# Six-year low — and slow

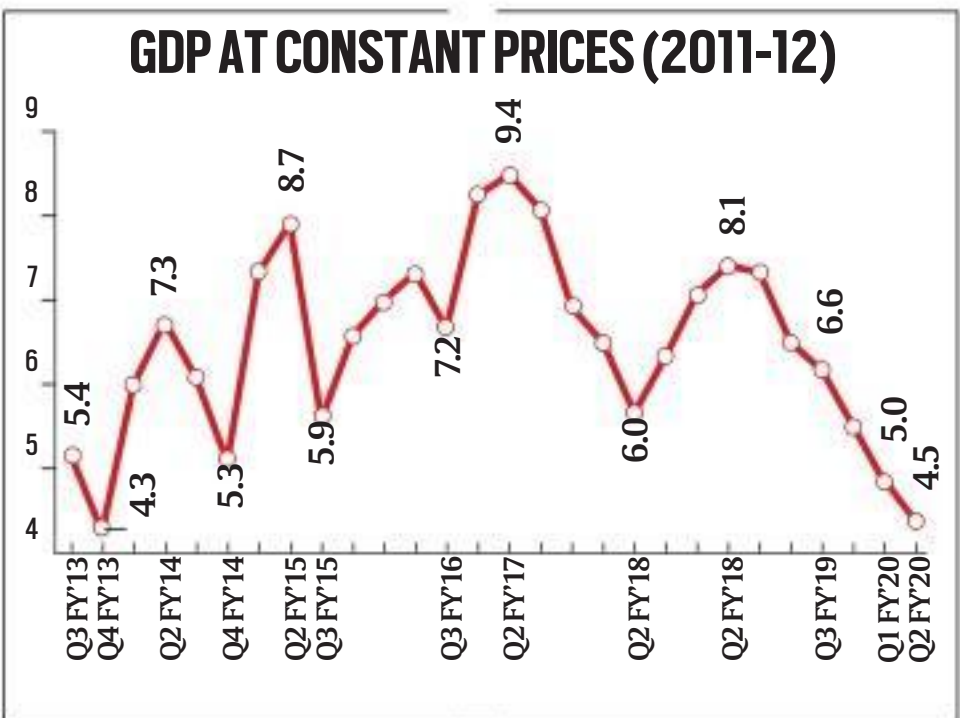
Expected to hit income growth, which would dent consumption demand

DROGGED DOWN by a contraction in manufacturing, weak investment, and lower consumption demand, India's GDP growth rate at 4.5 per cent for Q2, 2019-20, hit a 26-quarter low in July-September, data released by National Statistical Office Friday showed.

This is the lowest quarterly growth rate in the five-and-half years of the Narendra Modi-led NDA government. The previous low was 4.3 per cent during January-March 2012-13.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), scheduled to announce its bi-monthly monetary policy



Value Added (GVA), which is GDP minus net product taxes and reflects supply-side growth, has slowed to 4.3 per cent in July-September as against 6.9 per cent a year ago. With this, GDP growth rate for April-September, the first half of this fiscal, is now at 4.8 per cent as against 7.5 per cent growth in the year-ago period.

The growth rate has now slowed for the sixth consecutive quarter, declining by 3.6 percentage points during this period.

The nominal GDP growth rate, which accounts for inflation, slowed further from the first quarter to 6.1 per cent in July-September from double-digit level of 12 per cent in the corresponding period last year.

## Manmohan flags fear, India Inc's silence on slowdown is telling

CALLING THE 4.5 per cent growth for the second quarter ending September 2019 as "shock decline" and "worrisome", former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh Friday said that many industrialists have told him they lived in fear of harassment by government authorities.

His words, perhaps, found resonance in the silence of several leading voices in India Inc after the GDP figures came in.

The Confederation of Indian Industry, the leading industry body, skipped issuing a statement on the GDP numbers. Leading corporate lights active on Twitter Uday Kotak (CEO Kotak Mahindra Bank); Anand Mahindra (chairman, Mahindra Group); Harsh Goenka (chairman, RPG Enterprises); Nandan Nilekani (chairman, Infosys); Sanjiv Bajaj (MD Bajaj Finserv & Bajaj Holdings); Gautam Singhania (CMD Raymond Ltd); Vijay Shekhar Sharma (Founder CEO, Paytm); and Harsh Mariwala (chairman Marico) were prominent among many who chose to maintain silence on the GDP numbers on their

handles until late tonight.

In sharp contrast, when the government announced a cut in the corporate tax rate in September, the entire corporate sector had cheered the move saying it would spur growth.

On September 20, Anand Mahindra had tweeted: "Woke up in the US to this news. The best way to start the day. Not only because companies will pay less tax. But because this isn't just another policy tweak. @nsitharaman fired a shot that will be heard around the world. India has sent an invitation letter to global investors."

Similarly, Harsh Goenka had on September 20, tweeted, "Virat cut by FM #Corporatetax. Much needed boost to unleash 'animal spirits'. I now expect the sentiment to change and private investments to start flowing. Sensex 'boom'rah!." In another tweet, he wrote: "Truly showing that the Government knows best! #MarketsRejoice"

## Won't allow third country affect our ties: Gotabaya on India's China worry

IN ONE-ON-ONE talks for an hour Friday with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, visiting Sri Lanka President Gotabaya Rajapaksa is said to have conveyed that he will not allow "any third country or third force" to come in the way of the strong bilateral ties between Delhi and Colombo.

Modi announced a \$50-million Line of Credit for security and counter-terrorism, and another \$400 million for development and infrastructure projects in Sri Lanka.

This is Gotabaya's first overseas visit after he took charge of the country as President less than two weeks ago. He invited Modi to visit Sri Lanka as the first head of government after he assumed office.

Brother of Sri Lanka's Prime Minister and former President Mahinda Rajapaksa, Gotabaya is learnt to have conveyed to Modi that relations with India will be his "top priority".

In a public statement after the bilateral meeting at Hyderabad House, he tried to assuage Indian concerns on Chinese projects in the island country. "While with India, our

cooperation is multi-faceted, with priority given to security-related matters; With other countries, initiatives for cooperation are by and large economic and commercial (in nature)," he said.

"We will continue to work closely with India to ensure that the Indian Ocean remains a zone of peace." This was aimed at Delhi's concerns, stemming from its past experience with the Rajapaksas between 2005 and 2015 when Gotabaya was Defence Secretary under Mahinda Rajapaksa's Presidency, and Chinese ships and submarines had docked at Lankan ports.

Maritime security in mind, Modi, who called Sri Lanka as India's "closest maritime neighbour and a trusted friend", said that in line with the government's "Neighbourhood First" policy and SAGAR doctrine, India prioritised its relations with Sri Lanka. "The security and development of our two countries are inseparable. Therefore, it is natural that we should be aware of each other's safety and sensibilities," he said.

"A stable, secure and prosperous Sri Lanka is not only in India's interest but also in the interest of the entire Indian Ocean Region," he said.

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## Why this isn't a surprise and how Govt and RBI saw this coming more than a year ago

IN JUST about a year-and-a-half, India has hurtled down the economic growth path. The GDP grew at a robust 8.1 per cent in January-March 2018. Since then, it has decelerated every consecutive quarter and latest figures show it is estimated at 4.5 per cent for July-September 2019. The bottom to the downward

spiral is getting harder to predict. This sharp powering down has disrupted the plans of Corporate India.

Companies across sectors — from those making tractors to toothpaste — had, over the last two decades, been primed to plan for a trend growth rate of 8 per cent. Investments were made, loans taken, capacities built, and people employed accordingly.

This normalised assumption has been wrecked, with an almost halving of the growth rate.

There have been tell-tale signs of this dramatic unravelling since the collapse of IL&FS a year ago in September 2018. A string of events since then has led to a freeze in the credit market. The financial sector is on the brink. The Reserve Bank of India and

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## Zurich Airport wins bid to build airport at UP's Jewar

SWISS COMPANY Zurich Airport International AG will construct and develop the international greenfield airport at Jewar in Uttar Pradesh. The company Friday outbid three Indian competitors — Delhi International Airport Limited (DIAL), Adani Enterprises Limited and Anchorage Infrastructure Investments — after qualifying for the technical bid.

"The Swiss company has offered the maximum premium per passenger for the upcoming Jewar airport and has been selected as concessionaire. The bid will be placed before the monitoring and implementation committee on Monday, where approval from the state government will be sought. The bidding process went smoothly and we are looking forward to the results," Shailendra Bhatia, nodal officer of the Noida International Airport Limited, said.

According to officials, the Switzerland-based company made the highest return per passenger financial bid, offering Rs 400.97 premium per passenger (pax). Adani Enterprises placed a bid of Rs 361; DIAL of Rs 351 and Anchorage of Rs 205.

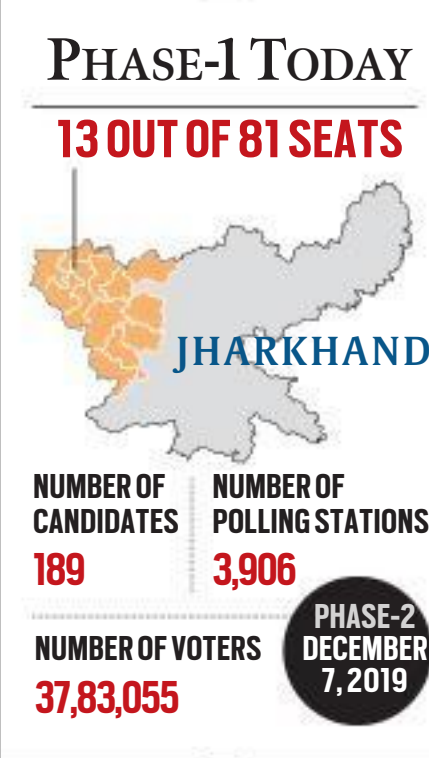

## For her praise of Godse, Pragya made to apologise twice in LS

UNDER FIRE for her remarks praising Mahatma Gandhi's assassin Nathuram Godse that forced her party to remove her from the consultative committee on defence, BJP Bhopal MP Pragya Singh Thakur had to apologise twice in Lok Sabha Friday after an angry Opposition rejected her first apology.

Her first apology, in which she also attacked Congress leader Rahul Gandhi for calling her a "terrorist", was rejected as "conditional" by the Opposition, forcing speaker Om Birla to call a meeting of floor leaders of parties to resolve the issue and resume normalcy in the House.

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## Rape-murder of vet: Four accused deflated scooter tyre before offering help

ONE OF them deflated the rear tyre of her two-wheeler parked at the toll plaza on the outskirts of Hyderabad. When she returned, two of them offered help. Scared by a truck crew "leering" at her, she took up the offer and waited at the spot. Three of them pounced from behind and dragged her to an abandoned room and raped her. She died of suffocation during the assault. They burned her body at an underpass.

This is the conclusion of police in Hyderabad based on the interrogation of four men who were arrested Friday for the alleged rape and murder of a 27-year-old veterinary doctor near the Shamshabad toll plaza on Wednesday night.

