Chhattisgarh 'encounter' probe indicts security forces: No firing by villagers, no proof they were Maoists

Security forces fired in panic, 6 of them injured in friendly fire, one villager shot next morning: Justice V K Agarwal

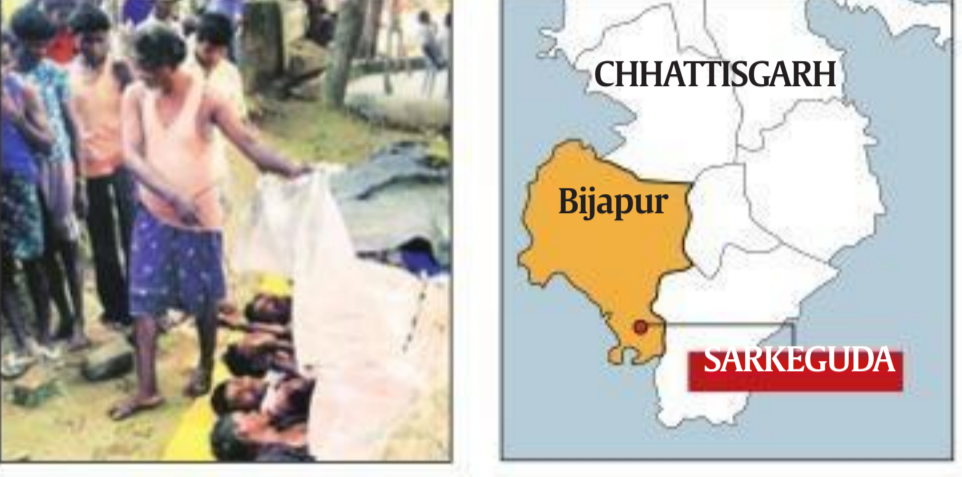

IN A damning indictment of the security forces, a one-member judicial commission set up to probe an alleged encounter in which 17 people, including six minors, were killed in Sarkeguda, in Bijapur district of Chhattisgarh, in June 2012, has noted the following findings: there was no firing by the villagers; there is no evidence to suggest they were Maoists; the villagers were assaulted and killed from close quarters; security forces may have fired "in panic"; and one of the victims was shot in the morning, several hours after the encounter at night.

The commission chaired by Justice V K Agarwal, a retired Judge of the Madhya Pradesh High Court, submitted its report to the state government earlier this month.

The report, reviewed by *The Sunday Express*, says the injuries suffered by six security personnel were due to "cross-firing", possibly by "bullets fired by fellow members of the security forces", and there was "clear manipulation in investigation". However, it also notes that the villagers' claim that they were meeting to discuss a festival "appears highly doubtful".

On the night of June 28, 2012, teams of the CRPF and Chhattisgarh Police, led by the former, had launched an opera-

tion to go to Silger, based on information about the presence of Maoists.

According to the sequence of events put forth by the security forces, two teams left from Basaguda and came across a Maoist meeting at Sarkeguda, 3 km away. The villagers attending the meeting opened fire, and the security personnel retaliated.

Alliance gets more support, Uddhav sails through vote

BJP walks out; Fadnavis says session, having a new pro tem Speaker illegal

MAHARASHTRA CHIEF Minister Uddhav Thackeray comfortably won the vote of confidence in the Legislative Assembly on Saturday. The Maha Vikas Aghadi government got 169 votes, including the votes of 16 MLAs from smaller parties, and Independents.

The BJP, led by former Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, walked out before the vote, claiming that the session had been called illegally. Fadnavis also objected to the oath taken by Ministers, and the government's move to replace the pro tem Speaker.

The trust vote took place within half-an-hour of the beginning of proceedings in the House. The Congress's Ashok Chavan moved the motion, which was seconded by the NCP's Nawab Malik and Jayant Patil, and the Shiv Sena's Sunil Prabhu. The Sena's 56 MLAs, the Congress's 44, and the NCP's 53 MLAs voted for the motion. The

Shah listening, Bajaj speaks: No one will tell you... not sure you like criticism

Shah says no need to fear, but if that is the mood, we are open to improving

WITH HOME Minister Amit Shah, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, and Railways and Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal listening, Bajaj Group chairman Rahul Bajaj expressed concern on Saturday evening over the lack of confidence among corporates to criticise the central government, the absence of effective action against lynchings, and the remark of Bhopal MP Pragna Singh Thakur praising Nathuram Godse in Parliament this week.

"Nobody from our industrialist friends will speak, I will say openly... An environment will have to be created... When UPA II was in power, we could criticise anyone... You (the government) are doing good work, but despite that we don't have the confidence that you will appreciate if we criticise you openly (*Aap achchha kaam kar rahe hain, uske baad bhi, hum aapko criticise openly karenin, confidence nahin hai ki you will appreciate*)," Bajaj said at an awards event organised by *The Economic Times* in Mumbai.

The ministers were on stage,

and top industrialists including RIL CMD Mukesh Ambani, Aditya Birla Group chairman Kumar Mangalam Birla, and Bharti Enterprises chairman Sunil Bharti Mittal were present at the gathering.

Bajaj expressed his concerns a day after former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh spoke at the National Economy Conclave about "a palpable climate of fear" in society. "Many industrialists tell me they live in fear of harassment by government authorities... Entrepreneurs are hesitant to put up fresh projects, for fear of failure attributed to ulterior motives," Singh said.

India, Japan hold first 2+2 meet, tell Pak to act against terror

INDIA AND Japan on Saturday expressed concern over the threat posed to regional peace and security by "terrorist networks operating out of Pakistan" and asked Islamabad to take "resolute and irreversible" action against them.

To ward off track deaths, Central Rly gets painted sleepers, staccato horns

EVERY DAY, 70-year-old Kasturibai Tekade crosses the busy railway tracks close to her home with a basket full of green vegetables on her head, to set up shop a few metres from one of several "black spots" on the line infamous for the large numbers of people who are killed by trains on it.

Kasturibai knows the risk only too well — her 23-year-old son died after being hit by a train

at that spot some 12 years ago. But she, and the other residents of Reti bunder and Datta chawl, have come to accept death as part of their lives.

Nearly 11,000 residents of these illegal settlements at the

foot of a hill on Central Railway's Mumbra-Kalwa stretch must cross the railway line in order to reach the highway that connects them to the rest of the world. They — and the Railways — have no option: it is not possible to build a foot overbridge (FOB) at that spot, identified in Railway records as "Km No. 38/1-16".

So, between March and August this year, what the Railways tried instead, was three seemingly simple interventions at 22 locations between Thane and Kalwa, which saw 88 deaths between January and November

lowed as the train approaches them.

2018 — the worst black spot, with 21 deaths, being Km No. 38/1-16.

And the interventions, based on principles of cognitive neuroscience and behavioural economics, have shown results.

First, in order to help people gauge more accurately the speed of an oncoming train, five sets of sleepers at intervals of 100 metres have been painted yellow, with the nearest set of these sleepers about 150 m from the black spot. The idea is for people to watch how quickly the yellow sleepers are being swal-

Second, a "whistle board" has been put up 120 m from the spot, asking the motorman to blow the hooter with breaks in between, described as a "staccato horn". Research suggests the human brain reacts better to a staccato horn than to a single, long blast.

Third, a huge board with a picture of a man with vivid expressions as he is being hit by a train, has been put up at all locations.

Chhattisgarh 'encounter' probe indicts security forces

But the villagers claimed that they had assembled for a meeting to discuss a "Beej Pandum" festival, and the security forces had encircled them and opened fire. They also alleged that one person, Irpa Ramesh, was killed after being picked up from his home the next morning.

On July 11, 2012, the then Raman Singh-led government had ordered a judicial probe. Confirming that Justice Agarwal has submitted the report, a senior Chhattisgarh government official said: "A report has been received. The next step is to put it before the Cabinet, and, if accepted, before the Vidhan Sabha."

Saying that statements of witnesses "from either parties suffer from discrepancies and shortcomings", the report says evidence and circumstances on record will have to be "considered and discussed".

On the fundamental question of whether Maoists were present at the meeting, it says: "It has not been proved by satisfactory evidence that the confrontation was with the members of the Naxal outfit or that they were present in or were participants of the meeting or in the incident of confrontation with the security forces. It has not been proved that the persons killed and injured in the incident other than security personnel were Naxals, as there is no satisfactory evidence in that regard."

Contradicting the security forces' claim that the villagers had opened fire, the report says: "According to the version of the security forces, initially there was fire from the members of the meeting... (it) does not stand the test of scrutiny as leader of the team, DIG S Elango, had admitted that he did not see any muzzle fire coming from the direction of the place of meeting, contradicting his own earlier statement. The conduct of DIG S Elango as well as Deputy Commandant Manish Barmola of not firing a single bullet during the incident clearly indicates that there was no firing by the members of the meeting, because had there been firing from the persons present at the meet-

ing, both the above senior officers who were fully armed would have certainly fired in retaliation and self defence. The conduct of DIG S Elango and Manish Barmola is against the normal human conduct and instinct of self-preservation and self-defence."

The report says it was likely that there was a "panic reaction" by security forces after their guide reported a "suspicious sound at a distance." "Possibility therefore appears to be that suspicion having arisen regarding the present of Naxals, firing was initiated by members of the security forces, resulting in injury and death of several persons," it says.

The defence counsel, representing the CRPF and state police, had pointed out that six security personnel were also injured in the "encounter." The report, however, says: "The nature of injuries sustained by the injured security personnel could not have been caused by firing from a distance, such as injury on the right toe or near the ankle. Secondly, the bullet injuries could only be caused due to cross-firing, as it appears more plausible, as it was dark all around in the place of the incident and possibility cannot be ruled out that bullets fired by fellow members of the security forces may have hit other members of the security personnel of the team."

The counsel for the villagers had said evidence shows that at least 10 of the 17 victims were shot in the back, suggesting that they were killed while fleeing. The probe panel has said that "bullets shot on the top of the head of some of the deceased shows that they were shot from close quarters, which could not be the result of firing from a distance as is the case of the defence force."

The result of consideration of material circumstances as above, including the nature and location of bullet injuries as also many other injuries, such as lacerated wounds and contusions, are circumstances which would show to show that the incident did not take place as is being described by the security forces. It also appears that firing by the security forces was not from a distance while they were under attack, and, in fact, it appears that security forces had confronted the members of the meeting

and had fired from close quarters inflicting injuries on top of their head to some victims, while others were also hit on their torso and their back. Besides, members of the meeting were also physically assaulted due to which lacerated wounds and contusions were caused. These injuries could be caused from close quarters only by weapons with sharp edges or by hand and blunt objects such as butt of gun or rifles. There is no explanation from the security forces as to how the said injuries were caused to the deceased or injured," says the report.

