seven days, the "jail administration will initiate further necessary legal proceedings as per law".

The notice to the four convicts — Mukesh (31), Pawan Gupta (24), Vinay Sharma (25) and Akshay Kumar Singh (33) — is signed by the Superintendent, Central Jail No. 2, Tihar Jail, and dated October 29.

"It is informed that all legal remedies in your case... as available in the Constitution of India

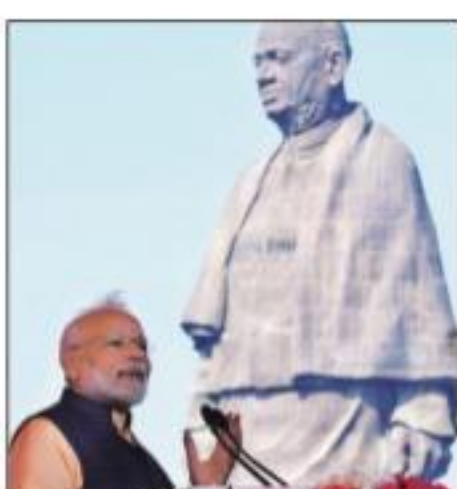

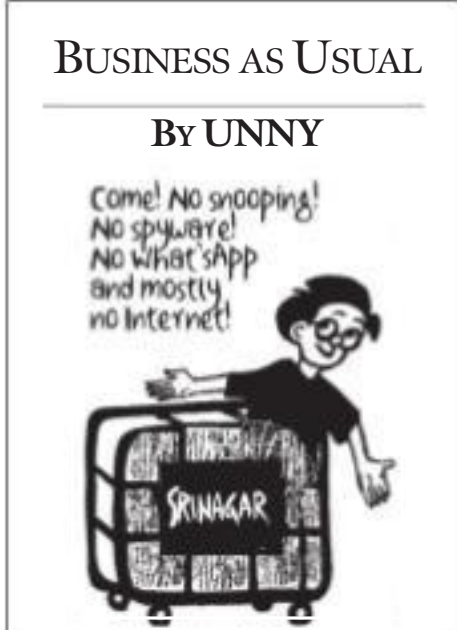

## China calls division of J&K unlawful, India says our internal matter

HOURS AFTER Beijing called the official bifurcation of the state of Jammu and Kashmir into the Union Territories of J&K and Ladakh as "unlawful" and "void", India Thursday responded sharply and said it doesn't expect China to comment on its internal matter, just as Delhi refrains from commenting on internal issues of other countries.

In Beijing, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Geng Shuang said: "The Indian government officially announced the establishment of so-called Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory and Ladakh Union Territory which included some of China's territory

into its administrative jurisdiction. China deplores and firmly opposes that. India unilaterally changes its domestic laws and administrative divisions challenging China's sovereignty."

Geng said: "This is unlawful and void and this is not effective in any way and will not change the fact that the area is under Chinese actual control."

Noting the Chinese statement, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesperson Raveesh Kumar said: "China is well aware of India's consistent and clear position on this issue. The matter of reorganization of the erstwhile State of Jammu & Kashmir into

## How RSS, BJP agreed on Ayodhya: Many meetings before LS polls

THE RSS decision to defer its meeting of pracharakas to hold a dialogue with the BJP leadership on Ayodhya — to harmonise their stance before the Supreme Court verdict — comes on the back of a four-month tussle over the temple between the two sides in the run-up to the Lok Sabha elections in May, *The Indian Express* has learnt.

On Wednesday, the Sangh's top brass deferred its once-in-five years gathering to facilitate its closed-door meeting with the

ruling party and VHP leaders. Last year, however, it took multiple meetings for the RSS and BJP to defuse tensions over taking the legislative route to construct the temple.

Thirty years after the BJP's resolution to build the temple, the issue emerged as an irritant between the party and RSS barely six months ahead of the announcement of 2019 general elections, according to sources briefed about the events.

## Employment falls first time — by 9 mn in 6 yrs: Study

A NEW academic paper — written by Santosh Mehrotra and Jajati K Parida and published by the Centre of Sustainable Employment at the Azim Premji University on Thursday — has formally concluded that the total employment in India declined between 2011-12 and 2017-18.

This is the first time such a decline has been recorded in independent India's history.

While this point has been made by the same authors as well as some others, such as Himanshu of Jawaharlal Nehru University, this is the first formal paper to this effect. According to Mehrotra and Parida, the "total employment during 2011-12 and 2017-18 declined by 9 million. This happened for the first time in India's history".

Mehrotra is Professor of Economics at Jawaharlal Nehru University while Parida teaches at the Central University of Punjab.

## In Karnataka, digital land records project to check dodgy transactions hits govt wall

A LANDMARK project in Karnataka to create digitised, geo-referenced and unique identity records for property in urban areas, and issue property cards to owners, has stalled in the pilot phase itself, official records reviewed by *The Indian Express* show.

The Urban Properties Ownership Record (UPOR) project was launched in 2014 in Shimoga and Mangalore, on a pilot basis, following clearances from previous BJP and Congress governments. The objective: Prevent cheating in land deals and protect government land from fraudsters.

But on September 30, ignoring objections from the Revenue Department, the new BJP government cancelled an order issued four years ago, making UPOR cards mandatory for property registration under the project.



Officials say project a success, BSY cites public reservations

The latest order follows a letter from Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa on September 9 to the Principal Secretary of the Revenue Department: "The UPOR project is being implemented in the city of Shimoga on a pilot basis. Many members of the public have expressed reser-

vations over the project making property cards mandatory for carrying out land transactions."

But government sources say there is more to it than meets the eye. Speaking to *The Indian Express* on condition of anonymity, a government official said: "A system like the UPOR project and digitised cards are the only way to save properties on lakes, drains, parks, forest areas or even coastal zones from being fraudulently sold to innocent people. It seems the government does not have

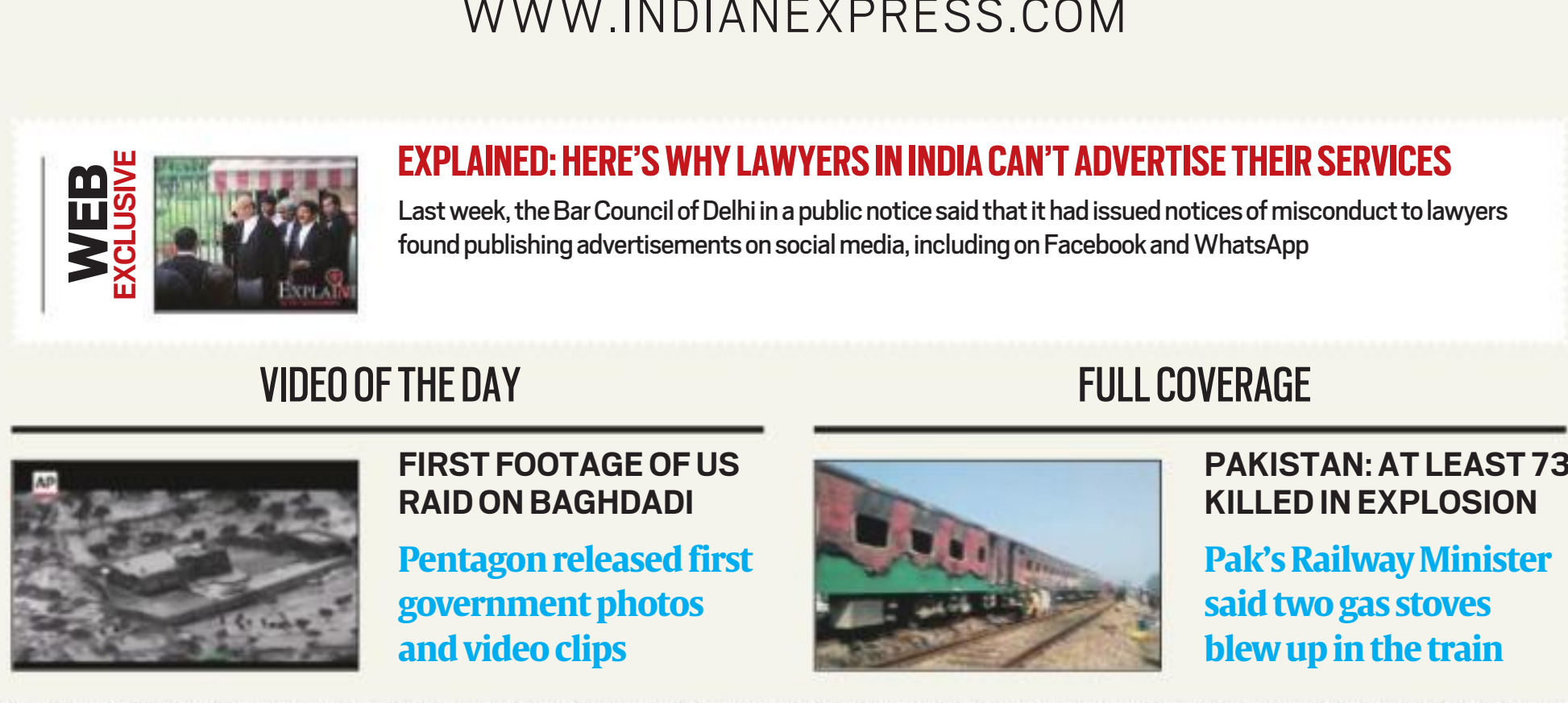

Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Tripura, Gujarat, Odisha and even from the landlocked states of Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. Only 5 students in the batch are from Gujarat.

