In a recent presentation to the 15th Finance Commission, the HRD ministry has pitched for a ₹36,000-crore higher education plan, pointing to the urgent need to prepare an employable workforce for the coming decade, for an Asean-like 'economic miracle

While recommending a '4E growth mantra'— educate, energise, employ and empower—the ministry emphasised the need to focus on the virtuous cycle that will emerge with a reduced dependent population, in-creased savings, investment in hu-man resources, higher productivity and higher growth rates. BOSTON MIT scientists developed a material that is 10 times blacker than anything that has been reported. 



Zomato Delivery Executives Up in Arms against Incentive Cuts

Bengaluru: Several hundred delivery executives of Zomato hit the streets of Bengaluru on Monday to protest against the online food or-dering platform's revised pay and incentive structure, which they sa id would hurt earnings amid a drop in the number of orders they fulfil.

on Monday, sparking off the protests. Zomato did not confirm
whether it had changed its incentive structure as claimed by its delivery agents. For delivery agents, the bone of contention is a revision in the way Zomato calculates payment for de-liveries based on distance. For orders up to 5.5 kilometres, the company would pay a flat rate of ₹30 and an additional ₹10 for every km beyond that. While the company has not changed the base pay, it

will now pay one rupee per additional 100 metres over the 5.5 km limit, the executives said.

The other big factor that sparked

off protests is a change in its in-centive structure. While the firm would earlier pay agents ₹300, ₹600 and₹800 for completing 11, 16 and 20 orders, respectively, in a day, delivery executives say the new struc very executives say the new struc-ture is nowhere as attractive. They claim the company has reduced the payments to ₹250 for 10 orders, ₹400 for 15 orders, ₹600 for 19 orders and ₹850 for 23 orders, in a day.

'Death Cross' Formation Hints at More Short-Term Pain for Nifty

The 'Death Cross', unlike most other chart patterns, is rather easy to read. But as its name suggests, the readings often point to the beginning of a bearish run – something Indian equities might have to endure in the event of a 2008 re-run globally. However, analysts don't expect the bear hug to last long in India, despite the 'Death Cross.'

In the 'Death Cross', short-term moving averages (typically, 50-day moving average) of a stock or index cross below Its long-term moving averages (usually 200-day moving average), and such a pattern generally points to further weakness for the stock or index. Nifty's current 50 and 200 DMAs stood at 11,186 and 11,224, respectively. The Nifty has dropped nearly 10% from the recent high in June, and this has resulted in a bearish pattern on the index.

Death Cross has a negligible impact on the Nifty, this has been the reason why re-reiterate our long recommendation in the Nifty with a target of 11,650-11700. We see outperformance in banking stocks NEERAJ AGARWAL Vice-President, IDFC Securities

Sensex, Nifty Slip as Crude Oil Surges After Saudi Attacks

Mumbai: Indian equity benchmarks slipped on Monday due to panic sell-offs by investors who were caught off guard by soaring cru de prices after drone attacks on Saudi Arabia's oil facilities.

Marking its worst fall in over two weeks, the Sensex settled 262 po-ints, or 0.70%, lower at 37,123.31. The

30-share index plunged about 356 points in intra-day trade. Likewise, the broader Nifty closed 79.80 points, or 0.72%, down at 10,996.10 Fresh geopolitical tensions in the

Arabian peninsula diverted inves tors' attention from the struggling ndian economy for which the Indian government came out with another set of relief measures, including for the housing and exports sectors, over the weekend. On the Sensex chart, 24 scrips closed in the red and only 6 ended in the green. Top losers in the Sensex pack included M&M, SBI, Yes Bank, Aslan Paints, HDFC, Tata Steel and L&T, shedding up to 2.55 percent

Logging its first fall in eight sessions, the Indian rupee on Monday plunged by 68 paise to 71.60 against

the US dollar amid concerns over soaring crude prices following dro-ne attacks on Saudi Arabia's oil facilities. Surging crude oil prices ha ve emerged as major fears for India - the world's third largest oil importer -- in form of fiscal slippage

