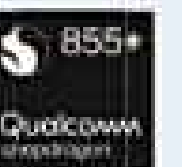
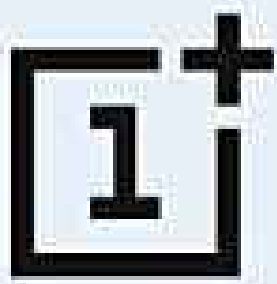

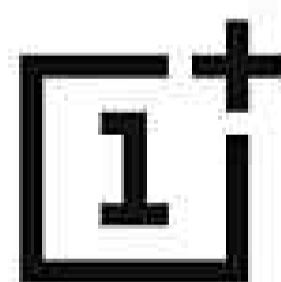

## RBI cuts rates to decade low

Loans set to be cheaper | GDP forecast down to 6.1% | Was 6.9% earlier

**MUMBAI, OCTOBER 4**  
The Reserve Bank of India today announced its fifth straight cut in key lending rates in a bid to revive country's stalled economic growth. The measure is likely to make home, auto and other loans cheaper should banks pass on the benefit to borrowers.

The RBI's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) at its meeting voted to cut repo rate — at which banks borrow money from the RBI — by 25 basis points to a 10-year low of 5.15 per cent. The previous lowest repo rate of 5 per cent was recorded in March 2010. The reverse repo rate was also

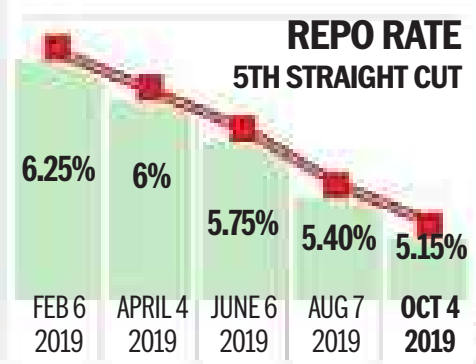

## IAF Chief bets big on indigenous jets

**NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 4**  
The new Indian Air Force Chief, Air Chief Marshal Rakesh Kumar Singh Bhadauria, today laid out a major indigenous plan that will involve quick induction of more variants of the Tejas fighter aircraft, designing and building of a new fifth generation fighter jet in India and getting the next lot of trainer aircraft from the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL).

Addressing mediapersons ahead of the Air Force Day on October 8, the IAF Chief who took over on September 30 said: "We are putting all efforts on AMCA (advanced medium combat aircraft) and have okayed the plan." The AMCA is a fifth generation jet, which the DRDO is designing.

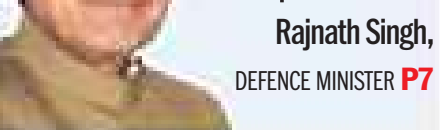

## Basmati faked as PR variety to bag MSP

PROCUREMENT FRAUD Kamal arhtiya-miller-official nexus 'siphoning' govt funds

**KARNAL, OCTOBER 4**  
With paddy procurement picking up in the rice bowl of Haryana, certain officials of the State Agriculture Marketing Board in connivance with procurement agencies, arhtiyas and rice millers are allegedly siphoning off money from the state exchequer by issuing fake gate passes for PR variety instead of PUSA 1509 Basmati.

### MODUS OPERANDI

- Arhtiyas in cahoots with officials buy 1509 Basmati and pass it off as PR paddy
- 1509 Basmati is not procured by govt, but PR paddy fetches ₹1,835/quintal MSP
- They collect MSP from govt, supply to it cheaper PDS rice from UP, Bihar later

PR variety is procured by the government for custom milling of rice (CMR), while it

doesn't procure Basmati varieties, which are purchased solely by private dealers. By

passing off Basmati as PR variety, arhtiyas collect Rs 1,835 per quintal MSP from the government though no crop is actually being purchased against fake gate passes.

Though farmers get their money — Rs 2,400 to Rs 2,600 as per the rate of the day for PUSA 1509 — arhtiyas and millers together earn huge profits by allegedly supplying cheaper PDS (public distribution system) rice brought from

## Prisoners' list: Five of 8 were already out

Even as Congress and SAD leaders are fighting to claim credit for the Centre's decision to release eight Sikh detainees charged under TADA, five of them recommended for premature release by Punjab

to the MHA were already out on completing their sentence. They are Ferozepur's Swaran Singh, Amritsar's Hardeep Singh, Waryam Singh, Patran's Dilbagh Singh, who was released last year, and Ajnala resident Bal Singh. Released in January 2016, the latter is dead.

Punjab Jails Minister SS Randhawa said they were yet to receive the list of prisoners who were to be released. Questioning the inclusion of names of those already free, Dal Khalsa official remarked: "The Punjab Government seems not to have updated the list of prisoners."

# Coordination panel meets, but fails to break deadlock

Yet again, the coordination committee meant to finalise the joint celebrations of main event of the 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev at Sultanpur Lodhi could not break the impasse between the SGPC and the state government.

As Cabinet Minister Sukhjinder Singh Randhawa skipped the event, his colleague Charanjit Singh Channi represented the state government whereas Tota Singh and Bibi Jagir Kaur were from the SGPC side and Baba Naurang Singh from Baba Nihal Singh Hariyan Wela Wale was the independent member in the meeting held at SGPC headquarters here today.

Randhawa, who was conspicuous by his absence, had already lodged his protest with Akal Takht against the SGPC's move to

go solo on inviting dignitaries while ignoring state representation. Akal Takht had forwarded his letter to the SGPC and Jathedar Giani Harpreet Singh had said the matter could be taken up in the meeting.

When asked, Channi said, “I am here as a state representative. Leave aside everything, the state government is working with a liberal approach on the modalities to hold the main celebrations at Sultanpur Lodhi jointly so that it should comply with the universal brotherhood and peace message of

Guru Nanak. I hope that we will reach a consensus”.

He said the issues regarding the venue and allied arrangements were discussed in detail, but it fell short of any decision. “After discussing it with the CM, we will give our viewpoint,” he said.

Hinting that another meeting was in the pipeline, SGPC president Gobind Singh Longowal said, “We had discussions with positive approach from both the sides. It will be revealed in a few days”.

SGPC has rented the Guru Nanak Stadium to

hold the main event and arrangements are underway where state government has pumped in at least Rs 50 crore to erect a stage at the back of Gurdwara Ber Sahib for the event in addition to the tents to accommodate a huge number of devotees.

The stalemate between the two sides was to decide upon the stage for joint event which would be graced by the President, the PM, CMs of various states and dignitaries from various countries.

He said the group category comprised three competitions pertaining to shabad group, dhadhi and kavishari. In solo category, the contests include solo, poetry recitation, poem singing, declamation, writing, painting, calligraphy, photography, digital poster and sketch (line art).

Winners in all the categories will get prizes worth Rs 15.90 lakh. The unique part is that the students will showcase their talent on the website www.derababananakutsav.com by uploading their performances. At the time of declaration of the results by judges, the reactions received on the social media will also be taken into account.

## Urea usage falls by 1.68L tonnes

CHANDIGARH, OCTOBER 4

The Tandrust Punjab Mission has been successful in safeguarding the soil health by optimising the use of chemical fertilisers, said KS Pannu, Director, Tandrust Punjab Mission. He said it was observed that farmers in Punjab were using fertilisers in excess of the recommendations of Punjab Agricultural University, Ludhiana. Therefore, the matter was taken up. Resultantly, the urea usage, which was 15.43 lakh tonnes in kharif 2017, reduced by 86,000 tonnes to 14.57 lakh tonnes in 2018.

It further decreased by 82,000 tonnes to 13.75 lakh tonnes in 2019. The cumulative reduction in its usage within two years of launch of Tandrust Punjab Mission is 1,68,000 tonnes and this has saved Rs 100.80 crore for farmers. — TNS

#### Defamation case stayed

Chandigarh: The Punjab and Haryana High Court on Friday stayed trial court proceedings in a defamation case filed by SAD MLA Bikram Singh Majithia against Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh. As the case came up for hearing, Sanjay Singh's counsel Himmat Singh Shergill contended that the trial court while summoning the petitioner had not followed the provisions of Section 202 of the CrPC. Shergill asserted the petitioner was residing at New Delhi and was summoned without taking recourse to the mandatory provisions. Taking up the case, Justice Mahabir Singh Sindhu issued notice of motion returnable on January 17 next year. “Proceedings before the trial court shall remain stayed, till the next date of hearing,” the Bench added. TNS

#### CM to hand over job letters

Ropar: Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh will hand over appointment letters to the youth selected for various jobs during fifth mega job fair held across the state at a state-level function at Chamkaur Sahib, near here on Saturday. Chamkaur Sahib MLA and Punjab Technical Education Minister Charanjit Singh Channi said the Chief Minister would also lay foundation stone of two gates in memory of Sahibzada Ajit Singh and Sahibzada Jujhar Singh. He would also lay foundation stone of a railway underbridge at Morinda, he said. TNS

#### 4-gm heroin seized, 2 held

Muktsar: The Muktsar (city) police on Thursday arrested two persons and recovered four-gm heroin from their possession. Those arrested included a Congress man Vakil Singh, who had twice contested the election of municipal councillor. The police said a man identified as Mohammad Akram, alias Mani, was walking on the Bathinda-Kotkapura bypass road and the contraband was recovered from him while frisking. Mani reportedly informed the police that he had bought the heroin from Vakil Singh. A case under Sections 21, 61, 85 of the NDPS Act has been registered in this regard. TNS

# Mishap that wasn't: Man held for killing 7 of family

Nursing a grudge against his kin, the accused drove vehicle into Gang Canal & passed it off as accident

The incidence of a car purportedly falling into Gang Canal near Jandwala Mirasangla village on September 26 resulting in the death of seven members of a family turned out to be a cold-blooded murder by Balwinder Singh (40) of Alamshah village in Fazilka district. However, the truth came to fore in a week.

Balwinder, who nursed a grudge against his family members, brainstormed for over two months to make the murder look like an accident.

Camouflaging his intentions, he motivated the victims to visit a child faith healer and seek his bless-

ings. He conducted a recce of the site twice.

The victims included his minor physically challenged son, mother and brother.

According to Fazilka DSP Jagdish Kumar, accused Balwinder Singh, who is currently unemployed and earlier worked with wine contractors in Rajasthan, was allegedly tied and thrashed by his family members, including mother and brother, two months ago as he used to drink excessively, indulged in “satta” and stole money from the house.

Balwinder Singh was married twice. His first wife had died and he had estranged relationship with his second

wife, who had also left him allegedly due to his bad habits.

Since then, Balwinder held a grudge and resolved



to avenge by killing all family members.

He took his kin to the faith healer at Achariki village in

Abohar subdivision twice. He stopped at the site of incident during these visits on one pretext or the other.

In his final plan, he took all seven family members, including mother Swaran Kaur (65), son Lakhwinder Singh (15), brother Surinder Singh (33), Surinder Singh's wife Kulwinder Kaur (30), their daughters Seema (6) and Sona (2) and son Sajjan (4).

According to the DSP, Balwinder said he removed the glass of the driver side window before leaving for the journey to save himself from drowning.

After committing the crime, he made a hue and cry to pass it off as an accident. After the incident, he

falsely told the police that his brother Surinder Singh was driving the car and the steering wheel got stuck, resulting in the accident. Actually, he himself was driving the car.

In-laws of his brother Surinder Singh lodged a complaint, suspecting foul play and demanding a thorough probe into the incident.

The police interrogated Balwinder Singh, who confessed to have committed the crime. The police which had earlier registered a case under Section 174 of the CrPC (unnatural death) has now booked Balwinder Singh under Section 302. The car involved in the crime had already been impounded.

