## Several injured, police station vandalised as Bihar bandh turns violent

AROUND TWO dozen people were injured, 1,550 people detained and 13 arrested across Bihar during a bandh called by the RJD and its alliance partners to protest against the new citizenship law and proposed na-

Six people were injured in firing, while another six including two policemen were injured in brickbatting in Patna, police said.

There were reports of violence in Vaishali, Bhagalpur and Bhojpur and Gopalganj as well. The police used teargas and mild lathicharge at these places.

Road and train services were disrupted across the state, with at least a dozen trains running behind schedule.

Leader of Opposition Tejashwi Prasad Yadav, who led the Opposition's protest march in Patna, said they had asked Bungalow Chowk their workers to protest peace-

RLSP chief Upendra Kushwaha, who also joined the

protest, said the central government had forced "unnecessary law and order problems" by amending the citizenship law. Around two dozen people in-

cluding an assistant sub-inspector were injured in Patna, Nawada and Aurangabad during the protests. More than 50 people vandalised a police station in Nawada. An assistant sub-inspector of police was injured in Aurangabad when a group of protesters allegedly threw stones at a police team, prompting them to use teargas.

#### Threat to Pak from India increasing due to anti-CAA protest: Imran

**PRESS TRUST OF INDIA** ISLAMABAD, DECEMBER 21

PAKISTAN PRIME Minister Imran Khan on Saturday expressed apprehension that India could carry out a "false flag operation" against it to divert attention from its domestic situation and warned that it will give a befitting response to any such action. In a series of tweets, Khan

said that under the Modi government, India has been moving towards "Hindu Rashtra" with its "fascist ideology".

"...Now with the Citizens Amendment Act. all those Indians who want a pluralist India are beginning to protest & it is becoming a mass movement," Khan said.

As the protests in India are increasing, "threat to Pakistan from India is also increasing" and the Indian Army chief General Bipin Rawat's remarks on the situation along the Line of Control adds to Pakistan's "concerns of a false flag operation", he said.

"I have been warning the int community of this for some time & am reiterating again: if India does such an operation to divert attention from its domestic

chaos plus whip up war hysteria to mobilise Hindu nationalism, Pak will have no option but to give a befitting response," he

Earlier, Pakistan Army spokesperson Maj Gen Asif Ghafoor had described Gen Rawat's remarks as a tactic to take global attention away from domestic issues.



## govt announces farm loan waiver up to Rs 2 lakh

MAHARASHTRA CHIEF Minister Uddhav Thackeray on Saturday announced an unconditional crop loan waiver of up to Rs 2 lakh on outstanding loans taken from 2015 to September 30, 2019. The scheme, to be called Mahatma Jyotirao Phule Farmer Loan Waiver Scheme, was announced by Uddhav in the Assembly on the concluding day of its winter session.

"The government will waive farmers' loans of up to Rs 2 lakh, pending till September 30. I am announcing the Mahatma Jyotirao Phule Farmer Loan Waiver Scheme today in the House. The scheme will start from March next year as the government will require two months for its rollout," Uddhav said in the Assembly. Besides, a special scheme would be offered for farmers who repay their loans on time, he said.

Uddhav said it would be a transparent scheme and the money would be directly transferred to the bank accounts of farmers. "Farmers will not have to meet any conditions. Our intention is to make as many farmers debt-free as possible. The loan taken for the current season, which will be pending next June, will be restructured. A separate incentive scheme will be announced in the next 15 days for farmers who are paying crop loans regularly," he added.

Jayant Patil, Minister for Finance and senior NCP leader, said the number of beneficiaries and total loan amount to be waived will be announced soon. "Loans of farmers, which have remained outstanding since 2015, would be waived. The total amount to be spent will be more than Rs 20,000 crore, as claimed to have been disbursed by the previous BJP-led government... no

FARM LOAN waiver was one of the main components of the Common Minimum Programme of the Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress government. The new scheme comes two years after the Rs 34,000-crore loan waiver announced by then BJP-Sena government in 2017. There was no word on the exact burden the new scheme would put on the state treasury.

forms would be needed, no one will have to stand in queue and no online form submission would be needed, which was required for the previous government's loan waiver scheme," he added.

Leader of Opposition Devendra Fadnavis alleged that the government had not fulfilled its original promise of full loan waiver Staging a walkout from the Assembly, he alleged that the government has "backstabbed' farmers. He also questioned the government's failure to give assistance of Rs 25,000 per hectare to farmers who suffered losses due to unseasonal rain, a demand which Uddhav himself had made before he became CM.

