





### Violence will Hit Trade, **Locals: Security Forces**

Say Kashmiris should focus on economic activity as season of walnut, saffron and cashew approaches

New Delhi: Security forces assess that large-scale protests and violence in Jammu and Kashmir will be detrimental to the growing economic activ ity there and believe that improving ity there and believe that improving trade, like hundreds of trucks laden with apples daily moving out of Kashmit, is a positive sign.

Alarge number of trucks laden with apples and dry fruits are moving out of J&K to the rest of India every day for the past formatch. Officials ox.

for the past fortnight. Officials ex plained that trucks arrive in Srinagar, where apples are loaded on to them. and then they move out via Jammu and Leh. The J&K administration has planned to rope in about 1,200 trucks from September 15 when the apple season will be at its peak. Hectic ac-tivities are on in the orchards for pick-Union home minister Amit Shah, who assured them of all possible help, said an official.

officials added.
Even the season for walnuts, cashews and saffron will start soon, furthering the economic activity in J&K.
These products will also be sent to rest of the country. "Violence can happen if the locals want it, but it will be controlled. However, violence at this junc ture is detrimental to Kashmiris, be cause apples and walnuts are coming out," said an official.

### K'TAKA BUREAUCRAT SAYS HIS IDEAS DON'T ALIGN WITH GOVT'S FUNCTIONING Another IAS Officer Resigns on Ethical Grounds

Bengaluru: S Sasikanth Senthil, an Bengaturu: S sasikanto sentili, an Indian Administrative Service officer belonging to Karnataka cadre re-signed on Friday, stating that it would be "unethical" for him to continue in the government service. He is the second civil servant to quit the service in

a fortnight's time. Senthil, 40, was serving as the deputy commissioner of Dakshina Kannada district. In a written statement issued soon after his resignation, Senthil said he took the decision as he felt it was unethical for him to continue in the government "when the fundamental building blocks of our diverse democracy are being compromised in an unprecedented manner."

Senthil, is an engineering graduate from Tamil Nadu and he had joined the service in 2009. Speaking to ET, Senthil said that his resignation had got noth-ing to do with the state government, but was in response to the developments taking place in the country. "My ideology does not align with the func tioning of the union government. I am upset about a whole lot of issues including polarisation in the name of reliresignation for quite some time now.



Officials said the variance was because the data comp the variance was because the data compi-led by the ministry was drawn from the Health Management Information Sy-stem, updated by Anganwadi and Asha workers, which largely considers home deliveries and births in government institutions only. It lacks information from

New Delhi: Hospitality chain Oyo refuted seew Deill: Hospitality chain Oyo refuted the allegations made in a police complaint filed by a Bengaluru hotelier against its fo-under Ritesh Agarwal and a few top execu-tives, calling those "false claims" and the case an "exaggeration" of a regular com-mercial dispute.

In his complaint to the Bengaluru Police, Natarajan VRS accused Agarwal and his colleagues of continuous criminal acts of colleagues of continuous criminal acts of fraud, cheating and misappropriation of 80% of the revenue share due to his hotel from June 2017 until August 2019. Other ex-ecutives named are Oyo chief operating of-ficer Abhinav Sinha, chief financial officer Abhishek Gupta, president of corpora-te affairs Siddhartha Dasgupta and two Bengaluru-based employees

The hotelier accused them of cheating him of more than ₹1.5 crore, and sought im

him of more than it. Scrore, and sought immediate, appropriate and necessary criminal action against them.

Oyo indulged in a wilful act of money laundering by falsely showing rooms for which bookings have been cancelled as occupied, he alleged in the complaint, a copy of which ET has seen.

"Our lawyers are looking into the matter and will be taking strong legal action as these claims are incorrect and defamatory in nature," a spokesperson for SoftBankbacked Oyosaid. "We respect the law of the land and believe it will do the right justice."

Meanwhile, industry body Federation of Hotel & Restaurant Associations of India (FHRAD) said protests and complaints against Oyo were emerging across the country.

inst Oyo were emerging across the country. We are advising members to terminate contracts and to approach police stations for cases of cheating and fraud," FHRAI jo int secretary Pradeep Shetty said.

"Therefore, in-directly they have admitted their liability directly, they have admitted their liability of payment of our claims of dues," his complaint stated.

Mumbai: A year after the non-banking finance companies, NBFCs, were hit by a credit squeeze, the problems of sector ap-peared to be over, said chief economic advisor Krishnamurthy Subramanian.

"The concerns on NBFCs have arisen but have now bottomed or seem to have bottomed out," Subramanian said while speaking at the 6th State Bank of India Banking & Economics Conclave.
"The NBFC narrative can also be linked to the quality of invest. linked to the quality of invest ment, banks withdrawing and non-banks trying to fill in the spa ce. If the credit expansion hap-pens at a break-neck speed, the

quality may be compromised."