On the villagers' allegation that one of the victims was picked up from his home on June 29 morning, hours after the alleged encounter at 10:30 pm the previous night, the report says: "Shashikala Telam has stated that her brother Irpa Ramesh was beaten in the morning. Her statement is supported by Mutta Kaka who has stated that in the morning, while Irpa Ramesh was in his house and was peeping outside from there, the police personnel caught hold of him, beat him and then shot him dead. It was pointed out by the learned counsel that stills taken from the post-mortem video would also show that 15 dead bodies are lined up in sequence, who died in the night. However, the body of Irpa Ramesh was lying separately by itself, as per photograph taken from the video film, which is also indicative of the fact that he did not die in the night's incident. Thus the beating and the death of deceased Irpa Ramesh in the morning of June 29, much after the incident on the night of June 28, stands established. It also casts serious doubt about the version of the incident as given on behalf of the security forces."

While the toll was initially 16, one of the 11 injured died later, taking the toll to 17.

Justice Agarwal, in his report, has called out "clear manipulation of investigation". "It is pertinent to note that several other documents such as seizure memos etc. were also allegedly prepared on the spot in the morning i.e. before FIR was recorded while crime number was not still then allotted to the incident. Yet those documents bear crime number which shows clear manipulation in investigation," says the report.

The commission has, however, cast doubt on the reason for the meeting between the villages of Sarkeguda, Kottaguda and Rajpenta. "Accordingly, on consideration of several factors and circumstances as above, and in view of the presence of anti-social elements also in the meeting, as also the timing and venue of the meeting and as it was being held in a clandestine manner, it appears highly doubtful that it was being held for the arrangement of festivity for Beej Pandum."

In the last part of the 75-page report, on his "recommendations for the future", Justice Agarwal has said: "Security forces should be better trained and modern gadgets and means of communication should be made available to the forces for swifter command and more balance and guarded action in critical situations."

He has also called for "training to improve the mental fabric of the security forces, with a view to make them more balanced, so that they act with equanimity and do not succumb to panic reaction even in a critical situation." He says the forces should invest in bullet-proof jackets, night vision, stronger intelligence, more communication with locals and better communication

and the Krantikari Shetkari Party. Six Independent MLAs too, voted for the government. No votes were cast against the motion after the BJP and its supporting parties walked out before the headcount began. Four MLAs — two from the MIM, and one each from the MNS and the CPM — abstained.

Fadnavis alleged that the session had been called in violation of norms. "For a new session, summons need to be issued by the Governor. The message was given to BJP legislators at 1 am on Saturday. Was that done to ensure that BJP legislators could not reach for the trust vote? This session is not as per the Constitution," Fadnavis said.

Fadnavis also questioned the replacement of pro tem Speaker Kalidas Kolambkar of the BJP with Walse Patil ahead

of the floor test. "Once appointed, the pro tem Speaker continues till the regular Speaker is elected. But for the first time in the history of India, the pro tem Speaker was changed. Also, in the history of the Maharashtra Assembly, the trust vote has not happened before the election of the Speaker. At every step, our great Constitution is being insulted by this government," he said.

Fadnavis also faulted the session for beginning without the ceremonial singing of 'Vande Mataram', and the procedure that Chief Minister Thackeray and six Ministers followed while taking oath.

"Someone took Balasaheb Thackeray's name, someone took the name of Sonia Gandhi and Pawar Saheb's name. The oath has to be taken as mentioned in the pro forma," he

told reporters outside the Assembly.

Walse Patil said that the Governor had given all permissions. "The incident about oath-taking happened outside the Assembly. It is related to the Governor's office. I don't want to comment. The new government has the right to name the pro tem Speaker. The new Cabinet gave my name to the Governor, who appointed me as pro tem Speaker," he said.

Minister Jayant Patil asked why Fadnavis and the BJP had a "grudge" against Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj and Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar. "When something good happens in our life, we take the name of deities, and of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. The names of Shivaji Maharaj, Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar, Mahatma Phule were taken. Then what was the reason for Fadnavis and the BJP

to get so angry? Why do they have a grudge against these personalities? It's not just today; they have had this grudge for generations, and that anger has come out now," he said.

Minister Chhagan Bhujbal said many MPs have used words such as "jai Shri Ram" in Parliament. "If oaths are going to be cancelled due to this, then the entire Parliament has to be dissolved," Bhujbal said.

After winning the trust vote, Thackeray thanked the House, and the people of the state. "I have taken the oath in the name of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, and also in the name of my parents. If this is a crime, I will do it again and again. This is not the culture of Maharashtra. We should make Maharashtra such that the names of the people we took while taking oath, would have been proud," he said.

India, Japan hold first 2+2 meet

Sjaishankar led the Indian delegation while the Japanese side was headed by Foreign Minister Toshimitsu Motegi and Minister of Defence Taro Kono — the two countries also noted "significant progress" in the negotiations on the Acquisition and Cross-Servicing Agreement (ACSA), which will allow them to use each other's military bases for logistical support.

"The ministers underlined the need for all countries to ensure that all territory under their control is not used to launch terrorist attacks on other countries in any manner," said a joint statement. "They noted in this context the threat posed to regional security by terrorist networks operating out of Pakistan and called upon it to take resolute and irreversible action against them and fully comply with international commitments including to FATF," it said.

"They emphasised the need for stronger international partnership in countering terrorism and violent extremism, including through increased sharing of information and intelligence," said the statement.

The statement recalled the shared vision of a free, open, inclusive and rules-based Indo-Pacific region, in which the principles of sovereignty and territorial integrity are ensured, and all countries enjoy freedom of navigation and overflight.

The two sides also took note of the negotiations on a Code of Conduct (COC), and urged that it should be effective, substan-

tive, and consistent with international law, and must not prejudice the rights and interests of stakeholders using the South China Sea and freedom of all states under international law.

In October 2018, the two countries had agreed to begin formal negotiations on ACSA, which will allow the Indian Navy to access a Japanese base in Djibouti, while the Japan Maritime Self Defense Force (JMSDF) will be permitted to use India's military installations on the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

As part of capacity building in maritime security, India and Japan welcomed the setting-up of the Information Fusion Centre-Indian Ocean Region (IFC-IOR) by India in December 2018. "The Indian side looked forward to Japanese side dispatching a liaison officer at the IFC-IOR in the near future," the statement said.

It said the ministers noted with satisfaction the commencement of exchange of information based on the Implementing Arrangement for Deeper Cooperation between the Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force and the Indian Navy signed last year.

They emphasised the need to further strengthen cooperation on defence equipment and technology and looked forward to productive discussions at the fifth Joint Working Group on Defence Equipment and Technology Cooperation (JWG-DETC).

The Japanese side appreci-

ated India's announcement of "Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative" at the recent 14th EAS to create a safe, secure, stable, prosperous and sustainable maritime domain, and the Indian side welcomed Japan's "Vientiane Vision 2.0" in November 2019 as an updated initiative for defence co-operation between Japan and ASEAN.

They concurred to proceed with coordination for the "first India-Japan joint fighter aircraft exercise in Japan".

Earlier in the day, the two visiting ministers from Japan met Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The meeting came a day after Japan's Deputy Minister for Economy, Trade and Industry Hideki Makihara said in an interview to Bloomberg that Tokyo was not considering signing the China-backed Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) without India.

Earlier this month, India announced that it was withdrawing from the RCEP, citing the deal's potential impact on the livelihoods of its most vulnerable citizens. China said the 15 remaining countries had decided to move forward first, and India was welcome to join whenever it was ready.

"We aren't thinking about that at all yet," Makihara said in the interview on Friday. "All we are thinking of is negotiations including India... It is meaningful from the economic, political and potentially the national security point of view," he said, adding that "Japan will continue to try

to persuade India to join."

Trade Minister Hiroshi Kajiyama will accompany Japan's Prime Minister Shinzo Abe on his trip to India next month, Makihara said.

According to an official statement by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), Modi said at the meeting that both he and Abe attach great importance to strengthening bilateral partnership. The takeaway from the 2+2 meeting will set the stage for the Modi-Abe bilateral meeting, most likely in Guwahati, in mid-December.

"Prime Minister added that India's relationship with Japan was a key component of our vision for Indo-Pacific for peace, stability and prosperity of the region, as well as a cornerstone of India's Act East Policy," the statement said.

What is important is that both Delhi and Tokyo's objectives are aligned, in the face of an assertive and proactive Beijing in the Indo-Pacific region.

So far, only India and the US have the 2+2 ministerial mechanism, although India and Australia also have the 2+2 dialogue at the official level. With this, India has 2+2 dialogue mechanism with all the Quad countries. India, Australia, US and Japan have met under the rubric of Quadrilateral since 2017 at the official level, and at the foreign ministers' level in September this year. The India-US 2+2 level dialogue is expected to take place in Washington DC on December 18.

Between March and August, these 22 locations saw 27 deaths — a 44 per cent lower number than the corresponding period in the previous year. Deaths on the full stretch between Mumbai and Kalwa have come down by 81 per cent over the same period, records show.

K K Ashraf, Senior Divisional Security Commissioner, Railway Protection Force, Central Railway, said: "This is one of the effective measures we have found, which have shown an impact in reducing trespassing deaths. We will be carrying out

repainting of yellow sleepers in December, as they have faded over the months. We will also carry out these interventions at other locations to observe their impact."

Biju Dominic, a consultant with Final Mile, the company that designed the interventions for Central Railway, said: "Bridges cannot be made at every location as these are illegal settlements, but we have to find a way to reduce such deaths."

A similar experiment carried out by Final Mile on a 1-km stretch at Wadala resulted in a 75 per cent reduction in the number of deaths at the end of a year. The Railway has asked Final Mile to implement the innovations at other critical locations such as Diva and Kurla now.

Dominic said 90 per cent of deaths occurred at isolated spots between stations where people

don't cross in large numbers, and 85 per cent of victims were hit in broad daylight. "Our observations led us to believe that people become overconfident, which makes them less cautious. In this situation, a staccato horn and painted sleepers have a better chance of reducing deaths than a traditional awareness campaign," Dominic said.

Jayant Pandurang Shindi, an autorickshaw driver who lives in Datta chawl, said, "It has helped to have motormen honking while passing through this section. It grabs people's attention, and provides adequate warning." Shindi said his wife and he ensure that their three children do not cross the line unaccompanied.

