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Andhra govt ends Amaravati project with Singapore consortium

THE YSRCP government in Andhra Pradesh has scrapped the previous TDP government's Start-up Area Development Project, covering an area of 6.84 sq km, in the state capital of Amaravati.

In January 2018, then Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu had awarded the development rights for the start-up area to a Singapore consortium and its Indian partners. Work was yet to begin on the project, to be developed in phases over 20 years.

A government order issued on Monday night said the agreement with the Singapore consortium to develop the green-field start-up area had been terminated, and orders had been issued to the AP Capital Region Development Authority (CRDA) not to proceed with the project.

It said the government, "after careful examination of the matter", had granted "approval to refrain from proceeding further in the Start-up Area Development Project of 6.84 sq km and in

NINETEEN DAYS after Maharashtra's fractured verdict produced no clear winner in the Assembly elections, the state was placed under President's Rule Tuesday evening after President Ram Nath Kovind gave his assent to the Union Cabinet's approval of the Governor's recommendation.

The Raj Bhavan move came shortly after the Shiv Sena, which parted ways with ally BJP over who should lead the government and tried unsuccessfully to stitch an alliance with support from rivals NCP and Congress, approached the Supreme Court, challenging the Governor's decision not to grant it three more days to demonstrate its majority. The matter will be mentioned for hearing Wednesday.

The Congress called Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari's move a "grave travesty" and "mockery" of the Constitutional process. A day earlier, NCP leaders, after meeting Koshyari, said he had given them time until 8.30 pm Tuesday to express "willingness and ability" to form the government.

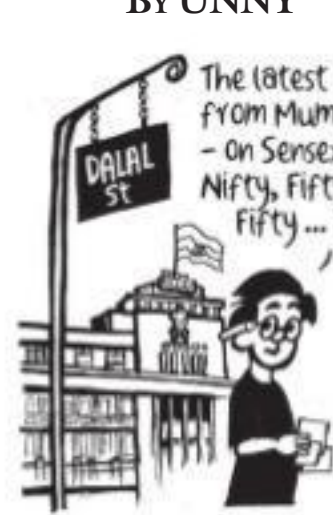

Credit growth slows to a crawl in both industry and services

REFLECTING THE sluggishness in industrial activity, growth in bank credit to industries slowed to 2.7 per cent in September — the lowest in the last 12 months. This is after having recovered earlier this year to hit a four-and-a-half-year high of 6.9 per cent in April 2019.

Data released by Reserve Bank of India showed that gross

bank credit, too, expanded by just 8.2 per cent in September — the lowest in 22 months. Gross bank credit witnessed double digit year-on-year growth in each of the months between April 2018 and July 2019.

Importantly, the services sector, which led to the revival of credit growth and was witnessing the highest economic activity, is also witnessing a continuing slowdown in credit demand.

BRICS meet begins today, host Brazil's envoy says J&K internal issue

AS PRIME Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday headed to Brazil for the 11th BRICS summit on November 13-14, Brazil's ambassador to India, André Aranha Corrêa do Lago, said Brazil supports India's stand that Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) is an "internal issue".

Asked if the government's decision on J&K would be part of the discussions, he said, "I don't believe so".

In an interview to *The Indian Express*, he said: "I think that the key to the strength of BRICS is to keep looking for consensus on complex issues. And also to make sure that we respect each other's differences... We are very different. Some countries are more democratic than others, some countries are growing more than others, some countries are in the (United Nations) Security Council. So we have to respect (that). We don't want to bring to BRICS issues that are already being discussed in the appropriate context, so it really has to be a group that goes into an exercise

Taekwondo player shot dead by man she refused to marry

A 25-YEAR-OLD state-level taekwondo player was Tuesday shot dead by a man after she rejected his marriage proposal. Police said they had lodged two FIRs against the man in the past five months after the woman alleged he had assaulted and threatened her. He was arrested after the first FIR was filed on June 17, but was later released on bail.

The victim, Sarita Dhandhi, had competed in state-level events and was pursuing a bachelor's degree in physical education from Gurgaon. Preet Pal, ACP (Crime), said Dhandhi met the accused, Sombir Singh (27), a former wrestler, six years ago in Rohtak, while she was training for a state-level competition.

On Tuesday, Singh reached Dhandhi's house around 4 am with a country-made pistol.

"She was sleeping but he barged into her bedroom and held a gun to her head, asking her to marry him. Her mother tried

to intervene, but he threatened her as well and asked her to convince Dhandhi to get married to him. When Dhandhi refused, he shot her in the chest," a senior police officer said. "He escaped by jumping the wall of their house."

Dhandhi lived with her parents, two sisters and a younger brother in Bhora Khurd village in Bilaspur. Her father died few months ago. Police said Dhandhi, who had won five state-level competitions from Rohtak, wanted to become a coach and was looking for a job.

ACP Pal said they first received a call from a villager. "We went to the spot and saw blood

outside the victim's house. The neighbours told us she had been rushed to the Rockland Hospital in Manesar, where doctors declared her dead. Her mother accused Singh of the crime."

Police said Singh knew the woman since they had previously trained at the same institute in Rohtak six years ago. On June 17, she had filed a case of criminal intimidation against him. He was then arrested and later released on bail. "On August 23, he again went to the woman's house and asked her to marry him, but she and her parents refused as he was unemployed. He then attacked the woman and threatened her. Dhandhi again filed a complaint and a case of criminal intimidation and assault was registered at Bilaspur police station, but he was not arrested," said a police officer.

"Singh hails from Jhajjar and his parents had filed a missing persons report about him a few months ago at Badli police station. For the past year, the man had been harassing the woman and her family; he wanted her to accept his proposal," said Pal.

Woman strangled in hotel room

A 33-YEAR-OLD woman was strangled to death, allegedly by a 21-year-old man, at an OYO hotel room in North Delhi's Alipur after she asked him to marry her, said police.

Police said the woman lived with her husband and two chil-

dren at Khara Kalan village, and had been in touch with the accused for about two years.

"She had checked into the hotel with him on Monday to celebrate his birthday. While they were consuming alcohol, an argument ensued. He allegedly assaulted her and she lost consciousness," an officer said.

Police said he allegedly strangled her and fled the hotel, leav-

ing her body in the room.

"With the help of CCTV footage, police found the accused," an officer said. He told police he met the woman online two years ago, and that he was unwilling to marry her.

An OYO spokesperson said: "Since the matter is under investigation, we are cooperating with the authorities and providing all possible support."

Govt begins recruiting more docs for mohalla clinics

THE DELHI government has started the process of hiring doctors for recently inaugurated mohalla clinics in the capital. Currently, around 300 doctors are empanelled with the health department to work in the health centres. The department has invited applications from across the city to fill 200 posts.

As per guidelines, the remuneration for each empanelled doctor is Rs 40 per patient registered, with a minimum assured guarantee of 75 patients per day,

to be calculated on a monthly basis.

"We've begun interviews to hire doctors for the clinics. The doctors are mostly from the private set-up, and will be paid Rs 40 per patient. The minimum qualification for hiring of any doctor is an MBBS degree," said Dr Shalley Kamra, State Nodal Officer, Delhi government.

Last month, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal had inaugurated 100 new mohalla clinics in the city, taking the total number of health centres to 301. At the time, the CM had said the government is planning to open one mohalla clinic every square kilo-

metre.

The government aims to set up 1,000 such clinics by the end of this year. As many as 1.69 crore patients have availed services from the health centres, and on an average, around 35,000-40,000 patients visit these clinics every day.

To meet the target, the government has also tweaked specifications for those willing to give their property on rent for the clinics.




The new set of guidelines will fix the maximum rent up to Rs 35,000. The minimum area for setting up the clinic has been reduced to 40 square metres.

"We have started the application process for that as well. Soon, more clinics will be set up in rented accommodations," said Dr Kamra.

In 2018, the government had given the responsibility of getting manpower to Maulana Azad Medical College, which was asked to chalk out a strategy to hire doctors and staff for the primary health centres.

Action against ex-BJP MP: HC won't intervene

THE DELHI High Court has refused to give direction to Delhi Police regarding action against former BJP MP Udit Raj, over allegations that he distributed metal tokens to unauthorised street vendors as a "licence to operate" in his constituency.

Udit Raj was a BJP MP from 2014 to 2019 from the North West Delhi Lok Sabha constituency. In April, he joined the Congress, after being denied a ticket from the BJP for the Lok Sabha elections.

A bench of Chief Justice D N Patel and Justice C Hari Shankar noted that the Delhi Police has already referred the matter to the police station concerned for necessary action and that the statement of several persons has also been recorded in this regard.

Observing that “we see no reason to further monitor this case”, the bench said, “If any illegality is found, action will be taken by the respondents (Delhi Police and authorities concerned) in accordance with law, rules, regulations and government policy against the persons who have committed illegality.”

The court noted that from the leader's affidavit in the matter, "it appears that the token distributed has nothing to do with the recovery of the money and the continuation of the illegal encroachment on the public road".

Taking note of this, the court disposed of a petition filed in 2017 by Parveen Kumar, a Delhi resident, alleging that he distributed metal tokens for Rs 250 each to unauthorised vendors,

ACCUSED STILL ON THE RUN

Faridabad family killer carried a knife and change of clothes

DAYS AFTER a man allegedly killed four members of a family inside their Faridabad home, police have found that the accused took a knife and an extra pair of clothes from his house before committing the crime. This has made police doubt a note left behind by the accused at his home, wherein he claimed that he had gone to rob the family and killed them because the plan fell apart.