Those arrested have been identified as Mohammed Areef (26), Jollu Shiva (20), Jollu Naveen (20) and Chintakunta Chennakeshavulu (20), all truck

crew hailing from Narayanpet district. The four have been charged under IPC sections 302 (murder), 375 (rape) and 362 (abduction). On Friday, a few minutes after Cyberabad Police Commissioner V C Sajjanar announced the arrests, police found the charred remains of another woman near Shamshabad. Based on the crime scene, police

FOR ALL those who want to know about his "reincarnation" — from a wary China to millions of followers across the globe — the Dalai Lama has a very simple question: Why the hurry?

"Resolutions regarding my reincarnation have been adopted. But a few years ago, I was in the United States of America and I was asked about my reincarnation there. Then, I took off my spectacles and stated, how do I look? What is

the hurry for my reincarnation? Now, I am 84, but my health is good."

The remarks came at the end of an hour-long address by the Nobel laureate and 14th Dalai Lama in Dharamshala. In the audience were over 200 religious heads, including representatives of the Central Tibetan Administration (CTA), who had gathered for the three-day 14th Religious Conference.

Speaking to *The Indian Express*, a senior member of the CTA said: "A few years ago, His Holiness had said that he shall announce his reincarnation plans either at the age of 84 or

when he turns 90. The first Dalai Lama was the only one who had reached the age of 84... But since His Holiness has said today that he is in good health, we are sure that he will live a long life and shall announce his reincarnation at the age of 90."

At the conference, which ended Friday, the leaders unanimously passed a resolution that a decision on the reincarnation, including the announcement venue and timing, vests solely in the Dalai Lama.

The resolution also took a shot at China, which had issued an order in 2007 that a "reincarnation application must be filed

by all Buddhist temples in China before they are allowed to recognize individuals as (reincarnated teachers)".

Titled "Dharamshala Declaration", the resolution states: "If the Government of the People's Republic of China for political ends chooses a candidate for the Dalai Lama, the Tibetan people will not recognize and respect that candidate. Regarding the method of recognizing the future reincarnations of the Dalai Lama, the same unique Tibetan traditional method, which has been continuously used until now, will be followed. This method conforms

to be basic philosophy and tenets of the Buddhadharm and originated in Tibet over 800 years ago". In October, a Special General Meeting on Reincarnation in Dharamshala had passed a similar resolution.

On Thursday, Dr Lobsang Sangay, the CTA president, had told *The Indian Express*: "The Chinese want to interfere in selecting the reincarnated Lamas... They have already selected 300. Now, they say they have a list of 1,300 that they have selected, and given certificates as Lamas. The communist party is interfering in selecting Lamas".







