Missing tourist hand inside shark

Saint Denis: The hand of a missing Scottish tourist has been discovered in the stomach of a tiger shark caught off the coast of Réunion. The 44-year-old man who has not been named, disappeared while snorkelling off the coast of the Indian Ocean island. His wife identified his wedding ring recovered during an autopsy of the shark. The shark was one of five caught for research purposes in the Indian Ocean. It was found about four miles from the lagoon where the victim was last seen. It is not known whether the man was eaten by the shark after being drowned

Brazil court ruling may free Lula

Braslia: Brazil's supreme court voted to overturn a ruling requiring convicted criminals to go to jail after losing their first appeal, paving the way for leftist icon Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva to be freed. The decision means thousands of convicts could be released from prison, including Lula, who is among dozens of political and business leaders caught up in a sprawling corruption probe. They would remain free until they had exhausted their rights to appeal their conviction - which critics say could take years in cases involving people with deep pockets. Lula's lawyers said they would seek the 'immediate release' of the former president after speaking to

Paris: An original score of two minutes composed by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart when he was just 16 is to be put up for auction in Paris later this month, Sotheby's said. The asking price for the handwritten score dating from 1772 has been set at 1.50.000-2.00.000 euros. the auction house said. It goes on sale on November 18. "It's the only version," said Simon Maguire, a specialist in musical manuscripts at Sotheby's in London. "Mozart always wrote first versions" without subsequently reworking them, "unlike Beethoven who revised (his scores) endlessthe expert said. The minutes, which are types of dances, have never been published.

35 TRAPPED IN GERMAN POTASH MINE

Berlin, Nov. 8: Around 35 mine staff were trapped about 700 meters below ground, two of them injured, after an unexplained blast in a potash mine in eastern Germany, a spokesman with the state mining authority

was cited as saying. The local broadcaster MDR reported that a res-cue operation had begun.

The staff were located in a safe sector of the mine in Teutschenthal, about 150 km southwest of Berlin, and were being supplied with oxygen.

The mining authority said one of the injured was in a serious condi-tion, the other only lightly injured, and that there was a possibility that they could be brought to the surface through a shaft that was intact. The mine is no longer active but is being used to deposit mining waste from elsewhere. - Reuters

IRAN DOWNS UNKNOWN FLYING OBJECT

Tehran, Nov. 8: The Iranian army shot down an unidentified drone near the port of Bandar-e Mahshahr on the Gulf coast on Friday, ISNA news agency reported.

The unmanned aircraft was downed over Iranian territory with a domestically manufactured Mersad surface-toair missile, said Tasnim. The incident which comes amid soaring tensions between Tehran and Washington since President Donald Trump unilaterally aban-doned a landmark 2015 nuclear deal last year and reimposed crippling sanctions.

ALL 39 DEAD IN UK TRUCK VIETNAMESE

London, Nov. 8: Vietnam said it was working to repatriate 39 bodies now identified as Vietnamese nationals found in a truck near London last month, in a case that exposed the deadly risks of illegal migration to Europe.

The country's embassy in London said a government delegation already in Britain was coordinating with officials to get the bodies home at the earliest.

The British police confirmed that those discovered in the refrigerated truck on October 23 all came from the southeast Asian nation.

In a letter to the families of the 31 men and eight women who died, Vietnam's Prime Minister Nguyen Xuan Phuc said the tragedy had caused them and Vietnamese people worldwide 'endless pain' and vowed to 'soon bring the victims back to the homeland'. Essex Police investigating

the gruesome discovery, said a coroner had now formally identified all the victims and their families informed.

"This is an important step in the investigation and enables us to work with our Vietnamese colleagues to support the families of those victims," a cop said.



he case of Aatish Taseer, a young, New York-based journalist and writer whose Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) status was revoked on Thursday, is lamentable for several reasons. One, official protestations notwithstanding, it can't but be construed as an assault by the government on free speech and expression, given the circumstances. Two, it is the most open and high-profile expression yet of official vindictiveness since taking away the OCI card is a means to make sure the person in question will not be able to enter India (in his case to visit his mother) again if the government's vendetta action is not reconsidered.

Three, and not the least, the episode casts India — not just the present government — in poor light. Since a full-fledged single-party rule took hold five years ago, this country has taken rapid strides in becoming an illiberal society with encouragement from those in power and from those who are the ideology-minders of the establishment.