Non-bank lenders have seen huge decline in credit growth and a liquidity crunch since the collapse of IL&FS a year ago. What aggravated the inquinty squeeze or non-bank lenders is the repay-ment concerns about Dewan Ho-using Finance Corp Ltd (DHFL) and the Essel Group, pushing funding costs at NBFCs by at le-set 70 by bloom as company disast 70 bps higher as compared to September last year. Mutual funds, a key lender to them, have frozen lending due to redemption pressures.

Subramanian also said the go Subramanian also said the go-vernment prefers longer-term structural reforms rather than short-term incentives to boost consumption. "The government remains focused on economic growth and is taking all structu ral steps necessary to be able to bring growth back on a high traoring growth back of a nigh tra-jectory," the CEA said. "The con-cerns over slowdown are legiti-mate and the government is sel-zed of the issues, but we should be very careful not to be drawn down by excessive pessimism."

The government has announ-

ced stimulus measures and re-forms, including a merger of sta-te-run banks aimed at strengthening them and bolstering credit

expansion to revive growth. "For countries like ours, investror countries line durfs, invest-ment is the key driver for growth and consumption is the force mul-tiplier," he said. pen in an instant. "Over the last 15 years, if you look at the structural reforms on factor markets it hasn't received much attention. Eventually, productivity is due to better utilisa-tion of land, labour and capital. The emphasis in the next five years will be on growth," he added.

### Merging PSU Banks won't Solve Issue of Governance: Reddv

Former RBI governor says globally half of all bank mergers have not worked out

Mumbai: Former Reserve Bank of India Governor YV Reddy on Friday said merging state-run banks will not solve the issue of governance and it should be based on synergies with boards driving the conso lidation. Reddy also said that global experience has shown that half of all bank mergers

"I won't call it a reform, it's a commercial decision based on synergy Global experience in the banking system shows that only half of the bank mergers have been successful," Reddy told the been successful, "Reddy fold the éth SBI Banking & Economic Conclave. "If the purpose is go-vernance, it will not be solved by merging two banks. However, if it's for economies of scale, name-ly operational efficiency, it could happen. Mergers could be done by the respective boards as well by the respective boards as well by analysing synergies, it need not necessary be through go-vernment."

Commenting of the collapse of the infrastructure financier IL&FS, Reddy said the whole episode reflects the failure of risk-assessment capabilities of risk-assessment capabilities of stakeholders. "The IL&FS pro-blem reflects the risk-assess ment capabilities of large institutions that had exposure to that," Reddy said. "SBI, LIC should examine this point. How did they miss it? It is not a

But, despite the long-pending demand the situation remains the same...

A long-time has elapsed from our initial demand but my impression from the engagement with the government at all and the need for 4G spectrum. The government is working overboard to address it. So, we believe, that very soon 4G spectrum will be allocated. It is also a part of the revival package, which the government has been discussing.

What other steps can the government take to help state-run telcos?

No company can survive on the government's support, and it has to come up to market expectations and strengthen its revenue in a market environment. The 40 spectrum is one of the items, and its cost is another item on which the government is working upon. The staff cost in MTNL and BSNL can be reduced. We all know that BSNL's employee cost is 75% of the reve

nue. The number of persons in the organisation are far higher than the competitors.

One of the proposals under discussion is the VRS. We are looking

forward to 70,000 to 80,000 employees and make it attractive for the employees, so that they can see value in the VRS

#### But, if you reduce people to VRS, how will you run operations?

We will do the outsourcing at that point of time, to maintain the operations, and may also opt for the people on the monthly contract basis, so that the gap can be fulfilled. Still, BSNL has substantial manpower, even if 60,000-70,000 people take

Agriculture minister Narendra Singh Tomar sald there would be no shortfall in production. "There is no threat to crops. We don't expect any

threat to crops. We don't expect any shortfall in food grain production,"

The government expects to meet its food grain production target of 291.1 million tonnes for this year. In 2018-19, output was pegged at 284.95 million tonnes, according to its fourth advanced estimates.

#### PM to Launch **Farmers' Pension** Scheme on Sept 12

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra New Delm: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will launch the farmers' pension scheme Pradhan Mantri Kisan Ma andhan Yojana (PM-KMY) from Ran-chi on September 12 with a subscriber base of more than one million.

Under the scheme, which was announced in the budget for 2019-20, a monthly pension of ₹3,000 will be provided to small and marginal farmers in the age group of 18-40 years on atta ining the age of 60.

