Ecuador: No land for Nithyananda

South American nation Ecuador on Friday confirmed that controversial "godman" Nithyananda visited Ecuador recently but denied that he was given asylum or that any land had been sold to him. India, meanwhile, on Friday said it had cancelled his passport over a year ago, and it had "sensitised" Indian missions to keep foreign governments informed about Nithyananda's antecedents.

The rape-accused self-styled godman flew the country without a passport and he may have fled through Nepal. Sources in Ecuador said Nithyananda had recently visited the country "as a tourist".

In an official statement from New Delhi, Ecuador said: "The Embassy of Ecuador categorically denies that self-styled Guru Nithyananda was given asylum by Ecuador or has been helped by the government of Ecuador in purchasing any land or island in South America

near or far from Ecuador. Moreover, Ecuador denied the request for international personal protection (refuge) made by Nithyananda before Ecuador and later on. Nithyananda left Ecuador presumably on his way to Haiti. All the information published in India, is based on the information which allegedly has been sourced from kailaasa.org, a website which is supposedly maintained by Nithyananda or by his people."

On reports that the "godman" had through his website declared a separate "nation" on an island purchased by his followers, MEA spokesperson Raveesh Kumar said: "Setting up a website is different from creating a nation."

"When we got information about the cases pending against him, what we did was that we cancelled his passport first," he said. "Then he applied for a fresh passport which was denied. There was an adverse police report. We have asked our missions to sensitise the local government that if he happens to transit through that country, they should let us know."

6 seek review of Ayodhya verdict

Claim Nov. 9 judgment condoned illegalities

The All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) on Friday said that the Ayodhya verdict, which stated that the entire disputed site must be handed over to a trust for the construction of Lord Rama's temple, was a "failure rather than a fulfilment of complete justice" as the judgment was "contrary to law and self-contradictory".

Pointing to a number of "illegalities and inaccuracies", the petition seeking the review of November 9 verdict also claimed that the judgment was "violative of the complete justice that was invoked".

Petitions seeking the reconsideration of November 9 judgment were filed by Maulana Mafiz-Ur-Rahman, Misdahuddin, Mohd Umar, Ahadif, Hasbilah, Hazi Mahboob. All six petitioners are backed by the AIMPLB.

"The judgment is flawed in privileging peace over justice while not appreciating that there could be no peace without justice," read the petitions seeking reconsideration of the Ayodhya verdict.

"By giving the title of the disputed site to the idol of Ram Lalla," the petitions read, the Supreme Court judgment "appears to have rewarded the Hindu parties for all the illegalities committed by them throughout particularly in 1952, 1949 and 1992 including preventing Muslims from offering

prayers at the mosque." At the outset, the petitioners backed by AIMPLB said that they were seeking the reconsideration of the verdict in their "quest for justice" and "not to disturb the peace" but in the "spirit" that any "peace must be conducive to justice."

The petitioners have emphasised on peace in the wake of a statement by Muslim intelligentsia appealing against seeking the reconsideration of the verdict in the larger interest of peace and tranquillity.

The AIMPLB-backed petitions would see senior counsel Rajeev Dhavan and Zafaryab Jilani arguing their case if they are heard in open court.

Normally review petitions are decided by judges in their chambers by circulation. However, in some cases, the petitions seeking reconsideration of a verdict are heard in the open court.

LAND ISSUES LIKELY TO COST BJP DEARLY

Time stands still in this holiest of the holy places in Jharkhand: village Ulihatu, the birthplace of Birsa Bhagwan. Cutting across parties, state politicians visit, eulogise Birsa Munda, and seek votes in his name. But when it comes to development and infrastructure, things have moved at a snail's pace. Ulihatu is in the Tamar assembly and the Naxalite "red corridor", and the BJP has never won here, for muscular nationalism and aggressive Hindutva had never found much purchase.

Employment and joblessness are perennial issues whose dark shadows have only lengthened with time. Since Jharkhand's formation there has been a steady exodus of youths from here. Though the BJP government provided "roads and electricity", unemployment remains "our major concern", a local resident said.

There are hardly any BJP flags or posters sitting MLA Rita Devi Munda. But posters of Vikas Munda, who switched from AJSU to become a JMM-Congress-RJD candidate are visible at prominent places.

Locals are also miffed at the failed "attempts" to amend the Chota Nagpur Tenancy Act and the Santhal Pargana Tenancy Act, which they claim intended to snatch from "prakar" (nature)" for sale to "outsiders". These efforts triggered the revival of the Pathalgarhi movement. Ulihatu is one of many villages where one can find green Pathalgarhi slabs notifying the Constitution's special provisions under the Fifth Schedule. The government claims that Naxals are misusing the age-old practice of demarcating gram sabha territory.

police action in Hyderabad spread faster than a late stage cancer, trending, flooding any dissent with a menacing put-down, perhaps friends were unfriended, and blocked, but the most liberal amongst the encounter-supporters just gently told all naysayers to go to the opposite of heaven. Well done, Hyderabad police," told a lady to a man who raised "technical legal points like should cops kill!" "I will celebrate tonight. Join me, brothers and sisters. #DayJusticeWasDone." #DayJusticeWasDone, posted a happy proud citizen. There will be much celebration there, at least as FB promises goes. Blood they sought, blood they loved sighting; and they hope there shall be blood no more from tomorrow.

