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HEARING OF APPEALS IN AYODHYA TITLE SUIT ENDS, SUPREME COURT RESERVES VERDICT

Over to Their Lordships

Verdict before CJI retires on Nov 17; parties get three days to file submissions

ANANTHAKRISHNAN G NEW DELHI. OCTOBER 16

WRAPPING UP hearings spread over 40 days on appeals against the 2010 verdict of the Allahabad High Court which ordered a three-way division of the disputed Ram Janmabhoomi-Babri Masjid site in Ayodhya, a Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court reserved its ruling Wednesday.

The verdict is expected before Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi, heading the bench, retires on November 17.

The bench, also comprising Justices S A Bobde, D Y Chandrachud, Ashok Bhushan and S A Nazeer, gave the parties three days to file their written submissions, if any.

The hearings concluded after the day saw high drama with the Uttar Pradesh Sunni Central Waqf Board, one of the three parties to the title suit, asserting that "the demolished (Babri Masjid) building belonged to us" and "the right to reconstruct it also belong to us... nobody else has the right". Its counsel, senior advocate Rajeev Dhavan, even tore up a map, which a Hindu party said was that of the Ram Janmasthan, in open court.


Appearing for Ramlalla Virajman — the idol of child Ram is also a party to the title suit senior advocate C S Vaidyanathan said "this place, we have believed for centuries,

is Ram Janmasthan. We can't call any place in Delhi as Ram Janmasthan. They (Muslims) may have several other places of worship. We have only this".

The Supreme Court has to rule on appeals against the September 30, 2010 verdict of the Allahabad High Court which ordered a three-way division of the disputed 2.77 acres between the Nirmohi Akhara sect, the Uttar Pradesh Sunni Central Waqf Board and Ramlalla Virajman.

Dhavan said Muslims were refused permission to pray at the mosque by Hindus through "intimidating means", but that does not take away the Waqf instituted by Mughal emperor Babur — according to the Waqf Board, the Babri Masjid was constructed by Babur's commander Mir Bagi in 1528.

On Tuesday, senior advocate K Parasaran, appearing for those in favour of a temple, had said that in 1886, the Faizabad district court had stated that a mosque had been constructed on the disputed land considered holy by Hindus in Ayodhya, and that it CONTINUED ON PAGE 2

Let Govt acquire land, allow prayers in ASI mosques: Deal on table

ON THE day the Supreme Court concluded the Ayodhya hearings, the court-appointed mediation team presented a proposal to the Constitution Bench, detailing contours of a "settlement" agreed upon by "some parties" to the Ram Janmabhoomi-Babri Masjid dispute.

The Indian Express has learnt that the Vishwa Hindu Parishadcontrolled Ram Janmabhoomi Nyas, the deity Ramlalla and six other Muslim parties which have filed appeals are not party to the proposed "settlement", making it a partial, if not a weak deal.

The parties which are part of this proposed "settlement" are the Hindu Mahasabha, Akhil Bhartiya Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Punaruddhar Samiti, and Shri Mahant Rajendradas of the Nirmohi Ani Akhara.

The proposed "settlement" essentially centres around one of the Muslim parties, the Lucknow-based UP Sunni Central Waqf Board, which has agreed to a "no-objection" if the land on which the Babri Masjid once stood — at the centre of the row — is acquired by the central government.

In return for the NOC by the Sunni Central Waqf Board chairman, the proposed "settlement" offers an institution for social harmony, ASI mosques being

It took about a month and "two or three meetings, both in Delhi and Chennai" to reach the proposed "settlement", sources told The Indian Express.

The five-judge Constitution Bench, headed by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi, is to meet in the chambers on Thursday morning. It has been learnt that this document, given to the court, will be an important point of discussion, and a decision will be taken on whether to make the proposed "settlement" public.

SUPREME Court Wednesday asked the Centre to produce before it orders under which restrictions had been imposed in Jammu and Kashmir in the wake of amendments to Article 370 of the Constitution and revocation of the special status granted to the state.

A three-judge bench headed by Justice N V Ramana told Solicitor General Tushar Mehta that the orders should be furnished to the court, and fixed the matter for further hearing in

the last week of November. "Why have you not placed the asked Mehta when Advocate Vrinda Grover appearing for Executive Editor of Kashmir Times newspaper Anuradha Bhasin said that the government had not produced the orders, the examination of which was needed to decide whether restrictions were proportionate and Constitutional.

The bench also comprised Justices R Subhash Reddy and BR Gavai.

Mehta said the petitioners had expanded their prayer. While the original prayer was that they could not publish their newspaper due to restrictions and sought lifting of the same,





Mumbai BJP chief refers to riots, blasts to describe Congress voters

From maidan tent to world record, Mumbai gets new batting star

MUMBAI, OCTOBER 16 ON WEDNESDAY, 17-year-old Mumbai opener Yashasvi Jaiswal became the youngest batsman in the world to score a double hundred in a 50-overs game with an innings of 203 in 154 balls against Jharkhand in the Vijay Hazare Trophy at

Six years ago, at the age of 11, Jaiswal was staying with groundsmen inside the Muslim

United Club's tent in Mumbai's iconic Azad Maidan after he was thrown out of a dairy shop where he slept earlier. He was also selling pani puri. And chasing his cricket dream.

Today, as the famous maidans buzzed with speculation about the emergence of Mumbai's next big batsmen, a strong endorsement came from Wasim Jaffer, the former India opener who has put in over 20 years in domestic cricket.







Sagar was taken to a local health facility, where doctors declared him dead. According to his family, he was

unwell the previous night and before leaving home, told his wife and mother that he would see a doctor. "He couldn't sleep the whole night because he was unwell. As soon as he left from here, security personnel informed us that he has been killed. I am yet to believe that he is no more," his mother Mehtireen told The Indian Express.

Sagar's wife Seema is also looking for answers. "I have nothing to say. No one here knows why he was killed," she said, holding her six-month-old daughter. His death has sparked fear among other labourers working at the

"We don't want to stay here anymore. We have told the contractor to bring buses and take us home.everyone is scared," said Firteen Bai, a woman labourer. This year, many were to leave next week after working all these months. "We are now going home in a day or two," said Hulchal, another labourer at the kiln.

Labourers like Sagar arrive in

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the Valley around June-July with their families and after working for several months leave by October end. "We are providing them with all assistance," said Abdul Gani, the owner of the brick kiln where Sethi worked. He said it was the first time that such an incident occurred.

Police sources said that on questioning Sagar's nephew, who was unharmed in the attack, they have determined that "one unknown gunman" had opened fire. "He was hit by one bullet," said a

Hours after Sagar was killed, militants targeted the fruit traders. Kashmir zone Police said on Twitter. "Terrorists fired on civilians in Shopian #killing 01 civilian and injuring another. Area has been cordoned and search operation in progress." Shopian Deputy

Commissioner Yasin Choudhary said: "Charanjeet was an old apple trader and was in Kashmir on work. He and his business associate were attacked in Trenz village, where they were staying with a local fruit grower."

In Punjab, the attack has spread panic in Abohar town, from where 20 traders are currently in Srinagar for the apple

Popli, who is survived by a wife and 8-year-old son, was in Shopian to assist trader Sanjay Charaya in bringing back apple

stock. Ramesh Kumar, his elder brother who is a tailor, said, "Charanjeet went to Kashmir every year for about 40 days during the apple season with traders as a helper. He used to get the material picked from apple orchards and packed to be finally sent to Abohar. After the apple season, he worked at farms in Abohar again picking, packaging and loading. He was just hand to mouth."

Another brother, Rakesh said, "We told Charanjeet a number of times not to go but he did not listen. We are yet to inform our parents. They cannot bear the shock."

Charaya's uncle Surinder said, "Normally, we go in September but this time, because of restrictions we could not go and so my nephew and others went last week. Today, they were to finish work and start for Abohar tomor-

The rules, once finalized by the DoPT, will need the approval of the Prime Minister, who is the minister in-charge of the department.

Sources said the CIC and ICs will be given the rank of Secretary to the Government of India, with the CIC being the "first among

While as per the original RTI Act, their pay and perks were that of CEC and ECs, respectively, they did not find a place in the 'Table of Precedence' at all. The office of the CIC had been pushing for a position in this table at the level of CEC

At present, apart from salary, CICs and ICs avail of Rs 34,000 sumptuary allowances, rent-free full furnished accommodation on government cost, three LTCs per year and unlimited medical allowances for self, spouse and dependent children; post retirement, they are entitled for additional pension, telephone with 1,500 free per month calls at their residence and orderly al-

If the CIC is downgraded to the Cabinet Secretary rank, the sumptuary allowance will see a fall to Rs 10,000 per month. Further, the CIC would not be eligible for many other allowances available to CEC/

Sources said for the state CIC, the draft rules propose pay and perks of the Secretary to the Government of India (or Chief Secretary of the State), and ICs of the state may get the pay and perks of Additional Secretaries to the government of India.

In July 2019, Parliament passed the Bill to amend Section 13 and Section 16 of the RTI Act to review the terms of the CIC/ICs of the Centre and states. The RTI Amendment Act said that the appointment will be "for such term as may be prescribed by the Central Government." And that salaries, allowances and other terms of service of the CIC/IC "shall be such as may be prescribed by the Central Government.'

Singh said an iron fence put up after the communal riots of 1855 to separate the Babri Masjid from the outer courtyard was "only for limiting the position to which one could go". He sought to compare it with the situation in a temple like Tirupati where a worshipper cannot touch the idol and has to pray from a distance.

Senior advocate Sushil Kumar Jain, appearing for the Nirmohi Akhara, referred to alleged discrepancies in the map submitted by the Sunni Waqf Board and said it was not even aware of the ground situation in Ayodhya at the time of filing the suit in 1961.

Appearing for Ramlalla Virajman, Vaidyanathan said there was no evidence to show that Muslims offered prayers at the disputed site after 1934 while Hindus continued to worship at the place. He said Muslims have not been able to prove that they had exclusive possession of the disputed area until 1949. All evidence, he said, show that Hindus never gave up their claim. Unless Muslims had exclusive possession, the property cannot be dedicated as Waqf, he said.

