

Lt Gen Naravane set to be next Army Chief

VICE CHIEF of the Army, Lieutenant General Manoj Mukund Naravane, is set to be the next Army Chief, official sources confirmed to *The Indian Express* on Monday.

He will succeed General Bipin Rawat, who will retire on December 31.

The government has stuck to the seniority principle in appointing Lt Gen Naravane as the next chief as he is the senior-most officer in the Army after Gen Rawat. He will serve till April 2022, when he turns 62.

Lt Gen Naravane had taken charge as the Vice Chief on September 1; before that, he headed the Eastern Command of the Indian Army.

In his nearly four decades in the Army, Lt Gen Naravane has worked in key appointments in active counterinsurgency environments, both in the Northeast and in Jammu and Kashmir, according to the Army. He was also part of the Indian Peace Keeping Force in Sri Lanka during Operation PAWAN in 1987.

He has been decorated with the Param Vishisht Seva Medal and the Ati Vishisht Seva Medal during his career. He was also the Inspector General of Assam Rifles (North) in Nagaland.

An alumnus of the National Defence Academy, Lt Gen Naravane was commissioned into the 7th Battalion of The Sikh Light Infantry Regiment in June 1980.

Hailing from Pune, his father, Mukund Naravane, had retired from the Indian Air Force, and his mother, Sudha Naravane, was a

writer and news broadcaster with All Indian Radio in Pune. She died last year.

Lt Gen Naravane is alumnus of the Jnana Prabodhini Prashala in Pune and has had a keen interest in painting and sports since school days. His friend from Jnana Prabodhini, Dr Milind Modak, an orthopaedic surgeon, said, "I remember from the schooldays that he has been a very composed and balanced person. (He) took keen interest in painting and sports. I don't remember him impulsively reacting to anything. After he joined the National Defence Academy, we always used to believe that he would do some magnificent in life. All of us from his friend circle and Jnana Prabodhini family are very proud and happy after hearing the news."

The Army Chief retires either at the age of 62 or after serving for three years at the post. The outgoing Army Chief, Gen Rawat, is considered one of the frontrunners to become the first Chief of Defence Staff, a post announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his Independence Day address this year.

Out on bail in rape attempt case, man threatens victim's family, held again

Lucknow: Prayagraj police Monday rearrested a 34-year-old history-sheeter for allegedly threatening a girl and her family to withdraw an attempt to rape case lodged against him in 2017.

The accused was released from prison on bail in April in connec-

tion with the attempt to rape case. The girl's father alleged that the accused had threatened to shoot and set them ablaze, police said.

Police said a case was lodged against the accused for allegedly trying to rape a 16-year-old girl in 2017. **ENS**

2 soldiers killed in Pak firing along LoC in J&K

TWO SOLDIERS were killed in firing from across the Line of Control in Jammu and Kashmir's Bandipore and Rajouri districts on Monday, officials said.

According to officials, an exchange of fire began along the LoC in Sunderbani sector of Rajouri on Monday evening after Indian soldiers noticed the movement of some armed men under suspicious circumstances and challenged them.

As soldiers challenged those moving along the LoC, they resorted to firing, followed by a heavy explosion, Defence Ministry spokesperson Lt Colonel Devender Anand said. Immediately thereafter, Pakistani troops resorted to "heavy firing" towards the Indian side to support the suspicious movement, leading to retaliation by the Indian Army, Lt Col Anand said.

The exchange of fire between two sides was in progress late

Monday evening, he added.

"In the ongoing heavy exchange of fire, one soldier of Indian Army martyred. Details follow," he stated.

Late evening, Pakistani troops initiated unprovoked ceasefire violation in Kalal area of Nowshera sector; the Army is retaliating befittingly, the spokesperson said.

During the day, Pakistani troops resorted to mortar shelling and small arms fire along the LoC in Krishna Ghati area of Poonch district and the Indian Army retaliated, it was informed.

Havildar Jyotiba Ganpat Chougule, 36, was killed in ceasefire violation by Pakistan in Gurez sector in north Kashmir.

"There was unprovoked ceasefire violation by Pakistan in Gurez sector. Our troops retaliated strongly. One soldier was martyred," an Army officer said.

Havildar Chougule came from a family of farmers in Mahagaon village, in Maharashtra's Kolhapur district. He had joined the Army in 2002.

He is survived by parents Ganpati and Vatsala, wife Yashoda, sons Atharv and Harsh, and younger brother Rajnikant. The family owns a farm near Mahagaon village.

