"There is no question of me going (for Pakistan's event) and I feel Manmohan Singh will not go

as well. There is a huge difference between visiting Pakistan and going to the gurdwara through the corridor," said Amarinder in a statement issued by the Chief Minister's Office (CMO).


HUGELY INFLATED ridership estimates along the 11.6-km stretch of Gurgaon's Rapid Metro, award of the project to lone bidder, a concession agreement allegedly skewed in favour of private companies, and undue accrual of benefits to real estate players in the process, have now left the Haryana government staring at the prospect of taking over the entire liabilities of Rs 3,771 crore.

Official records accessed by The Indian Express show that the Rapid Metro project's origin traces back to a 2007 proposal by DLF group. Without much skin **CONTINUED ON PAGE 2**







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

Protests against Citizenship Bill in Manipur, Nagaland

LEIVON JIMMY IMPHAL, OCTOBER 3

DAYS AFTER Union Home Minister Amit Shah said the Citizenship Amendment Bill would be brought again in Parliament, protests were held in Manipur's Imphal Valley and in neighbouring Nagaland

against the legislation.

The protest in Manipur was organised by Manipur People against Citizenship Amendment Bill (MANPAC), a conglomerate of several civil bodies.

Six major student outfits, All Manipur Students' Union. Democratic Students Alliance of Manipur, Kangleipak Students Association, Students Union of Kangleipak and Apunba Ireipak Maheiroi Singpanglup, supported the protest.

Hundreds of school and college students took to the streets, formed human chains and raised slogans against the Bill.

Similar protests were organised by local clubs and the vendors of Ima market, an exclusive market for women vendors.

Yumnamcha Dilipkumar, convenor of MANPAC, said people of the region will take their own course if the central leaders implement the legislation by force.

Indigenous People, Nagaland and North East Forum of Indigenous People (NEFIP) and submitted a memorandum to Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio.

The memorandum stated that the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill is like a "Sword of Damocles hanging over the head of all the indigenous tribes of the northeast region". They urged Rio and the state

government to take up the matter with the central leadership, asking them to respect the sentiment of the people in the region and not to pass the Bill in the interest of peace and harmony. NEFIP vice-president Theja

Therieh told a gathering that once the Bill is passed in Parliament and becomes a law, illegal immigrants will get full right to settle in Nagaland. He said the Naga people want the state government and the MLAs and MPs from the state to join hands in protecting the indigenous people. "We should speak in one voice

and tell the Centre to listen to it,' Therieh said.

The Citizenship Bill was passed by Lok Sabha on January 8, 2019, but could not be placed in Raiya Sabha and lapsed. The legislation seeks to facilitate the granting of citizenship to identified minorities — Hindus, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains, Christians, and Parsis — who escaped religious persecution in Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Bangladesh and entered India before December 31, 2014.

evant reasons... it is the constitutional duty, as reflected in one's oath, to be transparent and accountable, and hence, a Judge is required to indicate reasons for his recusal from a particular Justice Madan B Lokur, who

was also on the Bench that ruled on the NJAC Act, had this to say: "The issue of recusal from hearing a case is not as simple as it appears. The questions thrown up are quite significant and since it appears that such applications are gaining frequency, it is time that some procedural and substantive rules are framed in this regard. If appropriate rules are framed, then, in a given case, it would avoid embarrassment to other judges on the Bench." Judges recuse from a case in

specific instances when there is an apparent conflict of interest that could prejudice the case or create bias — for instance, holding shares in a company that is a party to a case, or when a lawyer or a party involved in the case is personally known to the judge or when the judge has dealt with the case in a lower court.

In its original proposal, DLF estimated the average daily ridership for the 5.1-km stretch from Sikanderpur Metro Station on DMRC Yellow Line to its properties running through DLF Phase II, Phase III and Cybercity - at approximately 2 lakh in 2015 and 2.6 lakh in 2021. The numbers were bumped up in the detailed project report (DPR) prepared by RMGL to 3,11,246 in 2015 and 3,72,560 in 2020. The first phase started commercial

operations in November 2013. Similarly, for the 6.5-km stretch, from Sikanderpur Metro Station to Sector 56, passing through big projects — Aralias, Magnolias, DLF Belaire, Florence Marvell, Palm Springs, Emaar MG — RMGL's feasibility report in May 2011 estimated average daily ridership at 147,150 in 2015 and 167,400 in 2020. At the DPR stage, this was hiked further by the sole bidder RMGSL to 222,450 in 2015 and 266,630 in 2020. This route became operational on March 31, 2017.

While the two phases cumulatively estimated a daily ridership of over 6 lakh, the actual ridership is less than a tenth at about 55,000.

HDIL father and son arrested in PMC Bank case

officer said police found records of alleged direct transfers from the bank to the personal accounts of the Wadhawans that were password-protected.

On Monday, police had registered an FIR against Rakesh Wadhawan, executive chairman of HDIL; Sarang, vice chairman and managing director of HDIL; Joy Thomas, former managing director of PMC Bank; Waryam Singh, chairman of PMC Bank; and unidentified employees of the bank and HDIL.

In the FIR, police said the actions of the accused allegedly led to bank losses totalling Rs 4,355.46 crore.

"During investigation, we found that there were nearly 44 accounts at the bank that were password-protected. These accounts were linked to the Wadhawans and DHIL-linked entities where a lot of the money from the bank had been transferred," the officer claimed.

Police also carried out searches at the residence of Warvam Singh and claimed to have identified demat accounts totalling a notional amount of Rs 100 crore. "The demat accounts have been frozen. We are also in the process of completing its valuation," the officer said.

According to police, Thomas had been served summons but has not appeared before them so far. "We have also carried out provisional attachment of his property and frozen his bank account," the officer said.

Apart from this, the officer said, police have also provisionally seized property allegedly belonging to HDIL worth Rs 3,500 crore, including land, residential properties and commercial projects. "We are checking the titles of these properties to see if they were kept as collateral in any other bank. As of now, they appear to have been mortgaged to PMC Bank," the officer

said. Police had first registered an offence on a complaint from the RBI following the collapse of the bank. The RBI had stepped in and placed restrictions on withdrawals after the crisis at the bank came to light last week mainly due to alleged under-reporting of Non-Performing Assets (NPA).

Hasina is in Delhi to attend the India Economic Summit of the World Economic Forum and is scheduled to meet Modi on

Saturday for a bilateral meeting. At the reception, Hasina met Delhi-based ambassadors from 78 countries who are also accredited to Bangladesh, along with former diplomats and experts from think tanks. The Bangladesh High Commissioner described the event as a gathering of "friends of Bangladesh".

In New York last week, Hasina told Modi that the NRC has become a matter of "great concern" for Bangladesh. Modi is learnt to have replied that there is "nothing to be worried" about since India and Bangladesh have good relations.

However, Union Home Minister Amit Shah reiterated in Kolkata Tuesday that the government would "identify each and every infiltrator and drive them out".

While the NRC could figure during discussions between the two Prime Ministers, sources said Modi has already assured Hasina on this matter. "It will depend on the Bangladesh PM. The Indian position will remain the same as articulated by the PM during their meeting in New York," sources said.

investigation. Sources said their culpability under charges of alleged extortion is under discussion within the agency. The agency Tuesday filed an

application before the Delhi High Court seeking more time to complete the investigation in the case. Earlier, on May 30, the HC had given CBI four months to complete the probe. The CBI stated in the applica-

tion that a "status report containing developments made in the investigation is being submitted in a sealed cover" for the court's consideration. The agency claimed some issues relating to investigation abroad are pending. An FIR registered by CBI on

October 15, 2018, when Verma was director of the agency, had alleged that a suspect in the Moin Qureshi case had been forced to pay Rs 2.95 crore to Asthana through Prasad brothers to water down the case against him. The suspect, Sathish Sana Babu, was made a witness in the case by CBI.

The case played out against the backdrop of a running feud between Verma and Asthana for supremacy within the agency. It led to unprecedented developments with the government swooping down on the agency in a midnight coup on October 23, 2018 and unseating both Asthana and Verma. Since then Verma has been sacked while Asthana has been transferred to the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS).

Sources said after almost a year of investigation under multiple officers, the CBI has concluded there is no evidence to prove that any bribe was ever demanded by or paid to Asthana. "A report to this effect has been submitted with senior officers within the agency and a legal opinion is awaited before a

Devender Kumar, who was then investigating officer in the Moin Qureshi case and was a member of the Special Investigation Team (SIT) supervised by Asthana. He was the No. 2 accused mentioned in the October 15 FIR against Asthana and had even been arrested by Verma's team. He is currently out on bail. The Prasad brothers, who

operate out of Dubai, may face some legal trouble as evidence has been found of them having been in touch with Sathish Sana Babu. Sources, however, said no money has been recovered nor any financial trail clearly established as yet. "However, there is electronic evidence of them being in touch with Babu and discussing financial matters," a source said.

