Free bus rides for over 2.2 lakh women on Day 1 of Delhi scheme

DELHI GOVERNMENT'S free bus ride scheme for women rolled out Tuesday and by 4 pm, over 2.2 lakh women constituted approximately 32% of the total ridership till then on DTC and cluster buses.

Under the scheme, women will not have to pay anything to travel on 5,589 buses that run on the city's roads. The cost of travel will be reimbursed to bus operators, with the Delhi government paving them a fixed fare of Rs 10 per commuter.

Pointing to lack of opportunities for women, Chief Minister Arvind Keiriwal said: "Structural inequalities inherent to our society come in the way of equal opportunities to women. Out of Delhi's total work force, only 11% are women. Out of all the people taking Metro and buses, only 30% are women... The Opposition says Kejriwal is making everything free, but I believe parties should rise beyond narrow partisan in-

The government proposed the scheme in June and had also made free travel for women on Delhi Metro part of the proposal. But that is yet to be implemented since the Centre is still to notify a new Fare Fixation Committee.

5 workers from Bengal killed in south Kashmir terror attack

Militants strike in Kulgam on day team of EU MPs reaches Srinagar

SUSPECTED MILITANTS shot dead five labourers from West Bengal in south Kashmir's Kulgam district on the day when an unofficial EU delegation visited the Valley to assess the situation after the abrogation of Article 370 three months ago.

The five killed Tuesday evening have been identified as Naimuddin Sheikh, Murshalim Sheikh, Rafikul Sheikh, Rafique Sheikh and Kamaruddin Sheikh, all from Bahalnagar village in Murshidabad's Sagardighi.

Officials said another labourer from the same village was injured in the firing and is undergoing treatment in Srinagar.

Speaking to *The Indian* Express, Murshidabad SP Mukesh Kumar said: "I have spoken to Kulgam Police, we are looking into other details." West Bengal police sources said the labourers worked in an apple orchard.

New energy firms & telcos stare at default, NPA fear grips banks

ANIL SASI NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 29

THERE is renewed nervousness among banks that lending to renewable power utilities and telecom companies over the last five years may turn bad.

Payment dues of renewable energy generators are mounting, primarily as distribution companies (discoms) of states such as Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Telangana have been falling back on payments for electricity contracted. The dues were pegged at close to Rs 10,000 crore upto July 31, 2019, according to data compiled by the Central Electricity Authority, and the amount is piling up.

Delays have started to stretch beyond 12 months in some cases, effectively impeding the working capital flows for these companies and hindering their debt servicing capability — a warning sign for lenders. In all, over 15 discoms have fallen back on their payment obligations against

Visva-Bharati V-C wants **CISF: Campus** security loyal to Trinamool

THE VISVA-BHARATI University in Santiniketan has asked the Centre to permanently deploy Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) personnel on its campus.

Citing recent incidents of confrontation between the university administration and students and karamcharis (staff), Vice-Chancellor (V-C) Bidyut Chakrabarty made the request in a letter to the Union HRD Ministry last month. A copy of the letter was also marked to the Prime Minister's Office (PMO).

The President is Visva-Bharati's Visitor and the Prime Minister is its Chancellor.

In his letter, Chakrabarty is learnt to have said that the private security personnel currently employed by the university owe their allegiance to the "TMC local bosses" and, hence, "disobey" Visva-Bharati's security officer "with impunity". He has also said that whenever the security guards are pulled up for lapses, local TMC workers intervene to protect them.

Chakrabarty has cited the protest by students in May this year against the increase in the price of application forms. The students had held a sit-in protest, preventing faculty members and officials from leaving the university campus. The V-C has alleged that in such instances, the security guards "remained silent onlookers" and even created enabling conditions for the protesters.

"Under these circumstances this is an earnest request to you to help us get a contingent of CISF to smoothly run the administration, which is required to put Visva-Bharati back to rails. Given their steadfastness and **CONTINUED ON PAGE 2**

India, Saudi sign strategic partnership pact, focus on security cooperation