## Cong bets on Moga actor for Versova

Four-time MLA Baldev Khosa has featured in several Punjabi films

Actor-turned-politician Baldev Khosa, who hails from Jhandeana village in Moga district, is contesting the Maharashtra Assembly elections for the seventh time on a Congress ticket.

Khosa is the senior most Congress leader of Mumbai who has served four terms as an MLA in the Maharashtra Legislative Assembly. He is contesting from Versova (Andheri West, Mumbai), the richest Assembly constituency in the country.

Since he enjoys a good reputation among the masses, the Congress has again fielded him. He has earned the reputation of an “honest” politician in Mumbai.

Khosa left his native village in his 20s in 1967 to try his luck in the film industry. He became a successful actor, but later on he landed in politics. Some of his popular Punjabi films include ‘Mahi Munda’ and ‘Putt Jattan De’. He himself produced film ‘Putt Jattan De’

and also played hero in it. He also acted in more than 30 Hindi films.

He was a close confidante of late Hindi film star Sunil Dutt and entered politics along with him for the first time in 1984 when Sunil Dutt was elected to the Lok Sabha. Khosa was fielded from the then Amboli constituency to fight the state Assembly elections in February 1985. He won the same.

In 1991, neither Sunil Dutt nor Baldev Khosa contested the elections. In 1999, 2004 and 2009, he was consecutively elected to the Assembly. In 2014, he lost the polls.

Talking to *The Tribune* from Mumbai, Baldev Khosa said he had already started the poll campaign and had been getting good response from the local people.

“It is a tough fight with the BJP, but I am getting a good

response from the Muslim community which comprises 50 per cent of the total votes in the constituency,” he said. According to him, the Punjabi community too has been helping him.

Apart from door-to-door campaign and holding ‘nukkar’ meetings, Khosa said he had also planned a media campaign through local TV channels, FM radio and cinema halls.

## Find better location for Ravidas temple, says SC

The Supreme Court (SC) on Friday asked those seeking permission to rebuild Guru Ravidas Temple in Delhi's Tughlaqabad forest area to amicably find a better location for the temple which was demolished on its order by the Delhi Development Authority in August.

“You find an amicable solution and come back to us. Any day we can pass the order. We respect the sentiments of everybody on the Earth but we have to follow the law,” said a Bench, headed by Justice Arun Mishra. Noting that Attorney General KK Venugopal was also appearing in the case, the Bench said all parties could hold talks to find an amicable solution for rebuilding the temple on a better location.

The top court, which had earlier questioned the maintainability of the petition filed by former MPs Ashok Tanwar and Pradeep Jain Aditya, posted the matter for further hearing on October 18.

Former Haryana Congress chief Ashok Tanwar and former MP Pradeep Jain Aditya had on August 27 moved the Supreme Court seeking reconstruction of the temple.

Maintaining that they were not seeking property rights over the land, the two Congress leaders submitted that they were only “for enforcement and protection of their right to worship the pious land where Saint Guru Ravidas lived and which was gifted to him by Sultan Sikander Lodhi in 1509.”

Contending that the pious site has been worshipped for over 500 years and was protected as per the provisions of the

Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act, 1991, the petitioners claimed that the ‘Guru Dham’ and the adjoining structures had been there for centuries and prior to any master plan or modern English law system now prevalent in India.

“Hence, no violation can be caused by a historical structure, which has come under green zone under laws which are subsequent to structure. The above temple/Guru Dham was in Jahanpanah City Forest, which is actually an urban park where people go for morning walks,” they submitted.

Taking strong exception to protests against its demolition order, the SC had on August 19 directed Punjab, Haryana and Delhi to ensure that no law and order problem was created over the issue.

# Justice VK Sharma appointed Lokpal

# Two key suspects held for STF cop's murder

Caught in Jaunpur in UP; were about to flee to Nepal

In a major breakthrough, the prime suspects, who killed Special Task Force (STF) constable Gurdeep Singh during an anti-drug operation in Jandiala Guru three days ago, have been arrested.

Identified as Varinder Singh, alias Foreigner, and Rajandeep Singh, both drug peddlers, they were nabbed from the Jaunpur railway station in UP.

Police officials said both were probably going to cross over to Nepal.

Amritsar (Rural) SSP Vikram Jeet Duggal confirmed the development. He said a police team, led by Jandiala Guru DSP Gurinderbir Singh Sidhu and the Jandiala SHO, had

left for Jaunpur to bring the accused to the city for further interrogation.

He said the accused were on the run since the murder of Gurdeep Singh, posted in Jalandhar who was posing as a decoy to nab the drug peddlers red-handed three days ago. However, they got suspi-

cious and had a scuffle with him. They snatched his weapon and shot him.

Sidhu said the two suspects were going towards Guwahati and possibly trying to flee to Nepal. However, they were constantly being followed by the Punjab Police through various surveillance techniques. He said their transit remand would be taken from the Jaunpur's judicial magistrate and they would be produced before the Amritsar Sessions court by Monday.

Meanwhile, the Jandiala police, in an early morning swoop on Bhalapind village in Ajnala, recovered a 9-mm pistol hidden by Varinder Singh and Rajan at the house of one Harmandeep Singh. The Baleno car used in the crime was recovered late Thursday.

# 169 litres of 'spurious' ghee seized

# ASI shoots at wife, kills himself

An Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASI) of the Punjab Armed Police tried to kill his wife by firing three bullets at her and later shot himself dead with his 9-mm service pistol on Thursday night.

The ASI has been identified as Baljit Singh (48), a resident of Mishriwala village in this border district. He was posted on deputation with the Excise Department at Talwandi Bhai.

Sources said Baljit and his wife Charanjeet Kaur (44) were not on good terms. A few days back, Charanjeet had left home and gone to her parents' house at Kali-

awala village. Yesterday, Baljit had gone to the house of in-laws to persuade his wife to come back, however, the things took ugly turn.

Last night, after some heated arguments, Baljit fired three rounds on his wife with his pistol. The first shot missed her while the

other hit her on chest due to which she was severely injured. Thereafter, Baljit reportedly shot himself dead with his pistol.

Both of them were referred to a private hospital at Moga where Baljit was declared brought dead while the condition of Charanjeet is critical. The couple had two sons, Kamalpreet Singh and Lovepreet Singh, both of whom are married.

Narinder Singh, Investigation Officer, said a case under Section 307, IPC, and Sections 25, 54, 59 of the Arms Act had been registered against Baljit at Talwandi Bhai police station after Kamalpreet Singh lodged a complaint.

# Efforts on to revive insurgency, claim police

Security agencies still not sure if weapons were dropped by a drone

FEROZEPUR, OCTOBER 4

Mystery continues to shroud the seizure of a huge quantity of sophisticated arms, including five AK-47 rifles, 10 magazines, 200 rounds, one Glock pistol, 22 magazines and 20 rounds, from Mamdot town in the district along the Indo-Pakistan border last week.

The seizure has set alarm bells ringing and security agencies have been since put on a high alert.

As per the information, the recovery was made during a joint operation by the Special Task Force and BSF in Mamdot on September 24. However, both the STF and BSF have remained tight-lipped about the recovery due to operational aspects. It has not yet been ascertained whether the consignment was smuggled across the border by land or through a water channel or dropped by a drone.

After the incident, senior BSF officers, including Director-General Vivek

Johri, had visited the area to take stock of the situation.

On September 22, the police had busted a terrorist module, being run with the support of a terrorist group from Pakistan and Germany. The police had recovered a huge cache of arms, including five AK-47 rifles, four Chinese .30 bore pistols, nine hand grenades and five satellite phones. The

police had claimed that these were dropped by a drone.

On September 12, a cache of arms, including four AK-56 rifles, two AK-47 rifles besides over 10,000 bullets, was seized from a truck at Lakhapur (Kathua). The source of the consignment which is believed to have passed through Punjab remained unclear.

“The seizure of such consignments within a gap of a few days is indicative of the fact that Pakistan is making attempts to revive insurgency in the state,” said an officer, adding that the investigation had further revealed that Khalistani and Islamic terror groups were working in tandem for executing their sinister designs.

# Another operative of KZF behind bars

The State Special Operation Cell (SSOC) today arrested Romanjit Singh of Jhahal, who had allegedly helped the Khalistan Zindabad Force (KZF) operatives in destroying the drones and deliver consignment of weapons smuggled from Pakistan.

A counter intelligence official confirmed it, adding that he would be produced in the court tomorrow and the police would seek his remand.

According to sources, Romanjit also accompanied the other operatives in throwing the remnants of drones, which were burnt by them, into the canal to destroy all evidences of drone sorties for smuggling weapons from across the fence.

Sources added that the police were looking into

whether more drones were used in smuggling AK 47, Chinese pistols and huge quantity of ammunition confiscated from the possession of the KZF operatives.

This is the ninth and reportedly the last arrest in the KZF terror module. On September 22, the SSOC had arrested Baba Balwant Singh of Mohanpura village in Tarn Taran, Akashdeep Singh Randhawa of Naag Kalan village, Harbhajan Singh and Blabir Singh of Tanda.

The police have also nominated their Germany-based handler Gurmeet Singh alias Bagga aka Doctor. Later, his brother Gurdev Singh was also arrested.

Later, the police had held Shubhdeep Singh, while eighth suspect Sajjanpreet was arrested a day before yesterday. All of them were currently under police remand.

# BSF official tells border farmers to remain alert

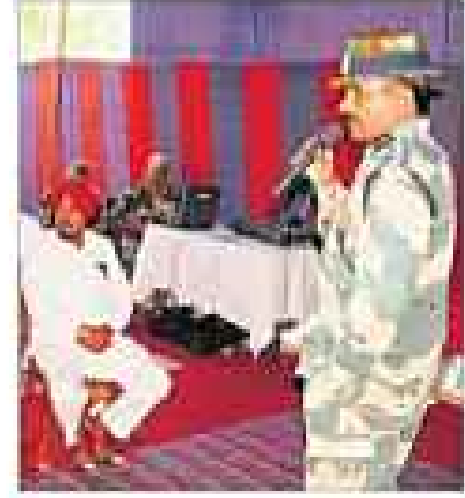

# NIA arrests main accused in Tarn Taran blast

The NIA today arrested Gurjant Singh in connection with the Tarn Taran blast that claimed two lives on September 5. In a statement, the NIA claimed that Gurjant was the main conspirator. His two accomplices Vikram, alias

Bikkar Singh, and Harpreet Singh had died on the spot.

Gurjant, who too was injured, had been undergoing treatment at a private hospital. According to sources, he was arrested after being discharged from the hospital. The sources revealed that the NIA had also taken the custody of his

accomplices who were in the Amritsar Central Jail.

The police have arrested six persons in connection with the blast at Pandori Gola village in Tarn Taran.

In view of its national and international ramifications and suspected links of the accused with the Pak-backed Sikhs for Justice, the state gov-

ernment had urged the Centre to let NIA take over the case.

The blast had occurred reportedly while digging a pit to retrieve a dumped explosive consignment, which they mishandled.

He was produced before the Special NIA Court, Mohali, which remanded him to NIA custody till October 11.

# Finally, commission agents give in, to purchase paddy from today

After a four-day protest, arhtiyas have finally agreed to start purchasing paddy from Saturday, bringing relief to farmers.

Friday was the fourth consecutive day of the commission agents' protest over dispute regarding Centre's direct payment system.

The Punjab Food and Civil Supply Department had been claiming that a group of arhtiyas was with them, another group had boycotted the purchase. Members of the Arhtiya Association, Punjab, had been asserting that a majority of the arhtiyas were with them.

“Till last evening, 3.02 lakh tonnes of paddy was purchased across the state. However, the private purchase was 16,635 tonnes, which has been done by millers only. In more than 19 districts of Punjab, purchase by arhtiyas is zero. The state government should not try to label us as Shiromani Akali Dal supporters,” said Ravinder Singh Cheema, president of the Arhtiya Association, Punjab. He said Chief

Principal Secretary to the CM Suresh Kumar assured them to look into their demands and invited them for a meeting in Chandigarh on Monday. “We have decided to start paddy purchase from Saturday,” Cheema said.