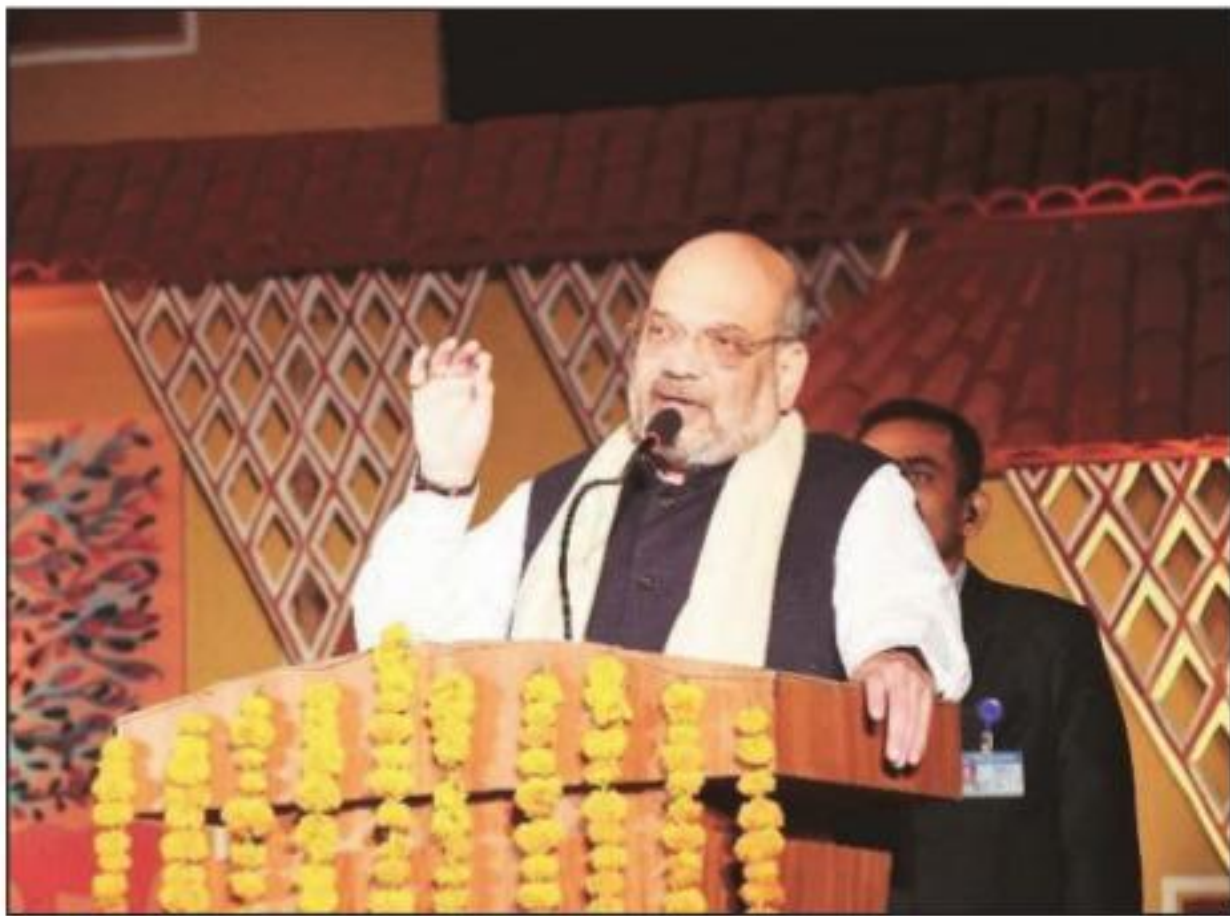

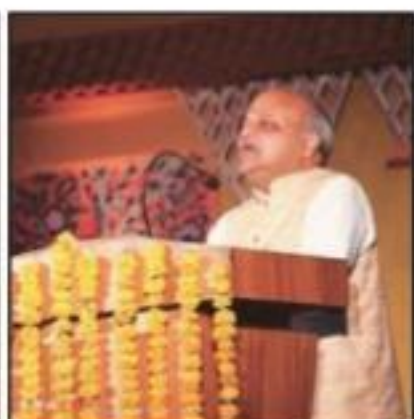

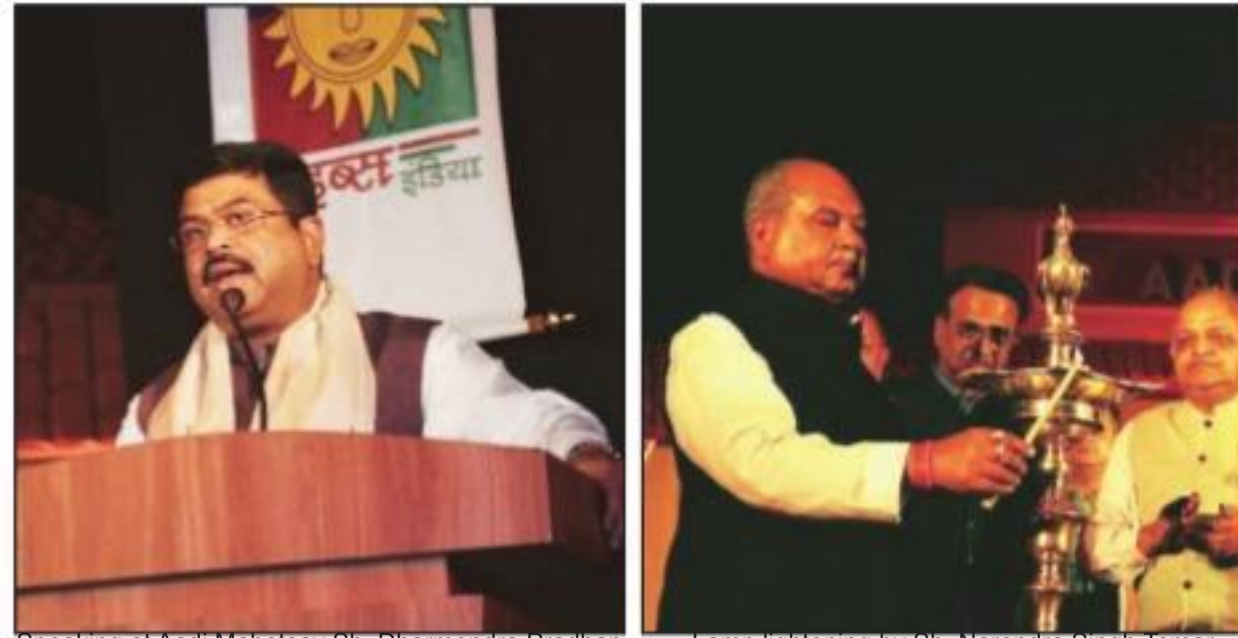

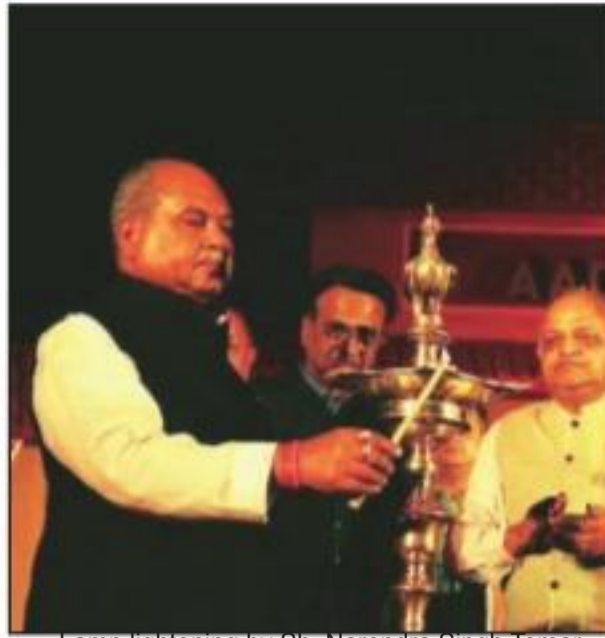

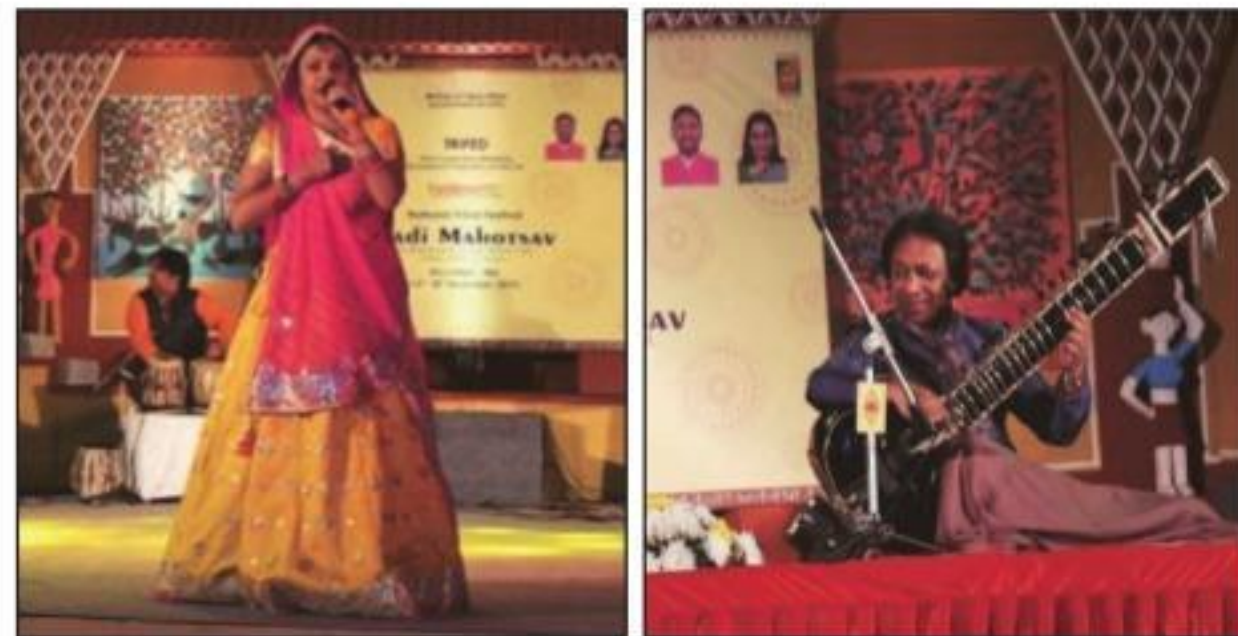

## ZURICH AIRPORT WINS FINANCIAL BID

## Jewar airport will give IGI a breather

At end of phase 1, airport will handle 12 million passengers every year, say officials

WITH A record-breaking financial bid for the greenfield airport in Jewar, the wheels have begun turning for the third airport in the national capital region, with phase 1 set to see the light of day by 2023.

According to officials, the financial bid by Zurich Airport International AG is the highest in the country's aviation sector so far. Under the proposal, the airport is expected to have six-eight runways once it becomes fully operational after all four phases are complete.

As of September 2019, Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport has the highest number of runways in India — three. O'Hare International Airport and the Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport have the most number of runways in the world — eight and seven, respectively.

"After technical bids are decided, the company that offers highest return per passenger is given the opportunity to become the concessionaire. In this case, the Swiss company made the highest bid we have seen in aviation. This is a positive sign for us since the bidding process was carried out in complete transparency. The people of NCR can expect a world class airport," said Shailendra Tripathi, nodal officer of Noida International Airport Limited.

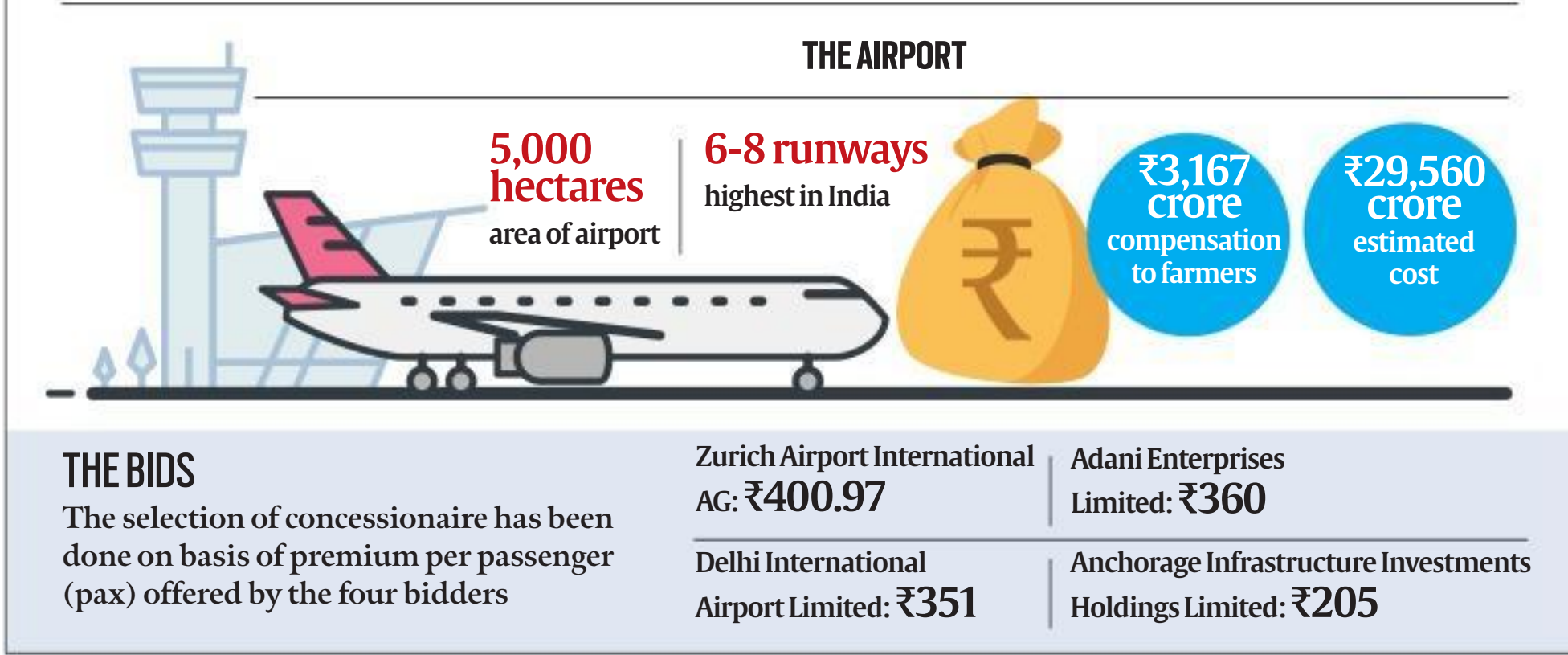
The Zurich Airport offered a bid of Rs 400.97 per passenger, followed by a bid of Rs 360 by Adani Group.

The Swiss Company is currently involved in eight airports in Latin America, and is looking at India as a "focus market". The company had sold its shares in Bengaluru's Kempegowda International Airport in 2017.

The airport in Jewar will be developed in four phases over the next 30 years. As per initial calculations, phase 1 will wit-

ness an approximate traffic of 12 million passengers per annum, which is expected to increase to 70 million passengers per annum by the end of phase 4.

The cost of the Jewar airport is set to increase from Rs 4,588 crore in the first phase to Rs 29,560 crore upon completion.

The Jewar airport will also be aimed at reducing burden on Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport, which is expected to reach its peak ca-

capacity of handling close to 110 million passengers in the next five-six years. It is proposed that the first phase will have two runways and two additional ones will come up in the following phase.

To ensure easy mobility to and from the airport, the Yamuna Expressway Industrial Development Authority (YEIDA) is planning to extend the Aqua Line towards the airport. According to officials, after a proposal was submitted by

the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation, an expert panel, including officials from the Noida Metro Rail Corporation, are currently examining the feasibility of the project which will be deliberated upon by the YEIDA.

With 998.13 hectares of land already acquired by the administration, airport officials are confident that the rest of the land will be made available in the month of December. The Jewar airport had earlier wit-

nessed a fair share of protests by villagers, who had alleged that they were not compensated adequately for the land that was acquired.

On September 23, more than 40 farmers had been detained while protesting for land compensation.

The new airport will be located about 72 km from Delhi airport, 40 km from Noida and Ghaziabad, 28 km from Greater Noida, 65 km from Gurgaon and 130 km from Agra.

## Real estate players hope airport will get growth on track

FORWARD MOVEMENT on the Jewar airport has given some impetus to the real estate industry, which hopes the project will spur demand.

"This will be a great boost for connectivity in the area, which will lead to a lot of potential for commerce, residential development and the hospitality sector. It can develop as a good residential option... and we can expect growth in population density," Jaxay Shah, national chairman, Confederation of Real Estate Developers Association of India (CREDAI), said.

Jagannarayan Padmanabhan, practice leader at CRISIL, said in a statement: "It will be important that all external connectivity issues are addressed on a war footing and an unencumbered site for the development of the new airport is also given to the concessionaire at the earliest."

Getamber Anand, MD, ATS Infrastructure, said it was clear that the "Noida story has arrived".

"It will be an exciting time since an international company will be building it. Noida will be on the path to become a global town in the coming five years. With the airport, jobs will be created since the manufacturing sector will also kick off. All of these factors are positives for the region."

While there was largely positive reception to the airport project taking off, some experts remained apprehensive about the immediate impact.

"A lot of evolution has taken place when it comes to merchandising in the aviation industry. The region might be conducive to a hotel industry or other jobs when the airport becomes operational. It is hard to co-relate the real estate industry with the airport since, given the demography, there is less

## Soon, seized liquor will be sold at cheaper rate

LIQUOR SEIZED by the Delhi Excise Department, which is usually destroyed, will soon be sold at a price 25 per cent cheaper than the market rates, official sources said Friday.

The excise information bureau (EIB), which is a wing of the department, usually seizes liquor smuggled from neighbouring states, or from bars serving alcohol without permits.

The seized bottles are subsequently destroyed. In 2018-19, the total worth of seized liquor was around Rs 15 crore.

Officials said that the proposal has been approved by the Finance Department. In the first phase, eight liquor vends have been identified where such liquor will be put on sale.

"The new policy may come into force in the first week of January. However, only seized alcohol that clears quality tests at accredited labs will be sold. Bottles that clear the test will be repacked," an official said.

The discount on a particular bottle would be on the price at which it was distilled or illegally imported from, the official added.

## Gurgaon hospital staffer held for molesting patient

New Delhi: A 29-year-old nursing assistant was arrested Thursday for allegedly molesting a semi-sedated patient admitted at a private hospital in Gurgaon.

SHO (Sushant Lok-I) Jagbir Singh said, "The man had been working at the hospital for a year. On Wednesday, he molested her when the patient was in her room post-surgery."

The 40-year-old woman had complained to the hospital administration Wednesday. A spokesperson for the hospital said the nursing assistant was suspended and was handed over to police. He is currently out on bail.

The patient is still being treated at the hospital, and will be provided counselling. **ENS**

## Student found dead at civic body hospital hostel room

A 26-YEAR-OLD medical student was found dead inside her hostel room at Darya Ganj's Kasturba Gandhi hospital Friday morning, police said.

DCP (Central) Mandeep Singh Randhawa said the woman, identified as V Monika, hailed from Telangana and allegedly "committed suicide by injecting herself with syringes which were found in her room".

A suicide note purportedly saying "no one is responsible for this... I am sorry mom, sorry dad... I love you all", was recovered from her hostel room, said a police officer.

According to police, Monika was a second-year post-graduate student of gynaecology at the North MCD hospital, and was allegedly depressed over the death of her grandmother.