Advocates for the Sunni not clear who will "assure" im-Waqf Board, however, said that "there has been no intimation, direction, email or any kind of the message and no appeal or NOC

has been filed by us". Although word spread Wednesday morning that the Sunni Waqf Board had withdrawn from the title suit, it became clear during the day that no such statement had been made by the Waqf Board.

On September 30, 2010, the Allahabad High Court had ruled that the disputed land be partitioned equally between the Nirmohi Akhara, the Sunni Waqf Board and the deity Ramlalla Virajman. Fourteen appeals were heard by the Constitution Bench over 40 days in marathon sessions since August 6.

The mediation process, led by three court-appointed mediators, began in March but was deemed to have "failed" when CJI Gogoi said as much in court on seeing their final report. Dayto-day hearings in the matter started thereafter. The process got another lease of life once the CJI, on September 18, allowed mediation to resume, alongside the hearings in court. At that time, Sunni Waqf Board chairman Zufar Farooqui and Dharam Das of the Nirvani Akhara had written saying they wanted the process to be continued.

'Geyser on, no water likely led to teen's death in OYO hotel'

NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 16

NO WATER supply to the hotel and a short circuit in the geyser led to a fatal combination that killed a 15-year-old national-level shooter at an OYO hotel in South East Delhi's Pul Prahladpur Sunday afternoon, preliminary investigation has revealed.

An officer probing Priyanshu Kumar's death told The Indian Express that an electrician was called to shed light on what had led to the boy's death. The boy's roommate Yash Gupta had earlier told *The Indian Express* that they had first shifted from one room to another, and then complained about the water supply in their new room. Once hotel staff told them it was resolved, Kumar went to take a bath. Within minutes, his roommate heard a scream and a loud thud. When hotel staff gained access to the bathroom, he

was on the floor. Police said they have sealed the hotel and are questioning the staff who attended the victim's

complaint before the incident.

"Prima facie, it appears there was no water supply at the hotel. So when the geyser was kept on without any water inside, it got short. Once water supply resumed and the boy went to take a bath, there was a surge of electricity and he was electrocuted moments after the water started flowing. We have found that there was a problem of electric current in the bathroom's other fittings too," a senior police officer said. The boy was staying in Collection O, a mid-tier brand by OYO rooms. DCP (South East) Chinmoy

Biswal said, "Prime facie, it appears he died due to an electric shock from appliances in the bathroom. We have started our investigation after registering an FIR under IPC section 304A (death due to negligence) on the complaint of the coach and called the forensic experts, who visited the spot."

Police said nine people were staying in the hotel at the time of the teen's death. Among those who have been questioned are the guest relations executive as well as the manager. No arrest has been made so far. "Senior company officials have been issued notices to provide relevant records," Biswal said.

An OYO spokesperson said that to ensure a thorough and unbiased investigation into the matter, personnel working in and associated with the property will be placed under suspension on following due process. "We are going to initiate electrical audits. The aim is to identify the root cause of the incident and also ensure that we take all possible steps to ensure safety of our guests and employees across all properties under OYO," said an OYO Hotels & Homes spokesper-

"Safety is our top priority. The property is closed and sealed till further notice. We are committing to install SOS Safety Switch Buttons in all rooms to be able to provide immediate 24x7 support and emergency assistance. We are also immediately instituting a risk reduction programme led by our chief of safety and our emergency response director. We are also instituting a new position of regional safety and security directors in each of our regions in India," the spokesperson added.

Surgeon arrested after rape complaint by woman

A SURGEON from Safdarjung Hospital was arrested four days ago for allegedly raping a sales representative of a pharmaceutical company.

"The woman alleged she was raped by the surgeon in April this year at a house in South West Delhi, which the doctor had allegedly taken on rent," said a police officer.

The woman claimed she met the doctor, who is in his 30s, in 2018 in a professional capacity as the sales representative of a pharma company.

The woman alleged the doctor drugged her and sexually assaulted her, and that he also took inappropriate photos of her, po-

A police officer said, "We haven't found the photos in question so far and will add ap-

propriate IT Act sections if and when we do so."

Police said that as per the woman's allegations, the two had stayed in touch after they first met. "The woman said the accused offered to help her prepare for an upcoming examination, and the two would meet for that purpose at a house rented by him. At one such meeting, the woman claimed, he drugged and raped her...She claimed he would often ask her to visit him at the flat. The accused has been remanded in judicial custody," said the officer.

The woman told police that she confided in her brother about the incident, who confronted the doctor as well.

A case of rape and causing hurt by means of poison has been registered against the doctor at Safdarjung Enclave police station. The hospital's medical superintendent said he wasn't aware of the case.

Vacate students' union room or we will lock it, JNU tells office-bearers as protests break out

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE NEW DELHI. OCTOBER 16

STUDENTS OF the Jawaharlal Nehru University protested Wednesday after the administration, citing legal reasons, asked them to vacate the students' union room by 5 pm Wednesday in order to lock it up. The INUSU, however, staged a

sit-in protest at the office from 3:30 pm, preventing the administration from locking it. Students also screened Anand Patwardhan's 'Raam ke Naam' in the office as a mark of protest at night.

In a circular dated October 15, Dean of Students Umesh Kadam said the "JNUSU for the academic year 2018-19 has not been notified by the university due to noncompliance of Lyngdoh Committee Report (LCR)... by the candidates of JNUSU elections 2018-19" and added that "the JNUSU for the academic year 2019-20 is yet to be notified".

"To prevent the misuse of university property, it is decided by the competent authority of the university that the said room shall be locked immediately and the same may be handed over to the INUSU after notification of the same... Therefore, it is directed to all concerned to vacate the room on or before 5.00 pm on 16/10/2019, failing which the concerned authority of the university will double lock the said room. The university will not be responsible for any damage/loss of items housed in the said room." Kadam added. INUSU condemned the no-

tice and said it would fight the "authoritarian measures". "We would like to remind the JNU administration that the JNUSU office is not the personal property of the Dean of Students to allot, it is a symbol of the JNU student community's right to representation and unionise, that is entrusted to the JNUSU," they said in a statement.

"The JNU administration has, one by one, snatched away our public spaces for democratic debate and dissent, be it our dhabas, or the mess halls that are currently only allotted to the V-C's political front on campus. The

JNUSU office has become one of the last spaces where we can organise our meetings and discussions," the JNUSU added.

Kadam, however, said:"If students have blocked the INUSU office from being locked, it's illegal. The office is the property of the university." According to officials, office

bearers of the students' union have always been allotted space in the campus since the 1980s. Earlier, the JNUSU office was situated in the old campus, but when Teflas (student activity centre) opened in the current campus sometime during the 90s, the student union was shifted there, where it continues to remain.

The space is used by JNUSU

office-bearers for all kinds of meetings, ranging from a student council meeting, organisation meetings, and even meeting with hostel presidents. During the JNUSU elections, the space becomes all the more important, with the Election Committee operating from there. The first press conference, where the JNUSU presidential candidates make their pitch, is also held in the JNUSU office.

Behind the deadlock: Matter of notification

BEHIND WEDNESDAY'S crisis is the matter of "notification" of the JNU Students' Union. The Dean of Student Umesh Kadam maintains that since the last union was not notified due to violation of Lyngdoh Committee Regulations (LCR), and the current JNUSU is yet to be notified, the office should be locked.

But there's a question mark on the issue of notification of the JNUSU. The controversy began after last September's JNUSU polls.

As per LCR, candidates are required to submit audited accounts of their expenditure within two weeks of declaration of results.

In October last year, Kadam issued a letter saying the bills the four winners submitted were not in proper format, since they did not factor in GST.

The INUSU had said they submitted their bills in the same format since 2012, when the LCR came into effect, and the DoS had never raised a query earlier.

Due to this, the administration did not "notify" the JNUSU all through last year, and refrained from inviting them to Academic Council meetings.

This year, INUSU has not yet been notified due to the case in the Delhi High Court, where two students alleged LCR was not followed during polls.

"After snatching the phone, the two sold it to a man in Azadpur, who then sold it to a person in Wazirabad. These men have also been arrested," said DCP (North) Monika Bhardwaj.

The main accused include Karan (20) and Raheem (19), and the two others have been identified as Durga Prasad (26) and Muzammil Ahmed (24).

SPELLS OUT VISION FOR CAPITAL

Ready to bow before any govt for cleaner Delhi: CM

DELHI CHIEF Minister Arvind Kejriwal Wednesday said he was "ready to bow down in front of any government" to ensure a clean capital in the next five years.

Talking about his vision for the city at a discussion on governance and development, organised by Assocham, Kejriwal said a clean Delhi, an integrated transport service, and better traffic management is what the Aam Aadmi Party government will take up in the next five years.

"Over the next five years, one thing we want to focus on is cleaning Delhi. The city is very dirty, drains and sewers are overflowing. Cleaning the city is not rocket science. I am mulling a global tender, whereby agencies can clean the city. Solid waste management is not rocket science. When the whole world has done it, why can't we?" he said.

The AAP government's term ends in the next four months and

the party has been pitching its work as its main poll plank. At the event, Kejriwal said,

"Cleaning the city is not difficult but here the Delhi government, municipal corporations, the Centre and DDA — all work independently of each other. But that does not matter. I'm ready to bow down in front of any government that I have to, to get this done."

Solid waste management in Delhi is handled by municipal corporations. Over the past six years, sanitation workers have gone on strike repeatedly over non-payment of salaries.

Bus aggregator service

The long-pending plan to have a policy for bus aggregators will also be finalised soon, Kejriwal said. Speaking about Delhi's bus service, a sore point for the government which has faced several hurdles in buying new buses for the cluster and DTC fleets, Kejriwal said the government wants luxury buses to wean people away from their personal vehicles.

Kejriwal said that the luxury bus policy, which has been hanging fire for several years, is finally set to get clearance this month.