These are among the issues that Mr Taseer had sought to flag, with a tinge of regret it appeared since he regarded himself as a child of India, in May in an article for *Time* maga-

The journalist-writer's defence is crystal clear: His Indian mother and his father were not married and that she was his sole legal guardian until he came of age, growing up in New Delhi for a good part. (As such, his father's nationality is immaterial.) It is to be presumed this would have been taken into account when he duly applied for and was given OCI status. The home ministry would be fully aware of this and had no business rais-

ing any queries. It is therefore a fair presumption that the episode was orchestrated — following the article he wrote — in order to deprive Mr Taseer of his OCI status. It is to be doubted that the official stance can withstand judicial challenge (unless the court is pliable, and nothing will be a surprise any more).

PEN America, a free speech organisation in the US, and the Committee to Protect Journalists have sharply criticised the anti-free speech and suppression of journalists angle in the matter. This indictment is likely to be taken seriously on the international plane, sullying our country's image.

Court's duty to Walayar girls

Rerala has been on the boil ever since a special Pocso court in Palakkad on September 30 and October 25 acquitted four accused charged with the rape and abetment to suicide of two Dalit girls, aged nine and 13, at Walayar on the Kerala-Tamil Nadu border. A fifth accused, a child in conflict with the law, is being tried by the juvenile court. The older girl was found hanging from the rafters of the single-room tenement in which her family was living on January 13, 2017; and her younger sister was found in the same position on March 4.

The court, which agreed to the prosecution's contention that the girls hanged themselves, did not agree with the reason that it had to do with their being sexually abused. The court dismissed the post-mortem report of the younger girl which stated there was "evidence suggestive of unnatural sexual offence on the child in the form of multiple episodes of anal penetrations in the past" as it is no conclusive proof. If did not find it a big se on the part of the investigating officer who failed to fo n on th suggestion of the forensic surgeon to find out whether a girl of 129 centimetres can manage to fix a ligature on a rafter placed at 246 cm. The judgment, which went against the very spirit of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, has shocked the people. They stare at the twin tragedies: one, two young girls were sexually abused and found dead; and then two, no one is found guilty of it. This is unacceptable as it makes a mockery of the criminal justice administration. People demand that the case be investigated further, the accused be brought to book. The government and the courts must do whatever it takes.

Mainstreaming veganism: What it teaches about bringing change

just returned from have Canada, which seems to share Britain's new-found obsession with veganism. There, chains such as Burger King and KFC are offering plant-based alternatives to meat-based meals. Five years ago could anyone have predicted this? True, vegetarianism has been growing for many years, but did anyone foresee its most extreme variant rapidly 'crossing the chasm' to go from an oddball niche to a standard

lifestyle choice? The 'chasm' is that mysterious and often impermeable barrier all technologies and behaviours must traverse if they are to make the critical leap from being a weird minority interest to an unquestioningly accepted option. Some things (mobile phones, Facebook, washing machines, smoking bans, credit

cards, Coke) eventually cross that gap and rapidly become commonplace. Other things (MySpace, the Segway, moist toilet paper, Quakerism, Dr Pepper) remain Quakerism, Dr Pepper) trapped in a niche for ever.

The idea of the chasm is essential to understanding why social and technological change frequently stalls or dies, while at other times it occurs with a bizarre rapidity. Quite simply there are two separate modes by which new technologies, beliefs or behaviours are adopted. At first adoption largely occurs conscious individual through action; this is slow. Once something crosses the chasm, however, it reaches a critical mass at which point adoption occurs through social imitation. This second process is much faster than the first. Everything new is weird, and

brings with it the risk of social embarrassment. In 1989, when I used a mobile phone on Oxford Street, people shouted abuse at me; a few years later, I was ridiculed at a party for buying groceries online. In upgrading our bathroom, I have encountered heavy spousal resis-tance when specifying a Japanese-style toilet which washes your bum with a pleasing stream of warm water. There is no rational reason not to buy such a wondrous device, but it will expose us to a certain amount of badinage. Once 10 per cent of British loos have this feature, that problem will disappear.

In the same way, once 10 per cent of people become vegan, the dynamics of eating change. Restaurants now have to offer two vegan and two vegetarian options, so that even carnivores are likely to eat more meatfree meals. More investment will be directed to developing enjoyable meat substitutes (witness the sudden proliferation of jackfruit) vegan food becomes less SO boring. Once one member of your family becomes vegan, many family meals become meat-free by default. When a behaviour crosses the chasm, adoption grows with surprising speed.