No Recession Threat in India, **but Global Downturn a Worry**

unlikely to slip into a recession, but the probability of a global recession is about 40% over the next 24 months, said Bharat Iyer, head of India equity research at JP Morgan. In an interview ahead of JPMorgan's India Investor Summit 2019, he told Rajesh Mascarenhas that large banks with a strong liability franchise, sectors that benefit from government spending and some state-owned companies with dominant franchises should deliver healthy returns in the current environment. Edited excerpts:

Many analysts believe a recession is coming globally and the fall could be bigger than what we have seen in 2008. How is India positioned to face suchan event?

Our global macro team estimates the probability of a recession at about 40% over the next 24 months. Policymakers are easing monetary and fiscal policies in response to the slowdown and the impact of these measures remains to be seen. Developments on the US-China trade dispute will also have a meaningful bearing on the global economy and trade. India is a relatively small part of the global supply chain. Our economy is driven more by internal factors – consumption, supported by demographics and investments, supported by the need for infrastruc ture - rather than trade. So, we do not see the Indian economy slipping into a recession. But a global recession will have an adverse impact on growth due to slowing international demand and increased competition from imports. Also, our equity markets are relatively open and will be impacted by the volatility in global financial markets that a recession would suggest

What do India's macros suggest? Are we on the right track or heading towards a major slowdown?

India's economic indicators are a mixed bag at this stage. On the positive side, there is macro stability. Inflation is well-behaved, giving policymakers substantial leeway in terms of easing monetary policy. The central governto be lauded. That said, growth has



slowed down meaningfully over the last few quarters due to a bunching up of supply-side issues. We see a gradual revival as we go into the second half of the fiscal year, driven by increased government spending post the elections and improved transmission of easier monetary policy. A more robust revival should come through over the medium term, as capacity utilisation levels in the economy improve, triggering a meaningful pick up in the private sector investment cycle. Attracting FDI at a faster rate and aggressive divestments by the government to boost finances could fast-track the investment cycle. The surge in crude oil prices over the weekend needs to be watched. If sustained, it could be a source of pressure for the economy and markets.

Some state-owned companies with dominant franchises are trading at very attractive valuations and should deliver healthy returns if there is a well-articulated divestment plan.

What is your advice for retail investors in the current situation? For a 12-month time horizon, we would

The company had filed a draft sche me of arrangement between the company and Equitas Small Finance Bank (ESFB) but Sebi returned it on grounds that it was not in compliance with regulatory provisions.

pany to resubmit the proposal after ensuring compliance with provisions mentioned in its circular Earlier this month, the company had informed that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) had declined its requ



India's cryptocurrency industry is once again in the throes of isonce again in the throes uncertainty. The Supreme Court has asked the RBI to respond to industry players in their petition filed against the banking ban on cryptocurrency. Indian regulators, particularly RBI, have always been a distant observer to the crypto frenzy. None of the bitcoin millionaires of 2017 were Indians and RRI had been unsure how to go about regulating it First, it warned, and later, in April 2018, virtually banned cryptos by prohibiting banks from servicing any crypto trans actions. Fledgling local crypto

exchanges like Zebpay shut shop. Now the government has rung the death knell for crypto trade the death knell for crypto trade. The Department of Economic Affairs has proposed a draft bill called the 'Banning of Cryptocurrency & Regulation of Official Digital Currency Bill, 2019'. Not only does this tinend to ban the use of all private cryptos but also suggests a blockchain-based contral bank digital currency. central bank digital currency.

Instead of analysing the benefits and risks of cryptos to adopt a and risks of cryptos to adopt a meaningful regulation, Indian watchdogs reacted hastily by imposing a ban. A ban — which simply paves the way for illicit trade — should be the last resort when regulation can't be the

game should begin with strict know-vour-customer and suspi cious transaction-reporting norms; second, the moneylaun-dering laws around cryptos should be unambiguous; third, the regulations need to address accountability, transparency and a degree of ur ormity around crypto exchanges. This could be done by setting up licensing to tackle fraudulent entities which engage in multi-level marketing and peddle Ponzi schemes. This should be backed by a strong consumer protection and griev-ance redressal mechanism cou-pled with spreading awareness about the risks and benefits.