"We need comfortable buses. Right now, buses cater to middle and lower middle classes. No car owner wants to leave their car at home and take a bus because there is no comfort. We want a big private sector investment in the field of luxury buses. We will announce that policy within the next 15-20 days," he said. The policy for such a service was notified by the government in 2016. The idea was to provide AC, Wi-Fi enabled buses on a charter bus model.

'Treat polls as freedom struggle'

New Delhi: Kicking off a se-

ries of volunteer meetings, the CM asked them to treat the upcoming polls as a "freedom struggle". "Don't fight the upcoming elections for the AAP or for Kejriwal. Fight these elections with the spirit of a freedom struggle as the AAP is the only ray of hope in the current political scenario in the country," he said at the meeting in Dwarka, which was first of 14 he will address in the coming few days. Earlier in the day, Kejriwal launched the AK mobile app, where news about him and the party can be accessed. The party hopes to call out "fake news" through it. ENS

BJP won't go with CM face for Delhi assembly polls

THE BJP has decided to go without a chief ministerial face for the Delhi assembly polls, scheduled for early next year, it is learnt. "We will not have a CM face to fight elections in Delhi. AAP has launched a massive campaign; the BJP is yet to. We will do it after October 24 – the counting day for Maharashtra and Harvana assembly polls," a BIP source said.

While the Aam Aadmi Party and its chief Arvind Kejriwal have changed tack following the dismal Lok Sabha performance in Delhi, focussing on its projects and promises instead of confrontation, the BJP, known for early preparations and strategising for elections, has not yet launched its campaign. A key reason, party leaders admitted, are internal differences and one upmanship among top

The dilemma before the leadership was whether the party should declare a chief ministerial candidate to counter Kejriwal's appeal, but the intense internal feud in the state unit discouraged them to do so. At least three leaders in the Delhi unit — Union Minister Harsh Vardhan, former Union Minister Vijay Goel and state unit chief Manoj Tiwari — have been nursing dreams to occupy the top post if the party wins

the polls. Supporters of each want the national leadership to announce their leader as the CM candidate before polls. Sources also said names of two other Union Ministers have been doing the rounds as possible contenders.

Internal feuds have been a perpetual issue for the BJP's Delhi unit, which has impacted the party's electoral performance in the past. "But now, the BJP, being a cadre party and the leadership being so powerful, is confident that it would be under control. Also, the leadership appears to be hesitant to repeat the mistake we made ahead of the 2015 February elections," said a BJP leader.

In 2015, the BJP had parachuted Kiran Bedi, India's first woman IPS officer, into Delhi politics and announced her name as its CM candidate. Despite a massive victory for the Narendra Modi-led BJP in

the 2014 Lok Sabha elections the party had to face a humiliating debacle, with even Bedi losing her Krishna Nagar seat to AAP, which won 67 of 70 assembly seats.

"The situation is different now. The BIP is more powerful, the leadership has a strong hold over party affairs and we have regained lost ground in Delhi. With the popularity of Prime Minister Modi, we have already got back our traditional support base as well as the middle class," said the party leader. "Despite the massive campaign AAP is running, BJP is in a formidable position."

After its 2014 Lok Sabha victory, the BJP had gone to assembly polls in Maharashtra, Haryana and Jharkhand without a CM candidate in the last polls. "The strategy was proved right, the party won comfortably. So going to polls without a face in Delhi will not be a big handicap," said another BJP

However, he admitted that Delhi polls will not be a cakewalk.

After the low of the Lok Sabha results, AAP has taken a number of steps to improve its image. Kejriwal, once a staunch critic of the PM, has been relatively muted in his criticism of the Centre.

Recently, the AAP also extended support to the BIP's move to scrap Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir.

Agencies making air quality claims should behave more responsibly: CM

ATTACKING THE "guessing games" being played over Delhi's air quality, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal Wednesday said source apportionment of pollution has not been done by agencies which are claiming that impact of stubble burning on the city's air quality is less. Speaking at the party headquarters, Kejriwal said local pollution sources were the same as before, and that air quality had been between 'good' and 'moderate' since the last 7-8 months.

He said the sudden spike in pollution is a result of smoke released from crop stubble burning, which is underway in parts of north west India, mainly Punjab and Haryana. "No additional population has suddenly settled in Delhi, no sudden inflow of vehicles has taken place and no new dust sources have come up in the last seven days. How could local sources have contributed to the sudden spike in pollution?"

The CM said agencies claiming that stubble burning has only

a little impact on the city's air quality should "behave more responsibly" about the figures they share.

The Chief Minister's statement comes a day after Sunita Narain, member of the Supreme Court-appointed EPCA, reportedly claimed that local sources in Delhi account for 90% of pollution in the capital.

Narain, when contacted, told The Indian Express: "I used data from SAFAR... I have no reason to dispute their...assessment of biomass contribution in the region." The government's air quality

monitoring system SAFAR has recorded that external biomass burning contributed 2% to Delhi's air quality Saturday and 9% Sunday, the highest till date.

Kejriwal said sources of pollution can only be measured using real-time source apportionment, and added that the government has been trying to import specific machinery to this end.

"None of the agencies that are

Produced before magistrate at Patiala House Court: 13 parrots

WHEN CHIEF Metropolitan Magistrate Manish Khurana asked 13 'victims' "where were you being taken?", some nibbled on pieces of apple inside their cage, others looked around the courtroom with beady eyes.

The peculiar scene played out at Delhi's Patiala House court complex on Wednesday afternoon, when 13 parrots, which were allegedly being smuggled to Tashkent by an Uzbekistan na-

tional, were produced in front of CMM Khurana, along with the 24-year-old accused Anvarion Rakhmat Jonov.

Looking at two cages with six and seven birds inside, the judge asked custom officials whether the birds were prohibited from being exported.

Special Public Prosecutor PC Aggarwal, appearing for the customs department, said that after the birds were seized "to ascertain the exact description of the live parrots, the Wildlife

Region, was called to verify the genuineness of the parrots".

"After examining them, it was confirmed that the parrots are live parakeets (of the family Psittacidae), and export of live parakeets is restricted under the EXIM (export import) policy," Aggarwal told the court.

The judge then ordered that the birds be handed over to the Wildlife department so that proper care and protection is provided to them.

It also remanded Jonov to 14-Inspector and Wildlife Crime day judicial custody, which was Control Bureau, Northern opposed by his counsel on the

ground that his client has been booked under the provision of the Wildlife Act, which is a bailable offence.

CMM Khurana dismissed the counsel's contention, saying "its (the parrots') export is banned". The accused will now be brought before the court on October 30.

While scanning baggage at the Indira Gandhi International Airport Tuesday, security personnel had spotted images of birds in shoeboxes kept inside Ionov's bag. While he claimed checked the boxes to find 13 parrots, most of them unconscious. The court was told that one of the parrots flew away when the cage was opened, but it later

returned on its own. A senior CISF official said Jonov was going to board a flight to Tashkent via Uzbekistan Airways. "During questioning, he revealed that these were roseringed parakeets, whose demand is high in Tashkent," said a senior officer in the customs department, adding that this is the first time someone has tried they were soft toys, officials to smuggle live birds from IGI

Art 370 not an issue, my fight with Khattar: Hooda

ON A whirlwind tour of his constituency, Garhi Sampla-Kiloi, former Haryana chief minister and Congress candidate Bhupinder Singh Hooda repeatedly asks voters to give him a victory margin bigger than that of Chief Minister M L Khattar in Karnal.

Asked about reason behind such an appeal, Hooda says with a smile, "Because the contest is between myself and him."

Outside his Rohtak bastion, too, Hooda does not take the name of Prime Minister

Narendra Modi or talk about national issues. Fighting perhaps the toughest battle of his life, the veteran Congressman, a two-time chief minister, has framed the election as one between his record against that of Khattar's. He talks about schemes he had implemented and counts the "failures" of the Khattar gov-

While the BIP is attempting to swing the elections in both Haryana and Maharashtra riding on issues of nationalism — Article 370, Balakot airstrikes, etc — Hooda, seeking election from Garhi Sampla-Kiloi for the fifth time, deftly avoids the minefield.

On way from his home at D-Park, Rohtak city, to Jassia village to address the day's first election meeting at 9.15 am, the Congress leader tells The Indian Express, "Why should I talk of Modi or bring up issues such as Balakot or Article 370 (at rallies)? I will then fall in the BJP's trap. My stand on Article 370 is widely known. It is no more an issue; it has become the law of the land. No one is opposing it. The only thing is that peace should be restored in

There is, however, a tinge of disappointment in his voice when he says the Congress high command took inordinately long in an-

nouncing the leadership change in Haryana.

"There is no doubt that there was a delay in taking the decision (appointing Hooda CLP leader), but better late than never.... Once the decision cane, our workers are fighting hard. We have to look forward now," Hooda says.

The veteran believes the tide is slowly turning against the ruling BJP in the state. Asked whether he is getting enough support from the party high command, with Sonia and Rahul addressing only one rally each, he says, "The message has to go to the people. Even if they address one rally or 10 rallies, the message will spread."

In his speeches at Jassia, and later at Kiloi and Bohar villages, Hooda sticks to local issues, promising, among others, waiver of farm loan debt, halving electricity rates, increasing scholarship, free plots to the poor, unemployment allowance to the youth, and Rs 5,100 old-age pension for men and women. Debt waiver, he emphasises, will be the first order passed if the Congress is voted in.

"The issues in Lok Sabha and Assembly elections are different. The Khattar government has not fulfilled any of the 154 promises it had made. This is a failed and non-performing government," he says, and argues that response from the people is beyond his

Former Haryana Cong chief backs JJP, says Dushyant should be CM

DAYS AFTER resigning from the Congress, the party's former Haryana unit president Ashok Tanwar announced his support to the Dushyant Chautala-led Jannayak Janata Party (IIP) on Wednesday.

A JJP leader, however, made it clear that as of now, there is no word from him on joining the party.

Addressing a press conference in New Delhi on Thursday, Tanwar said, "I wish they (JJP) form the government. In the current political circumstances and requirements, I believe the 36 biradaris (communities) should join hands to make him (Dushyant) the chief minister of the state."