While Somesh is currently in Dubai, Manoj was arrested by CBI in October last year after he arrived from Dubai in Delhi allegedly to collect bribe money from Babu. The CBI case against Asthana

was based on a statement of Babu, recorded under Section 164 of the CrPC, in which he alleged that he was being consistently harassed by CBI in the Moin Qureshi case through multiple interrogations about a Rs 50-lakh investment he had made with Qureshi, a meat exporter who allegedly influenced CBI cases for bribes. To get out of the wrangle,

Babu said, he got in touch with the Prasad brothers who claimed to have been close to Asthana. He said they spoke to someone over the phone and showed purported details of Asthana's WhatsApp account to convince him they knew him. They demanded Rs 5 crore to settle the case. On another occasion, Manoj

Prasad spoke to Babu over the phone claiming to be sitting in Asthana's office. Subsequently, in various tranches, the Prasad brothers received Rs 2.95 crore from Babu, he has alleged. These were the two instances where Asthana was mentioned in Babu's complaint

PLAN TO TABLE BILL IN WINTER SESSION: KEJRIWAL

Cabinet nod for Sports University in capital, L-G green signal awaited

NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 3

THE DELHI Cabinet Thursday cleared a bill towards the creation of a Sports University in the national capital. In the 2017-18 annual budget, the government had announced the creation of the university in a 90-acre land parcel in West Delhi's Mundka. Chief Minister Arvind

Kejriwal, at a press conference, said the bill will now be placed before L-G Anil Baijal, whose nod is needed for it to be tabled in the Assembly. The government plans to table it during the winter session, Kejriwal said.

In the 2017-18 budget, a token amount of Rs 1 crore was set aside for the university by the Higher Education department. A panel was formed, under the V-C of Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, which had submitted its final draft report on the proposed university to the department in January 2018.

However, Kejriwal said the

bill only fixes the administrative structure of the university: "Now, the curriculum has to be fixed. Experts will be roped in."

The CM said the proposed university will be "one of its kind" as it will issue degrees for sports, including cricket, football, hockey.

"Full time sportspersons, who eventually fail to make it big, often fall behind as they cannot apply for jobs in other fields. The sports university degree will help them pursue careers in

other fields, including civil services. This will help a person focus on sports, instead of thinking about what failure might entail...." he said.

The government, in a state-

ment, said the university will ensure students are also equipped in educational and literary skills: "Besides training towards sporting excellence, the university will also have provisions and facilities for liberal academics to ensure that trainees and

Social media photo leads cops to man wanted in robbery case

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 3

A 21-YEAR-OLD man, who allegedly robbed two men in North West Delhi's Rohini at gunpoint, landed in trouble when he posted a photo of himself in Shimla on a social media website. Police found the photo and arrested him Thursday.

According to police, on September 23, the accused, Shubham, along with two of his associates, robbed two men in Rohini Sector 3 to finance a trip to Shimla.

The complainant in the case, Mohit Singh, had claimed that the men robbed him of Rs 27,000 and fled.

Singh said, "I was closing my shop around 9.30 pm when three men attacked me. They brandished a gun and threatened me... one of them was standing outside the shop. They beat us and stole Rs 1,500 from my wallet and Rs 23,000 from my uncle. They then entered the shop and took Rs 2,500 from the locker. They then left on their bikes."

Police said one of the accused was arrested soon after the incident. Shubham, however, managed to go on a trip to Shimla with his friends.

"We had identified him and were looking for him when he uploaded his photo on Facebook. We deployed a team and Shubham was arrested from a market in Shimla Thursday. The matter is being investigated. Efforts are on to nab the third accused in the case as well," said S D Mishra, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Rohini).

INCIDENTS LIKE THESE ON THE RISE: COURT

4-year jail term for 3 who robbed man in shared auto

ANAND MOHAN J NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 3

A DELHI court has sentenced three men to four years' rigorous imprisonment for robbing a passenger while travelling in a shared autorickshaw and throwing him out of the vehicle 12 years ago.

"It is seen nowadays that such incidents are on the rise and everyday, in a city like Delhi, multiple instances of snatching/robbery are reported," the court observed.

The incident took place in 2007, when the three men sitting in the shared auto robbed the complainant of Rs 2.4 lakh, assaulted him and threw him out of the vehicle near Ritz Cinema at Kashmere Gate. They were later arrested by two policemen on patrolling duty who chased down the vehicle. However, police could not recover the stolen money.

The three men — identified as Shakil, Fahimuddin and Kasim — were found guilty under IPC sections 394 (voluntarily causing hurt in committing robbery) and 34 (common intention).

Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate (ACMM) Pawan Singh Rajawat also imposed a cost of Rs 1 lakh on each convict.

Ravinder Singh, the counsel for the state, submitted before the court that Shakil was previously involved in a robbery case and Kasim was involved in heinous crimes like murder and robbery and was booked under the UP Gunda Act.

The counsel for the accused, on the other hand, prayed for le-

The ACMM, however, said, "Convicts have robbed the complainant of Rs 2,40,000 which is yet to be recovered. Convicts not only beat up the complainant but also threw him out of the

moving TSR (three-seater autorickshaw). This has resulted not only in loss of money to the complainant but also caused undue mental trauma... It has been seen that such robbers are hell bent to make quick money by robbing common citizens and can cause any injury towards the commission of offence. The act of convicts in throwing the complainant from running TSR could have resulted into loss of limb or, in worst case scenario, could have resulted in loss of life also."

The court added, "Most of these cases remain untraceable as robbers use masks/helmets to hide their identities. The pleas taken with regard to convicts having family to maintain should have been considered by the convicts themselves before committing the crime."

During conviction, the court had also noted that non-recovery of the looted money is not fatal to the case of prosecution.

Out to celebrate birthday, elderly woman targeted by snatchers

OUT TO celebrate her birthday with her husband, a 62-year-old retired LIC official was robbed of her bag outside a restaurant in West Delhi's Rajouri Garden on September 28. Police said the snatchers pushed the woman due to which she sustained injuries and is undergoing treatment at a hospital.

The woman has been identified as Reeta Goswami. Her family said she has injured her hand and fractured her left leg.

"After the incident, we recorded the woman's statement and registered a case under IPC section 356 and 379 at Rajouri Garden police station. We have

recovered CCTV footage from the lane where the incident took place. While resisting the snatching, the woman fell on the road and sustained injuries," said Additional DCP (West) Sameer

Reeta was accompanied by her husband Sudhir Goswami (65) when the incident took place outside Bikanervala restaurant in Raiouri Garden.

Sudhir said, "After cutting a cake with our son at our house,

we left for Bikanervala to have dinner. Around 10 pm, we left the restaurant and were crossing the road to get to our car. Reeta was behind me. That's when two men on a scooter stopped next to her. They pushed her and tried to take the bag from her hands. When she resisted, they pushed her again and she fell near the footpath. The men took the bag and fled. She suffered multiple injuries to her limbs and has fractured her left leg."

Police said the bag had the woman's debit cards, identity proof, mobile phone and Rs 13,000 cash.

Reeta is undergoing treatment at Mata Chanan Devi Hospital. Her husband said she will undergo an operation on

Knee-deep water, traffic snarls as sudden showers lash Delhi-NCR

FOLLOWING A long dry spell, sudden showers greeted the city Thursday evening.

Total rainfall of about 35.2 mm was recorded in the city from 8.30 am till 8.30 pm Thursday evening, IMD officials said. Light showers are expected to continue over the next two to three days, officials added.

Mercury is also expected to dip till October 9, with Safdarjung and Palam observatories of IMD recording minimum temperature of 23 degrees Celsius from October 5 to 7, and maximum of 34 degrees Celsius, accompanied by a partly cloudy sky. Due to the heavy rain, run-

way operations at the Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport were suspended for around 20 minutes till 8.20pm. As many as four flights were diverted during this time.

The downpour also led to waterlogging and traffic jams all across the city, especially in Central and South Delhi. Kneedeep water was seen at busy stretches such as Moolchand Underpass, Tilak Bridge, Hyatt Hotel, Bhikaji Cama Place, MB Road, IGNOU Road, Munirka, IIT Gate, South Extension and Sainik Farms.

Domestic help among three held for burglary

THREE PERSONS, including a woman, have been arrested in connection with a burglary at a house in South East Delhi's Amar Colony. According to police, Fatima (34), who works as a domestic help, did a recce of vacant houses in the area and passed the information to Mahmood (37) and Zakir (35).

A senior police officer said: "On September 29, a resident of Lajpat Nagar found Rs 50 lakh and some jewellery missing when he returned home in the evening. A case of theft and house-trespass was registered."