The Government Railway Police (GRP) has identified some 128 black spots on Mumbai's suburban railway network. Most of these spots are the result of poor connectivity across the tracks,

which results in trespassing.

GRP records show trespassing is the biggest cause of deaths on tracks, and accounts for half of all accident deaths on Mumbai's suburban network. An average eight deaths occur on the suburban network every day.

Of the 2,981 deaths in 2018, more than 54 per cent (1,619) were due to trespassing. In 2017, the ratio was nearly the same: 1,651 out of 3,014.

Both Central Railway and Western Railway have been carrying out awareness campaigns, creating infrastructure, imposing penalties, and shutting down level crossing gates in an attempt to reduce deaths on the tracks.

on Saturday on the telling silence from India Inc. after official figures announced on Friday showed India's GDP growth slowed to 4.5 per cent in the second quarter of 2019-20, the low-

est quarterly growth rate since the January-March quarter of 2012-13. The absence of reactions from industry contrasted sharply with the effusive reactions after the government cut the rate of corporate tax in September.

Responding to Bajaj, Amit Shah said that while there was no need for anyone to fear, if he was saying that there is a certain kind of atmosphere, then "we will have to make an effort to improve the atmosphere". Several newspapers and columnists have written, and continue to write, against Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the NDA government, Shah said — in fact, the most stringent criticism had been directed against the present regime.

"Magar phir bhi aap jo keh rahe hain ki ek atmosphere banaa hai, hamein bhi atmosphere ko sudhaarne ka prayasa karna padega... but main itna zaroor kehna chaahtha hoon ki kissi ko dame ki koi zaroorat nahi hai... Na koi daraana chaahtha hai... Na kuchh aisa karaa hai jiske khilaf koi bole to sarkar ko chinta hai... Most transparent way mein ye government chali hai, aur hamein kissi bhi prakara ke virodh ka koi dar nahin hai, aur koi [virodh] karega bhi to uske merits dekh kar hum apne aap ko improve karne ka prayasa kareng (But even then, if you say that there is a certain kind of atmosphere, we will have to make efforts to improve the atmosphere. But I would like to say that there is no need for anybody to fear... No one wants to scare... and we have done nothing to be concerned about any criticism... The government has run in the most transparent way, and we have no fear of any kind of opposition, and if anyone does criticise, we will look at the merit of the same and make efforts to improve ourselves)," Shah said. Bajaj also flagged the statement of Pragya Thakur in Parliament praising the Mahatma's killer, and noted that she had been made a member of a House Consultative Committee even after the Prime Minister had said it would be difficult for him to forgive her (after she had said something similar earlier).

Lynchings, Bajaj said, "creates a hawaa — intolerance ki hawaa hai — hum darte hain... kuchh cheezon ko hum bolna nahin chahte hain par dekhte hain ki koi convict hi nahin hua abhi tak (It creates an environment of intolerance and we are scared. We don't want to say certain things but we see that until now no one has been convicted)".

Shah responded that he and senior BJP leaders such as Defence Minister Rajnath Singh had immediately condemned whatever Thakur had said. "Neither the BJP nor the government supports any such statement. We strongly condemn it," Shah said. He noted that while there was some confusion over whether Thakur had meant Nathuram Godse or the revolutionary Udhram Singh, she had apologised in Parliament.

On lynchings, Shah said: "Lynching pehle bhi hota tha, aaj bhi hota hai — shaayad aaj pehle se kam hi hota hai... Par ye bhi theek nahin hai ki kissi ka conviction nahin hua hai. Lynching waale bahut saare cases chale aur samaapt bhi ho gaye, sazaa bhi hui hai, par media mein chhapti nahin hain... Vineet ji yahaan par hain, agar dhoondh ke chhaenge to hamare liye thoda achchha hoga (Lynchings happened earlier too, and probably more than now... But it is not correct that there have been no convictions. Several cases of lynchings have been concluded and there have been punishments but the media does not publish them. Vineet ji [Vineet Jain, MD of the Times Group] is here, if he looks for them and publishes them, it will be good for us)."

Rs 12 cr gone from bank, AIIMS files complaint

THE ALL India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) has filed a complaint with the Economic Offences Wing of Delhi Police over "Rs 12 crore being stolen from its two State Bank of India accounts through cloned cheques in the last one month".

According to officials, the medical institute had discovered a few cases, wherein some SBI branches had "honoured" cloned/fake cheques worth Rs 12.44 crore. They added that in some cases, SBI officials managed to contact the authorised signatories of AIIMS to verify cheques before payments, hence preventing a few incidents of fraud.

"The institute uses public finance management system, a digitally secure system of the Ministry of Finance, for payments. There is no lapse on part of AIIMS. We have filed a complaint with Delhi Police Economic Offences Wing," said a senior official from the institute.

After the alleged fraud came to light, the SBI alerted all its branches and advised its employees against paying high-value cheques issued by AIIMS. The bank has also sent an alert message, which pops up as soon as employees working in the transaction department open their systems.

DCP (EOW) Varsha Sharma said, "We received a complaint from AIIMS Friday and are probing the matter. No FIR has been filed yet." As per sources, the money was siphoned from bank accounts the institute has with the SBI at its non-home branches in other cities.

AIIMS has also submitted a report to the Health Ministry in the matter.

TO BOOST INTELLIGENCE COLLECTION; INSPIRED FROM MUMBAI POLICE Police revive anti-terror officer post

IN A bid to boost ground-level intelligence collection, Delhi Police Commissioner Amulya Patnaik has decided to strengthen staff at all police stations by training them in counter-intelligence and reviving the post of anti-terrorist officers (ATO).

Following the Mumbai terror attacks, the Union Home Ministry had in 2009 decided to appoint an inspector-rank officer for anti-terror operations at all police stations in Delhi. Appointed as ATOs, these officers were in charge of beat patrolling,

the police's 'eyes and ears scheme', and conducting a security audit of potentially vulnerable places.

According to police, due to staff shortage, the ATOs had to begin looking after arrangements for protests and picket checking.

At the moment, sources said, two specialised units — anti-terror unit of the Special Cell and the counter-intelligence (CI) unit — work round-the-clock and coordinate with intelligence agencies such as the Intelligence Bureau (IB) and Research and Analysis Wing (RAW). However, intelligence gathering from the ground has taken a back seat, sources said.

Sources said the ATOs, these officers were in charge of beat patrolling,

such as the Walled City, Lajpat Nagar, Jamia Nagar, Okhla and some areas in North East Delhi.

While senior officers denied being inspired by other state police, *The Sunday Express* has learnt that the idea was inspired from the Mumbai Police, which has

specialised anti-terror cell units at all police stations. "A few months ago, a committee was formed by Patnaik, headed by JCP (Special Cell) Neeraj Thakur and senior officers of the Special Cell. Its members were asked to visit police stations in Mumbai. The team observed that the ATC gathers local intelligence, which they share with the anti-terrorism squad (ATS) and state intelligence department (SID) through official channels," said a senior police officer, adding that the findings were shared with Patnaik.

Police said personnel "with potential" will be identified to be part of the anti-terror unit. "At every police station, we are training the ATO and two personnel —

we hold a meeting, give them a task and assess it at the next meeting. For instance, we asked them to keep an eye on anti-social elements in their area and probe missing person complaints to ascertain if people have joined terror groups. We checked their reports at the next meeting. Now, we have asked them to maintain a record of suspicious people, illegal organisations operating in their area, and to start reading up on terror outfits such as the Islamic State," said a senior officer.

He added that personnel have also been told to look into missing persons complaints, especially of youth, and talk to their family about any change in behaviour before they went missing.

HC asks govt to fill school vacancies at the earliest

EXPRESSING CONCERN over vacant posts of teaching and non-teaching staff and lack of basic amenities in government schools in the capital, the Delhi High Court has directed authorities to fill up vacancies "at the earliest".

"We further direct the respondents (Delhi government and its education department) to provide drinking water in government schools... wherever there is a need of upliftment of

infrastructural facility, the same shall also be evaluated by the respondent concerned and remedial steps to this effect shall be carried out at the earliest," a bench of Chief Justice D N Patel and Justice C Hari Shankar said.

The court was informed that the appointment process for 9,232 vacancies for posts of teachers is underway. It was also told that selections for these posts are already over, and only the final posting remains, subject to certain verifications.

Noting this, the bench disposed of the petition.

Neighbour arrested for 'raping and killing' 55-yr-old in her home

A 55-YEAR-OLD woman was allegedly sexually assaulted and strangled by her 22-year-old neighbour early Saturday morning in North Delhi, police said. The accused, who works as a hawker in the locality, has been arrested, said police.

According to police, the woman was allegedly sexually assaulted by the accused after which she spat on his face. Angered by this, he allegedly strangled her, police said.

DCP (North) Monika Bhardwaj said, "During questioning, it was found that the man strangled her because he got angry that she spat on his face... the incident took place at 12.30-1 am Saturday."

Bhardwaj added that "sexual

assault can only be confirmed when the post-mortem report is out."

The woman ran a small shop at her home and lived alone, said police. According to Bhardwaj, the matter came to light when the woman's friend stopped by at her shop for a cup of tea. "Her friend stopped by every morning before leaving for work. He saw that the door of the house was open and the woman was lying on the floor," said Bhardwaj. A PCR call was made and the woman was taken to a hospital, where she was declared dead on arrival.

A police officer said, "CCTV footage of the locality showed the accused entering the lane where the woman lived around 12.30 am... A case of murder has been registered against the man. The woman's post-mortem will be conducted Sunday."

'CORRUPTION' CASE Court handed photocopy of document, pulls up CBI

A DELHI court pulled up the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) while hearing a corruption case related to former Delhi High Court judge Shameet Mukherjee, after the agency produced the photocopy of a case document instead of the original.

Special Judge Pulastya Pramchanda said, "I do find a serious need for overhauling of the system by senior officers concerned, so as to put a check over such irresponsible and ignorant attitude of the prosecution, which has the only effect, that is, to complete a formality without any gain for prosecution and to waste the precious time of the court."

The court said its order will be given to the director of prosecution and the CBI joint director to ensure sufficient remedial measures.

Mukherjee was arrested by the CBI for his alleged involvement in a criminal conspiracy in the 2003 DDA case scam.

As per the investigating agency, Mukherjee allegedly favoured restaurant owner Vinod Khatri in the Azad Singh vs DDA case, by handing over a draft judgment to him via a middleman.

The case related to the widening of Aruna Asaf Ali Road in the national capital.