Use cases for cryptos in India should be considered to formulate a cohesive policy. In Japan, the use of cryptos as currency has been approved. Germany and the US treat them as an asset class. Vene-zuela (though not the best exam-ple) had introduced a crypto backed by the country's oil supply tional sanctions. In India, cryptos have been used mainly for ar bitrage. So regulations must be put in place to allay fears that culminate in a han. It would be a

ET Q&A ANIL KUMAR JHA CMD, COAL INDIA

Can Plug Coal **Import Gaps by** Raising Output

Coal India needs to step up production to meet India's coal import requirements of 235 million tonnes. The state-run miner must do this, overcoming its own constraints and increasingly erratic and taxing climatic conditions. In an interview with ET's Meera Mohanty, Anil Kumar Jha addresses some pressing and some recurrent issues.

Coal India unions have called for a strike against government's decision to allow 100% FDI in mining. How are you reassuring them?

Yes, the unions have called for a strike on September 24. We are in constant dialogue with them and even had a meeting. This is government of India's decision.

What's your view? Competition is welcome, we are

ready for it.

What are your concerns or economic slowdown. Will it affect capital expenditure

and targets of Coal India?

As far as Coal India is concerned, there is absolutely no slowdown We are not in a position to meet country's coal demand. Last year, CIL produced 607 million tonnes of coal and the country as a whole, produced 730 MT. So 83% was from Coal India Ltd. But consumption was 965 MT, so we had to import 235 MT of coal. Demand is increasing and we are trying to bridge the demandsupply gap as much as possible.

How much of India's needs will you be able to meet?

India imported 235 million tonnes of coal. Out of this, we will have to import 120 million tonnes - 50 million tonnes of coking coal and 70 MT for power plants in the coastal region, where logic supports coal import. But 150 million tonnes of non-coking coal imports can be reduced by enhancing our own production. Coal's contribution to electricity generation is 70%, this will reduce with renewable energy's share growing. But in absolute terms, the quantity of coal won't reduce because India has a huge requirement of electricity, which will rise from

Is the state-run miner behind the target this year?

In the last six months, we have fallen behind our target. We are behind by around 20 MT. We are coming six months. It is due to a host of reasons. In case of MCL (Mahanadi Coalfields Ltd), we suffered a lot due to cyclone Fani in Odisha. In August and Septem-

New Delhi: The microfinance in-New Deim: The microfinance in-dustry in India will double its len-ding in the next five years if the current growth trends continue, said Nobel laureate and founder of Grameen Bank, Muhammad Yunus, on Monday.

The industry grew at over 40% in FY2019 with its loan portfolio reaching <178,552 crore at the end of March 2019, according to

end or March 2019, according to the Sa-Dhan Bharat Microfinan-cereport 2019. Yunus, considered a pioneer in the microfinance sector, said that the industry was likely to double in size in the next five years. "Whatever the industry has done in the last 25-30 years, you would see it double in the next fl

would see it double in the nextri-ve years as it has gained tremen-dous speed now," he said.

The Peace Prize winner from Bangladesh pointed out that the key challenge for the industry would be to prepare itself to generate employment for the next genera tion and to transform rural econo mies to reduce migration from ru-

mles to reduce migration from ru-ral areas to cities.