To protest the FCSD order to collect and upload the bank accounts and Aadhaar numbers of farmers on Public Financial Management System (PFMS) portal of Controller General of Accounts, Ministry of Finance, arhtiyas of Punjab had been boycotting paddy purchase from the first day of official purchase of October 1.

# Those 'misleading' farmers to face action

Reiterating the government's commitment to not effect any amendment to the APMC Act to exclude arhtiyas from the procurement process, Food and Supplies Minister Bharat Bhushan Ashu has categorically warned against any attempt to mislead farmers regarding implementation of the Public Management Financial System.

The minister said attempts were being made to sabotage the procurement process. He said those attempting to vitiate the food procurement process would face exemplary punishment.

Ashu observed that because of the non-implementation of this system, the Union Government had withheld state's Rs 1,000-crore payment. This includes reimbursement of Rs 500 crore already paid to the arhtiyas. The state govern-

ment will continue to make payments to the farmers through the arhtiyas, he said.

With the beginning of paddy arrival in some mandis across Kapurthala, Patiala Fazilka, and Sangrur districts, Ashu, while expressing satisfaction at the elaborate arrangements for ongoing procurement season, directed food officials to regularly review the progress of arrival and lifting across all 1,734 state mandis on a daily basis to ensure not even a single farmer has to unnecessarily wait for his produce to be procured by state agencies.

Pertinently, the procurement season, which officially began from October 1, would end on December 15, 2019 during which the state targets to procure 170 lakh metric tonnes of paddy. The paddy, purchased and milled into rice from more than 3,700 shellers across the state, will be handed over to the FCI for the Central pool.

# NSS volunteers push for mgmt of straw

Under an awareness programme to dissuade farmers from burning stubble, Cabinet Minister Tript Rajinder Singh Bajwa, along with the Punjab Pollution Control Board (PPCB) chairman, flagged off a campaign by NSS volunteers at Gursewak Singh Government College of Physical Education today.

Across the state, 1.25 lakh NSS volunteers will apprise the farmers about the harmful effects of the stubble-burning.

Under the drive, NSS volunteers will reach out to the farmers in all 12,984 villages in the state to persuade them

to abstain from burning crop residue in open fields.

Making an appeal to the farmers, Tript Bajwa said farmers should avoid stubble-burning in view of the celebrations of 550th Parkash Purab of Guru Nanak to be held in November.

It is pertinent to mention that around 200 lakh tonnes of stubble is produced every year in the state.

However, a majority of the farmers in the state burn the residue after harvesting paddy to clear their fields for sowing the next crop.

Bajwa said the government would provide Rs 260-crore subsidy to the farmers for crop residue management.

# Monitor air pollution daily, NGT tells states

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has directed the chief secretaries of Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh to constitute special cells to review the air pollution levels on a daily basis for the next one month, including on holidays. It has also directed to finalise a monitoring mechanism by coming October 7 to check paddy straw burning.

The NGT panel, headed by Justice AK Goel, passed the order on a plea filed by Ganga Lalwani for remedial action to prevent burning of crop residue that leads to air pollution in the NCR region.

Referring to the statistics report, placed before it, the panel noted that 25 per cent to 30 per cent air pollution in the NCR was caused by burning of crop residue in and around Delhi in October and November every year.

On October 12, 2015, the principal bench of the tribunal in Vikrant Kumar Tongad versus Environment Pollution (Prevent and Control Authority) and Others directed the Centre to ensure that farmers were provided with equipment

The NGT panel has also directed the Joint Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, and secretaries (Agriculture) of the states of Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh to appear before the panel with the status report on the next date of hearing — October 15, this year.

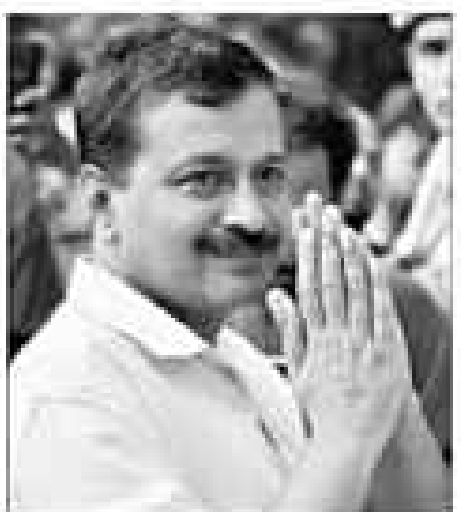

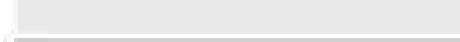

Dismissing Nirupam's insinuations, Tewari said, "Sanjay Nirupam is anxious about one ticket not being given to his loyalist. This sometimes happens. Nirupam has been Mumbai chief and ex-MP. It would be good if he doesn't kite fly these conspiracy theories because this serves no one's purpose."

The Congress also said leaders who are upset with ticket allocations must introspect over whether or not their actions are strengthen-

ing anti-Congress forces that have "wreaked havoc in India over the past five years."

Post the show of factionalism in Haryana and Maharashtra, the Congress appears increasingly divided between Sonia-backed old guard and Rahul Gandhi's loyalists with the latter either quitting since Sonia Gandhi took charge or rebelling bitterly.

Former Jharkhand state Congress Chief Ajoy Kumar resigned recently and in a letter to Sonia alleged that "worst criminals looked better than some Congress leaders." He was Rahul's pick.

Ex-Tripura Congress chief Pradyot Debbarman quit two weeks ago alleging corruption by AICC general secretary northeast Luizinho Faleiro in a letter to Sonia and that Congress was its own enemy.

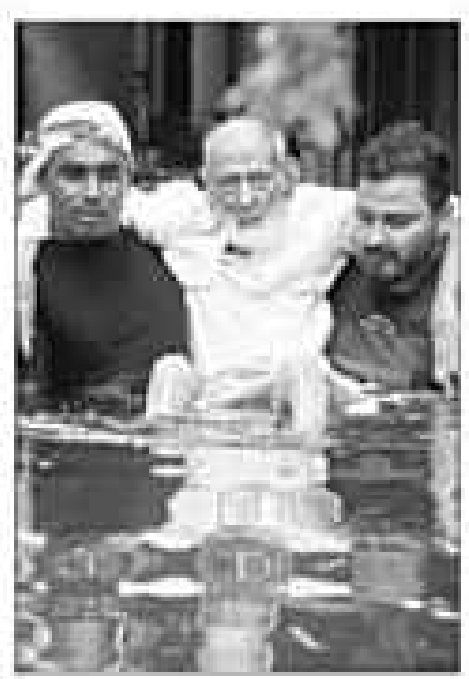

# 1,874 died in recent rain, floods: MHA

**NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 4**  
The countrywide rain and floods have led to the death of 1,874 persons while another 46 have been reported to be missing, officials in the MHA said, while noting that more than 25 lakh in 22 states were affected.

The highest 382 persons died in Maharashtra, followed by 227 deaths in West Bengal in rains, floods and landslides that hit 357 districts in the country.

According to the officials, 738 persons were injured and nearly 20,000 animals perished. The heavy rains and floods fully damaged 1.09 lakh houses, partially damaged 2.05 lakh houses and destroyed 14.14 lakh hectares of crops.

Though monsoon remains active in a few parts of the country, the season officially ended on September 30. During the four-month period, India recorded the highest rainfall since 1994, according to the India Meteorological Department.

In Maharashtra, where 22 districts were hit by floods, 382 people died, 369 were injured and 7.19 lakh people were forced to seek shelter in 305 relief camps.

In West Bengal, 227 people lost their lives. In Bihar, which is currently reeling under floods, 161 people have lost their lives. — TNS

# SC notice to CBI on PC's bail plea

**NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 4**  
The Supreme Court on Friday issued notice to the CBI on senior Congress leader and former Finance Minister P Chidambaram's petition seeking bail in a corruption case relating to the INX Media case.

Asking the CBI to respond to Chidambaram's bail plea by October 14, a Bench headed by Justice R Banumathi posted the matter for hearing on October 15.

Chidambaram (74) will be at Tihar Jail — where he has been lodged since September 5 — during Dussehra. Special Judge Ajay Kumar Kuhar had on Thursday remanded him to judicial custody till October 17.

On behalf of Chidambaram, senior advocate Kapil Sibal said the high court had said he was not a flight risk and was not likely to tamper with evidence. It had rejected his bail plea only on suspicion of influencing witnesses.

The HC "erred" in dismissing his bail plea on the mere apprehension that he might influence the witnesses, without any supporting material, and on the basis of unverified allegations that do not allege or point anything against

him, he said. Terming his continuing incarceration as a "form of punishment", Chidambaram had on Thursday moved the Supreme Court for regular bail in the case. He has challenged the Delhi High Court's September 30 verdict denying him bail.

In his bail plea, he contended that liberty of an individual cannot be denied on the basis of "anonymous and unverified allegations". He has also cited his "frail" health as grounds for bail and said he was not "accustomed" to food given to him in the jail and has lost 4 kg weight during his judicial custody. The Special Court had allowed him home cooked food inside jail once a day as an exception.

# Will wind up Ayodhya hearing by Oct 17: SC

October 17 would be the last day for winding up the hearing when all the parties will have to make final arguments about the relief would like seek and how they would like to mould their respective relief.

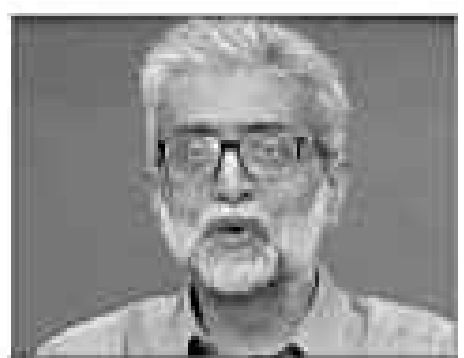

# Gautam Navlakha's protection from arrest extended till Oct 15

A Bench asked the Maharashtra Government to produce all the material collected against Navlakha during the probe on the next date of hearing. On behalf of the activist, senior advocate Abhishek



Manu Singhvi pressed for extension of protection from arrest and said the issue of quashing of the FIR can be taken up thereafter. The Maharashtra Govern-

ment — which had filed a caveat in the matter to preempt any ex-parte order — opposed his plea.

Earlier, as many as five judges of the Supreme Court, including Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi, had recused from hearing Navlakha's petition.

He had challenged the Bombay HC's order rejecting his plea for quashing of an FIR in the case on the ground that there was prima facie substance in the case. — TNS

# CBI moves SC against bail to West Bengal cop

The CBI on Friday moved the Supreme Court seeking cancellation of anticipatory bail given to former Kolkata Police Commissioner Rajeev Kumar in connection with the Saradha chit fund scam.

It has challenged the October 1 Calcutta High Court order granting anticipatory bail to Kumar. The HC had said it was not an appropriate case for custodial interrogation.

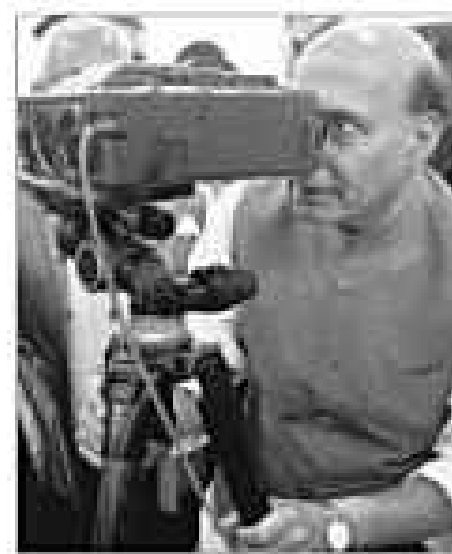
The SC on February 5 restrained the CBI from taking any coercive action against Kumar who was directed to cooperate with the probe agency. — TNS

# No separate test for MBBS at AIIMS from next year

Admissions to be conducted through NEET-UG

**NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 4**  
There will be no separate entrance exam for MBBS admissions to AIIMS, JIPMER Puducherry and other institutes of national importance from the academic session 2020 and all admissions starting next year will happen through the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test-UG system.