Police said that prima facie, it appears that she committed suicide Thursday night, hours after she arrived in Delhi from Telangana, where the last rites of her grandmother were carried out. Her body was discovered around 10 am Friday, said police.

A police officer said, "When she did not take her parents' calls on Friday morning, they got worried and called her friend. The door was locked from inside, so the hostel administration was informed. Once they managed to break in, they saw her lying on the floor."

Police said that her parents told them that Monika was upset over losing her grandmother.

Police said that inquest proceedings have been initiated in the matter and all angles are being investigated. Monika's post-mortem will be conducted Saturday.

North MCD commissioner Varsha Joshi has asked senior officials of the hospital to prepare a report on the incident.

## Delhi govt forms panel that will clear all research on disability

TWO-AND-A-HALF-YEARS after Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act (RPWD) was implemented, Delhi government has become the first to constitute a six-member state-level committee on 'research on disability'. As mandated under the Act, no research can be carried out with disability as a subject of research without permission from this panel.

The committee comprises Persons with Disabilities (PwD),

with the Dean of Maulana Azad Medical College (MAMC) being its chairperson. It will be in place for three years.

"There were seven categories of disabilities under the Act earlier, but the new Act has extended the number to 21. This committee will monitor all kinds of research being conducted on disabled persons," Delhi Social Welfare Minister Rajender Pal Gautam told *The Indian Express*.

The Act covers research done on participants with locomotor disabilities, visual/hearing/speech disability, intellectual

(down syndrome, autism), thalassemia, hemophilia, sickle cell disease, Parkinson's, multiple sclerosis, mental illness, blindness as well as learning disabilities.

"Several research projects are being carried out on the subject and the purpose of the committee is to keep a tab on all of them. At present, every medical college has an ethical committee, but those mandated under the Act are above all," said Dr Satendra Singh, associate professor, University College of Medical Sciences, GTB, and a member of the committee.

## 2 others held woman as husband pulled the gun on her: Police

AS 21-YEAR-OLD Sahil Chopra allegedly pointed the pistol at his 20-year-old wife Nancy Sharma on the night of November 11, his two accomplices held her tightly to ensure she doesn't escape the fatal hit, said police.

Additional DCP (West) Sameer Sharma said, "Around six km away, the three men dumped Nancy's body behind bushes near Panipat refinery in Haryana, and returned to Delhi. They parked the car near Pankha Road, stayed at a guest house for a day and then went back home."

On Friday morning, the car, a Chevrolet Cruze, was recovered along with the pistol which was inside vehicle. Sharma said, "Sahil didn't think that his wife's body would be recovered or that police will be able to solve the case... he had no fear and was in Delhi the whole time."

Two weeks after Sharma was allegedly shot dead, Sahil was arrested along with a friend and a cousin. He led police to the

spot where Nancy was dumped.

"The four left Delhi together and carried alcohol in the car. They were drinking on the way. The murder appears to have been planned," said a police officer.

A day before Nancy was shot dead, the couple allegedly fought over food cooked at home, police said.

"This may have been one of the reasons... the two fought over petty issues ever since they got married in March. They first met at a birthday party and started hanging out. They also were in a live-in relationship before they decided to get married," said Sharma.

## Out to find love, man loses phone, cash and 2-wheeler

ON SEEING the matrimonial ad of a 38-year-old divorced man looking for a bride in a newspaper, a woman approached him, and the two decided to meet at an East Delhi mall. A day later, the man woke up in a park — with his phone, Rs 1,000 and his two-wheeler missing.

Police said the man, a resident of Krishna Nagar, was looted by the woman after she allegedly spiked his cold drink. "The incident took place three weeks ago but the man was in shock, so he didn't file a complaint. On Thursday, we filed an FIR under IPC sections 328 (causing hurt by means of poison) and 379 (theft)," said a police officer.

Police said they are looking for the woman, and analysing call records to ascertain her identity. "The incident took place in a park. We are analysing CCTV footage from the mall," said an officer.

## SCHOOLS RELEASE CRITERIA

# This time too, home location key to nursery admission

THE ENTRY-LEVEL admission process to Delhi's private schools — a process spanning over three-and-a-half months and consisting of several rounds to admit children into nursery, KG and class I — began Friday.

According to provisions of the Right to Education Act, all recognised private schools of the city are required to reserve 25% of their seats for children from economically weaker sections, those from 'disadvantaged groups' and children with special needs. Admissions against these are conducted through a centralised process of draw of lots by the Delhi government's Directorate of Education (DoE), for which guidelines will be issued later by the government.

The process, which commenced Friday, is for the rest of the 'open seats' in these schools — a hugely competitive process with parents vying for a spot in the more well-known schools.

In an attempt to keep admission to these early classes as objective and fair as possible, a 'points system' is followed. In this, schools are free to select a set of criteria against which applicants will be allocated points.

The most common criteria chosen by almost every school is

that of distance. The second most common criteria is the applicant having a sibling in the school, or the applicant having a parent who is an alumni of the school.

While schools are free to select their criteria, there is a list of 51 criteria which are disallowed by the Directorate of Education on grounds that they are discriminatory. Among these are parents' education, professional field/expertise, vegetarianism, non-alcoholic, non-smoker parent, and attitudes and values.

At Vasant Valley School, 30 points are allotted to those living within 10 km of the school and 15 points for those living beyond 10 km. At Springdales School Pusa Road, 39 points are allotted to those who reside in list of areas provided in the registration form, while the rest are allotted 29 points. At Air Force Bal Bharti School, those living within 5 km are allotted 25 points, those living between 5 and 10 km are al-

lotted 20 points, and those living between 10 and 15 km are allotted 15 points.

Apart from the alumni and sibling criteria, there are some additional criteria selected by schools. Air Force Bal Bharti School allots 10 points for children having only a single parent, 10 for a single girl child and points for children of former or deceased defence personnel or IAF employees.

The junior schools of DPS RK Puram offer points for girl applicants, as does Mother's International School. Vasant Valley School offers points for parents' achievements in sports, social service, the arts, awards received and for original research and publications — 2 points if it is at the state level, 4 points if it is at the national level and 6 points if it is at the international level.

Apart from these schools, most schools reserve 20% of their seats under a 'management quota', which are filled at the discretion of the school management. The Delhi government had attempted to scrap this category but this was challenged in the Delhi High Court by an association of private schools. The High Court had upheld the challenge observing that "promoters of a school who make investment at their own personal risk are fully entitled to full autonomy in administration, including right to admit students".



1. SEBI, vide its final order dated 11.2.2016 (“final order”), found that BAFIL and its directors, Mr. Innsaipillai Lurdpillai Joseph Jeyaraaj, Mrs. Prakasam Sagaya Packia Santhi, Mr. Irudayaraj Manickam Pillai Jeyabalan and Mr. Santhanapeter (collectively referred to as “the defaulters”) were engaged in the illegal fund mobilising activity by floating/ sponsoring/ launching, unregistered/ unauthorised Collective Investment Schemes (CIS), in violation of the provisions of section 12(1B) of the SEBI Act, 1992 and regulation 3 of the SEBI (Collective Investment Schemes) Regulations, 1999. Details of the defaulters:

The final order also observed that “ as per the auditor's certificate, as on March 31, 2014, the Company had collected around Rs.84.30 Crores from 1,30,189 investors and claims to have paid back around Rs.10.41 Crores to 12,970 investors and that the outstanding amount is Rs.73.89 Crores”.

3. The final order inter alia directed the defaulters to wind up the existing CIS and refund, through ‘Bank Demand Draft’ or ‘Pay Order’, the money collected by BAFIL under the schemes with returns which are due to its investors as per the terms of offer within a period of three months from the date of the final order and thereafter within a period of fifteen days, to submit a winding up and repayment report to SEBI in accordance with the SEBI (Collective Investment Schemes) Regulations, 1999, including the trail of funds claimed to be refunded, bank account statements indicating refund to the investors and receipt from the investors acknowledging such refunds.

4. The defaulters filed an appeal before the Hon'ble Securities Appellate Tribunal (“SAT”) in Appeal No.73/2016, which was disposed off by SAT without any relief to the defaulters. The directions issued by SAT were also not complied with by the defaulters.

5. In view thereof, SEBI has initiated recovery proceedings for recovering a sum of Rs.84,30,01,000/- along with interest at actuals and cost etc., incurred in respect of the recovery of the said sum and in pursuance thereof, has attached the bank and demat accounts of the defaulters, while also attaching the movable and immovable properties/assets of the defaulters. SEBI also appointed an Administrator to inter alia perform the functions under the SEBI (Appointment of Administrator and Procedure for Refunding to the Investors) Regulations, 2018, which inter alia include sale of properties of the defaulters to realize monies for making payments to the investors, call for claims from investors, verify the same and make payments to them.

6. Accordingly, by this public notice, the investors (who had invested in the unregistered/unauthorized CIS sponsored and continued by BAFIL) of BAFIL are advised to submit their claims along with ORIGINAL proof of investment against BAFIL and annexure to the Administrator's address as detailed below: (by communication as per S.No: 7 ONLY)



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NOIDA, GURGAON SEE CLEAR SKIES TOO

Rain, strong winds push pollutants away, air now in ‘satisfactory’ range

WITH POLLUTANTS pushed out by strong winds and rain over the past couple of days, Delhi's air quality improved further to the 'satisfactory' range Friday for the first time in over a month.

The city's average air quality index (AQI) was 84 Friday. The AQI last reached 'satisfactory' levels on October 5, when it was 98, as per the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).

Kuldeep Srivastava, scientist at the India Meteorological Department, said winds have been strong over the past few days, peaking at 35 kmph Thursday.

“Air quality has been improving over the past few days, and as a result, concentration of pollutants is already in the lower end... The air quality had improved a lot on Thursday because of strong winds, rain and hail brought on by a passing



Air quality is expected to start deteriorating Saturday

Western Disturbance in parts of Haryana and Uttar Pradesh. Even though wind speed dropped Friday, it was enough to keep pushing pollutants out,” Srivastava said.

A Western Disturbance is an extratropical storm originating in the Mediterranean region that

brings sudden rain during non-monsoon months to northwest India. Scattered rains and hail had lashed parts of Delhi-NCR on Wednesday and Thursday and the AQI in the region reached 'moderate' category.

On Friday, parts of the NCR also recorded 'satisfactory' air

PM10 — fine particles suspended in the air — in Delhi-NCR was 45.2 and 84.6 respectively between noon Thursday and 8pm Friday, which is below the 24-hour acceptable standards of 60 and 100 micrograms per cubic metre air.

The Delhi Pollution Control Committee's air monitoring stations in Delhi also recorded a fall in real-time concentration of particulate matter in the city. The lowest reading of PM2.5 at Mandir Marg monitoring station was 19 at 7 pm, and at Anand Vihar it was 22 at 3 am.

However, the relief may be short-lived for the city as the Centre-run System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Research (SAFAR) has forecast a deterioration to 'poor' air quality Saturday.

Impact of stubble burning in nearby states on Delhi's PM2.5 levels was estimated to be 5% Friday and is expected to go up to 6% Saturday, according to SAFAR.