Yunus stressed that the fact that commercial banks form 80% of the microfinance industry had to change. "The deposits of the poor have to be utilised for financing their needs," he said, adding that banks wore cetting deposits from banks were getting deposits from the rural areas at a very low cost and lending to microfinance companies at high interest rates A Code for Microfinance



Sa-Dhan, along with the Micro Finance Institutions Network (MFIN) and the Finance Indust-ry Development Council (FIDC) released a code for responsible lending in the micro-credit in dustry aimed at improving transparency and dealing with



Trai Issues Paper on Maximum **Call Ringing Time**

Wants operators to have uniform span for best use of resources

Kolkata: How long should a phone ring before a disconnection? That's the focus of the sector regulator's latest consultation paper, seeking views on the maximum call ringing time to ensure optimal usage of network resources, including spectrum.

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (Trai) has also sought feedback on whether mobile phone users must be given the option to customise the

users must be given the option to customise the ringing duration, and possible ways to do so.

Maximum ring-time is now configured in the pho-ne network, beyond which it releases the connec

ne network, beyond which it releases the connec-tion forcefully, if the called-party does not answer. "The maximum time allowed to answer calls takes on more importance in mobile networks as the aler-ting phase engages scarce radio spectrum resour-ces," said Trai in a discussion paper, titled 'Dura-tion Alert for Called Party,' issued on Monday. More so, since mobile users carry their handsets

in person and can respond much quicker, unlike in case of an incoming landline call where the instrument is likely to be



where the instrument is likely to be away from the user.

Ringing or alerting for a long time, when the called-party is unlikely on answer, Trai said, "would lead to non-optimal utilisation of resources".

But the regulator also conceded that if ring time is configured "on the lo wer side", it could undermine custo mer experience, especially if the duration is lower than the time usually

ration is lower than the time usually taken to answer a call. A particular telco, it said, hadreduced call ringing span to 20 seconds, a scenario that may impact network performance of other mobile and landline operators with longer durations, building a case of bringing uniformity. Ring time in mobile networks is typically 30-45 seconds, while for landlines, it is 60-120 seconds.

As the festive season approaches, the organized refurbished players expect a 25% growth by the end of fiscal year through March 2020. "As the economy is going down, the mindset of customers is shifting from new products to refurbished devices. We foresee that the sales of refurbished pro-

foresee that the sales of refurbished pro-

foresee that the sales of refurblished products are going to be on the higher side this festive season," said Yogesh Bhatia, founder of PreLoved Device, an online marketplace for refurbished devices.

Neil Shah, research director at Counterpoint Research, backed the view, saying as consumers curtail discretionary spending, they will prefer to buy refurbished phones, which lower the cost of owners. phones, which lower the cost of owners hip, instead of new models.

Counterpoint Research said the refur bished smartphone market grew 9% year-over-year in the first-half of 2019, the highest globally, and it expects the growth momentum to continue.

Awareness though has been a challenge for growth in the refurbished phones seg ment, Varun Mishra, research analyst at Counterpoint Research, said. But that is

Challenge for the Political Executive

Paving govt's bills is hostage to babu paranoia

A notice issued last week by a Supreme Court bench headed by Justice Rohinton Nariman to various arms of the Union government that owe large amounts of money to a construction company deserves wider attention. The company has bank loans under ₹4,000 crore and around ₹1,800 crore worth of dues to operational creditors, some of whom have moved the National Company Law Tribunal against the company under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code. The company is owed large amounts of money by various arms of the public sector, including arbitration awards in excess of ₹6,000 crore. Instead of paying up, the public sector agencies have challenged the arbitration awards in court. Such conduct on the part of the government and its companies is a major contributor to the country's economic woes.

Finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced the government's intention to disburse outstanding payments to those who have performed work for the govern-



ment. But such payments are not materialising and companies are forced to take on loans to meet expenditure they should be meeting from their own resources. The government's promise of increasing and front-loading infrastructure spending by the public sector sounds hollow, if the governme-

nt refuses to pay its bills in time. At the heart of the problem is the conflict between the private interests of the civil servants, who have to sign off on payments and run the risk, ever since the infamous Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) report of notional loss to the exchequer worth ₹1,76,000 crore in the allocation of 2G spectrum, of being hauled off to jail for causing some loss or the other to the exchequer and so avoid taking any payment decision until a court orders them to, and the public interest of restoring faith in the viability of doing work for

It is the job of the political executive to release the economy's fate from the thrall of civil servants' perception that doing their work is a threat to their future liberty. That must be accepted as an urgent priority.

