City may see rain due to cyclone

Hyderabad: The city could experience isolated rain accompanied by thunder-showers under the influence of a cyclonic circulation, the Indian Meteorological Department said on Friday. The districts of Mahbubabad, Bhadrachalam, Suryapet, Khammam, Mahbubnagar, Wanaparthy, Nalgonda and Jogulamba Gadwal could receive heavy rainfall, it said. The maximum temperature in the city fell to 29.3°C, against the norm of 31°C to 33°C at this time of the year.

Pak on grey list for terror funding

Paris: Pakistan was again put on the Grey List of the international terror financing watchdog Financial Action Task Force (FATF), which on Friday warned Islamabad of action for its failure to combat money laundering and terror financing, officials said. If Pakistan continues with the Grey List, it would be very difficult for the country to get financial aid from the global lenders. — PTI

Justice Bobde will be new CJI

New Delhi: Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi on Friday sent a letter to the Centre recommending Justice S.A. Bobde, who is next in seniority, as his successor. Official sources said that Justice Gogoi wrote a letter to the Ministry of Law and Justice recommending Justice Bobde to be the next CJI. Justice Gogoi, who was sworn in as the 46th CJI on October 3, 2018, will demit office on November 17. — PTI

HC orders RTC bosses to begin talks with staff

Court asks RTC MD and unions to keep in mind people's plight

The Telangana High Court on Friday directed the management of the TSRTC to invite RTC employees and workers' unions and the RTC Telangana Mazdoor Union for negotiations as the RTC workers unions were not stressing on the merger of RTC into the government as a pre-requisite to enter into dialogue.

A High Court bench asked the RTC management to enter into talks as expeditiously as possible to resolve the disputes and build confidence between the corporation and unions.

A division bench comprising Chief Justice Raghuvendra Singh Chauhan and Justice A. Abhishek Reddy was dealing with public interest litigations concerning common people's plight during the RTC workers strike. The petitions challenged the extension of Dasara vacation to educational institutes in view of disruption of public transportation across the state.

The HC bench asked the RTC MD and the workers' unions to keep in mind the agony of common people, and told both parties that they should negotiate

KCR lets officials talk to RTC staff

Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao on Friday night is said to have given his nod to senior officials of the road transport department to initiate steps to hold talks with the leaders of the RTC joint action committee (JAC) to resolve their crisis and look into the workers' demands.

Mr Chandrashekar Rao held a review meeting with senior officials of the transport department, along with minister Puvvada Ajay Kumar, in the wake of the HC's instructions to

the RTC managing director. The court directed the RTC MD to find out an amicable solution to the demands of employees and to take measures to get the strike called off given the increasing woes of the public due to disruption of public transportation across the state.

Sources said Mr Rao told officials that they should invite the JAC leaders and inform them that the government was prepared to accept all their demands wherein financial constraints were not involved.

RTC-LED BANDH SET TO PARALYSE STATE TODAY

Public transport is set to be further crippled in the city, besides other parts of the state, severely affecting and disrupting lives of people from all walks of life from Saturday with autos, Uber and Ola and other private cabs, and private bus drivers' unions decided to participate in the state-wide bandh.

The bandh call was given by the TSRTC employees and the JAC of various unions, and fully supported by all major opposition parties.

Despite the state government's claims of making alternate arrangements, there are doubts about the number of buses that will ply with private drivers behind the wheels, because the RTC unions have announced that "they would not allow buses to come out from the RTC depots" across Telangana from 4 am on Saturday.

SUV falls into canal, 6 die

Six people from the city are feared dead when the sports utility vehicle (SUV) they were traveling in lost control and fell into the Nagarjuna Sagar left canal, near Chakirala, in the Suryapet district.

Chakirala. The initial reports from the police indicate that the driver lost control of the speeding vehicle, which fell into the canal. The Nadigudem police said that they were facing difficulty in carrying out rescue operations due to poor lighting and a heavy current in the canal.

After learning about the mishap, D. Amoy Kumar, district collector, along with other officials is said to have reached the spot to monitor rescue operations.

Speeding police vehicle mows down pedestrian

A pedestrian, who was hit by a speeding police van while crossing a road in Uppal on Sunday, died while undergoing treatment at the Gandhi Hospital on Friday morning. The driver of the police vehicle, an Armed Reserve constable, was arrested and produced before a court the judicial remand by the Uppal police.

