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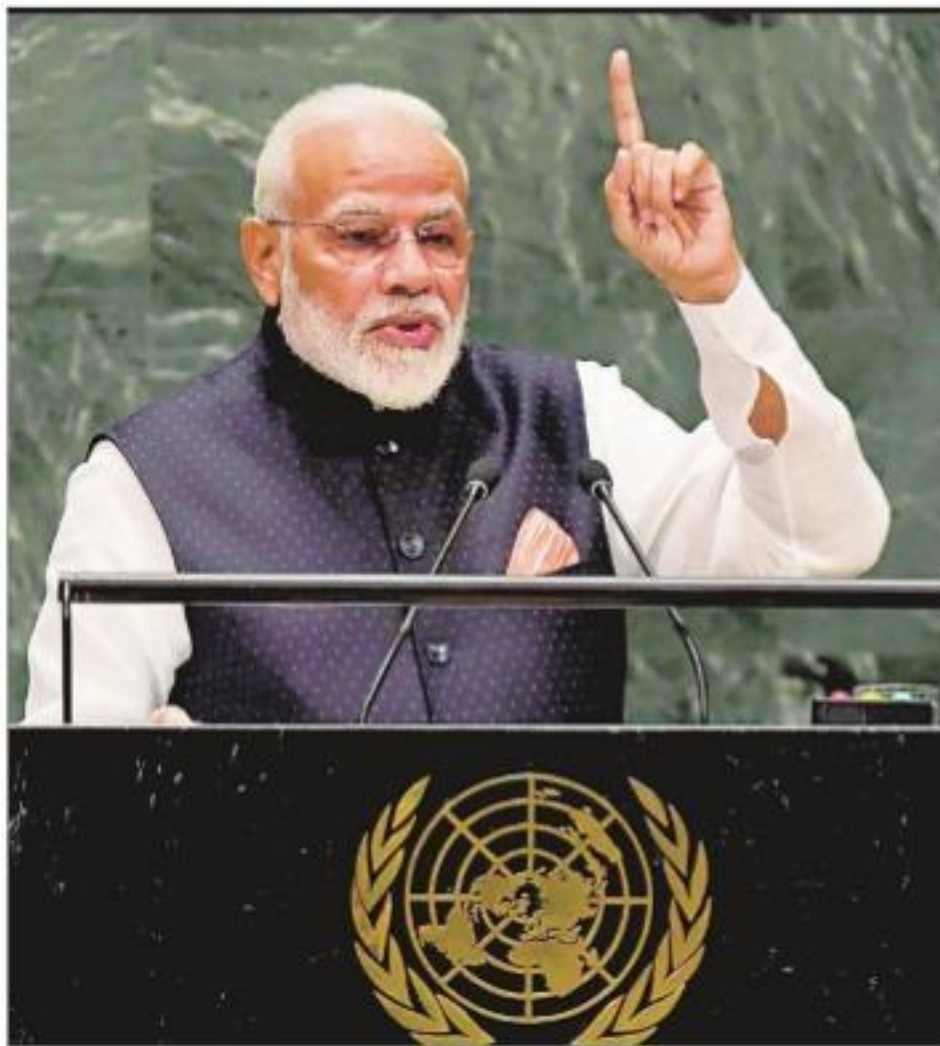
Shun terrorism & protectionism: PM

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27

Prime Minister Narendra Modi today eschewed Pakistan and Kashmir while speaking at the UN General Assembly in New York. Instead, he sought to demonstrate how India's domestic and foreign initiatives are in line with the key objectives of the United Nations.

"All Indian Government's initiatives are centred on fulfilling the dreams of its 1.3 billion citizens. The efforts are ours but the fruits are for all. This conviction of mine gets stronger everyday when I think of those countries which like India are striving for development in their own ways. When I see their joys and sorrows, when I get to know their dreams, my resolve to develop the country at a faster pace gets stronger so that India's experience can be beneficial to these countries too," he observed during a brief

18-minute address in Hindi. PM Modi began by pointing out the magnitude and meaning of his second General Election victory and

quickly moved on to recounting those of his government's achievements that are the largest or the biggest in the world. He listed

"Swachh Bharat", the world's biggest sanitation campaign, health insurance scheme, also the world's biggest giving, Jan Dhan, the

biggest financial inclusion scheme in the world, and digital identification programme which has checked leakages of about \$20 billion. "These successes will bring confidence to people elsewhere because when a developing country achieves this, it gives the world a new hope. The need for this public policy is not confined within the borders of India, nor is it an expression of piety but inspired by a sense of duty alone. We believe that this is one of the biggest challenges not for any single country but the entire world and humanity," the PM added.

In the next five years, India aims to be free of single-use plastic, besides promoting water conservation, ensuring water supply to 15 crore homes, building 20 million houses for the poor and 1,25,000 km of new roads. "The question that arises is how have we achieved all these rapid changes?" PM Modi asked

Why no word on Muslims in China, US asks Pakistan

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27

The US today said it expected talks between India and Pakistan besides "rapid action" from Prime Minister Narendra Modi in lifting of restrictions in Jammu & Kashmir and the release of those detained. It also asked Pakistan to keep cross-border terrorism under check and prosecute UN-designated terrorists, including Hafiz Saeed and Jaish leader Masood Azhar.

Pointing out that the US was concerned over widespread detentions in J&K, including those of politicians and business leaders, senior State Department official Alice Wells said Washington looked forward to the Indian Government's resumption of political engagement with local leaders and the scheduling of the promised elections at the "earliest" opportunity.

She criticised Pakistan PM Imran Khan for not speaking out against China, which has

detained an estimated million Uyghurs and other Turkic-speaking Muslims in Xinjiang province. "I would like to see the same level of con-

cern expressed also about Muslims who are being detained in western China, literally in concentration-like conditions," she said.

"The world would benefit from reduced tensions and increased dialogue between India and Pakistan. And given these factors, the President is willing to mediate if asked by both parties," said Wells while giving an overview of US' activities on the margins of the UN General Assembly. She also spoke of Washington's expectations of matching commitments from Pakistan PM Imran Khan, such as his promise to prevent cross-border terrorism and to combat militant and terrorist groups without distinction.

Wells said US wanted to see India and Pakistan hold a constructive conversation which would hinge on Pakistan's seriousness in ensuring that terror groups did not engage in cross-border infiltration. — TNS

15 tax officers retired over graft

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27

In the fourth round of "spring-cleaning", the government has compulsorily retired 15 senior Income Tax Department officers over corruption charges.

An official news release said the move was in line with PM Narendra Modi's statement that "some black sheep in the tax administration may have misused their powers and harassed taxpayers, either by targeting honest assesses or by taking excessive action for minor violations". As many as that 49 high-ranking tax officers were compulsorily retired earlier this year. — TNS

Special cell says second drone seized; police contradict claim

AMRITSAR, SEPTEMBER 27

The state special operation cell (SSOC) today claimed to have recovered a drone from Mahawa village near Attari on the India-Pakistan border here. The Punjab Police, however, in a late-night press release said the seizure was made in August.

This comes days after a terror module was busted in Tarn Taran with the arrest of four Khalistan Zindabad Force (KZF) members and recovery of a cache of arms and ammunition dropped by drones from Pakistan in Chahal in Tarn Taran. A burnt drone was also recovered.

The SSOC claimed Akashdeep, one of the suspects, told investigators that

a drone had crashed during a sortie and that they had hidden it near the village. A team

took Akashdeep along and recovered the drone under a tree in the village this morning, it claimed.

SSOC DSP Balbir Singh said: "During investigation, KZF member Akashdeep confessed to having destroyed one of the drones in Chahal area and hiding another at Mahawa after it crashed. The drones had been used for carrying consignments of arms and ammunition from Pakistan. Akashdeep claimed the drone seized from Mahawa had crashed while returning to Pakistan." The five-foot-long drone had the capacity to carry 5 kg payload, he said. "The drones made multiple cross-border sorties to drop off five AK-47 rifles, four Chinese

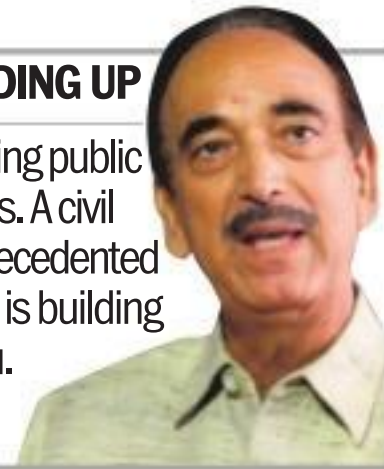

SC recommends elevation of six judges to HC

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 27

The Supreme Court collegium has resolved to recommend elevation of six judicial officers as judges of the Punjab and Haryana High Court. The judicial officers to be elevated are Ashok Kumar Verma, Sant Parkash Phutela, Karamjit, Vivek Puri, Meenakshi I Mehta and Archana Puri.

The recommendation was initially made by the then Chief Justice of Punjab and Haryana HC on March 14, in consultation with his two senior-most colleagues. The list has the concurrence of the states of Punjab and Haryana.

Referring to the HC collegium's recommendation regarding judicial officer Satish Kumar Aggarwal, the SC collegium asserted: "Having regard to the material on record and all relevant factors, the collegium is of the considered view that his case deserves to be remitted to the High Court. The collegium resolves to recommend accordingly." The High Court as of now has 47 judges against the sanctioned strength of 85.

Moviegoer Bhagat Singh liked it first day, first show

The Excelsior Theatre in Lahore was screening 'Uncle Tom's Cabin' and Bhagat Singh told his friends they must watch it. It was a silent film and Bhagat Singh delivered a passionate speech after the screening.

The film is based on Harriet Beecher Stowe's classic anti-slavery novel of the same name, which is said to have laid the groundwork for the civil war in America.

A lot has been written about

Bhagat Singh the martyr; but not enough about Bhagat Singh the moviegoer. In Lahore's vibrant cinema scenario, there was a lot for him to soak in on and he often liked it first day, first show. And among the films he loved was 'Uncle Tom's Cabin'.

Advertisements in newspapers of the time, including *The Tribune*, had been inviting people to watch the film at the Lahore theatre on December 15, 1928. According to historian KC Yadav, Bhagat Singh had proposed to his friends that they must see the "revolu-

tionary film", which they did. Yadav quotes Bhagat Singh's comrade Bhagwan

Das Mahor, who recalls that Bhagat Singh gave an impressive lecture after the film and underlined the usefulness of it for the revolutionaries.

Bhagat Singh's fondness for cinema has been documented in the memoirs of revolutionaries as well as works of historiography. Prof Kama Maclean, Associate Professor, South Asian and World History, University of New South Wales, says Bhagat Singh would often spend his daily food budget on films.

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Govt: MC officials to pay for mishaps involving strays

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 27 Local Bodies Minister Brahm Mohindra today said officers in the urban local bodies will be held accountable in the event of any accident involving stray cattle in their respective jurisdiction.

The development comes a day after the Punjab and Haryana High Court, while hearing a writ petition pertaining to Haryana, held the state and civic bodies responsible for stray cattle menace.

Issuing directions to the Principal Secretary, Local Government, the minister said henceforth, if any untoward incident pertaining to the stray cattle was reported from any area of the state, the officer concerned would be held accountable and departmental action would be initiated against him. The minister also sought a detailed report in this regard from the Principal Secretary in three weeks.

“If any untoward incident pertaining to stray cattle is reported from any area of the state, the officer concerned will be held accountable and departmental action will be initiated against him.”

Issuing instructions to the urban local bodies and district administrations to launch a collaborative action to grapple with this socio-economic threat posed by stray cattle, Mohindra asked the Principal Secretary to hold an emergency meeting with all municipal commissioners and executive officers to fix their responsibility in this regard. Recently, a demi official letter was also written to all deputy commissioners, asking them to check government and private gaushalas in their districts within 15 days for creating a database of animals housed therein.

Only 18% of treated water being put to use

Local Govt's time-bound action plan for reuse of waste water

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 27 Even as the state heads for a severe water crisis due to over exploitation of water resources, only 18 per cent of the water treated at sewage treatment plants (STPs) is being put to use in 167 urban areas of the state.

Of the 1,609 million litres per day (MLD) of waste water being treated at the 90 STPs, only 300 MLD is being put to use, while the remaining is discharged into nearby drains and other water bodies, according to the data available with Local Government Department.

Though the Punjab Municipal Building Byelaws, 2018, make it mandatory to use treated water, lack of infrastructure to supply it to the end-users has been hampering the cause.

Now, the Local Government has come out with a time-bound action plan to ensure “reuse of treated waste water” for gardening, road washing, construction and industrial purposes. The ‘State Treated Waste Water Policy’ has been notified, listing guidelines for

waste water collection, treatment and reuse.

A time frame—varying from six month to a year—has been fixed for the urban local bodies (ULBs) to put in place infrastructure to supply treated water to end-users. These bodies have also

been asked to implement the water metering policy in a year and undertake feasibility studies for supply of treated water to end-users.

Principal Secretary (Local Bodies) A Venu Prasad said the department would strictly enforce the guidelines.

An official maintained there were 167 urban local bodies with a population of 1.03 crore. At present, 92 STPs, having a total capacity of around 1,600 MLD, were functional, while 25 more STPs (271 MLD) had been approved, he added.

No contamination in flood-hit areas

JALANDHAR, SEPTEMBER 27 The groundwater tests in four of the flood-hit villages show no major contamination. But not taking any chances in 20 other villages, the Water Supply and Sanitation Department has pressed 15 potable water tankers into service.

Mobile testing teams of the department had collected samples from Yusufpur Darewal, Kra Ram Singh, Sabhuwal and Manak villages. In other villages, officials fear seepage of polluted Chhitti Bein/Sutlejo into groundwater through pipes/borewells has caused contamination. The DWSS is also distributing pamphlets, urging villagers not to consume water of regular supply.

Notably, the initial water samples are only from nine tube wells set up by the DWSS at 20 Lohian villages.

