Hat-trick hero Bumrah rips through the West Indies

The pacer finishes with a six-wicket haul as the hosts are shot out for 117; Kohli decides to bat again despite taking a 299-run lead

Jasprit Bumrah became only the third Indian to get a Test hat-trick after Hanuma Vihari's maiden century powered the visitors to a commanding position in the second Test against the West Indies here on Sunday.

Chasing India's 416, the hosts were bundled out for 117 with Bumrah finishing with sensational figures of six for 27 on the third day.

Batting again

Captain Virat Kohli declined to enforce the follow-on despite India taking a 299-run first innings lead, opting to bat again. At lunch, the tourists were 16 for one – an overall lead of 315.

Bumrah failed to add to his six-wicket tally from Saturday and it was left to the other frontline bowlers pacers Mohammed Shami and Ishant Sharma and spinner Ravindra Jadeja - to claim the last three wickets.

Shami produced a steep lifter to remove Rahkeem Cornwall who gave a simple catch to Ajinkya Rahane at gully, while Ishant accounted for the other overnight debutant, Jahmar Hamilton, Kohli holding on to the chance low at third slip. Roach opted to hit out against Jadeja but could only spoon a catch to Mayank Agarwal at cover.

In a lethal opening spell on Saturday, Bumrah made

inroads into the West Indies line-up in the seventh over by inducing an edge from John Campbell, which wicketkeeper Rishabh Pant accepted gleefully. Bumrah was at his best when he picked up the wickets of Darren Bravo, Shamarh Brooks and Roston Chase to register his name in

the record books.

He first had Bravo caught by K.L. Rahul at second slip and then Brooks and Chase lbw off the next two balls. Part of the credit for Bumrah's hat-trick must go to skipper Virat Kohli, who insisted on a review after Chase was given not out by on-field umpire Paul Reiffel. Earlier, Vihari, who scored a careerbest 111, dedicated his maiden Test ton to his late father, keeping a promise he made to himself 13 years ago.

Ross Taylor hit a quickfire 48 to set up New Zealand's five-wicket win over Sri Lanka in the first T20 International here on Sunday.

Taylor lifted the Black Caps from a precarious 39 for three in their chase of 175 to complete the win in 19.3 overs and lead the three-match series 1-0.

But his effort was not enough as Taylor put on 79 runs with Colin de Grandhomme, who scored 44, to take the attack to the opposition bowlers.

The outcome left India Blue and Green level on two points, but Green's quotient of 1.197 was superior to Blue's 0.63. India Red had already booked its spot in the final and will now meet Green in a five-day red-ball game at the M. Chinnaswamy Stadium from September 4.

That India Green conceded the lead here was due in no small part to Avesh Khan. The Madhya Pradesh paceman made 64 (56b, 2x4, 7x6) – his highest First Class score - as Red's last-wicket

pair added 73. Nearly half of those runs had been scored on the third evening, when Avesh had clubbed five sixes in a stunning onslaught. He would not be dislodged easily on the final morning either. The 22-year-old kept up the entertainment, reversesweeping Rahul Chahar for four and thumping two more sixes. He raised his maiden first-class fifty off 45 balls and was eventually dismissed after having guided Red past Green's 440.

"We were the last pair; we just wanted to add as many runs as we could," Avesh said later. "I was just hitting and it was connecting; it was a good feeling."

It was clear, though, that but for a spectacular collapse, Green would not slip below Blue on quotient. Faiz Fazal and Akshath Reddy fell cheaply but Dhruv Shorey remained in control. With a draw the only probable result, play was called off at tea with Green 98 for three.

Charles Leclerc dedicated his maiden Formula One victory at the Belgian Grand Prix on Sunday to his late friend, Anthoine Hubert on an emotional day at a sombre

Spa-Francorchamps.

The Ferrari driver's landmark success came in the aftermath of 22-year-old Frenchman Hubert's death in Saturday's tragic Formula Two race.

Leclerc led almost the entire race from pole to hold off Mercedes' defending fivetime World champion Lewis Hamilton's dramatic late charge by one second.

Difficult to enjoy

"My first victory in F1 and this one is for Anthoine," he said on the team radio. "It feels good, but it's difficult to enjoy on a weekend like

After what he described as "a very difficult weekend"



he added: "I have lost a friend and I want to dedicate this victory to him.

"One hand I've got a dream since being a child that has been realised, on the other hand it has been a very difficult weekend since yesterday," said Leclerc, who dedicated his win to Hubert.

'We grew up together, my first ever race I did it with Anthoine, Esteban (Ocon), Pierre (Gasly). I can't fully enjoy my first victory, but it will definitely be a memory I will keep forever," added