Friends censor worse than govts

response. More savagely dealt was the man who wrote, "The equation is becoming simple in dealing with rape cases. If accused is an inconsequential, kill him. If he is well connected, kill the victim." On another day, one might have advised that he go to the police to complaint against some of the replies he received. "Killing criminals like this isn't what Indian democracy is about. This is a dangerous path we are treading on. It's failure of judiciary. Wake up call for all, emotions and filmy endings can't overrule democratic pillars," said a political activist. However, strongly the responses came, voices of reason stood rocksteady. But the voices of reason were drowned in the tsunami of irrational outrage, blind hatred and a vicious bloodthirst.

Disha's family hails encounter

Our daughter will never come back, but the encounter alleviates our pain: Father

The family of the veterinarian who was brutally raped and murdered on November 27 have hailed the "encounter" killing of Mohd Arif, Jollu Shiva, Jollu Naveen and Ch. Chennakesavulu, the four men who had been arrested for the crimes.

Her father told *Deccan Chronicle* at his residence on Friday. "True justice is impossible for us, our daughter will never come back. But today's incident has alleviated some of our pain."

The sister said, "I did not expect there would be an encounter. I thought a trial would go on for a few months and (perpetrators) would be sentenced to death. But today's stringent punishment will help prevent similar crimes."

"We have received justice. I thank the police, media and the residents of our colony for their support." The mother of Disha, the name given to the vet to protect her identity said, struggling to find words. Recalling the 2012 Delhi gangrape, she said, "I did not think we would ever get justice. Nirbhaya's family still hasn't got any justice. I told everyone nothing would happen, but Telangana police has proven me wrong."

It was through television news channels that the family came to know about the encounter. Visibly exhausted, Disha's father asked a reporter, "I have said the same thing multiple times already."

On what he thought of those criticising the encounter, "I won't be able to comment on that. I leave it to their judgment," he said.

Though the grief was palpable, there was also a sense of peace in the house. The family members, around 20 of them in total, were watching TV in the living room, flipping through news channels.

Satyapal Reddy, an uncle of Disha, said he was happy with the encounter of the four men. "I think no one is scared of the law. We are happy with what has happened," he said.

Disha's father said the family had still not completely processed her death. "It will be really hard to move on from this, but we have to. We are all in a depressed state right now," he said.

He admitted that he was worried about his younger daughter who works at the Rajiv Gandhi International Airport. "She works at night. I am worried how she will go to her office every day. I am hoping I can request the government to change her shift timings. It will be of great help to us," he said.

Residents of Nakshatra Society, where Disha stayed, were a jubilant lot on Friday. During the past week, they had protested and held candle-light marches every day to express solidarity with the aggrieved family. They hailed the encounter as a great move. As soon as news of the encounter broke in the residents got together and burst crackers on the society's main

road and distributed sweets among themselves.

Ms Seema Singh, a resident of the society, said, "We fought every politician and policeman who came here. We confronted each of them. Today's action is an outcome of our relentless fight for justice."

Fellow resident Aarathi Pathak said, "We feel that whatever justice was needed to be delivered has arrived." Housewife Soetha Sowjanya said the encounter was essential. "I hope every perpetrator

gets the same treatment," she said.

On whether a police encounter was acceptable, Ms Sowjanya said, "At one level, it is not appropriate. But one has to think of the pain felt by the girl's family, and all of us as neighbours, who have known Disha, all these years. My personal view is that every rapist should be dealt a similar punishment."

A male resident said, "Sajjanar has become a hero in our eyes. We are in awe of the way he handled the case."

Killings no solution, say psychiatrists

Encounters won't deter rapists, experts argue

The 'encounter' killings of the suspected rapist and murderers of the veterinarian referred to as Disha is a deterrent only for the time being and does not stop rapists from the act, stated psychiatrists. This is only a short term solution to the larger problem that is prevailing in society. The present situation can lead to 'aversion therapy' where it will instil fear in those who indulge in molestation, sexual assault and rapes but it will deter them from committing the act.

Dr. Preeti Swaroop, president of the Hyderabad Psychiatric Society, explained, "In the case of Disha the encounter comes across as a punishment for heinous crime. It sends a message out to many

others that this kind of behaviour will not be tolerated by society. This will act as one measure of deterrence. But does it help to solve the problem? No. The reason is because gang rapes are an instinctive, pre-meditated behaviour and these are not done for the first time. The rapists try it with those who are in their close circles first and who will not talk about it to anyone. This gives them the courage and they try again and again.

