nou to give Barca the lead with less than two minutes on the clock, smashing a pass from Frenkie de Jong into the net.

The teenager then returned the favour by dashing into the area from the left wing and teeing up Dutchman De Jong to score his first goal for the club in the se-

venth minute. Valencia pulled a goal back later in the half through Kevin Gameiro but Barca the interval.

Gerard Pique bundled the ball into the net in the 51st minute after Antoine Griezmann had hit the post while Luis Suarez netted twice after coming off the bench.

Maxi Gomez got a consolation goal for Valencia in stoppage time.