He referred to Dushyant, who was also present at the press conference, as a "nice and young face".

Tanwar, who was appointed the Haryana Congress president in 2014, had been locked in a feud with former chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda over the past few months. Last month, he was replaced by Kumari Selja and Hooda was appointed as the Congress's legislative party leader.

Earlier this month, Tanwar protested outside Congress president Sonia Gandhi's residence over alleged irregularities in ticket distribution. Soon after, he resigned from the party.

JJP leaders claimed that Tanwar's support to Dushyant will boost the prospects of their candidates in many areas, especially Sirsa, Fatehabad and Hisar.

According to a press note released by the JJP, Tanwar said the Congress will become the "third party" in the state and "face the wrath of people due to arrogant leaders".

Dushyant said Tanwar is a "grassroots" leader with a mass appeal and his support will benefit the JJP. He added that Tanwar's support to the JJP is not limited to the Assembly elections, but will continue.

The JJP leader said Tanwar will be addressing dozens of rallies in support of JJP till October 19.

Soon after the announcement, the two went to address a rally at Hathin to extend

support to the local JJP candidate.

Later in the day, Tanwar and his wife Avantika met senior INLD leader Abhay Chautala in Sirsa to announce his support to him in Ellenabad constituency. Abhay, in turn, invited Tanwar for an INLD rally.

Tanwar told local journalists that his decision to support the JIP is aimed at keeping the BJP out of power, adding that he would support the winnable candidates of the JJP and the INLD.

"The comrades who were with me during the days of struggle in the Congress will also get my support," he said.



Bhandara: Clean water on voters' minds, missing in poll campaign

RESIDENTS in Maharashtra's Bhandara Assembly segment have a word for the water that sometimes flows out of their taps during the monsoon — "Coca Cola". This blackish fluid pouring out of old pipelines has fuelled an exponential demand for RO (reverse osmosis) water in the area over the past four years.

Nearly 30 privately-run RO plants dot this city with a population of nearly a lakh. They sell 20-litre water jars for Rs 5 and charge Rs 25-Rs 30 for the same volume of cold water.

Kiran Chopekar, who runs one such plant, says the capital investment is not huge. His shop comprises two large tanks — one processing water at room temperature and the other cold water — and a series of pipes. Residents line up at the shop daily with plastic jars. When the shop shuts, those in need of water get it from the water ATM fitted beside the door.

Atul Algave, who runs a granite store at Nagour Naka, says there is no option but to use treated water. "The water supplied by the municipal council is not fit to drink or bathe in. Before customers step into my shop, they always ask if I have RO water inside," he says.

Over the past five years, Bhandara has been pushed into using RO systems as the water in Wainganga river, on whose banks it is situated, is highly polluted. Toxic industrial effluents and

Groundwater level sees a dip

THE MUSHROOMING of RO plants has resulted in a gradual dip in the groundwater level at Bhandara. The district administration, which now has to dig steadily deeper for borewells, admits that local supply could dry up unless those operating RO plants return excess water back into the ground.

sewage flow down the Nag river in Nagpur, which then joins the Wainganga.

While the Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC) has proposed to undertake a massive operation to clean up the Nag river, those living on the banks of the Wainganga have been de-

manding a swift solution to the crisis. Local residents have seized the business opportunity provided by the demand for clean

water. Each of Bhandara's 33 administrative wards has at least three privately-run RO plants, says Surender Makode. The 40-yearold, who runs four plants, says, "In Bhandara, we are now so used to drinking RO water that we cannot drink any other kind. If we do, we immediately catch a cold."

The issue, however, has not been addressed by any of the candidates in the fray for the Bhandara Assembly seat. "No candidate has spoken about resolving the issue. Had a water supply problem of this magnitude taken place in any other city, people would have come out on the streets in protest," says Makode. The municipal council has opened RO pla-

nts and set up water treatment plants. It has also started building new underground pipelines. "These pipelines were built during the British rule. When a crack develops in any pipe, water mixes with the earth and dirty water pours out," says Prashant Ganveer, Junior Engineer with the city water supply department.

Zilla parishad member and BJP candidate Arvind Bhaladhare says people in every locality he visited during canvassing have demanded a solution to the water crisis. "People need to understand that a project of this scale takes time to execute," he says. A key opponent to Bhaladhare is Narendra Bhondekar, who quit the Shiv Sena after being denied a ticket and is now contesting as an Independent. Sitting MLA, BJP's Ramchandra Avsare, did

not get a ticket this time.

IN THE battle for the Ulhasnagar Assembly

Omie agreed because it would still be in the family. When we did not get the ticket, we felt cheated."

She said that when she was being considered as the BJP candidate, Jyoti had resigned

from NCP. "It is now my duty to stand by her. We don't look at the party. We work as a family...we can't just leave our seat and sit at home," said Pancham. She is aware of the conseguences. "I have been treated like an outsider and I am being threatened with show cause notices. If necessary, I will resign from the party"

On a warm Wednesday afternoon, Ivoti is meeting a group of Sindhi businessmen and lawyers. They listen intently before one of them assures, "Don't worry. We will support you."

Ulhasnagar has flourished as a town of Sindhi migrants who moved to the town in Thane district after Partition.

According to information available with the UMC, Ulhasnagar, originally known as Kalyan Military transit camp, was especially set up to accommodate soldiers and others during World War II. The camp was deserted at the end of the war and came to be inhabited by Partition victims, mostly Sindhis, who moved into the town for a fresh start. The constituency has about 2.30 lakh reg-

istered voters, with Sindhis and Marathis as the major groups. In 2014, Jyoti defeated Ailani, a former MLA,

by a slim margin of 1,863 votes. "The BJP's issues like (dilution of) Section

370 in Kashmir don't resonate with voters here. They are worried about the economic slowdown and their suffering businesses and rising costs," says Jyoti. Thane BJP in-charge Ravindra Chavan said,

"We have already taken action against them (Pancham). We have issued them a notice. She may be campaigning because her mother-inlaw is contesting the election but this is contrary to the party interest. We will take action as per the rules." "We did not know that they would do something like this. They had sought a BJP

ticket. There were seven-eight aspirants. Out of them, Kumar Ailani was given the ticket. Only one candidate could have been chosen and the parliamentary board chose Ailani. The BJP, Shiv Sena and RPI are doing their best to ensure that Ailani wins. We are confident."

No footage of Babri demolition: TV guidelines

New Delhi: News channels must neither show any footage of the demolition of Babri Masjid nor broadcast any visuals of celebrations or protests on the issue of the disputed site in Ayodhya, according to guidelines issued on Wednesday by the News Broadcasting Standards Authority, a self-regulatory organisation for television news.

The NBSA issued nine specific guidelines on the "Ayodhya matter", keeping in mind the "sensitive nature" of the issue, and asked all editors part of the organisation, in an advisory, to ensure these are followed by all news channels, besides the Code of Ethics and Broadcasting Standards.

The NBSA advisory stated, "The reporting of the Ayodhya issue... is one in which extra care and caution needs to be exercised to ensure that the telecast of any news relating to it should not be sensational, inflammatory or provocative." ENS

No leave for **UP field** officials till November 30

Lucknow: The UP government on Wednesday issued an order saying officials on "field duty" will not be granted leave till November 30. The instructions come on the last day of the Supreme Court hearing in the Ayodhya land dispute case. The official order, however, attributed the decision to the festive season. Officials considered to be on field duty include police officers posted at the district and lower levels, as well as district magistrates.

As the five-judge Constitution Bench concludes the 40-day hearings on appeals, **Ananthakrishnan G** summarises the key arguments and SC's observations

■ Material unearthed by ASI points to presence of a "massive structure with features distinctive of a temple" beneath the ground on which the Babri Masjid stood. A significant discovery is a "pranala" — a discharge outlet attached to the temples — on the northern wall of the structure.

Drama in SC: Dhavan tears 'birthplace' map

ANANTHAKRISHNANG NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 16

UNPRECEDENTED SCENES were witnessed in the Supreme Court Wednesday, in the final hours of the Ayodhya hearings, when senior advocate Rajeev Dhavan, appearing for the UP Sunni Central Waqf Board, tore a map provided by a Hindu party.

This happened following an argument between Dhavan and senior advocate Vikas Singh who was representing the All India Hindu Mahasabha. Singh wanted the court to take on record a book Ayodhya Revisited, authored by retired IPS officer Kunal Kishore. Dhavan objected, saying the book was not part of the records before the Allahabad HC and it was not open to the other side to produce fresh evidence. Following an argument, Singh agreed not to submit the book. But he asked the bench to look at a map which, he said, showed Ram's birthplace. He said this map was also part of the records before the HC.

This infuriated Dhavan who asked CJI Ranjan Gogoi if he could throw it away. The CJI said he could tear it if he so wished. Dhavan promptly tore the map into pieces, at which Singh said "yeah, shred it further". When there were more interruptions, the CJI said it would be impossible to continue and the bench would rise if the parties didn't behave.

During the post-lunch session, Dhavan told the bench: "There is a controversy that I tore papers in the court on my own... I think I asked if I can throw it away, and CJI told me I can tear it if I want. So I tore it".

The CJI had a smile when he replied: "Yes, you are right... you can say the CJI told Mr Dhavan that if it's tearable, you can."

J&K govt revokes PSA against Shopian minor

Family had challenged detention under PSA in J&K HC

ADIL AKHZER SRINAGAR, OCTOBER 16

THE JAMMU and Kashmir government has informed the High Court that it has revoked the Public Safety Act (PSA) slapped against a minor from South Kashmir's Shopian district.

The boy's family had challenged his detention under the PSA in the J&K High Court. With this, the J&K government has revoked the PSA in all the four cases where the families had approached the High Court and said those detained were minors. In its dossier on the boy, the

Shopian Police had mentioned his age as "20 years". However, the judicial inquiry ordered by the J&K HC in September, concluded that he was 14 years old.