## Mangaluru cop says didn't talk of bodies, BSY defends firing

A POLICE officer who has been linked to a voice heard in a video clip where policemen were being asked why no bodies had not dropped in the firing in Mangaluru on Thursday has denied any knowledge or link to the clip. The video clip, which has

been widely shared online, was also provided to the media by Congress leader Siddaramaiah during a press briefing in Bengaluru on Friday. An inspector from Kadri police

in Mangaluru, Shantharam, was linked to the video, which had an officer (who was not seen) telling policemen why no bodies had dropped in police firing. The video has been linked to the police firing incidents in Mangaluru during protests against the citizenship law.

"I don't know anything about this," said the police officer, who was on duty during Karnataka Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa's meetings with officials in the

coastal city on Saturday.

"The participants in the protests were rogues and were bent on disrupting law and order. If firing had not occurred then an Uttar Pradesh-like situation would have prevailed (here). We had few choices. We get hauled up whether we do something, or (even) when we do not," the inspector said.

Referring to the video clip shared by Siddaramaiah, Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister CN Ashwathnarayan said, "We all know such videos can be created."

Mangaluru police have faced criticism for their action against

protesters on Thursday, including firing and an 'attack' on a hospital with teargas.

Yediyurappa, who met families of the victims on Saturday, defended the police's version - that the police opened fire on protesters in self-defence. He said, "The incidents are unfortunate. The police had no options when they felt that firearms at Bunder police station would be targetted in the protest. We do not know what catastrophe would have occurred had the police station been attacked and the firearms taken away by the protesters."

But local residents of Bunder area claimed protesters had no plan to attack the police station.

Referring to the police firing teargas shells in Highland Hospital, where victims of the firing in Bunder were taken on Thursday evening, and the police barging into the hospital to look for protesters, Yediyurappa said, "An inquiry will reveal the truth....They(police) have shown me all video clips. I have had two rounds of discussions with the police authorities... I have told everyone to maintain peace."

#### Vandals will be shot: Bengal BJP president

WEST BENGAL BJP state president Dilip Ghosh has said that those destroying government properties will be shot. "Dosh hok ba aksho hok, desher sompotti noshto korle guli khete hobe. Ta she Assam e hok, ba Uttar Pradesh e hok (Be it 10 or 100, those destroying our nation's properties will get bullets, whether in Assam or Uttar Pradesh or anywhere else)," Ghosh said when asked about the deaths in Uttar Pradesh and other parts of the country during the anti-CAA protests.

Ghosh was speaking to the media on the sidelines of a pro-Citzenship Amendment Act rally in Bankura.

The Trinamool Congress has reacted strongly to Ghosh's statement, accusing the Midnapore MP of trying to provoke people. "His statements are meant to provoke people and disturb peace. We do not expect anything better from him or his party colleagues," said TMC leader Tapas Roy.

### Modi holds meet with ministers, reviews key sectors

PRIME MINISTER Narendra Modi on Saturday held a marathon meeting with the Council of Ministers, reviewed the performance of key sectors and held deliberations on a vision for the next four and a half years. The meeting, which started

10.30 am and concluded after 6 pm, was attended by all the ministers in the Modi government. According to sources, discussions were held on two key sectors: rural agriculture and allied sectors, and infrastructure. The government had set a tar-

get of doubling farmers' income by 2022 and has launched some schemes such as PM-Kisan. Sources said that the implementation of such flagship schemes was reviewed in the meeting.

It was also learnt that suggestions regarding the Union Budget 2020-21, which will be

of the Council of Ministers of the Modi government that took oath on May 30 this year. The first meeting took place in June.

It was not clear whether the protests over the new citizenship law came up for discussion during the meeting. The issue may figure in a meeting of the Union Cabinet scheduled for Tuesday, as it is expected to approve a proposal of conducting the 2021 Census and updation of National Population Register (NPR).

#### Sonia's anti-CAA post retweeted from Oli's handle, later deleted

A RETWEET of Congress president Sonia Gandhi's video message criticising the Narendra Modi government from Nepal Prime Minister K P Oli's official Twitter handle was removed after severe criticism on social media, with a top aide of the Nepal PM stating that the account may have been temporarily compromised.

Sonia's 2.37-minute video message, criticising the Modi government over attempts to allegedly suppress protests

against the new citizenship law with "brute force" and tweeted from the Congress party's official handle, was retweeted a few minutes later from Oli's Twitter handle on Friday.

As it was greeted with hostile messages, some calling it an act of immature diplomacy that may affect Nepal's relationship with

India, the tweet was removed. Oli's press adviser Surya Thapa said, "Someone may have abused the Prime Minister's password (and misused the Twitter account)." Thapa said the matter is be-

ing investigated, without giving more details.

Traditionally, Oli and his erstwhile Communist Party of Nepal-United Marxist Leninist and the Sonia Gandhi-led Indian National Congress have been on good terms, while Oli's relationship with PM Modi soured after the 134-day-long economic blockade by India beginning September 2015.