The academic offerings of Gujarat Maritime University are highly unique and sector specific. There are not many institutes across the country offering similar programmes. ■ Erasmus University – Centre for Urban Port and Transport Economics (Erasmus UPT) for sending students of

GMU on a 2 week international study tour.

■ STC International and Erasmus UPT for conducting joint certification short term programmes for executives and working professionals.

As a part of the international study tour the students of GMU will be sent on a 2 week study tour to Rotterdam, where they will be exposed to not only classroom training but shall also be taken on industrial visits to ports, ship owners' association, legal practitioners etc. Also, to make

the students internationally competitive, finishing school training shall also be provided to them additionally. Bi-monthly field visits to various ports shall also be part of their training.

Further, the Post Graduate Diploma programme offered by the university is specially designed for working professionals in the industry who wish to further enhance their skillset and employability. These programmes are a mix of classroom learning plus distance education, wherein the participants have to attend only a few days of contact classes in a semester. The rest shall be delivered through digital platforms. The programme duration is 1 year. This programme has also witnessed encouraging response and 11 admissions have been made so far making total enrolment at the university to 43 students in its first year itself. The 2 week international study tour offering is also extended to the candidates of the PG Diploma programme.

Also, realising the need of the industry, GMU now envisions to start the Centre for Executive Education which will offer shorter duration Executive Development Programmes in January 2020 in collaboration with the Erasmus University and STC International, both reputed global maritime institutes. Under the center, GMU will launch short term Executive Development Programmes (EDP) / Management Development Programmes (MDP) programmes for the experienced professionals from the Industry and will be offered as joint certification programme in collaboration with International partners.

Going further, in coming years, the university will also launch various schools & centres to cater to the needs of the entire value chain of the maritime sector.

**School of Maritime Management:** This school would offer programs focused on management and commercial aspects of maritime sector such as Shipping Management, Port Operations, Ship Finance, Transportation and Logistics Management.

**School of Marine Technology:** This school would offer programs focused on engineering, science and technology related aspects of the maritime sector such as Marine Engineering, Naval Architecture, Naval Sciences etc.

**School of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences:** This school would offer programs focused on liberal arts and social sciences – maritime history, ecology etc.

**Centre of Continuing Education:** This centre would offer Continuing Education programs for professionals in the maritime sector.

**Centre for Faculty Development:** This centre will cater to needs of faculty development in maritime education.

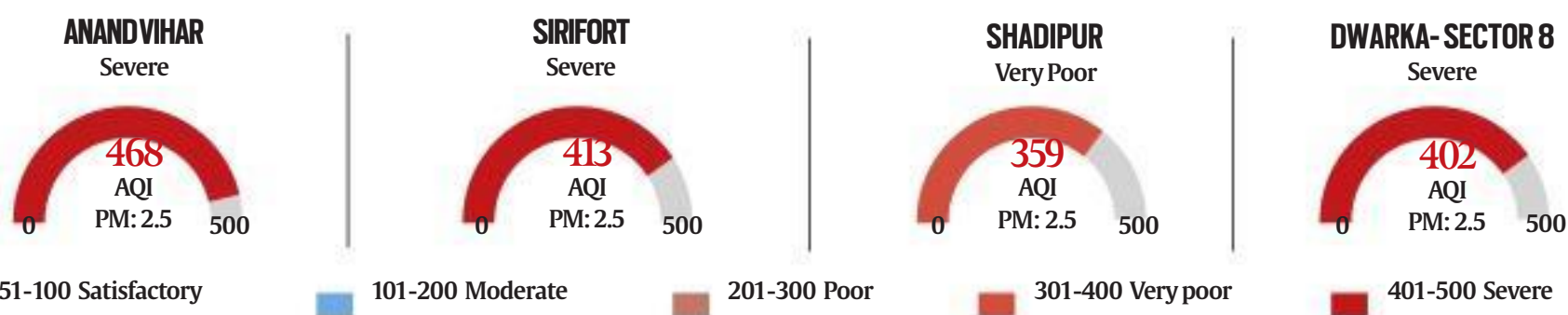

GOVT WANTS TO HIRE 2,000, LESS THAN 200 ON BOARD

Odd-even: Pvt buses to run in two shifts, not entire day

PRIVATE BUSES, which are being temporarily roped in to augment public transport, are likely to run in two shifts during the odd-even policy, which will be in force from November 4 to 15. The associations informed the Delhi government Thursday that they will be unable to lease their vehicles for the entire day during the 12-day period. During a meeting chaired by Transport Minister Kailash Gahlot, officials said that so far, around 180 private bus operators have submitted applications offering their services during odd-even. The Delhi Cabinet has cleared a proposal to hire 2,000 private buses. "The associations informed the government that they will be able to extend their services between 8.30 am-12.30 pm and 3.30 pm-8.30 pm. The window in between is required to ferry school students. Buses can be offered through the day only if schools remain closed dur-

ing odd-even, representatives of bus operators have told the government," said a senior official. The lukewarm response from operators to the government's proposal prompted consecutive meetings on Wednesday and Thursday. The issue is a matter of concern for the authorities as the city has around 5,589 buses as against the requirement of 11,000. Meanwhile, the government

also expects a jump in the average daily bus ridership, which stands at around 42 lakh currently, due to the implementation of the free rides scheme for women in DTC and cluster buses. As per an official, the government has been assured that more operators will be roped in by November 2, so that the requirement of 2,000 buses can be met. "The umbrella associations will try and persuade operators at the

local level," said the official. Bus owners also sought the government's assistance in dealing with "harassment in the name of implementing the amended Motor Vehicles Act", sources said. The government's stand on the issue could not be immediately ascertained. The Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) will provide conductors in these buses, and will keep the revenue generated from them. The driver will be provided by the bus owner, who will also be in charge of all other responsibilities, including maintenance. During odd-even, which was implemented twice in Delhi in 2016, one's licence plate, or date in the calendar, determines whether or not they can drive on roads. Two-wheelers and vehicles driven by a lone woman, or the ones in which she has female co-passengers or children below 12 years of age, will not have to follow the restrictions. Private CNG cars have been brought under the scheme's ambit this time.

'75% crop harvested, farm fires to reduce in Punjab'

DIRECTIONS TO sow paddy a week earlier than last year could help Delhi beat another pollution peak owing to crop residue burning in Punjab. According to KS Pannu, agriculture secretary, Punjab government, the peak number of fires has already been reached earlier this week and a large percentage of grain has also arrived at purchase centres. Data collected by NASA's MODIS tool between 2012 and 2019 shows that the number of fires usually sees a spike in the first week of November. So far this year, the number of fires in the fields of Punjab has already exceeded those recorded last year. The worst year in the recent past was 2016. "We had advanced the date of sowing by a week this year. As a result, around 75% of the paddy crop has already been harvested and around 66% has arrived at mandis," said Pannu. According to NASA's data, most of the fires this year are concentrated in Punjab. The highest number of fires in the state were recorded, so far, on Wednesday at 3,135. In 2018, till

October 31, the total number of fires recorded was 17,646. This year, it is 22,137. "We have already got 116 lakh tonnes of paddy at the centres. We are expecting 180 lakh tonnes so around 65% have already reached. This indicates that in several places, harvest is complete and the number of fires will come down now. The peak is behind us," said Pannu. An analysis done by Hiren Jethwa, a research analyst with US-based Universities Space Research Association, showed

crop stubble burning this time has already crossed the 2015 and 2018 levels. Jethwa also attributed the dip in air quality to "intense farm fires" in Northwest India. The cause of Delhi's severely polluted air quality also resulted in sparring between AAP and BJP workers. AAP leaders held a protest outside Punjab and Haryana bhawans Thursday. AAP Delhi chief Gopal Rai led the protest, which was attended by MLAs, councillors and workers. "The situation was normal in Delhi till a few days ago... But as soon as stubble burning started in Haryana and Punjab, pollution levels in Delhi spiked," he said. The Delhi BJP, however, said AAP had failed to control pollution in the city and was needlessly blaming other states for the spike. "Continuously rising pollution in Delhi shows the failure of the Delhi government... the Chief Minister of Delhi is doing the same thing that he has been doing for the last few years - accusing others for it. Instead of taking steps to control pollution, AAP is staging a demonstration at Haryana and Punjab bhawans to cover its failures," said Delhi BJP president Manoj Tiwari.