"Though the note is an important evidence, we don't trust it entirely since we found that he carried a pair of extra trousers and a shirt before he visited the family home. He also took a knife from his home. He knew that there were CCTV cameras outside the

house... there is a possibility that the note was false and the accused, Mukesh, conspired to kill the family. We are ascertaining the reason," said a senior officer posted at Sector 8 police station.

On November 9, 65-year-old Dr Praveen Mediratta was found dead with a stab injury on his abdomen, at his X-ray clinic in the basement of his house. His wife, Sudesh (61), was found dead on

the first floor. Their daughter Priyanka (30) and her husband Saurabh (36) were found with deep cuts on their necks in another room, said police.

Police Sunday found a pair of blood-stained trousers outside the accused's house. Police said the accused is a gym trainer and was known to the victims through their son.

'Godman' booked over engineer suicide

THREE MONTHS after the suicide of a 27-year-old engineer in Ghaziabad, a self-styled godman has been booked for alleged abetment.

On August 20, Swapnil Singh allegedly jumped off the balcony from his seventh floor apartment in Mahagun Society.

His family told police that he had said *"Mujhe baba se milna hai*

(I want to meet the baba)" before jumping to his death. While the family did not wish to pursue police action in the case, they recently approached Vijay Nagar police station with fresh evidence.

“A self-styled godman named Manoj Kumar Sharma has been booked under IPC section 306 (abetment of suicide). It appears the family found Swapnil's links to Sharma, and believe his teachings allegedly pushed him towards suicide.

Teams are being sent to question Sharma and an arrest will be made accordingly...," said an officer from Vijay Nagar police station.

Police said Sharma hails from Rajasthan's Jhunjhunu area. Police have so far not found any evidence of Swapnil having met him in person. Staying in touch with him on WhatsApp, Swapnil would allegedly watch Sharma's videos on social media, claimed police. Police said the Cyber Cell is

working on data from his mobile and computer to gather more details of their association.

Swapnil's family told police that days before he committed suicide, he had become withdrawn and would not interact with family members.

He also visited Haridwar prior to his death, his family claimed, adding that his eating habits had changed and that he would speak to Sharma on WhatsApp for hours.

2How does your bank decide your home loan eligibility? Your bank will assess your repayment capacity while deciding the home loan eligibility. ABVP and Left on same page as JNU fee hike protest cuts across outfit loyalties

THE PROTEST against hostel fee hike at JNU has student outfits from across the political spectrum on the same page.

While the JNU Students' Union, led by all four Left organisations — Students' Federation of India, Democratic Students' Federation, All India Students' Association and All India Students' Federation — has been leading the protest, other outfits hold the same view.

The Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP), RSS's student wing, is opposing the fee hike, although they have criticised JNUSU's mode of protest. The ABVP will be holding a sit-in protest at the UGC office Tuesday.

"We believe education must be inclusive and affordable. The present fee hike in JNU is inappropriately high and this shall make higher education inaccessible to a large section of students in the present and future

too," said ABVP JNU unit secretary Manish Jangid. "However, the problem's root is the UGC which has stopped funds to the university. The JNUSU should work towards a solution to the problem, but they are protesting aimlessly," he added.

Congress students' wing National Students' Union of India has expressed its "unconditional solidarity and support" to the protests.

JNUSU councillor from NSUI Vishnu Prasad said the move is "outrightly exploitative and against the Nehruvian ethos and values on which honorable for-

mer PM Indira Gandhi established JNU".

"JNU used to be a university known for its progressive environment... We strongly condemn the fact that... all spaces of democracy, freedom of expression and thinking are being targeted and systematically destroyed," he said.

The BirsA Ambedkar Phule Students' Association has also spoken out against the fee hike and participated in JNUSU's calls for protest. In their pamphlet, BAPSA said JNU was among the "few public universities wherein educational cost and expenditure is affordable and viable to all marginalised communities".

The Chhatra Rashtriya Janata Dal slammed the move. Priyanka Bharti, a leader of the organisation, claimed, "We are continuously protesting against this fee hike. Yesterday, we even got beaten up by police, but we stood as most of the Bahujan students here and economically weaker sections will have to leave the campus (if the fee is hiked)."

NO FOOD IF MESS BILL NOT PAID

New Delhi: Residents of JNU's Sutej Hostel have been told to clear outstanding mess bills or they would not be given any food. "All residents are required to clear understanding mess dues till November 14, failing which food will be stopped the same day," mess warden Asheesh Kumar said in a notice dated November 8.

Kumar said the move had nothing to do with current protests over hike in hostel fee.

Official sources said 30-40% of the students had not paid the mess bill of around Rs 2,500 per month, and that the mess contractor was owed Rs 30 lakh, including for previous payments. **ENS**

Brainstorming over breakfast: As part of poll prep, Javadekar calls BJP leaders over

BREAKFAST WITH BJP's Delhi unit leaders is what Union Minister and Delhi assembly election in-charge Prakash Javadekar believes can lead to a harmonious relationship between them, and help develop a unified strategy for the polls.

Ever since he was put in charge of the election three months ago, Javadekar has been

holding regular breakfast meetings with top leadership of the city. The meetings are held whenever he's in the capital, at his Kushak Road residence around 9 a.m.

The core group includes Union Minister Harsh Vardhan, Delhi in-charge Shyam Jaju, Delhi co in-charge Tarun Chugh, state unit president Manoj Tiwari, Rajya Sabha MP Vijay Goel and leader of opposition in the Delhi assembly Vijender Gupta.

Sources said he has held 12 such meetings already, where

the party's agenda for the day, its response to issues that are making news, press conferences and protests that are to be held are discussed. A senior leader said, "These meetings are held so that there is clarity on the party's line."

Another leader present in one such meeting said that in the past few meetings, the discussions have revolved around the issue of unauthorised colonies and how the party will ensure that people know it was the BJP-ruled Centre that paved the way for regularising them.

The Union Cabinet last month approved a proposal to grant

ownership rights to people living in 1,797 unauthorised colonies — a move that is estimated to benefit 40 lakh people in the city.

Another senior leader said meetings are being held so that the top brass can resolve whatever differences crop up.

"There have been incidents where leaders have taken different stands on issues since the party line was not communicated properly," he said.

Party MPs and the state unit's top functionaries are also asked to join the meeting if the day's agenda needs their intervention or falls in their jurisdiction.

3 STAFFERS AMONG 4 HELD

Cheating probe leads police to Rashtrapati Bhavan staffers

A POLICE probe into a cheating case involving three Rashtrapati Bhavan staffers and a head constable has revealed that at least three of the 22 people duped on the pretext of a job were interviewed by the accused at a guesthouse inside the President's official residence last year.

According to the chargesheet, two of the accused, who were multi-tasking staffers, had posed as joint secretaries to dupe people. Police identified the accused as Moti Lal (36), who worked as a butler at the premises since 2006; staffers Monu Vaid (24) and Rahul Mishra; and Harendra Singh, posted with the VIP security unit headquarters of Delhi Police last year. The four were arrested after the case came to light.

"The incident came to light after the President's personal office staff received complaints of a fake job racket being operated by Rashtrapati Bhavan staffers. The arrest was made after one Satish Kumar lodged an FIR with South

Avenue police station, alleging that his son, nephew and 17 others were promised jobs at the President's official residence and allegedly cheated by the staffers," said a senior police officer.

The case was transferred to the Crime Branch's Inter-State Cell and the chargesheet was filed before a Delhi court a few days ago. "Lal told police that he met Vaid, who earlier worked at Gujarat Bhavan before getting a job as an MTS staffer at Rashtrapati Bhavan. Vaid was working at the Peacock guesthouse, while Mishra was working at guesthouse number 2. They all met Singh when he was posted at Rashtrapati Bhavan in a security unit. Vaid hatched the plan and with the help of his friend, posted at the Defence Research and Development Organisation Bhawan, they would dupe aspirants wanting an MTS job — taking Rs 8 lakh per candidate. Mishra, who has a BCom degree from Delhi University, is fluent in English, so they convinced him to be part of the gang," the police chargesheet claims.

Police claimed the complainant approached the gang

with Singh's help, and they assured jobs for his son and nephew. Others approached them as well, and they allegedly took Rs 30 lakh from them. "They told the complainant they would take Rs 4 lakh in advance and Rs 4 lakh after the candidate gets the job. Three persons, including Kumar's son Vivek Chaudhary, received a letter on May 22 last year to come for an interview on May 31. They entered Rashtrapati Bhavan from gate 17 in a private vehicle; Lal was sitting with them. Their interview was conducted at guesthouse number 2, where Vaid and Mishra were sitting, dressed in formals," the chargesheet further claims.

The investigation team, led by DCP (Crime) Rajesh Deo, found that after the interview, Lal allegedly took the three job aspirants to the President Estate Dispensary for a "medical examination". "They gave them 'appointment letters' on December 18 and asked to join on March 23 this year. The matter was exposed after Kumar's son went to join his posting, only to be told by security personnel that the letter was forged," said an officer.

Farm fires have 25% share as pollution reaches severe level

THE AIR quality in Delhi-NCR plummeted to 'severe' category yet again Tuesday as haze returned to the city. As per CPCB data, Delhi's AQI stood at 425 Tuesday, with PM 2.5 being the prominent pollutant. Ghaziabad recorded the worst AQI at 453, followed by Noida at 440 and Greater Noida at 436. Factors such as low surface level wind-speed, higher share of external pollutants and low temperatures contributed to conditions witnessed Tuesday.

As per SAFAR, stubble burning in Punjab and Haryana had 25% share in PM2.5 levels in Delhi Tuesday. Punjab has recorded the highest number of such cases at 48,683 so far.