"PM will launch this scheme. Earlier, he had launched the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi minimum income support scheme, which gives 76,000 annually to farmers. Like PM Kisan, through which we have reached out to around \$5 million farmers for we expect to

which we have reached out to around 85 million farmers so far, we expect to benefit more and more farmers thro-ugh the pension scheme," said a se-nior agriculture department official, who did not wish to be identified. Registration for the farmers' pen-sion scheme was started on August 9. It offers a guaranteed income to far-mers in their old age. Life Insurance of India (LiC) has been appointed in-surer for this scheme.

"We hope the Centre will enter into dialogues with us before September 24 and we want it to announce a rollback of the FDI decision or to put it in abeyance. In case talks fall, we may go for an indefinite strike." indefinite strike

Coal fuels the bulk of India's po wer generation and the develop ment comes at a time when power demand is growing around 6%. A demand is growing around 6%. A large number of plants require additional coal for keeping up their pace of generation. It is esti-mated that a day's production dis-ruption may lead to losses of Rs 110-130 crore for Coal India

### Delay in Walnut Arrival from J&K Forces Traders to Import More from US, Chile

New Delhi: As the festive season nears, walnut traders are buying more of the dry fruit from the US and Chile to tide over the delay in arrivals from Kashmir valley, who mobile phone services remain

re monie phone services remain affected.
Over 90% of the country's walnut production comes from Kashmir. According to traders, the average price of walnut kernel in the wholesale market of Jammu mandi has increased by 35% in the last one month to ₹900/kg due to the uncer-

monto to sook ag due to the uncer-tainty over arrivals.

Harvest of the dry fruit, which be-gins from end of August, has been delayed by a formight, they said.

This could mean traders may not be able to stock up to meet festive-season demand, which picks un season demand, which picks up with the onset of the Navratras in the last week of September.

"Supply from the valley has been "Supply from the Vaney has been delayed and yet to begin. Further, there is no LoC trade, which has impacted supplies. Hence, to ensure that consumers get supplies, importers have now booked additional or-



ders for walnuts from USA and Chile," said Praveen Gupta, president of Jammu Fruit Association.

Gupta said the situation in Kash-Gupta sant the situation in Kash-mir has pushed up prices of both the domestic and imported varieties. "Since August, prices have been in-creasing gradually and now the cur-rent price for domestic walnut ker-nel is 750/kg, while imported is 200/kg. The new cron is very cook. ₹900/kg. The new crop is very good, but if it doesn't arrive on time, the prices will further increase," he said Higher import duties at 132% for US walnuts and 110% for Chile wal nuts is also being seen as a chal-lenge, said importers who expect orders from the US to be delayed and reach by December. sors, supplies of walnut from Kup-wara and Uri through the road route should have arrived at Jammu mandi by now. However, it has just started trickling in, said Gunjan Ja-in, MD of VKC Nuts, India's largest alnut processor and exporter

However, it's been just 300 kg per day in the first week, he said. A trader in Jammu said that with a civil curfew in place, farmers we-re only able to harvest and load in between 10 pm and 4 m. They are keen to harvest the crop, but have delayed operations due to the cur-rent situation in the valley," said a trader in Jammu's Narwai mandi.



New Delhi: In the biggest order for electric vehicles (EVs) in the country so far, Uttar Pradesh has put out bids to buy 700 electric bu-ses in one go at a cost of Rs 1,065 crore to run them in 15 cities, inclu ding Varanasi, Agra and Lucknow

The order is part of the second The order is part of the second phase of the Centre's FAME (Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Hybridand Electric Vehicles in India) scheme, under which 5,565 air-conditioned electric buses are to be bought across the country.

Uttar Pradesh has added chief minister Yogi Adityanath's hometown Gora spots Mathura-Vrindavan and Shahjahanpur to its list of cities for electric buses, though they did

for electric buses, though they did not feature in the Centre's list. The new electric buses will run to Taj Mahal in Agra, near the ghats in Varanasi and to Gorakh-nath Temple, the new All India In-stitute of Medical Sciences and the almost in Corashburg as nor the airport in Gorakhpur, as per the routes decided by the UP go-vernment. Agra, Kanpur and Lucknow will have 100 of these bu-ses each while Mathura-Vrinda yan, Prayagraj, Varanasi, Ghazia-bad and Meerut will have 50 apie-ce and Aligarh, Bareilly, Jhansi, Moradabad, Gorakhpur and Shahiahanpur will have 25 each.

'In order to kick-start green mobility, the Directorate of Urban Transport, Government of Uttar Pradesh is inviting proposals from interested parties for profrom interested parties for pro-curement, supply, operation and maintenance of electric buses and providing bus services in the identified urban areas of the sta te along with planning, designing, installation, operation and

maintenance of charging in-frastructure," says the UP go-vernment's proposal.
The FAME-II scheme proposes to give a push to EVs in public transport and to encourage their adoption by way of market crea-tion and demand aggregation.

