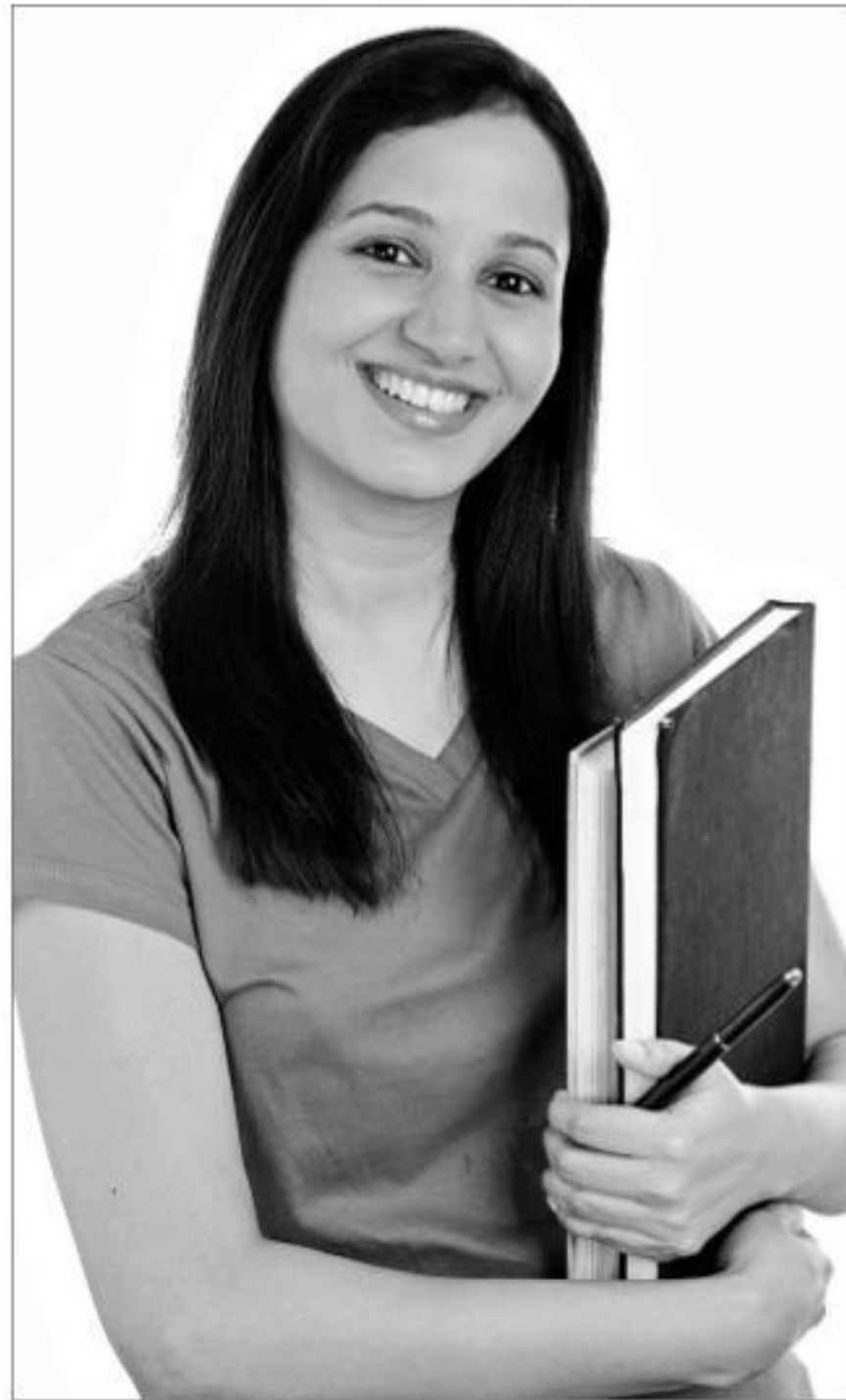


# Who wrote 'The Hungry Tide'?

- Dialogic criticism is modeled on the theory and critical procedures of the Soviet critic Mikhail Bakhtin.
- 'Dissociation of sensibility' was a phrase introduced by T.S Eliot in his essay 'The Metaphysical Poets' (1921).
- Daniel Defoe is often credited with writing the first 'novel of incident'
- 'Proletarian novel' flourished especially during the great economic depression of the 1930.
- Dickens' 'A Tale of Two Cities' (1859) set in Paris and London during the French Revolution.
- George Eliot's 'Romola' (1863) set in Florence during the Renaissance.
- Margaret Mitchell's 'Gone with the Wind' (1936) set in Georgia during the Civil War and reconstruction.
- The 'irregular ode' also called the 'Cowleyan Ode, was introduced in 1656 by Abraham Cowley.
- 'Onomatopoeia' also called 'echoism' is used both in a narrow and in a broad sense.
- 'Pathetic Fallacy' is a phrase invented by John Ruskin in 1856.
- Pen names of authors : Samuel Clemens – Mark Twain, Emily Bronte – Ellis Bell, Mary Ann Evans – George Eliot, Charles Dickens – Boz, Benjamin Franklin Silence Dogood, Eric Blair – George Orwell, Marguerite Annie Johnson – Maya Angelou.
- 'Poetic Justice' was a term coined by Thomas Rymer, an English critic of the later 17th century.
- Pre – Raphaelites: In 1848 a group of English artists, including. Dante Gabriel Rossetti, William Holman Hunt, and John Millais, organized the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood.
- Cyberpunk emerged in the early 1980 as a postmodern form of science fiction.
- 'Speech –act Theory' was developed by the philosopher John Austin, was described most fully in his posthumous book 'How to do Things with Words' (1962).
- Rime Royal was introduced by Chaucer in 'Troilus and Criseyde'.
- Dante composed his 'Divine comedy' in terza rime.
- Stream of consciousness : A phrase used by William James in his 'Principles of psychology' (1890) to describe unbroken flow of perceptions, memories, thoughts and feelings in the waking mind, it has since been adopted to describe a narrative method in modern fiction.
- French structuralism, inaugurated in the 1950 by the cultural anthropologist Claude Levi – Strauss.
- Surrealism was launched as a concerted artistic movement in France by Andre Breton's 'Manifesto on Surrealism' (1924).
- Transcendentalism in America : A philosophical and literary movement, centered in Concord and Boston, which was prominent in the intellectual and cultural life of New England from 1836 until just before the civil war. It was inaugurated in 1836 by a Unitarian discussion group that came to be called the Transcendental Club.
- Repartee is a term taken from fencing to signify a contest of wit, in which each person tries to cap the remark of the other, or to turn it to his or her own



advantage.

- Academic novel, University novel, or Campus novel set primarily in a college or university community in which the main characters are academics, often employed by the English department.