Pollution control bodies say the situation is being closely monitored and further action would be taken if air quality dips to 'Severe+' or 'Emergency' category.

Sunita Narain, member of the Environment Pollution (Prevention and Control) Authority, told *The Indian Express*, "We've been told the situation would improve in 48 hours... Construction work, use of diesel gensets and bursting of firecrack-

ers have been banned. Odd-even will be in place tomorrow." She added a CPCB-led taskforce will meet Wednesday to discuss the future plan.

Meanwhile, authorities in Punjab said stubble burning cases have reduced in the past three-four days as most of the crop residue has already been burned. Punjab Agriculture Secretary Kahan Singh Pannu said, "We will figure out the reasons for rising farm fires and try to fix the issue."

Officials in the state agriculture department conceded that despite spending excessively on subsidies and awareness campaigns, "desired effects could not be yielded." An official said, "We need to think why farmers are not taking up subsidies." He said even an incentive of Rs 100 per quintal of paddy for straw management, directed by the apex court recently, has not attracted farmers.

Man nabbed for running emigration racket from Saudi Arabia

A 28-YEAR-OLD man was arrested after he allegedly helped six men forge emigration clearance stickers in Delhi, said police Tuesday. The incident took place in 2016 when the six men, who were boarding a flight to Dammam in Saudi Arabia, were caught carrying fake Protector of Emigrants (POE) clearances from the emigration department by police at IGI Airport.

Police said the men were arrested. They later told police they were unemployed and wanted to settle in Saudi Arabia. Police said they were helped by two agents and a man in Dammam, who guided them about the emigration clearance. Sanjay Bhatia, DCP (Airport) said the two agents along with one officer from the emigration department, who helped the men in forging the clearance stickers, were arrested in 2016.

"On Monday, the 28-year-old was caught at Lucknow Airport after he returned from Dammam. He was recognised after a lookout circular was issued in his name," said Bhatia.

The accused, Sher Ali, worked as a contractor in Saudi Arabia, and helped unemployed people get fake emigration clearances through his agents.

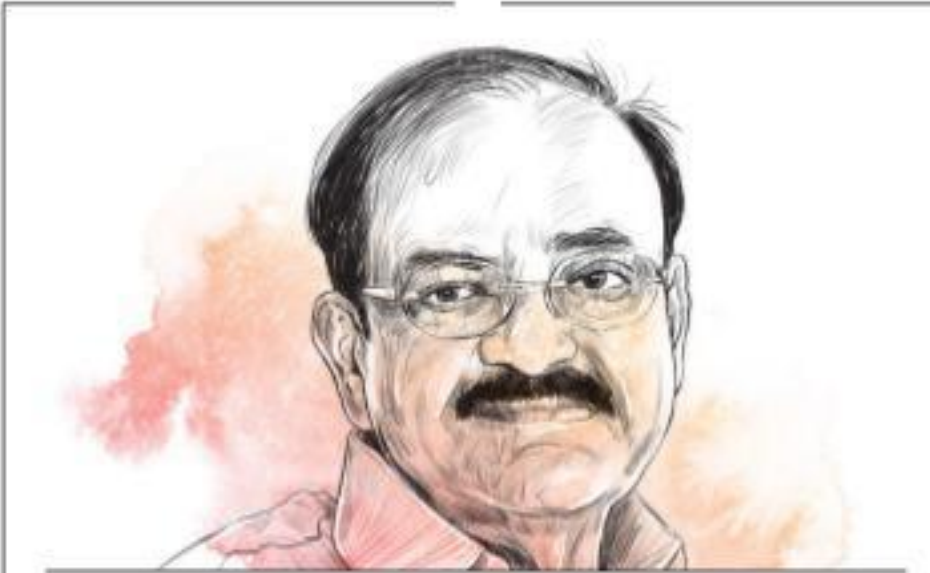

MODI LEAVES FOR BRICS SUMMIT

PM: Focus on economic ties, counter-terrorism

PRIME MINISTER Narendra Modi on Tuesday said that the BRICS summit will focus on strengthening ties among the world’s five major economies in key areas such as digital economy, science and technology, and also build mechanisms for counter-terrorism cooperation. Modi, who left for Brazil on Tuesday afternoon, will be in Brasilia on November 13-14 to attend the 11th BRICS summit.

The Prime Minister said he will also meet Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro to discuss ways to enhance the bilateral strategic partnership. “I look forward to exchanging views with other BRICS leaders with the aim to further strengthen intra-BRICS cooperation, particularly on the theme of the summit ‘Economic growth for an innovative future’,” Modi said in his departure statement. During the summit, the five

major economies of the world will aim to significantly strengthen their cooperation in science, technology and innovation, he said. The BRICS countries will also look to enhance coop-

eration on digital economy and build mechanisms for counter-terrorism cooperation within the BRICS framework, Modi said.

“Our business and industry play an important role in intra-BRICS ties. I will be addressing BRICS Business Forum and interacting with BRICS Business Council and New Development Bank,” he added.

On the bilateral meeting with the Brazilian President, he said Brazil and India share close and ever expanding bilateral relations, including in the spheres of defence, security, trade, agriculture, energy and space. Close cooperation between the two countries in multilateral forums has been a significant aspect of our strategic relationship, Modi said.

“BRICS summit will also provide me with the opportunity to hold useful bilateral interactions with leaders of other BRICS countries,” he added.

The PM is scheduled to hold separate bilateral meetings with Russian President Vladimir Putin and Chinese Premier Xi Jinping.

Bailable warrants against Tharoor for non-appearance in defamation case

A DELHI court has issued bailable warrants against Congress MP Shashi Tharoor after he failed to turn up for a court hearing in a defamation case.

Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Naveen Kumar Kashyap issued the bailable warrants with a sum of Rs 5,000 and notice to his surety for

November 27. The court took notice of the fact that Tharoor and his counsel did not turn up for the court hearing and no exemption application was filed for his non-appearance.

Kashyap also took note of the fact that the complainant in the case, Delhi BJP leader Rajiv Babbar and his main counsel, were also not present. The court noted that the exemption application filed on behalf of Babbar was “vague in nature”.

“It is stated in in the application that he is in personal difficulty, but what is such difficulty is not explained at all in such application. Further, his main counsel is not present. Still taking the lenient view instead of dismissing the present complaint for the reasons of non-appearance of complainant, he is burdened with a cost of Rs 500 to be deposited with DLSA, Central District Tis Hazari Court,” the court said.

AJSU fields nominees in same seats as ally BJP, says no going back

A DAY after the All Jharkhand Student’s Union (AJSU) Party announced candidates for 12 seats—in four of which ally BJP had declared its nominees —AJSU chief Sudesh Mahto on Monday asserted that they would not go back on their decision.

“We are strong in these 12 seats and will not go back. We have prepared for the election and are waiting for a response (from the BJP),” Mahto said at a press conference on Tuesday.

The BJP, meanwhile, said its course of action would be decided by the central leadership. BJP spokesperson Pradeep Sinha said, “We are in a wait and watch mode, and it depends on the central leadership now.”

A BJP leader who did not wish to be named said, “There are chances that the alliance could be over.”

Mahto made the announcement after returning from Delhi where, according to sources, no agreement on seat-sharing with the BJP could be reached.

Mahto had earlier told *The Indian Express* that he had indicated the party’s strength in 25 constituencies. Sources said AJSU had pitched for 17 seats.

The BJP announced candidates for 52 seats for the Jharkhand Assembly polls, following which ally AJSU declared candidates for 12 seats, including four where BJP had already named candidates. The four common seats are Sindri, Chakradharpur, Simaria and Mandu.

Chakradharpur is currently with Shashibhushan Samad of JMM. The seat was won by

Lakshman Giluwa, who is now the state BJP chief, in 2009. BJP has fielded Giluwa in Chakradharpur this time, while AJSU has nominated Ram Lal Munda.

Simaria was won by Jay Prakash Singh Bhogta of the JVM(P) in 2009, and by Ganesh Ganju of the same party in 2014. In 2015, Ganju and five other JVM(P) MLAs joined the BJP. The AJSU has now fielded Manoj Chandra from Simaria while the BJP has named Kishun Kumar Das.

Mandu was won by JMM’s Teklal Mahto in 2009. The party retained the seat in the 2011 by-poll, and in 2014. This time the AJSU has fielded Nirmal Mahto and BJP J P Patel.

For Sindri, the AJSU has fielded Sadanand Mahto and the BJP Indrajeet Mahto.

Two other seats — Chandankyari and Lohardaga — are another bone of contention between the allies. For Chandankyari seat, AJSU has announced the candidature of

E Concession hope after recent polls

FOLLOWING THE BJP’s less than expected performance in the recent Maharashtra and Haryana elections, AJSU seems to be hoping to extract concessions from its alliance partner in Jharkhand. AJSU chief Sudesh Mahto had earlier said that they had played the role of the opposition from within the government better than the actual opposition.

Umakant Rajak, who won the seat in 2009. In 2014, JVM(P)’s Amar Kumar Bauri won, and the following year he joined the BJP. The BJP is yet to announce its Chandankyari candidate for this year.

For Lohardaga, AJSU has named Niru Shanti Bhagat. The BJP, sources said, is likely to field Congress turncoat Sukhdeo Bhagat, who joined the party recently.

Meanwhile, at Mahto’s press conference, BJP MLA from Chattarpur Radhakrishna Kishore joined AJSU after he was denied a ticket. Nine other MLAs have also not got tickets from the BJP.

At the press conference, Kishore said: “In the last five years I worked hard to implement development schemes. I am shocked to see that I did not get a ticket. I would request the BJP to make the reasons public... I joined AJSU as it has the character of a political party.”