Dr. Maresh Vallamani, senior psychiatrist, explained, "In gang rapes, the act is often done by those who are drop outs, failed students who are always criticised for being good for nothing. The act is their ability to score on the society. They will do it under the influence of drugs

and alcohol and will continue to do it as it is not considered a crime by them. But killing them will not solve the problem."

Vadlamani said what we need is "a strong judicial system. They must be tried first and locked up forever in jail. They must not be let out ever. The United Kingdom has Rampton and Broadmoor prisons where serial killers are kept. They have no human rights and will never be out of prison in their lifetime."

There is jubilation presently at the killings and sad demise of Sri Harkishan Lal Dutt, but as it subsides there will be a strong voice raised for a strong police system and legal machinery to deal with these cases.

Dr. Pragna Rashmi, consultant psychologist, explained, "There was a pressing need for

closure. This has led to sense of justice and a sense of instant gratification. Which is not necessarily actual justice which is taken justice. Will it ensure no rapists happen? Will now criminals be dealt with on case to case basis? Who decides and how? Does it really send a message home to perpetrators? These are larger questions which will need to be addressed. This particular case has led to an individualistic approach and not a collective approach. Can the same be utilised for all? No. It can't be."

The question of how to prevent sexual assault and rape cannot be answered by killing the perpetrators. Society needs to inculcate a sense that such behaviour is unacceptable and will be dealt with harshly but in the full process of justice.

Rights groups condemn unlawful killings

Human rights groups have called it an "alleged encounter", "cold blooded murder" and demanded that the police must be booked for homicide.

Civil Liberties Monitoring Committee general secretary, Lateef Mohammed Khan, said, "It is a cold-blooded murder which was meticulously planned and executed. The killing of the suspects has taken away the major clues which would have

later shed light on the crime."

"There are many questions which will remain unanswered forever as the case is now closed. Was there an attempt to save the others in the system? The crime was heinous, no doubt, but there are many lapses in the system which led to the crime. Is the cold blooded murder to be attempted to hide these failures?" Mr Khan asked.

After the Nihavan incident, the Verma Commission had given a list which must be imple-

mented in the criminal law system. Has that been done, ask the activists.

The Human Rights Forum demanded that all police personnel who participated in the killing of the accused must be arrested and prosecuted for homicide.

G. Madhava Rao, HRF's Telangana state president,

said, "The police have taken advantage of the sentiment of the people and carried out murder. This is the third incident of custodial killing and these are methodical slaying by the police in their physical custody. It is not justice of any kind. It is merely satisfying the collective conscience in an unlawful and murderous manner."

In December 2008, three accused in an acid attack where murdered in Warangal. In October 20, 2007, two men accused in

the murder of Bank of Indore branch manager were murdered by Vishakhapatnam police near Yanadala. Human rights activists state that the police claim of self-defence is farcical. There are major questions being raised whether these killings will make women safer. The activists say No. Preventing crimes against women requires a long, sustained and complex battle and has to be fought at homes, educational institutes and also places of work.

First man to see Disha's burnt body is happy

Friday's encounter killing of four persons accused of the rape and murder of the veterinarian Disha took place in the agricultural fields of Samala Sathyan, a resident of Lingareddyguda, was the first person to notice Disha's burning body under the culvert.

This time Sathyan who was at the home was informed by other villagers on Friday morning that the accused had burnt stones at the place of Mohd Arif, J. Shiva, J. Naveen, and Ch. Chennakeshavulu. "I feel happy that the killing of the woman has been gunned down. It is said that they attacked the police and the police fired. There is a strong need for us to teach the children about personal safety and self-defence techniques," Sathyan.

Soon after the reports of the encounter were on media, scores of people reached the spot and

hailed the police. Commuters stopped on the highway and service roads leading to the agricultural fields. The fields are located just about 200 metres from the spot where Disha was burnt.

At around 11.45 am, Arif, Naveen, Shiva, and Chennakeshavulu were brought to the place where the burnt body was to recover her belongings — mobile phone, power bank, and a wrist-watch, that were hidden under the bushes nearby.

After the police recovered them, the accused tried to move away from the police. Arif and Chennakeshavulu allegedly snatched two 9 mm pistols from the police, while Shiva and Naveen picked up stones and sticks. Despite the police warning, the accused said to have several rounds of fire at the police and Arif and Chennakeshavulu cocked the pistols and opened several rounds of fire at the police. Though none of the police received bullet injuries, two of the 10-

member team suffered bleeding injuries caused due to stone-pelting. The police opened fire with AK 47s and gunned down the Disha's accused killers. Each accused had at least two bullet injuries in the 15-minute gun battle! The scene of the encounter has found that the fire was opened from 9mm pistols and AK 47 assault rifles.