"We examined CCTV footage and saw two persons leaving the house in an e-rickshaw on the day of the incident... More than 100 e-rickshaw drivers were questioned. On Tuesday, we received information that the accused were near Sarai Kale Khan. Teams raided the area and arrested the two men," said Chinmoy Biswal, DCP (South East).

During questioning, the accused men told police about Fatima, who was later arrested.

Meanwhile, a day after police arrested three men following an exchange of fire in Vasant Kunj, it has been found that one of the accused. Sunil Kumar Meena (38), targeted offices of property dealers.

"Meena, along with his associates, were involved in robbery cases in Bindapur, Nangloi, Hari Nagar, Moti Nagar etc. They kept changing number plates of their car to evade arrest," said Devender Arya, DCP (South West).

Snake rescued from DDA flats

New Delhi: A common krait snake was rescued from the DDA flats in Malviva Nagar by members of an NGO involved in wildlife conservation.

Wildlife SOS received a call from a Malviya Nagar resident at around 9 pm Wednesday. The caller said he had spotted a snake curled up behind a brick right next to the entrance to his house.

Woman's body found in sack, police identify her as missing student

"I find it a very strange situation where the state is showing least interest in prosecution of this case. By simply writing a letter to the state government, it appears that the Director

(Prosecution) has washed his hands from the responsibility to conduct the trial on behalf of the state," said Special Judge Ajay Kumar Kuhar, who had summoned Director of Prosecution Suresh Chandra Sharma.

Special Public Prosecutor, Rajiv Mohan, was not present in court on Thursday. The court said he had skipped hearings several times in the past as well. He was present for the hearing on September 23, 2019.

The woman was an air hostess with MDLR Airlines, owned by Kanda. She committed suicide



Kanda is accused of abetting the 23-yr-old's suicide

at her family's Ashok Vihar residence in North West Delhi in 2012. In her suicide note, she blamed Kanda and his aide Aruna Chadha. Six months later, her mother also committed suicide and left behind a note blaming Kanda and Chadha for her death. Kanda was arrested in 2012 and

granted bail in 2014.

The judge, Kuhar, said that three prosecution witnesses were present in court but in the absence of the Special PP, they were being discharged unexamined.

An Additional Public Prosecutor, posted at a CBI court in Rouse Avenue, also informed the court that the department was yet to get the sanction to prosecute from the Delhi government. The sanction was required since Kanda was an MLA.

When the judge had asked the prosecution about the whereabouts of the Special PP, he was

informed that the Director of Prosecution had written to the Special Secretary (Home) of the Delhi government, requesting that the case be assigned to Manish Rawat, an Additional Public Prosecutor assigned to Kuhar's court. The judge told the



FORMER HARYANA CONG CHIEF QUITS PARTY POLL PANELS Haryana Cong now Hooda Cong: Tanwar in Cong poll campaign

ARGUING THAT the Harvana Congress has become "Hooda Congress", former state Congress chief Ashok Tanwar raised a banner of revolt ahead of Assembly elections by resigning from all election-related committees. He did not resign from the party, but made it clear that he would not cooperate with the state leadership as his supporters were ignored in ticket distribution.

Sources said that former chief minister and CLP leader Bhupinder Singh Hooda had got his way in terms of selection of candidates — as many as 60 tickets went to his loyalists. The other big leaders — state Congress chief Kumari Selja, Tanwar, Randeep Singh Surjewala, Kuldeep Bishnoi – got only a handful of tickets for their supporters. Tanwar, those close to him said, got only two tickets for his supporters.

A day after he protested outside Congress president Sonia Gandhi's residence, Tanwar on Thursday sent her a letter claiming that some "individuals" were "selling tickets and subverting the great political legacy of the Congress party by ruthlessly killing the political career of hardworking Congress leaders". He argued that a section of Haryana Congress

leaders focused on attacking him because "of their personal prejudices and selfish interests" over the last five years when he was state Congress president.

"The same individuals sabotaged the party, haven't done any organisational work at the grassroots and didn't allow the party to function properly in Haryana by stalling the appointments of committees and office-bearers... it is excruciating to see the same individuals taking all the decisions and instead of allowing just, free and fair selection of candidates..." he said.

Tanwar said he had suggested that those who contested the last Lok Sabha elections, those who had forfeited their deposits in the

THE FORMER Haryana Congress chief's move has blown a hole in the party high command's attempt to sent a signal of unity through leadership change. While the high command tries to regroup after the crushing defeat in the Lok Sabha elections, this tussle only adds to the drift in the grand old party. It also exposes the tussle between the old guard and young leaders who were promoted by Rahul Gandhi.

last election and those who had lost twice or more consecutively should not be given tickets. He also wanted that "those who have

openly worked against party whip in the Assembly or had taken an anti-party stand outside the House (like sabotaging the Congress candidate in Rajya Sabha election) should not be given tickets. Besides, he argued that "sitting MLAs do not automatically qualify for tickets". He was referring to the defeat of RK Anand, the Congress candidate in Rajya Sabha election in 2016, after the votes of at least 14 party MLAs were found invalid.

"I have tried to raise these issues with my seniors in the party and found them to be indifferent and not willing to understand or resolve this unprecedented crisis..." he said.

Tanwar said "it feels like the Congress in Haryana has been hijacked by an individual and even senior leaders of the AICC are insensitive towards the Harvana Congress becoming Hooda Congress. Ever since the Lok Sabha elections, I have felt that the party has become unresponsive. This has not only demoralised the party workers, but the lack of a united and strong opposition is also giving a free run to the BJP for undoing the Congress party's ideals and principles that have been the foundation of our nation."

Tanwar reiterated that party workers are alleging corruption in ticket distribution, but did not provide details. He said if need be, he would give adequate proof to Sonia Gandhi.

INFIGHTING WITHIN the Congress's Mumbai unit came to the fore on Thursday with former Mumbai Congress president Sanjay Nirupam declaring that he will not participate in the party's poll campaign. Nirupam was reportedly upset with the party's leadership for not considering his nominee for candidature from the Versova seat.

Meanwhile, exposing cracks within its alliance with the NCP in the state, the Congress on Thursday nominated its own candidate from Western Maharashtra's Pandharpur seat, a day after ally Nationalist Congress Party announced the candidature of sitting MLA Bharat Bhalke from the constituency.

Earlier this week, Bhalke had walked out of the Congress to join the NCP. The Congress has now nominated Kalunge Bajirao from the constituency.

In Mumbai, even before the Congress declared the candidature of two-time MLA Baldev Khosa from Versova, Nirupam went public with his revolt. Nirupam had sought a ticket for his close-aide Raees Lashkariya, but there was opposition within the party to that name. "It seems the Congress party doesn't

want my services anymore. I had recommended just one name in Mumbai for Assembly election... I heard that even that has been rejected. As I had told the leadership earlier, in that case I won't participate in the poll campaign. My decision is final," he said.

"I am the party's leader in the Mumbai North West district. I did not interfere with the ticket distribution process at all, and had just sought this one seat, guaranteeing the party that I would ensure that the seat is won. But even that has not been respected,' Nirupam said. He refuted reports of joining any other party. "At this moment, I've no such plans," he said.

Nirupam has been sulking ever since he was unceremoniously dumped from the Mumbai Congress president's post, and has been vocal about his differences with Milind Deora, who had replaced him.

Narayan Rane's son joins BJP, to contest from Kankavli

Kankavli (Maharashtra): Former Maharashtra CM Narayan Rane's younger son Nitesh, who fought the 2014 Assembly elections on a Congress ticket, joined the BJP on Thursday. Nitesh(37) resigned from the Congress and the MLA post two days ago. Narayan Rane, who formed the Maharashtra Swabhiman Paksha in 2017, is a Rajya Sabha MP on BJP's nomination. Rane, a former Sena leader, has reportedly been keen on joining the BJP as support for his party has been dwindling in its erstwhile stronghold of Sindhudurg district. But the proposed induction of the Rane family into the BJP has become a point of contention in the BJP-Sena alliance. The latest development has irked the workers of Sena, which has a strong base in Sindhudurg district. BJP's local unit chief Pramod Jathar said Nitesh will be the BJP's candidate from Kankavli. **ENS**

Fadnavis to file nomination today

Mumbai: Maharashtra CM Devendra Fadnavis will file his nomination from Nagpur South West assembly constituency on Friday. State BJP president Chandrakant Patil, Union minister Nitin Gadkari, all India BJP general secretary and poll observor Bhupender Yadav and BJP general secretary Saroj Pandey will be present when Fadnavis files his nomination in Nagpur. A procession of party workers will follow the Chief Minister. A four-time MLA, Fadnavis first contested state Assembly elections in 1999. On Thursday, 95 BJP candidates, including Girish Mahajan, Pankaja Munde, Babanrao Lonikar, Suresh Khade, Jaikumar Rawal, Sambhaji Patil Nilengekar, Ashok Uiley, Madan Yerawar, Sanjay Kute and Ashish Shelar filed nominations for the Assembly polls.