After submitting a habeas corpus petition, the boy's family members had submitted a school certificate stating that he was a minor.

On September 25, Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey had asked the Registrar Judicial, HC, to conduct an inquiry and "take such

evidence as may be necessary to determine the age of applicant detenue". The court had said the inquiry should be completed within 10 days. The report submitted by the

Registrar Judicial said: "To sum up all the statements, especially of principal, Maktaba Islamia High School, paternal uncle and brother of the petitioner detenu, as well as the documents brought by the principal, Maktaba Islamia High School, Shopian, the age of petitioner detenu, as on 10.08.2019, comes to about 14 years, 04 months and 25 days."

The police had said that the boy "has close liaison and friendship with active militants". "You used to assist both these militants in letter and spirit... You not only indulge in stone-pelting but instigate others to follow suit. As such, you continuously, without rhyme or reason, turn youths to stone pelting," it had said while giving its grounds for detention. It had listed four cases against him — three registered in 2019, and one in 2018.

Denying that the boy was involved in stone-pelting, his family said he worked as a baker and was the only earning member. His sister said since they couldn't afford to travel to meet the boy, who

HC: Give legal aid if necessary

THE I&K High Court on Wednesday directed that legal aid should be provided, "wherever necessary", to those detained under the PSA.

A division bench of Chief **Justice Gita Mittal and Justice** Rashid Ali Dar gave the direction while hearing a PIL filed by senior advocate Syed Tasaduque Hussain. Hussain said many detained under the PSA are from poor families and don't have the resources to engage a lawyer. He also said that many families could not travel to meet their relatives detained outside the state. He said the government should provide legal assistance in such cases.

Granting his plea, Chief Justice Gita Mittal issued directions that legal aid be provided to those detained "wherever necessary".

Hussain has also challenged the constitutional validity of the I&K PSA, and asked the court to scrap it. The case has been listed for November 6.

A DAY after they were arrested for trying to stage a silent sit-in in Srinagar to protest against the Centre's decision to revoke special status to Jammu and Kashmir, the J&K administration on Wednesday released 13 prominent women from the Valley, including the sister and daughter of Lok Sabha MP and former chief minister Faroog Abdullah.

After more than 30 hours in Srinagar's Central Jail, the activists were released after they signed a mandatory bond assuring that they would "not commit breach of peace".

"Yesterday they asked us to sign a bond to apologise (for the protest). We refused," said Muslim Ian, retired editor of Kashmir University students' newspaper who was among those arrested.

With Srinagar Central Jail running short of space, they were locked up in a room in the jail's new administrative block.

The arrested people included National Conference president Farooq Abdullah's sister Suraya and daughter Safiya Abdullah. Among the others arrested are Delhi-based activist and head of Centre for Dialogue and Reconciliation Sushoba Bharve, academic Hawa Bashir, who is

In a statement issued at the time of their arrest, they had said that they are individuals from different fields and "disapprove of the unilateral decision taken by the government to revoke Article 370, 35A and downgrade and split the state of Jammu and Kashmir.... Ants in eyes of dead patient; 2 docs suspended in MP hospital

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE BHOPAL, OCTOBER 16

A CIVIL surgeon and a doctor were among seven suspended on Wednesday by the Madhya Pradesh government for dereliction of duty after a local newspaper published a photograph showing ants inside the eyes of a dead patient in Shivpuri district

Health Minister Tulsi Silawat suspended civil surgeon Dr P K Khare and Dr Dinesh Rajput. Five others, including three staff nurses, a ward boy and a security guard, were also placed under suspension and a departmental inquiry ordered against them.

Patients had reportedly alerted the doctor and nurses on duty that the 50-year-old patient was dead but the body was not covered. On being informed by someone, the wife of the deceased came to remove the ants from the body.

FINANCIAL ACTION TASK FORCE PLENARY

Talks on blacklisting: China, Turkey for more time to Pak

SHUBHAJIT ROY NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 16

HECTIC NEGOTIATIONS are underway in Paris for the blacklisting of Pakistan at the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) plenary, where China, Turkey and Malaysia are learnt to be resisting India's efforts and the discussions are headed towards keeping it in greylist.

The Indian Express has learnt that China and Turkey are pushing for giving Pakistan a "little more time" to fulfill the commitments made. Saudi Arabia has not yet committed to giving sup-

port or oppose the Indian efforts. A final decision is expected to arrive by Friday afternoon about 4 pm IST on October 18.

At the meeting, India is learnt to have asked FATF members to blacklist Pakistan, citing the re-

cent example that Islamabad has allowed Mumbai terror attack mastermind Hafiz Saeed to withdraw funds from his frozen

According to the latest assessment by FATF's Asia Pacific Group's reports, Pakistan was found to be non-compliant in four areas, and partially compliant on 26 areas. It was found compliant in one area — and largely compliant in nine areas. The only area where it was found to be compliant was financial institution secrecy laws.

Sources said the FATF, which will see deliberations from October 13 till October 18, is "under intense discussions" on each of these commitments.

FATF procedure provides that after a year of grey-listing, if the action plan remains substantially unaddressed, the next step, which is black-listing, could be considered, sources said.

Officials from 37 countries and two regional organisations are discussing the issues pertaining to Pakistan.

FATF president Xiangmin Liu

opened the FATF plenary meeting. The key outcomes of the next three days of meetings on global action against money-laundering and terrorist-financing, and decisions on Pakistan, Iran and other countries will be announced on Friday, the FATF stated. Prime Minister Narendra

Modi and External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar had met their counterparts of many of these FATF member-countries in the last few weeks, especially at the UN.

While Modi had met leaders from Belgium, France, the US, the UK, Italy, New Zealand and South Africa, among others, at the UN, Jaishankar had met his counter-

parts from Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Singapore, Turkey and Japan at the UN. He has also met his counterparts from the two regional organisations in FATF — the GCC and the EC.

Earlier, Jaishankar had met leaders from Finland and has met his counterparts from France, Germany and Canada. Doval and Jaishankar had also visited Russia separately. According to sources, be-

tween Modi, Jaishankar and Doval, they have had meetings with leaders and ministers from at least 24 out of 37 countries in the last few weeks.

After the second informal summit at Mahabalipuram on October 11-12, the MEA said, Modi and China's President Xi Jinping were "concerned that terrorism continues to pose a common threat".

Cattle population down in UP, increases in Bengal

HARIKISHAN SHARMA NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 16

DESPITE A marginal increase in cattle population in the country, the number of cattle is down in the Hindi-speaking belt, particularly in BJP-ruled Uttar Pradesh.

On the other hand, the number has gone up in West Bengal.

The 20th Livestock Census report, released by the Wednesday, shows that the total cattle population in the country is 192.49 million in 2019. marginally up from 190.90 million in 2012, when the last such

In Uttar Pradesh, the number of cattle is down from 19.6 million in 2012 to 18.8 million (down 3.93 per cent). The buffalo population in the state has gone up by 7.81 per cent from 30.6 million in 2012

The total population of buffaloes in the country has gone up from 108.70 million in 2012 to 109.85 million in 2019

to 33 million.

The decrease in cattle population in Uttar Pradesh comes at a time when the Yogi Adityanath-led BJP government has made cow protection a major political issue and taken several steps to save cattle.

The state has also seen a rise in incidents of cow vigilantism by self-styled gaurakshaks.

Apart from Uttar Pradesh, the cattle count is down in Madhya Pradesh (by 4.42 per cent), Maharashtra (10.07 per cent) and Odisha (15.01 per cent).

On the other hand, West Bengal has seen a rise in cattle population by 15.18 per cent,

Bihar by 25.18 per cent, and Jharkhand by 28.16 per cent between 2012 and 2019.

According to the latest livestock census data, the number of cattle in West Bengal has gone up to 19 million in 2019 from 16.5 million in 2012. In the same period, the number of cattle has gone up from 12.2 million to 15.3

million in adjoining Bihar. Jharkhand has seen a rise in cattle population from 8.7 million to 11.2 million during this period.

The total population of buffaloes in the country has gone up from 108.70 million in 2012 to 109.85 million in 2019. The states which have seen a rise in buffalo population in this period include Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Maharashtra and Telangana Some states, including Andhra Pradesh, Haryana and Punjab, have seen a decline in buffalo

26-yr-old found dead, AMU students allege delay, clash with police

According to the FIR, students began a violent protest after police personnel allegedly reached late to remove the body.

The AMU administration and the police have denied allegations made by the protesters.

For bid to intimidate witnesses in court, 27 Chennai students jailed

ARUN JANARDHANAN CHENNAI, OCTOBER 16

IN A bizarre court-room drama, 27 college students in Chennai were arrested and sent to jail Tuesday for allegedly trying to intimidate witnesses in a murder trial — by staring at them.

According to police, the students were trying to help their classmate who is a cousin of two men accused in the murder last vear of a brick kiln owner in Tiruvallur, about 50 km north of Chennai city.

Police said those arrested from the sessions court hall in Tiruvallur. where the trial is being conducted, were first and second-year students of the Nandanam government arts and science college in Chennai.

"All of them were mobilised by the accused in the court hall during the trial. They were trying to intimidate witnesses. They had come from different places outside Tiruvallur. The police were alerted by one of the witnesses and we secured them from the court itself," said P Aravindan, SP Tiruvallur.

"There were six witnesses to be heard. As the court procedure was on, one of the witnesses alerted an officer about the suspicious presence of youth inside the hall who were staring at him and others. As the statements of witnesses were being heard in a tense environment, these students had been asked to intimidate them. There were some 30 students and we managed to arrest 27," said an officer who was present

in court when the incident happened.

"They had come on the request of one of their classmates who is the cousin of two of the accused. The cousin brought them all the way from Chennai to Tiruvallur for the trial," the officer said. The students have been remanded in Puzhal Central Jail in Chennai. The cousin of the accused, who got the students to court, were among those who managed to escape, police said.

Attempt for recusal of judge nothing but bench hunting: SC

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 16

THE SUPREME Court on Wednesday deprecated attempts made for recusal of a judge from a Constitution bench hearing challenges to provisions of the Land Acquisition Act, saying it is nothing but a ploy of "bench hunting" which, if allowed, "would destroy the institution".