Raise, Don't Waive, **Urban Water Charges**

The Delhi government's move to waive water charges and arrears for all and sundry, which for commercial establishments alone add up to as much as₹10,000 crore including late payment $surcharge, is {\it symptomatic} \ of \ the \ wide spread \ mis allocation \ of$ resources for water in our major metropolitan centres. Five of the world's 20 largest cities under water stress are in India, with $Delhi\,being\,second\,on\,the\,list, and\,yet, if\,\,we\,waive\,reasonable$ nominal water charges to shore up populism, urban hubs would face more severe water shortage.

At least a fifth of the households in Delhi do not have access topiped water. So, the waiver is more likely to benefit the wellheeled. An estimated 40% of piped water is simply lost in the



city-state due to leakage from rusting pipes. Further, only about 35% of urban hou $seholds\,nationally\,have\,piped\,supply\,whi$ ch can support drinking water needs. In 'New India', the neglect of water supply infrastructure must surely be thorough ly plugged. Besides, we need focused policy attention for urban water treatment

Note that the American Planning Association (APA) now treats water as an essential element in infrastructure planning and sustainable development of cities. We need similar guidelines here. States must also have independent regulatory oversight



Making a Beeline for a High-Flying Home

No matter how cosy, after a point, old hangouts lose their buzz and more than one gueen bee in the same place is had news anyway, honey, as society animals will vouchsafe. And which queen bee worth her social cachet would not want her own private jet, where she can be waited on hand and foot by minions? It is not surprising, therefore, that despite their dwindling numbers worldwide, bees have been showing an increasing interest in aircraft as prospective high-flyer homes in the past few decades. The early 1990s were a challenging time in Kashmir and a difficult negative to the symbol of the property of t

time in Kashmir and a difficult period in India-US relations. Prime Minister P V Narasimha Rao had to nister P v Nairasimia Rao nau to contend with a newly elected US pre-sident, Bill Clinton, who even named Kashmir in a UN speech while refer-ring to human rights violations across the world. Clinton had also ap-pointed Robin Raphel as the first as-sistant segretary of State for South sistant secretary of State for South Asia. Raphel left no opportunity to castigate India on Kashmir.

It was with this backdrop that Na-rasimha Rao addressed a joint sitting of both chambers of the US Congress in 1994. He brought up Texas to make the point why Jammu & Kashmir was an inseparable part of India.

"Indeed, in 1868, your Supreme Co-urt had to say, and I quote, 'When Tex-as became one of the United States, she entered into an indissoluble rela sne entered into an inclissoluble rela-tion. All the obligations of perpetual union and all the guarantees of rep-ublican government in the union at-tached at once to the State. It was the incorporation of a new member into the political body, and it was comple-te final. India accepts this statement

tural, multi-ethnic and multi-religio-us republic like India or the United es, and as totally unassailable

Texas was a part of Mexico, but had declared independence in the 1830s. It later entered an agreement of annexation with the US. Washington ratified the agreement, resulting in hostilities between the US and Moxico followed by certiforial disput. Mexico, followed by territorial dispu tes over where the boundary should pass. Interestingly, this is now the boundary on which Trump wants to build 'The Wall' between the US and

Twenty-five years after Narasim-ha Rao borrowed from US history to convey India's national resolve on Kashmir, the coming together of Modi and Trump in Texas is an expres sion of both clout and solidarity, just before the Indian PM heads for the United Nations General Assembly for the first time after the govern ment suspended Article 370 and split the state of Jammu & Kashmir into two Union territories.

We Have the Numbers

It's important not to lose sight of the political dynamics at play here. An expected 50,000-strong gathering of Indian-Americans is huge by US stanindian-Americans is nuge by Osstandards. It would be among the largest gatherings Modl has mustered outside India since he first became PM in 2014. 