According to the police, Chander Rao, 35, a resident of the Shubhodaya Colony in Karmanghat, the sole breadwinner of his family, who was living with his wife and a one-year-old son, and working at a nursery in Ghatkesar.

THE ACCIDENT caused a serious blood clot in his head. An ambulance shifted the victim to Gandhi Hospital for treatment, where he succumbed to injuries at around 6.30 am on Friday.

As per his routine, Chander boarded an auto and reached Uppal X roads on Thursday morning, from where he had to go to work. At around 6.45 am, when he was crossed the median and was about crossing the road, a speeding police van, registration number: TS 09 PA 3618, heading from LB Nagar towards Uppal hit and knocked him down,

the police said. The van was assigned to B. Bhaskar, detective inspector, Kushaiguda, who was present in the vehicle when the accident took place.

Chander fell on the road and suffered a fracture to his left hand and injuries on other parts of the body. The accident caused a serious blood clot in his head. An ambulance shifted the victim to Gandhi Hospital for treatment, where he succumbed to injuries at around 6.30 am on Friday.

"Based on a complaint from Chander's cousin P Srikrishna, a case was registered against the van driver. The body was handed over to the family after conducting an autopsy," said Uppal SI S.K. Mybelly.

State tops in milk adulteration

Mothers at home and teachers in school tell children to have milk because it is good for their health. Terrible news — Telangana might be on top of a dubious list of Indian states in terms of milk adulteration. The news is confirmed, which would set alarm bells amongst a large section

of the population, by a study by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI), which has found that milk sold by even major premium brands failed to meet prescribed quality standards.

Of all the milk samples collected from across the country by FSSAI, as much as 37.7 per cent of processed milk samples and 47 per cent of raw milk samples

failed to meet prescribed norms. The highest number of adulterated samples were recorded from TS. The other states which reported high cases of adulterations included Madhya Pradesh and Kerala. In actual numbers, 12 out of 6,432 milk samples studied were found to be adulterated.

The study was conducted on 6,432 milk samples collected from 1,103 cities

across India between May and October 2018. About 40 per cent of samples were of processed milk while the rest were of raw milk.

Another concern flagged by the study was that more than adulteration, it was the nature of contaminants found which pose a serious health problem.

Demand to shift trash dump yard

Hyderabad: Residents of Dammaiguda held a dharna at the Medchal-Malkajgiri district collector's office on Friday to demand the removal of the Jawahanager dump yard from their neighbourhood, which now has many homes. "The stench is affecting our livelihood. Why is the government ignoring the matter," asked Kamal Pant, a local resident. She said that apart from the dharna before the collector's office two residents have begun a relay hunger strike. The protestors want the dump yard to be moved elsewhere and had been told that the state government was looking for alternatives.

Transco calls unions for talks

Hyderabad: TS Transco joint managing director Srinivas Rao has called the Telangana Electricity Trade Unions Front for talks with chairpersons of power utilities at Vidyut Soudha here on Saturday. The 21-union federation has threatened to go on strike in support of its demands, and has scheduled a meeting at Warangal on October 23. TETUF chairman N. Padma Reddy said "We will participate in the meeting and then decide our response. We know it might take some time to fulfil all the demands but we expect our major demands to be fulfilled immediately." The major demand is for regularising the services of 23,000 artisans and implement the old pension rules.

Nims doctors ask for convocation

Hyderabad: Resident doctors of the Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences (Nims) submitted a representation to health minister Etala Rajendar stating that the institution had not conducted a convocation for its graduates for 15 years. "Every year, 1,444 resident doctors pass out from this institution," Dr Srinivas, president, resident doctors' association said. The minister was at Nims to inaugurate high-end medical equipment, including imaging devices, worth ₹22 crore. The hospital had acquired a PET-CET scanner, single-photon emission computed tomography (SPECT) and a dual head SPECT gamma camera. The minister said the government would upgrade Nims.

CHILD ACTOR GOKULSAI DIES OF DENGUE

Popular child artist Gokulsai Krishna succumbed to dengue during treatment in a private hospital at Bengaluru late on Thursday night.

Gokulsai, 10, said he was feeling sick after returning from a karate class at Madanapalle four days ago. He was taken to local doctors, but his parents shifted him to Bengaluru as the temperature continued to rise.

Gokulsai shot to fame for mimicking dialogues and action scenes of film actor and politician N. Balakrishna. He has acted in two films.