Sources said, "The scene suggests that around 20 rounds are expected to have been fired during the exchange of fire between the police party and the accused persons. However, only about eight empty shells were recovered, while the others are yet to be found. Each accused had at least two bullet injuries on different parts of the body, while Shiva had a bullet injury to his neck. The traces of Gun Shot Residue (GSR) were also identified in the hands of Mohammed and Chennakeshavulu.

NOW, DISHA-LIKE JUSTICE SOUGHT FOR APARICHITA

Three people are accused in the rape and murder of Aparichita. It is learnt, police have taken the three into custody from the Adilabad district jail on Friday to conduct further investigations.

Mr Sajjanar said the DNA profiling of the accused would be conducted to find out if they were involved in similar offences in Telangana and in other neighbouring states.

During the questioning of the accused, more information was unearthed about their suspected involvement in other offences. A DNA profiling would help in finding out more information.

He said that a case would be registered for a probe. The deceased's bodies were taken to Mahabubnagar government hospital mortuary for the postmortem and will be handed over to their families.

Cops took all care to avoid falling into legal quagmire

Top cops meticulously planned the encounter with Disha's killers so that they would not face any legal difficulties keeping in view of the past experience of encounter cases where they faced the wrath of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) and the courts.

Through the trial court granted an order to take four accused ten days' custody. On December 2, the investigators took them into custody on December 4. Sources close to the investigation revealed that after taking them into custody the accused were taken to a secret place (possibly the Telangana Police Academy) and questioned there on Disha's missing mobile phone and to secure clenching evidence.

When the investigators were busy questioning the accused, senior cops including Cyberabad police commissioner V.C. Sajjanar and intelligence officials had a prolonged brainstorming in the backdrop of mounting pressure from across the country on the state government and police for instant justice for Disha.

The embarrassing situation faced by Chief Minister Nara Chandrababhan Rao during his visit to Delhi to attend a marriage, when the media targeted him on Disha's rape and murder, appears to have forced the police bosses to take this case to its logical conclusion.

In earlier cases of encounters, police faced legal consequences. The NHRC had chided the police about the encounter of terror suspects Vigaruddin and others at Alair in Nalgonda.

Two months after Ayesha's murder in a girls' hostel in Vijayawada, the local police arrested Laddu and made him the accused. He was sent to judicial remand and his bail petition was rejected by the lower court several times.

The police and legal experts involved in the case pondered what fate Laddu Singh would have met if the police succumbed to the public pressure of delivering instant justice. "We should not miss in the overwhelming public support to the Friday's encounter that majority demanded for quick justice not police encounter," the advocate pointed out.

Unwilling to be quoted, he said delay in justice delivery lent support to such acts that his own family members would not spare him talking against the encounter. On the other hand, police bungling and a botched up investigation left family members of Ayesha's kin suffering till date as the real culprits were at large. "Right from the beginning, we have been complaining that the real culprits are the kin of former minister, K. Rangarao. But the police never investigated the case properly for obvious reasons," said Shamshad Begum, mother of Ayesha. After Laddu's fiasco, the police arrested Satyam Babu about nine months after the rape and murder. They claimed to have collected scientific evidence including semen and DNA samples. In 2018, the Women's Court sentenced Satyam Babu to life imprisonment and another 10 years on charges of rape. But, eight years later, a division bench comprising Justice C. V. Nagaraj, Justice M. S. K. Jaiswal of Hyderabad High Court acquitted Satyam Babu and another 10 years on charges of rape. The judgment rapped the police for failing to establish that the rape even took place. It also stated that Satyam Babu had committed it. "They brought out the theory of rape to save the real culprits," the court said. The Bench made it clear that police responsible for the investigation goot up should be punished.

That the encounter killing — which is an extra-judicial killing and totally against the law — has been welcomed by the public, is an indication of how little confidence the public has that the due process of law will bring justice. Indeed, a Member of the Upper House of Parliament seems to hold the same opinion when she declared that a public lynching would be a good punishment for the offenders in the Disha case.

● In the 2007 Ayesha Meera case, at least one innocent person would have got killed.

The police also subjected the accused to several tests including a polygraph. Subsequently, the bail petition landed in the High Court. "We asked police several times if they were sure. Laddu committed the crime and every time the answer was a firm 'yes'," said an advocate involved in the case.

The prosecution put up a strong case against a bail application which eventually got rejected. "Within days of bail rejection, the Vijayawada police showed another person, Satyam Babu, as the accused," he said.

The police and legal experts involved in the case pondered what fate Laddu Singh would have met if the police succumbed to the public pressure of delivering instant justice. "We should not miss in the overwhelming public support to the Friday's encounter that majority demanded for quick justice not police encounter," the advocate pointed out.