HC irked over capital's dark spots

New Delhi: Observing that incidents of crimes against women, children and the elderly are on the rise, the Delhi High Court Friday expressed anguish over existing dark spots in the city despite an earlier order to ensure that the same be removed. A bench of Justices G S Sistani and A J Bhambhani also directed Delhi Chief Secretary to examine the possibility of using money from the Nirbhaya fund for the purpose, which it said will also help the overburdened Delhi Police.

The directions were issued after the bench was informed by the counsel for the Delhi Police that the unused amount in the Nirbhaya Fund was over Rs 3,200 crore in 2017, out of which Rs 1,000 crore was earmarked for certain projects not yet functional.

“This...will help curb crimes against women and children,” the bench said. **ENS**

THE DELHI government Friday formed a 13-member committee of senior advocates to recommend ways to spend a Rs 50 crore corpus, announced in the annual budget in February, meant for the welfare of lawyers practising in the national capital.

Dec 16 rape: Court seeks convicts’ legal options

A DELHI court Friday asked the four convicts in the December 16, 2012 rape and murder case and their counsel to apprise it of the status of their legal remedy options on December 13.

Additional Sessions Judge Satish Arora also pulled up the special public prosecutor for not appearing in court.

On October 29, the Tihar Jail authorities informed the court that the four convicts — Vinay Sharma, Akshay Kumar, Mukesh Singh and Pawan Gupta — on death row had “exhausted” all legal remedies, “except the provision of filing of mercy petition” before the President of India.

However, the amicus curiae in the case, Vrinda Grover, told the court that only Sharma has filed a mercy petition. While Akshay Kumar Singh is planning to file a review petition, Mukesh and Pawan Gupta are yet to file a

curative petition, Grover said.

“No warrant is to be issued till all remedies are available. We are quite far from judicial and subsequently administrative remedies,” Grover told the court.

Advocate Jitender Kumar Jha, who appeared on behalf of the victim's mother, said that the court must first issue the warrants for the death sentence. “One by one, they (convicts) are killing time... Only once we moved this application the wheels of justice started moving,” said Jha.

The judge told the counsel appearing for the victim's mother: “Let the remedy be exhausted... When the mercy petition is pending it cannot be done like that. I do not know when the mercy petition will be filed and I have to wait for that result. But I give you my word, the day the report is filed with me, I will decide the matter then and there.”

The judge also pulled up the Special Public Prosecutor Rajiv Mohan's proxy counsel after the SPP did not appear in court.

Woman dead while boarding train, family claims help took time

A VISIT to Delhi's Medanta hospital from UP's Shahjahanpur for her daughter's treatment took a fatal turn for a woman, who fell on the tracks while boarding a moving train at the New Delhi Railway station Wednesday.

The victim, Neelam Saxena, was on her way home to UP with her husband and two daughters, and was trying to board Kashi Vishwanath Express. According to police, Saxena fell in the gap between the train and the platform.

The family also alleged that the Railway Police Force (RPF) took over 40 minutes to arrange a cutter, and then took another hour to pull Saxena out. “They told us that they didn't have the equipment and that it would take some time to get the cutters,”

claimed her daughter, Anushka. RPF inspector Bhupinder Singh said, “We rushed to the spot with gas cutters and pliers. It took us an hour because we had to cut all the steps of the footboard.”

A N Jha, Senior Divisional Security Commissioner, RPF, claimed said that Saxena was trying to board a moving train. She was declared dead on arrival at the Lady Hardinge Hospital.

The victim's husband, Dinesh Chand Saxena (46), said, “We got late to the railway station as we got stuck in traffic. When we reached the platform, the train had started moving... I helped my daughters board... but Neelam fell. We screamed for help and somebody pulled the chain to stop the train.”

In separate incidents, two other persons fell trying to board a moving train at Nizamuddin Railway station. They were pulled out in time by RPF.

HC: Clear encroachers around dargah

New Delhi: The Delhi High Court has ordered the appointment of the Chief Executive Officer of Delhi Waqf Board within six weeks and directed the board to “commence in right earnest” the proceedings for removal of encroachers in and around the tomb and dargah of Sufi Saint Hazrat Khwaja Baqi Billah in Paharganj, Justice Prathiba M Singh said the eviction drive shall be concluded within three months from the date on which the new CEO takes charge.

Chemical deaths: Truck driver held

New Delhi: A week after three people were killed after falling from their bike on a chemical on the road, a 45-year-old truck driver was arrested. On November 23, the chemical, suspected to be phenol, leaked from the truck on the road in north Delhi's Kashmere Gate. Later, three men on a bike fell on it and died due to the burn injuries. During questioning, the driver, identified as Mahender Bil, said he knew the truck was leaking but wasn't aware of the accident. **ENS**

ADMITTED UNDER EWS CATEGORY, HE SAYS OTHERS NOT PUNISHED

Barred from school for hookah smoking video, teen moves court

A 15-YEAR-OLD boy has moved the Delhi High Court claiming that he was stopped from attending classes on the ground that he was seen smoking hookah in a social media video.

The applicant, who reportedly received admission under the economically weaker section category in the school, sought direction to the school authorities to let him continue his studies, pointing out that the current or-

der violated his “fundamental right to education”. The application also claimed that the boy's friends, who were also seen in the video, were not barred from attending classes.

The petition states: “Sometime in August 2019, the petitioner (minor) along with few friends went to a pub at Kalkaji to celebrate a birthday... It happened that all the friends, including him, smoked hookah and one of them recorded a nine second video.” It said that one of the friend uploaded the video on Instagram, which was brought

to the notice of the principal on October 8, 2019.

“The principal was so infuriated that despite regret by the petitioner as well as by his parents, she (the principal) did not allow the petitioner to attend classes from October 9, 2019, onwards,” the plea stated, adding that none of the boy's friends, who were at the party, were barred from attending classes.

The petition, which is likely to be heard next week, also said that the child's parents were called again and told to “withdraw” him from the school.

Seeking direction to Delhi government's education department and school, the petition, filed through advocates Ashok Agarwal and Kumar Utkarsh, stated that the action has resulted in agony and harassment to both the child and his parents.

It said that since he belongs to EWS category, he is entitled to continue his studies up to class XII under the category and added that the “government of Delhi has a legal duty to enforce” the Rules on Free and Compulsory Education.

## Venkaiah suggests committee to check children being exposed to pornography

EXPRESSING CONCERN over children being exposed to pornography through social media, Vice-President M Venkaiah Naidu on Friday asked a group of Rajya Sabha members to come up with solutions to tackle the issue.

Speaking during the Zero Hour on Friday, Naidu said, “We have to come out with some concrete suggestions.” He also said that he can “advise the Minister of Communication and the Minister of Information and Broadcasting on this”.

Naidu stated that a discussion on the topic was held on Thursday in the House. Naming Congress's

Jairam Ramesh, BJP's Vinay P Sahasrabudhe, TMC's Sukhendu Sekhar Ray and DMK's Tiruchi Siva, Naidu said that these members can “take the initiative and call a

group of MPs, discuss this issue of pornography in social media and the effect of it on the children and all”.

Calling it a “very serious issue”, Naidu said, “Please, see to it that some meaningful solution can be found through a firm action, social as well as legislative action, at the earliest because this is assuming alarming proportions.”

He said that parents, “particularly mothers”, are “very much worried and agitated at homes, and we can interact with various people”.

Naidu said that many of them may not express themselves publicly, but they are “disturbed”.

He asked Ramesh to “take initiative to call his other friends and whoever is interested can be co-opted”. He clarified that it will not be an official committee, but “in the larger interest of the country” and added that “we, the House of Elders, should really do something in this regard and come forward”.

# States strong if Union strong, says Jairam

THE RAJYA Sabha on Friday witnessed a lively debate on Centre-state relations and federalism as it took up for discussion a private member resolution moved by MDMK member Vaiko seeking amendments to the Constitution to bring back subjects that were transferred from the State List to the Concurrent List in the last 70 years and ensure that the residuary powers are vested with the states by reviewing and restructuring the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution.

His resolution also wanted the government to allocate more funds to states to ensure they are financially empowered.

The two-and-a-half-hour debate saw Congress's Jairam Ramesh and BJP members Rakesh Sinha and Shiv Pratap Shukla opposing Vaiko's main demand, and members from many regional parties like RJD, AAP and TRS backing him.

Vaiko's demand that the post of the Governor be abolished found support in AAP's Sanjay Singh.

Ramesh said “tinkering with the Seventh Schedule will open up Pandora's box” and “giving the residuary powers from the Centre to the States will be a very retrogressive move”. He said transferring items from the Concurrent List back to the State List will be detrimental not for the Centre but to the States.

Initiating the debate, Vaiko asked the House to make a distinction between unity and uniformity. He argued that residuary powers that are in the Union List should be included in the State List and items like education be deleted from the Concurrent List and added to the State List.

He said subjects like education are in the Concurrent list “only for namesake”. “Through the new education policy, they are thrusting one nation, one ration card, one Aadhaar card, one language, one religion.

Where are we leading to? Finally, you won't have that one nation... Are you going to do like the Nazis and Fascists in Germany and Italy?” he said.

He said India is not a nation but a multi-national State, a point strongly rebutted by Sinha in his speech later.

Ramesh said that while he sympathised with the spirit of Vaiko's resolution, some of its aspects would be detrimental to national interest. He asked how subjects like population control, forests, education and administration of justice, which went from State List to Concurrent List by the 42nd amendment to the Constitution, be switched back as the central government has a key role in all these matters.

He argued that chief ministers of all parties often demand greater power from New Delhi, but are not prepared to devolve more powers to panchayats and nagar palikas.

Arguing that no Constitution can be divorced from its historical context, he said the historical context was that “Gandhi, Nehru, Patel, Ambedkar, Azad, Rajendra Prasad, Syama Prasad Mookerjee, all wanted a strong Centre. All wanted the Government of India to be strong because if the Government of India is not strong, India is going to wither away. I sympathise with Vaiko's sentiments (but) I think Vaiko is going to the other extreme of denying the centrality of the Central Government.”

He said “no State should forget that they are part of the Indian Union and they are strong if the Union is strong” and argued that “cooperative federalism is the only way.”

TMC's Derek O'Brien expressed concern on the role of Governors, citing developments in Maharashtra and West Bengal. He also favoured bringing back the subject of education to the State List, saying that state governments would not mind spending extra on education. AIAMDK's Vijila Sathyananth backed the demand, and BJD's Amar Patnaik emphasised the need for greater financial autonomy for states.

# questions govt over machines to cut crops

AAP LEADER Sanjay Singh on Friday asked the government how many machines to cut crops and thus prevent crop burning have been provided to three states.

Speaking in Rajya Sabha, Singh said that Union Minister for Environment, Forests and Climate Change Prakash Javadekar had told the House that the government had given the three states 55,000 machines, but an affidavit in the Supreme Court mentions that only 20,000 of these machines have been given. He wanted Union Minister of State for Panchayati Raj, Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Parshottam Rupala to clarify the exact number.

Rupala told the House that according to the figures available with his department, the government has given 55,000 machines, and that is the “perfect figure”. He said that machines have also been shared with the Delhi government, but the “it has not been well organised in the Delhi state”.