SHIV SENA scion Aaditya Thackeray on Thursday filed his nomination from Worli constituency, declaring assets totalling Rs 17.69 crore. Aaditya, who is the first Thackeray to contest an election, also became the first member of the family to make his finances and wealth public. The 29-year-old Yuva Sena chief has de-

clared himself to be a businessmen with movable assets valued at Rs 13.02 crore. These include Rs 10.9 crore in bank deposits and around Rs 58.11 lakh in shares and debentures. Aaditya has also declared owning a car, which has been valued at Rs 6.5 lakh. He also owns jewellery and gold valued at Rs 1.10 crore.

His total immovable assets are pegged at Rs 4.67 crore, including five land parcels valued at Rs 77.66 lakh, which were gifted to him by his father. He is also the owner of two commercial shop spaces in Kalyan and another in Thane, which were gifted to him by his mother. He does not own a house.

During his filing of nomination, the Shiv Sena put up a massive show of strength with the entire top leadership of the party accompanying Aaditya to the nomination centre.

"I am thrilled and excited to see this support for me. For me, the common man is the CM of the state. I am also a common man and wish to work without expecting any position. People wishing me to be the CM is just their love for me. I called CM in the morning. He wished me luck and gave his support. He was never supposed to attend this (nomination filing) event. He sent his people to show his support," Aaditya told the media.

Asked about his uncle and MNS chief Raj Thackeray not fielding a candidate against him, Aaditya said, "Many people have supported me. I thank all of them. I wish to fulfil all these expectations."

The Sena took out a rally, accompanied by dhol players and Lezim dancers, from Lower Parel till Worli. It was attended by top leaders of the party along with huge number of supporters. The rally, which began at 9 am, also disrupted traffic during the office hours.

Around 12 pm, Aaditya reached the BMC office at Worli to file his nomination along with his father and Shiv Sena chief Uddhav Thackeray, mother Rashmi and brother Tejas.

"We are happy and excited that Aadityaji has chosen Worli to contest. We want to see him as the chief minister. Maharashtra will see a new era of development," said Santosh Jadhav, a party worker from Gandhi Nagar, Worli.

WITH JUST a day left for filing of nominations

The BJP has announced the candidates for all 90 seats that will go to the polls on October 21. Aggarwal was denied the party ticket.

The Gurgaon MLA, who has not been on good terms with CM Manohar Lal Khattar, on Thursday tweeted in Hindi, "Look at the blade of this axe, some have been axed while some are ready to be chopped off."

If Anita files nomination, she will be pitted against BJP's official candidate Sudhir Singla, who happens to be the father-in-law of Aggarwal's nephew.

Sources close to the Aggarwal and Singla families said that efforts were on to pacify the Gurgaon MLA who was "hurt over the party's decision to drop him".

Aggarwal on Wednesday had held a show of strength in Gurgaon.

Aggarwal earlier had come out in support of Rao Inderjit Singh when BJP denied ticket to the Gurgaon MP's daughter Aarti Rao. Hours before the BIP announced its first list of 78 candidates for the Assembly polls on Monday, Aggarwal had advised the party that ignoring "Rao Inderjit will cost BIP dear".

BJP's Guhla MLA Kulwant Ram Bazigar too has been sulking after being denied a ticket. He said he will remain with the BJP, but the party should tell him why he has not been renominated.

The denial of a ticket left at least one leader literally in tears. Samalkha MLA Ravinder Machrauli, who joined the BJP ahead of the polls, broke down before his supporters.

Dushyant to take on Birender Singh's wife, Tej Bahadur to contest against CM Khattar

THE JANNAYAK Janta Party (JJP) named party leader Dushyant Chautala as its candidate from Uchana Kalan and his mother and sitting Dabwali MLA Naina Chautala from Jatdominated Badhra, setting the stage for high profile fights in the two Assembly constituencies in poll bound Haryana.

The two leaders figure in the list of 43 candidates, released in three tranches, by the JJP Thursday. With this the party has named 85 candidates for the polls on October 21.

Dushyant, a former MP from Hisar, will once again take on BJP's sitting MLA Prem Lata, who had defeated him from the Uchana Kalan constituency by a margin of over 7,000 votes in the 2014 Assembly polls. Prem Lata is the wife of Rajya Sabha MP and former Union minister Birender Singh.

The constituency in Jind district has remained a bastion of Birender Singh. Prem Lata defeated Dushyant in the 2014 polls when he had entered the fray despite

Dal from Hisar.

Dushyant also tasted defeat at the hands of Birendra Singh's bureaucrat-turned-politician son Brijendra Singh, fielded by the BJP, in the Lok Sabha polls from Hisar this year.

The JJP has shifted Dushyant's mother Naina Chautala from Dabwali to the Badhra constituency in Charkhi Dadri district, where she will take on former Chief Minister Bansi Lal's son and former Board of Control for Cricket in India president Ranbir Singh Mahindra. BJP has retained its sitting MLA,


Naina's name was announced by the JIP in the fifth list of candidates released Thursday evening.

LANGUAGE MATTERS

THE HINDI Advisory Committee decided to look beyond Delhi and met outside the national capital for the first time on Thursday. Speaking at the meeting in Hyderabad, Rajya Sabha Chairman M Venkaiah Naidu hoped that such events outside Delhi would help promote Hindi, even as he made it clear that no language should be thrust on people and there should be constant dialogue between various Indian languages for linguistic, cultural and emotional unity. He cited Mahatma Gandhi as an example — he recalled Gandhi setting up Dakshin Bharat Hindi Prachar Sabha in Madras in 1918 and inspired by it, Hindi Prachar Sabha was established in Hyderabad in 1935. Naidu made it clear that it is good to know as many languages as possible. Besides Naidu, six Rajya Sabha members, secretary general and other members of the committee attended the meeting that reviewed the use of Hindi in Rajya Sabha secretariat.

Name Game

WITH BIHAR politics heavily influenced by backward castes, a section of the state BJP unit is very keen on expanding its clout by sending an OBC/Dalit to the Upper House. The current BJP MPs from Bihar in Rajya Sabha are Gopal Singh Narayan, R K Sinha, C P Thakur — all from upper caste communities. However, on Thursday, when the party announced nominees for the by-election, for which the party has managed to make its ally ID(U) agree to support its candidate, those hopes were shattered. The BJP nominated Satish Dubey. In Uttar Pradesh, too, the BJP nominated another Brahmin leader, Sudhanshu Trivedi — who has been a regular face on visual media defending the Central government's policies and the party — for the seat vacated by late Arun Jaitley.

JOB EQUATION

POLITICIANS LOVE to be chief guests at public events. But a brochure of the Ministry of Skill Development appeared to have scared some MPs. At a recent meeting of a parliamentary standing committee, the ministry, while showcasing its achievements, distributed a brochure that contained photographs of MPs inaugurating Rojgar Melas in their constituencies. Facing dissidence within govt, Biren gets backing of BJP brass

Amid Oppn boycott, Shivpal, BSP MLA praise Yogi in House

A DAY after Congress MLA from Rae Bareli, Aditi Singh, defied her party to attend the special 36hour session of the Uttar Pradesh Assembly, rebel Samajwadi Party MLA Shivpal Yadav and BSP MLA Aslam Raini attended the House and praised the BJP government and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath.

Raini said that he decided to attend the special session after "listening to his antaraatma (inner voice)".

"I have come to the House today to raise the issues of people of my district, and I hope that you would listen," Raini, who represents Shravasti constituency, told the Assembly and then went on to point out the condition of roads in his district and also in front of his house.

He. however, did not blame the Chief Minister, but called it an "administrative failure".

While Raini said that his loyalties are still with BSP, but to everyone's surprise, he said that the ruling BJP has gone far ahead than the BSP in terms of cadres and organisation. "I have been with BSP since 2002 and people used to praise BSP for its organisation, but today, the BJP has gone far ahead," said Raini. Targeting his own party chief Mayawati, he said that leaders like him feel neglected in the BSP.

"Our leader does not think it is right to consult even 18 leaders," he said, referring to the

"EVM does not win elections. Whoever works would win the election instead. My belief is in the BSP and would remain so but we have lost our path today," Raini said. Notably, BSP chief Mayawati had accused the BIP government of "manipulating EVMs" after the party candidate came a distant third in the Hamirpur Assembly bypolls last week.

He praised Chief Minister Adityanath for "strict" law and order and said that it was either during Mayawati government or during the regime of Adityanath that such a "control over law and order has been exercised".

