Govt. signals shift in stand, allows EU MPs to visit Srinagar

Embassy in Delhi says parliamentarians are in India in their 'personal capacity'

Nearly three months after its decision on Article 370, the Union government has allowed a delegation comprising 27 Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) from Italy, Britain, France, Germany, Czech Republic and Poland to travel to Srinagar on Tuesday to see the situation there. The European Union (EU) Embassy in Delhi has clarified that the MEPs were in India in their "personal capacity".

This is the first time the government has allowed such a visit to the Kashmir Valley since August 5, when hundreds of leaders were taken into custody and communication lines cut.

Meet PM, Vice-President

On Monday, the MEPs met Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Vice-President Venkaiah Naidu. At a lunch hosted by National Security Adviser (NSA) Ajit Doval, they met a few mainstream Kashmiri leaders, including former Minister Muzaffar Beigh from the PDP and winners of the Block Development Council polls held in I&K last week.

IS chief Baghdadi killed in U.S. raid

Cornered terrorist set off suicide vest

U.S. President Donald Trump said on Sunday that the Islamic State (IS) group's elusive leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi had been killed, dying "like a dog" in a night raid by U.S. special forces in northwest Syria.

Mr. Trump told the nation in a televised White House address that a "large number" of IS militants were killed during the raid. Cornered in a tunnel, Baghdadi detonated a suicide vest. "He died after running into a dead-end tunnel, whimpering and crying and screaming all the way," Mr. Trump said, adding that three of Baghdadi's children were also killed in the blast.

Mr. Trump said the raid involving eight helicopters flying more than an hour from an undisclosed base was carried out with the cooperation of Russia, Syria, Turkey and Iraq. He also thanked the Syrian Kurds "for a certain support they were able to give us."

Mr. Trump's National Se-Adviser Robert O'Brien described the dramatic message the President and his advisers received as they monitored the raid from the White House Situa-

tion Room. "The commander of the mission called and said, '100 per cent confidence, Jackpot" - meaning Baghdadi was dead – Mr. O'Brien said on NBC.

Identity confirmed Baghdadi, an Iraqi native, was believed to be 48 years old. His death has been reported several times over the years. Mr. Trump said there was no doubt this

time, with a DNA field test

confirming his identity. At its height, IS controlled a swath of Iraq and Syria in a self-declared caliphate, brutally imposing a puritanical version of Islam and planning terror attacks. It took years of war before its final slice of territory in Syria was

European Union grants Brexit delay

The European Union (EU) on Monday agreed to a three-month flexible delay to Britain's departure from the bloc as Prime Minister Boris Johnson pushes for an election after opponents forced him to request an extension.

Just days before the U.K. is formally due to leave the EU on October 31, Brexit is hanging in the balance as British politicians are no closer to reaching a consensus on how, when or even if the divorce should take place. "The EU27 has agreed that it will accept the U.K.'s request for a Brexit 'flextension' until 31 January 2020," European Council president Donald Tusk said in a tweet, referring to the idea of a "flexible extension".

EU member-states will need Britain to formally reply to the offer of a threemonth delay before launching a "written procedure", whereby governments will have 24 hours to accept or reject. Mr. Johnson will respond to the EU's delay offer once he has reviewed the details, his spokesman said.

As the tussle for power sharing continues in Maharashtra, delegations of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Shiv Sena met Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari separately at Raj Bhavan on Monday. The BJP delegation was led by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and the Sena team by Transport Minister Diwakar Raote.

The two said the meeting was just a courtesy call to extend Deepavali greetings to the Governor, but party sources indicated a discussion on the modalities of government formation did take place. The alliance partners had secured the support of five more Independent legislators, party

Capital's air quality dips to season's worst

'Very poor' to 'severe' AQI, but post-Deepavali air cleaner compared with previous years



Delhi's air quality nosedived to the season's worst on Monday, reaching the higher end of 'very poor' category on Monday.

While it was due to a mix of factors including bursting of firecrackers on Deepavali night that went beyond the Supreme Court-prescribed time slot of 8-10 p.m, the Capital experienced cleaner post-Deepavali air compared with previous years.

The Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) said peak values of PM2.5 – the deadly respirable particles were lower than last year's.

The average Air Quality Index of the past 24 hours at 4 p.m. on Monday was 368, 'very poor', according to the Central Pollution Control



(SAFAR), put the AQI in the

around 4 p.m. Though both

CPCB's and SAFAR's AQI is an average of the past 24 hours, the former considers 37 monitoring stations and the latter 10.

Both also use different methodologies to arrive at their AQI figure.

The city's AQI at 9.30 p.m. on Monday stood at

401, 'severe' category, with 18 out of the 35 monitoring stations for which data were available showing 'severe' and the rest of the stations showing 'very poor' AQI, according to CPCB.

Second round of Smart Cities, AMRUT may roll out in 2020

Those who were left out will be covered, says Minister

The second round of the

Centre's flagship urban development schemes - the Smart Cities Mission and the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) - were being considered and could be rolled out in 2020, Union Minister of State (independent charge) Housing and Urban Affairs Hardeep Singh Puri told The Hindu.

The first round of the Smart Cities Mission that covers 100 cities would be 50% complete, that is 50 cities, by December, Mr. Puri