Nominated member Rakesh Sinha asked the minister about the long-term plan to tackle the problem of crop burning. He said that when the crop burning takes place, there is hue and cry, but “is the government preparing any futuristic plan?” he asked.

Rupala informed the House that a committee has been created which will come up with a new policy to tackle the issue. He added that crop burning is related to farming practice, and even farmers “don't enjoy” burning the crops, but because there is little time between the cultivation and sowing of the next crop, they do it.

BJP's Harnath Singh Yadav asked Rupala about the number of industrialists who have been jailed and why only news of farmers being jailed for crop burning had come up. Rupala said that he cannot answer the question as it was not relevant to his ministry, but assured Yadav that government was willing to provide machines and technology to all farmers.

**PRATIMA BHOUMIK**, BJP MP FROM TRIPURA WEST, TOLD **AVISHEK G DASTIDAR** THAT FARMERS IN BORDER AREAS OF THE STATE ARE SUFFERING LOSSES DUE TO FLOODLIGHTS AND NEED TO BE GIVEN COMPENSATION.



### Why do you think farmers need compensation?

In Tripura, the situation is different from other states. We are surrounded by Bangladesh on three sides. A large portion of the international border is lit with floodlights. Because of those lights at night, the paddy crop doesn't grow properly as photosynthesis can't take place. So the yield is low.

### How long has this problem been there?

Ever since the floodlights have come up.

### Has this been scientifically verified by some competent agency?

Those with, say 1 acre land worth of paddy cultivation, lose around 50 per cent of the yield as that much portion comes under floodlights. Overall, farmers lose around 10-20 per cent of the yield to this unnatural cause.

### How have you taken up the matter with the government?

I have met the Minister of State for Agriculture and apprised him of the situation. He has assured me that he would look into the matter. Something needs to be done and the government must intervene, that's why I raised this in the House today.

### How much compensation do you think is appropriate?

Affected farmers should get compensation twice a year for the loss. That way, they will be suitably protected from this loss.

## MEETING HALFWAY

WHEN SPEAKER Om Birla called the floor leaders to discuss the course of action following the Opposition's unwillingness to accept Pragya Singh Thakur's apology, Samajwadi Party veteran Mulayam Singh Yadav left the meeting midway. Mulayam, who suggested on the floor of the House that the proceedings be adjourned for a discussion among the leaders, said he could not sit through the "screaming and shouting". Apparently, the treasury benches and opposition locked horns during the meeting too. "Such things never happened in our time. Nobody knows who is speaking and who is listening. How can you come to a point when everyone is shouting?" the former UP CM said.

## QUESTION OF SEAT

DURING QUESTION Hour in the Rajya Sabha, Congress's Jairam Ramesh wanted to question Union minister Piyush Goyal after he had responded to a supplementary question by Ramesh. Vice-President M Venkaiah Naidu disallowed it. At the end, Naidu appreciated that after a long time the Rajya Sabha had taken up all 15 questions and all Zero Hour submissions, to which Ramesh — who had changed his seat to come in front of Naidu, closer to the treasury benches — interjected that he was not allowed to ask an important supplementary. Naidu said he couldn't be allowed to speak as he was not in his seat, to which Goyal laughingly added "Sir, he is coming closer to us" just as the House was adjourned.

## PROBE CLOUD

THE RAILWAY Ministry has initiated a Vigilance inquiry against the entire team that made the Vande Bharat Express train sets in Integral Coach Factory (ICF), Chennai. Questionnaire has been served to at least nine top officers who worked on the project, including the former GM of ICF who retired some time ago. One of the officers on the list is a serving GM in a Railways, while another is tipped to be a GM soon. While serving questionnaire is considered a first step before launching a full-blown Vigilance probe, the officers are nonetheless terming this a 'witch hunt'. The ministry is in the process of recasting the specifications of the trainset project to float a fresh tender for future procurement.

# Bill on e-cigarettes faces hurdles in RS as 2 Oppn MPs move resolutions

THE GOVERNMENT may face some hurdles in the passage of a Bill to prohibit e-cigarettes as two Opposition members in Rajya Sabha have moved statutory resolutions objecting to promulgation of an ordinance that the Bill seeks to replace.

Rajya Sabha will discuss The Prohibition of Electronic Cigarettes (Production, Manufacture, Import, Export, Transport, Sale, Distribution, Storage and Advertisement) Bill, 2019 next. However, MPs K K Ragesh of CPM and T Subbarami Reddy of Congress have moved resolutions against the issuance of the ordinance banning e-cigarettes on September 18.

The Bill — passed by Lok Sabha on Wednesday — aims to ban all commercial operations for the trade of e-cigarettes.

Replying the debate in the Lower House, Minister of Health and Family Welfare Harsh Vardhan dispelled doubts of members about the proposed legislation. Referring to a survey, he said, "The use of e-cigarettes in India was found in only 0.02 per cent of the population. However, during surprise school inspections by the school management, we found 150 vaping devices in the school bags of children in a school in Delhi itself. We cannot assume the problem is not growing. Regulation is not enough. A complete ban was absolutely necessary."

Justifying the ordinance, Vardhan said, "The ministry was also cognizant and aware of the fact that there was an announced entry of a leading company 'Juul' towards the end of this year in India. This leading company is a manufacturer of e-cigarettes. This global giant would have taken the Indian

market by storm. The need of the hour was preventive action and immediately, the ordinance was promulgated on 18th of September, 2019."

He added, "In a country like India, it is difficult to ban a product which has a large consumer base and social acceptance... Since e-cigarettes have a small consumer base, ban will be very highly effective in the initial, like nipping it in the bud."

About two dozen members participated in the debate.

Congress leader Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury, who moved a resolution objecting to the ordinance, questioned the urgency of its promulgation. "Minister was talking about Juul. Only the scare of Juul Company has propelled this government to invoke the ordinance route. Yes, ordinance could be promulgated but it should be promulgated in emergency. The government cannot invoke ordinance in such a supercilious way or casual way," Chowdhury said.

He also raised the issue of misuse of power by central or state government officers given under the Bill. "Minister's legislative document, he has given simply no-holds-barred weaponry to law enforcement agencies," he said.

Chowdhury said 10 people die every second due to tobacco use, and the government should bring a robust and comprehensive legislation to save them.

# India, Japan to engage in 2+2 dialogue today

AHEAD OF Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's visit to India mid-December, India and Japan are going to hold the inaugural meeting of India-Japan Foreign and Defence Ministerial Dialogue (2+2) on Saturday in Delhi.

So far, only India and the US have the 2+2 ministerial mechanism, although India and Australia also have the 2+2 at the official level. With this, India has 2+2 mechanism with all the Quad countries. India, Australia, US and Japan have met under the rubric of Quadrilateral since 2017 at the official level, and at the foreign ministers' level in September this year. India and the US 2+2 level dialogue is expected to take place on December 18 in Washington DC this year.

A statement by the Ministry of External Affairs said, "The 2+2 meeting would provide an opportunity for the two sides to review the status of and exchange further views on strengthening defence and security cooperation between India and Japan so as to provide greater depth to the

## Format may boost strategic trust

INDIA AND Japan will discuss their diplomatic and national defence strategies, as the top ministers meet from both sides. Taking a leaf out of the book of the Indo-US 2+2 engagement this will be a top level exchange of ideas at the political level — an upgrade from the official level 2+2 between the two countries. This format is expected to boost the strategic trust between Delhi and Tokyo significantly.

'India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership'.

It said that the two sides will also exchange views on the situation in the Indo-Pacific region and their respective efforts under India's 'Act East Policy' and Japan's 'Free and Open Indo-Pacific Vision' for achieving their shared objective of peace, prosperity and progress to realise a better future for the people of the two countries and the region.

This meeting is being held after the decision taken by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Japan PM Abe during the 13th India-Japan Annual Summit held in Japan in October 2018 to institute a Foreign and Defence Ministerial Dialogue for further

deepening bilateral security and defence cooperation.

While Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will head the Indian delegation for 2+2, the Japanese delegation will be led by Foreign Affairs Minister Toshimitsu Motegi and Minister of Defence Taro Kono.

Sources said the meeting between the two defence and foreign ministers will feed into the strategic component of Abe's visit, which is expected to take place in mid-December.

In September 2017, when Abe last came to India for the bilateral summit, he visited Ahmedabad and a roadshow was organised to welcome him.

## Petition in SC for stay on Electoral Bond Scheme

THE ASSOCIATION for Democratic Reforms (ADR) on Friday moved the Supreme Court seeking a stay on the Electoral Bond Scheme, 2018.

In an application, the ADR referred to alleged objections raised by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to the scheme.

The plea said documents obtained under the Right to Information (RTI) Act showed that the "Reserve Bank of India gave repeated warnings to the government against the electoral bond scheme stating that it has the potential to increase black money circulation, money laundering, cross-border counterfeiting and forgery."

In a letter dated January 30, the RBI raised concerns regarding the proposed amendment to the RBI Act for enabling

Scheduled Banks to issue Electoral Bonds, but the concerns "were summarily dismissed by the Finance Ministry", the petition said.

"The RBI again raised concerns... highlighting that globally, there are hardly any precedents in recent times for issuance of bearer bonds and recommended safeguards to minimise misuse..." it said, adding that then RBI Governor Urjit Patel too had conveyed his reservations on two occasions to the government.

"Not only were the objections raised by the RBI disregarded, but even the suggestions made to make the scheme less vulnerable to fraud were ignored. The only suggestion which was accepted was regarding restricting the validity of these electoral bearer bonds to 15 days," it said. ADR and NGO Common Cause had moved the Supreme Court in September 2017 against the Scheme.

## Govt extends FASTag deadline to December 15

GIVING VEHICLE owners more time, the government on Friday extended by 15 days the deadline by which toll on national highways would be accepted through FASTags only. Instead of December 1, the deadline is now December 15.

The National Highways Authority of India said it was ready to roll out the new system by December 1. "It appears that a large number of people are yet to obtain the tags. This extension is to facilitate them," said a senior official. Accordingly, an NHAI release said all toll plaza stands were fitted with the equipment to read FASTags but the earlier provision of charging a vehicle double the toll if it entered a lane without a tag will not be effective on December 1.

# State of economy alarming: BJP allies

EVEN AS India's GDP growth rate for the second quarter of 2019-20 hit a 26-quarter low, allies of the ruling BJP did not mince words on the prevailing economic situation. One ally pointed to a "talent deficit" in the government, while another asked the government to hold an urgent meeting of political leaders and economists to find a way out of the crisis. BJP leaders, meanwhile, avoided making public remarks on the economy.

"The state of the economy is alarming, we all are concerned," SAD leader Naresh Gujral told *The Indian Express*. "It is causing alarm because of the joblessness and lack of growth which is leading to unemployment."

Articulating the disquiet among NDA partners, Gujral said the BJP had not convened any meeting of allies to discuss serious issues. "The allies are quite unhappy. The oldest ally, Shiv Sena, has already walked out and others are waiting at the departure lounge," Gujral said. "Allies are not vying for positions, but there has to be consultation."

JD(U) leader K C Tyagi said his party was concerned about the falling growth rate, transfer of PSU assets to private parties and gloom in the agriculture sector which triggers exodus from villages. "The government should not ignore or ridicule warnings of economists or former RBI governors. It should open modes of communication, there should be a meeting of political leaders and economists. People like (former PM) Manmohan Singh should be called to discuss the issue. Because this is not a matter of confrontation, it is a matter of consultation," Tyagi told *The Indian Express*.