Candidate choice increases rift between Cong’s top two leaders

THE BYPOLLS to 15 Assembly seats in Karnataka is seen as causing a strain in the Congress’s state leadership, with two of its tallest leaders, former CM Siddaramaiah and former minister DK Shivakumar, ostensibly pulling in different directions on the choice of candidates, especially for Belagavi region.

Siddaramaiah, popular among Congress MLAs, is said to be pitching for some of his old associates in constituencies in Belagavi region, while Shivakumar, who enjoys trust of the party high command, is keen to field BJP rebels in what is also seen as a personal battle for Shivakumar against former Congress leader from the region Ramesh Jharkiholi — once a Siddaramaiah associate who has since switched sides and led to the Congress-JD(S) government’s fall last year.

Since his bail in an Enforcement Directorate case last month, Shivakumar, who was visited in jail by senior Congress leaders, including party chief Sonia Gandhi, is seen as emerging as a counterweight to Siddaramaiah in state Congress.

At a meeting held in state party office on Monday to decide on candidates for the December 5 bypolls, the two senior leaders are reported to have had sharp exchange of words over the choice of candidates for Belagavi constituencies. For the Gokak constituency, a family fiefdom of the Jharkiholi brothers, Siddaramaiah is said to be backing the candidature of Lakhnan Jharkiholi to take on his brother Ramesh, expected to be fielded by the BJP, while Shivakumar is learnt to have pitched for Ashok Poojari, the BJP candidate who lost the 2018 polls from Gokak.

In Kagwad, Shivakumar has reportedly pitched for Raju Kage, the BJP candidate in 2018 who lost to then Congressman Shrinanth

Patil, who has also switched sides and is likely to be fielded by the ruling party if the Supreme Court decides in favour of the rebel Congress-JD(S) legislators in its verdict scheduled on Wednesday.

Shivakumar’s ostensible move to support candidature of BJP rebels in two Belagavi constituencies is seen as having kept Siddaramaiah’s close associate from Belagavi region, Satish Jharkiholi, away from Monday’s party meeting.

State Congress chief Dinesh Gundu Rao said that the meeting will be reconvened on Wednesday, after the Supreme Court verdict.

Siddaramaiah on Tuesday said, “We are gathering information from all leaders for constituencies where candidates have not been picked. We will consult the party high command and decide the final list. Our aim is to win at least 12 of the 15 seats.”

The Congress has already chosen eight out of the 15 candidates.

Although Shivakumar was instrumental in bringing Siddaramaiah, a Backward Class leader, from JD(S) to the Congress in 2006, the two have had a frosty relationship from the time the latter became the chief minister in 2013. Shivakumar was initially kept out of the state ministry, and was included after nearly a year into Siddaramaiah’s tenure.

In 2016, when Shivakumar fell out with the Jharkiholi brothers, Siddaramaiah’s associates, over multiple issues, including Shivakumar’s attempt to take political control of Belagavi region, the Congress directed him to stay out of Belagavi affairs.

After the Congress failed to win enough seats to return on its own in 2018, under Siddaramaiah’s leadership, Shivakumar forged a close alliance with JD(S) leader H D Kumaraswamy, until then a fierce rival for electoral attention of their dominant Vokkaliga community. Kumaraswamy subsequently became the CM.

SC order on MLAs’ disqualification today

SUPREME Court on Wednesday will pronounce judgments on three important matters, including on a plea by 17 Karnataka MLAs challenging the then Speaker’s action of disqualifying them.

A bench of Justices N V Ramana, Sanjiv Khanna and Krishna Murari had reserved its judgment on the plea by the ex-MLAs on October 25.

The other two judgments that will be delivered by a Constitution bench of Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi and Justices N V

Ramana, D Y Chandrachud, Deepak Gupta and Sanjiv Khanna.

In the first case, the constitutional validity of the provisions of the Finance Act, 2017, which affect the composition and functioning of various Tribunals, will be tested.

In the second case, the court will rule whether the office of the CJI would come under RTI Act. The matter relates to a plea by the apex court questioning an order of the Central Information Commission, which ruled that the information pertaining to appointment of judges should be disclosed under the Act. The outcome of the case will have a bearing on questions of transparency in the judiciary.

Uddhav hits out at Governor: Don’t understand his maths

SHIV SENA chief Uddhav Thackeray on Tuesday hit out at Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari over denial of more time to drum up support for government formation in the state.

Claiming that the Sena had asked for 48 hours, but the Governor had now given them six months, Thackeray said the Congress, the NCP and his party will work out a formula for formation of the government soon.

The Sena had failed to produce the required letters of support of the NCP and the Congress when it met the Governor Monday night to stake a claim to form the government. The party had informed the Governor that it wanted to form the government and had sought two days’ extension, which was denied.

“Our claim is still there. But it is not a child’s play to run a stable government of a state like Maharashtra. So, we had requested an extension of 48 hours because we didn’t have the letters from the Congress and the NCP. But the Governor was so kind that he has now given us six months. I didn’t understand his mathematics,” Thackeray said.

The Sena chief was addressing the media at a resort in Malad (West) where his party MLA-elects have been put up since last Thursday, minutes after the Congress-NCP leadership held a press conference. He said the Sena needs clarity on the Common Minimum Programme (CMP), just like the Congress and the NCP if a government is to be formed with their support.

Taking a dig at the BJP for questioning how parties with such different ideologies could come together, Thackeray said: “Everyone is asking this question. I have sought information about how the BJP and PDP leader Mehbooba Mufti came together, and how the BJP and Nitish Kumar, Ram Vilas Paswan, Chandrababu Naidu, who once said ‘Modi hatao’, came together... Then we will decide how parties with different ideologies can come together and will take our claim about government formation forward.”

Referring to the Congress-NCP press conference, Thackeray said one major thing had come out from it. “They said, I contacted them seeking their support for government only on Monday. It is important because orally, the BJP, had claimed that we didn’t have time to speak to

them... We’re contacting Congress-NCP three times in a day. It was an answer to that.”

Claiming that it was not he who had closed the door on the BJP, Thackeray reiterated that the chief minister’s post for two-and-a-half years was a key to the alliance with the BJP forged just ahead of the 2019 Lok Sabha elections. “I’m angered by the fact they (the BJP) have lied and attempted to portray me as a liar,” he added.

Asked if the BJP was still in touch with him, the Sena chief said, “There is no point in the BJP contacting me if new things are being decided every time. Hindutva is our ideology and keeping promises is an integral part of it. You want Ram temple (in Ayodhya), but don’t want to keep promises. Then it can’t be Hindutva.”

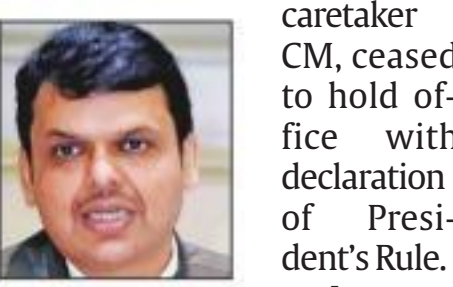
Earlier, Thackeray had told party legislators during a meeting at the hotel that they “need not worry” about the President’s Rule which was imposed in the state Tuesday evening.

“He assured party legislators that Sena can still form the government with the Congress and the NCP and that the President’s Rule didn’t mean the end of the road,” a Sena functionary, who did not wish to be identified, said.

President’s Rule unfortunate, appeal for stable govt: Fadnavis

Mumbai: The imposition of President’s rule in Maharashtra due to non-formation of government was an extremely unfortunate development, BJP state legislative party leader Devendra Fadnavis said on Tuesday.

Fadnavis, who was holding

In a statement, the BJP leader reflected on the political developments. Flagging “critical issues” such as the hardship faced by farmers due to unseasonal rain and how instability could affect investments, Fadnavis said, “Therefore, it is my ardent appeal that all political parties should seriously consider these developments and work towards giving a stable government,” he said. **ENS**

From hill state to Malabar Hill, a political journey

A FORMER RSS pracharak known for his simple and frugal lifestyle, Bhagat Singh Koshyari, 77, the Maharashtra Governor, is the man of the moment in Mumbai, approximately 1,800 km away from his hometown in Uttarakhand’s Bageshwar district and light years away in sociopolitical and economic import.

An MLC in undivided Uttar Pradesh in 1997 and chief minister for a brief, five-month term after the hill state of Uttarakhand was carved out from the politically crucial north Indian state in 2000, Koshyari, who will administer Maharashtra after imposition of President’s Rule on Tuesday, took charge as Governor in September.

Koshyari has a Masters degree in English literature and was active in student politics during his days in Almora College - he was elected general secretary of the college students’ union in 1961-62.

He served as a lecturer at Raja Inter College, in Etah district of UP, for a few years and subsequently had a career as an author and journalist, too.

‘Bhagat-da’, as he is known affectionately among party workers, joined RSS at a young age. He took part in the nationwide agita-

tion against the Emergency and was jailed. He served as RSS pracharak for a long time before entering active politics.

In 1997, he was elected as Member of UP Legislative Council. After formation of Uttarakhand, Koshyari was said to be frontrunner for the post of interim chief minister, but Nityananda Swami was appointed instead and Koshyari worked as a minister. A few months before the first Assembly elections in the new hill state, the BJP replaced Nityananda with Koshyari as CM, but he also remained in office for only five months, as the BJP lost the elections to the Congress.

Koshyari won from Kapkot Assembly constituency in 2002 and 2007 Vidhan Sabha polls.

He served as BJP national vice-president and president of the party’s Uttarakhand unit as well. Between 2002 and 2007, he was the Leader of Opposition in Uttarakhand Assembly.