Shivpal, who has formed Pragatisheel Samajwadi Party (Lohia) but continues to be an SP MLA, meanwhile, showered praise on Adityanath, calling him "the honest Chief Minister".

While he praised Adityanath for the investors' summit, and

the Centre's Ujiwala Yojana (LPG connection scheme), construction of toilets, he also gave his advice towards making these schemes better.

"The leadership of this state is in the hands of an honest CM, who respects public sentiment. But those sitting in police and administration do not understand public sentiment and do not even listen to the elected representatives," said Shivpal.

However, he drew objections from the treasury benches, when he alleged that corruption was rampant at tehsil level. BJP MLAs said it was the habit formed during the previous regime, of which even Shivpal was part. Shivpal then retorted: "If habits of the past remain, then you would also be replaced and someone else would come, I was just giving a suggestion."

SC reserves order on petition challenging changes to SC/ST Act

THE SUPREME Court on Thursday reserved its judgment on a petition challenging amendments to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989, with a three-judge bench observing that it "didn't want to

dilute" the provisions. The Centre had brought changes in the Act last year to nullify the top court's March 20, 2018 order which forbid automatic arrests in cases under the Act and prescribed prior sanction for the arrest of public servants and private persons and also ruled that a preliminary enquiry to verify the charges in the complaint be held before an FIR is registered.

A bench headed by Justice Arun Mishra also said it had already clarified that a Constitution bench had ruled in the past that anticipatory bail could be granted in such cases if courts came to the conclusion that no prima facie case

On October 1, another bench headed by Justice Mishra had recalled the March 20 order, especially the directions for prior sanction for arrest and mandating a preliminary enquiry.

On Thursday, a counsel in the case told the bench that High Courts have been entertaining petitions seeking quashing of FIRs under the Act

To this the bench said, "We cannot curtail rights under Article 21 (protection of life and personal liberty)" and that "individual cases have to be dealt with separately".

The court also said it will clarify the aspect of anticipatory bail in its judgment.

In January this year, the apex court had refused to stay the 2018 amendments, which restored the provision that no anticipatory bail be granted to the accused in offence lodged under this law.

The amendments were challenged in the SC with the petitioners contending that these were ultra vires



RECENTLY DECLARED the Tiger State of India, Madhya Pradesh is inching closer to getting its seventh tiger reserve — the Ratapani Tiger Reserve.

A committee set up by the state government to finalise contours of the core and buffer areas of the proposed reserve, to be carved out of the Ratapani wildlife sanctuary, has submitted its report. The proposed reserve has been hanging fire for more than a decade.

Of the 823.065 sq km area of the existing sanctuary, 763.812 sq km has been redrawn as the core and the remaining 59.253

sg km will be the buffer area of the proposed reserve. Out of the 29 revenue villages that were part of the sanctuary, nine villages, spread over 26.947 sq km, fall in the reserve's core area. While residents of

Dantkhow village have been relocated, the process to relocate residents of three other villages is on. Besides the remaining five revenue villages, residents of three forest villages (spread over 3.070 sq km) will have to be relocated.

Former Chief Conservator of Forests (Bhopal), Dr S P Tiwari, who headed the five-member committee, told The Indian Express that the relocation won't be hasty and will be done at the villagers' convenience. Dr Tiwari,

SC to hear bail plea on Friday

New Delhi: The Supreme Court will on Friday hear a plea by former finance minister P Chidambaram seeking bail in the INX Media case. Chidambaram moved the top court on Thursday contending that his continuing incarceration is in the "form of punishment", and that liberty of an individual cannot be denied on the basis of "anonymous and unverified allegations". The bail plea has been listed before a bench of Justices R Banumathi and Hrishikesh Roy. Stating that "bail is the rule, jail is the exception", Chidambaram said courts should frown on the attempt of the prosecution to use judicial custody as "a kind of pretrial punishment".

THERE WAS a ruckus at the Iharkhand BJP headquarters in Ranchi on Thursday when supporters of former JMM leader Sashi Bhushan Mehta, who was being felicitated after he joined the BJP, assaulted three people, including a woman, protesting against Mehta's induction.

Mehta, a Palamu-based politician, owns schools in Ranchi and is an accused in the murder of Suchitra Mishra, a warden in one of Mehta's schools in 2012.

Mishra's two sons and a woman relative were protesting on Thursday with a placard that read, "Suchitra Mishra ka hatyara Sashi Bhushan

Mehta". Mishra's sons then climbed on the dais where Mehta was seated with top state BJP leaders, including state party chief Laxman Giluwa, and started shouting slogans.

A video of the incident purportedly showed Mishra's son Abhishek being pushed off the dais. Mehta's supporters were also seen hitting Abhishek, his brother and their woman relative. Abhishek was seen retaliating in the video.

A complaint was registered in this regard at Arghora police station. Asked if any action had been taken, SSP, Ranchi, Anish Gupta said, "The DSP visited the BIP office. I have to check with him.' Gupta did not respond to repeated calls later.

Suchitra Mishra's son Abhishek told The Indian Express that he is a BIP member and his whole family supports the party. However, he said, "BJP's slogan 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vish waash' has changed to 'gundai ke saath, bhrastachaar ka vikaas'. We were protesting as Mehta is an accused in my mother's murder. As a member, I expected the party would

revoke his membership." State BJP vice-president Aditya Sahu said, "It was very unruly of the family to come on stage and protest."

Jharkhand BJP spokesperson Pradeep Sinha said, "The family protested on Wednesday too, and their behaviour was not appropriate. But manhandling them was wrong."

Court rejects Deepak Talwar's bail plea

A DELHI court Thursday dismissed the bail plea of corporate lobbyist Deepak Talwar in a corruption case related to negotiations allegedly favouring foreign private airlines and causing loss to state-owned Air India.

Special Judge Anil

Kumar Sisodia dismissed the application filed by Talwar seeking "default bail", claiming that the cognizance of the chargesheet was not taken within 60 days as prescribed under the law. The application also said that the accused had deep roots in society, had a permanent address and that he is not a flight risk.

"The applicant is not in a position even otherwise to tamper with the evidence or influence any witness and he is willing to abide by all the orders and directions passed by the court and is ready to furnish the bail bond," the application said.

The CBI opposed the application saying the chargesheet was filed within stipulated time against the accused, i.e., the 60th day.

The accused was evading arrest and remained outside India during 2017-18 and "if he is enlarged on bail, he may flee or may influence the witnesses and tamper with the evidence", the agency said, praying for dismissal of the

application. Dismissing the application, the judge said, "The chargesheet in the case was filed by the CBI on 60th day itself i.e. on September 23,

Journalists protest over restrictions

Srinagar: As the lockdown and suspension of Internet entered its 60th day on Thursday, over 100 journalists in the Valley staged a sit-in at the city's Kashmir Press Club, seeking immediate and unhindered access to communication.

A joint statement issued by 11 media associations in the Valley said: "There have been no clear answers from the government why it has barricaded the Kashmir journalist fraternity under a communication blockade. The government must come up with an answer on how long the crackdown on news would continue."

Thursday's sit-in was the first protest by Valley journalists since August 5 after the scrapping of I&K's special status and bifurcation of the state into two Union territories.

Wearing black bands and holding placards that read 'Journalism is not a crime', 'Information blockade - 60 days and counting', the protesting iournalists demanded an immediate end to the curbs.

The I&K government has set up a Media Facilitation Centre at a private hotel in Srinagar. Journalists complained that their movements and activities in the centre were tracked

Journey of J&K's development begins with Vande Bharat Express, says Shah

UNION HOME Minister Amit Shah on Thursday flagged off the Vande Bharat Express from Delhi to Katra and said the train was the beginning of development of the "new" Jammu and Kashmir.

"I believe that not only was Article 370 a roadblock for the unity of this country, but it was also the biggest roadblock for the development of Kashmir. I am sure that after the removal of this Article, we will be successful in completely eradicating terrorism and the ideas promoting terrorism in the area," Shah said.

"In the next 10 years, Jammu and Kashmir will be one of the most developed regions of the country and the journey of development has begun with Vande Bharat Express which is set to boost development and promote religious tourism," he said at the flag-off function.

Shah, who was accompanied by Railway Minister Piyush Goyal, Union ministers Jitendra Singh and Harsh Vardhan, flagged off the train from New Delhi railway station.

Speaking on the occasion, Goyal said Jammu and Kashmir will be connected through rail link to the rest of the country by

August 15, 2022. Work on the missing link in the Kashmir project — the Katra to Banihal section including a bridge over the river Chenab — is underway and is expected to be complete by then, he said.

"The abrogation of Article 370 has connected the people of this country to Jammu and Kashmir and I believe that this train will become the symbol of the development and progress that this region will see in the years to come," Goyal said.