### **Getting States to Release Payments**

Let Finance Commission penalise payment delay

One of the seriously useful measures announced by finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman to counter the economic slowdown was releasing outstanding dues of the government to companies that had done work for it or supplied things for it. For the central government, she said, ₹30,000 crore of dues would be released. She went on to say that central public sector enterprises, too, would release payments to those who have done work for them. But what of state governments and state-level public enterprises? Held-up payments in the states choke the finances of small companies that depend on government orders for the bulk of their business. How can the Centre persuade the states to follow its example and release outstanding payments?

The Centre has been trying to use the Finance Commission to centralise governance, shifting resources and powers from the states to the Centre, such as by getting the states to share the burden of defence spending and recommending transfer of health from the Constitution's



States List to the Concurrent List. Releasing outstanding dues to small and medium enterprises, whose survival depends on receiving these monies, is far nobler a goal to pursue using the Finance Commission than such erosion of federalism. In the interest of sound finance, even without any formal

change in its terms of reference, the Finance Commission can recommend an additional weightage, in the interse distribution of devolved resources among states, for clearing the backlog of payments by state governments. The commission could figure out the precise parameter to be deployed, for example, how many months' worth of average monthly claims on the government remain unpaid, and penalise states for delaying payments.

The Centre could offer short-term credit to the states to enable them to clear their dues, these advances to be adjusted against devolutions in the remainder of the year, so that the Centre's fiscal deficit is not aggravated. The boost in economic activity induced by releasing a host of enterprises from a resource crunch would yield additio-

### NHAI Can, Should Reduce Debt Burden

Reports say that the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) is fast accumulating excessive debt as it grows fast. Union highways minister Nitin Gadkari says NHAI plans to raise long-term finance from banks by securitising user fee receipts from toll plazas. But it surely can do much more, NHAI needs to leverage its locational, 'right of way' vantages to gainfully monetise land value by stepping-up public-private partnership for myriad built spaces to reduce its debt levels.

Otherwise, NHAI debt levels would soon reach ₹2,50,000 cro re, with interest payments almost ₹25,000 crore, even as its toll collections grow barely 6% annually. The Prime Minister's Office has reportedly expressed its concern, and the Comptrol-



ler and Auditor General has had similar reservations too. orests have been all over the news recently as the Brazi-lian Amazon burns and the world reacts. One of the most consequential deci-sions for India's forests will be made soon in a surprising place—the 15th Finance Commission.

Five years ago, at the recommen-dation of the 14th Finance Commisston, India began awarding a share of the central tax revenue to states in proportion to their forest area. When the 15th Finance Commission issues new recommendations on tax revenue distribution next month, it should keen the forest area indicator in uld keep the forest area indicator in the formula and update the year when forest area is measured to acco unt for states' recent forest growth. Doingso would keep India at the van-guard of countries leveraging forests to combat climate chan

resis to combat climate change.
Around 4% of India's GDP is distributed to states each year using the 
tax revenue distribution formula set 
by the 14th Finance Commission in 
2014. The tax-sharing formula inclutee, on Indiators For Forest Ages des an indicator for forest area, alongside indicators for population, poverty and land area.

The motivation for including forest area in the formula was twofold. First. to compensate states for the 'fl scal disability' they incur when they keep forests standing. And, second, to recognise the 'huge ecological be-

nefits' that forests provide. Forest-proportional tax revenue

re than just compensate states for maintaining forests in the past. They potentially offer an incentive to keep them growing into the future. If — and this is a big if —states expect that contemporary forest cover will rema-in part of the formula for many years to come, they will have a financial motivation to plant and protect forests, not just an environmental one.

Even states that currently have little forest area can gain by planting more trees. In August, volunteers in Uttar Pradesh planted more than 200 Uttar Pradesn planted more than 200 million trees in a single day, eclipsing records set by previous tree-planting events in the same state and in Madhya Pradesh. A durable and periodically updated forest area indicator in the tax sharing formula would mean the states they plant trees an and that states that plant trees can find themselves as not just Guinness World Record-holders, but also reve nue for their states' budgets.

#### Favourable Climate

Forest-proportional revenue transfers comprise 7.5% of the total fiscal transfer from the Centre to states, and averaged around \$7.4 billion a year between 2015-16 and 2018-19. The se revenue transfers represent the largest payments for forests between governments anywhere in the world, dwarfing the \$1 billion that Norway paid Brazil for reducing deforesta-tion in the Amazon.

