Students have to prepare for Summative Assessment basing on this. Much weightage is given to reading comprehension. Students should write accurate answers as brief as possible. Some times there may be open ended questions which have more than one relevant answer.

At the same time maximum weightage is also given to grammar (40%) for 20 marks in Paper-I and vocabulary (40%) for 20 marks in Paper-II. The exercises that are given at the end of each unit will help the students to get full marks in these sections.