NP Singh, XEN, Water Supply and Sanitation Department, Jalandhar, said, “The

initial samples are only from our department tube wells. These have been taken both directly from tube wells and indirect water supply to homes. All these samples are of 500-600 feet deep water. It is estimated that contamination has affected only the upper strata, especially up to 150-200 feet deep. With contamination ruled out, we have restored their water supply, but not to other villages until we receive reports.”

Officials of the PPCB too took water samples from 25 villages. Reports are awaited, officials said.

3 ambulance service officials suspended

The action came after an accident victim's kin uploaded an audio clip of the alleged harassment on social media.

Didn't send ambulance despite requests of a mishap victim's attendant

Sukhvinder Singh of Beli village was reportedly going on a motorcycle on September 19, when he met with an accident on the Ropar-Anandpur Sahib road near Bharatgarh. He was taken to the Community Health Centre, Bharatgarh, from where

doctors referred him to the Ropar Civil Hospital.

Beli village resident Mohinder Singh, who was accompanying the victim at the hospital, rang up ambulance service phone number seven times, but the phone operator did nothing except wasting time on pretext of seeking details of the patient and hospital.

The ambulance was not sent even after the hospital staff requested for it. The conversation was recorded on phone by

Mohinder Singh, who later put it on social media.

Taking cognisance of the issue, the Health Minister yesterday ordered the suspension of two emergency response officers and one cluster leader deputed at Dial 108 headquarters in Amritsar.

The minister said the Punjab Health System Corporation had been directed to change protocol in which priority must be accorded to emergency cases.

5 get life term for murders

IG files plea in court, wants call details of SIT members

In the Behbal Kalan and Kotkapura police firing cases in which two Sikh protesters were killed on October 14, 2015, one of the main accused, IGP Paramraj Singh Umranganal, on Friday moved an application in the Sessions Court here.

He urged the court to summon phone call details of 11

police officers, who are members of the SIT probing the cases, and those assisting the SIT for the period between December 1, 2018, and May 23, 2019.

In his plea, Umranganal maintained that the record was necessary for effective cross-examination of the witnesses

and to prove his innocence.

The IG has also asked the court to call the record and status report of the case registered on October 14, 2015 in which a criminal case against the protesters was lodged. However, on August 7, 2018, on the directions of the SIT, a counter-case against several police officers, including Umranganal, was registered. — TNS

34 rescued from illegal rehab centre

One of the owners, Paramjit Singh, a resident of Manimajra in Chandigarh, has been arrested. The inmates were taken to the state-run rehabilitation centre in Sirhind.

The police said the kingpin, Jagrup Singh of Ismailpur, with his men, escaped.

Addressing mediapersons, SSP Amneet Kondal said the Khamano police received a tip-off regarding Baba Jujhar Singh Anti-drug Society. A police team,

Row over handling of ex-judge's case against Sukhbir, Majithia

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 27 A controversy of sorts has erupted over the way a former judge's case is being handled by a sitting judge of the Punjab and Haryana High Court, about seven months after he filed a complaint against SAD chief Sukhbir Badal and MLA Bikram Majithia.

Justice Ranjit Singh's complaint was listed for hearing before a single-judge Bench of the High Court on Thursday at serial number 235 and was expected to come up for hearing late in the afternoon. The complaint was filed in February and has so far come up for hearing seven times.

A senior advocate appearing on Justice Ranjit Singh's behalf was not expecting much to happen during the hearing. One of the opposing

Implications

The first-of-its-kind plea by Justice Ranjit Singh has larger political and legal implications. If allowed, the respondents may find themselves facing proceedings for simple imprisonment for a term extending up to six months or fine or both. Five years after the judge hearing the matter was elevated, the Supreme Court Collegium earlier this month recommended his transfer to the Kerala High Court. His request to reconsider the transfer was also declined by the collegium.

senior counsels had reportedly intimidated him beforehand about his non-availability. The judge hearing the matter, too, was under transfer.

But the judge took Justice Ranjit Singh's counsel by “surprise” by taking up the case out of turn. The case was called up for hearing at 2 pm. At the very onset, Justice Ranjit Singh's counsel submitted that the case could have been taken up when its turn came later during the day as there was no urgency. But the hear-

ing continued for about two hours before the case was adjourned till Monday.

Taking exception, Justice Ranjit Singh has sent an SMS to acting Chief Justice Rajiv Sharma. Since then it has gone viral and is believed to have been received by the Supreme Court as well.

Justice Ranjit Singh asserted he filed a complaint against two political leaders for bringing disrepute to him as chairman of a commission appointed by the govern-

ment to inquire into incidents of sacrilege in the state.

Justice Ranjit Singh added that he was told that the judge left urgent or freshly filed cases and took up his complaint out of turn. The judge started hearing the case on maintainability of his complaint, whereas his counsel was told that the respondent-politician would take date. Despite protest by his counsel, the judge heard the case and kept it for Monday. “The judge is under transfer and is showing undue haste in dealing with case. I apprehend that justice may suffer. I am bringing it to your notice as acting Chief Justice to take appropriate action considered necessary in the case, where a former judge of this court is before the court to save the honour and prestige of the institution,” Justice Ranjit Singh concluded.

Singh, the SAD chief asked him to list major achievement of his government in the last more than two years. “Drug trafficking is on the increase because Congress legislators are patronising the mafia. The Chief Minister has been blaming the Union Government for rise in drug trafficking instead of taking concrete steps to end it,” he alleged.

On the recent seizure of arms airdropped through drones from Pakistan, he said, “Pakistan was desperate to revive terrorism in Punjab, which has been proved by the seizure of a drone along with arms and ammunition. Yet another serious issue was that the accused in this anti-national case were associated with Amritsar MP, who misused his position to shelter them. Keeping in view the national security aspect, the CM should intervene and there should not be any cover-up,” he said.

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Protest over Abohar mishap, families seek compensation

3 labourers were killed while cleaning oil tank | 3 booked, one held

ABOHAR, SEPTEMBER 27

Infuriated over the death of three labourers while cleaning an oil tank in a factory at Focal Point near Alamgarh bypass, victims' kin, along with members of the Kisan Majdoor Talmel Samiti, staged a protest at the Civil Hospital here today. The protesters demanded compensation for the affected families besides strict action against the factory owners.

Carrying a two-month old baby in her lap, Sarabjit Kaur, alias Seema, wife of deceased Happy Singh (25), led the demonstration. Seema has no other source to feed her baby as well as herself.

Mahabir Prasad, brother of another deceased, Badri Ram (25) of Bhilwara in Rajasthan, said the latter, who got job just two months ago in the factory, was survived by wife and four children for whom survival would be difficult task.

The protesters resented delay in postmortem "due to police apathy" and demanded arrest of the accused besides compensation for the affected families.

The postmortem on two bodies was conducted by three doctors, led by Addi-

₹2.78-cr power bill: Education Dept to opt for OTS scheme

PATIALA, SEPTEMBER 27

With Punjab State Power Corporation Limited (PSPCL) declaring that there has been a pendency of Rs 2.78 crore on the part of government schools and other education offices, the Education Department has directed the district education officers (DEOs) to enroll the defaulters under the recently launched one-time settlement scheme of the PSPCL.

The step has been taken to facilitate the defaulters to pay bills and avoid the heavy burden of interest.

The scheme is, in fact, for all connections given to the government departments which defaulted on bill payment, but their connections couldn't be discontinued in public interest. The announcement is said to have come after the PSPCL asked the state Education Department to clear the pending electricity bill at the earliest.

To expedite the payment process, the department has asked the DEOs to immediately pay Rs 2,000 as the processing fee/defaulters at the subdivisional offices to pay the pending bills under the said scheme.

Meanwhile, Director General School Education (DGSE) Mohammad Tayyab said, "We are trying to settle the pending PSPCL bills. The move is one of the steps to clear the pending bills of the department." — TNS

No bail for 'labourer' with ISI links

The Punjab and Haryana High Court has turned down the regular bail plea of a "labourer" allegedly having links with Pakistan's secret agency ISI. Photographs of sensitive Army areas of Mamun Cantonment in Pathankot were allegedly found in a mobile phone stated to have been recovered from him.

The Bench of Justice Hari Pal Verma was told that the

petitioner, Irshad Ahmad, had disclosed during inquiry that he was having relations with one Sujjad Hussain involved in work of private computer. Hussain would visit Pakistan and was having relations with the ISI.

Hussain had asked the petitioner to send him photographs of the Army Cantonment. After clicking the photographs, he was to send them to Hussain, who was to further transmit them to ISI. In

exchange of these photographs, they would get money from the ISI.

The Bench was also told that FIR in the matter was registered on February 2, 2016. Justice Verma asserted the court did not find any reason to grant regular bail to the petitioner, in view of the "very serious nature of allegations" against the petitioner. "However, as the petitioner is in custody since February 2, 2016, it is expected that the trial court shall expedite the trial", he added.

Surprisingly, the officers had listed the family as Scheduled Cast (SC), but the commission's investigations revealed that they belong to the Back-

ward Class (BC) category. The commission has announced to issue a show-cause notice to Block Development and Panchayat Officer (BDPO) Parmjit Singh. The team directed

all officers concerned to take up the matter with their senior officers, arrange funds to repair the dilapidated house and file a detailed report within 14 days.

Kangra first conducted a meeting with Malerkotla SDM Vikramjit Singh Painthe and DSP Sumit Sood and other officers. Later, the team went to Jhuner and interacted with the three brothers — Kartar Singh (72), Surjit Singh (82) and Janga Singh (65 — whose house has been falling apart from the past seven years and they are shifting to various portions of the house. But now, only the entrance point is left.

"We have checked our record and they are registered as BCs. But due to typing mistake, their category was added as SC while uploading the details online," said BDPO Parmjit Singh.

Martyr Bhagat Singh's 'protected' hideout faces official neglect

Notwithstanding its notification as a 'protected monument' around four years ago, the state government has failed to make any concerted efforts for the development and preservation of the double-storey building located in the heart of this border town which used to serve as a secret hideout of "Krantikari Party", led by Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh.

After a prolonged battle of seven decades, fought by local residents, followed up by a PIL filed in the high court by Advocate HC Arora, the Department of Tourism and Cultural Affairs had declared this building a protected monument on December 17, 2015, under the Punjab Ancient and Historical Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains Act, 1964. However, no steps have been initiated till date to take over this building nor have any funds been allocated for the purpose.

The building is presently under the control of "Krishna Bhagti Satgung Trust".

The district administration had even served a notice to the occupants to

not alter the structure or sell it. The then Deputy Commissioner, DPS Kharbanda, had mooted a proposal in 2016 to relocate the shopkeeper on ground floor and family occupying the first floor to another location for which an agreement was also drafted. However, the matter is stuck up in files only.

"For me, this building is

no less than a pilgrimage as I have grown up on stories around this 'hideout', which was taken on rent by my father Dr Gaya Prashad under the fake name of Dr BS Nigam to run a pharmacy in 1928-29," said Kranti Kumar Katiyar, demanding that a museum be set up in the building at the earliest.

"While the pharmacy was run on the ground floor, the

first floor was used by revolutionaries to make bombs and evolve a strategy against the oppressive British rule," said Rakesh Kumar, who has also authored several books on this monument.

Last year, Tourism and Cultural Affairs Minister Navjot Sidhu, had promised to provide Rs 15 lakh for the renovation of the building. However, the funds are still awaited.

Threedayson, sixbookedfor Abohar youth's murder

Six persons have been booked in connection with the murder of a youth of Bhangala village. Identified as Bittu Singh (26), the deceased had gone to Daulatpura village along with his friend whose sister was being allegedly assaulted by her in-laws when he was attacked on Tuesday night.

Sources said his friend Sarpreet's sister Sukhdeep Kaur was married to Alampreet Singh since 2011. The couple has three children. Her in-laws had been "torturing" her on one pretext or the other. At 10 pm on Tuesday, when Alamdeep "thrashed" her, Sukhdeep informed her brother Sarpreet Singh, who along with his friends Bittu and Chhinda, reached Daulatpura. The trio were thrashed by the accused with sticks.

Bittu suffered a head injury. An ambulance took Sukhdeep to a Abohar hospital where Bittu was declared brought dead. Sukhdeep is under treatment. The Khuyiansarwer police have registered a case under Section 302 of the IPC against Alampreet Singh, Raja, Baby, Babu Singh, Lakhwinder Singh and Akashdeep Singh. None of them has been arrested. — OC

Sediments reduce storage capacity of Bhakra Dam by 23%

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 27

Facing the challenge of sediment deposition, which has reduced water storage capacity at the Bhakra Dam by almost 23 per cent, the Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB) has chalked out a detailed plan to deal with the problem.

Under this plan, the Board has roped in Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Roorkee, and IIT, Ropar, to conduct studies to identify the areas from where the sediment was coming and its possible use.

Besides, the BBMB was also seeking help from the World Bank under the Dam Rehabilitation and Improvement project (DRIP). This was disclosed by DK Sharma, Chairman of the BBMB, to *The Tribune* today.

Sharma said the Board had prepared a project of Rs 230 crore under which various works related to the improvement of the dam and treatment of the catchment areas would be carried out. The project was almost ready and would be submitted to the World Bank for approval soon.

The BBMB had also decided to carry out large-scale plantation in the catchment areas to stop the sediments from flowing in. The dam management was tackling the problem of sediment as a top priority, the chairman added.

Meanwhile, the Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB) organised a workshop on 'Sediment Management for Sustainability of Large Storage Reservoirs and Run-of-River Projects' in Chandigarh, today. Sarvjit Singh, Principal Secretary, Department of Water Resources, was the chief guest on the occasion.

DK Sharma, Chairman of the BBMB, and Martin J Teal, Chairman of International Committee on Large Dams, were keynote speakers at the workshop. Tarun Agarwal, Secretary of BBMB, presented the vote of thanks.