The top court said if request of parties demanding that Justice Arun Mishra be recused from the five-judge Constitution bench is accepted, it would be the "blackest chapter in history" as an "onslaught is going on to tame the judiciary".

The bench, also comprising justices Indira Banerjee, Vineet Sharan, MR Shah and SRavindra Bhat, said it would pronounce order on October 23 on the plea seeking the recusal.

"This is nothing but an attempt of bench hunting and you want a person of your liking to be in the bench. If we allow your request and accept your view for recusal of judge, it will be destroying the institution. This is a serious issue and history will judge it that even senior counsel were involved in

this attempt," Justice Mishra told senior advocate Shyam Divan, appearing for some farmer associations.

Divan contended that a judge must avoid any reasonable apprehension of bias, otherwise there would be erosion of public confidence and their prayer for recusal is nothing but for upholding the integrity of the institution.

He said their prayer is not remotely concerned with bench hunting and "there are global principles that have to be applied here. We are only drawing attention to it".

During the hearing, Justice Mishra observed that the plea seeking his recusal from the bench is "sponsored" and said, "In case, we succumb to these attempts this would be the blackest chapter in the history. These forces are trying to compel the court to act in a particular way. Onslaught is going on to tame this institution. This cannot be the way, must not be the way, and shall not be the way."

Without naming anybody, Justice Mishra said, "These forces which are trying to compel this court to act in a particular way...are compelling me to continue. Otherwise, I would have recused."

Men have to be equally involved, say some members

THE NEW Parliamentary com-

mittee on women's empowerment is an all-woman affair, a fact many of its members call "shocking". They said the committee has earlier always had men as members, and they were enthusiastic participants in the deliberations. BJP MP Locket Chatterjee de-

fended composition of the committee and said if women such as Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, Women and Child Development Minister Smriti Irani and former External Affairs Minister, late Sushma Swaraj, can hold powerful Cabinet posts women MPs are enough to talk about women's empowerment.

While the committee has traditionally been dominated by women, complete absence of men is a new development. The committee, notified earlier this month, has 30 members - 20 from Lok Sabha and 10 from the Upper House - and is chaired by BJP's Heena Gavit.

Parliamentary committees are usually constituted for a period of one year, or until they fulfill their mandate, as happens for select committees. NCP MP Vandana Chavan,

member of the present committee and who has been part of previous panels, said: "It is shocking. Normally there are some male members...there has to be some male members because women's issues are not just women's issues - they are social issues. Men have to address them just as much as women, and unless men are equally involved there is no point, because it really is an issue of the male mindset. It cannot be addressed by women alone."

In fact, she proposed reservation for men in the committee to "make it effective - may be 33 per cent (reservation for men)". Rajya Sabha MPs Prabhat Jha,

Anubhav Mohanty (now in Lok Sabha) and A V Swamy have been members of this committee in the past, and Chavan remembered them as enthusiastic participants.

TMC's Satabdi Roy, another member, said is little point if men, who are a "part of the problem", are not a part of the solution. Roy said said even though the panel deals with women's issues, that issue is there not just because of women. "The problem is how men look at things -

half the battle is to make men understand those issues. Men need to understand our problems so that we can solve them. Unless they become a part of the solution, I do not think it can work," she said.

Committee chairperson Gavit was not available for a comment; she is currently hospitalised in Nandurbar, Maharashtra. Congress's Chhaya Verma

asked why in a day and age when women do not have a problem consulting male gynaecologists men not be a part of a committee on women's empowerment. "But you really need to ask this to the people who constituted the committee," she said.

BJP's Chatterjee, who is also president of the party's women's wing in West Bengal, said, "There are 78 women MPs in Parliament and we are enough to deal with the issue (of women's empowerment). I am not saying male members are not required - that is how social balance is struck - but in this issue women would connect better with women, understand their issues and their realities better, and solve those problems."

'Leaks to media': MP IAS officers write to chief secretary

ACCUSING STATE probe agencies of seeking publicity by leaking to the media details of complaints and likely conclusions before conducting a proper inquiry into merits of the case, the Madhya Pradesh IAS Officers' Association on Wednesday approached Chief Secretary S R Mohanty, seeking "appropriate advisory"

to the investigating agencies. The association shot off the letter after the Economic Offences Wing named a senior IAS officer, now on deputation to the Centre, in connection with alleged irregularities in award of Rs 300-crore tender for setting up Integrated Command Control Centre.

"This is quite demoralizing for government servants and adversely affects decision making. Officers have to often take complex decision, involving multiple stakeholders, in their official capacity. There are cases where stakeholders/competitors adversely impacted by the final decision, approach courts to challenge the decisions or file complaints before relevant entities. It's expected that the investigating agencies will objectively inquire into these complaints while ensuring that reputation of institutions and individuals is not unnecessarily tarnished," wrote Association president Gauri Singh to the Chief Secretary.

ARMY COMMANDERS' CONFERENCE

Pension plan for war veterans not absorbed in forces discussed

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 16

A PROPOSAL to provide pension to Army veterans, who joined duty under Emergency Commission and Short Service Commission, and actively participated in the wars in 1965 and 1971 but could not be absorbed in service later, was discussed on the third day of the biannual Army Commanders' Conference Wednesday.

The Army leadership was also apprised about the Officers Automated Structured Information System (OASIS) — a project for digitisation of service records of all Army officers. The project, hosted on Army's intranet, was rolled out on June 4 but uploading of records started only on September 29, Army sources said.

The proposal to provide a pension amount of nearly Rs 30,000 per month, at par with what the Union Home Ministry gives to freedom fighters, has been in the works since March when the Army wrote to Defence Ministry. The ministry responded in May, asking for more details for justifi-

cation and entitlement. The proposal was discussed by the Army leadership on Wednesday and a reply will be sent to the Defence Ministry soon, sources said.

There are 2,000 such potential beneficiaries, who have already been provided medical benefits under the Ex-Servicemer Contributory Health Scheme.

Data available with the Pune office of the Controller of Defence Accounts (Officers), information about payslips, allowances etc will also be integrated with the OASIS making it easier for an officer to check information.

Since it is hosted on Army's intranet, officers posted in areas such as Tawang or Siachen with no internet availability will also be able to access it. The Army's manpower planning office will be responsible for OASIS.

Officers can log in to the OASIS and "see their personal records such as leave, encashment among others", and "occurrences in the life of an officer", sources said. "If the officer finds something wrong in the records", there is a query box through which a rectification can be sought.



UNCHECKED DECLINE

Trade data suggests weak domestic and global demand. Tinkering won't do, government needs to push reforms

NDIA'S MERCHANDISE EXPORTS continued their subdued performance, contracting by 6.57 per cent in September this year. Over the first half of this financial year, exports have contracted by 2.39 per cent, indicating that GDP growth is unlikely to have received a fillip from the external sector in the second quarter as well. Equally worrying, non-oil non-gold imports, an indicator of domestic demand, contracted for the 11th straight month, indicating continued weakness in domestic demand. Coupled with sluggish investment activity, as leading economic indicators suggest, these numbers point towards a subdued economic outlook in the near term. Unsurprisingly, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) has lowered its forecast for economic growth to 6.1 per cent this year, down from its earlier estimate of 7 per cent — bringing it in line with the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) assessment of the Indian economy.

Part of the decline in exports can be traced to a fall in petroleum exports. But, it is cause for concern that exports of major labour intensive segments such as gems and jewellery, garment and leather products, continue to decline. In fact, non-oil exports have contracted by 1.7 per cent in the first half of this financial year, with 22 of the 30 major export segments contracting in September. In part, the sluggish export performance can be attributed to a synchronised global slowdown. Exports of other nations have also been weak during this period. In fact, the IMF has also lowered its forecast for global GDP growth to 3 per cent. Then there are issues of competitiveness that afflict exports. An overvalued exchange rate and a complicated GST process exacerbates matters. But, the collapse in imports is equally worrying. Imports have contracted by 13.85 per cent in September, and by 7 per cent over the first half of this year. Excluding oil and gold, imports of other items have contracted by 5.6 per cent in the April-September period, signalling weak consumer and industrial demand. The situation is likely to have been exacerbated by inventory destocking — which along with risk aversion by banks could explain the collapse in credit flow to the commercial sector during this period.

The government has announced several steps to boost exports. But these are not enough. At this juncture, mere tinkering will not suffice. The government must draw on its political capital to push through contentious reforms that address the deeper structural issues plaguing the economy. Even in the midst of a slowdown in global trade, India, which accounts for around 2 per cent of global trade, should look aggressively to expand its share. After all, in the current economic environment of subdued domestic demand and investment, exports could provide the much needed boost to growth.

PULLBACK AND CHAOS

US withdrawal from Kurdish Syria, the manner in which it has been done, augurs more instability in the region

N OCTOBER 15, US President Donald Trump tweeted that "after defeating 100% of the ISIS caliphate... I said to my generals, why should we be fighting for Syria and Assad to protect the land of our enemy? Anyone who wants to assist Syria in protecting the Kurds, whether it is Russia, China or Napoleon Bonaparte. I hope they do great, we are 7,000 miles away". The most charitable view of Trump's withdrawal of US forces from north-east Syria, an area under Kurdish control with its capital in Rojava, is that he is attempting to fulfill his promise of extricating the US from the conflicts it has been embroiled in across the globe ahead of the 2020 US presidential elections. The manner of the troop withdrawal, though, has strengthened the Bashar al Assad regime, sharpened the conflict in the region, as well as increased the influence of Russia in West Asia. From a US foreign policy perspective, these outcomes are an unmitigated failure. For regional and global security, they augur a time of instability.

