

Hat-trick hero Bumrah rips through the West Indies

The pacer finishes with a six-wicket haul as the hosts are shot out for 117; Kohli decides to bat again despite taking a 299-run lead

Jasprit Bumrah became only the third Indian to get a Test hat-trick after Hanuma Vihari's maiden century powered the visitors to a commanding position in the second Test against the West Indies here on Sunday.

Chasing India's 416, the hosts were bundled out for 117 with Bumrah finishing with sensational figures of six for 27 on the third day.

Bumrah failed to add to his six-wicket tally from Saturday and it was left to the other frontline bowlers - pacers Mohammed Shami and Ishant Sharma and spinner Ravindra Jadeja - to claim the last three wickets.