Protecting and restoring forests— alongside increasing the availability of renewable energy—offers an im-portant way to meet the challenge of climate change. Climate change is predicted to cost India more than any other country, despite India ha

any other country, despite India having per-capita emissions of greenhouse gases well below many others. India laid out a multifaceted and far-reaching plan for flighting climate change in 2015 that stated how the country's growing forests pulled more than a billion tonnes of carbon dioxide out of the atmosphere betwe-

en 2005 and 2013. The plan mentioned India's long-term goal of increasing forest cover from 24% to 33% of its land area, and cited forest-proportional revenue transfers as an important initiative for giving afforesta-

tion a 'massive boost'. According to our research ('Are Indian States Increasing Their Forestry Budgets as an Investment in Future Revenue From Ecological Fiscal Transfers<sup>2</sup>, Earth Innovation Institu-te, bit.do/e7EKf), the first three years of forest-proportional revenue trans-fers haven't yet led to an increase in states' forest area. States where forest-proportional transfers comprise a lar-gor share of state myoung haven't reger share of state revenue haven't reforested faster than other states.

Perhaps that's to be expected. Fo rest-protection policies take time to implement, forests take time to grow, and growing forests take time to be detected by satellite images. The 15th Finance Commission should keep forest-proportional revenue transfers in the formula at least until thoy have in the formula at least until they have had a reasonable time to work — clo ser to 10 years.

States also don't seem to be responding to the transfers by inves-ting in forests in order to increase future tax revenues. We found that sta tes where forest-proportional trans fers comprise a larger share of state

revenue haven't vet disproportiona revenue haven't yet disproportiona-tely increased their budgets for fo-restry. We surmise that this is becau-se state government officials don't yet expect that increases in forest co-ver will be rewarded with increases

#### More Green Shoots

The 15th Finance Commission can address states' cautious expectations address states cautious expectations by making the indicator of forest area contemporary — that is, by updating it to a more recent year to reflect recent forest growth. If this means increasing resources for the India State of Forest Report, that's well worth it to have a reliable basis form. worth it to have a reliable basis for re venue transfers. States need to expect that the forest area indicator on which their tax revenue is based will

which their tax revenue is based will endure and be updated, rather than cycle out or remain stuck in the past. By keeping forests in the formula, the 15th Finance Commission can keep India at the forefront of nations floating climate change. fighting climate change



#### **Japan to Put Surname First** for Japanese Names in **English**

Japan will start using the traditional order for Japanese names in English in official documents, with family names first, a switch from the westernised custom the country adopted more than a century ago, government officials said on Friday. The idea has been floated for years and but some ministers in Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's in Prime Minister Shinzo Ades ultra-conservative Cabinet recently started pushing for it again. The Cabinet agreed on Friday to begin making the change with government documents, though no timeline was given for its timeline was given for its start AP

H&M Stops Buying Brazilian Leather over Amazon Fires

Swedish multinational clothing retail company H&M has stopped purchasing leather from Brazil over concerns that the country's cattle industry has contributed to the deforestation of the Amazon rainforest. The announcement of the temporary ban is the second to hit Brazil after a spike in rainforest fires this year drew global outcry, reports mytimes com. Last week, VF Corporation, which includes labels such as Timberland and The North Face, announced a temporary halt on the purchases of Brazilian leather, until its suppliers could prove they were not connected to any environmental harm. H&M's ban on all leather from Brazil will remain "until there are credible assurance systems in place to verify that the leather does not contribute to environmental harm in the Amazon", the company said via an email on Thursday. Nearly 50,000 fires have been detected in the Brazilian Amazon so far in 2019 – the highest number in almost a decade use.

### **HK Bookseller Held in China Raises** \$100,000 to Open Taiwan Store

A Hong Kong bookseller who disappeared into Chinese custody for half a year raised nearly \$100,000 in less than a day on Friday as he tries to open a new store in Taiwan Lam Wing-kee fled to Taiwan in April after Hong Kong announced plans to allow extraditions to China, a move which sparked months of massive streat sparked months of massive street protests in the financial hub. The 64-year old was one of five publishers selling gossip-filled tomes on China's leaders who vanished at the end of 2015. resurfacing in mainland custody and making televised confessions. Their disappearance – and the abduction of a billionaire from a five-star hotel by



billionaire from a five-star notel by suspected Chinese agents – caused widespread alarm in Hong Kong, Lam launched an online crowd-funding campaign late Thursday to open a bookstore in Talwan. By Friday evening over 1,600 people had pledged more than Tw\$3.11 million (\$99,800), exceeding his target of Tw\$2.80 million in less than a day. "Many thanks for everyone's support... thank you for giving me more confidence to accomplish this," Lam said in a message on a Facebook page for his bookstore project. He added that he aims to pick a location in six months and open his shop by mid-2020. AFP