- Aesthetic ideology was a term applied by the deconstructive theorist Paul de Man.
- Alliteration is the repetition of a speech sound in a sequence of near by words.  
**Eg :** A big bully beats a baby boy.
- Consonance is the repetition of a sequence of two or more consonants, but with a change in the intervening vowel : live –love, pitter – patter, learn – lone.
- Assonance is the repetition of identical or similar vowels –especially in a stressed syllabus in a sequence of near by words.  
**Eg:** the cat ran after the alligator who was trying to assist an alarmed drawing armadillo to get across the river.
- Archetypal literary criticism was given impetus by Maud Bodkin's 'Archetypal Patterns in Poetry' (1934) and flourished especially during the 1950 and 1960.
- Bloomsbury Group is the name applied to an informal association of writers, artists, and intellectuals, many of whom lived in Bloomsbury a residential district in central London.
- The "Celtic Revival" also known as the Irish Literary Renaissance, the Gaelic Revival, and the Celtic Twilight, identifies the remarkably creative period in Irish literature from about 1880 to the death of William Butler Yeats in 1939.
- The originator of deconstruction is the French thinker Jacques Derrida.
- 'Of Grammatology' 'Writing and Difference' and 'Speech and Phenomena' are written by Derrida.
- 'Black Skin White Masks' and 'The Wretched of the Earth' are written by Frantz Fanon.
- Orientalism is written by Edward W. Said in 1978.
- The Empire Writes Back : Theory and Practice in Post Colonial Literature' is co-authored by three critics from Australia: Bill Ashcroft, Gareth Griffiths and Helen Tiffin.
- A Grain of wheat (1967) is written by Naugi wa Thiong'o.
- 'Anthills of the Savannah' is written by Chinua Achebe.
- Dr. Johnson called Dryden, as 'the father of English Criticism'
- The French Revolution had a significant impact on Romantic Literature.
- The essay, 'The Death of the Author' is written by Roland Barthes.
- Emma by Jane Austen is a novel about the perils of misconstrued romance.
- The character Mrs. Malaprop is main figure in Richard Sheridan's 'The Rivals' (1775).
- A Passage to India (1924) is a novel by E.M Forster set against the back drop of the British Raj and the Indian Independence movement in the 1920.
- The phrase 'Objective Correlative' was coined by T.S Eliot.
- 'Under the Greenwood Tree' is a novel by Thomas Hardy, published in 1872.
- 'A House for Mr. Biswas' is a 1961 novel by V.S Naipaul.
- Endymion is a poem by John Keats first published in 1818. It is written in rhyming couplets in iambic pentameter.
- Diction means syntax and word order.
- 'The Hungry Tide' is the sixth novel by Amitav Ghosh.
- Wuthering Heights the only novel of Emily Bronte is set in Yorkshire Moors.
- A 'Curtal Sonnet' consists of 11 lines.
- The author of 'Nation and Narration' is Homi Bhabha.

- Arthur Miller's 'The Death of a Salesman' is mainly about American dream.
- The concept of 'arche writing' is developed by Derrida.