Condolences poured in after news of his death spread. Actor Balakrishna said he was impressed by the way Gokulsai acted and delivered dialogues just like him. Gokulsai's last rites will be performed at Madanapalle on Saturday.

Ashwathama asks Harish Rao to break silence, promises support

RTC JAC convener arrested during protest rally, says KCR does not care for employees

Refuting allegations made against him by TRS leaders that he had amassed illegal assets, RTC joint action committee convener Ashwathama Reddy said they could hang him in public if they had any proof to back their charge. Mr Reddy was addressing a gathering at the Sakala Janula Samme Bheri at Sundarayya Vignana Kendram along with leaders of opposition parties and trade unions.

He recalled the statements made by Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao that if Telangana state became a reality then there would not be any strikes. The Chief Minister does not care about employees, he said.

He appealed to finance minister T. Harish Rao to break his silence and take the initiative to solve the RTC's problems. The workers are ready to support him if he resigns and contests again from Siddipet, he said.

He recalled that he was the first man to hold a public meeting with the RTC staff during the statehood agitation, and at that time, the rulers of the combined state had warned him not to fall into the trap of the TRS.

He said Mr Chandrasekhar Rao was arrested only once during the agitation but he was taken into police custody every day. Mr Reddy said that around 4,000 RTC employees have not received their salary for the period for their participation in Sakala Janula Samme during the agitation, which is a shame on the ruling party. He said RTC employees will raise their voices strongly against the anti employees attitude of the government.

Mentioning the steps taken by AP Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy for the merger of RTC with the government, and also purchasing buses a cost of ₹1,000 crore, the RTC union leader advised Mr Rao to learn from his AP counterpart about commitment towards the public good.

He said that the state bandh will create a huge impact on the government. The police arrested Mr Reddy and workers when they took out a bike rally from the Sundarayya Vignana Kendram to Bus Bhavan on Friday.

After bike rally, BJP plans march to Assembly today

BJP state president K. Laxman led a motorcycle rally from BHEL to Kukatpally with almost 2,500 two-wheelers in support of the TSRTC employees strike. Thousands of BJP activists and people participated in the rally.

Speaking to mediapersons, Dr Laxman said the BJP welcomed the order of the High Court on the RTC strike. "Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao is ruling the state like a

dictator. In a democracy, people should be given importance but the Chief Minister has ignored everyone. We appeal to traders, workers and intellectuals to support the strike by the RTC workers. The BJP demands the appointment of a managing director for the RTC."

Dr Laxman said all party leaders will participate in the bandh to make it successful across the state. Appealing for support for the state bandh on Saturday, party leader N.V.S.S. Prabhakar told a rally at ECIL crossroads

that the TRS government's alleged conspiracy to privatise and occupy RTC properties will not be allowed at any cost.

The former MLA questioned the Chief Minister's "dictatorial attitude" in curbing the strike. "Since the High Court is closely watching the agitation, workers need not be afraid," Mr Prabhakar said.

On Saturday, BJP leaders will hold a dharna at Abids and march towards the Assembly in support of the bandh called by the RTC unions.

Those issues which have financial implications could be resolved after constituting a committee and deliberating with union leaders. The government and unions could prepare a road map to solve issues in phases, based on the financial

position of the corporation and government.

Sources said that the merger of RTC involves several issues. Dropping it for now would remove a roadblock in taking forward the negotiations. The court had indicated that issues which would increase the financial burden have to be solved

through negotiations.

As the court put sought a submission on October 28 of the outcome of these deliberations, the Chief Minister asked officers to put forth all proposals before trade union leaders and appeal to them to withdraw their strike.

Mr Rao is said to have told authorities that the

government was sympathetic towards the issues of the RTC staff who played a crucial role in the statehood agitation. But, the time and circumstances of the strike caused much worry and embarrassment to the government. If the unions stress on merger, it would become a hurdle for talks.

Desperate farmers forced to sell tomatoes at ₹1 a kg

Distressed farmers were forced to sell tomatoes at one rupee a kilo at Pathikonda on Friday. The agriculture market yard was unwilling to lift the produce and the unauthorised market yard by private agents started buying tomatoes at a steep discount.

The price for 60 kgs hovered at around ₹80 and ₹150 for most of the time while the better variety fetched ₹500, said a private buyer.

This triggered protests from farmers at Pathikonda, the second largest market for tomatoes in AP after Madanapalle.

Agricultural marketing department regional joint director, Sudhakar, who had been camping at Pathikonda market, said the farmers were persuaded to sell their produce at

the market yard from 6 pm on Friday.