Special Judge Pramchanda summoned a prosecution wit-

ness, Ramesh Chandra Joshi, who appeared before the court. As per the CBI's case, Joshi had furnished a copy of his ration card and signed an application form for obtaining a mobile phone number/connection from Airtel.

The witness was supposed to be confronted with the application form.

However the CBI prosecutor, Mohd Fareed, informed of the application that a photocopy of the application was on record, which has been marked during the examination of a previous witness.

When the court asked for the original application, the CBI counsel informed that "since the document had been marked, therefore, no steps were taken to seek production of original application form".

The judge replied such a submission was "shocking for me, because just putting mark on a document does not mean that such document stands proved and this is the basic principle of law of evidence, which is expected to be within knowledge of any prosecutor".

The judge added, "I have been requesting the prosecutors time and again to check the record before examination of any witness in advance, so as to make all necessary arrangements in advance. I fail to understand that how in absence of original application form, prosecution/CBI is going to achieve their expected objectives qua this witness".

Construction ban: Good for air, tough for daily wagers

AROUND 8 am, Dharam Singh (38) reaches the labour chowk near Govindpuri in his rented home in Okhla to find work. He waits for his turn as contractors and employers drive past, hiring workers for jobs ranging from brickwork to demolition to wall painting.

Of late, going has been tough. In an order earlier this month, the Supreme Court called for a complete ban on construction work in Delhi-NCR as a pollution control measure.

"I found work on two-three days this month. Earlier, I would work every day," said Singh, who came to Delhi from Bihar 20 years ago.

Dust emanating from construction sites is one of the major internal contributors to air pollution in the capital. A 2018 joint study by The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI) and Automotive Research Association of India (ARAI) found that dust and construction activities contributed 31% to PM10 levels and 15% to PM2.5 levels in Delhi during winters.

At the labour chowk, though, the conversations are less about

pollution and more about making ends meet. Dinesh Prajapati (39), who also begins his day at the Govindpuri labour chowk, said: "There is nothing to do. We hang around till noon but no one comes with a job. The only work we get is painting interiors of buildings, which has too many contenders."

The Environment Pollution (Prevention and Control) Authority (EPCA) had imposed a partial ban on construction activities during October 26-30 between 6 pm and 6 am as a measure to control deteriorating air quality, which had reached emergency levels on November 3. Since October 30, the EPCA, advised by a task force led by the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), has been extending the ban. From November 1 to 5, a complete ban was ordered by EPCA until the Supreme Court, on November 4, directed that all construction activities in Delhi-NCR be stopped until further orders.

This is the longest the construction ban, a pollution control measure under the Graded Response Action Plan, has been enforced in winter months for the past few years. Last year the ban was imposed from November 1-12. In 2017, it was

for an eight-day period from November 8.

Most men at the chowk either live with their families or send money back home. Niwajiz (24), another labourer at the chowk, says making enough for even food has been proving to be tough. Plus landlords have been knocking on their doors, asking for rent that is already due.

Usually, labourers say, they earn Rs 400-500 for a day's work. "We have been borrowing money for breakfast from anyone who is able to find work. Rs 20 here, Rs 10 there and we are able to eat something in the morning. At night, we either go to a gurdwara or a temple," Singh said.

With the threat of heavy penalties, construction sites in Govindpuri, CR Park and Greater Kailash II have remained shut since the ban was imposed, security guards at the sites confirmed.

Bharat Singh Chandal (22), a security guard at a construction site in Govindpuri, said, "Work stopped here last month and we were told that it would restart in a week. After a while, the labourers left as they could not find any work. There were around 25 of them who had come from UP, MP and Bihar. They couldn't go on that long without work."

BJP's poll pitch: Better homes for slum residents

AFTER PASSING a Bill in the Lok Sabha to regularise unauthorised colonies, the BJP will now focus on people living in the capital's slum clusters with a scheme that promises better homes for them.

More than 4 lakh people live in sub-standard housing in around 700 slums and JJ (jhuggi-jhopri) clusters. Many such homes lack basic facilities such as clear water, sewer connections and toilets.

To this end, the Delhi Development Authority (DDA), which is the nodal agency for implementation of in-situ development of JJ clusters, has completed the demand survey of 32 JJ clusters and started a survey of 160 slums on DDA lands in various parts of the city. Roughly 85,000 households are present in these areas.

Demand surveys are done to assess and ascertain the viability of a proposed housing project or scheme. Factors such as availability of land or any other upcoming project by a builder or third party are usually evaluated.

AAP lashes out at Centre over rising onion prices

The BJP-led Centre Saturday over rising onion prices in the capital. At a press conference, senior AAP leader and Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh alleged there is a nexus between BJP and black marketeers and hoarders. "The Delhi government was selling onion at Rs 23.90 per kg. To stop this, the Centre hiked the rate from Rs 15 per kg to Rs 60 per kg, while 32,000 tonnes of onion rotted away at government godowns.

For the remaining 180-plus JJ clusters on DDA and central government land, the demand survey will be carried out by engaging an agency on a priority basis, said a DDA official.

A total of 376 JJ clusters exist on DDA and central government land spread across Delhi, and comprise about 1.73 lakh households, covering an area of 40 lakh square kilometres.

Leopard scare: Housing society on toes but no sign of animal

EARLY SATURDAY morning, the Uttar Pradesh forest department received a call about a leopard spotting in the populated Gaur City II area of Noida Extension.

For the next 10 hours, officials from the department and a tranquillising team looked for the animal, as panic spread across the condos. Till the evening, however, there was no sign of the leopard.

Mohd Talib, a forester with the department, told *The Sunday Express*, "A call was received from the guard of JKG Palm Court society around 7 am about a leopard he spotted in a basement. We reached the spot with a net, a cage and a tranquillising team and looked everywhere, but didn't find the animal."

He said that the guard claimed he saw the leopard in the basement of an under-construction tower.

Manoj Pathak, SHO Bistrakh, said that a police team too reached the spot early morning and stayed till 11 am, but after no animal was found, the team left. What was found, however,

was a mysterious paw mark on wet soil. "It could have been a fishing cat—smaller than a dog,

bigger than a cat — and could have been mistaken for a leopard. It feeds on fish and might have strayed here by mistake," said Talib.

Apart from looking for the animal, the team also analysed CCTV footage, but to no avail. "We couldn't see anything but a team of five forest department officials will stay the night there, along with a net and cage," said Talib.

Even though no animal was spotted till late Saturday night, residents nearby were told to "maintain caution, keep the children indoors, keep doors and windows locked, and to inform the forest department or police if any animal is spotted".

'High levels of obesity among medical students'

A CROSS-SECTIONAL study conducted on students of Vardhman Mahavir Medical College (VMMC) & Safdarjung Hospital found that almost 50% of them were either overweight or obese. Researchers attributed this to a lack of physical activity.

The study, published in the International Journal of Healthcare Education & Medical Informatics, was done among 101 third-year medical students to assess their knowledge and practice of physical activities, using a pre-designed standard questionnaire. Of these students, 35.6% were female and 64.4% were male.

"The lifestyle today has become more sedentary. Obesity and many non-communicable diseases are increasing among people. Medical students have a

very demanding, stressful life. They have often been found to develop an unhealthy lifestyle. The activities assessed were walking, moderate-intensity activities and vigorous-intensity activities," said Dr Jugal Kishore, Director Professor & Head of Department Community Medicine, VMMC & Safdarjung Hospital and one of the study's authors.

Around 40% of the students had low-activity, while 44% were sufficiently active or moderately active. Only 15% of the participants were involved in high-physical activities. The study found that males (40%) were significantly more obese than females (13.8%).

"The most common reason for not exercising regularly was lack of time due to a busy schedule. Almost 58% of the students couldn't work out due to a hectic schedule," added Dr Kishore.

Protesting near Parliament, woman detained

New Delhi: A 25-year-old woman was detained from outside the Parliament Saturday afternoon, as she sat for a protest over crimes against women. Anu Dubey was holding a placard that read: "Why I can't feel safe in my own Bharat."

Delhi Police Additional PRO Anil Mittal said, "The woman was told she could not protest there and should move to Jantar Mantar. She refused to go and women personnel were sent. She was detained and let go after some time."

'CORRUPTION' CASE Court handed photocopy of document, pulls up CBI

A DELHI court pulled up the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) while hearing a corruption case related to former Delhi High Court judge Shameet Mukherjee, after the agency produced the photocopy of a case document instead of the original.

Special Judge Pulastya Pranchanda said, "I do find a serious need for overhauling of the system by senior officers concerned, so as to put a check over such irresponsible and ignorant attitude of the prosecution, which has the only effect, that is, to complete a formality without any gain for prosecution and to waste the precious time of the court."

The court said its order will be given to the director of prosecution and the CBI joint director to ensure sufficient remedial measures.

Mukherjee was arrested by the CBI for his alleged involvement in a criminal conspiracy in the 2003 DDA case scam.

As per the investigating agency, Mukherjee allegedly favoured restaurant owner Vinod Khatri in the Azad Singh vs DDA case, by handing over a draft judgment to him via a middleman.

The case related to the widening of Aruna Asaf Ali Road in the national capital.

Special Judge Pranchanda summoned a prosecution wit-

ness, Ramesh Chandra Joshi, who appeared before the court. As per the CBI's case, Joshi had furnished a copy of his ration card and signed an application form for obtaining a mobile phone number/connection from Airtel.

The witness was supposed to be confronted with the application form.

However the CBI prosecutor, Mohd Fareed, informed of the court that a photocopy of the application form was on record, which has been marked during the examination of a previous witness.

When the court asked for the original application, the CBI counsel informed that "since the document had been marked, therefore, no steps were taken to seek production of original application form".

The judge replied such a submission was "shocking for me, because just putting mark on a document does not mean that such document stands proved and this is the basic principle of law of evidence, which is expected to be within knowledge of any prosecutor".

The judge added, "I have been requesting the prosecutors time and again to check the record before examination of any witness in advance, so as to make all necessary arrangements in advance. I fail to understand that how in absence of original application form, prosecution/CBI is going to achieve their expected objectives qua this witness".

AROUND 8 am, Dharam Singh (38) reaches the labour chowk near Govindpuri for his rented home in Okhla to find work. He waits for his turn as contractors and employers drive past, hiring workers for jobs ranging from brickwork to demolition to wall painting.

Of late, going has been tough. In an order earlier this month, the Supreme Court called for a complete ban on construction work in Delhi-NCR as a pollution control measure.