The Road to Perdition Managing Water

Almost every minute of each day, there is an accident on India's roads. The newly minted Motor Vehicles Act 2019 with stringent penalties was an attempt to curb that. And yet several states have either put this necessary act on hold, or watered down its penalties. This 'rollback' is a foolhardy move, because India cannot afford the economic cost of these preventable citizen deaths and

study conducted by the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (Unescap) estimated that road accidents cause a 3% dent to the econo my of India. At the time of the study iny of India. At the time of the study in 2016, that amounted to about \$58 billion each year. India's populist politicians have mistakenly assu-med that they are easing the financial burden on citizens by diluting the Act. To the contrary, the majority of victims are the less privileged who can ill afford disability and hospitalisation costs from road-related

In India, a road injury can be parti-cularly crippling because of the lack of access to affordable quality he-althcare. Imagine a cyclist who gets hit by a speeding vehicle. Chances are, if the victim gets to a nearby hospital, it is likely to be a private one, as they are greater in number Once there, the costs clock up really fast and before a few hours are out not only has the accident physically shaken the victim, it has beggared

the family financially.

Truth is, when an earning member

creates a ripple effect by putting the burden of care on others in the family. This means a victim who gets injured may have to depend on other earning members to opt out of the workforce to be caregivers, or even workforce to be caregivers, or even force a slowdown in the productivity of the family. No state in India can afford to say that a < 10,000 fine is too costly for an

erring driver. The cost of care bills for accidents tend to be much higher, and cause collateral damage to more than just the injured or diseased What's worse is that nearly 75% of what s worse is that nearly 75% of Indians don't have life insurance, and more than half have no medical insurance either, dealing a severe financial blow to victims' families. Of course, several of the vulne-rable have opted for the Pradhan

rable have opted for the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY) to cover for accidental deaths and disability. But that in itself cannot be a reason to allow preventable accidents and deaths by keeping a strict law tepid. Over the years, there has been no significant let-up in accidents. The



The number is likely to be much higher given several accidents probably go unreported.

Of the ones recorded, 400 people die or the ones recorded, 400 people die each day on India's roads. Most of those who die are vulnerable road-users ranging from cyclists, bikers to pedestrians. Then there is road rage, which remains largely unaccounted for, but is often triggered by faulty driving. It is not just the sweeping lack of

adherence to rules that is a deep-rooted problem, but the enforcement of rules is even worse. It is also not unusual to see, in many states, the law enforcement agencies them-selves flouting rules. Politicians must acknowledge that

India is not a country where people follow norms because they are mostly civic-minded. That is typically the privilege of developed countries. Besides, because the consequences Bestides, because the consequences of unsafe road practices have been negligible, it has vested generations with reckless driving behaviour and a disbelief in rules.

So, while harsh penalties for now may seem cruel, it is necessary to set

examples that will trigger a mindset change. It is hard to expect that just awareness campaigns alone will work. Indian states must no longer be allowed to choose how and when they will prioritise road safety Road safety should be a measure linked to the spending the state receives. Tho-se with a good track record should be given bonus funds, so that there are incentives for performance.

The only common language India needs to speak for now is a uniform Motor Vehicles Act that is implemented in all states alike. GoI needs to focus far more on saving lives instead of scuppering away the opportunity to do so.



World's Biggest Crane Gets to Work at **British Nuclear Plant**



The world's largest crane is getting ready to hoist more than 700 of the heaviest pieces of the first new nuclear plant bein built in Britain in decades. The machine, affectionately known as "Big Car" after an executive at Belgian owner Sarens, is in piace at Electricite de France's £19.6 billion (\$2.4.1 billion) Hinkley Point C project in southwest England. It can carry as much as 5,000 tons, or the same weight as 1,600 cars, in a single lift and arrived on 280 truckloads from Belgium. solver" in cricket today by Australia coach Justin Langer, Smith's batting is marked by an unorthodox shuffle across the crease and he is a fidgete between deliveries, ince between deriveries, incessantly adjusting his pads and clothing.
But he has the ability of all great players to make batting look ridiculously easy and often appears to be playing

a different game from his teammates Smith said he appreciated the re action from the crowd in London although he was disappointed not to have ended the series with a flourish.