"Being a socialist party, the JD(U) has serious concerns about the pace in which assets of PSU are being sold to private firms. Selling PSU assets for revenue collection has proved to be a wrong method of dealing with economic crisis. During Atal Bihari Vajpayee's time, there was a ministry for it, but it did not yield results. Even in Manmohan Singh's term it happened but with no results," he said.

According to Tyagi, the government should not "ignore or

ridicule" warnings from economists. "Former RBI governors have been giving warnings," he said.

Gujral, senior leader of SAD, one of the BJP's oldest allies, pointed to a "talent deficit" in the Narendra Modi cabinet. "There is a talent deficit in the cabinet today. We have seen that ministries manned by competent ministers are doing well. Not that there is a dearth of efficient people in BJP benches. Besides, some ministers are overburdened," Gujral said.

BJP leaders avoided public remarks on the economy. "We presume that appropriate quarters in the party are seized of the matter," said a BJP office-bearer requesting anonymity.

One leader took exception to the remarks of various ministers to downplay the crisis. "When NSSO reports on unemployment and rural consumption reports come to light, our people cited alternative statistics on automobile sale, Ola/Uber services, full airports, cinema earnings to counter. That the finance minister has come to a situation to admit slowdown, if not recession, is a way of acknowledging the situation ultimately," the party functionary said.

"There is no buoyancy in industry/business these days. Even GST collections are down. It is a matter of concern. We will talk over it. But not on phone please," said a senior BJP MP.

"The economy should be our focus. The situation doesn't look promising," another senior BJP functionary said, wondering whether the announcements by the Finance Minister since the Budget had been able to make a dent in economic sentiments.

Several party leaders did not rule out economic slowdown playing a part in the poll results in Maharashtra and Haryana, where the BJP fell short of its expectations.

# Oppn slams govt over management of economy

AS ECONOMIC growth slowed to 4.5 per cent in the July-September quarter — the weakest pace in more than six years — Opposition parties on Friday slammed the government.

The Congress said an economic recession has hit India, and argued that the Narendra Modi government continues to remain in denial. It said the government should stop "divisive politics" and focus on reviving the economy.

"The continuing and sharp fall in GDP to a new low confirms the disastrous mismanagement of the economy under the watch of a boastful PM and a confused Finance Minister. Knee-jerk interventions have been counter-productive. With a crippling industrial production and collapsing

demand and consumption government had wrong priorities," senior Congress leader Anand Sharma said.

"Facing falling revenues, reducing corporate tax and losing Rs 1.4 lakh crore of revenue has ruined finances... Modi ji and Nirmala Sitharaman, can you still be in denial after ruining our economy?" he asked.

Congress communication department head Randeep Surjewala said, "Failed 'Modinomics' and a pakoda economic vision have sunk the Indian economy into deep recession. As predicted by numerous rating agencies, it is now clear that the GDP data of second quarter at 4.5 per cent is at a six-year low. During the 10 years of the Congress government, the GDP growth was at an average of 8.13 per cent. Even in the last year of Congress government in 2013-14,

GDP growth was 6.39 per cent. Let the nation compare it with the BJP government's decimation of economy emanating from bankruptcy of economic vision."

Senior Congress leader Jairam Ramesh said, "What will it take for our government to acknowledge this crisis?..."

CPI(M) general secretary Sitaram Yechury called the state of the GDP a "Modi-made disaster".

"When you put yes-men in all important positions, when you shut your ears to the cries of distress from farmers, small enterprises... you manufacture trouble... Farmers (are) facing economic depression, youth (are) facing unemployment, factories (are) facing shutdowns. Only cronies are growing. Can PM explain this magic? We reiterate (the demand for) a white paper on the economy..." he added.

# Pragya apology: Perception concerns led BJP to accede to demand

CONCERNS OVER perception about the BJP, especially after recent political developments, seems to have forced the ruling party to be defensive about the Pragya Singh Thakur row and direct the Bhopal MP to offer her apology twice on the floor of the Lok Sabha for her remark praising Nathuram Godse.

Asked why the BJP — which initially tried to deny that Thakur was referring to Godse — changed its stand, a senior leader said: "For the perception." He added that the BJP did not want to give "a fresh weapon" to the Opposition.

Sources said the decision to make Thakur apologise in the

House was taken at the top level on Thursday evening.

Party leaders admitted that the BJP — which has always tried to lead in the battle of perception over its political rivals — faced a

major setback as its political moves in Maharashtra could not succeed. "When the party is facing severe criticism over the economic slump and Maharashtra developments, it would not have

been wise to let this controversy carry on," said a party leader.

An unrelenting Opposition forced Thakur to apologise for her remark in Lok Sabha for a second time on Friday after rejecting her first apology as "conditional" — in which she targeted Congress leader Rahul Gandhi for calling her a "terrorist".

Thakur had earlier removed Thakur from the consultative committee on defence and barred her from attending its parliamentary party meetings. However, the Opposition questioned why she was not expelled from the BJP.

The BJP leadership's decision to oblige the Opposition's demand, after a noisy meeting of all party leaders at the Speaker's chamber, surprised even some Opposition members. "But the

perception was made, the party had to act," said a top leader.

"Once we decided we should not let the Opposition take it beyond today, it does not matter whether she apologise once or twice" was the argument given by a senior party leader. Sources in the party said the intensifying protests over Thakur's remarks, which had been condemned by Prime Minister Narendra Modi earlier, had the potential to dent the PM's image too. Responding to Thakur's earlier remark, Modi had said he would not forgive her.

However, the BJP has prepared a counter-defence by making Thakur give a privilege notice against Rahul. "She is called a terrorist when there is no terrorism charges against her. In the same argument, what about Sonia

Gandhi, who apparently wept for the terrorists killed in Batla House encounter? Mani Shankar Aiyar, who argued against hanging of Mumbai blast convict Yakub Memon? What about Shashi Tharoor, who said the hanging of Parliament attack convict Afzal Guru was wrong?" said a source in the party.

With the BJP all set to fight the upcoming elections in Jharkhand, Delhi and Bihar on Modi's image, the party has to avoid such situations that have the potential to dent it, said a BJP MP.

Party leaders had admitted that the developments in Maharashtra "left a deep dent in its credibility, damaged the image of PM Modi and gave an impression that the BJP is a greedy power-grabbing party".



Kashmiri truck driver says beaten by cops, inquiry initiated

THE FARIDABAD Police have initiated an inquiry after a truck driver was allegedly beaten up by a police officer in Ballabgarh on Friday.

Mohammed Maqbool, the driver, hails from Kashmir's Yusmarg. He was on his way to Srinagar when the policeman allegedly thrashed him and his friends for stopping the truck on the expressway.

Maqbool said, "We were carrying pipes from Kolkata to Srinagar for a government project. In Faridabad, near the Maujpur toll plaza, I stopped the truck since I wanted to take some rest and let someone else drive. As I stepped out of the truck, the policeman came in his van and shouted at me."

He alleged that the policeman, a sub-inspector posted with the Ballabgarh police station, was accompanied by three constables. "They pinned me to the ground and kicked me. I told them to let me go but they didn't listen. They also thrashed my friends and later took Rs 30,000 from our wallets," Maqbool alleged.

In a video that later surfaced online, Maqbool shows his injuries and alleges that he was beaten brutally for an hour.

Police said they have initiated an inquiry in the matter.

"We have not received any complaint from the man or any witnesses. Through the video, we have taken cognizance of the matter and officers are looking into this. If allegations made by the driver are true, then we will take strict action against the accused policeman," said Faridabad Police Commissioner K K Rao.

Gujarat: 6 of a family found dead with throats slit

SIX MEMBERS of a family were found dead with their throats slit at their residence in Tarkhanda Mahua village in Gujarat's Dahod on Friday, police said.

The bodies of Saniben Palas (34) and her children Amraj (11), Dipika (9), Ravi (5) and Pritesh (3) were found outside their house on separate cots. The body of Saniben's husband Bharat (40) was found at a farm one km away. All six were killed with sharp-edged weapons.

The police suspect that more than two persons could have been involved in the murders. The nearby villagers claim that they did not hear any screaming or cries for help at night, the police said. "Prima facie it appears to be a case of personal enmity... We are questioning their family members and friends to get some leads," Dahod SP Hitesh Joysar said.

Will bring structural changes in British-era IPC, CrPC, says Shah

# Day 1: Uddhav stays Metro car shed work, not project

Two-day Assembly session: floor test today, Speaker election tomorrow

MAHARASHTRA CHIEF Minister Uddhav Thackeray, on his very first day at work, Friday said he had ordered a stay on work for a Metro car shed in Aarey colony in Mumbai till a review is completed.

While stating that "not a single leaf of a tree can be cut until the review is taken and further course of action decided," Thackeray clarified he "has not stopped the Metro work or any other development work".

There were angry protests last month by green activists and residents who objected to the felling of trees for the car shed. Trees were felled on October 4 night, hours after the Bombay High Court dismissed a petition challenging the Brihamumbai Municipal Corporation's decision to allow felling of 2,185 trees and transplantation of 460 trees for the project.

The issue took a political turn with the Shiv Sena, then an ally of the ruling, opposed the Metro move. The Mumbai Metro Rail Corporation Ltd (MMRCL) said only two per cent of the Aarey land would be used. On October 21, the Supreme Court said there was no stay on construction of the proposed car shed project. It sought a report on the number of trees cut.

On Friday, Thackeray, addressing the press in Mantralaya after taking charge, said: "I have

ordered a stay on the Metro car shed in Aarey colony. And until I review it completely, there will be no work there. Because, I read news reports today that trees were cut during the night. I cannot tolerate this."

He was quick to add that he "has not stopped the Metro work or any other development work." "If we are undertaking development by destroying existing things, then it is not development. Not a single leaf of a tree can be cut until a review is taken and further course of action is decided. All the remaining trees should be retained as it is," he said.

Former Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said it is "unfortunate that State Government stayed Aarey Metro CarShed work in spite of Hon Supreme Court & Hon High Court orders".

"This shows State Government is not serious about Mumbai Infrastructure projects! And ultimate sufferer is the common Mumbaikar only!"

Fadnavis tweeted with hashtag "savemetrosaveMumbai".

Fadnavis said the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) had given Rs 15,000 crore for the Metro project on "nominal" interest rates. "Decisions as the one taken by Thackeray will demotivate investors and all infrastructure projects will get stalled, which were already delayed for "so long" during the Congress-NCP combine's 15-year rule till 2014," he said.

Meanwhile, the new government has called a two-day assembly session starting Saturday. The ruling alliance will take a floor test Saturday. On Friday, the alliance changed the Pro-tem Speaker, replacing BJP's Kalidas Kolambkar with NCP's Dilip Walse Patil. Governor Bhagat Singh Koshiyari administered the oath of office to him.

The election for the post of Assembly Speaker is likely to take place Sunday, when the Leader of Opposition will also be named, most likely Fadnavis.