"I found work on two-three days this month. Earlier, I would work every day," said Singh, who came to Delhi from Bihar 20 years ago.

Dust emanating from construction sites is one of the major internal contributors to air pollution in the capital. A 2018 joint study by The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI) and Automotive Research Association of India (ARAI) found that dust and construction activities contributed 31% to PM10 levels and 15% to PM2.5 levels in Delhi during winters.

At the labour chowk, though, the conversations are less about

Most men at the chowk either live with their families or send money back home. Niwajiz (24), another labourer at the chowk, says making enough for even food has been proving to be tough. Plus landlords have been knocking on their doors, asking for rent that is already due.

Usually, labourers say, they earn Rs 400-500 for a day's work. "We have been borrowing money for breakfast from anyone who is able to find work. Rs 20 here, Rs 10 there and we are able to eat something in the morning. At night, we either go to a gurdwara or a temple," Singh said.

With the threat of heavy penalties, construction sites in Govindpuri, CR Park and Greater Kailash II have remained shut since the ban was imposed, security guards at the sites confirmed.

Bharat Singh Chandal (22), a security guard at a construction site in Govindpuri, said, "Work stopped here last month and we were told that it would restart in a week. After a while, the labourers left as they could not find any work. There were around 25 of them who had come from UP, MP and Bihar. They couldn't go on that long without work."

BJP's poll pitch: Better homes for slum residents

AFTER PASSING a Bill in the Lok Sabha to regularise unauthorised colonies, the BJP will now focus on people living in the capital's slum clusters with a scheme that promises better homes for them.

More than 4 lakh people live in sub-standard housing in around 700 slums and JJ (jhuggi-jhopri) clusters. Many such homes lack basic facilities such as clear water, sewer connections and toilets.

To this end, the Delhi Development Authority (DDA), which is the nodal agency for implementation of in-situ development of JJ clusters, has completed the demand survey of 32 JJ clusters and started a survey of 160 slums on DDA lands in various parts of the city. Roughly 85,000 households are present in these areas.

Demand surveys are done to assess and ascertain the viability of a proposed housing project or scheme. Factors such as availability of land or any other upcoming project by a builder or third party are usually evaluated.

For the remaining 180-plus JJ clusters on DDA and central government land, the demand survey will be carried out by engaging an agency on a priority basis, said a DDA official.

A total of 376 JJ clusters exist on DDA and central government land spread across Delhi, and comprise about 1.73 lakh households, covering an area of 40 lakh square kilometres.

"The Delhi government was selling onion at Rs 23.90 per kg. To stop this, the Centre hiked the rate from Rs 15 per kg to Rs 60 per kg, while 32,000 tonnes of onion rotted away at government godowns.

The BJP-led Centre is responsible for the paucity of onions that happens every year," Singh said.

"When a farmer sells his onions in the market, he gets Rs 2-3 per kg for his produce. Hoarders and black marketers buy onion at this price, hoard the stock and later sell it for Rs 100 per kg, when the onion stock goes down in the market. This is possible only because the black marketers get support from the BJP-led Centre," he said. ENS

Leopard scare: Housing society on toes but no sign of animal

NOIDA, NOVEMBER 30

EARLY SATURDAY morning, the Uttar Pradesh forest department received a call about a leopard spotting in the populated Gaur City II area of Noida Extension.

For the next 10 hours, officials from the department and a tranquillising team looked for the animal, as panic spread across the condos. Till the evening, however, there was no sign of the leopard.

Mohd Talib, a forester with the department, told *The Sunday Express*, "A call was received from the guard of JKG Palm Court society around 7 am about a leopard he spotted in a basement. We reached the spot with a net, a cage and a tranquillising team and looked everywhere, but didn't find the animal."

He said that the guard claimed he saw the leopard in the basement of an under-construction tower.

Manoj Pathak, SHO Bistrakh, said that a police team too reached the spot early morning and stayed till 11 am, but after no animal was found, the team left. What was found, however,

bigger than a cat — and could have been mistaken for a leopard. It feeds on fish and might have strayed here by mistake," said Talib.

Apart from looking for the animal, the team also analysed CCTV footage, but to no avail. "We couldn't see anything but a team of five forest department officials will stay the night there, along with a net and cage," said Talib.

Even though no animal was spotted till late Saturday night, residents nearby were told to "maintain caution, keep the children indoors, keep doors and windows locked, and to inform the forest department or police if any animal is spotted".

'High levels of obesity among medical students'

A CROSS-SECTIONAL study conducted on students of Vardhman Mahavir Medical College (VMMC) & Safdarjung Hospital found that almost 50% of them were either overweight or obese. Researchers attributed this to a lack of physical activity.

The study, published in the International Journal of Healthcare Education & Medical Informatics, was done among 101 third-year medical students to assess their knowledge and practice of physical activities, using a pre-designed standard questionnaire. Of these students, 35.6% were female and 64.4% were male.

"The lifestyle today has become more sedentary. Obesity and many non-communicable diseases are increasing among people. Medical students have a

very demanding, stressful life. They have often been found to develop an unhealthy lifestyle. The activities assessed were walking, moderate-intensity activities and vigorous-intensity activities," said Dr Jugal Kishore, Director Professor & Head of Department Community Medicine, VMMC & Safdarjung Hospital and one of the study's authors.

Around 40% of the students had low-activity, while 44% were sufficiently active or moderately active. Only 15% of the participants were involved in high-physical activities. The study found that males (40%) were significantly more obese than females (13.8%).

"The most common reason for not exercising regularly was lack of time due to a busy schedule. Almost 58% of the students couldn't work out due to a hectic schedule," added Dr Kishore.

Protesting near Parliament, woman detained

New Delhi: A 25-year-old woman was detained from outside the Parliament Saturday afternoon, as she sat for a protest over crimes against women. Anu Dubey was holding a placard that read: "Why I can't feel safe in my own Bharat."

Delhi Police Additional PRO Anil Mittal said, "The woman was told she could not protest there and should move to Jantar Mantar. She refused to go and women personnel were sent. She was detained and let go after some time."

Delhi Commission for Women chief Swati Maliwal also reached the police station where Dubey was detained. She said, "The woman claimed police misbehaved with her and she has filed a complaint. We have issued a notice to Delhi Police in the matter." ENS

CHIHUAHUAS, MALTESE PUPPY AMONG STOLEN ANIMALS

33 dogs stolen from Noida vet hospital, 10 recovered in raid

SHIVAMPATEL
NOIDA, NOVEMBER 30

TEN OUT of 33 dogs, allegedly stolen by a pet shop owner from a private veterinary hospital in Noida and being kept in "unsanitary conditions", were recovered by Noida Police Friday after an overnight operation.

The shop owner, Gyanendra (27), is absconding, an officer at Noida Phase III police station said.

Among the dogs recovered are a female golden retriever, a male golden retriever stud, two chihuahua puppies, a maltese puppy and a blue eyed beagle. Police said they have been handed over to the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA). Police are looking for the rest of the animals.

The officer said an FIR was earlier filed against Gyanendra for animal cruelty and illegal dog breeding, following which police and animal care activists Thursday rescued 33 dogs and a cat from his shop in Noida's Phase II. The rescued dogs were then shifted to private hospital

in Noida Phase III for medical examination. However, the same day, Gyanendra and his associate allegedly stole all 33 dogs.

The FIR was filed by Kaveri Rana Bhardwaj, president of non-profit People For Animals (PFA), Gautam Budh Nagar, after she received a complaint by one of Gyanendra's customers on the "poor condition of animals at his shop".

Bhardwaj said, "All kinds of dogs, sick and healthy, were kept together in cages. We found seven puppies inside a box that was

closed and taped from the top... they were separated from their mother. The cages looked like they had not been cleaned in days."

Bhardwaj alleged Gyanendra had been breeding dogs without a licence. "At the private hospital on Friday, one of the accused engaged doctors in a conversation as the other stole the dogs," an officer said. However, Bhardwaj claimed Gyanendra and his associate had threatened the doctors of violence. She claimed she had seen CCTV footage of the incident, showing the accused "stuffing all 33 dogs inside an

SUV along with their beds".

A Noida police officer said that after being intimidated of the alleged theft, police teams raided several locations overnight in Noida and Delhi before tracing the dogs to Gyanendra's residence in Noida's Sector 119 on Friday morning.

While Gyanendra is absconding, police have made an arrest in the case.

Bhardwaj said the dogs were identified through photographs. She said the female golden retriever recovered is pregnant, and its condition was "critical" as of Saturday evening.

A veterinary doctor who is overseeing the treatment of the rescued dogs said all of them were brought in with cough and ticks and were in trauma after being shifted from one place to another several times. "Medical test results will tell if they have any disease," he said.

At a facility on Saturday, where the dogs are being housed temporarily, most were asleep. The male golden retriever, who appeared to be in good health, was taken out for a walk.

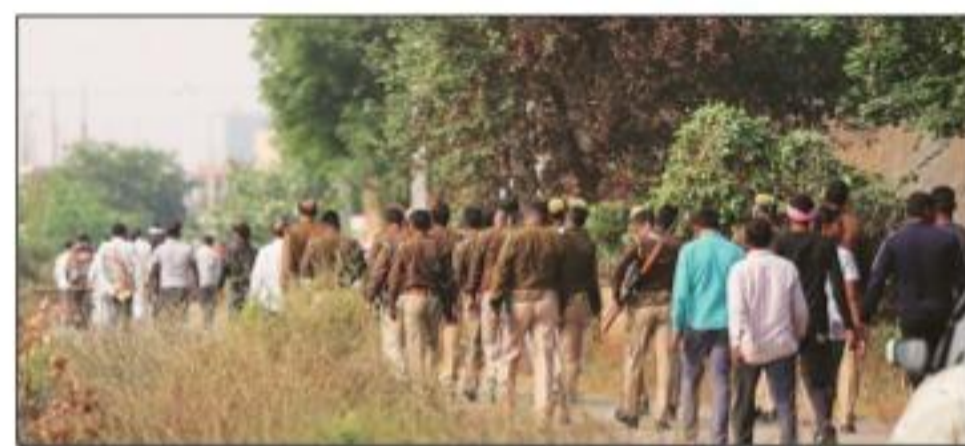
Two brothers gunned down in UP village

POLICE HAVE increased deployment in Gautam Budh Nagar's Rabupura village after two brothers were gunned down over a rivalry between two families that has spanned several years.

According to police, Gajender Singh (33), a farmer, and Akash Bhati (23), a powerlifter who was famous in his village, left home for an outing with two friends in two vehicles, a Creta and an Accent, on Friday night.