Pregnant woman injured after ambulance rams 5 cars, gives birth to boy in hospital

AN AMBULANCE rushing a pregnant woman to the hospital for delivery jumped a signal and hit five other vehicles before toppling at an intersection on Mehrauli-Badarpur Road Thursday, leaving the 35-year-old and her relative injured. Police said the woman was later taken to Jamia Hospital where she delivered a healthy

baby boy. According to police, the ambulance was on its way from Mandi Village, where the women live, to ESI Hospital in Okhla when the driver lost control. Atul Kumar Thakur, DCP (South), said that officers found an overturned ambulance upon reaching the spot. "Bystanders immediately rushed both women to the AIIMS Trauma Centre. The women are stable after primary treatment. Jasoda, the pregnant

woman, was later referred to Jamia Hospital where she gave birth to a boy," said a senior police officer at Saket police station. Eyewitnesses told police that the ambulance driver was speeding and jumped the signal. "The occupants of the other vehicles didn't sustain major injuries... A case has been registered against the ambulance driver at Saket police station under IPC section 279 and 337," said Thakur.

Contracts end, guest teachers face uncertain future yet again

WITH THEIR contracts having ended Thursday, thousands of guest teachers working in Delhi government schools find themselves in the same situation they were in eight months ago, when they protested in large numbers against expired contracts and the lack of job security. When the contracts of 22,000 guest teachers had ended on

February 28, they protested in massive numbers outside Education Minister Manish Sisodia's residence. On March 6, the Delhi Cabinet cleared a policy which enabled guest teachers to "function with the DoE till they attain the age of superannuation". But this was passed on to the L-G, who has not approved it yet. "We have no option but to go back and protest outside the education minister's residence," said a member of the All India Guest

Teachers' Association. In the meantime, DSSSB has selected 11,056 candidates to join Delhi government and MCD schools as regular teachers. However, in an affidavit to the Delhi High Court, the Delhi government submitted that only a fraction of guest teachers qualified for regular positions. On Thursday the court directed the DSSSB to file an affidavit in four weeks, laying out the schedule for recruitment of another 15,000 regular teachers.

How Dal Lake lotus gave colony for Kashmiri Pandits its name

AN EFFORT to rebuild a community far away from home in the 1950s and 1960s lent an unfamiliar name, in an unfamiliar language, to a residential colony in the heart of Delhi — Pamposh Enclave. As the first wave of Kashmiri Pandits who migrated to the capital in the late 1940s worked towards building their first community here, they decided to name it after the lotus which grows in the Dal Lake, or the pamposh in Kashmiri. Dr B B Dhar, a resident of the area and president of the

Kashmir Education Culture and Science Society, recalled how the idea of the enclave was conceived. "By the late 1940s, there was a good number of Kashmir Brahmins who had moved out of the state and begun settling in different parts of Delhi. Most of them took up lower level government jobs, in the capacity of clerks and likewise, and were scattered around the city in Lajpat Nagar, Karol Bagh, RK Puram and other Government of India colonies. A group of these new settlers began to meet in order to discuss getting their own place, a place for the community. They approached the central government, which was sympathetic," Dhar said.

This stretch of then-forested land to the Southeast of the capital centre was allotted to a newly created Kashmiri cooperative housing society in the late 1950s, and the process of allotting plots to families began in 1961.

Then remained the task of giving this newly created residential area a name. A name chosen by members of the community, Pamposh was different from names of many post-Partition refugee colonies which were named by the government after heroes of the new nation, such as Lajpat Nagar, Malviya Nagar, Jawahar Nagar, Patel Nagar, Subhash Nagar, and so on. The settlers did not choose to commemorate a personality as was common with Delhi's street and locality names, but instead decided on an emotive symbol. "Our forefathers in the general council of the cooperative

society considered multiple options. It was significant — it was to be a mini Kashmir, the first colony to be set up after the migration began. They ultimately chose to name it after the lotus, which holds meaning for all Kashmiris," said Arun Shalia, one of the oldest residents of the area. "It is a symbol of home for Kashmiris. It grows in our lakes. Even more significant than the flower is what is beneath it — the nadru or the lotus stem which is used in our cuisine and is a source of livelihood for many. The blooming of the lotus is also symbolic of how our forefathers wanted the community to grow in this new home," Dhar said.

# Inaugurating new HQ, Shah calls for image makeover of police

INAUGURATING THE new Delhi Police headquarters at Jai Singh Road Thursday, Union Home Minister Amit Shah asked the force to be proactive and responsive towards redressing grievances of the public.

Stating that the Narendra Modi government is trying to make people understand the challenges that police face every day, Shah said: "To make the 'law and order' system accessible to all, police must be sensitised and must help the public with their grievances. Also, we (public) need to change our perception and understand the sacrifices the police make for us since they work day and night to protect us."

Cautioning them that new buildings do not guarantee a reformed police force, he stressed on the need to change the image of police: "It can be achieved only by transforming the spirit of policing towards being public-service oriented. Only then will the public image improve and the efforts the force is making achieve the intended positive results."

Stating that internal security is the Modi government's top priority, Shah said: "We have undertaken a lot of work to improve security at the borders, and cracked down on fake notes." He also said security forces are working diligently towards accomplishing it.

He congratulated the Delhi Police for its new headquarters and said, "Finally, after 70 years, they got their own house. It was delayed but it happened for good." He added that the inauguration could not have hap-

pened on a more auspicious day than the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the country's first home minister and the 'Iron Man of India'.

He paid tribute to Delhi Police personnel who lost their lives in the 2001 Parliament attack and were conferred the Kirti Chakra, and to inspector Mohan Chand Sharma who was killed during the 2008 Batla House encounter.

"The Modi government has developed the National Police Memorial in New Delhi, which chronicles the sacrifices of over 34,000 officers and jawans who laid down their lives for the country," he said, and urged the public to visit the memorial and witness the challenges faced by police forces and sacrifices made by them in securing the nation.

Talking about the importance of the police in the nation's progress, Shah said that a stable law and order situation is most important for economic growth and social development in the country. He observed that the police is perpetually projected in

a negative light in popular media, but the sacrifices made round-the-clock by officers and jawans to ensure the safety of citizens are seldom highlighted. "Such a kind of negative projection demoralises our police force. The public image of police needs to change," he said.

On the contribution of Sardar Patel in national integration, Shah said he was known for his actions, more than his words, and for integrating over 550 princely states at the time of Independence. "Sardar Patel accomplished a near-impossible task of surmounting tough challenges in a short time and creating a united India that we are proud of today," he said.

Delhi Police Commissioner Amulya Patnaik said: "The new police headquarters has been built in a public-private partnership mode at a cost of Rs 286 crore. It is spread over an area of eight acres."

For women officers and policemen who have no one to look after their children at home, a creche has also been made.

## Call to food delivery service lands woman on run in police net

A CALL to an online food delivery service led to the arrest of a woman, who had been on the run for the last two months after allegedly duping several people by selling them fake tour packages, from South Delhi's Chhatarpur.

DCP (South West) Devender Arya said the accused, Tuba Fatma (28), is from West Bengal. She did her schooling in Noida and B.Tech in Bengaluru.

According to the DCP, she was arrested based on a complaint filed at Vasant Kunj (North) police station by Keshav Dhingra, who claimed he was duped of Rs 6.5 lakh by Fatma's company, Clique Meraki Pvt Ltd.

Police said she had promised him a Europe tour package for two families, but went on the run after he filed the complaint.

"Her father, who was in real estate, suffered huge losses. She was looking for a job but didn't get one. She then decided to

cheat people by opening a tour company with her friend and her younger brother, who are absconding," said a senior officer.