Jitendra Singh, Union Minister of State in the PMO, said that with the abrogation of provisions of Article 370, "the Vande Bharat Express will bring new India to new Jammu and Kashmir".

Singh said the government's decision on Article 370 was a gift for the people of the region after "three decades of struggle" and the launch of the train was another present which would contribute towards building a "new Jammu and Kashmir".

The New Delhi-Katra Vande

Bharat Express, also called Train 18, will depart from the New Delhi Railway Station at 6 am to reach Katra at 2 pm. It will halt at Ambala Cantt, Ludhiana and Jammu Tawi for two minutes each. It will run on all days of the week except Tuesday.

Detention of 'minor' revoked: J&K to HC

KAUNAIN SHERIFF M NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 3

A WEEK after Jammu & Kashmir High Court sought the state government's reply on a plea challenging a detention under Public Safety Act (PSA) and claiming that the detainee is a minor, authorities have replied that the home department has "revoked" the detention order and directed the police to "hand over" the detainee to the family.

The Indian Express on September 26 reported that a bench of Justice Sanjeev Kumar, hearing the habeas corpus petition, had ordered the government to file a counter affidavit in a PSA case where relatives have produced a school report card to claim that the detainee is 16 years old. The government had been asked to file a reply before October 1. The government has now

filed the reply before a bench of Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey and informed that the detention order under PSA has been revoked and police has been directed to release the detainee. "In view of the aforesaid position, nothing survives for further adjudication in this Habeas Corpus petition, as a seguel thereto, the same shall stand closed as settled," Justice Magrey said.

order stated. During the hearing, the detainee's uncle claimed before the single judge that despite revocation of the detention order, the detainee has not been handed over to his family. The court has now directed SSP, Anantnag, "to ensure that the detenue is got released shifted back and, subsequently handed over to his family".

The Indian Express had earlier reported that relatives of two detainees in the Valley have moved the Jammu and Kashmir High Court, saying they are minors one 16 and the other 14 -and the court has ordered a probe in one and asked the government to reply in another.

In the other petition, the Srinagar wing of the high court has ordered an inquiry has asked the registrar to complete the probe within 10 days and ascertain the age of the detainee.

Indrani, Peter granted divorce

The terms agreed upon by the two included financial settlement between them, division of their immovable properties as well as their personal articles.

MARADU FLATS FACE DEMOLITION

Their dream homes left behind, residents look for new address

LIFTS AT Alfa Serene, one of the four apartment complexes in Maradu that face demolition for

violation of Coastal Zone Regulation (CRZ) norms, haven't halted since Wednesday. Men from packers and movers are going up and then returning with furniture and other items dismantled from dream homes. At the ground floor, men and women plonk on bundles meant

to be loaded on to trucks. The residents of the four complexes, which are facing demolition following a Supreme Court ultimatum, have resigned themselves to the fact that they have to leave the homes in which they invested their hard-earned money

. The four complexes have 343 units, 190 of which housed the flat owners till Thursday evening. As the deadline fixed by the

state government to vacate the flats ended on Thursday, many residents are yet to find a new address or shift out their belongings from the high-rises. To ensure that they leave, the state government has said it will snap power and water supply at Thursday midnight. The supply had been snapped earlier too, but was later restored to enable the flat owners to pack.

Among those leaving is a 54year-old doctor attached to a medical college. "I haven't gone to work since September 25. It is heart-wrenching to leave this flat which I bought a decade back with a bank loan. My youngest daughter goes to school. I have

to find a flat somewhere here to ensure that the relocation does not affect her schooling. I could not find a feasible alternative place as builders elsewhere have started exploiting the situation and demanding exorbitant rent.

So, I have decided to move in with my brother, who lives with his family at a village in Ernakulam district," he said.

RAPE-MURDER CASE

In 2:1 verdict, SC upholds death penalty

THE SUPREME Court has upheld the death penalty awarded to a man found guilty of raping and killing a twoyear-old girl, daughter of a fruit seller, in Maharashtra in March

A three-judge bench, by a majority verdict of 2:1, upheld the death sentence. While Justices R F Nariman and Surya Kant upheld the death sentence, Justice Subhash Reddy while upholding the conviction modified the sentence to life imprisonment.

The majority ruling took note of the fact that Parliament had amended the POCSO Act and introduced the death penalty for brutal rape of children aged below 12.

It said "if Parliament, armed with adequate facts and figures, has decided to introduce capital punishment for the offence of sexual abuse of a child, the Court hitherto will bear in mind the latest Legislative Policy even though it has no applicability in a case where the offence was committed prior thereto".

The court noted that the "victim was barely a two-yearold baby whom the appellant kidnapped and apparently kept on assaulting over 4-5 hours till she breathed her last... He ruthlessly finished a life which was yet to bloom".

"The appellant instead of showing fatherly love, affection and protection to the child against the evils of society, rather made her the victim of lust. It's a case where trust has been betrayed and social values are impaired," it noted.

Justice Reddy, however, said, "I am clear in my mind that in this case on hand, the mitigating circumstances of the appellant, dominate over the aggravating circumstances, to modify the death sentence to that of life imprisonment. Even as per the case of prosecution, the appellant was under influence of liquor at the time of committing the offence, and there is no evidence on record from the side of prosecution, to show that there is no possibility of reformation and rehabilitation of the appellant."

Unnao: CBI chargesheet in gangrape case

New Delhi: The CBI Thursday filed a charge sheet in a case of alleged gangrape of the Unnao rape victim on June 11, 2017, when she was a minor.

The chargesheet was filed before District Judge Dharmesh Sharma. The matter is now expected to be heard on October 10 as the CBI has sought time to file additional documents. This case is separated from the rape case in which UP MLA Kuldeep Singh

According to a PTI report, the CBI has named three persons as accused in the chargesheet — Naresh Tiwari, Brijesh Yadav Singh and Shubham Singh. All three are out on bail. According to the chargesheet, the three allegedly kidnapped and gangraped the victim a week after she was allegedly raped.

Sengar is an accused.

Shubham is the son of Shashi Singh, who allegedly lured the victim to Sengar's residence and is Sengar's co-accused in that case. **ENS**

MP: 7 dead as bus falls into flooded river

Raisen (MP): Seven people died and over 30 were injured after a bus fell into a flooded river in Madhya Pradesh's Raisen district in the early hours of Thursday. The bus was apparently speeding and the driver lost control while it was passing over a

bridge, the police said. CM Kamal Nath expressed grief over the incident and announced an aid of Rs 4 lakh for the kin of each deceased. PTI

'Lime-surkhi used in India much before Islamic era'

LIME-SURKHI mixture as a building material was used "continuously" in India much before the arrival of Muslims, the counsel for Ramlalla Virajman told the Supreme Court on Thursday. He was opposing claims by the Muslim side that its use started in the Islamic era and its presence on a 50 m wall discovered by Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) in Ayodhya was proof that it was an Islamic structure.

Nirmohi Akhara, meanwhile, alleged that the Ramlalla's suit instituted in 1989 was for "political reasons".

Appearing for the deity, Advocate C S Vaidyanathan told a bench headed by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi that it was "wrong" to say that lime-surkhi made its appearance in India from the Islamic period.

It was used in Gangetic plain from the 2nd century BC as shown by excavations in Kaushambi, he said, citing experts. He said some experts had suggested that Surkhi is "purely indigenous and was not brought in India from Central Asia".

The bench, also comprising Justices S A Bobde, D Y Chandrachud, Ashok Bhushan and S Abdul Nazeer, is hearing appeals against the 2010 verdict of Allahabad High Court which or-

He also rejected claims that pillar bases found by ASI were at different floors and said it was a "complete misreading" of the report. Of the 50 pillar bases unearthed, 46 belong to fourth floor and the rest to third floor, he pointed out.

Justice Chandrachud referred to the report finding similarities between an octagonal stone block used over the pillar bases and one used in Sarnath and asked if there was any evidence to show that what was unearthed was not part of a Buddha Vihara.

Vaidyanathan said Hindus have for centuries held the place as Ram's birthplace. It was not any place of significance for Buddhists, he said, adding that it was possible to draw a reasonable inference that it could not have been a vihara.

"Faith is one thing, but now we are in the area of evidence," Justice Chandrachud said.

Vaidyanathan said the temple at Sarnath was constructed by the queen of Garhwal Dynasty during the same time when the tem-

ple at Ayodhya was renovated by the king of Garhwal Dynasty. He said he will submit a detailed note

He also opposed Sunni Central Wakf Board's contention that travelogues and gazetteers recording the faith and belief with regard to the Ram's birthplace are hearsay.