The cars were ambushed by a group of around eight men, who fired around 10 bullets into the vehicles. While both brothers

died from gunshot wounds, their friends were injured and admitted to AIIMS in Delhi.

"It was a matter of circumstance that just one bullet hit


each... but these punctured their heart, causing instant death. At this point, it is hard to pinpoint how the rivalry started. But it had been going on for years. The

tempers were raised many times before, but never to this level," said Ranvijay Singh, SP Rural, Gautam Budh Nagar.


"The accused, many of whom are related, have fled. One person has been arrested," said Vineet Chaudhary, SHO Rabupura. "It appears they have fought in the past leading to enmity. The family of the victims claim it was an ambush," said the officer.

Sources said there had been friction between the two families because of financial reasons as well as a petty parking row around two months ago.

Police had to calm the victims' family before the cremation could be carried out, an officer said.





Polling peaceful, turnout 64.6% in Jharkhand

ABHISHEK ANGAD RANCHI, NOVEMBER 30

THE FIRST phase of Jharkhand Assembly elections in 13 constituencies spanning six districts saw a voter turnout of 64.66 per cent. At 71.47 per cent, Lohardaga recorded the highest turnout, while the lowest was recorded at Chatra Assembly constituency — 58.92 per cent. "All these constituencies are in the most Maoist violence-affected districts, but the polls went off peacefully. In all, 4,162 out of 4,892 polling stations were categorised as critical, adequate security arrangements were made," the Election Commission stated.

According to the EC, there was a low-intensity IED blast near a bridge connecting Ghagra village with Hapad village under Bishunpur police station area of Gumla district. "There was no loss of life. The incident seems to have been carried out by some local sympathiser of Maoists," the poll panel stated.

In Daltanganj constituency, a clash between supporters of the BJP and the Congress was reported. Congress candidate from Daltanganj, KN Tripathy, said: "In Koirahra booth of Chainpur block, when I went to look at the election process, I saw about a hundred men who weren't letting anyone enter the booth. When I resisted, they started beating me. I had to pull out my licensed gun to save myself. They destroyed my bulletproof vehicle."

The EC stated: "The candidate

took out his licensed weapon and his bodyguards came out to protect him as people were chasing him. The weapon has been seized and action is being taken. There was no disturbance in polling."

The value of total seizures in the first phase stood at Rs 1.56 crore, according to the EC.

Prominent candidates whose fate will be decided in the first phase include Jharkhand Health Minister Ramchandra Chandravanshi, state Congress chief Rameshwar Oraon and Sukhdev Bhagat, a former minister, and BJP candidate Bhanu Pratap Shahi.

The BJP is contesting 12 seats and supporting one Independent. The JMM, Congress and RJD are fighting in alliance, and have fielded candidates in four, six and three seats, respectively.

Cong's Patole in Speaker contest with BJP's Kathore

THE CONGRESS on Saturday announced party MLA Nana Patole as the candidate of the ruling alliance for the Assembly Speaker's election. The BJP has named Kisan Kathore as its nominee.

Patole's nomination has cleared the path for NCP to take over the post of deputy chief minister in the Shiv Sena-led coalition government. The Congress had been keen that it too should be allotted the deputy CM's post and had been hesitant in taking over the Speaker's position.

But with Patole's nomination, NCP's path towards installing its own nominee as the deputy CM has increased, with party leaders Jayant Patil and Ajit Pawar being frontrunners for the post.

The Speaker's election will be held on Sunday, a day after the ruling alliance cleared the floor test.

Both Patole and Kathore are in their fourth term as MLAs. While Patole is the MLA from Sakoli in Bhandara-Gondia, Kathore has been elected from Murbad constituency in Thane. "We have fielded Kisan Kathore as our candidate for the Speaker's post. We would like to put up a fight on the floor of the House on Sunday," state BJP president Chandrakant Patil said.

Unlike the trust vote, the Speaker's election will be conducted through a secret ballot and not telecast live, giving the BJP hope that it would be able to make some dent in the ruling coalition's numbers.

But state Congress president Balasaheb Thorat maintained that there would be no surprises on Sunday. "Our support base will remain intact. We have 169 MLAs. We will win the Speaker's election," he said.

Fadnavis gov't decisions in last 6 months likely to be reviewed

AFTER ORDERING a stay on the construction of a Metro car shed at Aarey Colony in Mumbai Friday, Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray has now ordered a review of all decisions taken by his predecessor, Devendra Fadnavis, in the last six months, it is learnt.

Sources said Uddhav has directed for a re-look into major policies, contracts, tenders and financial decisions taken by the previous government. They said orders on review of all files approved in the last six months were issued on Friday.

"All department secretaries have been asked to submit files cleared during to the period to the chief minister's office," a senior official said.

During his first interaction with department secretaries on Friday, Uddhav had indicated that while he did not wish to disturb the continuity in the decision-making process, he will not tolerate submission of "dubious" files.

On September 3, the Fadnavis government had cleared a Rs 13,000-crore guarantee to the 701-km Mumbai-Nagpur expressway project, or Samruddhi Corridor, despite objections by the state finance department. Following the change of guard, this decision will now be reviewed, said officials.

The project, estimated to cost Rs 55,335 crore, is likely to be one of those under review. Clearance granted to many irrigation projects before the elections is also under review, officials said.

THE GOVERNMENT of Assam on Saturday appointed an Assam Civil Service (ACS) officer to officiate as the NRC state coordinator until Hitesh Dev Sarma, the officer appointed as Prateek Hajela's successor, returns from a month-long leave, officials said.

Babul Sarma, an ACS officer of 1989 batch currently posted as a secretary in the home and

political department of the government of Assam, will hold office as state coordinator so that necessary official and administrative processes are not hampered by the absence of the head of the NRC office in the state.

"It is a temporary arrangement," a top state government official told The Sunday Express.

ernment on November 11 following a Supreme Court order, and the new appointee Hitesh Dev Sarma went on a month-long leave for his son's marriage.

With the office remaining empty, there was uncertainty regarding issuance of rejection slip to the 19 lakh people excluded from the final NRC. Only with the rejection order, specifying the cause of rejection, can the excluded people file appeals against their exclusion at the state's Foreigners' Tribunals.

Cong alleges Rs 5,000 cr 'mining scam' in Haryana, seeks probe

THE HARYANA Congress Saturday accused the previous BJP government in state of turning a blind eye to illegal mining, leading to a "scam" of Rs 5,000 crore, and demanded a probe by a sitting Punjab and Haryana High Court judge. The BJP said these were "politically motivated allegations".

Citing a Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) report, which reportedly detected a loss of Rs 1,476 crore in Haryana's mines and geology department because of "irregularities" in execution of its projects, Congress chief spokesperson Randeep Singh Surejwala alleged that illegal mining not only caused loss to the state exchequer, but also damaged the environment. "The CAG report has exposed how the Manohar Lal Khattar government turned a blind eye towards illegal mining and over-exploitation of valuable minerals. The report states how the course of the rivers were changed for illegal mining and open loot of minerals," Surjewala said. Till March 31, 2018, the Khattar government did not recover Rs 1,476.21 crore from

mining contractors, he claimed citing the CAG report, and alleged that "the mass bungling was due to collusion between politicians, bureaucrats and mining mafia".

He said that the previous government was expected to earn a revenue of Rs 2,133 crore per year from 95 mining areas. "But the mining contractors were illegally extracting minerals from double the allotted areas. If we assume that three-fourth mining contractors are extracting minerals in this illegal manner then it puts the state to a loss of more than Rs 5,000 crore," he alleged.

Polling peaceful, turnout 64.6% in Jharkhand

THE FIRST phase of Jharkhand Assembly elections in 13 constituencies spanning six districts saw a voter turnout of 64.66 per cent. At 71.47 per cent, Lohardaga recorded the highest turnout, while the lowest was recorded at Chatra Assembly constituency — 58.92 per cent. "All these constituencies are in the most Maoist violence-affected districts, but the polls went off peacefully. In all, 4,162 out of 4,892 polling stations were categorised as critical, adequate security arrangements were made," the Election Commission stated.

When I resisted, they started beating me. I had to pull out my licensed gun to save myself. They destroyed my bulletproof vehicle."

The EC stated: "The candidate

took out his licensed weapon and his bodyguards came out to protect him as people were chasing him. The weapon has been seized and action is being taken. There was no disturbance in polling."

The value of total seizures in the first phase stood at Rs 1.56 crore, according to the EC.

Prominent candidates whose fate will be decided in the first phase include Jharkhand Health Minister Ramchandra Chandravanshi, state Congress chief Rameshwar Oraon and Sukhdev Bhagat, a former minister, and BJP candidate Bhanu Pratap Shahi.

Cong's Patole in Speaker contest with BJP's Kathore

THE CONGRESS on Saturday announced party MLA Nana Patole as the candidate of the ruling alliance for the Assembly Speaker's election. The BJP has named Kisan Kathore as its nominee.

Patole's nomination has cleared the path for NCP to take over the post of deputy chief minister in the Shiv Sena-led coalition government. The Congress had been keen that it too should be allotted the deputy CM's post and had been hesitant in taking over the Speaker's position.

But with Patole's nomination, NCP's path towards installing its own nominee as the deputy CM has increased, with party leaders Jayant Patil and Ajit Pawar being frontrunners for the post.

The Speaker's election will be held on Sunday, a day after the ruling alliance cleared the floor test.

Both Patole and Kathore are in their fourth term as MLAs. While Patole is the MLA from Sakoli in Bhandara-Gondia, Kathore has been elected from Murbad constituency in Thane.

"We have fielded Kisan Kathore as our candidate for the Speaker's post. We would like to put up a fight on the floor of the House on Sunday," state BJP president Chandrakant Patil said.

Unlike the trust vote, the Speaker's election will be conducted through a secret ballot and not telecast live, giving the BJP hope that it would be able to make some dent in the ruling coalition's numbers.

But state Congress president Balasaheb Thorat maintained that there would be no surprises on Sunday. "Our support base will remain intact. We have 169 MLAs. We will win the Speaker's election," he said.

Fadnavis gov't decisions in last 6 months likely to be reviewed

AFTER ORDERING a stay on the construction of a Metro car shed at Aarey Colony in Mumbai Friday, Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray has now ordered a review of all decisions taken by his predecessor, Devendra Fadnavis, in the last six months, it is learnt.

Sources said Uddhav has directed for a re-look into major policies, contracts, tenders and financial decisions taken by the previous government. They said orders on review of all files approved in the last six months were issued on Friday.