Notification issued: Electoral process set in motion | 10 candidates file papers

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 27 With the process of Assembly elections in Haryana formally set in motion today with the Election Commission issuing the notification, almost a straight contest between the ruling BJP and the Congress is being predicted on a majority of the 90 Assembly seats. Ten candidates filed their nominations today — four from Sonepat and one each from Beri, Kosli, Nalwa, Rewari, Rai and Kharkhauda. Though the INLD had emerged the main opposition party after the 2014 Assembly poll, but the performance of the party as well its offshoot, the JJP, in the May 2019 Lok Sabha elections indicates that the split in the Chautala clan has dented the poll prospects of the two parties badly. A comparison of the number of seats won by the BJP, Congress and the INLD and also their vote share in Lok Sabha and Assembly elections in 2014 with their performance in parliamentary polls held in May this year is indicative of which way the wind is expected to blow in the October 21poll. In the 2014 Lok Sabha poll, the BJP had won 7 of the 10 seats with a vote share of 38.84 per cent. The INLD came next by winning the Hisar and Sirsa seats with a vote share of 24.43 per cent while the Congress came third by winning only the Rohtak seat and its vote share was 22.93 per cent.

It will be interesting to see whether Jats who voted for Modi will also vote for Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar, because while Modi did not trigger caste factor in the caste-ridden Haryana, the latter being a Punjabi is likely to elicit caste-based equations. Political observers believe that under the given conditions, the main contest is likely to remain between the BJP and the Congress on a majority of the seats, with the INLD, JJP or others coming in the main contest on a couple of seats depending upon the individual stature of the candidates.

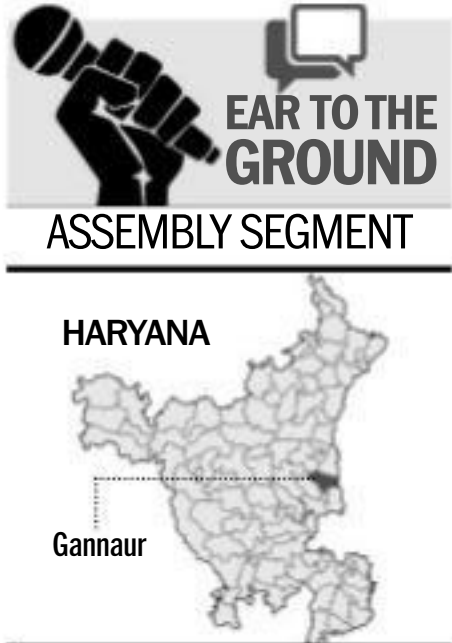

comprises Gannaur town and 77 villages. During the Jat quota agitation in February 2016, it had witnessed large-scale violence on the National Highway 44. The violence had driven a wedge among the communities, leaving voters divided on caste lines. Jogender of KD Nagar listed out major problems ailing the segment: the menace of monkeys, dogs and stray animals, scarcity of clean water and dilapidated roads. "The main road from National Highway 44 to the Gannaur railway station and several link roads in the con-

"The Congress envisioned the IIHM, a project of international standing, but the ruling party's apathy has stalled it," he alleged.

Tap water samples from 11 areas fail quality tests

Union Minister calls for meeting on Oct 3 to address issue

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27

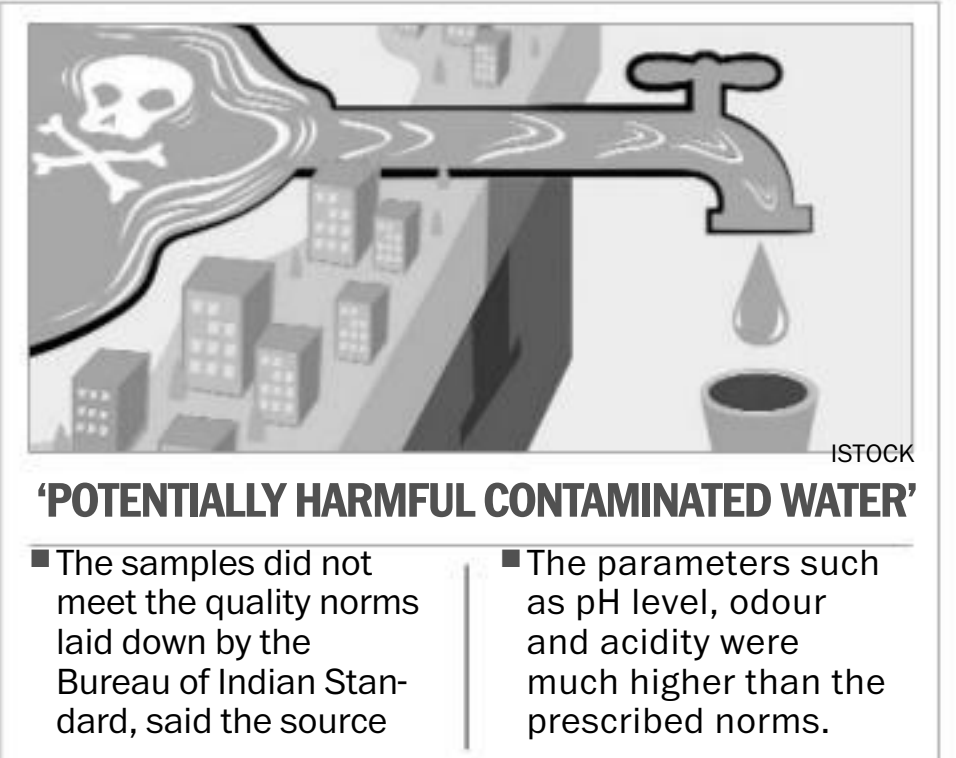
A preliminary investigation of tap water samples collected randomly from 11 areas in the Capital has revealed that the water was not safe for drinking, a government source said on Friday.

The samples did not meet the quality norms laid down by the Bureau of Indian Standard (BIS), a national body that frames quality standards for products and services, the source said.

The parameters such as pH level, odour and acidity were much higher than the prescribed norms. The final report is expected in a month, the source added.

The samples, sent voluntarily by Delhi households, were tested by the BIS. The samples collected were from tap water supplied by both the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) and the New Delhi Municipal Corporation (NDMC).

To address this issue, Union Food and Consumer Affairs Minister Ram Vilas Paswan has called a meeting on October 3. Senior officials from the Delhi Government, DJB,

NDMC and the urban development ministry will be present. "BIS has tested samples of tap water randomly taken from 11 areas. A preliminary report prima facie showed that the tap water supplied by DJB and NDMC was not safe for drinking at all," the source said.
The samples did not meet the BIS quality standards in terms of parameters like pH level, odour and acidity. In some areas, the water did not meet any of the quality parameters, the source said. The samples will be further investigated and the final report is expected to be released in a month, the source added.
Responding to Paswan, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, who is also the chairman of DJB, had recently said the water utility would take corrective action if there were any shortcomings found. Currently, BIS standards on drinking water are voluntary in nature. — PTI

Two held for duping over 1K people

Around 81 debit cards, 104 cheque books and 130 pass books seized

The accused Alimuddin Ansari (27) was arrested from Ajmer while his associate Manoj Yadav (31) was arrested from Karol Bagh, they said. Ansari - the mastermind of the syndicate allegedly operated through multiple unorganised call centres in Jharkhand's Jamtara, Giridih, Deoghar, Dhanbad and West Bengal's Wardhaman area, they added.

The matter came to light after police received a complaint from a resident of Dwarka Rakesh Gilani, who was duped of over ₹4 lakh.

Around 81 debit cards, 104 cheque books and 130 pass books of different bank accounts were recovered, the police said. — PTIs

Demolish Maradu flats in 138 days: Apex court

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27
Taking a tough stand against illegal constructions, the Supreme Court on Friday ordered demolition of flats built on the coastal zone of Kochi's Maradu in 138 days and asked the Kerala Government to pay ₹25 lakh interim compensation to each affected flat owner in four weeks. A Bench headed by Justice Arun Mishra directed setting up of a one-member panel of a retired high court judge to oversee the demolition and assess total compensation. Ordering freeing of assets of builders/promoters involved in construction of illegal buildings in the coastal zone areas of Kochi, the court said the government may consider recovering the interim compensation amount from them. While issuing notices to the builders/promoters concerned, the Bench posted the matter for further hearing on October 25.

The buildings needed to be brought down through implosion and an expert agency would be appointed by October 11 for the purpose, he said, adding power and water supply to the four apartment complexes had already been snapped. Terming illegal construction in coastal areas of Kerala as a "colossal loss" to the environment, the court had on September 23 expressed shock over spate of unauthorized structures at Kochi's Maradu. On May 8, it had ordered these illegal buildings in a notified CRZ be demolished in a month. The order came after the Bench took note of a report submitted by a three-member committee, which concluded when the buildings were constructed, the area was already notified as a CRZ and construction was banned.

The Kerala Government was represented by senior counsel Harish Salve and the state's Chief Secretary was present during the hearing. The court cited the case of Kant Enclave, Faridabad, where illegal structures have been razed and recovery of compensation from erring builders have been worked out. Maintaining that there should be no reason for delay in demolition, it said primary concern ensuring that no construction made in the eco-fragile coastal zone. At one stage, the Bench — which had earlier rejected residents' area against the demolition — said, "If you (Kerala Government) cannot do it, we will think of involving some other outside agency." Ayodhya: SC backs ASI report

Amid continued attempts from Muslim parties to discredit the 2003 report of Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) on Ram Janmahoomi-Babri Masjid, the Supreme Court on Friday defended it, saying it was not an ordinary opinion as archaeologists were acting on behalf of Allahabad High Court and inferences were drawn by "cultivated minds". The High Court had asked the ASI in 2002 to excavate the site and give its findings on whether the "disputed building" was constructed on the site of an "alleged Hindu temple" after demolishing it. After analysing the artefacts, idols, pillars and other remains found at the disputed site, ASI report talked of the existence of a massive structure beneath the "alleged Babri Masjid".

Says it's not an ordinary opinion; inferences drawn by 'cultivated minds'

But lawyers representing Muslim parties have been attacking the ASI report, terming it "merely an opinion" and not binding on the court. On the 33rd day of the hearing on Friday, a five-judge Constitution Bench headed by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi sought to put at rest the controversy over the ASI report, saying the inferences from the report were drawn by "cultivated minds" (archeologists). "You (lawyer) cannot equate the (court) Commissioner's report to any other ordinary opinion. They (ASI experts) conducted it (excavation) after the Commissioner asked them," the

Bench said, adding, the experts excavated and analysed the excavated material on the direction of the Commissioner who was delegated the powers by the Allahabad High Court. The Bench — which also includes Justice SA Bobde, Justice DY Chandrachud, Justice Ashok Bhushan and Justice S Abdul Nazeer — said it was conscious of the fact that both sides had their arguments based on inferences and there were no eyewitnesses to these events. "We have to see which side's story is reasonably probable," it noted. On behalf of the Wakf Board, senior counsel Meenakshi Arora maintained the ASI report was "weak evidence" and merely "an opinion" which needed to be supported by substantial proof to establish that a Ram temple existed at the disputed site before the mosque came up.

Kalyan Singh appears in court, put on trial

IIT council okays exit option for weak students

The Council of Indian Institutes of Technology chaired by HRD Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal today approved an exit option for weak undergraduate students at the institutes of national importance. The council, the highest decision-making body of the 23 IITs, approved a proposal to let academically weak students opt for a three-year BSc course in place of a four-year BTech if they are unable to make the grades to jump to the progressive semesters. The current BTech course at IITs has eight semesters and is structured in a way that many students find it hard to clear various levels. Over 2,000 students dropped out of IITs in UG and PG streams in two years, the government had said. The exit option will be available after the second semester. — TNS

16 killed as minibus collides with Bolero

389 districts have 100 pending child abuse cases each

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27
There are 389 districts in the country where the number of pending child abuse cases exceed 100 and as per a Law Ministry proposal, one fast-track special court will be set up in each of these districts to exclusively try such cases. According to a Law Ministry document, "Scheme on Fast-Track Special Courts for expeditious disposal of cases of rape and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act", there are 389 districts in the country where the number of pending cases under the POCSO Act exceeds 100. "Therefore, as per the SC order, in each of these districts, one exclusive POCSO court will be set up which will try no other case," it said. — PTI

V-P stresses reforms in judicial system

Proposes bifurcation of Supreme Court, setting up of 4 Regional Benches

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27
Expressing concern over inordinate delay in justice delivery in the country, Vice-President M Venkaiah Naidu today suggested bifurcation of the Supreme Court and setting up of four Regional Benches of the apex court besides evolving Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) to limit the number of adjournments and a time-frame for disposal of cases. "The speed and quality of justice delivery in the country has a huge bearing on the economic development as it impacts the flow of investment. It would be better if judges at various levels are exposed to special orientation programmes organised by the judiciary itself on various



technical and specialised branches of emerging laws and the attendant issues and processes," the Vice-President said after releasing a book "Parameswara to PP", a compilation of articles by former senior Supreme Court advocate late PP Rao. Endorsing the recommendation of the Law Commis-

Supreme Court shall sit in Delhi or in such other place or places, as the CJI may, with the approval of the President, from time to time appoint." He also referred to a recommendation of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Law and Justice on having Regional Benches of the SC on a trial basis. In order to reduce delays, Naidu said judiciary could evolve SOPs through which the number of permissible adjournments can be specified and a time limit can be set for disposal of cases based on the nature of issues involved. He said some three crore cases are in different courts across the country with some pending over for 50 years. — TNS

'84 riots: HC seeks Centre's reply on SIT legality

The Delhi High Court has sought the Centre's response on a plea by one of the convicts in 1984 anti-Sikh riots challenging the legality of the Home Ministry's order for setting up a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to reprobe the cases. A Bench of Justices Sidharth Mridul and IS Mehta issued notice to the Union of India through the Secretary of Ministry of Home Affairs and listed the matter for further hearing on September 30. The legality of the SIT has been challenged by convict Yashpal Singh who was sentenced to death by a trial court in a 1984 anti-Sikh riot case which was reopened by the SIT. — PTI

Blot on Swachh Bharat

Double murder of Dalit kids brings forth madness of casteism

HOURS after PM Modi received the Global Goalkeeper Award in New York for the success of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, two Dalit children were thrashed to death by upper-caste men for defecating near the village panchayat building at Bhavkedhi in MP's Shivpuri district. The irony does not end here. The village was declared open defecation-free (ODF) in April last year, but the kids' family still does not have a toilet at home. For the record, about 11 crore toilets have been built across the country under the mega cleanliness mission, which was launched with fanfare on October 2, 2014. The PM is set to declare the country open defecation-free, again on October 2, on the occasion of Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary.