He was elected to Rajya Sabha from Uttarakhand in November 2008, and as chairman of the House committee on petitions gave a report on ‘One Rank One Pension’ and ‘Railway Network in Himalayan States’, two key issues in the hill state.

In 2014, he was elected to 16th Lok Sabha from Nainital-Udhamsingh Nagar.

President’s rule for third time in state, Pawar again key figure

THIS IS the third time that Maharashtra has come under President’s Rule since the state was formed in 1960. And in all three instances, NCP chief Sharad Pawar has been the central figure.

This is the first time when President’s Rule has been imposed after poll results were declared and parties failed to stake claim for government formation.

President’s Rule was imposed in the state for the first time on February 17, 1980. The government of the day had completed one-and-a-half years in power. The central rule lasted 112 days, till June 8. Sharad Pawar was the then chief minister and was dismissed by then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi.

In 1978, Pawar was with the Congress, which had won the Assembly elections that year. The Congress made Vasantdada Patil the chief minister. This upset Pawar. Five months after

Vasantdada’s government came to power, Pawar parted ways with the Congress and floated the Indian National Congress (Socialist). “He joined hands with the Janata Party, toppled the Vasantdada government and at 38, became the youngest chief minister,” says veteran Congress leader Ullhas Pawar.

He added that Sharad Pawar would not have lost his chief ministership had he returned to the Congress. “Sanjay Gandhi urged him to return to the Congress... However, Janata Party leaders like Chandrashekhar dissuaded Sharad Pawar from doing so, which resulted in the dismissal of his government by Indira,” he said.

President’s Rule was imposed again in 2014. It was imposed after the then chief minister Prithviraj Chavan submitted his resignation to Governor Ch

Vidyasagar Rao after the 15-year-old Congress-NCP alliance fell apart. Then President Pranab Mukherjee had signed the proclamation for imposition of central rule in Maharashtra.

‘Our party strengthened in Jharkhand... that’s why we decided to contest alone’

CHIRAG PASWAN, the Lok Sabha MP from Jamui, has been elected the IJP president, replacing his father and Union minister Ram Vilas Paswan, and has announced that his party will contest from 50 seats in the upcoming Jharkhand Assembly elections. He speaks to HARIKISHAN SHARMA about the issue of nepotism, the challenges ahead, and about the upcoming Assembly elections in Jharkhand, Bihar and Delhi.

You have big shoes to fill. How do you look at the challenge and opportunity?

I am confident, and this confidence comes from my father only because he has given me that scope of taking decisions... Since the time I became the chairman of IJP’s central parliamentary

board, whatever decision I wanted to take, he gave me the freedom. His guidance will be there always. I hope that I live up to the expectations — not only of my father but also to the people of my party.

Ram Vilas Paswan is a champion of Dalit issues. Why should the Dalit support base, so carefully crafted by your father, trust you? I might not have lived through those issues but the background, place and state that I come from is largely dominated by caste set-up. That has given me a lot of experience because when I go back to my native place or when I go back to Bihar, I also deal with these issues. When the SC/ST Atrocities Act was diluted, I was the only one who raised the issue very strongly.

I think this gives confidence to people coming from my caste that I will raise their issues.

What is your view on Mayawati and Bhim Army chief Chandrashekhar Azad? About Mayawati ji, I am just a little confused with her working style. There have been times when she spoke against people from upper castes, then eventually she joined hands (with them), so I have seen a mix in her working style. (But) it doesn’t concern me what Bhim Army is doing and what their leaders are doing.

What will be your answer to questions of nepotism? Well, I can’t shy away from the issue of nepotism. I myself am the outcome of the same. I will be the

last person to run away from this. I honestly believe that when you are in the public domain, eventually, it’s the people of the country who decide your fate, no matter which big family you come from. I’ll give you an example — had this

(nepotism) been the reason (for success in the political arena), my elder sister Misa Bharti, the daughter of Lalu (Prasad) ji, would have won elections but she lost twice from Pataliputra.



What are the issues that you, as a new leader, suggest the government should focus on over the next five years?

The IJP is a 19-year-old party; we have a young leadership. My focus is going to be on youngsters who are the future of the country. There are many issues concerning

them and employment is one of the issues.

The immediate task in front of you is the Jharkhand Assembly election, where you have decided to contest from 50 seats.

I had huge pressure from the state unit (of the party) to contest alone, though I wanted to contest under an alliance. I had given it in writing to (BJP president) Amit Shah ji, (BJP working president) JPN Nadda ji, and the Jharkhand CM (Raghubar Das), but didn’t get any positive response. Our party has strengthened in Jharkhand over the years. That is why we decided to contest alone...

Does your party plan to contest the coming Delhi

Assembly elections? Yes, definitely. As the president, I am very clear my first preference will be under an alliance but in case we are not able to hold up an alliance, we will be contesting alone in the coming elections in different states.

The Bihar Assembly elections are due next year. Do you think the time has come for the state to have a young chief minister?

As of now, I am very confident that the face for NDA will be Chief Minister Nitish Kumar ji. I am confident that in 2020, he will not only be the face (of the alliance) but will be CM again. But, yes, for 2025 I don’t know, definitely a young face will emerge.

Man attempts suicide after killing girlfriend in Rajasthan

Jaipur: A 27-year-old man shot his girlfriend dead and then tried to commit suicide in Jhotwara area of Jaipur district on Tuesday, officials said. The woman died on the spot while the man is being treated at SMS hospital, they said. “Prima facie, Govind Soni shot Varsha Soni (23) and then attempted suicide. The firearm has been

seized,” police said. The two were in a relationship and wanted to marry but were not able to convince their families and decided to take the extreme step, a senior police official said. “They were living in the same locality in Shree ram nagar extension and committed the act near their house,” the police officer said. **PTI**

Three die, two injured as car hits flyover in Kolkata

Kolkata: Three people died and two others were grievously injured when their car hit a flyover pillar in New Town area on Tuesday. FAMILY QUESTIONS PROF’S ROLE, HoD SAYS CLUELESS

Class topper in all subjects but one, IIT-Madras student kills self

THREE DAYS after the death of a first year IIT-Madras student, allegedly in a case of suicide, her parents on Tuesday submitted a petition to Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and sought the state government’s intervention in Tamil Nadu police’s investigation of the case.

Fathima Latif, a first year student of MA, humanities and development studies (integrated), who came from Kollam, Kerala, was found hanging in her hostel room at IIT-Madras on Saturday morning. Her teachers recalled Fathima as a brilliant student and a class topper.

While the police have registered a case of unnatural death (suicide) and said that no suicide note was found, her father Abdul Latif, who has also sent petitions to the Prime Minister seeking justice, mentioned a note purportedly written in her cellphone and naming one of the teachers. “The note names a professor and stated that he [name withheld] ‘is the cause of my death,’” Latif told *The Indian Express*.

The cellphone is in police custody.

The professor concerned was not available for a comment.

Train services partially restored in Kashmir

TRAIN SERVICES were partially restored in the Valley on Tuesday, more than three months after they were suspended following the abrogation of Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir on August 5.

Officials said that on the Banihal- Baramulla line, train services between Srinagar and Baramulla were restored from Tuesday, while the decision about restoring train services from Srinagar to Banihal would be taken soon.

A senior railway official told *The Indian Express* that the services remained smooth on day one of the operations. “Some boys had gathered near the Mazhama area in Budgam district. The GRP officials were informed and the boys were dispersed from the area and the train then plied normally,” the official said.

“The footfall was not much today but the number of passengers would increase as people would know that train services have resumed,” the official added.

The next challenge for officials will be to restore train services between Srinagar and Banihal, as the train will pass through areas in south Kashmir.

“We are expecting to go for a trial run on the Srinagar- Banihal stretch likely from next week. If it remains peaceful, only then will a trial run be done,” said a railway official.

Umakant Dash, head of humanities department at IIT-Madras, said the entire department, including students and professors, were clueless how and why she died.

Maintaining that Fathima had never said or done anything that could have been deemed as reflecting a suicidal tendency, or exhibited any psychological problem, Latif said: “There is a mystery behind this death. She told us about this professor earlier, too — that he makes some students cry. We also have information that she used to sit and cry regularly at the mess hall around 9 every night. So we demand that the police check CCTV footage.”

Accusing the authorities of suspected foul play, he said, “After Fathima’s death, her department has suspended classes for the next 45 days, postponed their main examination in

December, and asked students to stay back at home. We suspect this is to derail the probe and collection of evidence.”

He added that Fathima had scored the highest nationally in the last IIT entrance exams.

HoD Dash denied reports that classes and exams were cancelled. “Classes are being held as usual; no class was suspended. Some students in Fathima’s class requested that the internal exams scheduled for next week in some subjects be postponed, as they are yet to recover from the tragedy. We may make necessary arrangements,” he said.

Dash said he has met teachers and students and spoken to almost everyone. “We have virtually no idea about a reason for her suicide. The incident being linked to a professor was about an answer-sheet distributed last week. She had scored the highest in other subjects and came second in only his (professor’s) paper. I am told she was expecting three more marks. But scoring two or three marks fewer (out of 20) in an internal exam...is that a reason for suicide?...It was very unfortunate,” he said.

Dash said the internal exam concerned carries 20 per cent weightage in overall scores in the semester. “I spoke to her friends — not one of them has an idea

(about Fathima’s death). Police investigation is in progress. The institute will follow due procedures; we will cooperate,” the HoD said.

Dash said Fathima had joined IIT-M in August. “She had a long way to go,” he added.

