#### Junior shooter electrocuted in Delhi OYO hotel room

IN TOWN for a shooting competition, a 15-year-old boy died at an OYO hotel room after being electrocuted while taking a bath Sunday. According to police, Priyanshu Kumar was staying at a Collection O hotel, a 'mid-market brand' of hospitality start-up OYO Rooms, in South East Delhi's Pul Prahladpur.

# Couple Abhijit Banerjee and Esther Duflo share Nobel for Economics

Together with Michael Kremer, Nobel committee recognises their experimental approach to alleviating global poverty; Modi to Rahul to Mamata, India applauds

IT MUST have been around sunrise Monday in Boston, home to Abhijit Banerjee, Esther Duflo and Michael Kremer, when The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences announced the Nobel Prize for Economic Sciences for 2019 to the three economists "for their experimental approach to alleviating poverty". Their research has, over the last two decades, helped obtain reliable answers about the best ways to fight global poverty.

While the couple, Banerjee and Duflo, are professors in the department of economics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), Kremer is a professor in the department of economics in Harvard University. Their work has revolved around identifying "low-hanging fruits", which are often the most effective interventions in improving outcomes in health and education for the poor.

Banerjee, born in Mumbai in 1961, studied at the University of Calcutta and the Jawaharlal Nehru University before receiving his Ph.D from Harvard University in 1988. Kremer, too, obtained his Ph.D from Harvard University in 1992, while Duflo received her doctorate from CONTINUED ON PAGE 2

INDIA'S MOST influential captain and Cricket Association of Bengal chief Sourav Ganguly emerged as the lone contender Monday in the race to be BCCI president, confirming his phenomenal rise to the top of Indian cricket.

# Granaries overflowing, Food dept's SOS to MEA: Send wheat, rice as aid to deserving countries

WITH FOOD Corporation of India granaries overflowing, the government is looking to liquidate its grain stocks to prevent damage and minimise the carrying cost in the country beyond the requirement. In fact, the Food Ministry wants the Ministry of External Affairs to look at the option of presenting the surplus

aid to deserving countries".

Sources told *The Indian* Express: "The Department of Food and Public Distribution has requested the Ministry of External Affairs to explore the possibility of export of wheat and rice from the surplus stock available with FCI, through G2G (government-to-government) basis in the form of humanitar-

ian aid to deserving countries." Earlier this year, a committee of secretaries too recommended that the possibility of offering surplus stocks of wheat in the form of aid to deserving countries be explored in coordination with the MEA. The Ministry of

Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution had made similar request to the MEA at least twice in the last two years. "Despite repeated requests,

there has been no positive outcome," sources said.

Procurement of wheat and rice in the central pool has been increasing over the years, leading

to accumulation of surplus stock of wheat and rice with FCI. As a result, stocks of food grain in the central pool continue to remain much in excess of stocking norms.

As per stocking norms, the total requirement of food grain in the central pool as of July 1 was 411.20 lakh tonnes, and as of October 1 307.70 lakh tonnes. However, as of September 1, the stock available in the central pool was 669.15 lakh tonnes (254.25 lakh tonnes of rice and 414.90 lakh tonnes of wheat).

# Mobile phones back in Valley, SMS stopped after terror attack

JUST BEFORE the Jammu and Kashmir administration restored mobile telephone services for post-paid connections in the Valley, Monday morning traffic in Srinagar slowed down. After more than two months of the communication lockdown, people walking, driving and even rowing shikaras in the Dal lake took a moment to acquire the network on their phones — the signal was back.

But hours later, the government re-imposed curbs on SMS services. Around the same time, I&K police said two militants shot dead the driver of a truck from Rajasthan transporting apples in Sindhu Shermal village of Shopian district.

Shopian deputy commission Yasin Choudhary told *The Indian* Express that the militants fired shots in the air to disperse locals and labourers loading the truck and took the vehicle a short distance away before killing the driver and setting the truck on

# To bridge trust deficit, J&K will try engage mainstream parties

AFTER RESTORING mobile phone connectivity in the Valley Monday, the Jammu and Kashmir administration is now working on a mechanism to initiate political engagement which is likely to involve mainstream

political parties. The move is expected to lead

to the release of more political leaders from detention though a decision releasing former chief ministers Farooq Abdullah, Omar Abdullah and Mehbooba Mufti is not on the table yet.

Sources said the Centre is keen on beginning political dialogue with the Valley to bridge he trust deficit between the state administration and Kashmiris following the August 5 decision to scrap the state's special status

and bifurcate J&K into two Union Territories.

The political mechanism

currently under discussion is likely to involve second-rung leaders from regional parties in the Valley to form a political council that can initiate dialogue with people and assuage their fears in the wake of the August 5 decisions.