In the immediate aftermath of Trump's decision, Turkey's President Recep Erdogan ordered his troops into the region, and there are reports of civilian casualties. US troops had suffered minimal casualties and were a buffer protecting the Kurdish forces. Erdogan, who is facing a violent Kurdish-led in insurgency in his own country, seems to be seeking a deeper strategic buffer through military control of Syria's autonomous Kurdish region. In a corner, and abandoned by their US allies, Rojava has sought assistance from Assad, and Russia and Iran too are expected to back the Assad regime, filling the power vacuum left by the US. Erdogan, for his part, seems undeterred by the sporadic threats of sanctions and other diplomatic consequences by the US and NATO. Trump's sudden withdrawal, without getting security guarantees from Ankara, is likely

to be counterproductive. First, the claim that the "ISIS caliphate" has been defeated may be technically true, but many IS fighters retreated into remote parts of Iraq and Syria. Since the conflict in Syria began in 2015, the Kurds, helped by their US allies, were instrumental in the fight against the Islamic State. The remnants of the IS, now, may be emboldened. Second, the Assad regime, which the US accused of war crimes, has consolidated and its influence is certainly waxing, along with that of Russia. Finally, an aggressive and expansionist Turkey could pose a long-term challenge to the regional balance of power. It has long been a NATO ally and even houses a US military base with nuclear capabilities. In the near term, what is required is well-thought out, firm diplomacy by the US and other world powers, that goes far beyond

A WIN-WIN

In embracing both Atwood and Evaristo, the Booker prize makes a heartening statement

HE 2019 BOOKER Prize for Fiction has been awarded jointly to Margaret Atwood, for The Testaments, and Bernardine Evaristo, for Girl, Woman, Other, opening up a backlash against the selection of two winners, when the rules, tweaked in 1993, stipulate that the prize cannot be shared. But this has been

an unusual Booker season in more ways than one, and, mostly for happy reasons. Of the 13 books on the longlist this year, eight were by women. The shortlist of six had four women authors. The 1959-born Evaristo is the first black woman to win the Booker since its 1969 inception. Atwood, at 79, is the oldest-ever winner. Once we get past the statistics — and ruffled emotions — we could take a moment to let it sink in that this could well be the year when the Booker Prize came of age. In rebelling against convention and going beyond discussions of colour, age or other restrictive notions, it has embraced both the overarching genius of Atwood and the sparkling originality of Evaristo's achievement. A vocal advocate of inclusive literature and gay rights, the eight-book-old Evaristo has worked for the stage and radio, besides writing short fiction, poetry and essays. Atwood,

who won the Booker first in 2000 for *The Blind Assassin*, needs little introduction. This is not to say that the inequity will end with this year's award. Dana Beth Weinberg and Adam Kapelner of Queens College-CUNY, in a 2018 paper published in the journal PLOS One, presented sobering findings — books by women were revealed to be priced, on an average, 45 per cent lower than books by men. For writers of colour, especially women, the numbers are starker. But the conversation around women's writing must be more widely joined. As one of the Booker judges, Afua Hirsch, wrote, "You cannot compare them. But you can recognise them both. And I'm glad this is what we did."

There is a contradiction in trying to attract foreign investors before reforming labour, land acquisition laws

PRIME MINISTER NARENDRA Modi launched the Make in India campaign on September 25, 2014 with these words: "I tell the world, 'Make in India'. Sell anywhere but manufacture here." Modi aspired to emulate China — a country he had visited many times as Gujarat chief minister — in attracting foreign investment to industrialise India. The objective was, officially, to increase the manufacturing sector's growth rate to 12-14 per cent per annum in order to increase this sector's share in the economy from 16 to 25 per cent of the GDP by 2022 — and to create 100 million additional jobs by then.

Five years later, this policy has produced contrasting results. Foreign direct investment (FDI) has increased from \$16 billion in 2013-14 to \$36 billion in 2015-16. But this remarkable achievement needs to be qualified from two standpoints. First, FDIs have plateaued since 2016 and second, they are not contributing to India's industrialisation. FDIs in the manufacturing sector, in fact, are on the wane. In 2017-18, they were just above \$7 billion, as against \$9.6 billion in 2014-15. Services cornered most of the FDIs – \$23.5 billion, more than three times that of the manufacturing sector. This is a clear reflection of the the Indian economy's traditional strong points, where computer services, for instance, are remarkably developed. But can a country rely on services without developing an industrial base? The response is clearly no and this is why "Make in India" was initiated.

The idea, then, was to promote export-led growth: Foreign investors were invited to make in India, not necessarily for India. But few investors have been attracted by this prospect, and India's share in the global exports of manufactured products remains around 2 per cent — China's is around 18 per cent.

Why has Make in India failed to deliver? First, a large fraction of the Indian FDI is neither foreign nor direct but comes from Mauritius-based shell companies. Indian tax authorities suspected that most of these investments were "black money" from India, which was routed via Mauritius. Second, the Bureaucratic procedures and corruption continue to make India less attractive for investors. It has made progress in the World Bank's Ease of Doing Business index, but even then, is ranked 77 among 190 countries. This is not just because of insufficient skills, but also because the size of the industrial units is too small for attaining economies of scale, investing in modern equipment and developing supply chains. Why are companies small? Partly by choice, because labour regulations are more complicated for plants with more than 100 employees. Government approval is required under the Industrial Disputes Act of 1947 before laying off any employee and the Contract Labour Act of 1970 requires government and employee approval for simple changes in an employee's job description or duties. Infrastructure is also a problem area.

Although electricity costs are about the same in India and China, power outages are much higher in India. Moreover, transportation takes much more time in India. According to Google Maps, it takes about 12.5 hours to travel the 1,213 km distance between Beijing to Shanghai. There was clearly a contradiction in the attempt to attract foreign investors to Make in India before completing the reforms of labour and land acquisition laws. Liberalisation is not the panacea for all that ails the economy, but it is a prerequisite if India intends to follow an export-oriented growth pattern.

A significant move in this direction was made last month with the reduction of the company tax from about 35 to about 25 per cent (at least on paper), a rate comparable with most of India's neighbours. This reform is also consistent with the government's effort to compete with South East Asian countries, in particular, to attract FDIs. This competition has acquired a new dimension in the context of the US-China trade dispute. After the Trump administration increases tariffs on Chinese exports to the US, several companies will shift their plants from China to other Asian countries. Some of them have already done so. According to the Japanese financial firm Nomura, only three of the 56 companies that decided to relocate from China moved to India. Of them, Foxconn is a major player which will be now assembling its top-end iPhones in India. Whether other big multinationals will begin to show interest at manufacturing in India remains to be seen.

But India will have to face another external challenge too as it sees capital fleeing the country. The net outflow of capital has jumped as the rupee has dropped from 54 a dollar in 2013 to more than 70 to a dollar in 2019, at a time when oil is becoming more expensive.

SAFFRON IN THE SLUMS

Among the urban poor, two strands of Hindutva mobilisation are emerging

B R AMBEDKAR often expressed how the Indian village was the setting for the discrimination of Dalits, and that they should migrate to cities. Dalits do suffer from the myriad oppressions heaped on them by dominant castes and along with other marginal sections of society, have migrated to cities, towns and kasbahs and settled mostly in slums. They constitute about 17 per cent of the country's urban-dwelling population. In Uttar Pradesh, slum dwellers constitute about 14 per cent of the urban population, according to the 2011 census. Most of them are poor and from marginalised sections.

Slums have emerged as sites for the practice of Hindutva politics. We are habituated to viewing this section of people as subjects who desire and demand houses, jobs, ration cards, medical treatment, etc. But they also aspire towards creating small temples in their bastis, where they can assemble, worship and share their joys and sorrows (sukhdukh) with their neighbours. With economic betterment, slum dwellers are also aspiring for religious empowerment. Dalits and other marginalised people residing in slums are becoming increasingly aware of their religious identity as Hindus.

The RSS and its various affiliates enter slums through running schools, organising medical camps, etc. RSS shakhas are also expanding their footprint among the urban poor by giving them a "Hindu" identity. Small Hindutva organisations with various names such as Hindu Yuva Vahini and Hindu Rakshak Sangh have been working in the

These two types of organisations have differing strategies. On the one hand, the RSS and some of its affiliates are working among the urban poor through "sewa" and "sahyog". The RSS-generated discourse is aimed at reshaping their identity as "Hindu Nagrik", by inspiring them to imbibe and perform various Hindu sanskaras. In contrast, the other organisations are trying to produce a proud identity as Hindus among Dalit slum dwellers.

The tone and tenor of these two Hindutva-based campaigns is producing two different political cultures. These may overlap, but they also diverge into two streams of Hindutva identity. The first positions itself as a "soft Hindu" identity, while the second is a proponent of an aggressive Hinduism. At times, the RSS looks uncomfortable with the presence and growing influence of these smaller, aggressive Hindutva outfits. The Sangh appears to have some difficulty in handling these groups. One may find conflict and contestation between these two streams of Hindutva politics.

Both kinds of outfits help to create a political ambience that likely helps a party like the BJP. But they are producing two different kinds of Hindutva subjectivities: The first wants to appropriate the communities in these slums within its own Hindutva frame; the second does not tolerate any difference in identity and culture.

It is certainly the case that only a thin line separates the two political cultures emerging in the slums of UP. But both these strands are working separately. Some people, who form the backbone of the smaller groups, may have been part of an RSS shakha at some point in their lives, but they have now evolved their own ways of functioning.

At one point, slums were considered a space for radical Ambedkarite and Left politics. That appears to be changing in UP. From the initial years, when Kanshi Ram used these sites to evolve Bahujan politics, they are now turning into Hindutva spaces.

The transformation of these social locations from the BSP's "blue" to saffron is taking place at a rapid pace. Since Hindutva groups use religious identity as an important axis of social, political and cultural mobilisation, they have managed to link the economic aspiration in UP's slums with religious empowerment.

Today, in the slums, one can view wellorganised programmes featuring chants of the Sunder Kand Path and Hanuman Chalisa. The RSS is also working towards building small temples dedicated to Hindu deities.

Both types of Hindutva organisations see religious conversion as a threat in these societies and view their work as antidote to the same. They claim that their efforts are strengthening Hindu society.

