Growth down but there's no recession: Sitharaman to House

COUNTERING THE Opposition's remarks on a "deepening economic crisis in the country", Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman told Rajya Sabha on Wednesday that growth may have slowed down but the economy will never experience a "recession".

Comparing macroeconomic data — GDP growth, inflation rate, FDI inflows, foreign exchange reserves and demand side indicators — under the UPA-II (2009-14) and the previous NDA (2014-19) governments, she said growth was higher during the Narendra Modi government's first term while inflation was far lower.

"If you are actually looking at the economy with a discerning view, you see that growth may

have come down, but it's not a recession yet or it won't be a recession ever. And therefore, consciously, all of us have to rise above, because economy also has a very big foundation in sentiments," she said while replying to a discussion on the economic situation.

AS THEIR party workers and authorities readied Shivaji Park in Dadar for Thursday's inaugural of Shiv Sena chief Uddhav Thackeray as Chief Minister of Maharashtra, leaders of the Sena, NCP and Congress got down to business Wednesday evening, distributing berths and portfolios for the incoming

While Thackeray will be Chief Minister for the full-term. six others will be sworn in with him. NCP leader Praful Patel said it has been decided that the Assembly Speaker will be from the Congress and the Deputy Speaker from NCP. The lone Deputy Chief Minister will be from NCP.

Former Chief Minister Prithviraj Chavan is the frontrunner for the Speaker's post. From the NCP, Jayant Patil is tipped to be Dy CM but there is also a demand from the party rank and file that Ajit Pawar — he is back in the party fold after the collapse of the Devendra Fadnavis government which he had shored up — be named to the post.

"Two people from each party will take oath as ministers tomorrow. The Assembly session for the trust vote will have to be called before December 3. The cabinet expansion will happen

Bad loans under Mudra Kishore jump 107% in six months

12 PSU banks data reveal smallest ticket size Shishu loans fare best

THE NUMBER and value of bad loan accounts in the Kishore category of the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY) for a dozen public sector banks including State Bank of India, Canara Bank and Bank of Baroda, have jumped 107 per cent and 71 per cent, respectively, as on September 30, 2019 compared with March 31, 2019.
