India to invite Imran Khan for Shanghai Council meet

Move comes hours after the UNSC discusses the situation in Kashmir

Prime Minister Imran Khan of Pakistan will be invited to participate in the Heads of Government Council meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) that will be hosted in India this year, the Ministry of External Affairs said on Thursday. The invite move came hours after the UN Security Council discussed the situation in Kashmir.

"As per the established practice and procedure within SCO, all eight members of the SCO, four observer states, and other international dialogue partners will be invited to attend the meeting," said Official Spokesperson Raveesh Kumar in response to a question on whether Mr. Khan will be invited for the summit.

Since becoming full-time member of the SCO in 2017, both India and Pakistan have participated in multiple Regional power play

meetings of SCO and the Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure (RATS) despite hostilities and tension in Kashmir. The Heads of Government Council meeting is attended by the Prime Minister-level leaders of the member states that deliberate on the regional body's economic and other pressing issues. The meeting also firms up SCO's annual budget.

Prime Minister Khan who assumed office in 2018 has been a tough critic of India's continued lockdown of Kashmir. He has also taken up the Citizenship (Amendment) Act 2019 and the National Register of Citizens both domestically and on global platforms.

Though his predecessor Nawaz Sharif had visited India in May 2014 for the "mini-SAARC summit", Mr. Khan has not been invited to India till now. On Thursday, the Pakistani leader welcomed the discussion on Kashmir held at the UN Security Council in New York, saying that the meeting "reflects a recognition of the seriousness of the prevailing situation (in Kashmir)."

Children as young as 10-12 years are being radicalised in Kashmir and there is need to isolate those completely radicalised and put them in "deradicalisation camps", Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) Gen. Bipin Rawat said on Thursday. He also said that security forces cannot be blamed for injuries caused by pellet guns.

Speaking on a panel on countering terrorism at the ongoing Raisina Dialogue organised by the Ministry of External Affairs and Observer Research Foundation, he said radicalisation could be countered by looking at where it was happening and who were behind it.

"What we saw in Kashmir, we saw radicalisation happening. Today we are seeing radicalisation being undertaken even amongst young people. Girls and boys as young as 10-12 are now being radicalised. These people

"We have deradicalisation camps going on in our country," he added, in the first comments on such camps from the Army.

Counter strategy Gen. Rawat said radicalisation was happening in schools, universities, religious places and other sites.

"First we need to get to the

people... You can start isolating these people gradually and then start a counter-radicalisation programme by identifying people who have been radicalised, to what degree. We have got to segregate them in degrees and then look at those who are completely radicalised, first target them, but also looking at the future," he said.

No relief for telcos; to pay ₹1.47 lakh-cr.

SC dismisses review petitions filed by Bharti Airtel, Vodafone Idea and others

A three-judge Bench of the Supreme Court led by Justice Arun Mishra, on Thursday, dismissed petitions filed by telecom companies, including Bharti Airtel and Vodafone Idea, for a review of its October 2019 judgment upholding the recovery of past dues amounting to ₹1.47 lakh crore from them.

The recovery by the government was based on adjusted gross revenue of about ₹92,000 crore.

ing. "Having perused the review petitions and the conpapers meticulous care, we do not find any justifiable reason to entertain the review petitions... Pending application (s), if any, shall stand disposed of," the Supreme Court observed in a short order.

On October 24 last year, the Supreme Court dealt a huge blow to telecom service providers when it upheld the Department of Telecom's move to recover adjusted

sector had long reaped the fruits of the Centre's liberalised mode of payment by revenue sharing regime. "The sector has benefited immensely under the scheme as is apparent from the gross revenue trend from 2004 to 2015," Justice Mishra had written. The service providers, in turn, had failed to fulfil their obligations to the government and instead raised frivolous objections.

Will act against prof. for 'Pappu' tweet: govt.

Let him return from leave, says Minister; what about JNU professors, asks BJP

The Maha Vikas Aghadi government will take action against a Mumbai University professor for an 'abusive' post against Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, Maharashtra Home Minister Anil Deshmukh announced on Thursday. On December 14, the professor had posted a video on Twitter targeting Mr. Gandhi for his statement against V.D. Savarkar, referring to him as 'Pappu'. The professor has since been sent on forced leave by the university administration. "A university professor's work is to teach children, not give statements like these (on Mr. Gandhi). He has been sent on leave for now but action will be ta-



ken once he is back," said

Mr. Deshmukh. Professor Yogesh Soman,

Director of the Academy of Theatre Arts at Mumbai University, had posted the video on December 14. Mr. Soman had said, referring to Mr. Gandhi, "You are right, you are not Savarkar. You have nothing of him in you, his dedication, his sacrifice, his valour, but you also do not have anything to be called Gandhi. I condemn your *pappugiri* (sic)." The tweet set in motion a

political blame game, with members of the Chhatra Bharti Students Union and activists of AISF (All India Students' Federation) staging a sit-in, which was withdrawn after the Mumbai University general secretary issued a letter stating Mr. Soman had been sent on forced leave. The Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) had called that a violation of the professor's freedom of speech. "According to @INCIndia, criticising a venerated freedom fighter like Veer Savarkar is perfectly okay. But dare

anyone criticise His High-

ness @RahulGandhi or anyone from the Nehru-Gandhi dynasty, they will be sent on forced leave! Hypocrisy, thy name is Congress," the ABVP tweeted, soon after.

The Bharatiya Janta Party (BJP) too criticised the announcement to send Mr. Deshmukh on leave.

BJP leader Shweta Shalini said by the same token, action should be taken against professors protesting in Jawaharlal Nehru University. "Really, what about all the professors in JNU who are participating in marches, sloganeering and stone-pelting? What's their work, and guess what the Fascist government is doing against them? Nothing," she said.