Explaining their modus operandi, an officer said they issued ads in newspapers and on social media.

"They would offer cheap and attractive domestic and international packages. After striking a deal with their victims, they got them to transfer the money after which they sent fake air tickets, without PNR number, via e-mail. The scam came to light when clients reached the airport, only to discover the tickets were fake. The trio, who were running the company for the last three years and mainly targeted senior citizens, duped several people," the officer said, adding that they would change their office address when people started pressuring them to return the money.

"A few days ago, we found she had made a call to an online food delivery service... We approached the company, which gave us the address of her rented accommodation," said the officer.

## Fined for parking violation, 'drunk' man sets bike on fire, arrested

## JNUSU protest against admin continues — with office orders

AS THE showdown between students and administration of the Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) over new hostel rules and fee entered the third day, the JNU Students' Union (JNUSU) has come up with a new way to take on the administration — by issuing them office orders.

On Thursday, JNUSU issued an office order against the V-C, replicating a proctorial office order: "You have been found to be involved in anti-student activities, including the illegal violation of the order of the Hon'ble HC judgment, and the undemocratic and illegal passage of the Draft Hostel manual 2019. These acts constitute a serious breach of the democratic ethos of the university..."

"... This is an act of indiscipline and misconduct. For due process of natural justice, your reply should reach the competent authority latest by November 4, failing which it will be presumed that you have nothing to say in your defence and the competent authority will be free to take appropriate

action against you," it added.

A similar office order was issued against Dean of Students Umesh Kadam, declaring him "out of bounds".

"Anyone giving shelter to Mr Umesh Ashok Kadam in any premises of the university shall be considered to be party to (his) offences. If he has to come to JNU for any academic purpose, he has to seek official permission from the office of the JNUSU, 10 days prior to the visit," it read.

Kadam and V-C M Jagadesh Kumar did not respond to calls and texts by *The Indian Express*. Kadam had earlier called the

notice insulting. Sharing a photo of the notice, he tweeted, "This is how Aishe Ghosh (JNUSU president) is insulting, threatening and defaming me in public space, I am requesting the Ministry of Social Justice and re-appealing to Vasant Kunj North police to take immediate action against her for instigating and holding me hostage even in the ambulance."

On Monday, the JNU administration claimed the union did not allow Kadam to leave the hostel committee meeting despite health issues. However, JNUSU claimed Kadam "faked health issues" to avoid discussion.

AT KALKAJI'S AMBEDKAR PARK

AAP, BJP spar over Chhath prep at MCD park

RESIDENTS OF DDA flats in South Delhi's Kalkaji woke up to a noisy slugfest between AAP and BJP workers Thursday over the Delhi government designating a municipal park for Chhath festivities, which faced stiff resistance from the local BJP councillor.

At the heart of the dispute was the government's decision to create a Chhath ghat in the colony's

Ambedkar Park, which, the BJP claimed, did not have the South Corporation's approval and the local RWA's support.

With the advent of the Assembly polls next year, all major political parties in the capital are trying to woo Purvanchalis. As per rough estimates by political parties, the Purvanchali population in Delhi, comprising people from Bihar and east UP, is close to 30%. Not all of them, however, are registered as voters in the capital.

While the BJP insisted that

Chhath festivities can take place at another designated spot, another park barely 100 metres away, the AAP remained firm that Ambedkar Park should also be used for this purpose.

Local MLA Saurabh Bharadwaj claimed the district administration had already notified the park for Chhath, while BJP councillor Subhash Bhadana, who pointed out the absence of permission from the civic body, got into a scuffle with Bharadwaj over the issue on Wednesday.

On Thursday, in a bid to raise the pitch over the issue, AAP fielded its Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh, former Delhi unit convenor Gopal Rai, Transport Minister Kailash Gahlot and South Delhi MLAs at the venue, who sat on a dharna outside the park. BJP supporters also showed up at the same time, prompting police to create a buffer between the two sides. The local SDM later filed an application with the SDMC seeking permission, which granted conditional approval and said the

function can be held only with the NOC from the RWA.

BJP MP Meenakshi Lekhi said: "Instead of misleading local citizens and vitiating the atmosphere, AAP should follow legal process." CM Kejriwal tweeted: "To ensure devotees don't have to go too far from their homes...we have increased the number of ghats from 72 to 1,108. The Delhi government is making grand arrangements at all ghats."

The festival, which began Thursday, will end on Sunday.

L-G's drive against corruption led to 108 compulsory retirements: Govt

DELHI LT-GOVERNOR Anil Bajjal's drive to weed out "dead wood and dark sheep" from the city's administrative machinery has so far resulted in 108 compulsory retirements from various departments of the Delhi government, MCD and DDA among others, said an official government statement Thursday.

At 39, the North Corporation saw the maximum number of compulsory retirements, followed by the DDA and Services department, both of which eased out 14 officials each, as per a chart shared by the Delhi government. Officials who were shown the door include those falling in Groups A, B and C services.

The compulsory retirements have been carried out under FR 56(j), FR 56(1) and Rule 48 (1) (b) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, the statement said. The retirements are a culmination of a process set in motion by Bajjal on July 4 to make the administrative machinery more efficient.

Review committees were formed to assess the performance of officials, and principal secretaries and other HODs were authorised to identify employees who are either inefficient or corrupt.

"The matter was vigorously taken up with various departments/bodies under Government of NCT of Delhi. Action taken was reviewed from time to time by the chief secretary and also at the level of L-G. Till October 31, 108 officers/officials have been compulsorily retired, in public interest, by the appropriate authority. The assessment of the functioning of the employees under government, in terms of the provisions of FR 56(j), is a continuous process. It will be continued to be monitored to give a robust and corruption-free administration in the delivery of citizens' services," the statement added.

The DDA, MCDs, services department and other departments/autonomous bodies of the Delhi government have compulsorily retired 14, 61, 14 and 19 employees respectively.

### FAST ACTION

AFTER THE Prime Minister ticked off officers over the conduct of ‘Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat’, the HRD Ministry has swung into action trying to get more visibility for the programme that is meant to celebrate the country’s diversity and promote national integration. On Thursday, HRD Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal launched the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat festival organised by the Kendriya Vidyalyayas. He wore a veshti and spoke in Telugu at the launch.

### SPECIAL APPEARANCE

THE TWO protagonists of the CBI vs CBI courtroom drama from five months ago found themselves under the same roof on Thursday. The former senior officers of the country’s premier investigation agency — Rakesh Asthana and Alok Verma — sat in the front row as Home Minister Amit Shah inaugurated the new Delhi Police headquarters. There was intrigue in the air, followed by nudges and winks, as retired CBI chief Verma made his entry 20 minutes after Asthana. Former CBI special director Asthana is now heading the Narcotics Control Bureau and the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security.

### TAKING A PLEDGE

NITI Aayog Bhawan on Parliament Street houses two organisations — NITI Aayog and EAC-PM. On the occasion of Rashtriya Ekta Diwas, the staff of EAC-PM took the Rashtriya Ekta pledge in a quiet and simple manner, assembling in a room on the first floor. On the other hand, the NITI team did it with some fanfare. A stage with a sound system was set up for the purpose. NITI Aayog V-C Rajiv Kumar, along with two members on the stage, administered the pledge to staff. After the event, a NITI official quipped that they seldom lose an opportunity to organise an event.

### ANOTHER FACE-OFF

IN A week from now, India and Pakistan will again face off on the issue of terror in the presence of representatives of the Financial Action Task Force. On November 7, a delegation led by MoS Home G Kishan Reddy will travel to Australia to participate in a conference on terror financing organised by the Australian government. The conference will see participation from Pakistan, and a presentation will be made by the FATF. Sources said India is likely to raise the issue of killing of civilians in Kashmir by Pakistan-sponsored terrorists.

## HC asks AIIMS to form medical board for opinion on Chidambaram health

THE DELHI High Court Thursday asked the director of AIIMS to form a medical board to give an opinion on the health condition of former Union minister P Chidambaram, who is lodged in Tihar jail in the INX Media money laundering case and is suffering from Crohn’s disease.

It sought a report by Friday on whether the senior Congress leader needs to be admitted to the hospital.

Justice Suresh Kumar Kait said that Hyderabad-based gastroenterologist Nageshwar Reddy, who has been treating Chidambaram (74), be included in the board.

The court was hearing Chidambaram’s plea for six-day interim bail to enable him to get examined by Reddy, his regular doctor, at the Asian Institute of Gastroenterology (AIG) in Hyderabad.