The double murder has exposed gaping holes in the implementation of the Swachh Bharat initiative, while laying bare an age-old social evil that persists even in the 21st century — caste discrimination. Manoj, a labourer whose youngest sister and only son met a gruesome end, has alleged that his family was repeatedly subjected to casteist slurs by fellow villagers. He claims that the panchayat had sanctioned a house with a toilet for him, but an influential relative of the accused threw a spanner in the works. Manoj's case can't be dismissed as an aberration; there must be countless others suffering a similar ordeal.

Even as our leaders remember Gandhi while only paying lip service to the ideals he lived and died for, we must not forget that the Father of the Nation was both a votary of cleanliness and a crusader against casteism and untouchability. Rapping the Centre recently over its failure to end the dehumanising practice of manual scavenging, the SC had observed that caste bias existed even over seven decades after Independence. Sanitation is only one aspect of cleanliness. The latter is indeed next to godliness if it also removes the filth of prejudice and hatred from our minds. Physical cleaning and mental cleansing should go hand in hand. India will witness a new dawn only when all inequalities and inequities are erased.

Cricket's dynasts

Family members of ineligible officials take over reins

AN analysis of cricket's administration in India reveals a disturbing fact: The administrators are dynasts, not democrats. To cling to power, they subvert all principles of democracy. This is very alarming because they are mostly powerful politicians and businessmen who should be strengthening democracy, not undermining it. Take the Tamil Nadu Cricket Association (TNCA), for instance. It has been controlled by cement industry tycoon N Srinivasan since 2002. Srinivasan was forced to leave office both at TNCA and the Indian cricket board after the Supreme Court mandated a clean-up of Indian cricket. But his control over the TNCA is absolute, and he has managed to install his daughter as TNCA's president.

TNCA is in august company when it comes to cricket dynasties. Anurag Thakur, a Central government minister now, became the Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association president in 2000. Thakur is ineligible to hold office now, and his brother has stepped in to become the association's president. The family of Banshi Lal has ruled over the Haryana Cricket Association since the 1970s. In Punjab, the grip of the Bindra-Pandove group has lasted over four decades. The son of Niranjan Shah, the Saurashtra Cricket Association strongman, has taken over as its president. Shah has been in control since 1972! The Vidarbha Cricket Association has been controlled by Nagpur's prominent lawyer family, the Manohars, for two generations, and the third generation is being groomed for the job. It's like family business. The newly-recognised cricket association of Chandigarh is following the time-tested formula — the sons and relatives of its president, Sanjay Tandon, are voting members of the association.

All these dynasts have followed the undemocratic norm of excluding cricketers from the list of voting members. It is only now that after being arm-twisted by the SC, the state associations are reluctantly allowing former international cricketers to become members. The court has done a favour to cricket by undertaking the clean-up. Clearly, it needs to do more to ensure that cricketers — and not dynasts — run cricket. The first step in that direction would be to make all first-class cricketers voting members of their state units. Only then could the sons, daughters and *chamchas* of the boss be outvoted.

Whither in India?

ELSEWHERE we reproduce in *extenso* the admirable article entitled 'Whither in India?' published in the *Nation* of the 30th August. The writer has set forth before the British democracy the case for India with a lucidity which we have learnt to associate with writings appearing in the columns of the foremost British weekly. After referring to India's glowing record of war services, the acknowledgements of the same by British statesmen, the representation of India at the Imperial War Cabinet and Conference, the status accorded to the Government of India in the League of Nations and finally in the Peace Treaty deliberations, the writer says that the definite promise of responsible government of August 20, 1917, is of far greater importance to India than any other political happening of recent years. But in the writer's opinion although the August declaration was universally acclaimed two years ago as such, things have materially changed since then. The ball was set rolling in this direction by the passing of the Rowlatt Act in the teeth of popular agitation.

Accommodation in Bombay Colleges.

LAST year the Government of Bombay appointed a Committee of educationists to consider providing additional facilities for education in Arts Colleges in the Bombay Presidency. Every year a large number of students are denied admission to colleges for want of accommodation and complaints from the public are increasing. The Committee submitted its report recommending an increase in colleges, not necessarily by establishing more Government colleges, if this could be done by encouraging private colleges. The Committee also stated that colleges should be more freely distributed over the presidency.

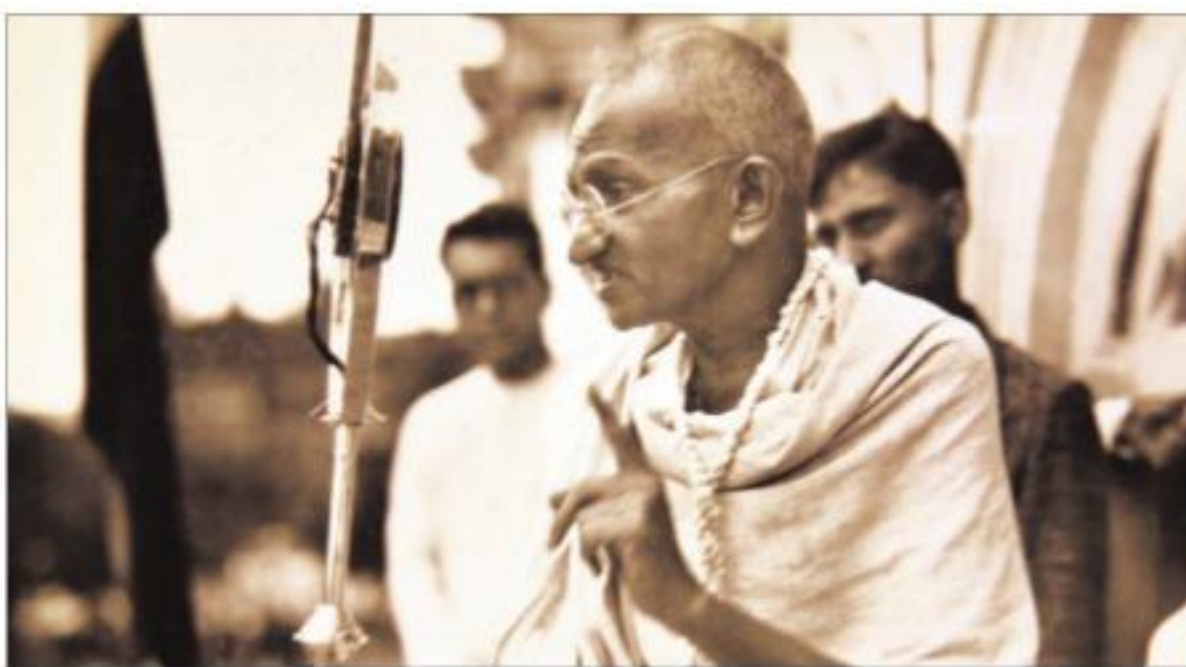
In his 150th birth anniversary year, the Mahatma remains defeated

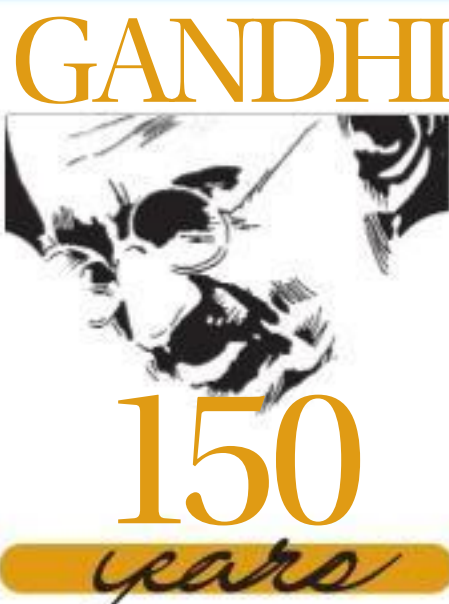
THE TRIBUNE, while explaining the importance of the first-ever pan-India protest against the British in the context of the Rowlatt Act, drew a picture of the emerging leader of the Indian national movement in an editorial on April 6, 1919: '...Mr. Gandhi, in whom, as Mr. Gokhale once said, Indian humanity has reached its perfection, whose knowledge of his people is profound and who is probably the most popular — as he is easily the most saintly — of Indian leaders...' This was written hardly four years after Gandhi returned from South Africa, when he was untested and India was still coming to terms with his quirky ways. He lived about three more decades, shaping the idea of India, fighting innumerable, excruciating battles within and without, evolving from an upholder of the *varna* system to an anti-caste reformer and changing the mainstream society along with him. But the editorial of 1919 more or less portrayed what he meant to most Indians for many decades more.

The greatest contemporary critics of Gandhi were those who collaborated with the British — Mohammad Ali Jinnah, VD Savarkar and Dr BR Ambedkar — to create identity politics and tear apart the fragile fabric of a nation Gandhi was painstakingly weaving. Of these three critics, Gandhi respected Ambedkar the most and understood his angst the best, finally ensuring that he was made the chairman of the drafting committee of the Constitution. But for Gandhi, even the image of Ambedkar in public consciousness — as modern India's lawgiver sculpted in stone with the Constitution in hand — would have simply been that of a member of the Viceroy's Executive Council. Gandhi shaped his rivals. Jinnah and

Savarkar were the complete antithesis of Gandhi, vying with each other to please the Empire and create separate Muslim and Hindu nations. No wonder their parties collaborated to be in power together in Bengal, Sindh and the North West Frontier Province, when real patriots were in jail. Yet, Pakistan was not Jinnah's victory, but born of British strategic exigencies.

Now, a century after the editorial extolling Gandhi as the perfect specimen of Indian humanity, on his 150th birth anniversary, Gandhi seems to have lost the battle against the politics of hatred. The idea of Gandhi has changed and a sizeable section of Indian society may not agree with that old editorial any longer. Why? The primary responsibility lies with the so-called Gandhians, the ones who wore the *topi* — like ND Tiwari in a sleaze video — making it the greatest symbol

of hypocrisy, untruth and unbridled greed for power. They even made Gandhi's killers acceptable. When Indira Gandhi issued a postage stamp in Savarkar's memory in 1970, she was putting the stamp of approval on his ideology and his role in the conspiracy to kill Gandhi. Three decades later, with Vajpayee as PM and Advani as deputy PM, a parliamentary committee comprising Pranab Mukherjee (Congress) and Somnath Chatterjee (CPI-M) put up the portrait of Savarkar in the Central Hall of Parliament, mocking Gandhi inside the temple of Indian democracy.

So, when the current Home Minister is photographed with Savarkar's portrait in the backdrop, it does not come as a surprise, for Gandhi was defeated and his politics of truth, compassion and nonviolence was replaced by his murderer's ideology long ago. Hindutvavadis' derision for Gandhi was always ostensibly over nonviolence. But that can't be true because their forefathers never took up arms against the British — even Savarkar got Madan Lal Dhingra to pull the trigger and go to the gallows. Their real grouse was Gandhi's interpretation of Hinduism and his sway over the Hindu masses. They termed it effeminate and cowardly, imagining a valorous variety instead, even as they served the British. But Gandhi's politics of nonviolence, apart from the moral power it exerted over

the enemy, was also an antidote to the British getting uniformed Indians to kill poorer Indians; something the Maoists still keep doing.

Apart from the Savarkarites, the biggest critics of Gandhi are the Maoists and their overground, well-heeled supporters. While the Hindutvavadis have tried to appropriate Gandhi of late, trying to reduce him to a waste management metaphor, the so-called left radicals have appropriated Ambedkar and are using him to attack Gandhi and thereby delegitimising the post-colonial Indian state. This phenomenon began with the economy opening up and foreign capital funding beauty pageants and literary festivals. The new India of Miss World and Booker titles and the new era of Aishwarya Rais and Arundhati Roy's threw up a newly-imagined past, where Gandhi is the villain and Ambedkar the hero. The creation of this binary conveniently used a British tool — separate electorates to divide society — camouflaging it as Ambedkar's idea. Thus the Poona Pact and Gandhi's fast unto death, which defeated the British ploy to create caste nationalities after constructing religious nationalities, were turned into a fight between Gandhi the oppressor and Ambedkar the victim. The memory of Gandhi the manual scavenger, making the upper castes clean their own toilets, was erased by this new generation of activists.

Worse, Gandhi — who adopted a girl from an 'untouchable' caste, married off another (who became the only Scheduled Caste woman member of the Constituent Assembly) in his Wardha ashram, and who wanted Hinduism to die if untouchability were to remain — is now being labelled a casteist. This hatred for Gandhi can only be triggered by a strange apathy towards post-colonial India by legatees of the old colonial elite or the colonially-empowered groups. The Hindutva identity, which took shape in the 1990s, should be understood in the context of Gandhi getting delegitimised by people using his idiom to manufacture caste and communal identities. The new Savarkarite Hindu *rashtra* could only have been built on Gandhi's grave.

Big, fat weddings at what cost?

CHAOTIC, slow-moving traffic competing for space with incoming *baratis* dancing to drumbeats with unbridled flamboyance while heading for wedding venues; countless cars, with valets at a loss to find appropriate parking; women decked up in what they perceive is 'wedding appropriate', glittering jewellery in the cold winter wedding season are a norm rather than exception. Resultantly, there is noise pollution — imagine the volume of firecrackers burst by all and sundry — traffic congestion; and colossal waste of time of road-users, many of whom may be negotiating that unwelcoming road for

other important purposes. Ambulance services are a classic example.

In July, the SC expressed outrage over the wastage of food and water at wedding functions in the Capital. The Delhi Government must be congratulated for its alacrity in drafting norms, designed to cap the number of guests and curtail food wastage. The salient features are fourfold: a) processions of horse-drawn carriages and band not allowed outside the venue; b) number of guests to be appropriately correlated to the area of the venue and parking capacity; c) number of firearms and DJ sets must be as permissible by current regulatory requirements; and d) surplus food must be distributed among

the poor by mandated nodal NGOs.