Fixing Returns to Haunt Indian Cricket

An India women cricketer reported An initial women cricketer reported a corrupt approach for the first time, while the Tamil Nadu Premier Leaguefound its coaches and officials under the scanner as the spectre of match-fixing reared its head yet again to cause upheaval in Indian cricket on Monday.

An unnamed member of the Indian women's cricket team was allegedly approached to fix matches ahead of approached to fix matches anead or the home series against England ear-lier this year, prompting the BCCI's Anti-Corruption Unit to lodge an FIR against two individuals on Monday. The alleged incident, which the player reported to the Board's ACU,

took place in February. Ajit Singh Shekhawat, the former DGP of Rajasthan and who heads the BCCI ACU, confirmed the development. "She is an India cricketer and also an international cricketer. So, the

ICC conducted an inquiry into it. The ICC warned the person who made the approach and informed us and acknowledged that the cricketer has done the right thing by reporting the approach," Shekhawat said. The ACU has registered a first

information report (FIR) with the Bengaluru police against two indi-viduals, Rakesh Bafna and Jitendra

Viduals, Kakesi Balia and Jieridia Kothari, for the alleged approach. This was after the Tamil Nadu Premier League (TNPL), an event run by the Tamil Nadu Cricket Association found itself in troubled waters with a few first-class cricketers and a couple of coaches coming under the ACU's scanner for suspect ed match-fixing. Shekhawat, however, ruled out the





SIESTA SHOWS LOVE FOR YOUR HEART

Daytime napping lowers risk of heart attack

Taking a nap during day time can not only refresh you but also lower the risk of heart attack or stroke if taken once or twice in a week, found a

The impact of napping on heart health has been hotly contested since many of the published studies on the topic have failed to consider napping frequency, or focused purely on cardiovascular disease deaths, or compared not opting for a mini siesta

Mapping sleep patterns
In the study published in the iournal Heart researchers looked at the association

between napping frequency and average nap duration and the risk of fatal and non-fatal cardiovascular disease events, such as heart attack stroke, or heart failure, among 3,462 randomly selected residents of Lausanne, Switzerland.

Each participant was aged between 35 and 75 when recruited between 2003 and 2006 to the CoLaus study. The first check-up took place between 2009 and 2012 when information on their sleen and nan natterns in the previous week was collected, and their health was then subsequently monitored for an average of five years.

napping a bad sign

Over half (58 per cent, 2014) of the participants said they didn't nap during the previous week; around one in five (19 per cent, 667) said they took one to two naps; around one in 10 (12 per cent, 411) said they took three to five; while a similar proportion (11 per cent, 370) said they took six to seven.

Frequent nanners (threeseven naps a week) tended to be older, male, smokers, weighed more, and slent for who said that they didn't nap during the day. And they reported more

daytime sleepiness and more severe obstructive sleep appoea – a condition in which the walls of the throat relax and narrow during sleep, interrupting normal

breathing.

During the monitoring period, there were 155 fatal and non-fatal cardiovascular

disease 'events'. Occasional napping, once to twice weekly was associated with an almost halving in attack/ stroke/ heart failure risk (48 per cent) compared with those who didn't nap at all.




THE BERKSHIR

Warren Buffett is the world's third richest person. But he has also spawned an entire generation of billionaires, who have all benefitted from Berkshire Hathaway's success. Here are the tales of six such

Networth: \$1.5 billion Horejsi bought shares of Berkshire Hathaway for \$265 apiece in 1980, according to Forbes. Horeisi, who owned a small business 40 years ago, had ad John Train's book *The Money Masters*, which heralded Buffett as one of the greatest investors alive. Inspired, he made a modest investment in Berkshire Hathaway. What started out as an initial investment of \$10,600 has turned into \$745 million. Interestingly enough, Horelsi's tale to riches was built the same way as Buffett's, who also purchased

great businesses when they were attractively priced. Horejsi today still owns some Berkshire stocks, but has since put millions into his own mu-tual fund, and has spent much of his life managing his family's money.