The government today said the proposal of having a single entrance examination and common counselling for admission to all medical institutions at UG level, including institutes of national importance, will be implemented from 2020. This proposal has been envisaged in the National Medical Commission Act.

"Efforts are underway to constitute the National Medical Commission under the NMC Act at the earliest so that some major reforms can be implemented from academic year 2020-21. A common NEET (UG) examination for entry into all medical

colleges and also AIIMS, JIPMER, etc, will be implemented from 2020," Health Minister Harsh Vardhan said today. The government also said it would try and regulate tuition fee in 50 per cent of all seats in private and deemed medical colleges from the next academic session. "The MCI Board of Governors is already working on this fee regulation rules," the Ministry said.

The exercise to set up the NMC has already been started and the Ministry has received 72 applications for the post of NMC Chairman, and chairpersons and members of the four autonomous boards that will be part of the NMC. These boards are—Under-Graduate Medical Education Board, Post-Graduate Medical Education Board, Medical Assessment and Rating Board (MARB) and Ethics and Medical Registration Board.

The selection to the said posts will be made on the recommendations of a soon to be set up search committee headed by Cabinet Secretary. The Minister said the process is on to constitute the Medical Advisory Council to the NMC. At present, 23 nominations of Vice Chancellors and 22 nominations from state medical councils have been received to be part of the council. Once the MAC is notified, nine members from state medical councils and 10 from state/UT representatives will be selected as members of National Medical Commission," Vardhan said.

# In a first, corporate train from Lucknow to Delhi

India's first private semi-high speed train — Tejas Express — was flagged off by Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath from Lucknow Junction on its journey to New Delhi railway station at 9.55 am on Friday.

# Yasin, others charged with sedition

NIA accuses them of criminal conspiracy, waging war against country

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Friday filed a 3,000-page second supplementary chargesheet before a Delhi court against JKLF chief Yasin Malik and other separatist leaders, including Asiya Andrabi, Shabir Shah and Masarat Alam Bhat, in the 2017 Jammu & Kashmir terror-funding case.

The chargesheet was filed before Additional Sessions Judge Rakesh Syal, during in-camera proceedings. The court has put up the matter for taking cognisance of the chargesheet on October 23.

Later in a statement, the NIA said the chargesheet had been filed against five separatists "for criminal conspiracy and waging a war against the Government of India" by carrying out terrorist and secessionist activities in Jammu & Kashmir.

"The 3,000-page chargesheet has been filed under various Sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967," the agency said.

The *Tribune* in its edition dated September 24 had reported that the NIA was "preparing a lengthy supplementary chargesheet against Yasin Malik and other separatists" and plans to file it in the first week of October.

The NIA had registered the case on May 30, 2017, and the first chargesheet was filed against 12 accused, including Hafiz Saeed, JuD chief, and Hizbul Mujahideen chief Syed Salahuddin, on January 18, 2018. Subsequently, the first supplementary chargesheet was filed on January 22, 2019, against a person, who was acting as a conduit for financial trans-

actions by the separatists. Based on its chargesheet, the NIA said during further investigations, the five named person in the chargesheet were found to be "part of the conspiracy related to secessionist and terrorist activities" in J&K following which they were arrested.

## 'GETTING FUNDS THROUGH HAWALA FOR UNREST'

■ The chargesheet was filed by the NIA against JKLF chief Yasin Malik and other separatist leaders, including Asiya Andrabi, Shabir Shah and Masarat Alam Bhat.

■ It says: "Various incriminating chats and emails have been recovered from the email accounts of Yasin Malik and Shabir Shah where description of receipt of funds from Pakistan and various other countries have been revealed."

■ It has also been found that Malik has been getting funds from foreign countries through hawala channels for causing unrest and insurgency.

It added that it was also revealed that the Hurriyat leaders, terrorists and stone-throwers were carrying out terrorist attacks and

orchestrating violence, stone-throwing and other subversive and secessionist activities in the state.

Their activities were part of a "well-planned criminal conspiracy hatched with the active support, connivance and funding from Pakistani agencies and terrorist organisations to achieve their nefarious objective of securing secession of Jammu & Kashmir from India," the NIA said.

It has been found that Malik has been getting funds from foreign countries through hawala channels for causing unrest and insurgency and the role of the Pakistan High Commission in supporting the separatists and other networks through transfer of funds via financial conduits and in providing directions to continue the unrest in Kashmir had also been clearly established, the chargesheet added.

"Sufficient evidence has been collected against Masarat Alam. Investigations have established the nexus of Dukhtar-e-Millat chief Asiya Andrabi with different terrorist organisations and hawala financial conduit Zahoor Watali. The role of ex-MLA Engineer Rashid in the conspiracy to destabilise Kashmir and cause unrest has also been revealed," it said.

# Congress says it will contest BDC elections

After questioning the intention of the ruling BJP to conduct the Block Development Council (BDC) elections amid unprecedented restrictions and detention of political leaders, the Opposition Congress on Friday decided to not to give a "walkover" to the saffron party by announcing to contest these polls.

"Despite our strong reservations over measures being adopted by the ruling BJP to gag the voice of the Opposition, the Congress has decided to contest the BDC elections to strengthen democracy in J&K," spokesman of the Pradesh Congress Committee (PCC) Ravinder Sharma told *The Tribune* after attending a meeting of senior party leaders held this evening.

"We will not give walkover to the BJP, so the party has decided to con-

test polls despite the fact that the situation is not conducive for the same," he said and alleged that in the prevailing atmosphere when all Opposition leaders were either detained or under restrictions, the BDC elections were announced only to give a free field to the BJP.

Meanwhile, highly placed sources said the Congress leadership was divided on the issue of participating in the BDC elections as the Valley-based leaders were against joining the electoral battle at this point of time.

"Boycotting elections means giving a walkover to the BJP in the whole of J&K, so Jammu-based leaders convinced the leadership to join the electoral battle," a source said, adding, "A large number of Congress supporters, who have won the panchayat elections warned the leadership that the party would be completely wiped out

from grass-roots level if free field was given to the BJP in the BDCs polls".

On September 24, Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) of J&K had announced the BDC elections on party basis despite the fact that the panchayat elections were held on a non-party basis. Out of the total 316 BDCs, spread over Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh regions, the elections will be held for 310 BDCs. Only sarpanches and panches will form the electoral college for the elections to the BDC chairpersons.

"We are of the opinion that the situation is not conducive for conducting the BDC elections," Congress spokesperson said, questioning, "If the situation is conducive for polls, why 60 per cent of the seats of the panchayat members, numbering 12,052 which are vacant in Kashmir, have not been filled during the past 10 months since the last panchayat elections?"

# ED seizes Shabir's assets

# Police deny Palpora death; family asks 'are we lying?'

Barely 4 km from home, Noora Begum's youngest grandson Osaib Altaf is buried at the "martyrs' graveyard". It has been two months and the family is still in shock.

On Friday evening when she was told the police, in a report submitted to the Supreme Court, had claimed no such death had occurred, she was in tears. "Are we lying?" she asked.

The report on juvenile detentions with signatures of AK Choudhary, Additional DGP, claimed that the Osaib

Altaf incident "as reported has been found to be baseless as no such death has been reported to the police authorities as per the verification report received from field formations."

The family and locals say that on August 5, hours after the scrapping of Article 370, Osaib, 17, was drowned in the Jhelum in Srinagar along with at least 12 more boys when they were "chased and cornered" by paramilitary forces.

"Except for Osaib and Adnan Ali, the rest knew swimming. Adnan was saved by labourers extracting sand," said Osaib's uncle Mohammed Rafiq. Osaib's body was fished out 20 minutes later. "We went to the Safakadal police station to file an FIR but were told the area was in the Parimpora jurisdiction. We went there but were turned away," recalled Rafiq. "There is no medical record of Osaib's death as they want us to get a copy of the FIR first." Several locals claimed the forces fired pellets during the funeral procession. At least three mourners were injured.

# Sept '20 Rohtang tunnel's new deadline

The BRO has pushed back its target to accomplish the task of completing the 8.8-km-long Rohtang tunnel to September 30, 2020.

Earlier, the government had set December 2019 as the deadline for the completion of the ambitious tunnel project. Talking to *The Tribune*, Chief Engineer of Rohtang tunnel project KP Purshothman said that both the portals of the tunnel would be connected permanently by October 31, 2019, while inside civil work would be completed by March 31, 2020.

"We are targeting to accomplish the electrification work of the tunnel till September 30, 2020 and progress is going on in this direction. The water ingress from Seri Nullah was a big hurdle for the tunnel authority but now we are in the final stage to

channelize the water course", he remarked.

He said that the tunnel authorities would allow movement of vehicles via tunnel only in emergency

cases for residents of Lahaul Spiti. The electric substation at Sisu on the Lahaul Spiti side would be connected via tunnel from Dundhi substation on the Manali

side till September 2020.

"This would provide better power supply during winter season to the residents of Lahaul Spiti because presently power lines via

Rohtang Pass from the Manali side get damaged frequently because of heavy snowfall during winter season every year", he added.

Rohtang Tunnel is a highway tunnel being built under the Rohtang Pass in the eastern Pir Panjal range of the Himalayas on the Leh-Manali Highway. The tunnel is at an elevation of (10,171 ft) whereas the Rohtang Pass is at an elevation of 13,050 ft.

This tunnel, when thrown open for traffic movement, will reduce the distance between Manali in Kullu district and Keylong in Lahaul Spiti by 46 kms and provide all-weather connectivity to the people of tribal district of Lahaul Spiti, who remain cut off from the rest of the state for more than six months after closure of 13,050 feet high Rohtang Pass, the gateway to Lahaul on Manali-Leh highway, during winter season every year.

## Positive move

Politicians rise above partisanship for Guru Nanak

PEOPLE from all over the world will gather to commemorate the 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev. In a spirit that cuts across narrow partisan divisions, which is rare in today's environment, political leaders both from the Centre and Punjab, along with religious leaders, will be together on the stage. This is the way it ought to be. However, recent politicking and bickering between various political parties, particularly the Congress on one side and the Akali-BJP combine on the other, have raised the unholy spectre of a distastefully fragmented event.

Guru Nanak's message of universal brotherhood finds resonance far beyond his followers, the Sikhs. The values advocated by Guru Nanak need to be followed, more so in these disturbed times. Credit for reaching out would go to Capt Amarinder Singh, who went the extra mile. President Ram Nath Kovind, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, all have accepted the Punjab Government's invitation to attend the Sultanpur Lodhi celebrations. The SAD announced that it had already invited the President and the Prime Minister. Such one-upmanship needs to be eschewed.

Now, more than ever, coordination between the state government and the SGPC, and thus the SAD, will need to be strengthened to ensure that various irritants are overcome graciously. Statements by both SAD and Congress leaders have betrayed a particularly myopic view focused more on 'taking credit' than taking concrete steps that would enrich the celebrations. The eyes of the world will be on what happens at Sultanpur Lodhi. It would be deeply distressing if partisan sniping were to detract from the main event. People who jostle for their spot in the sun must remember that the focus of the event is a celebration of the Guru and his teachings, which guide us to take the path of honest living and sharing. Let the spirit of 'seva' prevail among all those who celebrate the birth anniversary of the founder of Sikhism.