The above recommendations offer the best composite package for checking vulgar extravagance, besides the resolution of multiple undesirable practices indulged by uncaring citizens, more to 'status match' with deep-pocketed patricians.

The most despicable practice pertains to the utterly careless use of firearms. There have been innumerable incidents where celebratory fire has accidentally injured and killed guests at such functions.

I hate to be a spoilsport. After all, those entering the so-perceived stratospheric heights of nuptial bliss deserve this once-in-a-lifetime event to be celebrated in the

'ideal' manner. It should therefore be done with a moderate dose of song and dance, literally and figuratively. Like too much work makes Jack a dull boy; too much song and dance would certainly leave even a vivacious couple with cramps and sprains.

Apologists for the 'Big Indian Fat Wedding' and its logical sequel — vulgar extravagance (the financial magnitude is mind-boggling; an estimated \$54 billion in 2014, as per a matrimony site) — may argue that besides assuaging the sensory pleasures of the elite, they generate phenomenal economic activity. While I can't counter this argument, I would still like to ask them, at what cost?

Steps not enough

The fundamental cause for the economic slowdown is insufficient consumption. Private consumption, which reflects demand, and contributes nearly 60% to India's GDP, fell to over a four-year low of 3.14% in the first quarter of 2019-20 from 10.6% in the fourth quarter of 2017-18. What the government has done so far addresses only the supply side of the problem whereas it needs to put more money in consumers' pockets (through tax cuts and creation of jobs) to get them to spend. The measures also do not address the low wages and depressed crop prices, a big factor in the slowdown. Steps like corporate tax cut may make it easier to do business in the long term, but it may not have an impact in the short term.

Pros & cons of opening Siachen to tourism

IMMEDIATELY after the bifurcation of Jammu and Kashmir was announced on August 5, Gen Bipin Rawat put forth the proposal that he was not averse to the idea of the Siachen area being opened to tourists. While I feel that it is not a bad idea, it did trigger some seismic, contentious opinions and debates.

First, let me dilate on various aspects pertaining to the Siachen glacier and why it becomes a focal point for triggering the interests of tourists. In Balti, 'Sia' means roses and 'chun' means in abundance (though no roses are seen). Siachen is sandwiched between the Saltoro ridge on the west and the Karakoram ranges on the east. Temperatures go up to minus 70°C and peaks on the ranges are up to 25,000 feet. It is also called the 'Third Pole' and is the highest battlefield in the world. It is the second longest glacier in the non-polar region in the world. It is approximately 76 km in length, though the glacier retreat is about 110 m per year. The Nubra river from the glacier drains into the Shyok river, which ultimately becomes the Indus river.

The idea of tourism in this area is not de novo. Since 2007, trekking activities have been undertaken by teams from the NDA, IMA, NCC and Military School, Chail. There is no reason why others can't be permitted to delve in such ventures.

Today, adventure has become the buzzword, so why not add adrenaline to the aspirants' dreams?

It will also motivate the youngsters to join the *fauj*. It will help them repose faith in the Indian Army and the Air Force and convince them that the forces are capable of maintaining our territorial integrity and that they can operate and sustain in extreme climate and very hostile terrain. It will be a capability demonstration to our countrymen.

The infusion of tourism in Siachen will act as a scalper to open myriad opportunities. These include:

- Encouragement to open wildlife sanctuaries. Snow leopard, ibex etc are found in this area.
- Creation of research centres.
- In 2003, at the World Peace Park conference in Durban, a proposal for making it a 'peace park' was put forth. However, this has serious security ramifications for India. Pakistan is known to have deceit in its DNA. If this area is demilitarised, surely Pakistan will occupy the Saltoro ridge, thereby converting their disadvantage into advantage. Presently, on the Saltoro, their positions are being dominated by us and their locations are highly prone to avalanches. In 2012, in the Gayari glacier, they lost 143 sol-

diers in a single avalanche.

- Long treks can be undertaken from the glacier to DBO/Tangse via Saser la.
- Above all, the opportunities will open up the doors for revenue generation for the locals as also the government.
- However, keeping the security in view, red lines will have to be drawn to restrict areas for visits.

But though the prospect of tourism in the glacier looks very encouraging,

there are many negatives which need to be addressed. These include:

- Environmental issues: Tourism and other activities will see a surge in waste dumping. This will hasten glacier retreat. Due to the presence of the Army, a lot of non-biodegradable waste is already present there and every day, about 1,000 kg is being added.
- Logistic support system, including casualty evacuation, will have to be created for various tourist activities.
- In the interim, I can foresee that

Army echelons will, by default, get involved. The Army in this area is already under tremendous strain to execute its primary task, and as such, any additional strain will have a cascading effect on the performance of the mandated task.

- This being a very sensitive area, security issues, especially concerning foreigners, will have to be factored in.

Will 'cry baby' Pakistan object to any such venture by us? Pakistan has no defensible equity to object, because

it is our territory and we don't have to take permission from Pakistan.

Earlier, Pakistan had been sending expeditions to Sia Kangri, Indira Col etc. Their justification came from a cartographic error by the US Defence Mapping Agency (USDMA) which published a map in 1963 showing a straight boundary line between India and Pakistan, from NJ9842 to the Karakoram Pass. Thereby, it gave a large chunk of the Indian territory to Pakistan. On our objection and further scrutiny, it emerged that this line was on a map of World War-II vintage, representing an 'air defence line'. Robert Blackwill, former US Ambassador, apologised later and the maps were corrected.

It is interesting to note that the point in this area up to which the boundary was demarcated in 1949 was NJ9842 and was mentioned 'Thence Northwards'. The same was ratified in the Simla Agreement of 1972. 'Thence Northwards' implied that the boundary as per 'international norms' would run along a geographical feature running northwards, which happened to be the Saltoro Ridge.

However, Pakistan always had the intention to change the status quo by occupying the Saltoro Ridge for strategic reasons and then dominate the Siachen glacier. It is providence that we occupied it on April 13, 1984, under Operation Meghdoot just a day prior to Pakistan's intended occupation under Operation Ababeel (a high-altitude hawk). The tourism dream in Siachen would not have fructified had the Pakistanis pre-empted us.

Potential danger, 100 ft above Indo-Pak border

Drones with 10-kg payloads were used by Pakistan's intelligence agencies to drop AK-47 rifles, counterfeit currency and narcotics at Tarn Taran. Unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) or drones are among the major growing technologies that have beneficial applications in security and other logistical employment, but at the same time, they are being misused by terrorists and smugglers.

THE drone technology is a double-edged sword. To the utter shock of the Indian security agencies, Chinese-made drones with 10-kg payloads were used by Pakistan's intelligence agencies to drop AK-47 rifles, counterfeit currency and narcotics at Tarn Taran in Punjab. The arms and ammunition were dropped by drones that came from across the Pakistan border in 10 sorties spanning over eight days. The aim was to carry out 26/11-like terror attacks in Punjab and Jammu and Kashmir.

This dangerous plan was revealed when the Punjab police seized a drone during its probe into the weapons seizure. The Punjab police recovered this drone, which used to drop arms and ammunition in Punjab, on the basis of information provided by the Khalistan Zindabad Force (KZF) terrorists arrested from Tarn Taran on September 22. An attempt was made by the terrorists to burn the drone.

Punjab Chief Minister, Captain Amarinder Singh, has urged the Central Government to alert the Air Force and the Border Security Force about the possibility of drones being used to supply weapons from across the border. He also requested Union Home Minister Amit Shah to handle the drone problem at the earliest. He tweeted, "Recent incidents of Pakistan-origin drones dropping consignments of arms and ammunition is a new and serious dimension on Pakistan's sinister designs in the aftermath of the abrogation of Article 370."

This is a serious issue which needs to be thoroughly investigated. Actually, unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) or drones are among the

major growing technologies that have many beneficial applications in security and other logistical employment, but at the same time, they can pose a significant threat to the very purpose for which they were invented. The Punjab incident is an example of this challenge. The use of UAVs was started with the beginning of the Cold War by the superpowers for the purpose of security and surveillance.

Irrespective of the rising popularity of UAVs among the civilian population, combined with expanding technological capabilities, there are significant challenges to regulating the use of UAVs. These challenges can be placed into three broad categories.

First, where should UAVs be allowed — or not allowed — to fly? This includes the difficulty in identifying the proper airspace for the different uses and sizes of UAVs.

The second problem is about who should be allowed to use UAVs —

and more specifically, who is responsible for damages from drone use. As UAVs increase in physical size and technical capability, the level of skill required to operate them safely has increased. Due to its smaller size, made of plastic body and use of electric batteries, it is nearly impossible to detect drones by conventional radars. Traditionally, radar technologies are used to detect flying objects in the sky, but technologies are often not suitable in this case. The reason is simple: for many years, radar technology and software was specifically made to avoid small objects, such as birds, and view them as noise. Most commercial drones are constructed of plastic and are difficult to detect electronically because of their small size. They also fly low in relation to the ground.

All these factors make it a favourite tool for carrying out terrorist and other illegal activities.

pistols, hand grenades and ammunition, besides Rs 10 lakh in fake Indian currency. They used an abandoned shelter in the Chabal area to destroy one drone and hid the other at Mahawa," claimed the DSP.
The police have nabbed seven members of the terror module so far.
The Punjab Police, however, contradicted reports about the recovery of the drone today. A police spokesperson clarified that two drones had been recovered — one last month and the second in a burnt condition recently in Chabal town of Tarn Taran.
The spokesperson said the

police had stepped up vigil along the border after recovering a crashed 'Hexacopter Drone' on August 13 from Mahawa village, 1.5 km from the border. The recovery followed an anonymous call received by Amritsar (Rural) police that an object had been seen in village fields.
The drone — 'U10 KV100-U' model — was designed and manufactured by T Motors, a Chinese company. Four brick-sized batteries (made in China) were found installed in the hexacopter.
The details of the drone were shared with the Central Government for facilitating technical investigations by Central agencies.

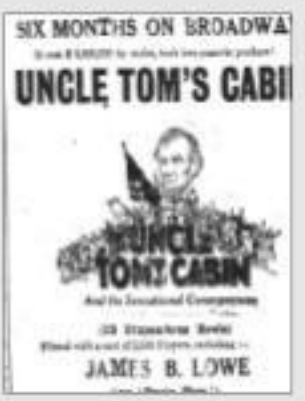

"He liked his films first day, first show. He didn't bother about the class that he got to watch the movie in. Sometimes, he even borrowed money from friends to buy tickets. We saw so many films together... 'Wildcat of Bombay', 'Uncle Tom's Cabin'. The last that I saw with him was 'Wings'. This film had the sound of aeroplane in it; rest of it was silent." 'Wings' is known as the first to win an Oscar for the Best Film.

Ruby Myers, who went by the name of Sulochana. "He especially loved (Myers') 'Wildcat of Bombay', re-released with sound in 1936 as 'Bambai Ki Billi', wherein Sulochana plays eight different characters, some of whom are Indian men and British spies."

Chris Moffat, author of the recent India's Revolutionary Inheritance: Politics and the Promise of Bhagat Singh, says Bhagat Singh's love and access to world cinema reminds one of the "vibrant cinema Lahore had in the early twentieth century. Many of the architecturally-striking old cinemas are still operational today, especially around Lakshmi Chowk, even though the middle classes have shifted their support to new commercial multiplexes in the south of the city".

They have no money to buy food either," Azad rued, terming the situation as a "government-induced calamity."

He alleged the Centre tried its best to prevent locals from meeting him and even video-graphed visitors.

"In Srinagar I wasn't allowed to use my house. I was

put up in a government accommodation which was like a fortress. People had to cross three barriers to reach me and most were sent back. At the gate were stationed state vigilance and CID teams. A camera was installed to capture visitors. In Anantnag, they even recorded my conversation with locals." He claimed the situation in Jammu was no better.

"The impression being given about Jammu celebrating the government decision is false."

The Congress leader demanded the release of detainees, including three former CMs — Farooq Abdullah, Omar Abdullah and Mehbooba Mufti.

Pakviolates truce in Poonch, Rajouri

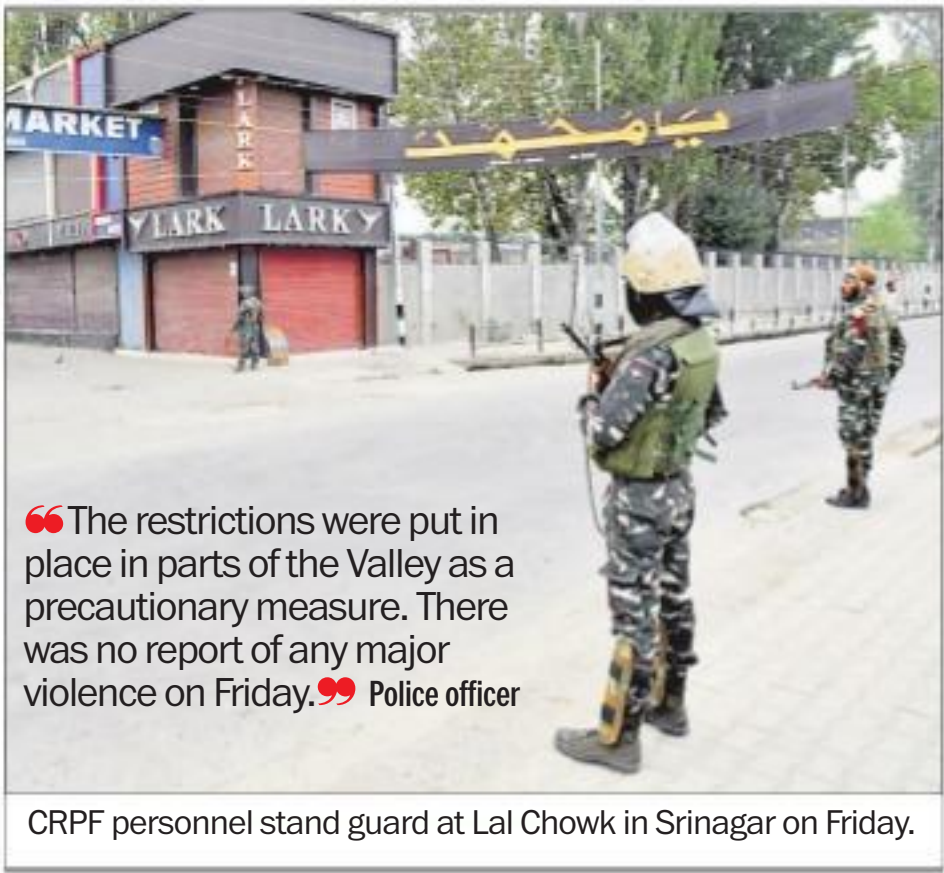

RAJOURI, SEPTEMBER 27
After a lull of two days and hours ahead of Prime Minister Modi’s address in the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA), the Pakistan army violated truce agreement thrice during the past 24 hours in Poonch and Rajouri districts.
On Thursday late evening, the Pakistan army resorted to unprovoked mortar shelling on the Indian Army’s forward locations in the Nowshera sector in Rajouri district.
At about 8 am today, the Pakistan army resorted to ceasefire violation with small weapon firing and mortar shelling in the Qasba, Kimi and Saral areas in the Poonch sector.
The ceasefire violation continued till 8.30 am, but no loss or injury was reported from any area. Again at about 11.40 am, the Pakistan army resorted to heavy shelling on forward locations and on civilians in the same area. Heavy exchange of firing and mortar shelling between both armies continued for about 30 minutes and many shells landed in the fields.