Asking the AIIMS director to constitute the board by 4 pm, the judge said it should give its opinion especially on whether the Congress leader needs to be in sterile environment at the hospital. It also made clear that the board will meet at 7 pm, and if Reddy is unable to reach from Hyderabad, the board should sit on Friday at 10 am.

The court will hear the matter on Friday.

In his application, Chidambaram has claimed that he needs “urgent medical treatment for acute and persistent ab-

dominal pain being experienced” by him since October 5 due to Crohn’s disease, which he was diagnosed with in 2017.

Justice Kait and Solicitor General Tushar Mehta said that Chidambaram can be treated and shifted to a private ward in AIIMS, if the need arises, as the premier institute has the best doctors.

Senior advocate Kapil Sibal insisted that Chidambaram be shifted from Tihar jail to a private ward in AIIMS on Thursday. But Mehta said the doctors who examined the leader on Wednesday did not advise admitting him to hospital.

Annoyed over Mehta’s response, Sibal said he is withdrawing the plea and he was “surprised that this government does not want to give a sterile environment to a person”.

“Okay, the application is dismissed as withdrawn,” the judge said, adding “this attitude is not right. An advocate of such a stature is behaving like this.”



### CHANCELLOR MERKEL ARRIVES

## PM: Think of administrative services as service for poor

PRIME MINISTER Narendra Modi on Thursday urged civil service officials not to think of the administrative services as a career, but as a service for the poor. Referring to Mahatma Gandhi’s principle that any service should reach the last man standing, Modi urged officers to be “proactive and progressive”.

He was addressing a gathering of probationary civil services officers who had undergone a joint conference titled ‘Aarambh’ in Gujarat’s Kevadia for over a week. The Prime Minister was visiting Kevadia as part of the Rashtriya Ekta Diwas or National Unity Day celebrations.

With the Statue of Unity — the giant statue of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel which also features in the logo of ‘Aarambh’, in the backdrop — Modi described the training conference as a “unique, integrated” course that brings together all civil services officers.

“So far, we have seen that some officers train in Mussoorie, some in Hyderabad. This is the first time that you all have gath-

ered in an integrated programme and been exposed to similar experts from the field of economics, administration and other important fields. This is truly the beginning of an integrated programme for the administrative services,” the Prime Minister said.

The video of his speech was put out by the BJP on its social media handle. Modi exhorted the probationary officers not to view the civil services as a career but draw inspiration from the works of Sardar Patel and Mahatma Gandhi to ensure development in their respective areas.

“You must come into this

system thinking of it as your service to the people. It is important to ensure that people do not think of you as officers sitting behind closed doors. Interacting with people and hearing them is extremely important. No one expects you to have an instant solution to problems but it is important to step into the field and check up on areas,” he said, quoting the example of Sardar Patel’s transformation of the Ahmedabad Municipality.

He also advised officials to follow Mahatma Gandhi’s principle of ‘antayodaya’.

“We must remember what Gandhi ji has said, that ‘any benefit given to the society must truly reach the last of the people’. You must always weigh each of your decisions on two parameters — whether it meets the aspirations and hopes of those people on the last rungs of society, and whether it meets the principles of unity and the sovereignty of the country. Your signatures can make a lot of difference on paper,” he said.

Emphasising on the need to reach out to people, Modi also laid importance on clearing the image of the bureaucracy as being “unapproachable”.

## Skewed vision of India’s history being imposed: Sonia

ACCUSING THE BJP government of equating “unity with uniformity”, Congress president Sonia Gandhi on Thursday said that a “skewed vision” of India’s history and society, along with falsehood and unscientific ideas are being imposed on people nowadays, arguing that all these are the “antithesis” of the “liberal, secular and democratic foundations” of India.

Addressing a gathering after presenting the Indira Gandhi Award for National Integration to noted environmentalist Chandi Prasad Bhatt, Sonia said national integration was one of Indira Gandhi’s many passions.

## CPI leader Gurudas Dasgupta dies at 83

ONE OF the prominent faces of trade union movements in the country, veteran CPI leader and former MP Gurudas Dasgupta died in Kolkata on Thursday following a prolonged illness. He was 83 and is survived by his wife and daughter.

West Bengal CPI secretary Swapan Banerjee announced his death in the morning. “He (Dasgupta) died at his home in Kolkata at 6 am. He was suffering from lung cancer for quite some time. Due to his poor health, he had relinquished party posts, though he continued to be a member of the na-

tional executive council of the CPI,” said Banerjee.

Earlier, Dasgupta was admitted to Tata Medical Centre where he was kept on the ventilator for some time. On Monday, he was released from the hospital and brought home.

A five-term parliamentarian since 1985, Dasgupta was elected to the Rajya Sabha three times and twice to the Lok Sabha from West Bengal. He was born on November 3, 1936, in Barishal district (now in Bangladesh) of undivided Bengal. After partition, he along with his parents and siblings moved to West Bengal.

He served as the president and general secretary of the undivided Bengal Provincial Students’

Federation in late ‘50s.

After the CPI split in 1964, which led to the formation of the Communist Party of India (Marxist), Dasgupta decided to stay with the parent party.

Later, he was shifted to the

of India’s many diversities and profoundly sensitive to its cultural traditions. “She was fiercely wedded to strengthening the bonds of political and cultural unity. ## In touch with BJP, Cong & NCP: Uddhav

INSISTING ON an “equal power sharing” formula with the BJP for government formation in Maharashtra, Shiv Sena chief Uddhav Thackeray on Thursday upped the ante by declaring that he was in touch with Congress and NCP as well, appearing to signal that he was prepared to explore other options.

The *Indian Express* learnt from Sena functionaries and legislators present at a meeting called to elect the party’s legislative leader that Uddhav said he wants “equal power sharing”, including for the CM’s post, “as was decided before the Lok Sabha polls” with BJP.

“The equal power sharing formula was decided before Lok Sabha polls between me, (BJP national president) Amit Shah and Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis. We want things to be as was decided and nothing more than that,” Uddhav said at the meeting.

The Sena chief also remarked that no one could make a “permanent claim” on the CM chair. “I am in touch with BJP, Congress and NCP,” said Uddhav.

As if to drive the point home, on Thursday evening, Sena leader and MP Sanjay Raut met NCP chief Sharad Pawar. Describing it as “courtesy visit”, Raut told *The Indian Express*, “I keep meeting Pawarsaheb... This time, I went to greet him on Diwali.”

Asked whether the Sena was looking for support from the NCP to form the government, Raut refused to divulge the nature of discussions between the two. He, however, said: “I think our party chief has already made things clear... he has clearly said that all options are open...”

On senior Congress leader Prithviraj Chavan’s remarks that the party was waiting for a proposal from the Sena, Raut said Uddhav had already clarified who he was in touch with.

At the meeting on Thursday, Uddhav is also said to have expressed his displeasure over Fadnavis’ remarks that no equal power sharing formula was decided ahead of the Lok Sabha polls

and asked Sena legislators to watch a video of the chief minister addressing the media in February after forging the alliance with Sena. “He can be seen talking about equal power sharing formula. We just want them to keep their word,” said Uddhav.

A senior leader said the BJP was trying to convey the impression that the Sena chief was lying. “It is not acceptable to us. How can they show our leader in bad light? So, Uddhav clearly said that the Sena has other options open, including that of the NCP and the Congress.”

Meanwhile, an editorial in Sena mouthpiece Saamana said that Fadnavis publicly used the word “equal power sharing” while addressing the media before the Lok Sabha polls. “Now, if anybody is saying that the CM post was not included, then we need to write new lessons of political science. Equal power sharing includes all,” it said.

It added that the BJP broke the alliance with Sena after its victory in the 2014 Lok Sabha polls under the leadership of Narendra Modi. “Now, the BJP has started another chapter after getting a similar victory in 2019, but we will not fall for it,” the editorial said.

“If anybody feels that the CM post is not a seat of power or it is not possible to share it, why is everyone across the country after such a non-significant post?” it asked.

### New rules final assault to decimate RTI: Congress chief

DAYS AFTER the government notified new RTI rules reducing the tenure of central and state information commissioners from five to three years and lowering their ranks, Congress president Sonia Gandhi Thursday termed the changes as the BJP government’s “final assault to decimate RTI”.

Sonia said the changes will “diminish” the office of the Information Commissioner, leaving it “at the mercy of the very government it is required to hold accountable”. The Congress chief said the Modi government has always viewed RTI as an “obstacle to enforcing their majoritarian agenda without being held accountable to people”.