"All department secretaries have been asked to submit files cleared during to the period to the chief minister's office," a senior official said.

During his first interaction with department secretaries on Friday, Uddhav had indicated that while he did not wish to disturb the continuity in the decision-making process, he will not tolerate submission of "dubious" files.

On September 3, the Fadnavis government had cleared a Rs 13,000-crore guarantee to the 701-km Mumbai-Nagpur expressway project, or Samruddhi Corridor, despite objections by the state finance department. Following the change of guard, this decision will now be reviewed, said officials.

The project, estimated to cost Rs 55,335 crore, is likely to be one of those under review. Clearance granted to many irrigation projects before the elections is also under review, officials said.

Assam: Babul Sarma to officiate as interim NRC coordinator

THE GOVERNMENT of Assam on Saturday appointed an Assam Civil Service (ACS) officer to officiate as the NRC state coordinator until Hitesh Dev Sarma, the officer appointed as Prateek Hajela's successor, returns from a month-long leave, officials said.

Babul Sarma, an ACS officer of 1989 batch currently posted as a secretary in the home and

political department of the government of Assam, will hold office as state coordinator so that necessary official and administrative processes are not hampered by the absence of the head of the NRC office in the state.

"It is a temporary arrangement," a top state government official told The Sunday Express.

The office of the state coordinator of the National Register of Citizens (NRC) has been vacant since Hajela, the former officer, was released by the state gov-

ernment on November 11 following a Supreme Court order, and the new appointee Hitesh Dev Sarma went on a month-long leave for his son's marriage.

With the office remaining empty, there was uncertainty regarding issuance of rejection slip to the 19 lakh people excluded from the final NRC. Only with the rejection order, specifying the cause of rejection, can the excluded people file appeals against their exclusion at the state's Foreigners' Tribunals.

Cong alleges Rs 5,000 cr 'mining scam' in Haryana, seeks probe

THE HARYANA Congress Saturday accused the previous BJP government in state of turning a blind eye to illegal mining, leading to a "scam" of Rs 5,000 crore, and demanded a probe by a sitting Punjab and Haryana High Court judge. The BJP said these were "politically motivated allegations".

Citing a Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) report, which reportedly detected a loss of Rs 1,476 crore in Haryana's mines and geology department because of "irregularities" in execution of its projects, Congress chief spokesperson Randeep Singh Surejwala alleged that illegal mining not only caused loss to the state exchequer, but also damaged the environment.

"The CAG report has exposed how the Manohar Lal Khattar government turned a blind eye towards illegal mining and over-exploitation of valuable minerals. The report states how the course of the rivers were changed for illegal mining and open loot of minerals," Surjewala said.

Till March 31, 2018, the Khattar government did not recover Rs 1,476.21 crore from

mining contractors, he claimed citing the CAG report, and alleged that "the mass bungling was due to collusion between politicians, bureaucrats and mining mafia".

He said that the previous government was expected to earn a revenue of Rs 2,133 crore per year from 95 mining areas. "But the mining contractors were illegally extracting minerals from double the allotted areas. If we assume that three-fourth mining contractors are extracting minerals in this illegal manner then it puts the state to a loss of more than Rs 5,000 crore," he alleged.

Rajesh Kalia said that an Army patrol operating at an altitude of 18,000 feet in Southern Siachen Glacier was hit by an avalanche in the early hours on Saturday. "An Avalanche Rescue Team rushed and managed to pull out all members of the patrol. Simultaneously, Army helicopters were pressed into service to evacuate the avalanche victims," the spokesperson said in a statement. Officials said that despite best efforts by the medical teams, two Army personnel succumbed. They were identified as Naib Subedar Tsewang Gialshan and Rifleman Padma Norgais, both residents of Leh.

NE leaders meet Shah, oppose CAB

Minister assures civil society groups, political representatives that all concerns will be addressed

HOME MINISTER Amit Shah on Saturday held a series of meetings with representatives, including chief ministers, from Northeastern states on the Citizenship Amendment Bill (CAB), 2019. Almost all those who met Shah, from politicians to student groups and other civil society members, opposed the Bill in its present form, and expressed fear that it would change forever the demography of their regions, and destroy local culture, sources said. The Home Minister on his part assured civil society groups and political representatives that the ethno-cultural concerns of all stakeholders in the Northeast would be addressed, and that the Bill would provide protection to such regions and states where the Inner Line Permit (ILP) is applicable, and autonomous ad-

ministration has been granted under the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution.

The CAB, which aims to make it easier for non-Muslim refugees from Bangladesh, Pakistan, and Afghanistan to get Indian citizenship, is likely to be introduced in this session of Parliament.

The consultations with the Northeastern states will continue until December 3; the House will be in session until December 13.

Among those who met Shah were Assam Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal and his senior colleague Himanta Biswa Sarma, Union Minister Kiren Rijiju, leaders from Assam's All India United Democratic Front (AIUDF), members of the All Assam Minority Students' Union (AAMSU), and several civil society groups from Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, and Meghalaya.

Shah had met representatives from Tripura and Mizoram on Friday. He will meet leaders from Nagaland on December 3.

"Most delegates were of the view that the CAB in its current form is not acceptable. Honourable Home Minister said the government is preparing a new draft which will preserve the rights and privileges of the Northeast people. There will be a cut-off date also. New draft of CAB will be followed by a pan-Indian NRC (National Register of Citizens)," Sarma told *The Sunday Express*.

As reported by *The Indian Express* on Saturday, Sarma said the states which have the ILP regime, and the areas under the Sixth Schedule and other special

provisions, will be exempted. "With the cited exemptions, Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, and 25 per cent of Assam areas will get exemptions. However, this may not be 100 per cent exemption," Sarma said.

Former Arunachal CM Nabam Tuki, who met Shah on Saturday, told reporters: "We oppose CAB because, if illegal immigrants are given citizenship based on religion, their population will spread across many states. Which state will give them land?"

Sources said AIUDF expressed serious concern over the CAB, while AAMSU urged Shah to ensure that the amended law does not violate the Assam Accord. Pramod Boro of All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) said: "If some populous group is regularised through this Bill, it will create problems for indigenous people."

Pradyot Manikya Debbarma, the erstwhile Maharaja of Tripura who led the organisations from his state, told *The Sunday Express*:

"We oppose the CAB in its present form... Of all the Northeast states, Tripura has suffered the most from the influx from Bangladesh... which has reduced the majority tribals to a minority."

Former Tripura Chief Minister Manik Sarkar, Tripura CPM secretary Gautam Das, and former CPM MP and president of the Tripura Rajya Upajati Ganamukti Parishad Jitendra Chaudhary, have written to the Home Minister opposing the CAB.

Oddly, Manipur has been left out of Shah's meetings. "This is strange since it is Manipur that has been spearheading protests against CAB," Th. Athouba, general secretary of civil society group United Committee Manipur (UCM), said. Manipur CM N Biren Singh said: "Manipur students' unions are a part of the Northeast Students' Organisation, which is being consulted in the process. We are hopeful that we will also be called to meet the Home Minister..."

Shakti and Disaster Management Practices here, Singh said. "No one should be under any misconception that some laws are not being applied here — all of them are coming. There are 854 Central laws, and we have less than 200 here... We have no choice but to cooperate; we will have to sacrifice." He added, "Let me also tell you, whether you cooperate or not, it is going to happen."

In fact, the MoS said, "we should have the spirit to come forward and say that we are ready to sacrifice our small interests for the bigger cause and the bigger purpose which Prime Minister Narendra Modi has laid before us." Maintaining that demands of the protesting lawyers are not justified, Singh said, "...All of us will have to swallow a bitter pill."

IN A settlement of tin huts that stands in the shadow of a high-rise apartment complex in Bellandur, Bengaluru, all talk is of the difficult journey back "home".

"This was a bustling colony. Now I look at it and want to cry. Almost everyone has left. Those who haven't are, like me, waiting to scrounge together some money," said a greying man in his 40s, who asked not to be named. "We need Rs 15,000 per head to return: there is the train fare to pay, money for the trip; and there are guards to be paid off at the border," he said. He said he has worked in the city's waste collection and segregation business for 13 years, doing the "ganda kaam" that paid for the education of his two college-going daughters back home in Bangladesh. "A few weeks ago, I sent most

of my family away. Only one daughter is with me. If the government does not want us here, what can we do? Better to be caught at the border than here," he said. He said he was born in Mohanganj, Bangladesh, and came to India as a child with his parents. He worked in Delhi for many years, before he moved to the Karnataka capital. According

to residents, of the 200 families that lived here, only 10-20 remain. In some of the abandoned houses, local Kannadiga residents have moved in.

In many other settlements (Thuburahalli, Haralur, Sarjapur) too, the story is of a reluctant but resigned exodus, turning many of the places into "ghost towns", said a legal aid activist.

A 28-year-old man said he quit his job as a driver soon after a raid by Bengaluru police on October 25 that led to detention of 60 people, including 40 women and children. "I quit out of fear. I didn't want the police to catch me. If even one person is caught, that family is ruined," he said.

He is now faced with the prospect of a perilous journey back to Bagerhat in Bangladesh with his 25-year-old wife and one-month-old son. "If we are caught in Bangladesh, it's still okay. We have documents to show, and they will release us eventually. But if we are caught in India..." said his wife. "Our country has little work, and too many people. Even if you work, you can't earn. That's why we move," she said.

Around 200 people were arrested on the India-Bangladesh border earlier this month, while trying to cross over from India. Reports in Bangladesh's newspapers suggest they were fleeing

"harassment" in Bengaluru.

For Bengaluru's waste management businesses, departure of the migrants has led to a crunch in workers. "I had 80 workers and 12 trucks to collect waste from colonies. Now, only 20 workers are left, they will leave too," said Minhaz, a resident of Chhapra, Nadia, who runs a waste segregation operation in Haralur.

Behind a construction site in Bellandur is a "godown", where the waste from the city's airport is segregated. "A month ago, the Bangladeshi *thekedar* of this godown left. So, I was asked by the land owners to take over," said Shariful, a migrant from West Bengal, whose workers now run operations here. "But with Bangladeshis leaving, there are just no people to do this work. Will the Bengalis or the Indians do this work? No way. They just will sit and watch TV," he said.

10 months as 'slaves' in Yemen, nine Indians back in Kerala on stolen boat

ON NOVEMBER 19, when they finally decided to flee Yemen coast to put an end to their 10-month ordeal, all that the nine fishermen from Kanyakumari region had was an 80-foot-long deep-sea fishing boat stolen from their employers, about 7,000 litres of diesel, limited supplies, and a GPS machine set with a latitude and longitude coordinating to Kochi.