Restrictions reimposed as Valley fears protests

SRINAGAR, SEPTEMBER 27
Amid fears of protests and violence ahead of the address of the Indian and Pakistani Prime Ministers at the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA), strict restrictions were reimposed in parts of Kashmir Valley on Friday.
In capital Srinagar, the restrictions were reimposed in parts of the old city, volatile Aanchar, Soura and Maisuma localities. The roads leading to these areas were blocked with razor wires. The road leading to the Clock Tower in the City Centre was also sealed with concertina wire, restricting inward and outward movement in the area.
The authorities had deployed large contingents of police and central armed police forces in Srinagar to thwart protests.
Due to the restrictions, no congregational Friday prayers were held for the eight consecutive weeks at

the historical Jamia mosque in the old city.
In other parts of the Valley, restrictions were reimposed in Anantnag, Awantipora, Handwara and Kupwara towns.
“The restrictions were put in place again in parts of the Valley as a precautionary measure,” a police official said. “There was no report of any major violence on Friday.”
Sources said there were apprehensions of “anti-India and pro freedom” protests or stone-pelting following the Friday prayers coinciding with the UNGA address of Prime Ministers of India and Pakistan. People in Kashmir have been closely watching the developments at the UNGA.
The Valley remained

glued to their television sets to listen to speeches of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Pakistan PM Imran Khan.
Despite restrictions, a protest demonstration was held in the Aanchar area of the city suburbs where protesters demanded solution to the Kashmir issue.
Meanwhile, shops and business establishments remained closed across the Valley for the 54th consecutive day, with public transport remaining off roads. The attendance recorded in government offices and banks was also affected today due to the fresh restrictions.
Kashmir has been on the edge ever since the scrapping of the special status that had been given to Jammu and Kashmir and the division of the state into two union territories. While the business activity remained shut, the near-complete communication blockade continued to badly hit the normal life.

No Internet, 3 online bids cancelled

The ongoing Internet shutdown has affected the working of the state government as the administration ordered cancellation of three more online bids due to lack of response.
The online bids were cancelled by the state government’s Town Drainage Division, the Department of Hospital Engineering and by the Executive Engineer, Mechanical, SKIMS Hospital.
In a public notification, the Town Drainage Division said it cancelled an e-tender as it could not be uploaded on the website “due to non-availability of Internet service”.
In another notification issued by the office of the Executive Engineer, Mechanical, the online tender seeking to provide medical gas facility to the operation theatre of Vet Lab at SKIMS Hospital has been cancelled. It said the bid was cancelled due to “poor response”.
In a third such public notification within a day, the state government’s Department of Hospital Engineering said it has cancelled an online tender for augmentation of 630 KVA transformer by 1 MVA transformer with 800 KVA servo stabiliser and other allied works at SKIMS Medical College & Hospital, Bemina.
The cancellation of the online bids has come in the wake of the ongoing Internet clampdown in the state which came into effect on midnight of August 4, hours ahead of the abrogation of Article 370.
The clampdown on the Internet services is having a crippling impact on private businesses. In addition to the Internet services, mobile phone services also remain suspended in the region.

Kharif sowing hit by rain deficit in Jammu

JAMMU, SEPTEMBER 27
The sown area under kharif crops has come down by nearly 15 per cent this year due to the deficit in rainfall in the Jammu province, comprising 10 districts.
Although the authorities are busy in compiling the exact report about the areas where crops have been damaged due to less rainfall, initial data has indicated that 15 to 20 per cent of the kharif crops were affected.
“It is a dangerous indication as not only a huge chunk of the cultivated area in the Kandi belts remained unsown, the paddy crop area in the plains has also shrunk by nearly 15 per cent due to the deficit,” Dr Vivek Arya, senior scientist at the Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences (SKUAS) and an expert in climate change told The Tribune.
The main kharif crops of the Jammu region are paddy, maize, pulses, vegetables and fodder, covering 78 per cent of the net sown area (NSA). As per an official document, maize is grown in 3.19 lakh hectares, followed by paddy in 2.58 lakh hectares and pulses in 0.30 lakh hectares.
Pulses are mostly grown in the Kandi belts of Jammu,

Samba, Kathua, Reasi, Udhampur, Rajouri and Poonch. As far as paddy is concerned, it is sown mainly in plains.
“Sixty to 65 per cent of the agricultural area in the Jammu province is rain-fed due to the non-availability of assured irrigation,” Arya pointed out, adding, “keeping in view the continuous rain deficit during the past five years, coping up with this situation is a big challenge before the authorities”.
Dr Mohinder Singh, scientist at the SKUAST, said rainfall was sufficient at the time of sowing, but there was deficit during the potential growth period of kharif crops. “Rain deficit at the time of growth period has affected the paddy crop,” he said.

All roads leading to Anchar shrine blocked

“The security forces have closed the area and forced everyone to stay in,” said another local.
He said: “Only those people must have offered the prayers at the shrine who live near it,” he said.
Security personnel deployed along the Soura road said the entry to the shrine was not allowed. “You can come in the evening,” said a security man.
People moving on two-wheelers or cars were

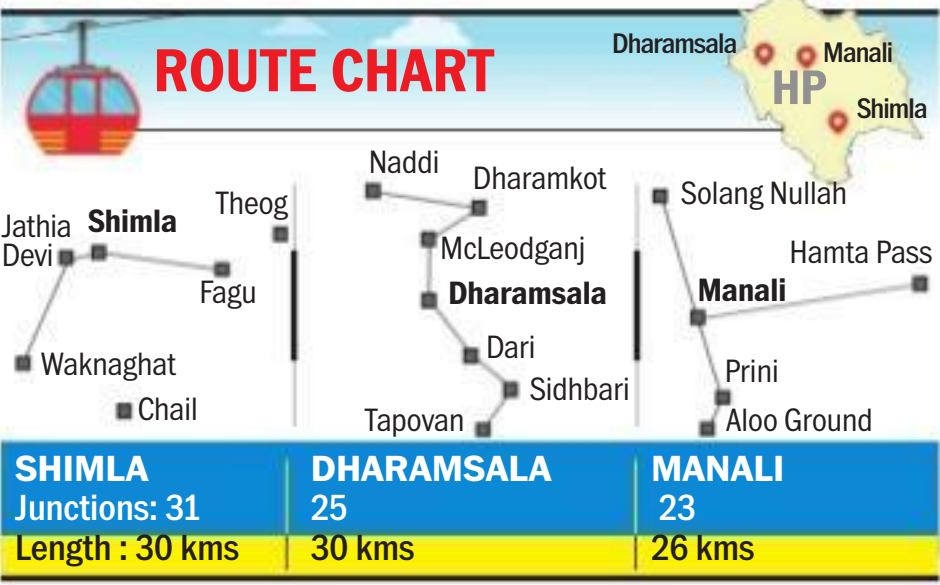
warned to go back. A group of security personnel standing at the mouth of a side road blew whistles and gestured with their hands to ask motorists to go back. A few youths, who were loitering in a bylane, were also warned to go inside. Most major mosques, including Jamia Masjid, remain closed for people since August 5. Govt proposes ropeways for Shimla, Manali, Dharamsala

Cost pegged at ₹2,800 cr | Experts preparing report for Shimla

SHIMLA, SEPTEMBER 27
With traffic congestion coming in the way of tourism promotion, the state government has proposed to set up ropeways in three main tourist towns — Shimla, Manali and Dharamsala — as part of its Urban Mobility Plan. The cost of the projects has been pegged at Rs 2,800 crore.
The ball has been set rolling for the setting up of the ropeway in the state capital as experts from Czechoslovakia are engaged in the preparation of a technical report.
Shortly, a drone survey of the entire track will be undertaken in Shimla and its suburbs. The ropeway will connect all major junctions, including the Core Area, Wagnaghat, Jathia Devi, Fagu and later it could be extended up to Theog and Chail.
“We have engaged WAPCOS to prepare DPRs for all three towns and the project has been sent for approval to the



Finance Department so that it can be posed for bilateral funding,” said Jagdish Sharma, Principal Secretary, Transport. He added that the project could have been undertaken under the PPP mode, but then the tariff for commuters would work out to be high.
WASCOM had examined the feasibility of various modes of transport, including sky buses, elevated pods and monorails, but ropeways were found to be the most suited, besides factors like low cost, less land acquisition and better linkages.

The ropeway project will have 31 junctions and have a span of 30 kilometres, while crisscrossing across the town, which has all-the-year-round tourist arrival. Besides, the peak tourist season in summer and around Christmas and New Year, there is a major surge in tourist influx every weekend, leading to parking woes.
Similarly, the ropeway in Manali will have a total of 23 stations, right from Aloo Ground, Prini, Mall Road and up to the Solang Nullah with a total length of 26 kilometres.

ties. The ropeway will prove to be a boon for tourists wanting to visit Rohtang as there are NGT restrictions on the movement of vehicles and permits are mandatory. “We plan to connect several new destinations like the Hamta Pass to decongest Manali and Rohtang,” said Sharma.
In case of Dharamsala, the ropeway will be 30-km long. Twenty-five stations right from Sidhbhari, Tapovan, Dari, Chamunda, McLeodganj, Naddi and Dharamkot.
Even though this is an ambitious project that the Transport Department has embarked upon, the ropeway projects envisaged by the department in the past have failed to take off despite inviting bids from investors several times. Despite giving concessions and making amendments to the rules, not much interest has been shown by investors in aerial projects like Tobanaina Devi besides others.

IIT Roorkee team inspects Shimla’s sinking Ridge, asks for soil samples

Experts from IIT Roorkee today inspected the sinking Ridge so that stabilisation measures could be taken based on extensive geological strata studies.
A team of experts headed by Dr Mahender Singh, Professor in Geo Technical Engineering from the Department of Civil Engineering, IIT Roorkee, visited the Ridge.
“The experts inspected the Ridge and have asked for cross section and soil samples so that a stabilisation plan can be prepared,” said Pankaj Rai, Commissioner Shimla Municipal Corporation (SMC). Later, Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur had a meeting with experts of IIT Roorkee. He said the stabilisation of the Ridge would not only help in its beautification but also provide appropriate place for erection of statue of former Prime Minister Bharat Ratna Atal Bihari Vajpayee.
Rai said the geological wing of the Industries Department had already given a report where it had been stated that

Bail plea of ex-DGP’s son rejected in forgery case

The Himachal Pradesh High Court today rejected the anticipatory bail petition filed by Amil Manhas, a son of former Director General of police DS Manhas, in a forgery case. During the course of hearing Amil Manhas was not present before the court.
An FIR was registered with the Una Vigilance Bureau on September 5 under sections 420, 465, 467, 471 read with Section 34 of the IPC and Section 61 of the IT Act.
The police have also lodged an FIR under the aforesaid sections of the IPC against Amil’s wife Harpriya Minhas in the matter related to the evasion of excise duty by submitting forged documents to the department. However, the court has deferred the hearing on the bail application of Harpriya for October 4.
The counsel for Harpriya stated that on account of unavoidable circumstances, she has not been able to be present today and as such the matter be adjourned.
The Una Excise and Taxation Department on September 5 registered a criminal case against two liquor contractors, including Harpriya, in the matter related to the evasion of excise duty by submitting forged documents to the department. The complaint has been lodged with the Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Department. She had been issued licences for sale of liquor at five vends in the district for the year 2018-19 and the same licences were continued for the current financial year.

23 cars vandalised in Kangra's Kachiari

Kangra: Unidentified persons damaged 23 vehicles at a private automobile showroom in Kachiari on Thursday night. remained an MLA from Dharamsala in 2003. Thereafter, she moved to Jodhpur, her paternal area, and contested the Lok Sabha polls.
Chandresh Kumari, when contacted by The Tribune, however, categorically denied that any of her family members were interested in contesting the elections.
Some sections of the Congress have proposed that Raghuveer Singh Bali, son of former Congress minister GS Bali, should be considered. GS Bali and his son were out

of the country and could not be contacted for comment. The sources here said that the party is likely to take a decision on the candidate for the forthcoming bypolls by Sunday due to conditions created by the sudden exit of Sudhir Sharma.
The sources here said that the Congress might have to put forward a greenhorn as at the last moment the party was not in a position to persuade a senior and established leader to contest the byelections.

Punjab to set up Centre of Excellence for floriculture

Move to play vital role in motivating farmers to diversify

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 27 Come March next year, farmers in Punjab growing flowers or those intending to diversify will have an access to Dutch technologies pertaining to floriculture. To build capacity among farming community while leveraging technology and innovation, the state government in collaboration with Dutch government is coming up with a Centre of Excellence (CoE) for floriculture at Doraha in Ludhiana.