Networth: \$1.6 billion

Munger is Buffett's right hand man, and has served as the vice-chairman of Berkshire Hathaway since a long time. In addition, he also heads Daily Journal Corp. and Costco. An Omaha native, just like Buffett, 95-year-old Munger first met Buffett in 1959 at a dinner party. According to Investopedia, he was a successful investor in his own right before joining Berkshire. And he too has been an ac $tive\,philan thropist, who\,has\,donated$ millions to charity.

Net worth: \$2.1 billion

Gottesman, who goes by the nickname 'Sandy', founded First Manhattan in 1964 and remains actively involved to this day, according to the company's website. The firm manages over \$16 billion for clients. Among the firm's most prudent decisions was to make an early investment in Berkshire Hathaway. Gottesman also sits on Berkshire Hathaway's board today. The 93-year-old currently has a net worth of \$2.1 billion.



Net worth: \$3.5 billion (Family's net worth)

He's today worth \$1.5 billion.

Van Tuyl's father opened the family's car dealership in 1952, and the father-son pair built it into the third-largest car dealership network in the country by 1997, according to *Forbes*. The duothen started selling new cars as well as insurance and service contracts. In 2015, the Van Tuyl Group, which was then worth \$9 billion in sales, sold a controlling stake of the family business to Warren Buffett's Berkshire Hathaway for \$4.1 billion. Larry van Tuyl remains chairman of what is now renamed Berkshire Hathaway Automotive



A 9/11 joke that went too far

Jokes on the subject are still taboo for the bravest of comedians. But the late Joan Rivers had no such qualms.
The North Tower of the World Trade Center

in New York had a restaurant on the top floor. It was called 'Windows on the World'. Towers North and South both crashed after the at-tacks. Just days later, the deflantly inappropriate Rivers called her writer friend Jonathan van Meter and asked if he wanted to meet her for lunch at 'Windows on the Ground'.

This was at least a personal conversation, revealed by van Meters only after Rivers's death in 2014, in an obituary. But Rivers also made a very public 9/11 joke during a show in the UK. Widows offire-fighters dead or presumed dead on 9/11 had received \$5 million each as com pensation. If their husbands ever returned, Riverssaid, the women would be disappointed. The remark did not go down well with a lot of people. The International Association of Firefighters condemned it. Post 9/11, fire-fighters had assumed exalted nobility in America After all, hundreds of them had trekked up the burning towers, despite knowing they had lit tle chance against the inferno and the sheer

height of the gigantic buildings. In all, 343 fire





fighters perished at the site. (Many others suffer to date. This July, Richard Driscoll became the 200th fireman to die from ailments caused by the attacks)

After Rivers's firefighters joke, an audience nember reportedly shouted, "Too soon." Not for Rivers, who believed there was never

a bad time to make a joke. And it wasn't that she was just a celebrity far removed from the struggles of real life. She had lost her husband Edgar to suicide, another no-fly zone for com-ics. But even then, there was no stopping her. Not long after Edgar's death, Rivers said, "After Edgar killed himself, I went out to din-ner with Melissa (her daughter). I looked at the menu and said, "If Daddy were here to see these

prices, he'd kill himself all over again." But 9/11 was different from the personal pain of a family member's suicide. Death was unwanted here. And the number of lives and families affected was in the thousands. In many of those cases, death was preceded by several minutes of brutality and fear. September 11 was about hurried calls to say goodbye. It was about two-and-a-half year old Christine Lee Hanson never making it to Disneyland. The plane carrying her and her parents exploded into the South Tower. Christine was 9/11's youngest victim. Her brown stuffed rabbit is one of the articles in the 9/11 Museum.