Two of Fathima’s teachers said they still cannot reconcile to the fact that the student is no more. “She was the best student.... In class, she would surprise me with some books or names of authors. It’s unbelievable that she committed suicide,” a faculty member who had taught Fathima said.

Pointing out that there have been multiple cases of suicides at IIT-Madras, a senior professor said, “Students are mere victims here. They are being prepared in such a way (at the level of schools and coaching classes) that they cannot accept ‘defeat’ — they see it (exams) as war.”

A teacher who works for a prominent IIT entrance coaching centre in Chennai said, “The change should take place at the level of schools. I have a student who of Class IX, who recently broke down and told me that he hates going to school. And he is the school topper. I had to meet the parents and alert them about his severe symptoms of depression,” he said.

After snowfall, power supply still affected, fruit industry hit

SIX DAYS since heavy snowfall threw life out of gear in the Valley, electricity supply in North Kashmir districts continues to be affected. Meanwhile, preliminary assessment by J&K’s horticulture department has shown that Kashmir’s fruit industry has been hit, with snowfall damaging 35 per cent of the orchards.

Lt Governor GC Murmu held a review meeting in Jammu on Monday regarding the situation, but has not visited the Valley since the snowfall — which occurred on November 6-7.

On Tuesday evening, Power Development Department officials in Srinagar said that power supply has been restored in North Kashmir. “As we speak, we have restored electricity in North Kashmir,” Hashmat Qazi,

Chief Engineer (Kashmir) of the department, told *The Indian Express*. He said the snowfall had damaged 4,000-5,000 electricity poles and the department has replaced 2,500 poles so far.

On November 5, the meteorological department issued an advisory that an active western disturbance from November 6-8 was likely to cause widespread to moderate snowfall. However, there were allegations that the government machinery was missing on the ground on the first day of snowfall, and that fallen trees were yet to be removed from roads.

“Last year we saw similar snowfall, but there was immediate restoration of power and clearance of snow from roads. This time it is worse,” said Naasir Khan, senior vice-president of Kashmir Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

He said that in view of re-

strictions on communication, it was the government’s responsibility to effectively alert people about weather conditions.

Speaking about the effects of the snowfall on the fruit industry, Horticulture Kashmir Director Ajaz Ahmad Bhat told *The Indian Express*, “As per preliminary and tentative figures, 35 per cent of the orchards in Kashmir have suffered damage.” He added that Shopian, Baramulla and Kulgam were the worst hit.

Deputy Commissioner Srinagar Shahid Choudhary tweeted, “Farmers have suffered massive losses. Preliminary survey done on November 7. We reached out to every village and farm saffron major casualty—nearly 70 percent. Inter department teams making assessment. Every loss will be compensated. Disappointed to visit some farms today.”

Navlakha anticipatory bail plea rejected

A SPECIAL court in Pune on Tuesday rejected the anticipatory bail application filed by activist Gautam Navlakha, who is among the 23 people booked in the Elgar Parishad case under provisions of the IPC and UAPA for their alleged links with the banned CPI (Maoist).

Special judge S R Navandar also rejected an application by Navlakha’s lawyer seeking extension of protection from arrest for three days. He sought the extension so that he could move anticipatory bail application in the Bombay High Court, which was closed on Tuesday.

The protection from arrest granted to Navlakha by the Supreme Court ended on Tuesday. This means that he may be arrested by Pune City Police, unless he manages to move the High Court and get protection from arrest on Wednesday. Sources said that police have started looking for Navlakha’s location.

The special court had last week rejected regular bail applications filed by six of the nine arrested accused in the Elgar Parishad case.

The police have alleged that Elgaar Parishad, a one-day conclave held in Shaniwar Wada on December 31, 2017, ahead of the 200th commemoration of the battle of Koregaon Bhima, was organised with help from the CPI (Maoist). They have also claimed that its probe had revealed a larger conspiracy against the government.

Opposing Navlakha’s application for anticipatory bail, the prosecution had cited letters and documents seized from his possession and co-accused and alleged that Navlakha was actively involved in activities of CPI-

Maoist such as “fact finding”, recruitment and funding.

Defence lawyer Ragini Ahuja argued that Navlakha’s custody was not required as he was a journalist and peace activist who had served as an interlocutor when five persons were abducted by Maoists in 2011. Ahuja said “fact-finding” is a legal activity. She argued Navlakha had openly opposed Maoist violence and there is no evidence to show his involvement in any terror act.

However, the court observed prima facie there is sufficient material to show that he is an active member of CPI-Maoist. “Custodial interrogation of the accused is needed,” it said.

The court found that submissions made by Ahuja regarding documents submitted by the prosecution are “attractive but cannot be accepted” for the reason that “apart from above mentioned literature there is other material on record which prima-facie shows that applicant (Navlakha) was not only actively involved but was managing the affairs of the banned organisation”.

Ahuja had argued that Navalkha, being a writer by profession, “had studied ideology and structure of banned organisation, had undertaken the task of fact finding, which is nothing but finding out truth and therefore it cannot be said that he was in any way involved in any conspiracy to commit any crime”.

Militant from Pakistan killed in encounter in J&K

An update posted by Kashmir zone police on Tuesday confirmed one militant has been killed. “01 terrorist killed. Arms and ammunition recovered.

Kerala HC orders probe into killing of four Maoists

THE KERALA High Court on Tuesday ordered the police to probe the circumstances behind the recent killings of four Maoists, and ascertain whether the police officials involved in the encounters had committed any offence in relation to the deaths.

The encounters occurred in Palakkad district on October 28 and 29. Four Maoists were killed, but only two bodies have been identified.

A bench of Justice R Narayana Pisharadi was hearing petitions moved by the families of the two Maoists identified, who have claimed they were killed in fake encounters.

Observing that there are lapses and omissions in complying with the Supreme Court directions regarding probing police encounter deaths, the court said, “The investigating officer shall forthwith seize firearms used by police officials during the two incidents and take immediate steps for sending them for forensic and ballistic analysis... Whether the death was on account of a genuine or fake encounter is a matter which has to be probed into closely.”

Identity and affiliation being ascertained. Search continues,” they tweeted.

In another tweet, police said the slain militant was identified as Khalid, a Pakistani national. “#Ganderbal #encounter update: Killed #terrorist has been identified as #Pakistani namely Khalid @Zebran. Affiliated with proscribed #terror outfit #LeT. Arms & ammunition recovered. Involved in terror #crimes. Search continues. @JmuKmrPolice,” they posted on Twitter.

On Monday, in an encounter between militants and security forces in nearby Bandipore district, two militants were killed.

Police assaulted protesters at new Dantewada camp: Activists

RAIPUR, NOVEMBER 12

A week after the Dantewada Police opened a police camp in Potali, activists alleged that a crowd protesting outside the camp on Tuesday was dispersed with the use of force. Police officials, however, have said that the matter was handled “sensitively”.

Senior police officials said the camp in Potali is of strategic importance on the Arunpur axis, the worst conflict-hit region in Dantewada district.

Civil rights activist and AAP leader Soni Sori claimed that villagers had been assaulted. “Thousands of villagers had assembled on Tuesday to protest the opening of the camp... They were protesting peacefully and the police used sticks etc to hurt them and disperse them,” Sori said.

Police, however, said that villagers have been protesting the opening of the camp and had congregated with “bows and arrows”.

Dantewada SP Abhishek Pallava said, “When we began to leave, some (villagers) advanced with bows and arrows... to disperse the crowd we fired fake weapons in the air... There were absolutely no injuries or assault.”

CHEAP ELECTRICITY SCHEME

MP govt may prosecute ineligible beneficiaries

MILIND GHATAWAI
BHOPAL, NOVEMBER 12

ALLEGING THAT nearly 71 lakh ineligible persons benefited under a scheme providing cheap electricity to unorganised labourers, the Congress government in Madhya Pradesh is looking at several steps, including prosecuting the ineligible beneficiaries and recovery of the subsidy amount.

The Saral Bijli Bill Scheme (SBBS), which was launched by the previous BJP government months before the 2018 Assembly elections, aims to provide cheap electricity to unorganised labourers by reducing their bills. Under the scheme, beneficiaries were provided electricity at a flat rate of Rs 200 per month. If the bill was less than Rs 200 per month, they paid the actual amount, and the government was to pick up the tab for the amount exceeding Rs 200 as long as the consumption was less than 1000 watts.

Those who pay income tax, have more than 2.5 acre agricultural land, are government employees and in employment where PF is deducted were ineligible for the scheme.

Jammu: Sixteen people died and one was injured as an overloaded TATA Trax vehicle fell into a nullah near Doda in Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday afternoon.

Sources said that the vehicle was going to Marmat from Doda and was carrying 17 people, including the driver. The seating capacity of the vehicle was only ten.

When the vehicle reached Khaleni road, driver lost control over the steering and it fell into a nullah flowing in a deep gorge. Twelve people died on the spot, while four others succumbed to injuries on way to the hospital.

Ayodhya verdict: Mahasabha may file review over five acre land for mosque

DAYS AFTER the Supreme Court, deciding the title suit of Ramjanmabhoomi-Babri Masjid, ruled that the entire disputed land be handed over to a trust to be constituted for construction of a Ram temple and that Muslims be given five acres of either the acquired land near the site or at “a suitable prominent place in Ayodhya” for building a mosque, the Akhil Bharat Hindu Mahasabha (ABHM), one of the appellants in the apex court, has raised an objection over the direction to provide five-acre land to Sunni Waqf Board.

The Hindu Mahasabha said they are studying the judgment to decide on filing a review petition against the order.