With that, they sailed for 10 days.

On Friday, the nine, natives of Colachel near Kanyakumari, reached Kochi harbour with the help of a Coast Guard vessel. After hours-long briefing before security agencies, they were let off on Saturday evening, a closure for all that they faced since January, when they landed, unwittingly, at Al-Shihri, a fishing harbour in southern Yemen's Hadhramaut.

Sahaya Jagan, 33, one of the fishermen, said five of them had initially gone to Sharjah port in the UAE in December 2018 with a job of maintaining boats, primarily ensuring performance of the engine and GPS. After working there for 45 days, they were asked to go to Oman with an Arab guide for

further work. It did not bother them, Jagan said, since Oman is a peaceful coast.

"But we were actually being taken to Yemen's Al-Shihri port, in the southwest of Oman. Soon after reaching there, the Arab guide left and a new agent took charge. They collected our passports and sent us for many fishing expeditions, each lasting 15 days," he said.

Four more fishermen from Thiruvananthapuram coast, near Kanyakumari, joined them by March.

After two months, and spending over 45 days in sea, Jagan said they were paid only 1950 Dubai Dirhams (about Rs 38,000). "We questioned this, but they were not

willing to talk. They stopped supply and refused to release our passports. As they denied us stay, we had to stay on the boat."

They alerted Yemen coast guard officials, only to be told that "our supply will be restored if we continue work. We had no other option and went fishing again," Jagan said.

"They gave us our passports only when we went for fishing — we finally decided to escape," he said.

On November 19 they left Shihri "as usual for fishing", and headed to India with a GPS coordinate for Kochi coast, about 1600 nautical miles (nearly 3,000 km) away.

When they were about 150 nautical miles (nm) from Kerala coast, they realised they were running short of diesel. "We managed to call a relative in Kanyakumari before the battery of the only phone died. We pleaded with them to alert Indian authorities to rescue us," Jagan said.

Finally, early Friday, when they were about 68 nm from Kochi harbour, a Coast Guard patrol ship traced them and towed their fishing boat to Kochi harbour.

Father Churchill, general secretary of South Asian Fishermen Fraternity, who was in Kochi on Saturday to help them complete formalities with the government agencies, said many such fishermen are stranded in Gulf countries, living a slave's life. "The Centre and state governments should have a mechanism to address such cases," he said.

House panel calls Twitter, Facebook to discuss women's cyber safety

THE PARLIAMENTARY Committee on Women's Empowerment has called representatives of social media giants Twitter and Facebook next week to discuss issues related to women's safety in the cyber world.

The issue of cyber safety and security for women will be discussed in the next meeting of the committee, and representatives of Twitter and Facebook group including WhatsApp and Instagram will be present, it was learnt.

The Committee on Women's Empowerment, headed by BJP member Heena V Gavit, will meet on Wednesday and Thursday.

This is the second time in a month that the committee will

discuss this issue. On November 21, officials from the Ministry of Home Affairs, Women and Child Development and Electronics and Information Technology made a presentation and briefed the members.

The issue assumes significance in view of an increase in cyber crime against women. A recent report released by National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) shows that out of the total cyber crimes (21,796) registered in the country in 2017, 4,242 were committed against women. The cyber-crimes against women were related to cyber blackmailing or threatening, cyber pornography or hosting or publishing obscene sexual materials, cyber stalking or cyber bullying of women, defamation or morphing and indecent representation of women.

Sambhal girl dies of burns week after being raped, set on fire

A 16-YEAR-OLD girl who was allegedly raped and set ablaze by her neighbour in Sambhal, Uttar Pradesh, last week succumbed to serious burns in a Delhi hospital on Saturday. She was admitted to Safdarjung Hospital for the past nine days.

The girl suffered 85 per cent burn injuries, said doctors from Safdarjung. "Her condition was critical when she was admitted. She sustained burns on the entire body," said a senior doctor.

On November 21, the girl was alone in her house when her neighbour allegedly raped her. He later poured kerosene on her and set her ablaze, police said, adding that she was rushed to the district hospital from where she was referred to Delhi.

"Following the unfortunate death of the rape victim, we have updated the FIR incorporating Section 302 (murder) of IPC. We will be taking the matter to fast-track court for speedy disposal. The victim's family will be duly compensated as per government guidelines. There was only one accused who was arrested on the day of the crime," Yamuna Prasad, Sambhal SP, said.

The National Security Act is being invoked against the accused, Prasad added.

HYDERABAD RAPE, MURDER: 14-DAY CUSTODY FOR 4

Amid big protest, remand plea heard in police station

THE FOUR accused in the rape and murder of a Hyderabad veterinarian on Wednesday night were remanded to 14 days in judicial custody on Saturday amid protests by people outside Shadnagar Police Station, where the accused were kept since Friday night after their arrest.

Amid protests by hundreds of people, demanding death penalty for the accused, the police decided to request the jurisdictional magistrate to visit the police station to take up the remand application.

Protests began around 9 am with a handful of individuals and soon became a huge gathering of angry people. "This was not organised by any NGO, political party or any organisation. We gathered here on our own. We are outraged by this inhuman act and want swift justice," Anmula Karthik, a graphic designer who lives nearby and was one of the protesters outside the police station, said.

The 27-year-old veterinarian went missing from Shamsabad toll plaza, near Hyderabad, on Wednesday night. The four accused raped and then burnt her to death, the police have said.

Her burnt body was recovered the following day.

Amid the protests on Saturday, Cyberabad Police Commissioner V C Sajjanar said, "We are assuring people that the case will be tried in a fast-track court and justice will be done. We understand the anger of the people, but we request them to be patient and let the law deal with this."

Four DCPs arrived at Shadnagar Police Station in the afternoon to assess the situation. As angry protesters tried to enter the police station on a few occasions, the police had to use force to keep them at bay. They later closed the police station's gates with chains and locks. Some protesters demanded that the ac-

cused should be handed over to the public for swift justice.

After assessing the situation, the four DCPs decided to call for reinforcements and a convoy of over a dozen vehicles to take the accused to jail. The accused were finally taken to the high-security Chanchalguda prison.

Earlier, police requested a team of government doctors to conduct a medical check-up of the accused at the station itself, as they sensed risk in taking them out in view of the protests.

The Ranga Reddy District Bar Association has, meanwhile, decided that no lawyers will represent the accused.

Minor out to celebrate birthday gangraped, 4 held: TN Police

A MINOR girl who had gone to a park near Coimbatore with a friend to celebrate her birthday was allegedly gangraped, police said. Four accused were arrested on Saturday, but two main accused are absconding.

According to the police, the girl and her friend spent time in a park on Tuesday evening to celebrate her birthday. "As they were about to leave the place around 8 pm, a six-member gang stopped them and assaulted the girl's friend, aged 19.

The victim and her friend were taken to an isolated place, where the gang members sexually assaulted the girl and filmed the act, according to the police.

Both the victim and her friend were taken to an isolated place away from the park, where the gang members allegedly sexually assaulted the girl and filmed the act. Six of them also assaulted her male friend, stripped

him and shot videos," said an officer.

"The girl told her mother about the incident the next day, and a complaint was filed at an all-women police station," the officer said. A special team was on the hunt for the accused over the last three days.

The accused who were arrested are T Rahul (21), RPrakash (22), S Karthikeyan (28) and S Narayanamurthy (30); all of them hail from the neighbourhood where the alleged crime happened, police said. After being produced in a mahila court, they were remanded in judicial custody on Saturday.

UP: 7-year-old raped, killed; 1 held

A SEVEN-YEAR-OLD girl was sexually assaulted before she was strangled to death by a man in Hardoi district. Police said the incident took place late Thursday night when the girl had gone to a wedding in her neighbourhood with some of her friends. Police said they have arrested a man who has confessed to the crime.

"After the girl did not return home for two hours, her family started looking for her. The next day, her body was found from

behind a temple close to the spot where the wedding took place. Police were informed and her body was sent for postmortem. The report has confirmed sexual assault and death due to strangulation," said police.

"Based on the complaint of the girl's father, an FIR was registered against an unidentified person under IPC sections 376 (rape) and 302 (murder) of the IPC along with relevant sections of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act. Teams were then formed to identify the accused. With the help of people present at the wedding and police informants, within 24

hours of the FIR, we arrested the accused who also confessed to the crime," the police said.

According to a statement issued by Hardoi police, the accused was arrested from a liquor shop on Saturday.

"The accused said that he was attending his distant cousin's marriage and in an inebriated state took the girl behind the temple on the pretext of giving her noodles. He sexually assaulted her and strangled her to death. He left the body there and fled from the spot. The accused is being sent to jail and the legal procedure will follow," the police statement added.

Retd officer probing stolen idol cases refuses to hand over records as term ends

RETIREED IPS officer Ponn Manickavel, who was heading the Idol Wing CID as a court-appointed special officer, has refused to hand over all records and details pertaining to idol theft cases to Additional DGP Abhay Kumar Singh even after his one-year tenure ended on Saturday.

The government had on Friday issued an order to Manickavel to hand over the records of all cases being probed under him. Manickavel "shall hand over all the records/details pertaining to cases and work done by him and by the special investigation team to Abhay Kumar Singh, ADGP, Idol Wing CID, on November 30, as his tenure is expiring on November 30," stated an order issued by Home Secretary Niranjan Mardi.

However, Manickavel on

Saturday replied that his appointment was made by the High Court and that the constitution of the special investigation team was confirmed by the Supreme Court, and that it is "legally impermissible" for him to hand over the records of the SIT and the officers to an ADGP.

Once a close aide of V K Sasikala, a friend of late J Jayalalithaa, Manickavel had shot to fame with raids seizing idols from high-profile businessmen and art collectors. While the ouster of Sasikala and her family from the ruling AIADMK dented his influence in the police force, Manickavel's functioning was questioned by the state over his refusal in cooperating with superiors in review meetings. He had earlier told the court that his superiors were trying to obtain sensitive information when the court was also monitoring the probe.

Manickavel was not available for comment.

Adityanath meets PM Modi

New Delhi: Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath Saturday called on Prime Minister Narendra Modi here on Saturday.

Adityanath described it as a courtesy meeting but sources said he discussed development-related issues with the Prime Minister.

Adityanath invited the Prime Minister to inaugurate a 25-ft

statue of former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee on his birth anniversary on December 25.