#### Last Orders Pre-Brexit: UK Pub Boss Cuts Beer Prices



British pub chain JD Wetherspoon, known for its cheap beer, slashed prices further on Friday as its vocal Brexit-backing founder Tim Martin shared anticipated savings. "Wetherspoon pubs across the UK are today cutting the price of a pint," the company said in a statement. The group added that a pint of real ale had been slashed by an average of 20 pence, with the Ruddles brand being served for as low as £1.59 (\$1.95). "A lot of politicians have misled the public by suggesting leaving the Customs Union would be a 'cliff edge' or 'disaster,'" Martin said. "This is the reverse

of the truth. Ending tariffs will reduce prices." AFP



## The Golden Generatio

A British craze brought badminton to India and 145 years later a more entrepreneurial approach to the game is bringing us success. Vikram Doctor reports



n March 1872, a Times of India (ToI) correspondent reported from Bareilly in the North-Western Provinces of British India (now Uttar Pradesh) on a new craze: "All the world here is nearly mad on the subject of 'badminton', the newly fashioned game of shuttlecock across a rope."

This was one of the first mentions in ToI of a sporting passion that would suddenly sweep India. And unlike many passing crazes this would have lasting effects. It would help formalise a game that had barely received its

malise a game that had barely received its

malise a game that had barely received its name. It would gain more participants that any other sport, even cricket, brought in by the British. It would spread from India to other parts of Asia, like Indonesia and China, that remain powerhouses for the sport.

Most important of all, from the point of view of India's sporting ambitions, that long-ago badminton craze would help develop the infrastructure that would set India on the path to success, most notably with PV Sindhu recently becoming the first Indian to win gold at the World Badminton Championships. She cently becoming the first Indian to win gold at the World Badminton Championships. She ispart of a great generation of Indian badminton players, like Saina Nehwal and Srikanth Kidambi, the doubles specialist Jwala Gutta and, from a bit earlier, Pullela Gopichand, who has also mentored many of the current players. Before him too were international champions like Syed Modi, whose life was tragically cut short, Prakash Padukone and Nandu Natekar, And as early as 1947, badminton eave

Natekar. And as early as 1947, badminton gave India possibly its first sportsman to reach an international final as an individual player International Tinal as an individual player when Prakash Nath reached the finals of the All-England Badminton Championship, even as his home in Lahore was ransacked and he became a refugee.

Badminton is by some estimates, the most widely played sport in the world after soccer, yet its barply taken seriously in the Wostern

yet its barely taken seriously in the Western world, with the odd exception of Denmark. Its centre of power is Asia and in recognition of this, in 2005 the Badminton World Federation moved to Malaysia (most global governing bodies for sports are located in Switzerland

bodies for sports are located in Switzeriand or Monaco).

Badminton originated with toys called battle-dores and shuttlecocks. Children used the bats to keep the shuttles in the air. Many people still play like this, at a leisure level, hitting around a plastic shuttlecock. But at the professional level technology operating a different professional level. it changes abruptly, almost becoming a differ it changes abrupity, almost becoming a differ-ent game, using more aerodynamic feather shuttles – making it one sport dependent on animal products, something animal rights activists aren't happy about – and requiring intense levels of athleticism and strength. The fastest serve recorded in professional tennis is

minton player hit a smash at 426 km/h. Modern badminton began when battledore and shuttlecock players started facing each other across a rope or net. In Betty Uber's book A BriefHistory ofBadminton from 1870 to 1949 she notes "an eighteenth-century French print, which depicts a game in progress definitely resembling an archaic form of Badminton." There is also the long-standing story that British officers in Poons started laying this British officers in Poona started playing this way and took the game back to Britain.
The one thing that seems certain is that at

some point games was played this way in some point games was played this way indoors, in one of the huge halls at Badminton Park, the British home of the Duke of Beaufort. Even this date isn't clear – Uber suggests 1870, but also notes a reference to a 1860 booklet published by a London toy dealer titled Badminton Battledore – A New Game, but no copy of this has survived. But as the Tol reference from 1872 shows the name had clearly been fixed by them. shows, the name had clearly been fixed by then and the game had come, or come back, to India.

It was two years later, in 1874, that the craze really swept India. "Mahabaleshwar has gone Badminton mad. The woods are deserted, and old and young spend their evenings in dark spots playing this evidently fascinating game," reported ToI in May from the hill station near Bombay. The writer noted disapprovingly that this obsession was coming in the way of the main reason young ladies were there, to find

main reason young ladies were there, to find good marriage prospects.