## Threatening dissenters

FIR against celebrities underlines intolerance

THERE is no democracy without dissent — this was the crux of an open letter written to PM Narendra Modi by about 50 renowned personalities, including historian Ramachandra Guha, filmmakers Mani Ratnam and Shyam Benegal, and vocalist Shubha Mudgal in late July. They had articulated their genuine concerns over the growing incidents of mob lynching and other hate crimes against minorities, barely two months after the BJP's thumping win in the Lok Sabha elections. Now, they find themselves in the dock precisely for expressing dissent as an FIR has been registered against them on the order of a court in Muzaffarpur (Bihar). Sudhir Ojha, a local lawyer who projects himself as a patriot-cum-crusader and has a knack for embroiling VVIPs in litigation, has accused them of 'tarnishing the nation's image, undermining the PM's impressive performance and supporting secessionist tendencies.' These public figures, much respected in their respective fields, have been booked on charges as diverse as sedition, creating public nuisance and hurting religious feelings.

The drastic action underlines how the space for exercising one's constitutional right of freedom of speech is shrinking in India. Ironically, these celebrities had faced opposition from their own peers soon after the open letter hit the headlines. As many as 61 newsmakers — more loyal than the king — had come out with a counter-statement against 'selective outrage and false narratives'. Actor Kangana Ranaut, lyricist Prasoon Joshi, dancer Sonal Mansingh and others had dubbed members of the 'rebel' group as self-styled guardians and conscience-keepers.

The ever-rising intolerance is a stark reality which the powers that be have been brushing aside for too long. The fact that the National Crime Records Bureau has failed to release its reports for 2017 and 2018 suggests that the government is not keen on making inconvenient truths public. Brazen attempts to muzzle the voices of sanity and reason are symptomatic of a deep malaise. Those who are red-flagging heinous crimes are themselves being branded as law-breakers. Such victimisation poses a grave threat to democracy. Hopefully, the cases lodged at the behest of overzealous petitioners won't deter right-minded citizens from highlighting the rot.

### GANDHIJI COULD HAVE BEEN GIVEN MORE PROTECTION

NEW DELHI, October 4 (UNI)—Mahatma Gandhi, who fell to an assassin's bullet on January 30, 1948, could have definitely been given more protection by the Government, according to Mr. Jivan Lal Kapur who constituted the one-man commission to probe the conspiracy to murder the Mahatma. Mr Kapur is reportedly not categorical if the Government could have altogether prevented the murder in view of the fact that a group of persons had been pursuing "this nefarious objective doggedly for months and even years". The commission, whose, 1,304-page report was submitted to Union Home Minister Y.B. Chavan yesterday, is understood to have felt that the then Bombay police had not effectively acted on the various clues given to it about the conspiracy by several important personalities.

### ASSASSIN'S BULLET SAVED CONGRESS

RAJKOT, Oct. 4. (UNI)—The bullet fired by Nathuram Godse killed Mahatma Gandhi but saved the Indian National Congress, says Miss Manibehn Gandhi, grand-daughter of Mahatma Gandhi. Though it is well-known that Gandhiji had advised liquidation of the Congress after independence, very few people know that Mahatma Gandhi actually drafted a resolution seeking transformation of the organisation into "Lok Sevak Sangh". The Father of the Nation was to have announced this at his evening prayer meeting on January 30, 1948, but before he could do so the assassin's bullet took his life. This episode has been described by Miss Gandhi, who was with him throughout his last year.

# All eyes on Modi-Xi meeting

Amid strain, the upcoming Mamallapuram summit will reset ties

IN mid-October, Chinese President Xi Jinping is scheduled to arrive in India for his second 'informal' meeting with PM Modi in the coastal town of Mamallapuram near Chennai. Xi Jinping is likely to combine it with a visit to neighbouring Nepal, where China has acquired considerable influence, the pace of which has accelerated since the installation of the communist government initially under Prachanda.

China was keen that the visit takes place soon after India's national elections so that Xi Jinping would be the first foreign leader to have a summit meeting with PM Modi and the two would be able to build on their first summit at Wuhan. Developments in the interregnum, centring especially on India's robust punitive response to terror attacks sponsored by Pakistan, the air strike on the terrorist camp at Balakot and scrapping of Article 370 have, however, dimmed the prospect of meaningful progress at the summit. China's support to Pakistan has been overt. Curiously, Chinese state councillor and Foreign Minister Wang Yi has not yet visited India. It is unusual for a Chinese Foreign Minister not to personally approve arrangements prior to the President's visit. Wang Yi has on two recent occasions — the latest on September 27 — made specific reference to UNSC resolutions on Kashmir. Chinese and Indian security delegations have, meanwhile, visited Mamallapuram and Chennai.

Around the same period, Wang Yi travelled to Islamabad for the trilateral Afghanistan-Pakistan-China meeting and held talks with Pakistan PM, army chief and President. India-Pak-

istan relations and Kashmir were discussed, with Wang Yi assuring Pakistan of China's support.

This was followed by his September 14-15 trip to Kathmandu to prepare for a possible visit by Xi Jinping, which, if it materialises, will be the first by a Chinese President to Nepal since 1996. In Kathmandu, Wang Yi is reported to have expressed concern at the large Muslim population and the possibility of their staging embarrassing pro-Uyghur demonstrations during Xi Jinping's visit. The demonstration by the Tibetans protesting Wang Yi's visit added to his concern.

Importantly, Xi Jinping's meeting with Modi takes place amidst mounting difficulties for the Chinese leader. Dissatisfaction with Xi Jinping and his policies is spreading inside China. The country's economy is shrinking and growth has slowed. The cost of living is rising. Hundreds of small private enterprises have shut down, adding to rising unemployment and the number of protests by laid-off workers has doubled over the previous year. Demobilised and retired military personnel also staged public protests in Beijing

last year, demanding re-employment, better benefits and 'respect'. Students and academics are disgruntled, and respected prominent academics, quite unusually and at personal risk, have gone public with their criticism of Xi Jinping's policies. The anti-corruption campaign continues to fell hundreds of senior party, military and government officials, widening the circles of the discontented.

The US-China trade war has accentuated Xi Jinping's problems and is a setback to China's technology sector. US curbs on the sale of critical components like laser micro-chips to Chinese companies highlighted how dependent China continues to be on the import of hi-tech components. Despite initial claims that they are equipped to weather the crisis, Chinese companies like Huawei and ZTE are in distress and laying off personnel. Xi Jinping's goal of achieving the 'China Dream' by 2021 and 'Made in China-2025' within the time limit declared at the 19th Party Congress now appears difficult.

Adding to these problems is the unending turbulence in Hong Kong, which has challenged the legitimacy

of the Chinese Communist Party's rule. Describing the protests as a 'colour revolution' instigated by the US and the West, and making a few token concessions, China's leadership has thus far taken no substantive action to quell the protests. There are indications of intra-party differences, which would suggest a weakening of Xi Jinping's authority.

China's recent actions, including calling for a UNSC meeting in support of Pakistan, were avoidable. The strain on ties with India has been compounded by the critical official Chinese media reactions since August 5, reiterating that 'Ladakh has been Chinese territory since ancient times', it is by no means India's internal matter and that India's action 'seriously violates China's territorial sovereignty'. Accusing India of 'creating and expanding disputes', it warned 'the Chinese side will certainly not sit idly by'.

Also in August, China and Pakistan held their largest air force exercise, Shaheen-VIII. Suggesting close cooperation between the air forces, reporting of the exercise by the official military media highlighted that China's air force had for the first time sent its fourth-generation J-16 fighter to help train the Pakistan air force take on Rafale fighters being acquired by India. This exercise was held after the Indian Air Force strike on Balakot.

Modi will, on the other hand, be meeting Xi Jinping for a one-on-one summit after obtaining a huge popular mandate in the national elections. He has also just returned from a successful high-profile public event in the US, where President Trump shared a platform with him and Modi unequivocally signalled there would be no talks with Pakistan, so long as it did not stop terrorism against India.

In this backdrop, there is limited potential for progress at the upcoming summit, when leaders of the world's two largest Asian nations meet. If there is some agreement on keeping the borders quiet and limited moves to reduce the trade deficit, that will be a good outcome.

# Once a teacher, always a teacher

THOSE were the times when teachers enjoyed a different status in society. Parents would go to school only once, at the time of admission, and leave it to the teacher to educate the child — and also to set him right. Setting the pupil right was taken as a serious occupation. The parent would take pride in telling the teacher, 'Massaab, do-char tagan ch parhez na karma. Munda soot hona chahida.' (Don't hesitate to give a few canes. The boy must be chastened).

I also went to a similar school. I still have the memory of my Ammi (grandmother) holding my hand to the school, and another lady carrying a *boeeya* with *batashas* to be distributed among students.

Primary classes did not have any benches. We would go in the morning, hair well-oiled, and the first chore use to be to change to the original state. And that was by creating an unbreathable cloud of dust all around under the pretext of dusting the mats before spreading them in lines for the students to sit through the day!

The school was in the open compound of a temple. While the teacher taught us tables, there would be the occasional chiming of bells by latecomers. There was a huge banyan tree, with leaves falling everywhere. Squirrels would be running after its red fruit.

We had two teachers with a benevolent heart and strong hands. They were like village heads, known to everyone in the town and commanding respect.

In class V, we shifted to the big school. The biggest joy and matter of pride were the desks — a class of grown-ups! A uniform of khaki shorts and a blue shirt added to the self-esteem. And then, there were different teachers teaching different subjects. All of them inspired awe, and fear.

In the higher classes, we had the opportunity of being taught by the principal himself — a great teacher of English and a disciplinarian. Tenses caused a tense situation. Learning grammar under his gaze was scary. He would not tolerate any wrong usage. In the evening, he took over as the volleyball coach.

The evening would come to an end, but he would not rest. After dinner, he would take up his position in front of the only talkies the town had. Any

student coming out of the cinema after the night show would get a beating there and then. No parent had the courage to challenge him.

Much later, after I had completed postgraduation and got a job, I went to see him. He was not well and was resting in bed. After recognising me and asking my well-being, he threw a question at me, 'Angreji ch tarjma kar (translate into English)...'. The sentence was tough. I somehow managed to do it to his satisfaction and could see the glow of happiness on his face.

Such teachers were not teachers only by profession. They always were teachers — in the school, the playground, at home, in the market, or at midnight in front of the talkies. *Un jaise ustaadon ko mera salaam!*

#### 'Organic' downside

This method cannot supply enough nutrients to sustain high yield, so fertilisers have to be used in a balanced manner to attain food security. India uses fertilisers at one-fourth of the rate used by the US, China, Japan and the EU, and their productivity is three-four higher. If these countries using high doses of fertilisers do not spoil their soil, how will our soil get degraded with low doses of fertilisers? The question of soil degradation by fertiliser usage does not arise. There is no authentic research report anywhere in the

world which says that fertilisers ruin soil. Soil has the capacity to hydrolyse any chemical added to it. Pesticides get detoxified in due course of time. Plants cannot use organic molecules for growth. They have to be mineralised into inorganic molecules for utilisation by plants. India is presently self-sufficient and exporting food grains because of the Green Revolution. We need another such revolution for our increasing population. It is better not to discourage agricultural scientists working for higher yields. India needs 400 million tonne by 2030, and it is possible through new technology and not through organic farming.

# Brexit policy riddled with deep discord

**B**RITISH Prime Minister Boris Johnson calculated that legal ambiguity would enable his minority government to override constitutional formalities and leave the European Union (EU) without an agreement by the end of October, and the purpose of his suspension of Parliament for five weeks was to prevent it from an oversight of Brexit. To leave the EU without a deal is in conflict with a parliamentary decision, and would pre-empt options for which there is some growing support in Britain, namely, an agreement for an orderly exit or to remain in the EU.

