Bengal Governor, State at loggerheads

The 'rescue' of Minister Babul Supriyo from university sets off controversy

The newly appointed Governor of West Bengal Jagdeep Dhankar has taken on State Education Minister and Trinamool Congress secretary general Partha Chatterjee over incidents of violence on the campus of Jadavpur University in Kolkata on Thursday evening. The Governor had intervened to personally escort Minister of State for Environment, Forest and Climate Change Babul Supriyo from the campus amid protests and heckling from students, who objected to his presence. Mr. Chatterjee had claimed that Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee had requested the Governor not to go to the university at the peak of commotion and to "give the government some time to peacefully solve the issue."

"This is most unfortunate and shocking that our Governor, the custodian of the Constitution of the State, without informing the elected government went to the so-called rescue of the BJP leader from Jadavpur University... Chief Minister requested him several times that the Governor being the constitutional head need not go at this moment. The CM requested him to give the government some time to peacefully solve the issue," Mr. Chatterjee said. A press note issued by Mr. Dhankar's office said, the Minister was not aware of the developments that took place before the Governor went to the University to rescue Mr. Supriyo. "Obviously, he did not know of the developments that took place between the Governor and the DGP [Director General of Police] / CS [Chief Secretary] as also the conversation with

The Honorable Chief Minister," the press note said. Mr. Supriyo, along with designer Agnimitra Paul, had gone to the campus to attend a seminar organised by the Akhil Bhartiya Vidarthi Parishad (ABVP) on Thursday. However, several students had protested against their entry by raising black flags and asked him to leave. The situation escalated when Mr. Supriyo refused to budge. As tensions rose, he remained stuck inside the college premises till the Governor arrived at around 8 p.m. and escorted him out. Meanwhile, members of ABVP and BJP forcefully entered the college premises, vandalised university property and beat up some students. Trinamool issued a statement on Friday, reiterating Mr. Chatterjee's "stand" and argued that it "must be made very clear [that] universities are autonomous institutions and as per time-honoured tradition, police cannot enter university campus with-

A fourth of Indians consider dementia 'dangerous'

Three fourths of those surveyed term patients impulsive and unpredictable

Almost a quarter of Indians surveyed said that they considered those suffering from dementia to be "dangerous" and about three-fourths said that those with dementia are "impulsive and unpredictable," according to a report released by Alzheimer's Disease International (ADI), a London-based non-profit organisation. The survey by the London School of Economics (LSE) was meant to gauge attitudes towards dementia among the general public, health practitioners and care givers and surveyed about 70,000 people in 155 countries.

Some of those surveyed were dementia patients. The study estimates that as much as 50% of all people living with dementia never receive a formal diagnosis and in China and India, this lack of diagnosis is much higher, perhaps as high as 70-90%. The number of those with dementia worldwide is set to increase to 152 million by 2050, according to the report. The current annual cost of dementia is estimated at \$1 trillion (approximately), a figure that is set to double by 2030. "In the survey analysis, we highlight the behavioural element first, giving promi-

nence to the voices and experiences of people living with dementia as direct assessment of actual behaviour is central to discrimination and is the closest representation of the true impact of stigma on people living with dementia," wrote the auth-

in the elderly increases, according to a 2018 report in the Indian Journal of Psychiatry. The ADI report, made public on Friday on the eve of Alzheimer's Day, finds that 95% of global respondents think they will develop dementia in their lifetime and 78% are concerned about developing dementia at some point. One in 4 believe that there is nothing you can do about dementia and 2 out of 3 think dementia is caused by normal ageing. Just under 40% of the public think that there are adequate community services for people living with dementia and for carers and just under 70% of people think there are adequate competent physicians for the diagnosis and treatment of dementia.

SC modifies recommendation on Kureshi after govt.'s letters

The Supreme Court Collegium has modified its May 10 recommendation to appoint Justice A.A. Kureshi as the Chief Justice of the Madhya Pradesh High Court, after the government sent two consecutive letters asking it to reconsider the proposal. In a resolution dated September 5 and published on Friday, the Collegium led by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi, has now recommended the appointment of Jus-

arat High Court. The Collegium resolution does not disclose any reason for the sudden change. It only says the modification is based on two communications, dated August 23 and August 27, from the government. The resolution comes shortly before a three-judge Bench led by the CJJ is to hear on September 23 a petition filed by the Gujarat High Court Advocates Association on the prolonged uncertainty over Justice Kureshi.

Cash seized from Trinamool MP's house

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has seized ₹32 lakh in cash and foreign exchange worth \$10,000 from the official residence of Trinamool Congress MP K.D. Singh in Delhi. "Searches were carried out on Thursday at seven locations in Delhi and Chandigarh, including the offices of 14 group companies of Alchemist Group related to, and controlled, by Mr. Singh," the ED said. The ED said several documents "reflecting circular nature of transactions, digital evidence and property documents" have been seized. Mr. Singh - through Alchemist Township India Limited and Alchemist Holdings Limited - had raised huge amounts of money from thousands of customers in the garb of investments by offering them high returns and also against sale of plots and flats, the agency said.