In February, a Calcutta paper reported a shortage of shuttlecocks. A local firm had ordered "25 gross", meaning 3,600 shuttles, but before they came "ascientific artisan in the bazaar, we are informed, essayed to make some, but failed signally." It would only be in the 1920s that Indian shuttle making would develon in that Indian shuttle making would develop, in Baniban village near Calcutta. This survives, using duck feathers from Bangladesh, but is struggling in the face of competition from

In 1874 badminton was so popular in Ooty that year that a local writer wrote a spoof of Shakespeare's 'Seven Ages of Man' speech, describing the seven ages of Badminton players. In Simla, summer capital of the Raj, the rains did not stop the game: "Badminton on swampy grass and under dripping trees, and sometimes in MacIntoshes and under umplar umpralias but still the real game."

under umbrellas, but still the real game." From Satara and Surat, Jabalpur and From Satara and Surat, Jabalpur and Faisabad, Ahmedabad and Ahmednagar, Hyderabad and Karachi (both in Sind, now in Pakistan) reports came to Tol of the badminton craze. In Delhi a group of Italian musicians made good money playing light music to accompany badminton events. In Mussoorie one of the first injuries was noted, a young lady hit in the eye by a shuttle. News of the craze even reached London – Tol reported how British magazines. Jike the Graphic. were talking magazines, like the Graphic, were talking about "The New Indian Game-Badminton."

In support for Poona's claim to being the In support for Poona's claim to being the founding centre for badminton, in 1874 the sport seemed particularly well established there, with the construction of 'sheds' for it at a cost of 1000 rupees. A report from June 1874 described "a cruciform building, each limb forming one court, so that four games may go on at some time in it." It was open on all sides, but if there was too much breeze banging mass. but if there was too much breeze hanging mats could enclose it.

In Imperial Boredom, Jeffrey A. Auerbach's
illuminating study of the monotony of British
lives in India, he notes that sports became an
obsession because "officers, many of whom had
grown up in military and middle-class families
in rural communities, increasingly saw them
as a way to alleviate boredom." It was common
not just to play existing sports, but also improvise new ones to pass the time. For example,
there was stické a kind indoor tennis using a there was stické, a kind indoor tennis using a special court, one of which was created at the Viceregal Lodge in Simla.

Back in the UK one might need to be as rich as the Duke of Beaufort to be create a special

court for badminton or any other game, but in India it could be done quite cheaply, and land was easily available. Most of the sports were, of course, meant for men, but badminton was deemed light enough - perhaps because of its association with toys - for ladies. And by the association with toys—for ladies. And by the 1870s, a generation after the trauma of 1857, there were again many British ladies in India, many, as that Mahabaleshwar correspondent noted, in search of husbands.

The report from the Ahmedabad tournament of 1874 mentions a style of playing called Unicorn 1874 mentions a style of playing called Unicorn "one lady and two gentlemen on each side" which seems like a set up for a sports swavay-amvar. In 1876 a report on Badminton matches in Simla noted that "Single versus Married is the usual match, the latter being the generally victors" – which is hardly being subtle about the intentions. By then Indians were getting interested too.

By then Indians were getting interested too. A Calcutta report from 1875 mentioned a tour-ing group of nobles from Jodhpur who "have taken kindly to badminton, at which nationtaken kindly to badminton, at which nation-alised pastime they can give points to some of the best local players." A report from Lucknow that year described a badminton party held by Dewan Muttra Dass who "is the first native gentleman who has set a good example of bad-minton; it is hoped that the rest of the native gentlemen will emulate the English game." Badminton probably seemed attractive to

Indians because it could be played indoors as Noel Coward's song would say, only "mad dogs and Englishmen go out in the midday dogs and Englishmen go out in the midday sun." This also helped with a particular group of fans, the many women in purdah. In David Gilmour's The British in India, he quotes one witness on how 'in the later 1920s purdah women in 'gorgeous saris' were 'experts at badminton and volley-ball." Indians also tweaked badminton - a Tol report from 1875 in Secunderabad describes a badminton same with 'the flight of a worsted ball across game with "the flight of a worsted ball across an elevated netting of wire." This kind of ball badminton, dispensing with expensive shut-tles, would become an established tradition in

Badminton became part of club life in India, with clubs building and maintaining courts. In S. Muthiah and Ranjitha Ashok's oral history of business life Office Chai, Planter's Brew, AV ofbusinessilfeOfficeChal, Planter's Brew, AV Ram Mohan, who grew up in Nellistuppam, a town dominated by EID Parrys, recalled how in the Club over there "new Slazenger tennis balls, Montana table tennis balls, and shuttle-cocks by the dozen were always available even to youngsters in those days when cost-cutting was not heard of, many youngsters became very good at racket games..."
From India the British took the game to their colonies in Malaya, and the Chinese trading community took to it enthusiastically. Malayan plavers like Wong Pens Soon would

ing community took to it enthusiastically. Malayan players like Wong Peng Soon would win the first Thomas Cup tournament in 1949, at a time when Asians were simply not expected to beat Westerners. Colin Brown, in his essay on politics and Indonesian badminton, argues that it was the Chinese who took the game from Malaya to Indonesia.