The submission was "untenable", he said, adding that it was also "reflective of the deep rooted prejudice of the Western historians and rejection of the oral tradition in the Orient. The recording of the history in India, unlike in Europe, is not one of recording dates and events, it is more in respect of culture, practices etc."

He said the significance of oral history cannot be ruled out and added that even the Quran and Hadith were transmitted orally and then recorded.

Appearing for one of the Hindu parties, Senior Counsel PS Narasimha submitted that the 8th century Skandamahapuran refers to the place of birth of Ram and "and provides the proof of the faith that is instilled in the heart of Hindus that visit (Tirthyatra/pilgrimage) to this place is of extreme merit which, for Hindus, is nothing but Moksha".

Appearing for the Akhara, Senior Advocate Sushil Kumar Jain said the Akhara was in continuous possession of the disputed land till it was attached by the local magistrate.

7 arrested for gangrape of teenager in Nalanda

SANTOSH SINGH PATNA. OCTOBER 3

POLICE IN Bihar's Nalanda have arrested seven youths under provisions of the POCSO Act for the gangrape of a minor girl after video clips of the incident went viral on social media.

According to police, the incident took place on September 16 after the accused attacked the teenaged girl, who had left home to attend coaching classes, and her male friend in a hilly area. Police said the girl underwent

a medical test and recorded her statement before a judicial magistrate. She is back with her family, they said. The district administration is in touch with her family to provide counselling, officials said. Videos of the incident show

the girl addressing the accused as "brother" and pleading with them to let her go. One clip shows one of the accused threatening to kill

her and "make the video viral" if she resists. Another shows her friend, who has been identified as a local guide, trying unsuccessfully to save her and being assaulted.

Bihar DGP Gupteshwar Pandey told *The Indian Express:* "All the seven accused have been identified and arrested. The chargesheet is likely to be submitted within a week. We expect a speedy trial and conviction within three months. I will be meeting the victim and her family members."

An officer at the local police station said the accused were identified during investigations based on the video clips. "All of them are local residents, some are school dropouts," the officer said.

Asked if the accused were minors, the officer said it was up to the court to decide after verifying their birth certificates. The accused have been booked for rape and criminal intimidation under sections of the IPC and provisions of the POCSO Act.



Karnataka: Flood-affected farmer commits suicide

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE BENGALURU, OCTOBER 3

A 55-YEAR-OLD coffee farmer in Chikkamagaluru district, who suffered crop losses in the recent floods and was battling a serious health condition, committed suicide on Wednesday, officials said.

The family of Chandre Gowda (55), who lost around half an acre of the five acres of coffee crop land he was holding in the flood in August, has filed a police complaint stating that delay in compensation precipitated his financial position, which eventually led to him commit suicide.

Gowda, of SK Meghal village, incurred debt because of cancer treatment, which he had been undergoing for four years. He had also borrowed money to cultivate coffee on the five-acre land, local officials said, based on a preliminary inquiry.

"The family has given a complaint saying the death is related to farm distress following the flood. They also indicated that he was being treated for cancer. An investigation is being carried out into the circumstances of the

death," a police officer said. People in as many as 17 districts of the state who suffered crop losses because of the flood are waiting for compensation. The total damage in the state has been pegged at Rs 32,000 crore.

The issue of flood relief has taken a major political turn with the Opposition attacking the government for failing to secure a relief package from the Centre.

Delaying, not asking questions, on J&K — this doesn't match SC tradition of speaking up for those who cannot

HE CENTRE'S MOVE in Kashmir, a defining one for the Narendra Modi government, is also turning out to be a critical moment for the judiciary. On October 1, responding to a raft of petitions challenging the constitutional validity of the August 5 decision to abrogate the special status of Kashmir, a five-judge constitution bench of the Supreme Court refused to order a stay, and adjourned the hearing to November 14 — that is, until well after the scheduled implementation of the Centre's order has carved up the state into two Union Territories on October 31. Earlier, addressing a separate batch of petitions questioning the restrictions on movement and communication that have accompanied the Centre's decision, another SC bench held that "personal liberty will have to be balanced with national security". The court has deferred such petitions, including one filed by CPM general secretary Sitaram Yechury questioning the detention of his colleague Mohammed Yousuf Tarigami, for hearing on October 16. Something is seriously amiss in the response of the country's apex court, and it is this: The court, which is the centrepiece of the system of checks and balances that keeps the political executive honest and accountable, that ensures due process and is the custodian of individual rights, is showing a striking lack of urgency. In fact, deferring and delaying, not asking questions that need to be asked, giving the government the benefit of the doubt — serious doubt on the drastic curbs on fundamental freedoms, doesn't quite match the apex court's own stellar tradition of speaking up for those who cannot.

This is especially troubling in habeas corpus cases where delay can have a costly human rights toll. The court's dithering here recalls its most forgettable moment. In the ADM Jabalpur case during the Emergency, four judges out of five, with the honourable exception of Justice H R Khanna, had handed out virtual good conduct certificates to the government, expressing the hope, "diamond bright, diamond hard", that the fears of the detenues would prove to be uncalled for. Of course, it made amends, overruled that embarrassing decision, in 2017. Yet, today, two years later, the judiciary's lack of urgency in pronouncing on the validity of citizens' detentions and the constitutional legitimacy of the government's decision, is made worse by its apparent glibness in imposing gag orders of its own. Last month, the J&K High Court allowed two National Conference MPs to meet Farooq Abdullah and Omar Abdullah, detained in Srinagar, but barred them from speaking to the press about the meeting. Earlier, a CJI-led bench of the SC had allowed Yechury to meet Tarigami after hedging the permission similarly.

On very many occasions, the Supreme Court has protected and expanded citizens' liberties. For its own sake, and that of the people who look up to it, especially those men and women — and in J&K, children, too — who are denied their rights in the name of "national interest", it needs to step up to its role.

SEIZE THE OPENING

Iran's president indicates that French plan for talks with US is acceptable. Washington mustn't squander the opportunity

N SEPTEMBER 7, the spokesperson for Iran's nuclear agency announced that the country had the ability to enrich uranium up to 20 per cent and it had launched advanced centrifuge machines, further violating its commitments under the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) or the Iran nuclear deal between Tehran and the US, France, Germany, Britain, Russia and the European Union. The move was an escalation of the brinkmanship underway since US President Donald Trump withdrew from the JCPOA in May 2018. This week, President Hassan Rouhani has indicated Tehran is amenable to the plan for talks proposed by French President Emmanuel Macron, with the US. It is a diplomatic opening.

The 2015 JCPOA came into being after arduous negotiations and placed restrictions on Iran's nuclear programme while removing the harsh economic sanctions on the country. Since the US's withdrawal from the deal, the Trump administration has ramped up the sanctions, and its anti-Iran rhetoric, while Tehran has flouted the limits placed on its nuclear programme. The logic behind Washington's plan appears to be that the sanctions would increase disaffection in Iran to such a degree that the government and the Ayatollah would be overthrown. It is, however, more likely that the moderate, democratically-elected Rouhani government has suffered due to the sanctions. Rouhani staked considerable political capital in pushing through the nuclear deal, particularly with the recalcitrant sections of the Islamic state opposed to any accord with the US.

Rouhani has said in a publicly-broadcast cabinet meeting that the deal proposed by Macron entails that Tehran will not pursue nuclear weapons and that sanctions would be lifted, allowing Iran to resume oil sales. The Iranian president has, however, expressed concern over Donald Trump's alleged doublespeak: "The American president on two occasions... said explicitly that we want to intensify sanctions... Should we accept your (European leaders') word that America is ready (for talks)?" The ball is now in Washington's court. New Delhi has thus far managed to walk the diplomatic tightrope between the US and Iran. Given the goodwill that PM Narendra Modi enjoys with President Trump, as well as India's close historical and trade ties with Iran, Delhi could join Paris and other world powers in nudging both countries towards talks. The alternative — the path of calibrated escalation — a slippery slope.

WRITING ON THE WALL

Banksy, artist of the masses, envy of high art, foe of commercial art, has opened a shop. There's a twist in the tale

HE MARKET ASSIMILATES all, even the most anti-market. British street artist Banksy, who turned anonymity into a virtue and the anti-original stencil into an instrument of high art on par with the palette knife, has opened a shop in Croydon, south London. He has been forced to this step by a greeting card company which is appropriating his name, one of the creative world's most valuable brands, to sell fake Banksy merchandise. Legally, it is a laughable ploy, since it seems to be trying to use a parallel from the world of patents — a patent which is not worked by the owner can be compulsorily licensed to keep a product on the market. But a brand is not a patent, only similar, and the case is likely to collapse.

In the meantime, to retain control over his name, Banksy has opened a shop to put his home products on the market. Some are all heart, like doormats made out of life jackets worn by migrants in the Mediterranean, stitched by other migrants interned in Greece. But the name of the shop, Gross Domestic Product, suggests that many products will be awful by design.

