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C.C.E. (Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation) is a process intertwined with learning which takes place everyday. It includes the discourses that are targeted at a certain level and the various skills of language. It is an attempt to shift from rote learning to constructing knowledge and applying it as and when required.

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Assessment has to take care of developing all the innate potential of the learners to the fullest extent. So it has to take place in a non threatening atmosphere without causing any burden for the learners. As a result the questions in CCE are not predictable and they don't demand fixed responses. Slots are provided for the learners to use their creativity and imagination.

#### **Types of Assessments**

- 1. Formative Assessment
- 2. Summative Assessment

#### **Formative Assessment**

It is an internal assessment.

### 1. Reflections

Teacher provides reading material such as library books, magazines, articles etc.. to the learners. The learners read them and write their reflections in their note book -2. Students have to present their reading experiences orally before the class. Teacher checks the written reflections of the students and awards marks individually. Both oral and written performance carry 10 marks.

#### 2. Written Works

#### **3. Project Works**