Light on national security

Signs of long-pending reforms are finally visible. But the lack of clarity about the role of Chief of Defence Staff and bellicose talk by politicians and soldiers are not reassuring





STRATEGIC CULTURE IS said to have a significant impact on national security and state behaviour. In 1992, RAND Corporation analyst, George Tanham had pronounced that a combination of "lofty Hindu philosophy and a fatalistic outlook" had prevented the development of a strategic culture in India, and that "... Indian elites showed little evidence of having systematically thought about national strategy". Tanham's contentions were contested by those who asserted that being heirs to the rich philosophy of Vedic literature, epics like the Ramayana and Mahabharata, and the wisdom of Chanakya's Arthashastra, Indians had never lacked a strategic culture. They also, stressed that, right from independence, India had followed a pragmatic grand strategy, scripted by Jawaharlal Nehru. Its elements included, domestically, secular federalism, a socialist command-economy, pursuit of self-reliance and externally, and a policy of non-alignment to avoid military conflicts. This Nehruvian legacy was accompanied

by a utopian proclivity for pacifism and disdain for the armed forces, rooted in phobia about military coups. According to Yale University professor, Steven Wilkinson, the Congress party evolved "specific coup-proofing' strategies to balance the power of the military during India's first decade". Most of these measures have remained in place ever since: The military continues to be excluded from the government's policy/decision-making process and the armed forces HQs are still subordinated to a civilian Department of Defence. Wilkinson suggests that the growth of the Central Armed Police Forces from 29,000 in 1961 to 1.1 million in 2017 is another "coup proofing" measure to "balance" the 1.3-million army.

The past five years have seen the last vestiges of the Nehruvian legacy being progressively swept away. Conclusive proof of this came when the present government ordered retaliatory raids, in peace time, on Pakistani soil. These not only marked a major shift of political focus that brought national security to centrestage, but also shattered two shibboleths: First, that India's timidity, disguised as "strategic restraint", was a chronic affliction; and second, that any armed incursion into Pakistan, ran the risk of a nuclear response. The latter, in any case, was an excessively alarmist view, given that the nuclear "red lines" informally signalled by Pakistan are far more stringent.

With the 2019 election-campaign behind us and politics having resumed normal tempo, there has been speculation whether the NDA government's newfound focus on national security signifies a strategic transformation or merely a vote-garnering election gambit. Such scepticism was not unjustified, given that the BJP's 2014 election manifesto, had promised to "address the issue of organisational reforms" in defence, and to "ensure greater participation of armed forces in the decision-making process of the MoD". While the ensuing five years saw no change in South Block, some recent "straws in the wind" may indicate growing political



interest in national security issues. The most significant of these and one that demands our close attention is the long awaited initiation of national security reforms. One hopes that the April 2018 appointment of the National Security Adviser (NSA) to head the newly constituted Defence Planning Committee and his post-election elevation to cabinet rank were harbingers of this reform-process.

A lack of transparency, however, raises larger questions about the roles of the Raksha Mantri (RM), the Chiefs of Staff and the Defence Secretary vis-a-vis the NSA in the new ambit of national security decisionmaking. While Prime Minister Modi's announcement, on August 15, about creation of a Chief of Defence Staff (CDS), received widespread welcome, it adds a new and complex dimension to India's national security paradigm.

A CDS must not be created in isolation because, normatively, it carries with it a whole eco-system that could transform India's national security, if correctly implemented. In theory, as the senior-most armed forces officer and Chairman Chiefs of Staff Committee, the CDS would be the military adviser to the PM and RM. Apart from his key role in the nuclear command chain, he would evolve a prioritised tri-service perspective plan for force modernisation and enable fiscal support. This task would be immeasurably facilitated by the issuance of a national security doctrine/strategy which highlights national aims, objectives and interests, and clearly defines the military wherewithal required to achieve them.

The CDS would oversee the integration of the armed forces HQs with the civilian MoD and implement "jointness" amongst the three armed forces, progressively ushering in the theatre command concept. In reality, however, if not empowered adequately or if found in conflict with the NSA, the CDS could easily be reduced to an inconsequential "paper-tiger".

Another topic that two RMs, in succession, have dwelt upon — albeit in passing is the principle of "no first use" (NFU) of nuclear weapons embedded in India's 2003 Nuclear Doctrine. NFU was adopted, not merely as a token of nuclear restraint and responsible conduct, on India's part, but also because it is, by far, the least burdensome and inexpensive form of nuclear-deterrence.

While ambiguity and doctrinal unpredictability may be useful to keep one's adversary off-balance, nuclear deterrence is far too serious a matter to be the subject of offthe-cuff public utterances by senior politicians. On the other hand, a formal review of the nuclear doctrine (including the NFU undertaking) is long overdue and must be undertaken.

In similar vein is casual, bellicose talk about "re-taking" of Pakistan Occupied Kashmir, presumably by military means. Let us remember that a major part of J&K's territory has been in our physical possession since the state legally acceded to India in 1947. Whether the hearts and minds of the people of the Valley are with us, remains a question unanswered. Once peace and prosperity prevail in our J&K, it is more than likely that the people of PoK would clamour to join their Indian brethren.

Finally, a word of advice for our military leadership. It is most heartening for the citizen to hear, from them, that our troops are in fine fettle and combat-ready. However, one's confidence evaporates when they are heard parroting political rhetoric or indulging in bombast. We are not Pakistan, and dignified reticence on the part of our soldiery would be far more reassuring.

Intelligence of the future

AI could transform the world. India and UAE could be partners in the transformation

I REMEMBER watching the 1997 battle of the chess "grandmasters", one a person and the other a machine. The machine, IBM's Deep Blue supercomputer, eventually defeated the human, world chess champion Gary Kasparov. And I wonder what the result would be today if an AI-run machine were to be pitted against the current world chess champion Magnus Carlsen.

The result probably would be the same but with one difference — the play would be far more exciting than it was more than two decades ago. Deep Blue didn't use techniques that would be considered true AI by today's standards. Instead it relied on "brute force" methods of calculating every possible option at high speed, rather than analysing gameplay and learning about the

Since 1997, AI has advanced a great deal, but so has our understanding of this extraordinary technology. Therefore, the more important question today is not whether AI could outsmart some of the most brilliant minds on earth, but how we can leverage AI as a powerful and tremendously efficient tool.

Governments and businesses around the world are determined to make the next decade a truly transformative time, with experts predicting that by 2030 AI could contribute \$16 trillion to the global economy. However, the humankind, not AI, will be the real driver of such transformation. The UAE's founding father, the late

Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, understood the real driver behind any substantial progress: "No matter how many buildings, foundations, schools and hospitals we build, or how many bridges we raise, all these are material entities. Between image and reality

Under Yogi Adityanath, Uttar Pradesh is making a break from its past

WHEN A respected english news magazine adjudged UP chief minister Yogi Adityanath as the best performing CM across big Indian states on Independence Day eve, it was an endorsement of his government's work in the past two-and-a-half years. The Adityananth government has already reached milestones that a majority of previous governments couldn't accomplish in their full tenure.

The figures speak for themselves. By creating over 2.5 lakh jobs in the government sector and over 20 lakh jobs in the private sector, the government has surpassed the job-creation record of the Samajwadi Party and Bahujan Samaj Party regimes. Another achievement of the Adityanath government is getting the status of best-performing state on 20 different counts, including the implementation of Central schemes. Be it the construction of over 25 lakh houses under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana and 2.61 crore toilets under Swachh Bharat, 1.35 crore LPG connections under Ujjawala Yojana and 1.1 crore power connections under the Saubhagya scheme, the state is number one in the country. Adityanath's first decision as CM was to waive Rs 36,000 crore worth of loans of over 86 lakh farmers. Since then, UP has become the first state to make DBT payment to its farmers.

The central government has honoured the state for making maximum purchases through e-markets. It is also number one in establishing micro, medium and small en-

terprises. The Adityanath government has paid a record Rs 73,000 crore to cane farmers, who were reeling under crop losses. The government's earnings have increased by almost 24 per cent under key heads as compared to the SP regime. The revenue under six major heads — excise, commercial tax, transport, mining, GST and VAT, and registration — has gone up to Rs 1.2 lakh crore in 2018-19, compared to Rs 86,000 crore in 2016-17 under the SP regime.

Law and order has been UP's bane and lawlessness reached its zenith during the SP regime. Adityanath took the menace by its horns. The elimination of over 100 and the arrest of over 10,000 dreaded criminals has not only broken the swag of anti-social elements, but has also restored people's confidence in the government and the police. Those who accuse the government of pursuing an "encounter policy" should realise that there is no policy as such. It's just a matter of giving operational freedom to the police to tackle crime.

Those who still cite cases like the Unnao rape case — more of a social issue than a law and order problem — should actually see the difference on ground. The government also cleared the long-pending recruitment of 75,000 police personnel and is all set to recruit many more.

On the education front, the biggest feat of the UP government has been the decimation of the copying mafia in board examinations.

The examination centres which were hotspots of organised copying have been debarred.

During the previous regimes, MoUs would be announced but nothing much followed. We have already seen two groundbreaking ceremonies in which investment worth Rs 1.50 lakh crore — out of Rs 4.28 lakh crore pledged at the February 2018 investors meet — has actualised.

The Lucknow Metro has been operationalised. Work on the Agra and Kanpur metros is on the fast track. The government is also targeting a 24-month deadline for completing three expressways – Poorvanchal, Bundelkhand and Ganga. These super highways will provide direct road access to the national capital: One can drive down to any corner of the state from Delhi in 8-10 hours.

The success of the government in controlling Japanese encephalitis in eastern UP is the stuff of folklore. When over 60 children died at Gorakhpur's BRD Hospital in August 2017, Adityanath was unfairly criticised. Everyone forgot that he was the only leader from eastern UP who fought for the eradication of encephalitis — from Parliament to the street. He, however, took the criticism in his stride and marshalled a final assault on the menace. Result: The number of deaths from AES has dropped from 655 in 2017 to just 42 in 2019 (till September 15). The number of JE cases has dropped from 93 to just 4.