“The BJP government has now launched its final assault to decimate RTI. To further erode and dilute its effectiveness, the Modi government has passed amendments which diminish the office of the Information Commissioner...” she said in a statement.

Sonia said the term of the Information Commissioners was fixed for five years under the 2005 law to ensure there was no executive interference. “Any official who allows the release of information against the government can now be swiftly removed or simply not continued in office. This will have a chilling effect on all Information Commissioners... By reducing the benefits for these important posts, the government has ensured no senior self-respecting official would agree to work under such monitored circumstances,” she said.



# FIR against Pehlu was a conspiracy: Gehlot

RAJASTHAN CHIEF Minister Ashok Gehlot on Thursday alleged that the FIR against dairy farmer Pehlu Khan and his sons was part of a conspiracy by the previous Vasundhara Raje government.

Talking to journalists in New Delhi a day after the Rajasthan High Court quashed the FIR for illegal transportation of cattle against Khan, his two sons and the owner of their pick-up truck, as well as the subsequent chargesheet which was filed against them, Gehlot said, “We welcome the judgment of the Rajasthan High Court. This is a classic example before the nation where a person named Pehlu was lynched by a mob. And when it became an issue, the then government and the police — rather than ensure punishment to those who were guilty and act impartially — did two things to save their skin: they filed a counter case of illegal transportation of cows against Pehlu Khan and his sons.”

“This was carried out as part of a planned conspiracy so that the real culprits get away; this

was the *chaal* (trick) of the then government and the police administration. They also filed a challan — we had just formed a government — and (and a challan was filed) within ten days; no one came to know because they had planned the conspiracy beforehand. Hence, they quietly filed a challan in the court, on December 31 [2018],” Gehlot said.

“Pehlu Khan is not in the world anymore but he has become a symbol of mob lynching - whenever there’s mob lynching in the country, the judiciary, bureaucracy, police and common people will remember Pehlu Khan. And it is the duty of Rajasthan Police to ensure justice to Pehlu Khan’s family and the guilty are punished. We want to ensure this,” he said.

# Stay calm, irrespective of SC order: RSS to cadres

THE RSS has asked its cadres to stay calm after the Supreme Court passes a verdict in the Ayodhya case. Many programmes of RSS and its affiliates which were scheduled between November 10 and 20 have either been cancelled or postponed and leaders have been asked to remain at their headquarters.

The verdict in the case is expected before Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi retires on November 17.

According to sources, at the annual Diwali meeting of the Sangh at Bhubaneswar, several RSS leaders addressed coordination meetings at the regional level and asked swayamsevaks to remain calm irrespective of the Supreme Court’s verdict because “miscreants” may “exploit” the situation to “discredit” the organisation.

The cadres have also been asked to maintain restraint and caution while posting on social

media platforms after the judgment. Leaders of RSS units in districts near Ayodhya have already held meetings to convey this to swayamsevaks.

Among the programmes of RSS affiliates that have been cancelled is the Bhartiya Majdoor Sangh’s national officebearers’ meeting which was scheduled in Hardwar from November 15 to 17. Vidya Bharti has postponed by 10 days its All India Science Fair in Kanpur, which was to begin on November 20.

A source in Vidya Bharti said, “Prior to the national fair, science fairs were to be held at state level starting November 10. We have postponed all of them.”

An RSS meeting scheduled in Varanasi from November 9 to 10 where RSS sah-sarkaryavah V Bhagaiah was the main guest has also been cancelled.

On October 23, RSS sah-sarkaryavah Dattatreya Hosabale addressed a coordination meeting of top functionaries of the Sangh’s eastern UP unit in Lucknow. A source who attended the meeting told *The Indian*

*Express*, “Datta ji told us to be calm on social media as well. Whether the judgment is in our favour or not, we should accept it and then decide on the next strategy. But if there is disturbance in the society after the judgment, it will go against us and our governments in the state and the Centre.”

Cadres, it is learnt, have also been told that they must not hold any celebrations if the judgment is “favourable”.

A senior pracharak who addressed some coordination meetings in the districts surrounding Ayodhya told *The Indian Express*, “I told them that in case we win, we must not be over-enthusiastic and if we lose, we must remain calm.”

Another senior pracharak of RSS in Bihar said, “We are also convincing sants that the only thing we may do if the judgment is favourable is bhajan and Ramcharitmanas path at our temples. Nothing else.”

The RSS issued a statement on Wednesday, stating that “everyone should accept” the Supreme Court verdict with an “open mind”.

# ‘Mob lynchings are not just happening in Jharkhand... should not be made political agenda’

Jharkhand Chief Minister **RAGHUBAR DAS** speaks to **ABHISHEK ANGAD** on incidents of lynching and the upcoming state polls. Excerpts:

**During our reportage, we found out that the most vulnerable sections of the society are not getting the benefit of Central schemes.**

All such schemes have been implemented as per the 2011 Census. I am aware of what you have mentioned. I frequently speak to people and it will be addressed. By 2022, nobody will be left homeless, but this will not happen quickly. It will take time.

**You have said the government has focused on roads, electricity and water. At Maspera, Sundarpahari, in Godda, ill people are being carried to hospitals on cots because there is no road. Water scarcity has been the biggest problem of the state capital during summer. You once said you will provide 24x7 electricity, that has not happened...**

A government needs at least 10 years to complete its work. I am not saying Ram Rajya has come. At Sundarpahari, the local MLA is from JMM. What did they do? On electricity, I was misquoted. I had said electricity will reach every village... it has reached 30 lakh more houses in the last five years — compared to 39 lakh in the last 14 years... It will take time. Regarding water, we have started conservation. There is no scarcity of water, but it has to be managed well...

**The government put thrust on Momentum Jharkhand. What is the total investment that came in?**

Work worth Rs 72,000 crore is going on in sectors like power, food processing and textiles. In the coming years, Jharkhand will become a textile hub. Garments are being exported to European countries over the past two years. Now footwear will be manufactured in Jharkhand.

**But how much is the business it is generating worth?**



You think only if it is big business. My focus is on MSMEs because I have to end poverty and MSMEs are the spine of the economy.

**You have created land banks where the government acquired uncultivated and common land to attract investment. Many have criticised this and said the tribals or villagers were not spoken to.**

These are people who are anti-development and do not want growth of the poor. When I conduct choupals, I ask people did the government take the land? The answer is in the negative. It is the government’s land. So, land mafia and anti-development people are having a stomach ache. People who took away land are now talking about land rights now. Look at the violation of Chotanagpur Tenancy Act and Santhal Pargana Tenancy Act by the Soren family.

**Mob violence has become a nuisance in Jharkhand. Recently, a Christian tribal in Khunti and Tabrez Ansari in Saraikela, who was made to chant Jai Shri Ram, died. In the last three years, 21 deaths happened due to child-lifting rumours and on the suspicion of cow slaughter or**

# HC admits Facebook plea against globally blocking content

THE DELHI High Court on Thursday admitted an appeal by Facebook against a single judge’s order directing social media platforms to take down, block or disable on a global basis links to a video containing defamatory allegations against yoga guru Ramdev. The court has fixed December 7 as the date for the final hearing.

A bench of Justice S Muralidhar and Justice Talwant Singh said that it hopes that the arguments would conclude on December 7. The

bench also clarified that it would not be passing any interim order, putting on hold the single judge’s October 23 direction, since the ap-

peal was listed for final hearing.

Facebook, represented by senior advocate Kapil Sibal, submitted that it should direct Ramdev not to initiate contempt action against it while the appeal was pending. The counsel appearing for Ramdev assured that no contempt action would be initiated against the social media platform.

The single judge’s direction had come on a suit filed by Ramdev, who has sought global blocking of videos on social media platforms - Facebook, Google, its subsidiary YouTube, and Twitter - which contain defamatory, disparaging and threatening statements against

him and Patanjali Ayurved Ltd.

None of the platforms have any objection to blocking the URLs (Uniform Resource Locator) and disabling the same, insofar as access in India is concerned. However, they raised objections to removal/blocking/disabling the content on a global basis.

But the single judge order on October 23 directed the social media platforms “to take down, remove block, restrict/disable access, on a global basis, to all such videos/weblinks/URLs” which have been uploaded from Internet Protocol (IP) addresses within India against Ramdev.

## In MGNREGA plan, govt focus on water conservation

IN VIEW of its ambitious target to provide tapwater connections to all rural households by 2024, the government will now focus on source sustainability through river rejuvenation and water harvesting works under the MGNREGA scheme.