"We have 50 metric tonnes of tomatoes to be disposed of," he said.

He refused to divulge at what rate the government was buying. Regional deputy director, agricultural marketing, P. Lavanya, said the crisis at

Pathikonda would be solved quickly. She said the state government was aware of it.

The tomato supply chain is skewed as the middlemen get a major share of the pie. Farmers are clueless as to whom to sell as the AP government has banned the commission

agents system. Mr P. Chennakeshav Reddy, a farmer from Pathikonda, said, "We have invested ₹28,000 to ₹30,000 to cultivate an acre of tomatoes but we are getting less than ₹5,000."

He demanded that the government intervene and give minimum support

- AP has seen a bumper tomato crop. Most agents are entering into out-of-market settlements, offering ₹2-3 per kg. The retail price is ₹15 per kg.
- It is only after bringing tomatoes to the market in rented vehicles that the farmer comes to know the price is ₹2.
- Left with few options, farmers sell at low prices or just throw the tomatoes away.

price for tomato farmers. Another farmer, Mr B. Narayana, from Aspari, said he had invested ₹1 lakh on four acres of tomatoes.

AP state agriculture mission (AP-SAM) vice-chairman, M.V.S. Nagi Reddy, said marketing of perishable commodities like

tomato was fraught with structural issues. Higher realisation of prices is possible when the cold storage capacity is made available to absorb excess production.

Referring to the issue at Pathikonda, he said that "It's a problem of plenty. A 10 per cent rise in production would bring down the prices by 20 per cent and vice versa. This year, the farmers had a bumper crop in Pathikonda, Alur, Adoni and Dhone and Yemmiganur."

He said Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy had asked the officials to study prices in Bengaluru and Chennai and find ways to get remunerative prices to the farmers.

Mr Nagi Reddy said that at a private market yard at Rappthadu in Anantapur district commission agents were charging a 20 per cent margin unheard of in other places.

I-T MEN FIND KALKI WELLNESS STASHED ₹500cr

The income-tax department continued searches at the Kalki Ashram at Battalavallam and other campuses in Varadaiahpalem in Chittoor district on Friday.

The raids were conducted following Intelligence reports that the Wellness Group, run by Krishna, son of Kalki Bhagwan, and an offshoot of the Kalki Ashram, has been suppressing its receipts at its various centres. The money is then ploughed into investments in land in Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu and in investments abroad.

The Wellness Group is a conglomerate of trusts and companies that run year-round "wellness courses" and training programmes in philosophy, spirituality, etc at various sprawling residential campuses in Varadaiahpalem in Andhra Pradesh, and in Chennai and Bengaluru.

Foreign currency and substantial quantities of undisclosed gold in the form of jewellery, about 88 kg approximately, valued at over ₹26 crore, has been found during the searches.

Undisclosed diamonds weighing 1,271 carats valued approximately at about ₹5 crore were found and seized.

The total value of the seizure so far is approximately ₹93 crore. The undisclosed income of the group detected so far is estimated at more than ₹500 crore. The searches are still in progress.

The department has been carrying out searches in about 40 premises of the Wellness Group located in Chennai, Hyderabad, Bengaluru and Varadaiahpalem.

According to a press release of the I-T department, proof has been found during the search that the group has been regularly suppressing its receipts at its various centres or ashrams, and has therefore not revealed its actual income.

Evidence has been found with key employees who maintained records of cash collections that were kept outside the official accounts, and used to make investments elsewhere and also for paying for properties.

It is learnt that the group earned unaccounted income from cash it received for property sold at over and above the documented value. A preliminary estimate of such unaccounted cash receipts is ₹409 crore from the financial year 2014-15 onwards.

Cash and other valuables were found at the residences of the group's founder Kalki Bhagwan and his son, Krishna, and at one of the campuses. Cash totalling ₹43.9 crore has been seized. In addition to this, \$2.5 million (approximately ₹18 crore) in foreign currency was seized from the residences.

Temp driver tries to rape colleague

A private driver hired by the TSRTC allegedly attempted to rape a 21-year-old woman conductor who was on duty alongside him, on October 17.

The Jaipur mandal police in Mancherial district has booked a case under IPC Section 354 (assault or criminal force to woman with intent to outrage her modesty).

The incident took place when they were returning to Mancherial from Chennur. There were no passengers and Srinivas allegedly stopped the bus on the outskirts of Jaipur village and attempted to rape his woman colleague.