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Two decades ago, Banksy had energised the counterculture by putting the Mona Lisa, wearing headphones and armed with an RPG launcher, on a building off Oxford Street, London's retail Mecca. Now, while going commercial with his own retail premises, Banksy is keeping the spirit of protest alive. GDP isn't really a shop. It's actually an installation featuring Banksy's art in a disused carpet shop. Its doors will never open, and it is as transient as a flashmob. Before it dissolves back into the mind of its creator, you could order its wares online, but only through a website which does not yet exist. Perhaps it never will.

Conflict of interest controversy is not about individuals, but about rules that must account for rule-benders

IF YOU THINK there is conflict of interest, there probably is. Indian cricket these days is dealing with this brutal, but undeniable, truth.

Sourav Ganguly has been told that he can't sit in the Delhi Capitals dugout and also be in charge at Eden Gardens. Sachin Tendulkar and V V S Laxman, because of their IPL connections, can no longer be on the all-powerful committee that picked Ravi Shastri as coach. Rahul Dravid can't be the vice-president at India Cements — the company that owns Chennai Super Kings — and also be the man in charge at the BCCI's National Cricket Academy.

The downgrade hasn't gone down well with the game's superstars. As always it was Ganguly, the voice of the Golden Generation, who took the lead in expressing the collective disgust of those with more pies on their table than their fingers could fit into. "New fashion in indian cricket... conflict of interest... Best way to remain in news. god help indian cricket ...," he tweeted.

Ganguly's immediate provocation was the BCCI ethics officer's notice to Dravid but his own angst of choosing just one of the four influential positions he then occupied – Cricket Association of Bengal president, BCCI's cricket committee member, Delhi Capitals advisor and television pundit — also seemed to have triggered this apocalyptic outburst. Ganguly's "new fashion in Indian cricket" has been a corporate norm for ages now. While the world was swearing their exclusivity to their employers by signing thick water-tight contracts, on the island that houses cricket's cozy club, "conflict of interest" was still an alien concept. Inside that bubble lived a closeknit community, and it was fashionable to wear more than one hat.

The Committee of Administrators (CoA), assigned by the Supreme Court to dismantle the old cricket edifice, has unknowingly promoted this system by being soft towards the omnipresent legends enacting multiple roles. A couple of years ago, historian Ramachandra Guha, in his resignation letter from the CoA, had, while describing this as cricket's "superstar culture", written: "The more famous the player (former or present) the more leeway he is allowed in violating norms and procedures... One famous former cricketer is con-

Ganguly continued to push the envelope. During the IPL, he would be seen giving a bear hug to his team's star player, the young wicketkeeper batsman Rishabh Pant and within days, as a World Cup commentator, questioned M S Dhoni's place in the team. Maybe, it was what Virat Kohli's India desperately needed and a fair call, but Ganguly, after his seamless switch from the Delhi Capitals jersey to the sharp suit of a pundit, didn't sound convincing. He might be the man solely responsible for sweeping regionalism out of the Indian cricket when he was the captain, but as a committed cricket

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tracted by media houses to comment on active players while serving as President of his State Association."

Guha's red flag was ignored, the CoA didn't find anything wrong in Ganguly signing a MoU with the Kolkata Knight Riders as Cricket Bengal president for hosting their home games at Eden Gardens and later getting into a contract with Delhi Capitals as their advisor. In his own backyard, Eden Gardens, the Prince of Kolkata would sit in the away dressing room. The picture of him assessing the Eden pitch wearing a Delhi jersey summed up Indian cricket's conflicted hierarchy.

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Casting aspersions on the country's superstars has never been popular. Their glorious cricketing deeds and unblemished life in public have given them a well-deserved squeaky clean image. So, to even think that Dravid would be biased towards the players of CSK, the IPL franchise owned by his employers, India Cements, would amount to blasphemy. That's where the players and fans misunderstand the concept of conflict of interest.

BCCI's ethics officer, former SC Judge D K Jain, in a detailed order that restricts Ganguly to just one BCCI post, has a line that should be read out repeatedly to those who get pained when reminded of the possibility of them availing personal benefits because of their official position.

"Generally speaking, the concept of Conflict of Interest is not necessarily a question about something one does or intends to do but a question of what one could do," Jain writes. It's not about judging an individual, it is about understanding the scope of his power. So, maybe, Ganguly wouldn't influence the curator at Eden or Dravid would never even think of pushing CSK players but in the days to come, someone in these powerful positions can.

Institutions aren't governed by rules meant for a handful of conscientious individuals, they need to factor in the worst rule-benders. While aspiring to put in place a set of principles that are over-arching, if the constitution is a shade idealistic, so be it. There are lessons to be learnt from the past.

Siding with the players, the CoA has often lamented about the serious dearth of players with stature while explaining why the same set of cricketers end up being on important committees, commentary panels or even in IPL dug outs. It's a flawed idea since this has resulted in the concentration of power in a few hands, which is at the core of Indian cricket's biggest crisis for the last three years.

When Lalit Modi went selling the IPL franchise more than a decade back, there were few takers of this untested format. Modi would rope in family and friends. The BCCI would strike out the "conflict of interest" clause from the constitution, allowing N Srinivasan to have commercial interests in cricket by way of pocketing an IPL team. Again, power rested in a few important hands. This inadvertently laid the foundation of the Indian Parivar League, where there was always an uncle, a father or a father-in-law that could be trusted to bail one out if caught pulling a fast one.

Based on the findings by Justice R M Lodha, the SC called the amendment of the "conflict of interest" clause, the true villain of the piece. That's why Lodha wanted an extensive background check for those wanting to be under the BCCI umbrella. The recent cases of cricket corruption in franchise T20 leagues have shown that the sharks are out there waiting to sneak into the system.

So, however much the players want, the new rule book can't have a conflict of interest clause with an asterisk at the start and a fine print below that reads: Tendulkar, Dravid, Ganguly, Laxman and all others with Test batting averages of 50 and more exempted, since we know they can do no wrong.

ON NRC, ARE WE LISTENING?

Supporters and opposers must engage each other with empathy

IN HIS ARTICLE 'Fakir in the detention camp' (IE, September 9), S Gopalakrishnan argues that an administrative register based on material proof of origin won't be able to record the nuances of the cultural roots of a land and its people. While it is true that an administrative register cannot be the base of identity, his views reflect only on one side of the story.

The National Register of Citizens (NRC) has evoked considerable discussion, and two persistent lines of argument have occupied centrestage: One that opposes the NRC tooth and nail; the other, appeals to look at the history and conditions leading up to the NRC. The first line of argument comes from mainstream civil society members who have criticised it, primarily on three fronts. The first is on the lines of "Hindutva". The NRC came to be seen as a case of "xenophobia" against Assam's Muslims in the light of the Citizenship Amendment Bill of 2016. However, this argument couldn't sustain owing to the fact that the people of Assam have been protesting against "illegal immigration" not because of religion but on grounds of culture and geography. The Hindutva argument has been followed by another line of argument which looks at the global precarity of labour created by globalisation. It is based on the fact that globalisation benefits from the vulnerability of labour. Now, after the release of the final list, around 19 lakh people have

been left out of it and they have to appeal to the Foreigners' Tribunal in order for their case to be reconsidered: The excluded people will be given 120 days to file an appeal before the Tribunal. Finally, there is the issue of the composition of those Foreigners' Tribunals as well as their capacity to solve those issues.

Another argument has surfaced, primarily from the civil society of Assam — who have been making appeals to understand the history and conditions leading to the NRC, conditions over which the Assamese hardly have control. They have also been pointing towards multiple layers of the issue while challenging the "ready made" structures which most of us use. Though there have been attempts at hijacking the process by a few politically motivated groups, yet, when it comes to sharing responsibility, people from the "mainland" can no longer afford to stay aloof from the concerns of scarce resources and land. Hiren Gohain, the renowned scholar, has pointed out that the NRC process was impersonal and its machinelike operation pre-empted the targeting of any particular community. While there may have been errors, he added, the allegations of bias are unfounded. One also needs to understand the colonial roots whereby migration from East Bengal took place in the early decades of the 20th century, and the conditions that led to 1971 being set as the cut-off year to verify citizenship in Assam.

Whose voices are we to listen to? We have to start by acknowledging that there has been an attempt to hijack the entire process by a few politically motivated groups. Yet, the many nuances of the problem need to be understood. Added to these nuances is another complexity: The 19 lakh people who have been excluded from the list. If rumours about detention camps being built are true, we need to not remain silent, and be vocal about it instead — something like a detention camp evokes unpleasant, inhuman images that we have only read about in our history books.

ONGC STRIKE