The Ministry of Rural Development has asked states to focus on works related to water conservation while preparing the MGNREGA labour budget for the 2020-21 financial year.

Issuing guidelines for planning works and preparation of labour budget under the MGNREGA, the ministry has said there should be a “special focus on water harvesting and water conservation, including river rejuvenation”.

According to sources, special emphasis will be laid on water conservation in 2,129 identified rural blocks, 1,593 of which are water-stressed. In such blocks, the maximum amount of labour budget will be spent on management of natural resources, including water conservation.

Water conservation works will be taken up in the convergence with central government-funded schemes such as

He also imposed a fine of Rs 10,000 on the trio. The magistrate later allowed petitions from the convicts and suspended the sentence for 15 days to enable them to file appeal. **PTI**

# Disquiet on streets, new L-Gs take oath at low-key events

AMID SHUTDOWN and anger in the Valley, Girish Chandra Murmu and R K Mathur became the first Lieutenant Governors of the Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh, respectively, as the state of J&K was officially bifurcated on Thursday.

The oath ceremony was a low-key affair with only top civil and security officials in attendance. While the media was kept at bay, most of the mainstream political leaders stayed away from the function at Raj Bhawan in Srinagar.

Sardar Patel's birth anniversary was chosen as the day to integrate Jammu and Kashmir with the Union of India as the country celebrates October 31 as the National Unity Day. While the government had earlier decided against celebrations, several events were held in Kashmir for the first time to commemorate the birth anniversary of Patel, who is seen as the force behind the integration of princely states with the Union of India. Police and civil administration installed 12x18-inch portraits of Patel across government offices, organised the Run for Unity and took pledges to uphold the unity and integrity of the country.

Justice Gita Mittal, the Chief Justice of the High Court for Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh, administered the oath of office and secrecy to Lt Governors Mathur and Murmu at low-key events in Leh and then in Srinagar, respectively.

J&K's Chief Secretary B V R Subrahmanyam read the Warrant of Appointment at the function in Srinagar attended by former advisors, top civil and security officials and high court judges. While most mainstream political leaders and workers are under detention, those who are out gave the event a miss. The only exceptions were BJP leaders and PDP Rajya Sabha member Nazir Ahmad Laway, who attended the event.

News agencies ANI and PTI, besides Doordarshan, were the only ones allowed to cover the event.

# ‘Everybody can sense mood... state lost its identity today’

AS THE first Lieutenant Governor of the new Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir took oath in Srinagar, the Kashmir Valley observed a complete shutdown on Thursday as it watched the state's transition into a UT amid tight security and partial communication lockdown.

Street vendors stayed off the roads in Srinagar and private traffic was also thin as restrictions continued for the 88th consecutive day. Over the last three days, shops and business establishments have remained shut even in the morning hours — they opened for a few hours in the morning in the weeks before.

"This is for the first time in the history of country that a state has been downgraded. People even today don't understand how things are going to change on ground because it is the first of its sort in the history of India. Three months have passed and so far we have seen only business

bleeding," said Sheikh Aashiq, president of Kashmir Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KCCI), who was not invited to the Lt Governor's swearing-in ceremony even as his Jammu counterpart Rakesh Gupta attended the event on Thursday.

"As a Kashmiri and president of KCCI, I want to say only one thing that today they say history has been created... but on the ground there is a complete shutdown, shops are closed and traffic is off the roads. This is how a Kashmiri person is reacting to the decision... I feel everyone is disappointed."

Professor Noor Baba, a political expert in Srinagar, believes the "unilateral action" by the government has "humiliated" and "hurt" people in the Valley. "They are disappointed and they feel humiliated because of the unilateral action that the government of India has taken. People are on protest without any call by anyone. The action has been imposed on people from above and people were not taken on board. Delhi is saying that it is a good decision, but this state-

ment should have come from the people in Kashmir," he said. "Everybody can sense the mood... We are seeing the longest continuous shutdown. There is no transport, schools and colleges are not functioning the way they should... all this is coming from people as a reaction," Baba said.

J&K High Court advocate Naseem Qadri said the government's decision has evoked a feeling that "something has been snatched from the people". "Everyone in Kashmir has the same opinion today because it is visible as there is a complete shutdown... No one here is happy with the bifurcation of the state and scrapping of the special status. I feel something has been snatched from us," he said, adding "the state has lost its identity today".

Mohammad Barjees, an MBBS student from Srinagar, said, "The Centre has been running the affairs of the state for some time now. But has it changed anything? No... this is the saddest day of my life."

# Delhi to Brussels, ties of two groups behind EU MPs’ trip go way back

THE INDIVIDUALS behind the non-profits Women's Economic and Social Think Tank (WESTT) and International Institute for Non-Aligned Studies (IINS) that invited and sponsored, respectively, a European Union delegation's visit to Kashmir, go back several years.

WESTT founder Madi Sharma, a British citizen, the founder of Madi Group and a member of the European Economic and Social Committee, had hosted a roundtable when IINS Director-General Dr Pramila Srivastava visited Brussels to raise awareness about the Indian education system in April 2015.

Pramila is also the chairman of the Srivastava Group, and Sharma's website (www.madisharma.org) features an undated testimonial of the group's vice-chairman, Ankit Srivastava, addressing her as

"Dearest Madi (Auntji)" and underlining how "all of us at Srivastava Group and *New Delhi Times* appreciate you and all your work in the promotion of entrepreneurship, human rights and towards empowering others".

The IINS, a think tank, was founded in 1980 by Pramila's husband Govind Narain Srivastava. More than a decade later, he launched the *New Delhi Times* newspaper (Ankit Srivastava, Govind Narain's son, is currently its editor-in-chief). The co-founders of New Delhi Times Ltd were Pramila, Govind Narain's brother Rakesh and the late Tamil Nadu leader, Vazhappady K Ramamurthy, according to records accessed by *The Indian Express*. Ramamurthy, who died in 2002, served as Union Minister of Petroleum in the Atal Bihari Vajpayee-led NDA government.

The IINS, *New Delhi Times*, besides other Srivastava Group companies, share a Safdarjung Enclave address in New Delhi. The Srivastava Group also has a Belgium address — 37, Square de

meus, Brussels 1000 — which it shares with *EP Today*, a self-proclaimed "monthly news magazine for the European Parliament", that last month earned EU censure. While the Srivastava Group lists *New Delhi Times* among its group entities, it does not mention *EP Today*.

Sharma, who describes herself as "Social Capitalist, International Business Broker, Education Entrepreneur" and speaker, has written for *New Delhi Times* variously as 'EU Correspondent' and 'Founder, WESTT'. On September 14, her article 'Why demolishing Article 370 is both a victory and a challenge for Kashmiri women' appeared on *EP Today* website. On her website, Sharma says 'Madi' stands for 'Make a Difference Ideas'.

Earlier this month, *EP Today* was in the news after EUvsDisinfo, a non-profit group funded by the EU, flagged it for targeting members of the European Parliament and other policymakers with media content critical of Pakistan and drawn mostly from Russia-

owned television network RT. According to the non-profit, the European Parliament contacted *EP Today* this September regarding the unauthorised use of the institution's name and suggested ways to rectify the situation and stop misleading the public.

Following EUvsDisinfo's reports, the Facebook page of *EP Today* was taken down and its Twitter account permanently suspended. The website (www.eptoday.com) remains active.

Four days after it carried Sharma's article on the scrapping of special status for Jammu and Kashmir, *EP Today* skipped a plenary event of September 18 where Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) criticised the curfew and information blackout in Kashmir by the Indian government. It then went on to publish separate articles quoting MEPs Ryszard Czarnecki and Fulvio Martusciello attacking Pakistan. Both Czarnecki and Martusciello were part of the EU delegation to Kashmir.

# Shah: Art 370 move fulfilled Patel's dream

FLAGGING OFF the Run for Unity on the occasion of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's 144th birth anniversary, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said the scrapping of Jammu and Kashmir's special status under Article 370 had fulfilled Patel's "incomplete dream".

"By scrapping the Article 370 and 35A, PM (Narendra) Modi made Kashmir a part of India and fulfilled Sardar Patel's incomplete dream," Shah said. "Patel united more than 500 princely states when the world believed that India would break into pieces af-

ter independence," he added.

Patel did not receive the recognition he deserved such as Bharat Ratna or a monument honouring him, said Shah. "To illuminate Patel's achievements, PM Modi got built the tallest statue in the world."