The decision by the British Supreme Court on September 24 that upholds parliamentary sovereignty, separation of powers and principles of responsible government has profound implications for countries that govern with the broadly-defined Westminster model. In holding that the issue was justiciable, as being not only political, but legal and constitutional in nature, the court underlined that separation of powers between the executive branch and legislature was the essence of parliamentary democracy. On the desirability of a written constitution — which Britain does not have, and the court made no reference to this lacuna — the nature of the case made that implicit.

Parliament resumed its work, which

could include a vote of no-confidence in the Johnson minority government and a General Election. But an election at this time is not favoured by the opposition as it could not be held before October 31 and they do not trust the Johnson government not to rush into a no-deal Brexit, with all the negative consequences anticipated in a leaked government document.

Parliament will supervise the government's actions, including the proposals it has submitted to the EU prior to the summit of October 17-18. The EU is well aware of the British Parliament's decision that the government must either propose a modified agreement that has the backing of parliament or ask for an extension of time for more negotiations, but the EU is hamstrung: it deals only with governments and not parliaments. Meanwhile, Johnson declares he will follow the law but neither resign nor ask for an extension, and leave the EU by October 31, 'do or die'. This is a circle that obviously cannot be squared.

The possibilities for the way ahead can be summarised. The Johnson government could agree at the EU summit on an agreement that is agreeable to Parliament, on the back of which the UK will leave the EU by October 31. This could be a modified Theresa May-EU agreement with editorial tweaks to the accompanying declaration on future trade relations and a different version of the 'backstop'.

This is what Johnson has proposed to Brussels. But the backstop, designed to prevent a hard border between the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland, in other words, to ensure an open border between Ireland that is in a customs union and single market with 26 other EU countries, and the non-member Northern Ireland, an appendage of

the United Kingdom, will prove as vexatious as ever. Some kind of border between Northern Ireland and Ireland, or between Northern Ireland and the rest of UK (i.e. on the Irish Sea), or between Ireland and the rest of the EU seems inescapable. Belfast rules out the second alternative and Brussels rules out the third. The EU is emphatic about effective controls to be imposed at whatever border is determined.

Assuming that Prime Minister Johnson has no withdrawal agreement by October 19, he is obliged by parliament to request additional time until January 31, 2020, in order to continue the negotiations. In this scenario, Johnson might resign, leaving a caretaker government to request a postponement. The EU would probably accept an extension over France's objections, especially if Britain could by that time be proceeding to an election or second referendum.

If by October 31 or any new agreed time limit, Britain still remains in the EU, there would be an early General Election or second referendum or both. The outcomes of these are impossible to predict, since the election would not clarify the Brexit issue because both major political parties are divided on it. The Conservatives under Johnson have expelled Remainers and moderates and reduced themselves to a 42-seat minority in the House of Commons. If there is no exit from the EU before an election, Nigel Farage's Brexit Party would take votes and seats from the Conservatives.

The Labour Party plans, if it attains office, to conclude a withdrawal agreement with the EU within three months and hold a referendum within six months, but is struggling for unity under Jeremy Corbyn and ambushed by those supporting a Remain-only

platform. The dilemma is that Corbyn and the Left of his party are convinced that the EU is run by corporates and moneyed men, but the EU's social legislation comprising working hours, minimum wage, health safety, and equal pay for women, are worth fighting for even by those ardently desiring Brexit. The Liberal Democrats under Jo Swinson have opted for Remain and show no concern about the 2016 referendum result, citing that the leave vote was only 37 per cent of the electorate.

The Johnson government is in difficulties of its own making since the Irish issue and Britain's future trading arrangements with the EU require a non-ideological approach to negotiations. Falling back on WTO arrangements would result in far lower level of trade access to the EU than presently enjoyed by British business. A free trade agreement (FTA) with substantial tariff and product alignment could mitigate the backstop issue, but any British FTA with the EU has to be aligned with the EU's other FTAs and with Britain's FTAs elsewhere, including those on the anvil with the US and Australia. Such trade negotiations can take years and in some cases (such as the proposed EU-India FTA), decades.

The deep chasms in Britain created by Brexit will erupt into disorder without the only safety valve in sight, which is Brexit with a Britain-EU deal. Remaining in the European Union will be acutely resented by those who voted to leave in the referendum.

In the end, neither Leavers nor Remainers can expect fully to get their way. The situation calls for common sense and compromise. As of now, both are in short supply in the United Kingdom.

# Bail jurisprudence remains blurred legal arena

One of the reasons for the fact that two out of three prisoners in the Indian jails are undertrials is the conflicting opinion given by the Supreme Court on whether reasons are to be provided by the lower courts for grant or refusal of bail. Granting bail, once a routine matter, is now subjected to magnified judicial scrutiny along with mounting fear of justifying it with valid reasons.

**T**he system of bail was prevalent in India in the form of *muchalakai*, i.e. a personal bond and *zamanat* in the Mughal period.

The ancient Hindu jurisprudence provided for an expedient disposal of disputes, where laxity was not an affordable option. After Independence, the Indian justice system, guided by the Constitution, guaranteed the axiomatic right to life and liberty to its people. 'Bail, and no jail' was the tradition followed by the Indian judiciary, which protected personal liberty, at personal cost. The power to release a person on bail, under the law, is exercised by either the police officer in charge of a police station or the magistrate/sessions court, and in the case of anticipatory bail, under Section 438 of the CrPC, by the sessions court.

This article deals with bail granted by a court of law only. Bail is the process by which a person is released from custody, the ultimate objective being to remove the restrictive and punitive consequences of pre-trial detention of the accused. The principle underlying a person's release on bail is that an accused is presumed to be innocent till his guilt is proved. Justice VR Krishna Iyer, in the Moti Ram case (1978), said, "There is no definition of bail in the CrPC, although offences are classified as bailable and non-bailable... We have to interdict judicial arbitrariness, deprivatory of liberty and ensure 'fair procedure' which has a creative connotation..."

As far as bailable offences are concerned, bail has to be granted by the police to the accused. In case of non-bail-

able offences, the general policy is to grant bail, rather than refuse it. The law presumes a person to be innocent till proved guilty and as a presumably innocent person, he is entitled to all access to freedom to defend his case. The grant of bail is a trust reposed, the breach of which will disentitle him to the prerogative.

The law of bail has to harmonise two conflicting demands — one, the necessity of society to be shielded against the dangerous propensities of an accused and secondly, the fundamental canon of criminal jurisprudence — the presumption of innocence. Clarifying the law, the Calcutta HC, in the case of Superintendent and Remembrancer of Legal Affairs (1973), observed "that in a barbaric society, you can hardly ask for bail; in

a civilised society, you can hardly refuse it, are more than an epigram, subject only to the tests of considerations laid down from time to time by the imprimatur of judicial decisions..."

Questions, therefore, arise as to the circumstances of denial of bail. Is it to prevent flight from justice, tampering of evidence, protection of society from further crime or to inflict pre-trial punishment? Or is the seriousness of the allegation of the crime committed being offered as a justification for denial of bail? The legal framework within which the judges must operate is ambiguous. The large variance in the decisions remains unexplained. However, the object of bail is simply to ensure the appearance of the accused at the trial as it is neither punitive nor pre-

ventative except in cases of preventive detention. Deprivation of liberty is a punishment, and it should commence only after conviction. The seriousness of the crime committed, cannot therefore, be a valid reason for denial of bail in view of the fact that his guilt is yet to be established and he is yet to be convicted.

Tampering with evidence and influencing the witness is another common reason for denying bail. In 2013, bail was denied to YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, son of a former Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, as the apex court felt that his release would hamper the investigation as he may influence the witnesses and tamper with the evidence. The court was of the view that economic offences involving huge loss of public funds needed to be viewed seriously. Recently, the Delhi High Court, in the case of a senior politician, observed that although there is no risk of flight or possibility of tampering of evidence, the influencing of witnesses by such a prominent member of the Bar cannot be ruled out. As opposed to this, the Supreme Court, in the case of Sanjay Chandra (2012), that related to similar economic offences, opined that "it would be quite contrary to the concept of personal liberty enshrined in the Constitution, that any person should be punished in respect of any matter, upon which he has not been convicted or that in any circumstances, he should be deprived of his liberty upon only the belief that he will tamper with the witnesses if left at liberty, save in the most extraordinary circumstances."

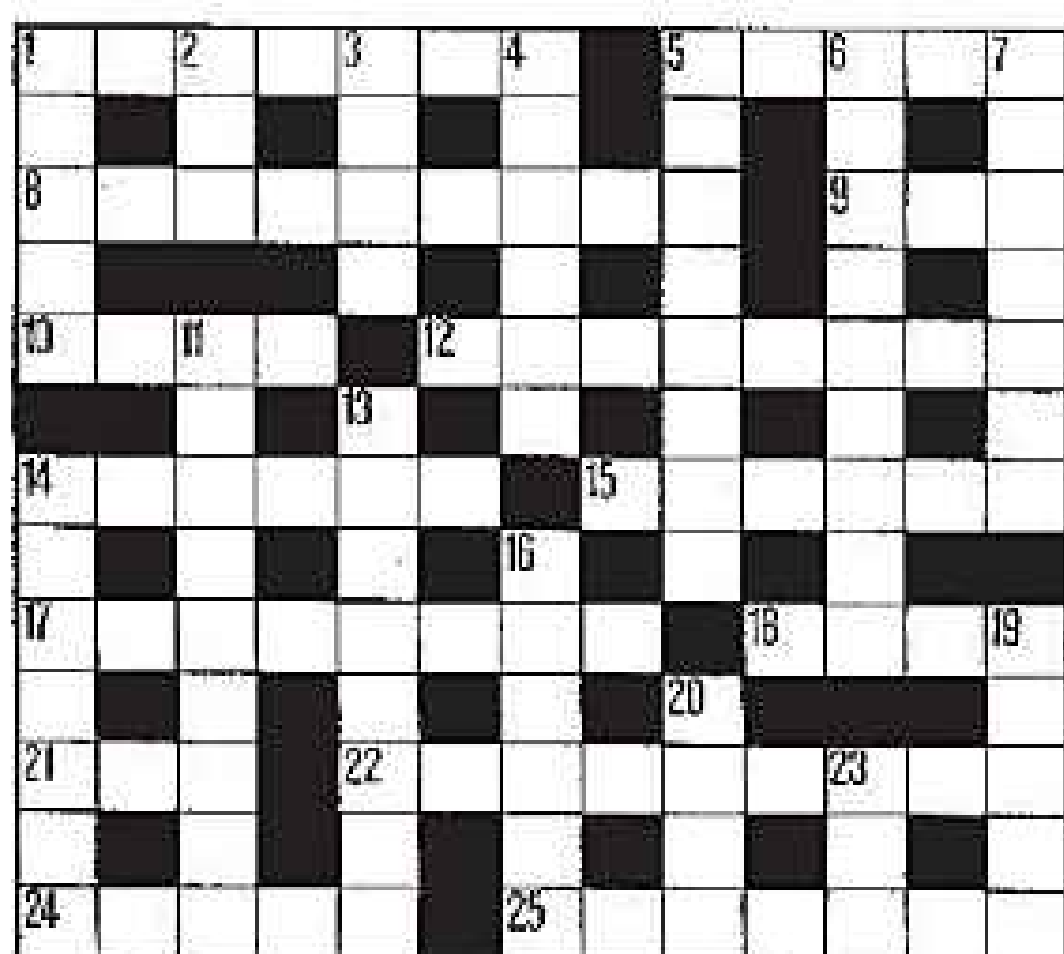
The court noted that no material evi-

dence had been placed on record to show the possibility of tampering with evidence/witnesses. Amongst other grounds, tampering of evidence and flight risk has acquired the status of authentic reasons offered by the courts for the refusal of bail. Further, the allegation of the accused's presumed non-cooperation becomes another ground for the refusal of anticipatory bail. This conclusion is drawn from the statements of the investigating agency opposing the bail, without any proof of any cogent material on record. Denial of bail in such circumstances transcends respect for the requirement that a man shall be considered innocent until he is found guilty. Moreover, imprisonment prior to conviction has a substantial punitive content.