This CoE has already been approved and sanctioned under National Horticulture Mission in the last fiscal year. The Centre would be established over an area of 7.5 acres with a total project cost of around Rs 8 crore. The project cost will be shared between the Centre and state in the 60:40 ratio. This will be the fourth CoE in the state. Currently, the state has CoE for vegetables (at Kartarpur), fruits (at Hoshiarpur) and Potato (at Jalandhar).

The proposed facility will standardise and demonstrate the world class floriculture technology to farmers. At present, around 1,700 hectares in the state are under floriculture. The major flower producing areas in Punjab are Ludhiana, Patiala, Kapurthala, Fatehgarh Sahib and Sangrur.

The state government is of the view that the pro-

posed centre will go a long way in assisting farmers in diversifying.

“The CoE is likely to be operational by March next year. For setting up infrastructure such as polyhouse and cold chain facility, the tender has already been floated. The centre will focus on low volume and high-value flowers so that the farmers’ income grows by 2-3 times after diversifying into floriculture,” said Gulab Singh Gill, Joint Director, Horticulture, Punjab.

He said the centre would serve the purpose of quality planting material in the form of seedlings of flowers and other ornamentals.

Besides other infrastruc-

tured nursery with automated irrigation system. According to people familiar with the project, quality planting material will be produced to meet demands of the farmers. In addition to this, there would be hi-tech polyhouse having Dutch technologies with automated climate control, irrigation and fertigation system.

The production technologies of four crops, namely, rose, gerbera, chrysanthemum and carnation will be standardised in this structure in a controlled atmosphere.

Apart from Dutch polyhouse, naturally ventilated polyhouse, shade net house, net house and walk-in-tunnels will be established for

demonstration of filler crops, cut greens and potted plants.

The centre will also have post-harvest management facilities. Further, to standardise temperature and humidity level required to increase the shelf life of different flowers, a pack house having pre-cooling room and cold room with a capacity of 2.5 MT and 5 MT will be set up.

Besides Punjab, Haryana also has a Centre of Excellence for vegetables in Karnal and for fruits in Sirsa under Indo-Israel project. In Haryana, proper implementation and adaptation of Israeli technologies have benefitted thousands of farmers in the state, resulting in rise in their incomes.

Govt’s capex on track: FM

Says dues of most MSMEs cleared; will push infra spending

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman today said the ministries have cleared most of the dues of goods and services to suppliers, mostly MSMEs, and the remaining payments will be done in the next few days.

The minister also said the ministries have been asked to provide detailed capital expenditure plans for the next four quarters as the government looks to boost growth with spending push.

After meeting infrastructure ministries, Expenditure Secretary GC Murmu, who was also present at the press conference, said out the total outstanding dues of about Rs 60,000 crore, Rs 40,000 crore has been cleared.

And the remaining amount, which is not involved in litigation, will be cleared by the first week of October, he said. This meeting assumed significance amid concerns raised by micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs)

that their payments were not being cleared by the different wings of the government within time.

“Government should not sit on overdue payments,” Sitharaman said, adding the money should go to people who have been waiting for it.

The money should reach the ground, she added.

The secretary further said

most infrastructure ministries have reached 50% of their capex target for the current fiscal. Sitharaman also said the government’s capital expenditure was on track and Budget estimates would be met.

The consumption was on rise and credit offtake was growing, which together should result in “bouyancy”

in the economy, she added. To a query on the fiscal discipline with rebate in corporate tax and expenditure, the minister said the government will reconcile fiscal deficit numbers later.

The Finance Minister will meet heads of public sector enterprises on Saturday to review capital expenditure plans. — PTI

Oil imports from US jump 72%

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27

India's crude oil imports from the US have jumped by over 72% in the first five months of the current fiscal as the country looks to diversify oil purchases beyond its traditional suppliers in the Middle-East, official data showed.

According to data sourced from the Directorate General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics, the US supplied about 4.5 million tonnes of crude oil during April to August 2019 as compared to 2.6 million tonnes oil sourced from that country in the same period a year ago.

Govt liabilities rise to ₹88.18 lakh crore in Q1

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27

Total liabilities of the government increased to Rs 88.18 lakh crore at end-June 2019 from Rs 84.68 lakh crore at end-March 2019, according to the latest data on public debt.

Public debt accounted for 89.4% of total outstanding liabilities at end-June 2019, the quarterly report on public debt management released on Friday said.

“Nearly 28.9% of the outstanding dated securities had a residual maturity of less than 5 years. The holding pattern indicates a share of 40.3% for commercial banks and 24.3% for insurance companies at end-March 2019,” it said.

During the first quarter of

the current fiscal, the Central government issued dated securities worth Rs 2,21,000 crore as against Rs 1,44,000 crore in the same period a year ago.

The weighted average maturity of new issuances stood at 15.86 years in the quarter as against 14.18 years in the fourth quarter of the last fiscal, according to data collated by Public Debt Management Cell.

G-Sec yields have shown a moderating trend in the first quarter of the fiscal with the rate declining to 7.21% compared to the weighted average yield of 7.47% in the previous quarter. — PTI

Multan Judge Imran Shafi announced the verdict in the case in the presence of all suspects and parents of Baloch. While the court awarded life imprisonment to Wasim, it acquitted six other suspects including Baloch's another brother Aslam Shaveen, her cousin Haq Nawaz and cleric Abdul Qavi. A total of 35 witnesses recorded their statements. Wasim will be sent to Central Jail in Multan. — PTI

Kashmir is a test for UN, says Imran

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27 Pakistan PM Imran Khan today said the situation in Kashmir was a test for the UN and demanded the lifting of curfew and granting its people the self-determination right. Speaking at the UN General Assembly shortly after PM Modi spoke, he blamed arrogance for PM Modi's clampdown in Kashmir which he said had not been thought through. "There will be a bloodbath when the curfew is lifted and people come out to face the nine lakh troops? What do you think they will do after being boxed in like animals?"

Tracing the crackdown to the RSS ideology, Khan said there was now no option left for India after humiliating its people. "Whatever happens there (after the curfew is lifted) Pakistan will be blamed. They might come and bomb us again," he said, warning that such a situation would bring two nuclear armed rivals face to face.

"Before we move in that direction, the UN has a responsibility. This is why the UN came into being. You were supposed to stop this happening. I feel we are back to 1939 when Czech was annexed. Are you going to appease a market of 1.3 billion or stand up for justice and humanity?" the Pakistan PM asked. Unlike PM Modi's speech, which was heard in rapt silence, Khan gathered applause on six occasions and once cries of "shame, shame" when he referred to the crackdown in Kashmir. He warned that the effects of radicalisation due to "ill-treatment" of Kashmiris would travel to India's hinterland. — TNS

Whistleblower on Trump's Ukraine links is CIA officer

House Speaker Pelosi accuses US Attorney General of going 'rogue'

WASHINGTON, SEPTEMBER 27 A whistleblower whose complaint accuses US President Donald Trump of trying to induce the Ukrainian government to take actions against former Vice President Joe Biden, is a CIA officer, media reports said on Friday. The unnamed Central Intelligence Officer once worked at the White House, the BBC quoted several US media outlets as saying. A lawyer for the whistleblower warned that trying to identify the officer could place them "in harm's way".

This development comes after the complaint, which refers to a controversial phone call between Trump and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky on July 25, where the American leader pushes his counterpart to investigate corruption claims involving Joe Biden's son Hunter, was released by the US House of Representatives Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence on Thursday.

"In the course of my official duties, I have received information from multiple US government officials that the President of the US is using the power of his office to solicit interference from a foreign country in the 2020 US election," the whistleblower wrote. "This interference includes, among other things, pressuring a foreign country to investigate one of the President's main domestic political rivals," he said, describing

BBC rules against Indian-origin anchor's remark

LONDON, SEPTEMBER 27 The BBC has upheld a complaint against its flagship news show presenter, Naga Munchetty, for an apparent breach of the broadcaster's strict impartiality guidelines after she criticised comments made by US President Donald Trump on air.

Munchetty, born Subha Nagalakshmi Munchetty-Chendriah to an Indian mother and Mauritian father, hosts the regular "BBC Breakfast" show

and back in July she reacted to Trump's "go back" comments in reference to four female American politicians. In July, Trump made racist comments apparently against Congresswomen Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, Ilhan Omar, Rashida Tlaib and Ayanna Pressley.

In a tweet, he said they should "go back and help fix the totally broken and crime infested places from which they came." "Every time I have been told, as a woman of colour, to go back to where I came from, that was embedded in racism," the journalist said in a discussion with her co-host while reporting on the story. "Now, I'm not accusing anyone of anything here, but you know what certain phrases mean," she said. — PTI

Azhar makes a comeback as HCA president

HYDERABAD, SEPTEMBER 27
Former India captain Mohammad Azharuddin has been elected the president of the Hyderabad Cricket Association (HCA), marking a remarkable return into the cricket fold of the man who was once indicted and banned for match-fixing. Azharuddin got 173 votes, 100 more than his opponent, Prakash Chand Jain, who polled 73 votes. Two years ago, Azharuddin's nomination was rejected on technical grounds. "If there is progress in cricket, there will be progress in association. If association is healthy, every person will be happy. The association had not been healthy for the last three years. Now, it is all clear and we will move ahead," Azharuddin said. Azharuddin, a former Congress MP

from Moradabad in Uttar Pradesh, was last year appointed the Congress working president in Telangana, where the Telangana Rashtra Samithi is in power. According to observers, today's cricket body elections were not influenced by the political scenario in the state, where the Congress has only 19 seats in the Legislative Assembly. Azharuddin praised VS Sampath, the former Chief Election Commissioner of India, who oversaw the HCA elections. "When election is fair, my nomination could not have been rejected (two years ago), but (now) fair election happened. Sampath sir followed clear-cut rules and regulations. That's why a proper election happened," Azharuddin said. "No problem occurred in the election."

Comeback man
Azharuddin played the last of his 99 Tests in 2000, when he implicated in the match-fixing scandal that shook Indian cricket. A Central Bureau of Investigation report had stated: "The evidence against Azharuddin... clearly establishes the fact that he took money from bookies/punters to fix cricket matches and also the fact that the 'underworld' had approached him to fix matches for them." Azharuddin was handed a life ban after an investigation, but in 2012, the Andhra High Court struck down the ban, ruling that the investigation against him was not conducted properly. His nomination papers for the HCA president's post were rejected two years ago on the ground that Azharuddin could not produce evi-

dence that BCCI had lifted the life ban on him. As the top representative of HCA,

Azharuddin will now become relevant as the N Srinivasan camp and its rivals fight for power in BCCI.

Ganguly back at helm
Former India captain Sourav Ganguly has been re-elected president of the Cricket Association of Bengal. He will continue in the post until July 2020, when he completes six years as an office-bearer. Pranav Amin, son of industrialist and former BCCI treasurer Chirayu Amin, was elected as president of the Baroda Cricket Association. Ajit Lele, son of Jayvant Lele, former secretary of the BCCI, was elected as the secretary of the association. The Mumbai Cricket Association announced October 4 as the date for its polls to elect the office-bearers. — TNS, Agencies

Arun Dhumal takes over HPCA, vows development

Arun Dhumal, brother of Union Minister of State for Finance and Corporate Affairs Anurag Thakur, was elected president of the Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association (HPCA) unopposed during its Annual General Meeting (AGM) here today. After being formally elected as the HPCA president, Dhumal said he would carry forward the good work done by his brother Anurag Thakur for cricket in the state. Asked how he managed to get elected unanimously for the post, Arun Dhumal said, "All the members decided that they should elect a body collectively rather than holding elections. The new office-

bearers have been elected with the consent of all the members of the cricket body." Una district's Sumit Sharma is the new secretary of HPCA as there was no opposition against the Dhumal-led panel. Regarding the controversies around the state cricket body, Dhumal said that when constructive work is undertaken, there is criticism also. When asked if his elevation to the post of president would raise controversy, he said, "I have been elected as the president for a period of three years by the members. As per the new rules, I can be the HPCA president for a period of three years. I would like that people judge me for my work rather than my legacy," he said.

Something big coming

High Performance Director Nieva wants to secure at least 5 Oly spots in Asian qualifiers

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27
Indian boxers are headed in the right direction and will do something big at the Tokyo Olympics, reckons High Performance Director Santiago Nieva, who wants his wards to emerge as outright winners and secure at least five Olympics spots during the Asian qualifiers. The Indian boxers produced their best-ever show at the World Championships, with Amit Panghal (52kg) and Manish Kaushik (63kg) winning silver and bronze, respectively, in Russia. Before this, the country had never won more than one bronze in a single edition of the showpiece event.

Target Tokyo
If the World Championships had been an Olympics qualifier, India would have had four boxers qualified. "Every tournament we go, we always compare the results to what could have happened if it were the Olympics. Are we on the right track? So far, we have shown in every single competition that we are doing well," Nieva said. "In Olympics, there are no guarantees but we are in the right direction and we are confident we will do something big in the Olympics." Indian boxers will now train their eyes on the Asian-Oceania qualifiers, scheduled to be held in Wuhan, China, from February 3 to 14. In the men's qualifiers, Olympics spots will be up for grabs in eight weight classes — flyweight (52kg), featherweight (57kg), lightweight (63kg),

welterweight (69kg), middleweight (75kg), light heavyweight (81kg), heavyweight (91kg) and super heavyweight (+91kg). "We want all the eight to qualify but realistically 5 to 6 boxers should qualify for the Olympics," Nieva said. "In the lower weights, there are World Championships medallists and Olympics medallists, so we can't sleep. We have to ensure that we beat them by enough margins so that there is no doubt in the judges' minds and that is our challenge."

What next
So what would be the schedule for Indian boxing in the upcoming months?

"Next we have two competitions. First is the World Military Games in October and then there is the Indian Boxing League in December," Nieva said. "It is good that there is competition but we have to be careful that we don't overload them with competitions."