Shah also said Article 370 and 35A had become conducive to the spread of terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir. "Article 370 and 35A had become a gateway to the entry of terrorism and Modi has closed this deadly gateway," he said.

Present at the event were hundreds of personnel from Delhi Police, paramilitary personnel, students, sportspersons and government officials.

# Radio Kashmir is now AIR

AT 5.53 am Thursday, the announcement "yeh *akashvani ka Jammu kendra hai*" marked a transition for Radio Kashmir Jammu and Radio Kashmir Srinagar. The two radio stations, which had been established to counter anti-India propaganda by Pakistan on Kashmir, will now be known as AIR Jammu and AIR Srinagar, respectively.

Radio Kashmir Jammu was set up on December 1, 1947, by Maharaja Hari Singh, and Radio Kashmir Srinagar on July 1, 1948. The former was the first to come up in independent India, said official sources. Both these radio stations remained with the state government headed by Hari Singh until 1952, and later

merged with All India Radio.

India's first Deputy Prime Minister Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, who held portfolios of Home and Information and Broadcasting, allowed both these radio stations to operate under their original nomenclature — Radio Kashmir Jammu and Radio Kashmir Srinagar — as this helped in countering Pakistani propaganda over the radio from Muzaffarabad opposite Kashmir valley and Tralhad opposite Poonch. This was done to showcase that the "real J&K" was situated on the Indian side of the LoC, an official said.

Sunil Kumar Chaku, head of AIR Jammu, said the name was changed with effect from October 31 following a decision by Prasar Bharti. Everything else, including the programmes and working of the station, remain the same, he said.

# MEA: EU MPs’ visit not to internationalise but to share India’s perspective

IN THE first official comments to counter criticism over the controversial visit of Members of European Parliament to Jammu and Kashmir, the Ministry of External Affairs on Thursday said a clear distinction has to be made between "sharing India's perspective" and "internationalising the issue".

MEA spokesperson Raveesh Kumar said these MEPs had "expressed a keen desire" to see the situation on the ground, and their statements clearly reflected that they got an understanding of "how terrorism affects India, and how terrorism affects Kashmir".

Kumar said it was sort of a "familiarisation visit" for these MEPs, who were from different political parties and countries.

Responding to criticism that the visit was organised by private organisations, the MEA spokesperson said that there are

many visits by several foreign dignitaries which take place through non-official channels. "It is not necessary that such visits take place only through official channels," he said, pointing to the recent visit of former US Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, who was in India at the invitation of a think tank.

The visit of the European parliamentarians was not ceding of ground on Kashmir, he said, adding that it was important to see whether such an engagement serves larger national interests.

He also countered the criticism that the visit by EU MPs to Kashmir was internationalisation of the issue, as he said that a clear distinction has to be made between "sharing India's perspective" and "internationalising the issue".

A team of 23 MEPs travelled to Kashmir on Tuesday on a two-day trip for a first-hand assessment of the situation after the state's special status was revoked in August.

In 4-5 years, Kashmir became a popular work destination for residents of Bahlalnagar and neighbouring villages. In the last two decades, the number of people who flocked to Kashmir reached 400.

# Blackmailed and sexually abused by neighbour, girl killed mother, say police

A RELATIONSHIP that took an unexpected turn led to blackmail and murder, and finally the arrest of three people, all residents of the same locality here, police said.

The details came to light during the investigation into the murder of a woman, whose decomposed body was found on the railway tracks on the outskirts of Hyderabad on October 21. The woman's daughter and her boyfriend, both college students, and their neighbour have been arrested. The daughter and neighbour have been charged with murder, while the two men have been charged under POCOA.

Police officials said that the woman was strangled to death by her daughter under the instructions of and with help from the neighbour. "He was blackmailing and sexually exploiting

the girl," an official said.

"The girl was in a relationship with a boy from the same locality. Last September, the girl, who was then a minor, got pregnant. The boyfriend sought the neighbour's help... After the abortion, the neighbour began blackmailing her for sex... He forcibly took photos of her and demanded Rs 10 lakh... He threatened to reveal the photos to her boyfriend... When the neighbour heard that the mother owned land... he started pressuring the girl to kill her so that the land could be sold and he could get the money," the official said.

On October 19, the girl allegedly threw chili powder into her mother's eyes. The neighbour knocked her down and the teen strangled her with a chunni. The neighbour then returned to his house while the girl went to her boyfriend's house.

"(The girl and her neighbour) tried to hang the body to make it look like suicide. But the body had

started decomposing, so they wrapped it in a blanket and on October 21, took it to Ramanapet and dumped it on railway tracks. The Government Railway Police found the body, and cremated it the next day as they could not identify it," an official said.

On October 24, her father, a truck driver, returned home and found it locked. When he called up his daughter, she said she was at Visakhapatnam, and feigned ignorance about the whereabouts of her mother.

While police started investigating, the boyfriend's father visited the girl's father and mentioned that she was at his house for three days. Suspecting something amiss, the girl's father called up the police and told them she had lied about her whereabouts. The police then took her into custody and interrogated her. It was then that she revealed the story, police said.

TWO MEN were arrested on Thursday for trying to bury alive a newborn girl, police said.

"An old man held something wrapped in a cloth while the other one was digging a small pit. I shouted at them to stop and suspected something was wrong and called the police," Kumar said.

The accused duo told the police they were digging a pit to bury a stillborn baby.

"When we confronted them,

one of them said they were from Karimnagar and that his daughter-in-law had given birth to a still-born at a hospital in Secunderabad and they were trying to bury it. Suddenly, the baby moved her hands and legs and wailed," said a police officer.

"They did not want a girl child so they decided to kill her by burying her alive. They were arrested on the spot," said the officer.

# MEA: Those not part of Indian jatha, Pak invitees will need clearance

THOSE NOT part of India's official delegation to Gurdwara Darbar Sahib through the Kartarpur Corridor will have to take political clearance as per the normal procedure, the Ministry of External Affairs said on Thursday amid reports of Pakistan inviting cricketer-turned-politician Navjot Singh Sidhu for an inaugural event of the corridor.

India's jatha, the list of which has been shared with Pakistan, includes personalities from different sides of the political spectrum, including Union ministers and those from the Punjab government, MEA spokesperson Raveesh Kumar said.

Asked if Sidhu's name was on the list, he did not give a direct answer and said those who are not on the list know that they have to take political clearance. "There will be no surprises," he said referring to the list of 575 people who will be part of the inaugural jatha.

"Those whom Pakistan wants to invite and who want to go in future, they have to take the normal political clearance as is required for a visit to a foreign country," he said.

As per the normal procedure, a political visit needs clearance from the government.

Former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, Punjab Chief Minister Amarinder Singh and Union Minister Hardeep Puri are among the 575 people who will be part of the inaugural jatha to Gurdwara Darbar Sahib, Central government sources had said.

Kumar also said the Indian side has shared a list of 480 people for a visit to Nankana Sahib, the birthplace of Guru Nanak and sought visas for them.

Pakistan is also yet to respond to the proposal made by India to enhance the number of pilgrims visiting on the occasion of 'Gurpur' on November 12, under the 1974 Protocol, to 10,000 instead of the regular 3,000, he said.

## Pak violated Vienna Convention in Jadhav case: ICJ to UNGA

PAKISTAN VIOLATED its obligations under the Vienna Convention in the arrest and detention of Indian national Kulbushan Jadhav, International Court of Justice (ICJ) President Judge Abdulqaw Yusuf told the UN General Assembly here.

Jadhav, 49, a retired Indian Navy officer, was sentenced to death by a Pakistani military court on charges of "espionage and terrorism" after a closed trial in April 2017. India has maintained that Jadhav was kidnapped from Iran where he had business interests after retiring from the Navy.

Presenting the ICJ's report to the 193-member General Assembly on Wednesday, Yusuf said in its judgment of July 17, the principal judicial organ of the UN "found that Pakistan had violated its obligations under Article 36 of the Vienna Convention and that appropriate remedies were due in this case."

In a major victory for India, the ICJ had ruled that Pakistan must review the death sentence given to Jadhav. India had argued that consular access was being denied to its national in violation of the 1963 Vienna Convention on Consular Relations.

The bench led by Yusuf had ordered an "effective review and reconsideration of the conviction and sentence of Kulbushan Sudhir Jadhav."

# Woman raped by relative, husband killed in MP

Bhopal: A woman was allegedly raped by a distant relative and her husband was murdered by an accomplice in a village in Madhya Pradesh's Vidisha district on Monday, police said on Thursday. Both the accused have been arrested and sent to judicial custody, they added.