“We have strong objections over the court direction to provide Sunni Waqf Board five acres of land near the site or a suitable prominent place in Ayodhya. If it has been proved that a temple was there, then why should any land be given to them? We are presently studying the Supreme Court judgment and will decide later on filing a review petition,” said advocate Shishir Chaturvedi, the current president of ABHM.

The ABHM appeal in the Supreme Court against the 2010 Allahabad High Court judgment was filed in 2011 by its then president Kamlesh Tiwari who was murdered at his residence in Lucknow last month.

The ABHM had formed a high-power committee and nominated Tiwari, the then president, to be an appellant in the title suit case on behalf of the outfit against the 2010 Allahabad High Court judgment.

Tiwari’s wife Kiran also told *The Indian Express* on Tuesday that they are not happy with the top court’s decision to give five acres to Muslims for building a mosque in Ayodhya. “We are happy with the Supreme Court judgment to form a trust to build a Ram temple at the disputed site...but have objection over its decision of giving five acres of land to the other (Muslim) side in Ayodhya. If the central or state government begins the process to give the land, we would start a protest,” said Kiran.

First amphibious Indo-US joint exercise starts in Vizag today

IN WHAT will be the first ever joint exercise involving the Army, Navy and Air Force of both India and the United States and commanded by each other, the tri-services joint exercise between the two countries, announced by US President Donald Trump during Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s event in Texas in September, will start in Visakhapatnam on Wednesday.

The exercise, ‘Tiger Triumph’, ends on November 21. Although it is a Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) exercise, defence sources said there will be exercises for a “limited threat scenario” as well.

For India, Naval ships Jalashwa, Airavat and Sandhayak, Army troops from 19 Madras and 7 Guards, and MI-17 helicopters and Rapid Action Medical Team (RAMT) from the Air Force will participate. The US will be represented by US Navy Ship German-town, with troops from

US Third Marine Division. The exercise is part of strengthening the Indo-US strategic partnership, and defence sources said it is the “next best thing in the absence of a strategic alliance”. The two countries will work out the modalities of how their forces can operate under the command of forces of the other nation.

Unlike other joint exercises that India holds with other countries, sources said Tiger Triumph is “not under any UN mandate”. It means exercise will be a simulation where the joint forces will “go to a hypothetical third nation for HADR”, a source explained.

The exercise will prepare the joint forces to conduct humanitarian and relief work in the region in case a third nation ever asks for such assistance, which is not covered by a UN mandate.

A common structure will be shared by forces of the two nations, with US marines also coming under the Indian command for certain exercises, sources said. For the exercises on land, India will hold the command, while the command will be shared for exercises in sea.

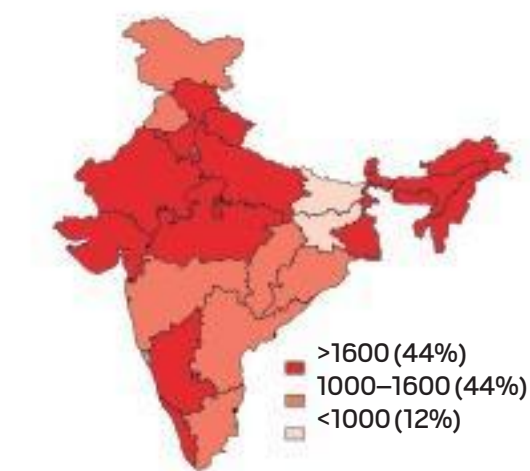
The US recently renamed its Pacific Command as the US Indo-Pacific Command, signifying India’s growing significance.

The first ever 2+2 dialogue between the two countries took place in 2018.

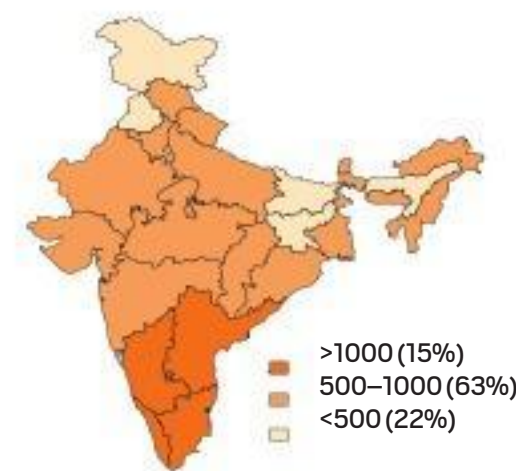

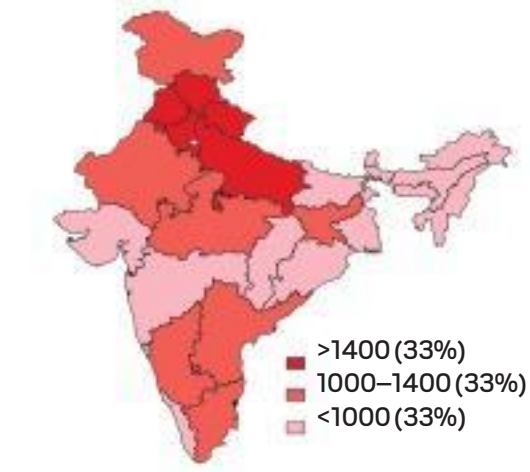
CANCERS (5.44 LAKH DEATHS)



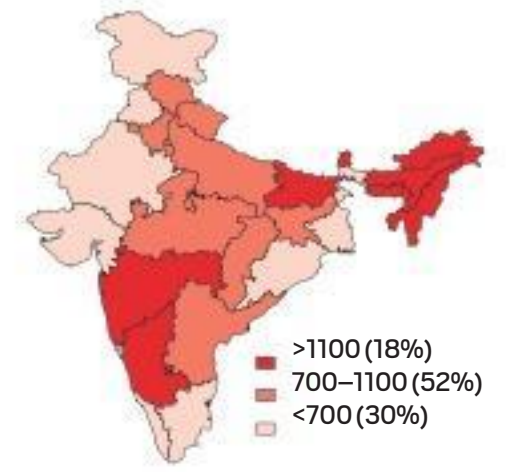
SUICIDE (1.99 LAKH DEATHS)

AN ANALYSIS published in *The Lancet Global Health*, which looked at about 9.7 million deaths in India in 2017, found that every condition that was common in one part of India was uncommon elsewhere. For example, the Northeastern states, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, West Bengal, Haryana, Gujarat, Kerala, Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh account for 44% of India's cancer burden (*The Indian Express*, November 12).

Premature deaths due to various causes, expressed as YLLs, too were unevenly distributed in terms of the burden on the states. By the World Health Organization definition, YLLs, or years of life lost, are calculated from the number of deaths multiplied by a standard life expectancy at the age of death. For example, liver and alcohol-related YLL rates were high in the northeastern states, Bihar, Karnataka, and Maharashtra, accounting for 18% of national YLLs. Suicide YLL rates were highest in the southern states, accounting for 15% of national totals. Road traffic injuries were high in the northern states of Uttar Pradesh, Punjab,

Uttarakhand, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh, accounting for 33% of national totals. Drowning YLL rates, meanwhile, were highest in the central states of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, and in Assam in the Northeast, accounting for 11% of national totals.

In 2017, India had 486 million DALYs (disability-adjusted life years, a measure of the number of years lost due to ill health or disability). The ratio of DALYs to the 9.7 million deaths was about 50 to 1. More than three quarters of deaths and DALYs occurred in rural areas, and males accounted for 54-3% of all DALYs. At all ages, the DALY rate per 100 000 population was 36,300, but rates were higher among rural residents and among males. DALY rates in rural areas were at least twice those of urban areas for certain conditions.

The study, funded by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, included authors from the Indian Council of Medical Research, and from the global health research wings of the University of Toronto and University of California, San Francisco.

Why BRICS matters for India

As Prime Minister Narendra Modi attends the BRICS Summit in Brazil, a look at how the grouping began and has since evolved, what are the issues it will take up, and what it means for India in the global order.

ON TUESDAY, Prime Minister Narendra Modi left for Brazil to attend the 11th BRICS Summit. What is on the agenda of this grouping, and why is it important?

The origins, and now

On November 30, 2001, Jim O'Neill, a British economist who was then chairman of Goldman Sachs Asset Management, coined the term 'BRIC' to describe the four emerging economies of Brazil, Russia, India, and China.

In a paper, 'The World Needs Better Economic BRICS', written for the Goldman Sachs 'Global Economic Paper' series, O'Neill — who went on to serve as Commercial Secretary to the Treasury between 2015 and 2016 in the governments headed by David Cameron and Theresa May — made a case for BRIC on the basis of econometric analyses projecting that the four economies would individually and collectively occupy far greater economic space and become among the world's largest economies in the next 50 years or so.

"In 2001 and 2002, real GDP growth in large emerging market economies will exceed that of the G7. At end-2000, GDP in US\$ on a PPP basis in Brazil, Russia, India and China (BRIC) was about 23.3% of world GDP. On a current GDP basis, BRIC share of world GDP is 8%. Over the next 10 years, the weight of the BRICs and especially China in world GDP will grow, raising important issues about the global economic impact of fiscal and monetary policy in the BRICs. In line with these prospects, world policymaking forums should be re-organised and in particular, the G7 should be adjusted to incorporate BRIC representatives," O'Neill wrote.

Answering a question, "Should the G7 be replaced by a G9?", he wrote it seems quite clear that the current G7 needs to be "upgraded" and room made for the BRICs in order to allow more effective global policymaking.

And, about India's role, he wrote, "India would almost definitely be the least eager to join the G9 club. They might regard any 'obligat'ns as unwelcome, as well as possibly seeing their own experiences as limiting their ability to give 'advice'. However, in view of their size, population and potential (and their geographical location), the possible inclusion of India would be attractive."

