

A) As per the provisions of section 80E of the Income Tax Act, deduction in respect of interest on loan taken for higher education shall be allowed as a deduction subject to the following conditions: •

A) According to Section 80C the life insurance premium paid by an individual, at any time dur-ing the previous year qualifies for deduction, if such premium is paid by an individual for him-self/herself, his/her spouse or for children whether dependant or not. It is not at all neces-sary that the person for whom the premium is paid should be an income-tax assessee. The req-uisite as per law is only that the premium paid by the assessee is for the persons specified above. Hence, you will not have any problem in respect of deduction claimed by you for earlier years as well.