Then, we have the trials, where except for Amit and Manish, rest have to go through the trials. Also, some boxers will go for the Olympics Test events in Tokyo late October. In January, we will invite foreign teams for training. We'll make sure that 5 to 6 teams

Deepak comes of age, crowned world No. 1; Vinesh No. 2

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27
World Championships silver medallist wrestler Deepak Punia has jumped to world No. 1 position in the 86kg category but Bajrang Punia lost the top spot in the 65kg category in the latest rankings issued by the United World Wrestling (UWW), the sport's international governing. Competing in his maiden senior World Championships in Nur-Sultan, Punia settled for silver after an ankle injury forced him to pull out of the final against Iranian great Hasan Yazdani. The 20-year-old Jhajar lad now has 82 points, four more than world champion Yazdani. This year, Punia had won silver at the Yasar Dogu tournament and bronze at the Asian Championships and Sassari tournaments. He has been rewarded for his consistent show. However, Bajrang, who went into the World Championships as the world No. 1, dropped to No. 2 spot after managing to win only a bronze. The 25-year-old now has 63 points while Russia's Gadzhimurad Rashidov, who won gold at the Nur-Sultan meet, is the new world No. 1 in the 65kg category. In the 57kg category, World Championships bronze medallist Ravi Dahiya has entered the top-five bracket. He is ranked No. 5 with 39 points while Rahul Aware's bronze has pushed him to world No. 2. Meanwhile, in the women's rankings, Vinesh Phogat, who also won bronze in Nur-Sultan along with the Tokyo Olympics quota, has jumped

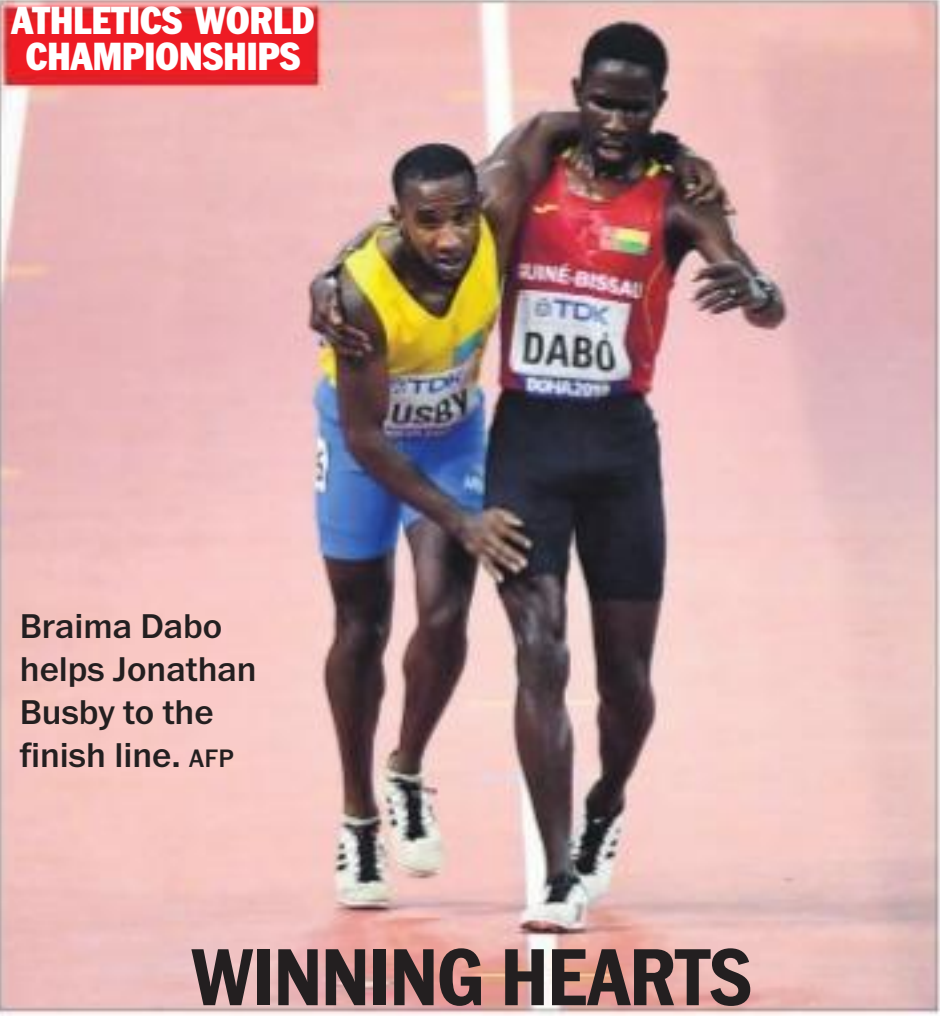
Qualifies for semis in 400m hurdles; Long jumper Sreeshankar finishes 22nd

It was the first time since 2003 that world record holder Usain Bolt was not settling into the starting blocks at the championships and his absence could be felt by a lack of excitement in the chilled air.

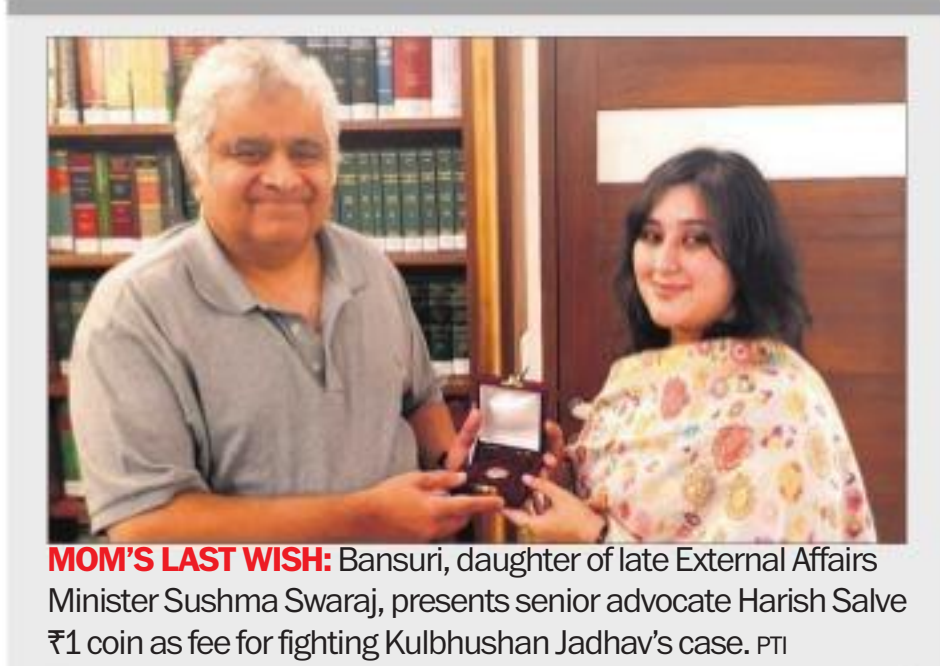

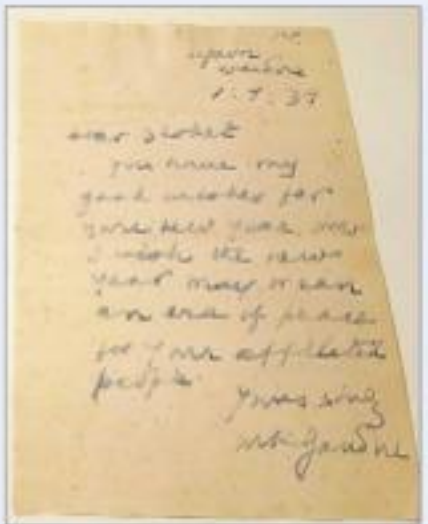

Israel unveils Gandhi's 1939 letter wishing Jews peace

JERUSALEM, SEPTEMBER 27 A short handwritten letter by Mahatma Gandhi 80 years ago on the same day the World War II broke out, wishing the "afflicted (Jewish) people" an "era of peace", has been unveiled for the first time by the National Library of Israel. Gandhi wrote the letter to Head of the Bombay Zionist Association (BZA) AE Shohet, who was trying to enlist support of Indian leaders in favour of the movement to establish a national home for the Jewish people. Written on the occasion of Rosh Hashana (Jewish new year) on Sept 1, 1939, the letter also marked beginning of WW-II when Germany invaded Poland, setting stage for despicable atrocities of the Holocaust. "The timing of the greeting reflects the extent to which Nazi persecution of Jews was of concern to global citizenry at the time. In hindsight, it also presents a chilling por-

tent of the horrors to come," said Zach Rothbart, incharge of communications at National Library of Israel (NLI). Gandhi's greetings came to light as part of a major initiative launched by the NLI, with support from the Leir

Vikram had hard-landing: NASA

CHANDRAYAAN-2 US space agency shares images of landing site near the south pole

WASHINGTON, SEPTEMBER 27 Vikram had a "hard-landing", NASA said on Friday as it released high-resolution images captured by its reconnaissance orbiter of the moon's uncharted south pole where the Chandrayaan-2 lander attempted to soft-land during the ambitious mission three weeks ago.

The module had attempted a soft-landing on a small patch of lunar highland smooth plains between Simpelius N and Manzinus C craters before losing communication with ISRO on September 7. The site was about 600 km from the south pole in a relatively ancient terrain, according to the US space agency.

"Vikram had a hard-landing and the precise location of the spacecraft in the lunar highlands has yet to be determined," the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) said. "The scene was captured from a Lunar Reconnaissance



Orbiter Camera (LROC) Quickmap fly-around of the targeted landing site image width is about 150 km across the centre."

John Keller, Deputy Project Scientist Lunar Reconnaissance Orbiter Mission, Goddard Space Flight Centre, told PTI via email that LRO would next fly over the landing site on October 14 when

"lighting conditions will be more favourable".

Vikram was scheduled to touch down on September 7. This event was India's first attempt to soft-land on the Moon and could have propelled it into a select club of countries to have landed on the lunar surface.

km above the touchdown site, the possibility of establishing contact with the lander had a deadline of September 21, because after that the region entered into a lunar night. ISRO had said the mission life of the Vikram lander and the Pragyan rover it carried will be one lunar day, which is equal to 14 Earth days. The lunar nights can be

very cold, especially in the south polar region where Vikram is lying. Temperatures could drop to as low as minus 200 degrees Celsius during the lunar night. The instruments aboard the lander are not designed to withstand that kind of temperature. The electronics would not work in absence of solar energy and would get permanently damaged.

The NASA orbiter passed over the Vikram landing site on September 17 and acquired a set of high-resolution images of the area; so far the LROC team has not been able to locate or image the lander. "It was dusk when the landing area was imaged and thus large shadows covered much of the terrain; it is possible that the Vikram lander is hiding in a shadow. The lighting will be favourable when LRO passes over the site in October and once again attempts to locate and image the lander," NASA said. — PTI

Case 'delayed,' litigant seals judge chamber

PALGHAR (MAHA), SEPTEMBER 27 An unidentified person locked the judge's chamber at a court in Maharashtra's Palghar district, claiming he was doing so because he was being made to run from pillar to post to get justice.

The incident took place during lunch recess at a court in Vasai town on Wednesday, the police said. Between 2 and 2.30 pm, when magistrate SB Pawar and the court staff had stepped out for lunch, an unidentified person put a lock on the door of the judge's chamber from outside, said a police spokesperson.

The culprit had pasted a piece of paper on the lock, on which was written, "Salman Khan convicted for five years by sessions court Mumbai. Got bail from high court within three hours and I am wandering door to door for justice. I am a tax payer. I pay tax so the honourable judges get salary. And if I am denied for justice, have the right to seal. Court sealed by order of Dr Fayaz Khan." — PTI

Chopper crash raises doubt over ageing fleet

NEW DELHI, SEPTEMBER 27 The death of two pilots, including one from the Indian Army, in a Cheetah helicopter crash in Bhutan, has raised questions about the slow process to induct new choppers in the forces.

Lt Col Rajneesh Parmar of the Army's Aviation Corps and Capt Kalzang Wangdi of the Royal Bhutanese Army were killed when the helicopter they were flying in crashed. The Indian Army undertakes training of Bhutanese pilots and Lt Col Parmar was part of the Indian Army Training Team. The crash raises serious questions as

the single-engine Cheetah copter is based on the 1950s-designed Alouette Aérospatiale 315B Lama of France. The Cheetah falls in the Light Utility Helicopter (LUH) category. A total 187 LUH are to be produced by the public sector giant Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) as per the existing plan. The Army will procure 126 copters and the IAF 61 from the HAL. Overall in the light utility category, the three armed forces need 495 copters to replace the aging Cheetah fleet. The Army and IAF need 384 of them with 259 for the Army and 125 for IAF — TNS

75% take to alcohol before age 21

MUMBAI, SEPTEMBER 27 As many as 75 per cent youngsters in the country, covered under a multi-city survey, revealed that they consumed alcoholic drinks before turning 21, the legal age for drinking.

The survey was recently conducted by the first-year students of St Xavier's College located in south Mumbai. The findings were presented to Bhmesh Agarwal, ACP, Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), on Thursday.

As many as 1,000 youths aged 16 to 21 years from cities, including Mumbai, Pune, Delhi and Kolkata, were surveyed. It also covered youth from Prague, capital of Czech Republic, and Hungary (in Central Europe).

The exercise revealed 47 per cent had tried cigarettes. The findings were presented to Bhmesh Agarwal, ACP, Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), on Thursday. As many as 1,000 youths aged 16 to 21 years from cities, including Mumbai, Pune, Delhi and Kolkata, were surveyed. It also covered youth from Prague, capital of Czech Republic, and Hungary (in Central Europe). The exercise revealed 47 per cent had tried cigarettes.

It also says that 20 per cent had tried drugs, while 30 per cent smoked a hookah. Almost 88 per cent youth tried some or the other addiction between 16 and 18 years of age, the report said.

Curiosity, peer pressure and easy accessibility to intoxicating substances are some of the prominent factors that drive the youth towards these addictions, it said. — PTI

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