Many well-known Indonesian players like Rudy Hartono and Liem Swie King are of Chinese origin, though this fact has been

Chinese origin, though this fact has been glossed over during the many periods of anti-Chinese fervour in Indonesia. These outbursts Chinese tervour in Indonesia. These outbursts also lead to many Indonesian Chinese badminton players leaving the country and moving to Singapore, and other parts of Asia, and ultimately China itself, where they would play a crucial role in developing the game.



Denmark is too small to develop team sports in a big way, and not as cold as the other Scandinavian countries to focus on win-ter sports, and so chooses to make its mark in more niche sports, like equestrian events, and hadminton. badminton.

India could have had more success earlier if it India could have had more success earnier in had built on the legacy of the 1874 craze, in the form of the many badminton courts that were built and the access to equipment across the country. The occasional success of players like Padukone was proof of this, but it seems to have been hard to achieve more, perhaps because of the inefficiencies of a government lead sports development system. development system.

It is only now, with Gopichand's more entre-preneurial attitude to badminton, and greater ability to raise resources, that we are seeing the successes of Sindhu, Nehwal and the rest of this 'golden generation' of badminton players Finally, 145 years after badminton first became a craze in India, and then rest of the world, we seem ready to take control of this part of our sporting heritage.

## In the Bag

From facing closure, the Kumarappa National Handmade Paper Institute of Jaipur made a turnaround, selling reusable carry bags made with plastic waste, writes **Anubhuti Vishnoi** 

Forty-eight hours before President Ram Nath Kovind was to swear in the new Modi Cabinet on a swelter-ing May evening, he decided that wa-ter bottles be served in special white handmade paper bags to the dignitar-

The little-known Kumarappa National Handmade Paper Institute (KNHPI) of Jaipur sprang into action and delivered the 700-plus custom-ised bottle bags, just the kind that the President had asked for.

These were no simple handmade pa-per carry bags. They were the first-of-a-kind product made with 20% recycled single-use plastic waste, which was welded in with cotton rags to create a reusable carry bag.

That was the story in May 2019

Back in August 2018, the same KNHPI
— an autonomous body for research
and development of handmade paper
under the Khadi and Village Industries

Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises —was running huge losses. It stood, in fact, on the verge of closure.

On his way to the KNHPI unit in

Rajasthan to announce the closure of the lossmaking operation, KVIC chairman VK Saxena crossed a nallah, choked with plastic bags.

"It was an ugly sight and bothered me considerably. I felt something must be urgently done about this plastic menace which was becom-ing so commonplace," Saxena said. "I went to KNHPI and said I would close it down unless they could create something worthwhile with all the plastic waste clogging the nallah outside. At first, they simply said it was not possible. I refused to budge and it worked. The plastic waste was collected and brought to the unit, washed and chopped and mixed with cotton rags and put through machines there and out rolled the first plastic-paper sheet," recalled Saxena.



The paper-plastic sheets have been rolling out ever since from KNHPI. which is set to report its first profit year, in a long long while and has filed

tor a patent.
Its signature paper bags made with recycled plastic waste are now being sold across Khadi stores in India. The tally is already 5 lakh bags sold and

Users can choose to opt into Face-book dating and create a dating pro-file separate from their main profile

New Delhi: Dating apps and security experts have raised privacy concerns about social network giant Facebook's foray into the world of online dating. Facebook on Thursday launched a

new dating service in the US and 19 other countries, and said it will be extended to Europe by early 2020. The company, though, didn't specify when it is planning to launch the product in India. Most global dating apps such as

Most global catting apps such as Tinder, Hinge, Bumble and Indian apps like TrulyMadly and Woo have been usting Facebook accounts for user logins. But TrulyMadly and Woo said they have also introduced new ways of user logins this year af-ter getting some user feedback on

privacy concerns.

"Signing up with Facebook does provide us with some sort of social credibility, but from our own experience, earlier we just had Facebook logins but we were forced by our year feedback to allow ced by our user feedback to allow people to login without Facebopeople to login without Facebook," said Snehli Khanor, cofounder of TrulyMadly. "There is this concern even in India, which is not a very privacy focused market as of now. I can assume what would it be like in the US."