Government and environmentalists need to understand this. To achieve change, you needn't legislate so everyone adopts new behaviours simultaneously: you simply need to ensure every desirable new behaviour (veganism, installing solar panels, not flying when you can travel by train) reaches that level where it no longer looks weird. If just 10 per cent of attendees refuse to fly to a meeting, it becomes essen-

-

tial to offer videoconferencing, at which point a further 10 per cent will opt to attend the meeting remotely. If 10 per cent start taking trains to Frankfurt, it will pay to launch a European sleeper train service, at which point another 10 per cent will take the train. Once someone on your street has solar panels, you'll feel happier installing your own.

The biggest single influence on whether people drink Guinness in a pub is whether there is already someone in the pub drinking Guinness. A lot of socially beneficial behaviours work the same way. It's not that we don't want to do them we do. We just don't want to be the weirdo who does it first.

Flap in Kerala as babu defends killing Maoists



t came as a vorker to the LDF government as Kerala chief secretary Tom Jose, in a newspaper article, justified the police slay-ing of Maoists even as minister chief

Pinarayi Vijayan, citing propriety, did not go into the details on Left Wing Extremism (LWE) and his government's action against armed combatants in jungles in the state's north.

Mr Jose penned the piece in the wake of the public outcry against the state special force of Thunderbolts gunning down four Maoists at Agali near Attappadi in Palakkad on the border with Tamil Nadu on October 28-29 and the subsequent arrests of two CPI(M) activists for alleged Maoist links.

A fact-finding team of the Communist Party of India

(CPI), the second-biggest LDF Constituent, reported to the government that the deaths were part of fake encounters. This has been the CPI stand on all seven Maoist slavings since the LDF has come to power. First, the salient points of Mr Jose's article, which appeared

on November 5: According to the UN's definition, people who use violence to achieve political objectives and put civilians in harm's way are terrorists.

State intelligence has identified 16 organisations having sympathisers in urban areas: They are the human face of terrorists, benign but malignant and vicious, plotting terror against innocents. Security forces carried out

their duty to protect citizens from terrorists. No rationale in arguing

Maoists, indulging in armed conflict, have the same human

rights as normal citizens. Kill or be killed: Security forces fight an asymmetrical war with Maoists. Soldiers on the border get applause while cops protecting innocent citizens get all the blame for it. The article had come as a counter, mainly to the CPI's criticism and the Congress-led Opposition's campaign of 'police lynching". It is incontestable that the

article, without the usual caveat of "views are personal" is a breach of propriety as he had spoken out of turn. The CM, being the top political executive, is yet to make any policy elucidation, not because the government lacks it, but not to influence the litigation and the outcome of ongoing probes.

The written piece has been unprecedented, either by a chief secretary or a Cabinet Secretary. But a minuscule section of bureaucrats justifies the well-intentioned article in the face of a real Maoist menace, which the chief secretary reviews every quarter in districts concerned.

One morning, residents at Nagarur-Kummil on the Kollam-Thiruvananthapuram border were greeted by the severed head of a landlord in the middle of the road.

The threat looms. The CPI (Maoists) believe in "the immediate aim and programme to carry on and complete the already ongoing and advancing New Democratic Revolution... protracted peo-ple's war with the armed seizure of power remaining as its central and principal task, encircling the cities from the countryside and thereby finally capturing them". Kerala had asked the Centre

to include the Maoist-affected districts in the Security Related Expenditure Scheme to tackle LWE. A unified command was formed under the CM's chairmanship to review the situation. However, the government's view is to confront "ideology with ideology".

id Milad-un-Nabi — the holy birthday of Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) — falls on November 10 this year, which is known as the 12th Rabi' ul-Awwal according to the Hijri calendar. Minister Commerce Piyush Goyal had recently met the e-commerce companies and had asked them to engage with small traders and make them part of their growth story. The Confederation of All

India Traders (Cait) on Friday rejected this idea and said that there is no question of joining hands with any business entity who is not following the policy of the government

and law of the land. "If the reports are correct, then it is most surprising that instead of directing such e-commerce companies to fall in line with the policy, the government is encouraging them to continue with their existing business model," Cait said in a release.

"So far we have not received any such communication from the government nor have we held any talks with any e-commerce entity on joining hands. It is a complicated matter as the offline business has suffered business loss of about 50 per cent in recent Diwali festive sea-

son due to e-commerce players who are indulging in predatory pricing, deep discounting, loss funding, controlling inventory. preferential treatment, influencing of prices which are in violation of the FDI policy. As per an estimate, the Diwali festival sale of small traders every year is about Rs. 6 lakh crore and this year they could generate sales of about Rs.3 lakh crore only. Cait Secretary General Praveen Khandelwal said.