Vinaya Sawant, close family friend and a neighbour, said, "We all remember him as a calm and composed brother-like figure from the village, who was always ready to help others... The entire village is mourning his death. We do not know how to console his family members.... The whole village stands with them."

Local officials said the last rites will be performed in Mahagaon on Tuesday afternoon.

Meanwhile, Northern Army Commander, Lt General Ranbir Singh, laid wreath at Dhruva Shahid Samarak in Udhampur, J&K, to pay homage to soldiers killed during the 1971 Bangladesh Liberation War with Pakistan.

Indore police file chargesheet in MP 'honey trap case'

INDORE POLICE on Monday filed the chargesheet in the alleged Madhya Pradesh 'honey trap case', naming eight people, including two who are at large.

Meanwhile, Indore police have booked Jeetu Soni, businessman and editor of the newspaper *Sanjha Lokswami*, on a rape complaint by a Mumbai-based woman. Soni's newspaper had filed several reports on the honey trap case until late-November.

The police chargesheet comes nearly three months after the case came to light in which government officials were allegedly blackmailed and extorted by threatening them with sex clips allegedly involving them.

Harbhajan Singh, a now-suspended Indore Municipal Corporation superintending engineer, had approached the police alleging that he was being blackmailed for Rs 3 crore by some women, who had threatened to circulate clips showing him in a compromising position. Five women were subse-

quently arrested from Indore and Bhopal on Sept 18 and 19. During raids on their premises, the police said, laptops and phones and Rs 14 lakh cash were seized. The gadgets contained hundreds of video and audio clips, the police said.

The electronic evidence has been sent to the Central Forensic Science Laboratory in Hyderabad on orders from the Madhya Pradesh High Court, which is monitoring the probe by a Special Investigation Team. The chargesheet was filed in the court of JMFC A K Gupta. The five women and their driver, Omprakash Kori, 45, have been charged under IPC Sections related to conspiracy, forgery, extortion, human trafficking and criminal intimidation, as well as Sections 66 (e), 67 and 67-A of Information Technology Act. All six are in judicial custody, while two others were named as absconders.

In the rape case against Soni, the Mumbai woman alleged that during her trip to Indore three years ago a bounce took her to the restaurant-bar 'My Home', where Soni allegedly raped her. She also alleged that the bounce made a video of the act.

Slew of illegal properties demolished across MP

Bhopal: A slew of illegal and unauthorised properties allegedly belonging to land sharks and criminals have been demolished in Indore, Bhopal, Gwalior and Jabalpur within days of Chief Minister Kamal Nath giving a free hand to the local administration and police to crack down on mafia at a meeting here on Thursday.

Indore saw the district administration and Indore Municipal Corporation working with the police on Monday to pull down three properties. On Sunday, the corporation demolished illegal construction in basements of hospitals and hostels among over 350 such violations in a list drawn separately.

The crackdown led to a war of words between the BJP and the Congress. BJP's Jabalpur MP Rakesh Singh alleged the Congress government was targeting those associated with the BJP. Hitting back, the CM's media coordinator Narendra Saluja said, "The mafia prospered during the 15-year rule of the BJP. Why did the previous government not act against these elements who terrorised people?" **MILINDGHATWAI**

Payal Rohatgi sent to judicial custody for eight days for remarks on Nehru, others

A LOCAL court in Bundi sent model-actor Payal Rohatgi to judicial custody for eight days on Monday following her comments against Motilal Nehru and Jawaharlal Nehru, among others.

The Rajasthan Police had picked up Rohatgi from Ahmedabad on Sunday and presented her on Monday at the ACJM court, which sent her to judicial custody. "Our argument is that she enjoys freedom of expression and the Rajasthan police has no jurisdiction," her lawyer Bhupendra Singh Sahay said, adding that "We have already filed a bail plea in the sessions court which will be heard Tuesday."

In a video, which she posted on her social media accounts, Rohatgi made comments about members of the Nehru-Gandhi family, including Motilal Nehru, Jawaharlal Nehru, Indira Gandhi, Rajiv Gandhi and Sanjay Gandhi.

The FIR was filed at the Sadar police station in Bundi on Oct 10, on the basis of a complaint by Charmesh Sharma, general secretary of the Indian Youth Congress in Rajasthan. She has been charged under IPC Sections 504 (intentional insult with intent to provoke breach of peace), 505 (statements conducing to public mischief) and Section 67 of the IT Act (publishing or transmitting obscene material in electronic form), said Bundi SP Mamta Gupta.