Her shouts for help were heard by people nearby who rushed to the bus. The driver started the bus and drive away but police chased the vehicle and took Srinivas into custody.

SUPERMARKET SHOPPERS PAY ₹26 FOR A KG

While farmers in Andhra Pradesh are selling tomatoes at ₹1 a kg, consumers at supermarkets in the city are paying between ₹22 and ₹26 and ₹15-₹18 at Rythu Bazaars.

While some money goes for transport and for cleaning and other operations, the middleman walks away with the rest.

Speaking to Deccan Chronicle, an official said, "Since the monsoons have gone, there is an imbalance in the supply and demand ratio. Now, the state is flush with tomatoes." Earlier the price was between ₹30 and ₹40.

Commuters to suffer as SRDP faces fund crisis

GHMC plans to collect ₹2,000 cr in next three months

The state government's flagship Strategic Road Development Plan (SRDP) to ease traffic snarls in the state capital has once again run short of funds.

Though the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation had earlier raised ₹100 crore through municipal bonds, the amount was sufficient only to clear the pending bills.

Citing lukewarm response from financial institutions to its proposal to raise another round of municipal bonds, GHMC is now contemplating a ₹2,000-crore Rupee Term Loan (RTL).

However, the process for availing RTL will take at least three months and till then commuters will have to continue suffering traffic jams. Work on SRDP has already been put on hold temporarily till the corporation is able to clear pending bills worth ₹30 crore, highly placed sources disclosed.

The SRDP is a self-financed project that relies on borrowings from external sources. A total of ₹1,000 crore was to be raised through sale of bonds based on GHMC's creditworthiness. However, the civic body has so far been

able to raise ₹495 crore in two tranches, ₹200 crore at 8.9 per cent interest rate in 2018 and ₹195 crore this year at 9.38 per cent.

Though the corporation hoped to garner another ₹200 crore through municipal bonds, it could only mop up just ₹100 crore. Of the ₹100 crore raised, a senior official said, the corporation paid ₹40 crore for land acquisition and the rest to clear pending bills.

It had previously paid ₹56 crore for acquiring land from the Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority. The municipal body has to still clear ₹500 crore worth land acquisition bills to get the SRDP construction back on track.

Further, GHMC requires ₹1,000 crore during next financial year to expedite SRDP and rescue commuters from traffic snarls. Moreover, the high interest rate being paid for the amount raised

HYD DIVIDED INTO 340 DOCKETS TO IDENTIFY PROPERTIES

As many as 40 docket were found to have overlapped during the ongoing geo-fencing taken up by the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation as a means to enhance property tax collection.

In order to prepare a list of the number of properties, the civic body divided the city into 340 dockets and geo-fenced them. The survey has helped expose the irregularities indulged in by bill collectors.

Each docket consists of about 2,000 properties. The same properties popped up in more than one docket in

the case of 40 dockets. Surprised by the overlap, civic body officials have decided to deploy a team of experts to re-verify the reason for the overlap.

A senior GHMC official said that if the team found irregularities, the corporation would initiate stringent action against the guilty. The geo-fencing was taken up on the instructions of municipal administration minister K.T. Rama Rao. The geo-fencing information is vital since the data will be permanently stored with the corporation.

"The corporation will fix the all the issues encountered while taking up the survey," he said.

through municipal bonds has been bleeding the GHMC.

Under this backdrop, an official disclosed that GHMC has now decided to opt for ₹2,000-crore RTL.

The RTL can be availed with a counter guarantee from the state government and the corporation has to take permission for the same from the government.

The civic body has already written to the government in this regard and the entire process will take two months' time.

Thereafter, it will take another month for GHMC to receive the RTL.

The rate of interest the corporation will have to pay for RTL will vary from 9 per cent to 9.5 per cent, the official added.

Officials from Narsingi municipality said construction permits for high-rise buildings are issued by the Hyderabad Metropolitan Department (HMDA). "The municipality can only issue permits for structures shorter than nine metres. For anything higher than that, it is the HMDA that is the issuing authority," said the official.

Narsingi inspector G.V. Ramana Goud, said that the residents had lodged a complaint that the blasting has resulted in dam-

age to their apartments. A case has been registered under sections 336 and 427 of IPC, and sections 9 (B) (1) (b) of Explosive Substances Act for the probe, he said. "Cracks were seen at the cellar of the apartment, which said to have occurred due to the blasting," he said.