The grant or denial of bail takes place in less than a few minutes in crowded courtrooms, where the judicial decision-making is overburdened with other imperatives. One of the reasons why two out of three prisoners in Indian jails are undertrials is the conflicting opinions given by the Supreme Court on whether reasons are to be provided by the lower courts for grant/refusal of bail. Granting of bail, once a routine matter, is now subjected to magnified judicial scrutiny coupled with the fear of justifying it with valid reasons. As a result, these tend to gather dust.

If public justice is to be promoted, mechanical detention should be demoted. Since the court's jurisdiction is discretionary, it has to be exercised with caution by balancing the valuable right of liberty of an individual and the interest of society in general.

# Trump in tight spot as texts of envoys reveal Ukraine links

**IMPEACHMENT** President says unsure if he'll cooperate with probe

**WASHINGTON, OCTOBER 4**  
Text messages sent by US diplomats revealing an apparent effort by Donald Trump's government to push Ukraine to investigate his political rival Joe Biden bolstered the Democrats' impeachment inquiry on Friday, as the President suggested he might not cooperate with the probe.



**ASKS KIEV, BEIJING TO INVESTIGATE BIDEN**

- President Trump openly called on Ukraine and China to investigate his potential 2020 election rival Joe Biden, taunting Democrats seeking his impeachment for inviting foreign election interference
- Trump blasted his accusers as "maniacs" pursuing "impeachment crap" as he sought to turn the tables on a probe that threatens to make him only the third US President ever impeached in the House of Representatives, and face a trial in the Senate
- Meanwhile, Ukraine's prosecutor-general said he would review cases related to a gas firm where Joe Biden's son used to work. Ryaboshapka said his office would revisit about 15 cases but stressed that they were not necessarily linked to Hunter Biden

The probe picked up steam as Democrats in the House of Representatives began interviewing a key US intelligence official on a whistleblower complaint that alleged abuse of office by the President. Meanwhile, Senator Mitt Romney, perhaps the most prominent Republican critic of Trump, blasted what he called a "wrong and appalling" move by Trump to ask Beijing and Kiev to investigate Biden—the latest

small crack in support for the president within his own party. Despite Romney's comments, Trump insisted that Republicans in the Senate will unite behind him, should the Democratic-led House of Representatives vote to impeach

him, triggering a trial in the upper chamber. "The Democrats — unfortunately, they have the votes. They could vote very easily, even though many of them don't believe they should do it," Trump said. "I have a 95 per cent

approval rating in the Republican Party," he said. "We'll get it to the Senate and we'll win. The Republicans are unified." Trump suggested it was "up to the lawyers" as to whether he would cooperate with the impeachment probe. — AFP

Hong Kong's embattled leader Carrie Lam invoked colonial-era emergency powers last used more than 50 years ago on Friday, in a dramatic move that enraged protesters who took to the streets of the Chinese-ruled city.

biggest political crisis since its handover from Britain to China in 1997 under a "one country, two systems" formula that granted it autonomy and broad freedoms not enjoyed on the mainland.

Lam, speaking at a news conference, said a ban on face masks would take effect on Saturday under the emergency laws that allow authorities to "make any regulations whatsoever" in whatever they deem to be in the public interest.

As darkness fell, defiant demonstrators took to the streets to vent their anger, vandalising what they perceived to be China-friendly businesses and blocking road in the heart of the financial centre. Police fired tear gas to disperse protesters in flash-point districts across the territory, including Causeway Bay, Sha Tin and Wong Tai Sin.

China's Hong Kong and Macao Affairs Office praised the move in a statement that said the protests were evolving into a "colour revolution", a term coined to refer to popular uprisings in Ukraine and other former Soviet states that swept away long-standing rulers, with interference from external forces.

Shopping malls, banks and shops across Hong Kong island had closed early in anticipation of violence as some protesters burned Chinese flags and chanted "You burn with us", and "Hong Kongers, revolt".

The emergency laws allow curfews, censorship of the media, and control of harbours, ports and transport.

What began as opposition to a proposed extradition law, which could have seen people sent for trial in mainland courts, has grown into a broad pro-democracy movement and a serious challenge to Chinese leader Xi Jinping. — Reuters

Swedish climate campaigner Greta Thunberg has responded with wry humour on Twitter to patronising comments made about her by Russian President Vladimir Putin.

The 16-year-old changed her Twitter biography to say "A kind but poorly informed teenager" after Putin described her in these terms. Putin said, "I don't share the general enthusiasm" for Greta Thunberg's impassioned speech at the United Nations climate summit. "I'm sure Greta is a kind girl and very sincere," he said. — AFP

## SA resist, take India by surprise

Ashwin takes 5 but Elgar, de Kock keep cool to get 100s, SA trail by 117

VISAKHAPATNAM, OCTOBER 4 Dean Elgar and Quinton de Kock struck commanding hundreds to author South Africa's spectacular fight-back before Ravichandran Ashwin wrested back India's control with a five-wicket haul on the third day of the opening Test.

Elgar was out for 160 after completing his 12th hundred in Tests while Quinton de Kock made 111 as South Africa reached 385/8 at close, 117 runs behind the hosts' first innings score of 502/7 declared.

Late in the day, Ashwin, who had picked up two wickets on Day 2, completed his 27th five-wicket haul in Tests with figures of 5/128 to put the hosts back on top. After South Africa resumed on a precarious 39/3, India would have expected their spin duo of Ashwin and Ravindra Jadeja to produce quick wickets but their only success in the first session came from fast bowler Ishant Sharma. Temba Bavuma was out leg before for 18 to the lanky paceman who got the delivery to curl back in viciously and hit the batsman's pad, reducing the touring side to 63/4.

## Massive deficit

A massive first innings deficit stared in South Africa's face but the 32-year-old Elgar had other ideas. The left-handed batsman added 115 for the fifth wicket with captain Faf du Plessis to launch South Africa's rearguard action in the morning before going on to compile a counter-punching stand of 164 for the sixth with de Kock to keep India at bay.

Elgar displayed nimble footwork against the spinners and was not afraid to take the aerial route to score runs as he hit 18 fours and four sixes in his knock. He reached his century in style by hitting Ashwin over the

midwicket boundary with a slog sweep and followed it up with an emotional celebration. Elgar had a lucky escape when wicketkeeper Wriddhiman Saha, making a comeback to the Indian side after an injury-induced lengthy absence, failed to hold on to a catch on 74 off Jadeja. He was finally dismissed when Cheteshwar Pujara completed a smart running catch to give Jadeja his 200th wicket in Tests.

## Missed opportunity

India also missed an opportunity to dismiss de Kock for seven with Rohit Sharma flooring a sharp chance at close in off spinner Hanuma Vihari. The wick-

etkeeper-batsman made full use of the reprieve, producing the fireworks with a stroke-filled innings during which he hit 16 fours and two sixes. The 26-year-old hit one of those sixes off Ashwin to bring up his fifth Test hundred but the off-spinner had his revenge when he disturbed his wickets with a straight delivery.

Du Plessis looked fluent at the crease and used the sweep shot well to neutralise the spinners, hitting eight fours and a six in his innings of 55 before he was caught by Pujara at leg slip off Ashwin, who also dismissed Vernon Philander. — Reuters

## PLAYING IN INDIA IS VERY TOUGH: ELGAR

The third day of the first Test between undoubtedly belonged to Proteas opener Dean Elgar, who hit a brilliant 287-ball 160 on a wicket that not only provided Ravichandran Ashwin and Ravindra Jadeja turn, but the odd ball also jumped after hitting the crack. Elgar said it is tough to bat in Indian conditions and he learnt from the experience he had on his last tour with the team. "Playing in India is very tough. The last time I was here, I was very inexperienced," he said. "In those four years, I have grown a lot as a cricketer. I have played county cricket, which has helped." Asked what he tried differently this time around, Elgar said: "If you want to use our last series in India, we shouldn't use that because of the wickets. You need to defend well against the spinners, because then you give yourself the best chance of attacking. County cricket with Surrey has helped a lot. Playing spin is something I have been conscious of, and you will face a lot of spin when coming to India. I think you have to find your strengths." "Hitting the ball in the air — that's a strength of mine," he said when asked about his attacking mindset. "Thankfully, it worked out in this game." — IANS

## To stay away from cricket was very tough: Ashwin

VISAKHAPATNAM, OCTOBER 4 Ravichandran Ashwin, playing his first Test match since December last year, says he badly missed playing for India in the last 10 months, so much so that the wily off-spinner stopped watching the game.

The 33-year-old, who has been playing only one format for India since July 2017, last played the Adelaide Test from December 6 to 10, the first of the four on the tour of Australia. To his disappointment, Ashwin did not feature in the playing XI in the following Test series against West Indies in August-September, when India only played one spinner, Ravindra Jadeja.

"To stay away from cricket itself was very tough for me. In order to substitute, I played whatever games I got. I played some county cricket for Nottinghamshire. I tried and played the TNPL as much as I could, played some league cricket in Chennai," he said. "It was very important to tick those numbers off because that is essentially where I came from. Going back and playing there is probably the best thing that could have happened."

By claiming his 27th five-wicket haul in Tests on Friday, Ashwin showed that he remained India's go-to spinner in home conditions. Asked how spent his time away from the spotlight, Ashwin said: "I felt like every time I watched the game on TV I felt like wanted to play the game. I was missing out I felt, it is very natural. I just wanted to play. Everybody goes through it. But that's not the end."

"I tried different things in my life," he added. "My life has revolved around cricket for the last 25 years. I thought my life, my family everybody deserved a bit more of my time so I tried to spend time away from the game. I discovered other interests (reading archaeology books was one of

## Need top-level infra to boost sport: NBA commissioner

The National Basketball Association (NBA) Commissioner Adam Silver is keen to introduce league matches in India, but he wants a suitable and vast infrastructure in India, to match up the standard of the league. Discussing his plans for supporting the junior programme here, Silver said it's difficult to sustain in any country in the absence of a proper setup. "It's a big thing for organising this tie here. It took us

almost five years to see its possibility," Silver, here to witness the historical pre-season NBA match between Sacramento Kings and Indiana Pacers, said at Dome Stadium SVP Stadium. "To see more teams from India or to develop a culture of basketball here, we surely need infrastructure of NBA standards. For instance, for this match we had to arrange locker rooms, seats, scoreboard... — Adam Silver, NBA COMMISSIONER

basketball." "Obviously, we wanted to make NBA a big thing here!" he added. "We are seriously considering it and,

say, in the next five years, things would change for sure. We did it in China and it is going to be done here. We are making a large investment and that's why we are very cautious in our approach."

## Punjab talent

Asked whether only a handful of academies could help raise the sport's standard in India, Silver said it was like putting just one toe in the water. "We have to have good grassroots setup here," Silver said. "To start with, it is Mumbai and Delhi, but our

ground teams are approaching other cities also. We certainly believe it's a must thing to achieve and considering the talent from Punjab, sure! We are working, it's just a question of time." However, he avoided commenting on the issue of getting into a partnership with the Basketball Federation of India (BFI). "We are connected to BFI automatically through FIBA (basketball's international governing body)," he said. "It's an enormous response to attract our 3,000 students for the match.

