PM Modi silent on economy, govt. clueless: Chidambaram

Ministers are allowed to engage in bluff and bluster, says Congress leader

A day after his release from Tihar jail on bail, former Union Finance Minister P. Chidambaram on Thursday questioned Prime Minister Narendra Modi's "silence" on the economic slowdown and accused the government of being "clueless even as its Ministers are engaged in bluff and bluster"

He also asserted that his "record as a Minister and his conscience was clear".

Mr. Chidambaram, who spent 106 days in judicial remand in money laundering and corruption cases, also hinted at the hardships he faced during his incarceration, stating that his "spine and head had become stronger by sleeping on a wooden cot without a pillow".

"Even after seven months into the fiscal year, the BJP government believes that the problems faced by the economy are cyclical... It is wrong because it is clueless. It is unable to look for the obvious clues because it is stub-

born and mulish in defending its catastrophic mistakes such as demonetisation, flawed GST, tax terrorism, regulatory overkill, protectionism, and centralised control of decision-making in the PMO," he told reporwhere he last addressed a press conference on the night of his arrest.

'Incompetent manager' Mr. Chidambaram's blistering attack on the government over the economy came on a day the Reserve Bank of India revised the GDP growth estimates for the current year from 7.4% to

He said the Prime Minister remained "unusually silent but allows his Ministers to engage in bluff and bluster". "The net result, as The Economist put it, is that the government has turned out to be an 'incompetent manager' of the economy."

In a surprise, RBI keeps interest rate unchanged

There is space for further policy action: Shaktikanta Das

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) surprised the market by keeping the policy interest rate unchanged at 5.15% at the fifth bimonthly monetary policy review meeting, despite slowing economic growth, citing inflation concerns.

The market was expecting the central bank to cut interest rates for the sixth straight time. All six members of the monetary policy committee voted for keeping the rate unchanged. The accommodative stance of the monetary policy was retained.

...the MPC has committed to maintaining an accommodative stance as long as it is necessary to revive growth, while ensuring that inflation remains within the target," RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said at a briefing.

Status quo

The RBI has retained the repo rate (rate at which the central bank lends to commercial banks) at 5.15%. It had reduced



"This forward guidance in itself indicates that there is space for further monetary policy action. However, there is a need to optimise the impact of rate reductions. The key consideration has to be the timing of further actions, even as we monitor the impact of actions taken so far," Mr. Das said. He said the RBI paused to wait for further clarity on the inflation front and the steps that the government might take in the Budget to prop up growth.

Set ablaze, Unnao rape victim battles for life

All five accused taken into custody

A 23-year-old woman from Unnao district in Uttar Pradesh is battling for life after she was set ablaze on Thursday allegedly by five persons, including two she had accused of rape in March last year.

After treatment at a community health centre in Unnao and at a government hospital in Lucknow, she was air-lifted to Delhi. She was in a critical condition with 95% burns, doctors said. All the five accused were arrested, the Unnao

Unnao, Vikrant Vir said the police received information through the Dial 112 emergency service that the accused had tried to burn the

While reports said the woman was going to attend a court hearing in Rae Bareli in connection with the rape case when she was attacked, Lucknow IG S.K. Bhagat said she was going to meet her lawyer. The incident occurred around 4.15 a.m., he said.

Chief Minister Yogi Aditvanath has ordered tough action against the culprits.

'DU ad hoc teachers will keep their jobs'

UGC will tweak the controversial August 28 circular issued by V-C, says DUTA

Office-bearers of the Delhi University Teachers' Association (DUTA) on Thursday met officials from the Human Resource Development Ministry over the issue of absorption of ad hoc teachers, following prolonged protests at the Vice-Chancellor's office. Declaring the teachers' movement a success, DUTA president Rajib Ray said, "No ad hoc teacher would lose their job on the basis of the August 28 circular [issued by the V-C office]." UGC officials have agreed

to amend the controversial circular, which had directed colleges to appoint guest teachers against vacancies arising in the current academic session, to include the terms "ad hoc/temporary/

contract" as well, a DUTA representative said. The decision of the Delhi University Principals' Association to not renew ad hoc appointments made after July 20, the start of the current academic session, on the basis of the circular had put at risk jobs of up to 400 such teachers, claimed Mr. Ray.

A DUTA representative said that their strike has not been called off and the union executive body would meet on Friday to take a call on it. Until then, the invigilation boycott of ongoing semester examinations will continue.

Through the day on Thursday, hundreds teachers gathered on the lawns of the Viceregal Lodge to hold demonstrations. Sources said that government officials refused to take the dialogue further until the premises were vacated.

Sources in DUTA said the MHRD officials have agreed to increase the weightage of "experience points" by two to three times the current weightage. The UGC will issue an advisory to DU to call all serving ad hocs for interviews for permanent jobs,