As squabbles break out over Deputy CM post, expansion of cabinet deferred

WHILE THE Uddhav Thackeray-led alliance of Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress has come to power in Maharashtra, the three parties are yet to find consensus on the power-sharing arrangement between them. On Friday, a day after Uddhav was sworn in as the chief minister, a fresh disagreement broke out between the allies over the post of deputy CM.

Sources said Congress raised a fresh claim over the post, but NCP shot it down. With the state leadership of both parties unable to resolve the issue, the national leadership of the two parties are now looking at the matter, said leaders.

Apart from the Speaker's post, the three parties have also not found consensus regarding some key portfolios, including home, finance and revenue.

Owing to the disagreements, sources said that the Cabinet expansion of the Thackeray government has been deferred.

Saradha scam: SC issues notice to Rajeev Kumar

THE SUPREME Court on Friday issued notice to former Kolkata Police Commissioner Rajeev Kumar on the CBI plea seeking his custodial interrogation in connection with the investigation in the Saradha chit fund scam cases.

Chief Justice of India S A Bobde, heading the bench which issued the notice, told Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the CBI, that "you will have to satisfy us that his custody is required".

On May 17, the SC withdrew the protection from arrest it had granted in February to Kumar, accused by the CBI of destroying evidence. The court, however, granted him seven days to seek suitable legal remedies during which period he will not be arrested. Subsequently, Kumar moved the Calcutta HC, which on May 30 granted him protection from arrest which the CBI has now challenged in the apex court.

'AFTER MAHARASHTRA, IT'S GOA'

Planning separate front in Goa, says Sena's Raut

SHIV SENA MP Sanjay Raut on Friday predicted a "separate front" in Goa, with an intention to form a potential non-BJP government in Goa.

Flanked by three Goa Forward Party MLAs, including former deputy chief minister Vijai Sardesai, Raut said at a press conference, "At least four MLAs, including those with Goa Forward Party president Vijay Sardesai, are in contact with Shiv Sena. We plan to form a separate front in that state with various parties, including Congress. We are hopeful that there could be a 'miracle' in Goa also soon."

"After Maharashtra, it is Goa, and then we will go to other states. We want to make a non-BJP political front in this country," Raut told the media.

The next Assembly elections in Goa are scheduled to be held in 2022.

Raut's statement came a day after the Sena-NCP-Congress coalition government in Maharashtra, led by Uddhav Thackeray, took office.

Sardesai said, "We will try to do a repeat of Maharashtra in Goa." Identifying his party as a "regional party", he said, "Our opinion is that what has happened in Maharashtra should be emulated elsewhere in India. We shall tie up with Shiv Sena, NCP and others to form a powerful front."

The Congress seemed lukewarm to the proposal, with state spokesperson Trajano D'Mello only questioning if Sardesai wanted to form a "legislative front or a political front".

The reaction from the BJP was of dismissal. State BJP chief and North Goa MP Vinay Tendulkar said, "Raut dream is more like *Mungerilal ke hasen sapne*," referring to the Doordarshan series which aired in 1989.

SC's new roster: PILs to be heard by CJI, 3 most senior judges

PILs FILED in the Supreme Court will now be heard by Chief Justice of India S A Bobde or the three most senior judges of the court.

According to the new roster of work notified by the apex court, besides CJI Bobde, the PILs may also be marked to Justices N V Ramana, Arun Mishra and R F Nariman.

The CJI will also hear matters of contempt, election, habeas corpus, social justice, direct and indirect tax cases besides criminal matters and cases related to commissions of inquiry and company law, among others.

The bench headed by Justice Ramana would deal among others with matters pertaining to armed forces, paramilitary, compensation, criminal and ordinary civil matters.

Petitions arising out of land acquisition and requisition matters, and others will go to the bench headed by Justice Mishra.

Besides PIL matters, Justice Nariman would also look into cases of family law.

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Shah begins meeting on CAB with groups from Northeast

Government may exempt areas under Inner Line Permit regime from Bill

NEW DELHI, NOVEMBER 29

AS HOME Minister Amit Shah began a series of meetings with stakeholders from Northeastern states on the Citizenship Amendment Bill (CAB) on Friday, sources said the government may exempt the Northeast states that have the Inner Line Permit (ILP) regime from the CAB. Exemption of such regions in Northeast states which come under the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution is also under consideration.

This would virtually mean that Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland and Mizoram may be kept out of the purview of CAB, as well as certain autonomously administered regions in Assam and other states such as Bodo Territorial District Area.

The CAB, which aims to give refugees from Bangladesh, Pakistan and Afghanistan — unless they are Muslim — Indian citizenship, is likely to be introduced in the ongoing session of Parliament. Raising the issue during Zero Hour in Lok Sabha on Thursday, BJP MP Dr R K Ranjan Singh said, "I would like to draw the attention of the Government of India to the Citizenship

(Amendment) Bill that is going to be placed in this winter session. It is also reliably learnt that some safeguards are likely to be given to Northeastern states. However, a few days ago, it was brought out in media that an exemption from this citizenship law will be given only to those states where the Inner Line Permit system is enforced. That means the law will not be applied in the states of Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh and Mizoram."

Singh said this was causing a lot of discomfort in his state. "Other Northeastern states like Manipur shall come under the

purview of this new citizenship law. There is a lot of hue and cry in my state of Manipur. People are apprehensive... They believe that if this new law is enacted, there will be huge influx of migrants. So they vociferously demand exemption from this law. Supporting the sentiments of my people, I would like to urge the Union government, particularly the MHA, that an exemption clause or safeguard clause may kindly be added for the state of Manipur in the proposed legislation," he said.

BJP leaders point to NRC as reason for loss

THE BJP's losses in three bypolls in West Bengal appeared to expose infighting within the state unit, with some leaders on Friday pointing to the "scare" over the issue of the National Register of Citizens (NRC) as a reason for their failure.

On Thursday, the ruling TMC won all three Assembly bypolls by wresting the Kharagpur Sadar and Kaliaganj seats from the BJP and Congress respectively, while retaining the Karimpur seat.

Calling it a mandate against the NRC, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee said it was a vote against the BJP's "arrogance".

who is Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's grandnephew, said that the NRC should not have featured as the poll plank during campaigning for bypolls.

"Since 1985, NRC was primarily concerned with the people of Assam. NRC was never considered for West Bengal. Union Home Minister Amit Shah had clearly said that first Citizenship Amendment Bill (CAB) will be tabled in Lok Sabha and after implementing CAB, there will be discussions on NRC. So there was no need for our party to campaign on NRC during bypolls," Bose said.

"There were other issues which people want the BJP to address. People want to know whether we will bring industries in Bengal... People here want to

HYDERABAD RAPE-MURDER

Fellow workers recall vet's daily struggle: 'but was always on time'

ON FRIDAY, as police in Hyderabad said that four people have been arrested in the sexual assault and murder of a 27-year-old veterinary doctor, animal health workers at a government facility 60 km away were struggling to cope with their loss.

"I remember the day she joined duty on January 23, 2017, the first veterinary doctor in this hospital in 10 years. She was so cheerful and pleasant. How can such a horrible thing happen to such a fine human being?" asked Saiyed Sarvar, an assistant at the veterinary hospital in Mahbubnagar district.

Rattled by the murder near a toll plaza on the outskirts of Hyderabad Wednesday night, the attendants and helpers recalled the Assistant Veterinary Surgeon's arduous daily commute to reach the hospital "every day, 10 am".

"After changing two buses, she used to endure a back-breaking ride in a shared autorickshaw to reach the hospital. But she was always punctual and rarely absent," said Sarvar.

According to staff, the doctor used to park her two-wheeler at Shamshabad bus stop near the toll plaza and take a bus to Shadnagar in Telangana's Ranga Reddy district. From there, they said, she would another bus to Kondurug and board a "share auto" to reach the local bus stand.

"One of us would pick her up from the stand and bring her to the hospital, and take her back at 4.30 pm every day. On Wednesday afternoon, I saw her leaving," said Sarvar.

According to police, the accused abducted her in their truck after one of them punctured the rear tyre of her two-wheeler at the toll plaza, and sexually assaulted and killed her.

Residents at the village where the veterinary hospital is located described her as "a very dedicated worker". There are about 5,000 livestock in the village, and "she always ensured enough stock of medicines and injections", they said.

"She played a key role in selecting and distributing sheep under a Telangana government scheme. She was chosen to go to Krishna district in Andhra Pradesh to examine and purchase the sheep. She was a honest and hard-working woman," said Venkataiah Yadav, a village resident.

The sarpanch Raghav Gupttha said she was "well liked by cattle owners because whenever they brought a sick animal, she would patiently explain what was wrong and what treatment she would provide".

"She would always say, 'If you have any concern, come again tomorrow, I will be here at 10 am,'" he said.

Actress assault case: SC allows Dileep limited access to memory card

THE SUPREME Court on Friday allowed Kerala actor Dileep, accused in the 2017 abduction and assault of an actress, to seek the opinion of an expert body like the Central Forensic Sciences Laboratory (CFSL) on the contents of a memory card relied upon by the prosecution, but turned down his request to provide him a copy of the card, citing the victim's privacy.

A bench of Justices A M Khanwilkar and Dinesh Maheshwari said this would balance the right of the accused to a fair trial and the victim's right of privacy.

In February 2017, the actress was allegedly abducted and assaulted by eight accused, and the act was allegedly filmed on a cellphone to blackmail her.

On Friday, the bench agreed with the contention of senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for Dileep, that the contents of the memory card would constitute a "document" under the Indian Evidence Act, but added that "considering that this is a peculiar case of intra-conflict of fundamental rights flowing from Article 21, that is right to a fair trial of the accused and right to privacy of the victim, it is imperative to adopt an approach which would balance both the rights."

The court said, "In conclusion, we hold that the contents of the memory card/pen drive, being an electronic record, must be regarded as a document... If the prosecution is relying on the same, ordinarily, the accused must be given a cloned copy thereof ... however, in cases involving issues such as of privacy of the complainant/witness or his/her identity, the court may be justified in providing only inspection thereof to the accused and his/her lawyer or expert."

Blast at forensic lab in Bengaluru leaves 6 hurt

A BLAST at the Karnataka Forensic Science Lab (FSL) in Bengaluru on Friday left six people injured.

The incident occurred when FSL lab technicians were prying open a sample of the explosive sent for examination from the site of a blast in Raichur in north Karnataka. The blast is suspected to have been caused by a sample of the industrial chemical methyl ethyl ketone peroxide (MEKP), which becomes very sensitive when it solidifies into crystals if stored for a long period of time, and can result in explosions with the slightest amount of friction, chemical and explosive experts said.

"The blast in the chemical section of the forensic lab occurred when one of the technicians tried to open a sample sent to the lab from Raichur for chemical analysis," lab sources said.

"The explosive material was sent from the Raichur West division to the chemistry lab for analysis. This is the first such incident at the lab. The fingers of Srinath, a senior scientific officer, were damaged in the explosion," Bengaluru police commissioner Bhaskar Rao said.

On May 19, an accidental blast involving MEKP occurred outside the home of a Congress MLA in Bengaluru, killing one. Two previous incidents involved MEKP — in October 2018 at Raichur and August 2015 at Ballari.

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