Eighteen years later, India finds itself as one of the emerging economies in the grouping

and beyond, especially G20. BRICS now brings together five economies accounting for 42% of the world's population, 23% of the global GDP and an around 17% share of world trade.

As a formal grouping, BRIC started after the meeting of the leaders of Russia, India and China in St Petersburg on the margins of the G8-Outreach Summit in July 2006. The grouping was formalised during the first meeting of BRIC Foreign Ministers on the margins of the UNGA in New York in September 2006. The first BRIC Summit was held in Yekaterinburg, Russia, on June 16, 2009.

It was agreed to expand BRIC to BRICS with the inclusion of South Africa at the BRICS Foreign Ministers' meeting in New York in September 2010. South Africa attended the third BRICS Summit in Sanya on April 14, 2011. Last year, leaders of the grouping commemorated the 10th anniversary of BRICS in Johannesburg.

India & the current Summit

As Modi attends the 11th BRICS Summit in Brasilia, his sixth since he assumed office in 2014, it will be the beginning of what New Delhi sees as the "second cycle" of BRICS. Since July 2014 in Fortaleza in Brazil, Modi's first multilateral summit after becoming Prime Minister, the grouping has completed the first

cycle during his regime in India.

From the Indian perspective, BRICS has emerged the voice of developing countries, or the global south. As these countries face an aggressive club of developed countries, raising challenges on issues from WTO to climate change, New Delhi believes BRICS has to protect the rights of the developing countries. The five BRICS countries are also members of G-20.

While the economic heft of three of the five countries has been dented in the last few years, the BRICS cooperation has two pillars — consultations on issues of mutual interest through meetings of leaders and ministers, and cooperation through meetings of senior officials in areas including trade, finance, health, education, technology, agriculture, and IT.

Also, India has to maintain the balancing act between Russia-China on the one side and the US on the other. While India has had a growing role in global affairs in the last decade or so, and is seen to be helping drive the global agenda, the current crop of BRICS leaders too are seen as strong personalities — from Chinese President Xi Jinping to Russian President Vladimir Putin to Brazil's President Jair Bolsonaro — with a pronounced nationalistic agenda. South Block views this as a potential for cooperation, as the leaders have more in common than their predecessors.

President's Rule in Maharashtra: what now?

ON TUESDAY, while recommending President's Rule in Maharashtra, Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari noted that a situation has arisen when the formation of a stable government is not possible even 15 days after election results had been declared.

How it is imposed

President's Rule implies the suspension of a state government and the imposition of direct rule of the Centre. This is achieved through invocation of Article 356 of the Constitution by the President on the advice of the Union Council of Ministers. Under Article 356, this move can be taken " (1) If the President, on receipt of report from the Governor of the State or otherwise, is satisfied that a situation has arisen in which the government of the State cannot be carried on in accordance with the provisions of this Constitution..."

The Maharashtra Assembly has been kept in suspended animation. However, the new Assembly stands constituted, with the names of the election winners having been notified by the Election Commission.

How long it can last

A proclamation of President's Rule can be revoked through a subsequent proclamation in case the leader of a party produces letters of

support from a majority of members of the Assembly, and stakes his claim to form a government. The revocation does not need the approval of Parliament.

So, this is not the end of the road for any formation in Maharashtra. In fact, all players now have time to work out their alliances and head to Raj Bhavan to stake their claim to form a government.

Any proclamation under Article 356 — which stands for six months — has to be approved by both Houses in the Parliament session following it. This six-month time-frame can be extended in phases, up to three years.

Similar precedents

This is not the first time President's Rule has been imposed following an election that did not lead to government formation. For instance, no party could mobilise a majority in the Bihar Assembly following elections in February 2005. President's Rule, which was imposed on March 7, 2005, lasted 262 days until November 24. It was lifted after fresh

elections in October-November.

A hung verdict in the Jammu and Kashmir elections of 2002 led to the imposition of President's Rule for 15 days, from October 18 to November 2 that year. The National Conference had emerged the single largest party, but was short of a majority. The PDP and the Congress formed a coalition government after prolonged negotiations. PDP leader Mufti Mohammad Sayeed became the Chief Minister for the first three years and Congress leader Ghulam Nabi Azad for the remaining three years. The alliance also included the Panthers Party.

In the UP Assembly elections of 2002, no party could secure a majority. This led to the imposition of President's Rule for 56 days, from March 3 to May 2, 2002. Then Mayawati (BSP) and the BJP struck a deal and the former became the Chief Minister on May 3. The alliance collapsed a year later and Mayawati resigned in August 2003. This was followed by the assumption of power by the Samajwadi Party with the support of BSP rebels.

Why SC verdict today holds key to Dec 5 Karnataka bypolls (and BSY govt)

THE SUPREME Court will deliver judgment on aspects of the Tenth Schedule of the Constitution, popularly known as the anti-defection law, on Wednesday in the context of the disqualification of 17 MLAs of the Congress and Janata Dal-Secular (JD-S) in Karnataka.

The MLAs were disqualified from the 16th Karnataka Legislative Assembly by the then Speaker on July 25 and 28 this year under the anti-defection law, and were barred from contesting elections during the tenure of the current Assembly (which is until 2023).

The judgment will have a bearing on the December 5 byelections to 15 of the 17 vacant seats in the Assembly, and on the future of the BJP government headed by Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa.

Under what circumstances were the MLAs disqualified?

The 2018 state elections produced a

hung Assembly — the BJP won 104 seats, Congress 80, and JD-S 37 in the 224-member House. Three seats went to others. When the BJP failed to muster a majority after three days of Yediyurappa being Chief Minister, the Congress and JD-S, whose leaders had forged an alliance soon after the results, formed the government with H D Kumaraswamy of the JD-S as CM.

In July 2019, 14 MLAs from the Congress and three from the JD-S quit the Assembly, ostensibly because they were unhappy with the coalition government. The resignations were seen as linked to a BJP attempt to topple the government, and the Congress and JD-S sought the MLAs' disqualification, and a bar on their contesting elections.

As the 17 rebels stayed away from the Assembly, the Congress-JD-S government collapsed during a trust vote on July 23, paving the way for the BJP to stake claim to form a new government under Yediyurappa on July 26.

In the interim, however, on July 25 and 28, then Speaker K R Ramesh Kumar issued two separate orders under the anti-defection law,

disqualifying the 17 MLAs from the House and barring them from contesting elections during the tenure of the current Assembly.

The MLAs subsequently moved the Supreme Court asking that the Speaker's orders be quashed. The Congress and JD-S too approached the court, seeking enforcement of the disqualifications.

How will the court's verdict impact the December 5 bypolls?

In its order on Wednesday, the Supreme Court will essentially decide whether the Congress and JD-S MLAs who were disqualified from the Assembly in July can contest the December 5 bypolls. Elections will not take place at two out of the 17 vacant seats — Rajarajeshwari Nagar and Maski — where separate election petitions challenging the results of the 2018 elections are pending in Karnataka High Court.

Nearly all the disqualified MLAs are hoping to contest the bypolls as BJP candidates. And the BJP is awaiting the outcome of the SC verdict to decide on its nominees. When the MLAs resigned from the Assembly in July

to topple the Kumaraswamy government, they had been assured they would be returned to the House on BJP tickets and given important positions in the government.

The 15 MLAs are hoping the Supreme Court will either quash their disqualification entirely, or set aside the ban imposed on them by the Speaker from contesting elections during the tenure of the current Assembly.

The bypolls were originally scheduled to be held with the elections to the Maharashtra and Haryana Assemblies on October 21, but were pushed to December 5 after the Election Commission told the Supreme Court that it was willing to wait for the outcome of the pleas made by the 17 rebel MLAs.

What impact can the verdict and bypolls have on Yediyurappa's government?

Yediyurappa currently has the support of 106 MLAs in the Assembly, including one Independent, while the Opposition combine of the Congress and JD-S has 101. The Karnataka House has 224 seats, with 17 vacancies. The BJP will have to win a minimum six out of 15 seats, and seven out of

17 to keep its majority. (It will, however, still be dependent on the support of the Independent — and would like to win at least one extra seat in both situations for a clear majority of its own.)

There are 14 vacancies in the council of ministers, which Yediyurappa intends to use to accommodate the rebels if they contest the bypolls and win. However, there is opposition within the BJP — including from many in the party's central leadership — over the kind of leeway being offered to the Congress and JD-S turncoats in order to save the Yediyurappa government.

With frictions between the Congress and JD-S rising after the collapse of their coalition government, the BJP could have the alternative choice of tying up with the JD-S in case it needs the numbers. The JD-S, whose leaders face CBI cases, has in recent days shown the inclination to back the BJP if necessary.

What larger questions could the Supreme Court answer today?

The major question the court could answer is whether lawmakers who are dis-

qualified under the anti-defection law can also be barred from contesting elections during the tenure of the incumbent legislative Assembly.

It could also decide whether disqualification proceedings under the Tenth Schedule gains precedence over acceptance of resignations of MLAs in a situation where the Speaker is simultaneously processing the resignations of MLAs, and pleas for their disqualification.

A great deal of ambiguity exists on these issues, often leading to confusion and gamesmanship in the use of the anti-defection law, which was inserted in the Constitution in 1985 by the 52nd Amendment Act with the intention of curbing horsetrading in Assemblies and Parliament.

There is also the question of whether the MLAs who resigned could have been subjected to the disqualification process under the anti-defection law, given that the Supreme Court had, in an order passed on July 17, said that the MLAs must not be compelled (through a whip) to attend the Assembly or the trust vote.