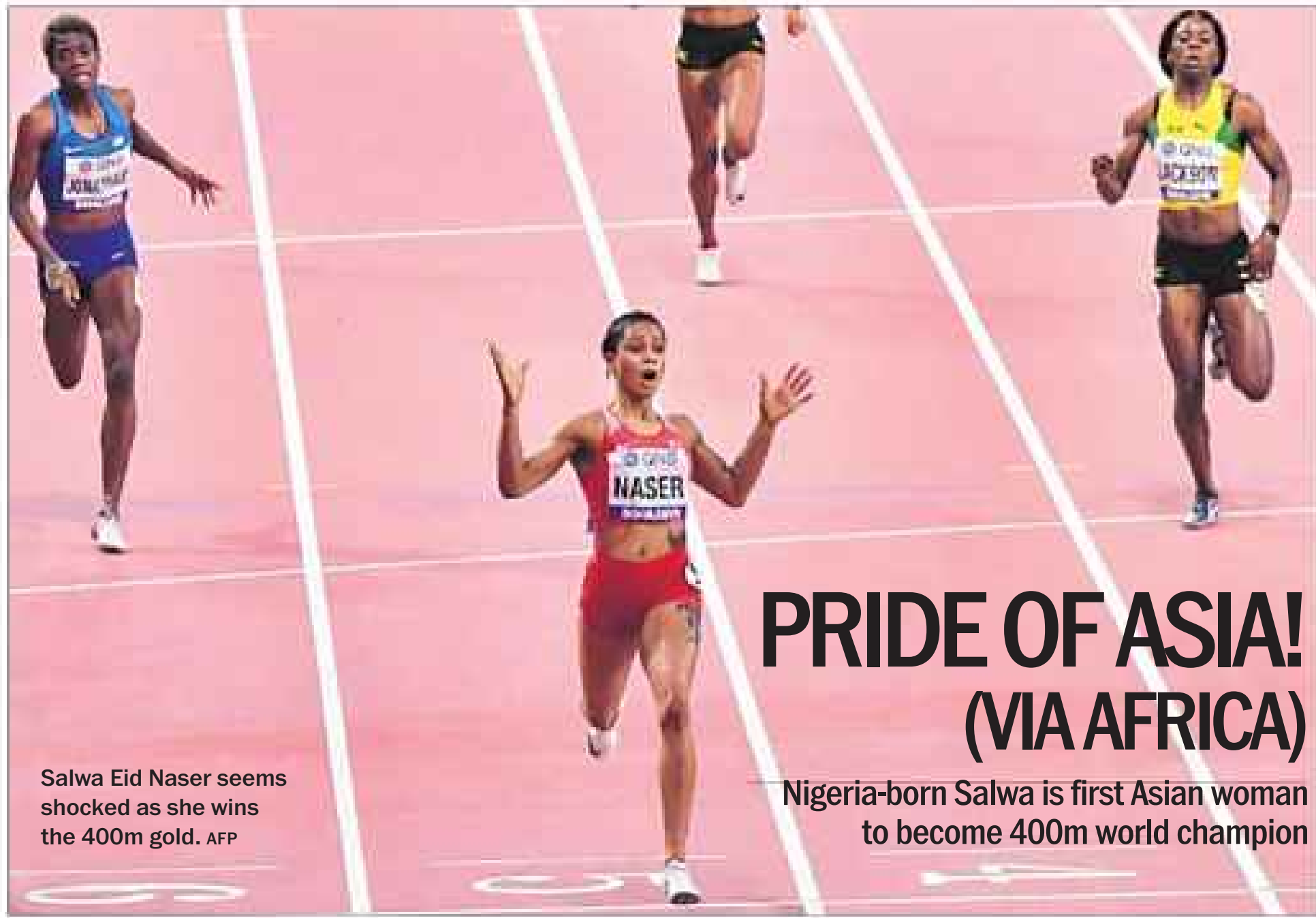

**Salwa shocks field in 48.14s**

**DOHA, OCTOBER 4**  
 Bahrain's Salwa Eid Naser destroyed the field and stunned Olympic champion Shaunae Miller-Uibo as she became the first Asian to win the women's 400m world title. The Nigerian-born Eid Naser, 21, surged past Miller-Uibo on the back straight to win in 48.14 seconds, the third fastest time in history.  
 Miller-Uibo took silver in 48.37. The Bahamian suffered her first defeat over the distance since she inexplicably stumbled with victory in her grasp in London two years ago. After running the fastest 400 metres since 1985, Eid Naser seemed to be in a state of shock as she sat on the track and covered her mouth with her hand at the end of the race.

**Couple Uibo, Miller-Uibo win silver each**

**Doha:** Estonian decathlete Maicel Uibo and his wife, Bahamian runner Shaunae Miller-Uibo, had two reasons to celebrate after they each won a silver medal at the World Championships. "Both medals at the same time, on the same night," Uibo said. "It's double the joy." Miller-Uibo, the 2016 Olympic gold medalist who had been favourite to win the 400 metres world title in Doha, finished second after Salwa Eid Naser of Bahrain stunned her by running the third fastest time in the event's history. As Miller-Uibo crossed the finish line, her husband was preparing to run the 1,500 metres, the tenth and final event in the decathlon. He came in third, giving him the overall silver. — Reuters

**This is crazy!**  
 "This is crazy," she said. "I was just hoping for the best but now I'm world champion."  
 Miller-Uibo managed to close the gap down the back straight but left it too late to catch her rival, despite herself running the sixth-fastest time in history. Jamaica's Shericka Jackson took bronze while defending champion Phyllis Francis also ran a personal best of 49.61 but could still only manage fifth.  
 Two years ago in London, Miller-Uibo was clear with less than 20 metres left but she

tripped on her own foot, stumbling almost to a standstill as her rivals stormed past. The 25-year-old also won silver at the World Championships in Beijing four years ago.  
 Some jeers were heard as Eid Naser's name was announced at the start, with Bahrain being one of the countries to have boycotted Qatar as it accuses the Gulf State of supporting terrorism. Qatar denies the allegation.  
 The runners were greeted with the light show which has been a feature of the championships although there were also shouting and whistling as the runners waited for the starting gun. Naser produced a stunning burst of pace as she caught the big-striding Miller-Uibo and then powered home. — Reuters

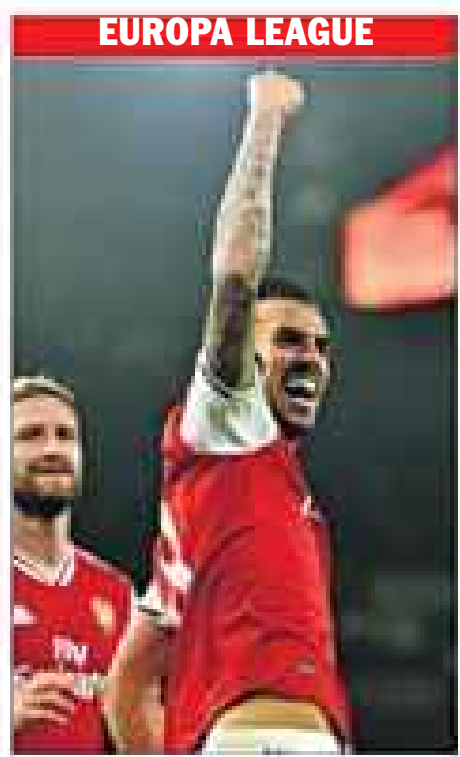

India may say yes to Pak fee

Kartarpur pilgrims to be charged \$20

India may be willing to compromise on Pakistan's insistence on charging facilitation fees of \$ 20 per pilgrim for using the Kartarpur corridor. India's priority is to get the project operational in time for Guru Nanak's 550th birth celebrations at Gurdwara Nankana Sahib, government sources said here today.

Under prodding from the Union Home Ministry, the government had taken a tough line on the fees issue at the previous India-Pakistan official level meeting to work out the modalities for the pilgrimage. However, with all infrastructure projects on the Indian side, including a four-lane approach road and a huge pilgrim holding centre, expected to be completed by this month end, New Delhi is keen to ensure it does not get the blame if the corridor does not get started because of Pakistan's refusal to accept some of the conditions.

India has sent its proposals to Pakistan, but there has been no word so far whether there is concurrence on any or all of them. They include an insistence on an Indian counsellor official to accompany the pilgrims and a counsellor outpost at the gurdwara in Pakistan to tackle emergencies.

Pakistan has sought to dis-

While ex-PM Manmohan Singh is welcome to accompany one of the jathas that will go to Nankana Sahib to pay obeisance, the sources said it was unclear whether he would be witness to the inauguration of the corridor.

'Hope Kartarpur ushers in peace on both sides'

NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 4

Former Governor of Jammu and Kashmir NN Vohra and noted journalist Mark Tully on Friday expressed the hope that Kartarpur Sahib corridor would usher in peace on both sides of the border. The latter inaugurated an exhibition titled “Rabab to Nagaara: Life and Legacy of Guru Nanak” on the 550th birth anniversary of the Guru at India International Centre (IIC) here. The event was hosted by the National Institute of Panjab Studies, Bhai Vir Singh Sahitya Sadan.

The former J&K Governor said the exhibition depicted the evolution of the history of North India. He hoped that

Kartarpur Sahib corridor would lead to peace with neighbours so that resources were deployed for countering disease and poverty instead of fighting wars.

Dr Mohinder Singh, National Institute of Panjab Studies, regretted that there were only celebrations to mark the birth anniversary of Guru Nanak and “no academic work.” He pointed out that while there was no golden ‘palki (resting place for Guru Granth Sahib)’ at Darbar Sahib, “we are ferrying one to Nankana Sahib.” He said rare books on Guru Gobind Singh's era were missing. “Today there is no money for Guru Nanak studies in universities,” he lamented. —TNS

Save one, all neighbours has been good story: Jaishankar

NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 4

In an obvious reference to Pakistan, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Friday said India's entire neighbourhood “minus one” had been a “fairly good story” for regional cooperation.

The abrogation of Article 370 provisions did come up for discussion in his meetings during the recent US visit, Jaishankar added at a session of the India Economic Summit here.

“That is natural for many people when there is a change of status...” he said during a conversation with World Economic Forum president Borge Brende.

Jaishankar said he “spoke fairly extensively” in the US on the Kashmir issue—on the background, history, “why we did, what we did”—and asserted that a lot of it was new to the people he discussed the matter with.

“Hardly anybody had the realisation that this (Article 370) was a temporary article in the Constitution or the misalignment due to the fact that a lot of the national laws did not apply in Jammu and Kashmir. These



MEA HITS OUT AT MALAYSIA, TURKEY

India on Friday sharply reacted to statements from Malaysia and Turkey expressing concern over the lockdown in J&K and urging the UN to play a more proactive role. “The statements are biased, factually incorrect and unwarranted since Kashmir is an internal matter to India,” MEA spokesperson Raveesh Kumar said. India has drawn satisfaction from extensive outreach to other countries on J&K, especially at the UN General Assembly, but it failed to turnaround Turkey and Malaysia. TNS

were all new things to them,” Jaishankar said.

Discussing India's push for strengthening of ties with its neighbours, the Minister said, “I would say the entire neighbourhood, minus one, has actually been a fairly good story of regional cooperation.” Asked if the

impasse with ‘minus one’ would continue, he said he hopes that someday even the ‘minus one’ comes around to regional cooperation.

“You put Kashmir aside for a moment...Today, with everybody else, trade, business, connectivity and contacts are increasing. Surely, at some stage, that would have an impact because you would see everybody else prospering with that cooperation,” the External Affairs Minister said.

The two-day India Economic Summit, which ended on Friday, was organised by the World Economic Forum in collaboration with the Confederation of Indian Industry.

Jaishankar said there is no doubt that the world has become more nationalistic, and a lot of that nationalism is economic nationalism and cultural nationalism. In India's case, nationalism is not a negative sentiment directed at the world, he said.

Asked about the possibility of a trade agreement between India and the US, he said it is not that easy as it is a “fairly complicated matter”. So if it is taking time it is fine, the minister added. —PTI