Mutual fund AUM rises to ₹27 L cr in Oct.

New Delhi, Nov. 8: Mutual funds' asset base increased to Rs 26.33 lakh crore in October-end, a rise of 7.4 per cent as compared with the preceding month, on the back of robust inflows in equity and liquid schemes.

The 44-player industry logged an assets under management (AUM) of Rs 24.5 lakh crore in September-end, according to data from the Association of Mutual Funds in India (Amfi). Mutual fund houses witnessed an overall inflow of Rs 1.33 lakh crore last month after a redemption of Rs 1.52 lakh crore in Sept. Of these, liquid funds alone witness ed an impressive over Rs 93.200 crore last month.

Fund managers attrib uted growth in the asset base to higher retail participation and robust inflows in equity schemes and liquid funds.

The open-ended equity schemes witnessed an infusion of Rs 6,026 crore, while there was a small outflow of Rs 11 crore in close-ended equity plans, taking total equity inflo-ws to Rs 6,015 crore last month.

Ficci stated that adhocism in export bans had serious repercussions and there was a need to remove onion from the purview of the Essential Commodities Act and undertake agriculture marketing reforms to facilitate direct purchase from the farmer in a transparent way.

Onion, being high in water content, is a delicate commodity to store. Up to 40 per cent of the total produced onions can be damaged in some areas in periods of high rainfall due to nonavailability of appropriate post-harvest storage facilities, it added.

'Many factors have contributed to the run-up in onion prices this year ... However, the seasonal price and arrival pattern of onion, could give some directions to strategise a sustainable policy in future," the Ficci said in a report submitted to the government.

To address the current onion crisis, Ficci said the government should focus on a long-term solution including studying the Israel and Brazil models and making investment in low cost modern technology for storing onion.

"In Israel, onions are stored in open ventilated warehouses with continuous forced air-ventilation through a stack of sets in bulk or bulk bins. Adoption of such measures will help in storage of onions with

innovative methods during the bumper production seasons and reducing the fluctuations in the onion prices. Such methods should be studied and customised for Indian conditions," it said. For ensuring cost-effective storage of onions, Ficci said the emphasis should be laid on building low-cost farm

gate storage. In Brazil, for the procurement and storage of onions, low-cost ventilated silos system is being used at farm level. They also use refrigerated storage rooms which is the most efficient system, it said.

In India, startups such as Inficold Inc are using multicommodity efficient farm level cooling systems for perishables. Low-cost thatched bamboo storage have been promoted by the government under

form, except in the months July, of August and September.

To maintain regular supply in this lean period of about three months, onions are being traditionally stored in ventilated warehouses (in bulk) where the losses are very high (range between 20-40 per cent mainly because of poor pre-harvest and post-harvest practices). "There is a need to invest in research to find optimum technological solution for storage of onion. The losses are likely to come down to about 5-10 per cent by following standard operating procedure of storage," the Ficci said.

Besides that, the method of storing onion crop should not be considered similar to normal agriculture produce such as grains and potatoes. "Technological innovations for storing onions are required in long run," the Ficci said.

Napier, Nov. 8: Eoin Morgan and Dawid Malan pummelled the New Zealand attack in a recordbreaking 182-run stand as England posted an imposing 241 for three batting first in the fourth Twenty20 international in

Napier on Friday. Malan was 103 not out at the close with Morgan falling in the final over for 91 as he tried to plunder the boundary to join his partner on three figures. The pair posted the high-

est third-wicket partnership by any side in a T20 international and the 241 is England's highest total. Malan faced 48 deliveries

for his century, eclipsing Alex Hale's 60-ball record.

His 103 included six sixes and nine fours while Morgan cracked seven sixes and seven fours.

After losing the toss, England then lost early wickets with Mitchell Santner removing Jonny Bairstow for eight and Tom Banton for 31 to have the tourists 58 for two in the eighth over.

Santner had the impressive figures of two for five from his first two overs but that was to change dramatically as Malan and Morgan took charge. They took 20 off the left-

arm spinners third over and Santner finished his spell with two for 32, which were the best New Zealand figures. -AFF

In contrast, Pakistan are struggling and have now lost five of their last six matches.

Despite the poor run, which included an embarrassing 3-0 home series defeat to an under-strength Sri Lanka that cost Sarfaraz Ahmed the captaincy, they remain number one in the rankings.

But their cricket chiefs will be wor-ried about the two Tests against Australia to come, starting this month in Brisbane.
